The Following Notices Were Issued from the Office of the Postmaster General

HARRY S. NEW, POSTMASTER GENERAL

RECORDING AND CHECKING C. O. D. PARCELS AND FUNDS AT OFFICES OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CLASSES

To provide proper check of the handling of C. O. D. parcels and funds, the following instructions, effective at once, supplementing and modifying those now in effect, shall be followed at all offices of the first and second classes.

RECORDING

When incoming mails are opened, C. O. D. parcels shall be segregated and turned over to an employee who will be designated the "C. O. D. recording clerk," and who shall make the following separations:

1. For the special-delivery section and each station or branch to which parcels are sent for delivery.
2. For each parcel-post carrier assigned to the unit where the recording clerk is located.
3. For a section to be designated the C. O. D. delivery section to which all remaining parcels will be sent.

The recording clerk shall then list in duplicate on Form A, specimen of which is shown below, all parcels for the various separations. The original shall constitute the office record of all C. O. D. parcels received for delivery.

At the larger post offices, the recording clerk should be provided with an inclosure so that adequate protection may be afforded parcels in his custody. Parcels for parcel-post carriers should be assigned for delivery by the recording clerk. At those offices where conditions are such that proper protection can not be given parcels while in the custody of the recording clerk, parcels for parcel-post carriers should be delivered by the recording clerk to the C. O. D. delivery section for assignment. In such instances, the C. O. D. parcels should be listed in triplicate.

ASSIGNMENT OF C. O. D. PARCELS TO CARRIERS

Parcels assigned by either the recording clerk or the C. O. D. delivery section for delivery by parcel-post carriers, shall be receipted for by the carriers on Form A, and the duplicate copy shall be given to the carriers. At the end of each trip, the recording clerk, or the C. O. D. delivery section, will receipt the parcel-post carriers on their copies of Form A, showing whether the parcels were delivered and charges collected or that the parcels were returned and, in addition, the total number of parcels delivered by each carrier and the total amount of the charges represented thereby. The use of delivering employees' coupons of C. O. D. tags should be dispensed with in connection with such deliveries but will continue to be used for receipting purposes for parcels assigned to foot carriers.

When parcels assigned to parcel-post carriers by the recording clerk fail of delivery and are returned by the carriers, they should be retained by the recording clerk if subsequent attempts at delivery are to be made and adequate facilities are afforded for their protection. But all parcels to be held awaiting call or to be returned or forwarded should be sent by the recording clerk to the C. O. D. delivery section. All C. O. D. parcels transferred to and from the recording clerk and the C. O. D. delivery section shall be listed in duplicate on Form A.

C. O. D. DELIVERY SECTION

The C. O. D. delivery section shall ordinarily consist of the inclosure where parcels are now held for window delivery and assignment to carriers. However, where such place is not arranged so that only authorized employees have access to the parcels, they should, when practicable, be handled in the registry section.

The C. O. D. delivery section will handle all parcels for window delivery, parcels for delivery by foot carriers, and those for delivery by parcel-post carriers which are not assigned by the recording clerk.

If practicable, the employee or employees effecting window delivery of parcels, both at stations and the main office, will not have direct access to C. O. D. parcels awaiting delivery. It is intended that a window, adjacent to the C. O. D. delivery section, be used for window delivery.

STATIONS

Parcels for stations and branches shall be dispatched by the C. O. D. recording clerk in locked sacks, the duplicate copy of Form A being inclosed. Outside pieces should be so marked on the list. Upon receipt any discrepancy should be reported.

At stations and branches where carriers are assigned exclusively to the delivery of parcel post, Form A may be used if the number of parcels appears to justify; otherwise, delivering employees' coupons of C. O. D. tags should be used as heretofore.

Stations and branches shall forward to other post offices, and return to senders, undeliverable parcels direct, without sending them to the recording clerk or the C. O. D. delivery section.

Parcels accepted for local delivery and those transferred for delivery from one station to another, which, in ordinary course, would not be handled by the recording clerk, should be listed in duplicate, on Form A, the original to be sent to the recording clerk and the other to accompany the parcel.

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The actual time required to attend the conventions, including traveling time both ways, will be allowed with pay and not charged against annual leave, but upon a postmaster's return to his office he must promptly report to the inspector in charge of the division in which his office is located the number of days absent.

Offices must be left in charge of competent and duly bonded employees.

PENALTIES OF BONDS

All postmasters whose salaries are \$5,000 or more will please submit to the First Assistant, Division of Postmasters' Appointments, a statement giving the following information in each case:

Total amount of the penalty of the bond of the postmaster and all employees of his office and the total amount of premiums paid therefor. The statement should be arranged to show the number of bonds in each class; that is, the number having penalties of \$5,000, \$10,000, etc.

This does not include the postmasters who have recently submitted such statements.

SUSPENSION OF BUSINESS IN CERTAIN CASES

It would seem that many postmasters have either failed to read or ignored the instructions published in the December, 1924, supplement to the Guide regarding the observance of Armistice Day, Columbus Day, Good Friday, and other local and State holidays involving a reduced or general suspension

of business on such days. For the information of such postmasters there is reprinted below the instructions governing in all such cases:

"Whenever there is a total suspension of business in a State, city, or town, or whenever there is a substantial suspension of business so that the requirements and demands upon the Postal Service on the part of the patrons are very materially reduced, a postmaster may curtail and reduce the service of the office to an extent reasonably commensurate with such suspension of general business; provided always that the Postal Service at all places shall be adequate to meet the reasonable requirements of the public on such days. The release of employees from work resulting from such curtailment of the Postal Service on such days should be distributed as equitably as practicable among them, because compensatory time may not be granted to those who of necessity can not be released from duty in such cases.

"This order is not intended as adopting or sanctioning the observance of State holidays, as such, because the department has no legal power to do that; but is intended rather to allow postmasters discretionary authority to reduce postal service to the extent of the public requirements on such days, and other days when general business is suspended.

"Postmasters should at all times carefully exercise their discretion as to the day on which the permission given in this order may reasonably apply, always considering the service needs of each particular office.

"A record should be kept of the extent of the curtailment of the service on all such days to the end that the department and the public may have such information available.

"A close observance of this order will eliminate much unnecessary correspondence and expense on the part of postmasters and department.

"In all cases where a postmaster is in doubt as to the extent to which service may be curtailed, he should bring the matter to the attention of the department and request full information and instructions as to the observance of this order."

The provisions of the above order can not, however, be applied in the case of the death of a postmaster or any postal employee. Post offices may not be closed in such cases to permit the attendance of fellow postal employees at the funeral of one of their members. Such number of employees may, however, be excused to attend these funerals as can be conveniently spared without impairment of service.

MISSENDING OF MAIL ADDRESSED TO BELVIDERE (MARIN COUNTY), CALIF.

