


London Underground (The Tube)

Bank and Cannon Street are the nearest stations to The Royal. Use exit 5 (King William Street Lombard Street). A new exit will open on Cannon Street by the end of 2022. In blue on the lower map.



Travel like a Londoner ... try the bus. Click for Central London Bus Maps



Another way to travel is by bus.

The King William Street / Monument Station stops are **F** and **G**.

Buses 8, 11, 21, 26, 43, and 141 pass these stops.

Pay using your contactless credit or debit card. You can just tap in when you get on the bus.

Mainline Railway Stations - and Public Transport

Cannon Street: Walk to Abchurch Lane.

Charing Cross: Walk to Embankment Station: Circle Line Eastbound to Cannon Street Station or District

Line towards Upminster/Barking

Euston: Northern Line - towards Morden - to Bank Station.

King's Cross: Northern Line - towards Morden - to Bank Station.

Liverpool Street: 15 minutes' walk or Central Line Westbound to Bank Station.

London Bridge: 10 Minutes' walk, or number 17 bus towards Archway. Get off at Cannon Street Station.

Paddington: Circle Line Eastbound to Cannon Street Station.

St Pancras International: Northern Line - towards Morden - to Bank Station.

<u>Victoria</u>: Circle Line Eastbound to Cannon Street Station or District Line towards Upminster/Barking. <u>Waterloo</u>: Waterloo & City Line to Bank (not weekends): Northern Line Southbound to Kennington and change there for a Northbound Northern Line train to Bank.

Taxis

There are usually taxis at mainline stations. Abchurch Lane is a one-way street for vehicles. Make sure that your taxi enters from Cannon Street. It is not well signposted, and you may need to tell the driver that it's OK to drive up to the Royal's entrance.

Download apps from the Apple Store or the company website

- <u>Uber</u> operates in London in the usual way using the Uber App. They are OK for an immediate need but not always good for advance bookings.
- Freenow is widely used by hotels.
- Addison Lee is a more upmarket company and reliable when booked.

Black Cabs and others: Traditional London black cabs are expensive, but they are OK for short journeys in central London. You can pay using your contactless credit or debit card. Black cabs can be hailed in the street. No other taxi can pick up fares off the street - if any other taxi offers to pick you up - say no.

By Air to London

By air to London and public transport to Bank Station

Travel times are variable in London. These are estimated times *from the station at the airport* to 15 Abchurch Lane.

London City (LCY) on the Dockland Light Railway (DLR): about 30-40 minutes.

<u>London Heathrow (LHR)</u> to Bank via the Heathrow Express: As little as 45 minutes. The <u>Elizabeth Line</u> links Heathrow with Paddington and Liverpool Street Stations.

London Stansted Airport (STN) to Bank via Liverpool Street: About an hour.

London Gatwick Airport (LGW) to Bank Station: About an hour.

London Luton Airport (LTN) to Bank Station: About ninety minutes.
