




### The Mail



- NZ mail to Australia (9 May)
- Departure date delayed (15 May)
- Additional 7 mailbags added
- Total mail items flown 28,279
- All mail flown in Southern Cross
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> plane cancelled

Kingsford Smith was paid 4d per mail item carried

### The Actual Flight



A map diagram showing the position, 650 miles off the coast of New South arcs, where the Southern Cross tost her starboard propeller while on the Jub et Air Mail flight to New Zealand. The heavy line indicates the course of the return trip. The dotted line shows the uncompleted section of the flight to the Dominion.