The attention of the service is invited to the failure of employees to make up and dispatch mail to Belvidere, Calif., as addressed. A considerable part of such mail is being sent to the Los Angeles, Calif., post office, and delivery attempted to the section locally known as "Belvidere Gardens," which is served through Station L, of Los Angeles. Care must be exercised in the distribution and make-up of this mail to eliminate further missending and resultant confusion and delay in delivery.

EXAMINATION OF EMPTY POUCHES AND SACKS

Notwithstanding repeated and emphatic instructions for the thorough examination of all pouches and sacks when emptied, mail is still found therein.

You will recall that the Postmaster General on page 3 of the September Supplement to the Guide under the caption "Examination of empty pouches and sacks," directed that postmasters of the larger offices designate supervisory officers who shall be held directly responsible for the execution of this order.

As an immediate result of this order and subsequent instructions appearing on page 11 of the November Supplement and page 7 of the December Supplement, the amount of mail found in empty equipment materially decreased.

However, reports are again reaching the department daily from the different depositories throughout the country of mail found in supposedly empty equipment. This can be due only to gross negligence and a deliberate failure to obey specific instructions, and is therefore inexcusable. The postmaster or supervisor permitting this is just as culpable as the employee himself.

Postmasters of first and second class post offices, where classified personnel is employed, should accept no excuses for any failure to make such examination of empty equipment as will insure that no mail is left therein. They should see to it that the supervisors or other responsible employees specially designated to

enforce the order are alert and on the job at all times to make certain that all employees when emptying pouches and sacks make a thorough examination thereof to see that no mail of any kind is left therein.

At third and fourth class post offices, in view of the limited number of pouches and sacks received daily, if mail is left therein it is due entirely to carelessness on the part of some one, either the postmaster or his clerk, as the operation of examining an empty pouch or sack is simple. Do not lay it down after emptying it to be examined afterwards. Do it at once under a good light in order that the entire interior of the sack may be fully illuminated.

Place yourself in the position of the addressee expecting an important letter, his daily paper, or some other piece of important mail that he has failed to receive, who, after expending much time and energy in endeavoring to ascertain what became of it, has it delivered to him after a long delay indorsed "Found in empty equipment." This inevitably causes merited complaint from the public and criticism of the service.

We are the servants of the public, and therefore must be thorough and conscientious in the performance of our duties. It is accordingly again directed that all postmasters immediately take this matter up in such a vigorous manner and issue such emphatic instructions as will preclude the possibility of any mail matter being left in any sack or pouch when emptied.

CARE OF MAIL LOCKS

It has come to the attention of the department that mail locks are frequently found in waste paper purchased from post offices. Such carelessness is inexcusable. Postmasters will issue such instructions as will preclude this in the future.

When locks are removed from pouches or sacks they must be placed in a suitable receptacle provided conveniently for the purpose, and not thrown on the floor. As waste paper is removed daily it must be examined thoroughly to make certain that there are no locks, mail, or other valuables therein.

SACKS CONTAINING SPECIAL-DELIVERY MAIL MUST BE SO LABELED

Many post offices are reporting the receipt from other offices and terminals of sacks containing special-delivery parcels not so labeled, notwithstanding repeated instructions have been issued that all sacks made up at any point containing straight special-delivery parcels shall have the address label marked or stamped "SPECIAL DELIVERY."

Such failure to properly label all sacks containing special-delivery parcels results in unwarranted delay in the handling and delivery of such parcels, as almost invariably the distribution of the contents of these sacks is not completed until after the special-delivery messengers have departed on their trips following the receipt of the mail.

Postmasters will give the matter immediate attention with a view to insuring compliance with this order in the future. Supervisors and employees responsible for failure to label all sacks "SPECIAL DELIVERY" which contain one or more special-delivery parcels will be suitably disciplined.

SPECIAL-DELIVERY PARCELS NOT TO BE INCLUDED FOR DISPATCH IN SACKS CONTAINING SPECIAL-HANDLING PARCELS

It has come to the attention of the department that some post offices make it a practice to include special-delivery parcels in sacks containing special-handling parcels. This is not in accordance with instructions and must not be done, as in transit special-delivery parcels not bearing a special-handling stamp are handled as straight fourth-class mail, whereas under the law special-handling parcels must be handled all the way through as first-class mail.

Special-handling parcels post must be sacked separately from other mails, a special-handling tag (yellow) attached to the sack, and given the same handling and dispatch, both in R. P. O. trains and closed-pouch trains, as is accorded pouches of letters. In no circumstances shall sacks containing special-handling

parcels be dispatched through Railway Mail Service terminals, or through post offices where similar distribution is performed. When it is necessary to handle special-handling mail in baggage or storage cars, it must be placed with letter mail for unloading and handling to the post office and connecting lines.

Straight special-delivery parcels addressed to offices where the salary of the postmaster is \$4,000 per annum or more, located in the States of which a distribution is made, shall be made up at all post offices and terminal railway post offices into direct sacks.

At all offices and terminal railway post offices where distribution is made of mixed parcel post, all straight special-delivery parcels shall be made up in directs where the quantity justifies and there is space in the office, or terminal railway post office, for such distribution.

All sacks made up at any point containing straight special-delivery parcels shall have the address label marked or stamped "SPECIAL DELIVERY."

SPECIAL-DELIVERY SERVICE ON SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS

The department has reason to fear that there may be some laxity in the delivery of special-delivery parcels as well as letters on Sundays, particularly in the larger cities. Attention is invited to section 842, Postal Laws and Regulations, paragraphs 2 and 3, which are as follows:

"2. Special-delivery matter shall be delivered at post offices of the first and second classes on Sunday, and at other offices if open on Sunday. Special delivery shall be made at all offices on holidays. (See secs. 321 and 322.)

"3. When special-delivery matter arrives on Saturday nights too late for delivery, or on Sunday morning, except where deliveries are made on Sunday, the postmaster should put a notice thereof in the addressee's box, or in the general delivery if he have no box, and deliver the matter on call; and if such matter is not called for, prompt delivery should be made on Monday."

All postmasters are called upon to attend to this very carefully and to so organize and instruct their employees that all special delivery letters and packages arriving in the office on Saturday evenings and Sundays and on holidays shall be delivered as speedily and promptly as on other days. At offices other than first and second class not usually open on Sunday, but where mails are received, there should be a spirit of accommodation in the matter of the delivery of special delivery articles.

DELIVERY OF FIRST-CLASS MAIL AND DAILY PAPERS

As matter of the first class and daily newspapers constitute mail of the first importance, it is essential that such mail be delivered at the earliest feasible hour after receipt.

It has come to the attention of the department that because of the partial suspension of business on Saturday afternoons in some cities a portion of such mail received Saturday afternoon and on Sunday and early Monday morning frequently is not delivered until the second or a later delivery trip Monday. Such inefficient service is inexcusable and can not be approved by the department.

