86. The business transacted by means of the Parcels Mails has attained to four times its original dimensions during the past ten years, having increased by a steady annual progression from the number of 955 parcels handled in 1891 to the number of 4,197 parcels handled in 1900, showing how this branch of the postal business has been gradually appreciated and turned to use by increasing numbers of the public.

87. The money order transactions comprised in orders issued and paid a total number of 2,094, with a total value of £3,269 18s. 8d., and comparing these figures with those of previous years it is found that the business is nearly stationary, showing that the institution suffices to meet the convenience of the public for the remittance of small sums of money, but is not turned to illegitimate uses by being made the vehicle for the remittance of large sums in competition with the bank.

88. The premium of four per cent. on remittances which has wisely been fixed and maintained in this Colony for the Post Office rate is, of course, much higher than bank rates, and there is, therefore, no inducement to evade the Post Office rule which limits the amount of any single Post Office order to £10, as it is commonly evaded in Colonies where the Post Office rate is fixed too low.

### Telegraph Service.

- 89. The telegraph line from Nassau to Jupiter in the State of Florida is owned and worked by the Government, and consists of a cable measuring 211 knots and a land line six miles in length.
- 90. The total cost of construction up to date has been £33,311, of which £30,000 was raised in 1892 by a loan bearing interest at 4 per cent., the annual charge for interest being £1,200.
- 91. Other annual charges comprise a contribution from General Revenue of £630 towards a Sinking Fund, and a contribution to the Repair Fund of £350.
- 92. Excluding the annual charge for interest and the other annual charges above mentioned, the total expenditure during the year was £477 13s. 6d. for ordinary working expenses, including salaries, and the total amount of receipts was £1,203 19s. 7d.
