James Grimwood-Taylor RDP FRPSL

James owned and ran Cavendish Philatelic Auctions for 19 years. He has served as a British national judge since the 1980s and was President of both the Great Britain Philatelic Society and the Society of Postal Historians. Author of several books, his two-volume, 1,000+ page opus *International Postal Reforms*, was awarded the Crawford Medal.





Douglas N Muir RDP FRPSL

Douglas was Senior Curator, Philately at The Postal Museum in London (and its predecessors) for 34 years. Author of several books on aspects of the Museum's British philatelic and postal history collections, he also founded the Postal Mechanisation Study Circle.

Theo Brauers

Theo was President of the FgGB (the German GB Study Group) for 25 years. Author of several books, the most recent is "Not Intended for this Purpose" on the use of the earliest British stamps overseas. Current studies include "Mail to and from the UK in times of trouble: 1792 – 1815" and "Pre-UPU mail from the UK to Scandinavia".





Nigel Gooch FRPSL

Nigel is a Past President and the current Chairman of the Society of Postal Historians, having joined in 2001 and a member of the Iran Philatelic Study Circle since 1969 and Chairman since 2005. He has served on the ABPS Executive Committee since 2007 and was awarded the Congress Medal in 2020.



Birthe is best known internationally for her promotion of "Open Philately" as an approach to collecting and exhibiting, and has published widely on the subject. She was a Director of FEPA (2013-19) and has worked with FIP on regulations for exhibiting picture postcards and "Open Philately".





Wolfgang Maassen RDP FRPSL

Wolfgang is President of the AIJP (the world association of authors and journalists in philately) and an internationally renowned author of many books and judge of philatelic literature. Former editor of the German magazine *Philatelie*, he is the publisher of *Phila Historica* about philatelic history and literature.