All first-class mail and daily papers received in any carrier-delivery post office in time for distribution and routing by the carriers must be taken out for delivery on the first trip each day, with particular reference to Monday.

The lack of a sufficient number of clerks to complete distribution will not be accepted as an excuse for failure to handle all such mail received in time for delivery on the first trip. When necessary, additional distributors must be assigned in order to insure the rigid observance of these instructions.

Postmasters and supervisory officers will give this matter their special attention to see that on Mondays and other week days no first-class mail or daily papers received in sufficient time for necessary handling are held until the second or a later delivery.

RECALL OF MAIL MATTER AFTER DISPATCH

The attention of all postmasters is invited to the subject of requests for the interception and return of mail. In nearly all requests of this character, the date of mailing is omitted, necessitating that watch be kept on mails from the point of origin until the particular letter or parcel arrives.

For the information of all employees involved and strict observance of instructions hereafter, the notice is reprinted below:

"Section 536, paragraph 2, Postal Laws and Regulations, reads as follows: 'When application has been made in due form for the recall of an article of mail matter, the postmaster shall telegraph a request to the postmaster at the office of address, or to a railway postal clerk in whose custody the matter is known at the time to be, for the return of such matter to his office, carefully describing the same, so as to identify it and prevent the return of any other matter.'

"It is directed that in the future all requests, either by telegram or letter, for the interception and return of mail include the date of mailing, the complete address, the name and address of the sender, and, where possible, whether the article is a large or small letter, package, or roll, the color of the envelope or wrapper, and the class of mail matter, registered, ordinary, etc.

"Paragraph 3, section 536, provides that 'If the mail to which the application relates has been delivered, the applicant or the postmaster at the mailing office should be so informed.'

"In this connection the regulations do not contemplate that the addressees should be appraised of the fact that certain mail is desired withheld from delivery, and in no circumstance should addressees be advised that mail matter has been returned, at the request of the sender or, in the event mail matter has been delivered, that a request has been received for its return."

COLLECTION-SCHEDULE CARDS ON STREET-LETTER AND MAILING-CHUTE BOXES

The schedule cards on street-letter and mailing-chute boxes indicating the hours of collection should at all times be kept up to date and in a neat and clean condition. When any change in a collection schedule is made the schedule cards on the boxes affected should immediately be corrected. Otherwise, the information given thereon is misleading to the public, and results in complaint and criticism of the service.

To insure compliance with the foregoing, postmasters will hold carriers and collectors responsible for the condition of the cards on the boxes on their respective routes from which they make collections. When cards become torn or soiled, or any change is made in the hours of collection, the carrier or collector collecting from the boxes affected will promptly report that fact to the proper supervisory officer, who will take the necessary steps to provide a new card or correct the old one.

Foremen of carriers, or other supervisory officers performing such work, in making inspections of delivery and collection routes will carefully observe the condition of street letter-box equipment and mailing-chute boxes including the collection-schedule cards thereon, and promptly see that any necessary replacements, corrections, repairs, painting, etc., are made.

PAPER AND RUBBISH ON FLOORS

It has been noted that the workrooms of some offices always present a clean and tidy appearance, whereas in others the floors are frequently littered with waste paper, twine cuttings, etc.

One office has solved this problem by placing in the workroom signs as indicated below, and urging upon the whole working force its cooperation in keeping the building clean and in order.

It is desired that all postmasters adopt this idea with a view to keeping the workrooms in as clean and attractive a condition at all times as possible.

OVERTIME SERVICE AND PAYMENT THEREFOR

The attention of postmasters and supervisors is again directed to the provisions of law and the regulations (secs. 348, 678, and 679, Postal Laws and Regulations) relating to overtime and hours of service of regular employees.

It will be noted in the beginning that overtime is to be used in cases of emergency or when the needs of the service require only when it is not practicable to employ substitutes. Except in cases of extreme emergency when a supervisor may not be present, it must not be left optional with employees whether or not they shall work overtime, such service to be performed only when specifically directed by the postmaster or the proper supervisory officer, based upon the needs of the service and the unavailability of substitutes or the impracticability of using them.

However, when overtime is required and worked it must be paid for. This is mandatory under the law, and neither the department nor the postmaster has any discretion in the matter.

It has come to the attention of the department that at some offices it has been the custom to encourage employees to render some service off the clock; that is, report ahead of the beginning hour or remain after the closing hour of the regular schedule for the purpose of performing certain work, the overtime service thus rendered not appearing on the time card and no compensation being allowed therefor. Such practice is not approved and should be discontinued. If overtime service is necessary, it should be specifically authorized, should appear on the time record, and full compensation therefor paid in accordance with the law. If the service is unnecessary, employees should be required to report and leave according to schedule, and not encouraged or permitted to perform any service for which no compensation is received.

PERSONNEL—APPOINTMENTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSFER

The attention of postmasters of first and second class post offices and postmasters of third-class post offices having village delivery service is invited to the latest interpretation of Civil Service Rule X, section 8.

It is now held that an employee in a post office must complete his probationary period in the office to which originally appointed before being eligible for transfer to some other post office, and that reinstatement of a person who resigned during probation will be permitted only to the office from which he was separated.

INTEREST ON RETIREMENT DEDUCTIONS

The attention of postmasters of first and second class post offices and postmasters of third-class post offices having village delivery service is invited to this bureau's circular letter of February 23, 1928, containing instructions respecting accounting for liabilities of the United States to the civil service retirement and disability fund.

The Comptroller General of the United States has been requested to supplement General Regulations No. 65 as to the manner in which interest is to be computed in the case of substitute clerks, substitute city letter carriers, and other groups of employees paid on an hourly basis.

As soon as definite information is received it will be published for the guidance of all postmasters concerned.

DIVISION OF FOREIGN MAILS

AIR MAIL ROUTES OF THE LONDON-TO-CONTINENT SERVICE WHICH ARE NOW IN OPERATION

The air mail routes from London to the Continent now in operation are those shown in the subjoined table. Special attention is called to the fact that the air fee shown in the fourth column of that table is in addition to the ordinary postage, special-delivery, or registration fee.

Mail matter intended for dispatch by the above-mentioned air mail service should be prominently marked in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope or cover with the words "Par avion (by air mail)—London to Continent," so that the articles in assorting may not be overlooked.

Articles for Morocco should, in addition, be plainly marked immediately below the above-mentioned marking with the indication "Par avion de Toulouse," meaning "By air mail from Toulouse," and articles for Dakar should be marked in the same place on the cover with the indication "Par avion de Toulouse à Dakar," meaning "By air mail from Toulouse to Dakar."

All mail articles for this service will be dispatched to New York for onward transmission from that exchange post office.

Postmasters will please cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices and the widest publicity, without expense to the department, to be given thereto.

