





On Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2020 a reception will be organised by the RPSL, during the Dutch National Exhibition Hertogpost, which is taking place from 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> March 2020 at the Brabanthallen in 's-Hertogenbosch, the Netherlands.

The reception will be sponsored by Corinphila Netherlands, and will be preceded by a presentation by Birthe King FRPSL on Open Philately and her collection *Denmark: Conscience, conflict, and camps 1932 – 1949*. The lecture starts at 3.00 PM and the reception at 4.00 PM.

The National Exhibition HERTOGPOST 2020 has been rescheduled. It is taking place from Thursday 28th May to Saturday 30th May at the Brabanthallen in 's-Hertogenbosch, the Netherlands. In principle, the same programme will be followed as was planned for March, and there will be a presentation about the Holocaust by Danny Spungen from the USA.

On the afternoon of Friday 29th May, Birthe will give her lecture on Open Philately and her collection, followed by the RPSL reception sponsored by Corinphila Netherlands.
