The foist stamps to be printed (by De La Rue) featuring the Colony mane 'LEEWARD ISLANDS' were the Fees stamps issued for Revenue purposes in 1881 - ten years after the formation of the Colony and nine years before the issue of the first 'POSTAGE & REVENUE' stamps.








Progressive King Edward VII Die Droofs.




Dossibly Colour Trials for the Purple of the Head Plate.