SHORT-PAID LETTERS FOR AUSTRALIA

The department having been advised of the receipt in Australia of a large number of short-paid letters from the United States, special attention is invited to the item "Letters" under the heading "Australia" on page 214, from which it will be seen that the rate of postage applicable to letters mailed in the United States addressed for delivery in Australia is 5 cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof and 3 cents for each additional ounce or fraction thereof.

BABY (DAY-OLD) CHICKS TO CANADA

Baby (day-old) chicks will be accepted for onward transmission to all sections of Canada under the conditions prescribed in the announcement published on pages 8 and 9 of the January supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1927.

The mailing period for baby chicks to all places in Canada has also been extended to June 15.

The above modifies the previous notice referred to.

Baby chicks are admitted into Canada free of customs duties, provided the importer submits a sworn declaration from the owner and shipper in the form shown below.

Under this prescribed form a declaration, including a pedigree, must be submitted for each chick, and each chick must be banded and have the band number shown on the pedigree.

DISCONTINUANCE OF PARCEL-POST ARRANGEMENTS WITH CUBA DOES NOT AFFECT SERVICE TO OR FROM UNITED STATES NAVAL STATION AT GUANTANAMO BAY

It having been reported to the department that some postmasters are refusing
to accept parcel post for the United States naval station at Guantanamo Bay,
Cuba (subject to domestic rates and conditions), as a result of the announcement
of this office dated the 25th ultimo and printed on page 7 of the March, 1928,
supplement, with respect to the discontinuance of parcel-post exchanges between
the United States and Cuba.

All concerned will please note, therefore, that the above-mentioned announce-
ment of February 25 has reference only to parcel post mailed at or addressed for
delivery through a Cuban post office and in no way affects the parcel-post service
to or from the United States naval station at Guantanamo Bay.

PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO EGYPT

The postmaster at New York has advised that approximately 75 per cent of
the parcels received at his office addressed for delivery in Egypt are unaccom-
panied by the relative invoices referred to in the announcement issued by this
office under date of September 12, and published on page 41 of the October
supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1927.

Postmasters should caution mailers that failure to attach invoices to the
relative customs declarations or dispatch notes may result in the return of the
articles to origin.

SENDERS OF ARTICLES FOR TAMPICO, MEXICO, SHOULD OMIT FROM THE RETURN CARD THE TIME LIMIT IN WHICH LETTERS ARE TO BE RETURNED IN CASE OF NON-DELIVERY

The postal administration of Mexico has advised this department that correspondence for Tampico is in most cases intended for delivery to persons in petroleum camps, and, in these circumstances, it is impracticable to deliver the correspondence concerned within the short period (three to five days) often indicated in the return card of the sender.

Postmasters will therefore please caution the senders of correspondence for Tampico to omit the time limit from the return card or to extend said time limit.

PARCEL POST PACKAGES SHOULD NOT BE ACCEPTED WHEN ADDRESSED TO CUBA

Information has been received that some postmasters are continuing to accept parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Cuba despite the notice regarding the discontinuance of parcel-post service to Cuba on March 1, 1928, published in the *POSTAL BULLETIN* of February 27 and on page 7 of the March supplement to the annual *Postal Guide* for 1927.

Postmasters should cause due notice of the discontinuance of the parcel-post service to Cuba to be taken at their offices and cause all possible publicity, without expense to the department, to be given thereto.

DUTIABLE ARTICLES PROHIBITED IN THE LETTER MAILS TO SPAIN

As stated in section 31 on page 183 of the July, 1927, *Postal Guide*, dutiable articles should not be accepted for dispatch in the letter mails to Spain.

As the Spanish postal administration advises that a considerable number of dutiable articles are being received in the letter mails from this country, contrary to the above-mentioned prohibition, postmasters should instruct all concerned at their offices with respect to the said prohibition and any letters or letter packages addressed for delivery in Spain which contain dutiable articles should be returned to the office of origin if received at a United States exchange office.

NEW COUNTERFEIT

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

\$20 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE

On the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, Ill.; 1914 series; check letter D; face plate No. 244; back plate No. 905; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Cleveland.

This is a photomechanical production printed on two pieces of paper with pen and ink lines imitating the genuine silk fiber. The seal and numbering are executed in a light blue tone, while the back is printed in pale green. Specimen at hand bears serial No. G36419836A.

The general appearance of this counterfeit is such that its spurious quality should be easily detected by anyone accustomed to handling currency.

ACCEPTANCE OF PROPERLY LABELED SEALED PARCELS AT THE THIRD OR FOURTH CLASS RATES OF POSTAGE

Sealed parcels of merchandise and other fourth-class matter may be mailed at the fourth-class rates of postage provided the parcels are labeled in printing to show the nature of the contents, as for example, "Contents: Merchandise—Fourth-class mail," or "Contents: Merchandise," together with the printed name and address of the manufacturer, producer, or shipper, and the inscription, "Postmaster: This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary." The word "postal" is essential in this notice. See paragraph 6, section 453, Postal Laws and Regulations, and article 57, page 15, of the July, 1927, Postal Guide.

Merchandise, books, seeds, and other articles, except circulars and miscellaneous printed matter, which when sent in parcels weighing 8 ounces or less are embraced in mail of the third class, may also be sealed and mailed at the third-class rates of postage, provided the parcels are appropriately labeled as indicated in the preceding paragraph.

Although a separate label bearing the indicia as to contents and inspection may be used, provided it is placed close to the printed return card of the sender on the parcel, it is preferred that all these indicia be combined with the address on a single label arranged as follows:

<p>CONTENTS—MERCHANDISE</p> <p>Postmaster: This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary</p> <p>From John Doe & Co. 2400 Washington Avenue Chicago, Illinois</p> <hr/> <p>Return Postage Guaranteed</p> <p>For ----- ----- -----</p>

The above indicia must be printed so that the labels will be uniform and legible, thus facilitating the identification of the sealed parcels as entitled to be mailed under this provision. Hand stamping, typewriting, or writing the name of the sender and other indicia does not meet the requirements for sealed parcels mailed at the third or fourth class rates of postage. When desired, the indicia may be printed on gummed paper tape, which is used by some shippers for sealing their parcels, but in such case the tape must be strong enough to enable the parcels to withstand the necessary handling in the mails.

Although the words "Return postage guaranteed" may be omitted from the above indicia when the parcels are sent as ordinary mail, it is desirable that they be placed on all parcels in order to expedite their return to the senders when undeliverable and relieve the latter of the trouble and additional expense of remitting postage to postmasters in advance of the return of the parcels. This will avoid delay and tend to keep mailing lists up to date.

When it is necessary to open sealed parcels of this character for postal inspection, they must be carefully repacked and indorsed:

"Opened for postal inspection by the postmaster at _____."

