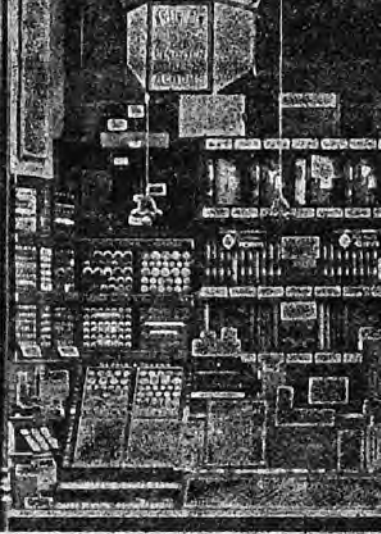

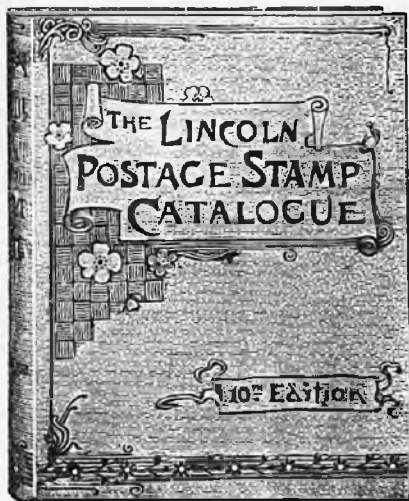

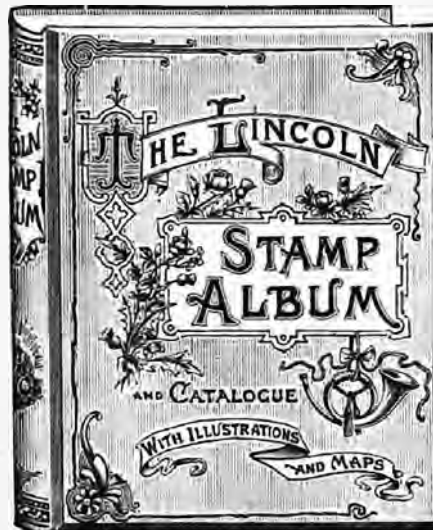

VIEW OF NEW PREMISES.



THE LINCOLN STAMP ALBUM, prepared and published by Mr. William S. Lincoln, has room in it for 6,000 stamps. Maps and an Illustrated Catalogue at the end make it an excellent one of its kind.—*Daily Telegraph*.

Mr. W. Lincoln is offering a series of Postage Stamp Albums, for which he has obtained a first-class Diploma at the Antwerp Exhibition. This edition is a most complete album, and gives a description of every known stamp, and compartments of different sizes are arranged for their reception, additional room being left for the insertion of new stamps. It contains a catalogue of Foreign, British and Colonial postage stamps, giving dates of issue, value and colours, and illustrated by three thousand engravings of various stamps; it also contains sixteen coloured maps, carefully got up.—*The British and Colonial Printer*.

"THE LINCOLN STAMP ALBUM."—This very useful work is now in its 10th Edition, and continues to be a favourite with beginners, as well as patronised by older philatelists. It has spaces to hold 6,000 stamps, the names of the Countries are printed on every page most legibly (in geographical order) and the binding is well done, there being sufficient guards introduced, so as to allow the stamps to be placed within, without making the Album bulge. The 16 Coloured Maps, engraved by the Queen's Geographer, exhibiting most of the Stamp-issuing Countries and States of the World, are a positive boon, whether for amateurs or professionals, and the excellent Index, with other attractive features, render the Album a triumph, and make it quite a record at the price. In the same artistic volume there is Lincoln's *Postage Stamp Catalogue*, with 3,000 illustrations, prices for used and unused, and the dates of issue and colours of every stamp, also varieties of perforations and watermarks. The reliable and interesting hints to collectors have been considerably increased in this edition, the numerous notes being simply invaluable. The two works in the one volume, *Album and Catalogue*, may be had for 8s., 6s., or 8s., according to binding, or the Catalogue and Maps alone for 3s. (Post free 6d. extra.) The establishment of Mr. W. S. Lincoln is at 2, Holles Street, London, W., the address being very knowingly arranged within two squares, the one having *hallies*, and the other an *ox* crossing a *ford*; a hieroglyphical study of an ingenious character. Bro. Lincoln has had several medals in recognition of his Albums, and has just been awarded one at the Paris Exhibition of Books and Printing, now being held at the Palais de l'Industrie."

The pilgrim westward-bound misses the familiar show of William Lincoln, who for years had cast a halo of philatelic enterprise around his premises in High Holborn. But he has 'gone on' further West into larger premises. May his business continue to increase."

The Engravings will be a great assistance in the arrangement of a collection, as, by their aid, the various issues can be easily separated; this is specially useful with Spain, Montevideo, United States, New Granada, and other countries that are otherwise difficult to describe. There are Ruled Spaces for over Fifteen Thousand Stamps

Abundant room has been given for all the Stamps issued, and spare spaces for new issues, one whole page having been left for Spain. Care has been taken to make the spaces sufficiently large for Envelope Stamps, and for the triangular and oblong Stamps; extra-large spaces have been provided for the New Zealand and New South Wales Fiscal Stamps that have been used for Postal purposes. Also oblong spaces for the New United States Stamps, issued to commemorate the 400th Anniversary of the discovery of America by Columbus.

By the arrangement of the Album, collectors are not compelled to adopt any special mode of collecting, and varieties can be collected or not as desired, or very rare Stamps can be left out, thus avoiding the blanks that appear in many Albums.

The paper used for this Edition has been specially manufactured, and is of very substantial and superior quality."

The *Preface* says:—The success which has attended the former Editions of this Album has induced the publisher when preparing this, the Fourth Edition of the LINCOLN STAMP ALBUM, to introduce some further improvements and to add several hundred more Illustrations of Stamps, some Diagrams of Watermarks, information respecting the Designs and Names of Portraits on the Stamps, and also a few Historical and Geographical Notes, which may be of interest to the Philatelist.

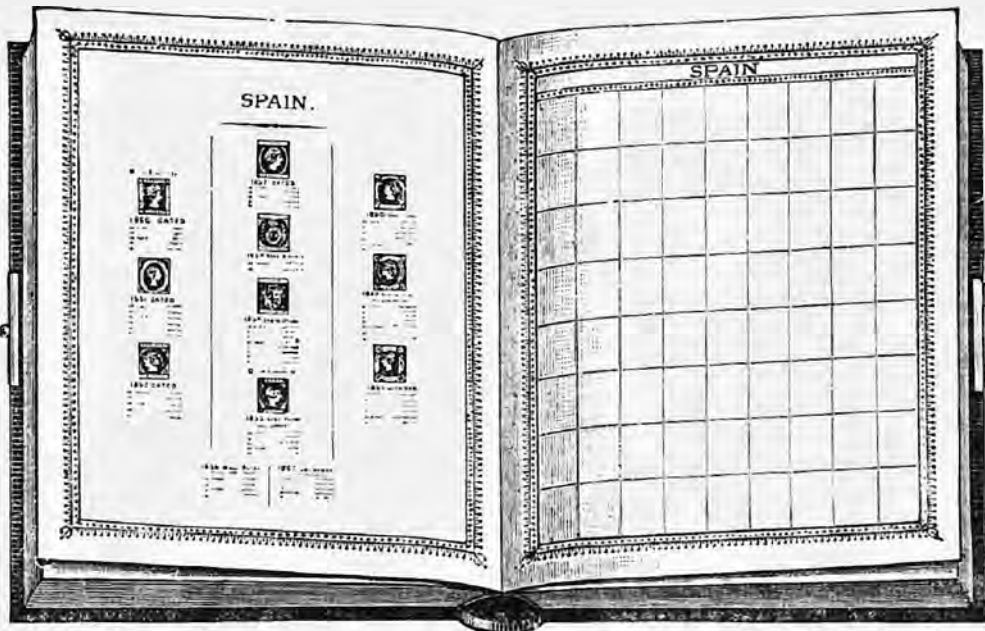

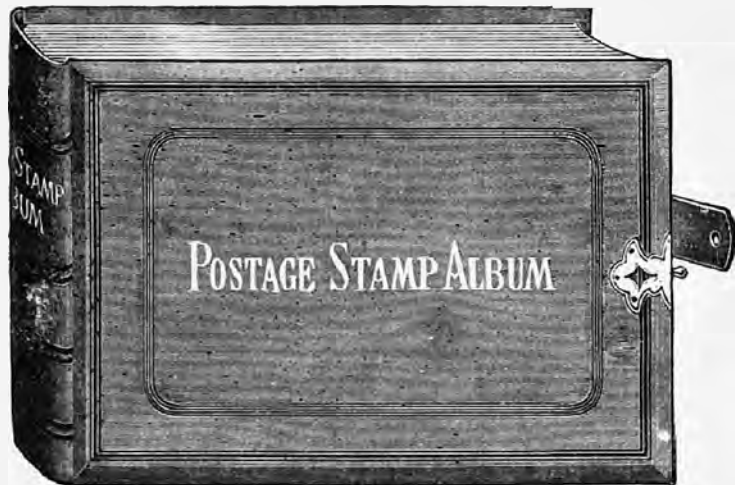

The stamps can be arranged in this Album according to the taste of the collector, and varieties of colours, perforations or watermarks, can be inserted when desired. Collectors are advised to use the LINCOLN Adhesive Stamp Hinges, by which they can hinge the stamps, and easily remove them when requisite.