When parcels originally mailed sealed under the foregoing regulation are returned by the addressees to the original mailers at the third or fourth class rates of postage they should not be sealed unless they bear in printing the name and address of the person returning the matter as well as the other indicia set forth above.

Patrons should be cautioned against placing unauthorized inclosures in sealed parcels mailed at the third or fourth class rates of postage. Violations in this respect will not only lead to withdrawal of the privilege of mailing sealed parcels in such manner but constitute an offense punishable by a maximum fine of \$100.

UNDELIVERABLE MATTER NOT BEARING PLEDGE TO PAY FORWARDING OR RETURN POSTAGE

The numerous reports received by the department make it necessary to call attention to the failure of some postmasters to comply with the specific requirements of sections 575 and 614, Postal Laws and Regulations, and article 215 on page 30 of the July, 1927, Postal Guide, that undeliverable second, third, and fourth class matter (other than perishable matter of the fourth class) shall not be forwarded to the addressee at another post office or returned to the sender charged with the postage for forwarding or return to be collected on delivery, unless it bears the sender's pledge that such postage will be paid.

Matter which does not bear the sender's pledge that such forwarding or return postage will be paid, or which is not perishable fourth-class matter of obvious value, should be treated as prescribed by paragraph 7, section 575, paragraph 2, section 612, and paragraph 5(a), section 614, Postal Laws and Regulations.

Postmasters are requested to give this matter their personal attention and to take such steps as may be necessary to prevent the improper forwarding or return of undeliverable matter which does not bear the pledge of the sender to pay forwarding or return postage.

REPORTS ON FORM 3580 AND FORM 3039

It has come to attention that when preparing Form 3580, report of receipt of unrated short-paid matter, and Form 3039, report of receipt of mail bearing uncanceled stamps, postmasters do not place thereon the name, letter, or number of the postal station of the office of mailing as indicated in the postmarks on the mail upon which the reports are based.

Postmasters are, therefore, requested to insert in Forms 3580 and 3039 not only the name of the post office and State where the matter reported was mailed but also the name, letter, or number of the postal station indicated in connection with the postmark of the office of mailing in order to enable the office where the matter was mailed to take the irregularity up with the particular station or branch at fault.

FORMS 3548 NOT BEARING NAME OF POST OFFICES SENDING THEM

This office is in receipt of a card, Form 3548, addressed to Mrs. P. H. Fleeer, Box 591, Lakeland, Fla., informing her that a piece of mail addressed to her is being held for 4 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office sending it, nor the State in which located, and it bears no postmark.

Form 3548 addressed to J. R. Anthony, P. O. Box 1125, Jacksonville, Fla., informing him that matter addressed to him is being held for postage, does not give the character of the matter or the amount of postage required and does not bear the name of the post office sending it nor the State in which located and it bears no postmark.

Form 3548 has also been sent to Mrs. Roy Stark, route No. 1, Wheaton, Ill., informing her that a piece of mail is being held for postage but does not disclose the nature of the matter nor the amount of postage required. The card form does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent, and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Mr. Lee Morgan, President, Farm and Life, Box 430, Batavia, Ill., informing him that a letter addressed to him is being held for 2 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office sending it, nor the State in which located, and it bears no postmark.

The postmasters by whom the notices above referred to were sent will promptly communicate with the addressees and in each case inclose another Form 3548 completely and properly filled out.

EACH STATE OF THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES AND THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
QUARANTINED ON ACCOUNT OF THE WHITE-PINE BLISTER RUST

Attention is called to the following provisions of amended quarantine order No. 63, issued by the Secretary of Agriculture on account of the white-pine blister rust, effective March 1, 1928.

Under the provisions of paragraph 1, section 467, Postal Laws and Regulations, the utmost care must be exercised to see that no parcels of five-leaved pine, currant, or gooseberry plants (including cultivated or wild or ornamented sorts) are accepted for mailing except in the manner or method or under conditions prescribed in the amended order.

REGULATION 2. *Five-leaved pines* shall not be moved or allowed to be moved out of any State except in compliance with requirements stated in regulation 5 (a).

Additional restrictions applying to interstate movement from certain States:

(b) Five-leaved pines shall not be moved or allowed to be moved from the District of Columbia or from any of the following States:

into any State lying west of the line formed by the western boundary of the States of Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Arkansas, and Louisiana.

(c) Five-leaved pines shall not be moved or allowed to be moved from the following areas into any State lying outside of such areas:

(1) The area comprised in the States of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

(2) The area comprised in the State of New York.

(3) The area comprised in the States of Minnesota and Wisconsin, except that such movement is permitted therefrom into the States comprised in areas (1) and (2) above.

(4) The area comprised in the States of Michigan, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, except that such movement is permitted therefrom into the States comprised in areas (1), (2), and (3) above.

(5) The area comprised in the State of Washington.

(6) The area comprised in the State of Oregon, except that this limitation of movement is confined to the counties of Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Hood River, Lincoln, Multnomah, Polk, Tillamook, Wasco, Washington, and Yamhill in said State, in view of the fact that the State of Oregon maintains and enforces a quarantine against the intrastate movement of blister-rust host plants out of the above-named counties and otherwise provides and enforces such control measures as, in the judgment of the Secretary of Agriculture, are deemed adequate to effect the control and prevent the spread of white-pine blister rust in the State of Oregon.

(7) The area comprised in the State of Idaho, except that such movement is permitted therefrom into the State of Washington.

REGULATION 3. *European black currant plants* shall not be moved or allowed to be moved interstate except within the area comprised in the States of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas.

The interstate movement of said plants within this area will be allowed only during the period from October 1 of the year of inspection specified in regulation 5 (b) to May 15, inclusive, of the following year, and such movement during the said period will be allowed only upon compliance with the requirements stated in regulation 5 (b).

REGULATION 4. *Currant and gooseberry plants other than European black currants* shall not be moved or allowed to be moved out of any State except in compliance with the requirements stated in regulation 5 (c).

Additional restrictions applying to interstate movement from infected States.—Except as hereinafter provided, currant and gooseberry plants other than Euro-

pean black currants shall not be moved or allowed to be moved interstate to points outside of any one of the infected States, as follows:

Provided, That, with respect to interstate movement from the State of Oregon, this regulation is limited to the counties of Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Hood River, Lincoln, Multnomah, Polk, Tillamook, Wasco, Washington, and Yamhill, in view of the fact that the State of Oregon maintains and enforces a quarantine against the intrastate movement of blister-rust host plants out of the above-named counties, and otherwise provides and enforces such control measures as, in the judgment of the Secretary of Agriculture, are deemed adequate to effect the control and prevent the spread of white-pine blister rust in the State of Oregon: *Provided further*, That cultivated red and white currant, mountain currant, and cultivated gooseberry plants may be moved interstate from any one of the infected States or counties designated in this regulation during the period specified in paragraph (e) upon compliance with the requirements specified in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), and (d), or in paragraph (f), of this regulation and upon compliance with the requirements specified in regulations 5 (c) and (d).

(a) That the said plants and the premises on which said plants were grown have been inspected during the period from August 15 to September 30, inclusive, preceding the shipment (except that in the States of Oregon and Washington inspection shall be made in September or October preceding the shipment) by an inspector, and that said plants and premises are certified to the Federal Horticultural Board to be free from white-pine blister rust.

(b) That there exists no European black currants within a radius of 1 mile of the plot where said plants were grown, and that the vicinity within 1 mile radius of said plot was carefully scouted for white-pine blister rust by an inspector during the period from August 15 to September 30, inclusive, preceding the shipment (except that in the States of Washington and Oregon inspection shall be made in September or October preceding the shipment) and certification made to the Federal Horticultural Board that no blister-rust infection was found.

(c) That the said plants when shipped are in a dormant and defoliated condition, and so certified by the consignor.

(d) That the whole of said plants except the roots have been immersed before shipment in a solution consisting of 1 part concentrated lime-sulphur testing not less than 32° Baumé to 8 parts water, by volume, the dilute solution to test not less than 4.5° Baumé, and so certified by the consignor.

(e) That the said plants shall be moved interstate from the said infected States or counties only during the period from October 1 of the year of inspection to May 15, inclusive, of the year following, except that in Oregon and Washington the said plants shall be moved only during the period from November 1 of the year of inspection to April 15, inclusive, of the year following.

(f) Cultivated red and white currant, mountain currant, and cultivated gooseberry plants which have been grown in a State or county not designated in this regulation as infected, and shipped into a State or county designated as infected, may be reshipped interstate from such infected State or county, only in compliance with paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of this regulation, and with regulation 5 (c) and (d).

REGULATION 5. *Certificate, permit, and marking requirements as a condition of interstate transportation—(a) Five-leafed pines moved from any State.*—Each * * * box, bale, or other container of five-leafed pines moved interstate from any State shall be plainly marked to show the name and address of the consignor, the name and address of the consignee, and the contents as five-leafed pines, and each such shipment shall bear on the outside of the container a certificate duly executed by the State nursery inspector or other responsible plant quarantine official of the State in which the said plants were grown, certifying that the plants in question and the premises on which said plants were grown were officially inspected within one year of the time of shipment (giving date of inspection) and found to be free from white-pine blister rust. Each such shipment moved interstate into any State having a legally established blister-rust control area shall also bear on the outside of the container a control area permit (Form 415) issued by the Federal inspector designated to act in the State into which the shipment is to be made. * * *

(b) *European black currants*.—Each * * * box, bale, or other container of European black currant plants which may be moved interstate only within the area designated in regulation 3 shall be plainly marked to show the name and address of the consignor, the name and address of the consignee, and the contents as European black currants; and each such shipment shall bear on the outside of the container a certificate, duly executed by the State nursery inspector or other responsible plant quarantine official of the State in which the said plants were grown, certifying that the plants in question and the premises on which said plants were grown were officially inspected during the period from August 15 to September 30, inclusive, preceding the shipment (giving date of inspection) and found to be free from white-pine blister rust.

(c) *All kinds of currant and gooseberry plants (other than European black currants) moved from any State*.—Each * * * box, bale, or other container of currant and gooseberry plants, other than European black currants, moved interstate from any State shall be plainly marked to show the name and address of the consignor, the name and address of the consignee, and the contents as currant or gooseberry plants; and each such shipment shall bear on the outside of the container a certificate, duly executed by the State nursery inspector or other responsible plant quarantine official of the State in which said plants were grown, certifying that the plants in question and the premises on which said plants were grown were officially inspected within one year of the time of shipment (giving date of inspection), and found to be free from white-pine blister rust. Each such shipment moved interstate into any State having a legally established blister-rust control area shall also bear on the outside of the container a control-area permit (Form 415) issued by the Federal inspector designated to act in the State into which the shipment is to be made. * * *

(d) *Cultivated red and white currant, mountain currant, and cultivated gooseberry plants moved from infected States*.—Each * * * box, bale, or other container of cultivated red and white currant, mountain currant, and cultivated gooseberry plants moved interstate from the infected States and counties designated in regulation 4 shall be subject to requirements specified in paragraph (c) of this regulation, and in addition shall have attached to the outside of the container a permit tag (Form 405) authorizing movement and bearing the serial number of the permit issued by the Federal Horticultural Board to the consignor of the shipment on an application signed and submitted by said consignor agreeing to observe the conditions governing the use of said permit as specified in the application therefor: *Provided*, That the use of the said permit tag is prohibited except during the period specified in regulation 4 (e), nor shall said tag be used when, after the permit has been issued, the plants to which said permit applies are found not to conform to the requirements of regulation 4 (a) and (b), or (f).

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

AMOUNT IN FOREIGN MONEY TO BE STATED IN BELGAS ON MONEY ORDERS PAYABLE IN BELGIUM

Confusion seems to exist in the minds of some postmasters in regard to the belga, the new monetary unit of Belgium, which is used for all transactions between Belgium and other countries.

The belga is in no sense the equivalent of the Belgian franc. It is invariably worth 5 Belgian francs.

As explained in the April, 1927, Supplement to the Postal Guide, the amount in foreign money on money orders payable in Belgium must be stated in belgas and centièmes, not in francs and centimes.

Postmasters will please bear this in mind and impress it carefully on all money-order clerks.

STANDARD GOVERNMENT INK TO BE USED IN ISSUING MONEY ORDERS

It has been brought to the attention of this bureau that many postmasters in issuing money orders use ink which, if immediately blotted, leaves a record scarcely discernible. To the end that the writing on money orders may be the most legible possible, postmasters are instructed to use only standard Government ink in their issue. See, in this connection, the instructions appearing on the inside of the front cover of the books containing money-order forms.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

RECORDS OF REGISTRATION OF WAR-SAVINGS CERTIFICATES

1. The attention of all postmasters whose offices were authorized to register war-savings certificates is directed to the importance of seeing that the records of such registrations (Card Form WS 110), representing both outstanding and paid certificates, are placed in proper order and kept carefully on file, so as to be protected from loss or damage, and so as to be readily accessible for reference. All offices which were of the first, second, or third class during the years 1918 to 1921 were authorized to register war-savings certificates, and many money-order offices of the fourth class were also specially authorized. Postmasters at all money-order offices of the fourth class where any war-savings certificates were registered, in addition to those at presidential offices, should give careful attention to these

instructions. This applies to fourth-class offices which registered certificates without authority, as it is necessary to treat such registrations as valid.