Extra spaces have been left for new issues. There are 583 pages in this edition, being 83 more than the previous edition, and printed on very superior paper. Will hold over 9,000 stamps. The binding is strong and durable, sufficient guards are provided, and extra good clasps.

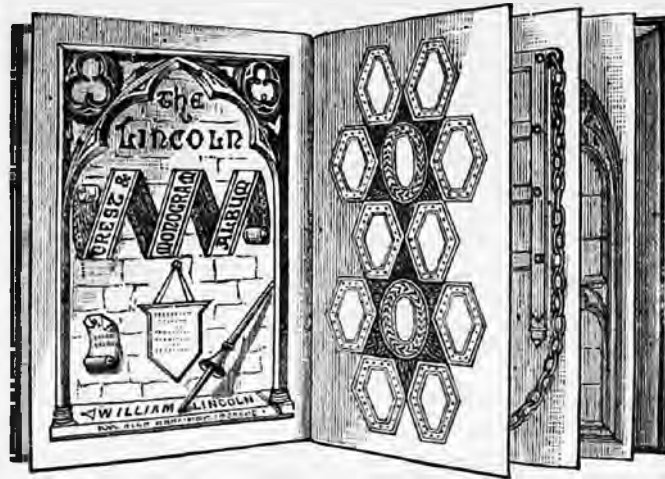

OPINIONS OF THE PRESS OF THE LINCOLN CREST & MONOGRAM ALBUM.

CREST AND MONOGRAM ALBUMS.—Mr. William Lincoln has already done good service in the cause of collectors of curious monograms and crests, but his latest effort quite eclipses his previous productions. The Album he has just published is the third edition, and is similar in shape to its predecessors, but the designs used are quite different, those in the present edition being perfectly original. One gives a representation of a gothic-shaped church window, and a second one is a fac-simile of a circular window in Lincoln Cathedral, the remainder being of a geometrical character; the spaces of all being designed to fit the various shapes of crests and monograms. The leaves are of good stout cardboard, with linen joints, and the designs well printed in twelve different colours. It can be had bound in cloth, gilt, 7s. 6d.; French morocco, gilt edges 10s. 6d.; and the best levant morocco, gilt edges, 16s. each.—*The Stationery Trades Journal*.

Mr. Lincoln has issued a New Edition of his Lincoln Crest and Monogram Album, an ingeniously arranged book, likely to be much prized by collectors of crests and monograms.—*Sunday Times*.

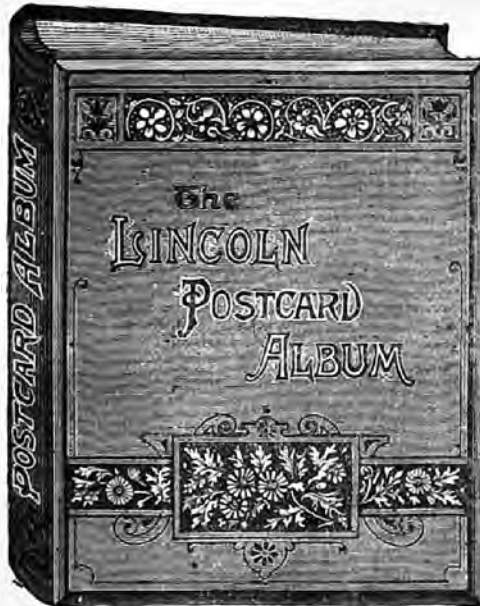

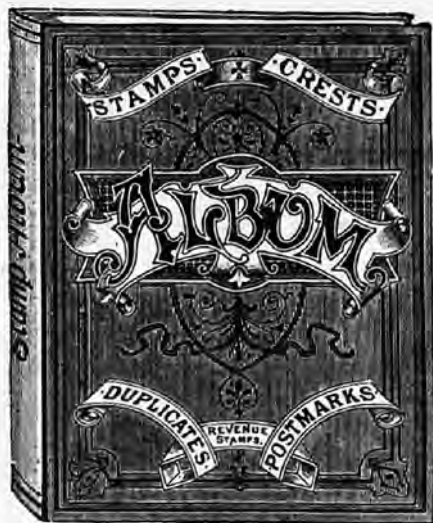

The results have proved that neither the paper nor adhesive matter contain anything likely to cause harm to the mouth and tongue, and no action results even upon such sensitive colours as are employed notably in stamps of Russia, Cashmere, &c. Even the green colour in the present issue of Great Britain is unchanged, hence I can thoroughly commend them to all collectors who need have no fear in their use, and as regards their adhesion there is no liability of chipping off or cracking.