2. At any office where the sequence of registration numbers is found to be incomplete, and there is reason to believe that some of the cards have become scattered or lost, thorough search of the office should be made to recover the missing cards so far as possible and bring them into orderly condition. When necessary, inquiries should be made of any former postmasters or employees who might have knowledge of the facts, showing where any missing records were regularly kept or last seen, or what is known concerning the loss or destruction of any of them.

3. Every postmaster having a file of cards, Form WS 110, is instructed to see that the file is labeled carefully to call attention to its importance; for example, with such words as "IMPORTANT RECORDS OF REGISTRATION OF WAR-SAVINGS CERTIFICATES, TO BE CAREFULLY PRESERVED." Postmasters at large offices, where the records are extensive and well cared for, will use judgment as to what kind of labels are needed. In the case of smaller files, especially where they are not kept in special cabinets, it is suggested that cards of the same size as Form WS 110 should be marked as indicated, in clear lettering, and placed in front of each lot of registration cards, representing paid or unpaid certificates.

4. When a change of postmasters takes place, especially at offices of the third or fourth class where war-savings certificates were registered, the outgoing postmaster must not fail to call the attention of his successor to the importance of these records, and to point out where they are on file.

5. Section 147, page 47, 1927 Postal Guide, provides that all payments of registered war savings certificates shall be entered on the corresponding registration cards, which shall be removed and placed in a separate file. Postmasters at offices where it is found that this very important provision has been neglected should go over all available records, such as interim receipts and copies of letters of transmittal by which the certificates were forwarded with postal funds, to determine, so far as possible, which registered certificates have been paid, and should make notations on the corresponding registration cards, transferring them to the file of cards representing paid certificates.

6. Special attention is directed to the importance of referring to the record of registration, Form WS 110, as required by the regulations, before payment of any registered certificate. Many such certificates have been paid or duplicated by the Treasury Department in pursuance of claims alleging loss or destruction, and in every such case the fact has been noted by the Treasury Department on the record of registration. By invariably referring to the record postmasters will avoid erroneous double payment of such certificates.

7. When a registered certificate is presented for payment and the record is found to be missing, the postmaster should satisfy himself that no claim alleging loss or destruction of the certificate has ever been allowed, besides taking such special steps as may be necessary to identify the applicant, before making payment. If in doubt as to whether such a claim has been submitted, the postmaster should address an inquiry to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps. In every such case of payment of a registered certificate for which the record is missing, the postmaster should make a memorandum on a new card, Form WS 110, showing the name and address of the owner, the serial number, the registration number, the date and amount of payment, and the fact that the card is a memorandum made to replace the missing original record. The card should then be filed with others representing paid registered certificates.

8. At some of the smaller offices irregular book records of registration of war-savings certificates were made, in lieu of the proper cards, Form WS 110. Any such records should be as carefully labeled and preserved as though they were regular. Any postmaster having such a record, and no proper file of cards, Form WS 110, should report the facts to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, copying a few sample entries to show what information is included, and stating whether payments of registered certificates have been duly noted in connection with the proper items in the book. This need not be done, however, when the postmaster has already had correspondence with the department concerning such book records.

9. In handling any war-savings certificates presented for payment, postmasters should observe with great care all the instructions on pages 42 to 47, 1927 Postal Guide.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

**REESTABLISHMENT OF THE C. O. D. SERVICE TO THE UNITED STATES NAVAL STATION
AT GUANTANAMO BAY, CUBA**

Effective January 1, 1928, the C. O. D. service on board United States naval vessels was discontinued because of the difficulties experienced in having C. O. D. parcels properly handled and accounted for under adverse conditions.

At the United States naval station at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, the adverse conditions referred to are not applicable and the facilities for handling C. O. D. mail appear adequate. Furthermore, it appears that there is considerable demand for the C. O. D. service at that point.

Therefore, effective April 1, 1928, the instructions of this office printed on pages 16 and 17 of the December, 1927, Postal Guide, under the heading "Discontinuance of C. O. D. service to and from United States naval vessels, effective January 1, 1928," are amended to permit the acceptance of C. O. D. parcels addressed for delivery at the United States naval station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. This amendment of those instructions does not permit the acceptance of C. O. D. parcels for delivery by Navy mail clerks *on board United States naval vessels* but only by the Navy mail clerk at the United States naval station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Collect-on-delivery parcels may be addressed to the personnel of the Navy on board United States naval vessels located in Cuban waters, but delivery of such parcels will be made only by the Navy mail clerk at the United States naval station at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Collect-on-delivery parcels for delivery at the United States naval station at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, must be addressed when accepted for mailing, "United States naval station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba," to prevent their being intercepted in transit and returned to sender under the previous instructions. Furthermore, when the addressee is located on a United States naval vessel in Cuban waters the name of the vessel on which the addressee is located should appear *as a part of the address* on such parcels in order that the Navy mail clerk at the naval station at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, will be in a position to notify the addressee to call at the naval station to receive his C. O. D. mail.

**INDEMNITY IN CONNECTION WITH REGISTERED REGULAR (POSTAL UNION) MAIL
ADDRESSED TO COLOMBIA**

A notice was published on page 45 of the March, 1928, Supplement in which it was stated that on January 1, 1928, the postal administration of Colombia put into effect the provisions of the Pan American Principal Convention of Mexico.

Accordingly, postmasters are advised that indemnity to the extent of the actual value of the article mailed in the amount claimed, but not exceeding \$3.85, is payable on account of the loss (but not rifling or damage) of registered articles of regular (Postal Union) mail (that is, letters, post cards, prints of all kinds, commercial papers, and samples of merchandise) and registered unsealed packages of merchandise weighing 8 ounces or less on which postage is prepaid at the domestic third-class rate, exchanged under the Pan American Principal Convention of Mexico, between the United States and Colombia.

**RECORD AT OFFICES OF ADDRESS OF THE NAMES AND ADDRESSES OF THE SENDERS OF
RETURNED REGISTERED MAIL**

It has been suggested, in the interest of efficient service, and in order to facilitate the searching of records and answering of inquiries, that all post offices of address be required to make a record of the names and addresses of the senders of all registered mail *returned to the senders*.

While it does not appear that the additional work required for this purpose would be warranted in all cases, there is no objection to postmasters at the larger post offices making a record either on Form 3849 or some other suitable form of the names and addresses of the senders of registered articles which are returned for restoration to the senders, when it appears that the maintenance of such a record will considerably facilitate the answering of inquiries, and providing this can be done without any additional expense.

REPORT OF COUNT OF MAIL ON RURAL ROUTES

The attention of postmasters at rural-delivery offices is specially called to the provisions of section 790 of the Postal Laws and Regulations as amended, requiring that the mail delivered and collected on *all* rural routes shall be counted during the first 15 days of the month of May of each year and that report of the result of such count shall be submitted to this bureau on Form 4240, trip report of rural carrier, a copy of such report to be kept on file in the post office.