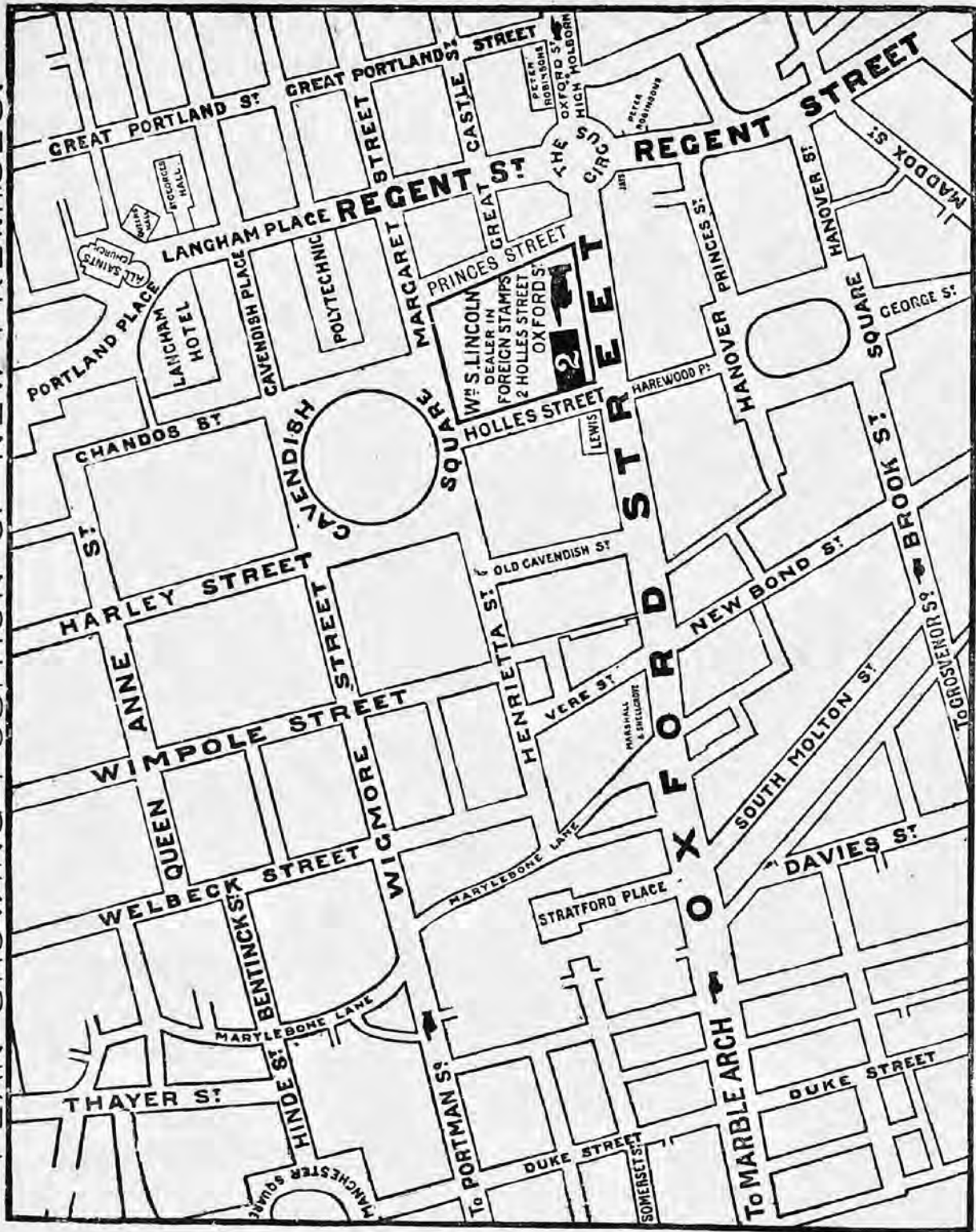