It is expected that every postmaster concerned will see to it that the required counting and weighing of the mails shall be done during the period mentioned, that record of the results be made and that immediately after the close of the period report of the results be submitted to this bureau on the form mentioned.

DELIVERY OF ORDINARY PARCELS BY RURAL CARRIERS

The amendment to section 760, Postal Laws and Regulations, published on page — of this Supplement permits a rural carrier to deliver outside of a rural mail box ordinary parcels too large to be contained therein, provided the addressee has filed with the carrier or the postmaster written order for delivery in this manner.

If a patron has not requested by written order delivery of large parcels outside of his box such parcels must not be so delivered. Parcels must be considered too large for delivery in the box if they can not be completely contained therein. They must not be left partially protruding from the box, as they are thus exposed to damage or deprecation.

Patrons of rural routes should be advised that delivery of ordinary parcels too large to be contained in their mail boxes can be expedited if the patrons will provide the No. 2 box, or a larger box complying with specifications, or file written order requesting delivery outside of the box, and agreeing to assume responsibility for damage or loss of parcels so delivered.

Notwithstanding the written order referred to has been filed, carriers will, of course, be expected to exercise their best judgment and avoid leaving parcels outside of mail boxes when the parcels are likely to be damaged by weather.

RETURN OF DETACHED CORD FASTENERS

Postmasters and postal employees generally are directed to return to the mail equipment shops, Washington, D. C., all cord fasteners that have become detached from mail sacks. Postmasters should cause a careful search of their offices in order that none may be overlooked. These fasteners cost approximately 5 cents each and most of them, even when damaged, can be made serviceable at small cost.

IMPROVEMENTS MADE IN THE GROUPING OF BOXES

Reports received indicate that much interest is being manifested by postmasters, postal employees, and patrons of the Postal Service in the effort being made by the department to have boxes in suburban and rural areas grouped and reerected on stands in supersedure of the irregular arrangement so often observed along the highways.

CHANGES AFFECTING THE OFFICIAL POSTAL GUIDE FOR JULY, 1927

CHANGE No. 172 (p. 199).

The first sentence of the note on page 199, beginning with two stars should be changed to read as follows:

"Newspapers registered in Australia, 1 pence per each 4 ounces."

By "newspapers registered in Australia" is meant practically the same as "newspapers entered as second-class matter" in this service.

CHANGE No. 173 (p. 216).

The last paragraph of the item "Australia" on page 216 is modified to read as follows:

"Pistols or revolvers which emit stupefying gas, whether described by that or any other name."

CHANGE No. 174 (pp. 287, 288).

The following modifies the information respecting articles sent as gifts now appearing under the item "Germany" appearing on pages 287 and 288.

The postal administration of Germany has advised that the regulations permitting the importation of "gifts" free of customs duties will be abrogated effective April 1 next.

However, the Berlin office has advised that customs authorities are authorized to cancel or reduce customs duties, at the request of the addressees, in the following cases:

- (1) When household articles (such as clothing, linens, beds, household utensils, or tools) are obviously sent as presents to persons without means; and
- (2) When foodstuffs or luxuries with a customs value not exceeding 20 marks are sent to persons without means as presents for their own use.

Used clothing and linens not intended for sale or trade in Germany are free of duty as heretofore.

CHANGE No. 175 (pp. 173-351).

The item "Letters" on page 173 and the column "Weight limits" opposite the item "Letters" under the heading "Nicaragua" on page 351 are modified as follows:

The maximum weight limit for letters and packages prepaid at the letter rate exchanged between the United States and Nicaragua is now 22 pounds (10 kilograms).

Packages sent at the letter rate must be fully prepaid in all cases. With respect to letters in their usual and ordinary form see section 10 on page 176 of the current annual Postal Guide.

There is no change in the maximum dimensions allowable, which remain at 18 inches (45 centimeters) in any direction, except in form of a roll, when the dimensions allowable are 30 inches (75 centimeters) in length and 4 inches (10 centimeters) in diameter.

In connection with the foregoing attention is drawn to notice of this office dated January 21, 1928, relative to increased weight limit for letters and letter packages exchanged with certain Pan American countries and Spain, published in the Postal Bulletin of January 23 and as Change No. 144 on page 47 of the February Supplement to the current annual Postal Guide.

CHANGE No. 176 (pp. 203-361).

The following should be added to the information appearing under the item "Persia" on page 361 and to section 63 on page 203.

Parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Persia MAY be sealed with wax, lead seals, or otherwise.

CHANGE No. 177 (p. 395).

The subitem "Parcel post" of the item "Switzerland" on page 395 is modified as follows:

The weight limit for parcel-post packages exchanged with Switzerland is 44 pounds (20 kilograms).

The maximum length of such parcels may be 4 feet, provided that parcels over 42 inches and not over 44 inches in length do not exceed 24 inches in girth, parcels over 44 and not over 46 inches in length do not exceed 20 inches in girth, and parcels over 46 inches and up to 4 feet do not exceed 16 inches in girth. Parcels which are 3½ feet or less in length must not exceed 6 feet in length and girth combined. The transit charges (in addition to the postage) applicable to such parcels will be as follows:

For parcels up to 2 pounds.....	12
For parcels over 2 and up to 11 pounds.....	20
For parcels over 11 and up to 22 pounds.....	36
For parcels over 22 and up to 33 pounds.....	60
For parcels over 33 and up to 44 pounds.....	85

CHANGE No. 178 (pp. 204-414).

The following modifies the information now shown in the fifteenth column of the table appearing under the item "Uruguay" on page 414, and in section 70 on page 204.

Postmasters of the first class will cause a dispatch note (Form 2972) properly filled out to indicate the office of mailing, name and address of sender, number of customs declarations, weight, postage paid, name and address of addressee, and place of destination to be attached to each parcel-post package mailed at their offices addressed for delivery in Uruguay.

Dispatch notes covering parcels for Uruguay, when mailed at second, third, and fourth class post offices, will be filled out and affixed at the appropriate dispatching exchange office.

Postmasters of the first class will please cause due notice to be taken at their offices and the widest publicity, without expense to the department, to be given thereto.

CHANGE No. 179 (p. 206).

Reference is had to section 86 on page 206.

In the case of parcel-post packages returned as undeliverable to Argentina, Egypt, Latvia, Russia, and Spain, postmasters at offices of address will mark all such undeliverable parcels to show the amount of the storage charges, if any, which were due thereon from the addressees, in order that record thereof may be made at the United States exchange office which dispatches the undeliverable parcels in question to the country of origin. In case no storage charges have accumulated on an undeliverable parcel returned to one of these countries, the parcel should be marked before its return by the post office of address with the words "No storage charges due" or words of similar purport.

The United States exchange offices dispatching the parcels to the countries of origin will enter these charges on the parcel bills accompanying the returned parcels. They will also submit to the department quarterly reports of the charges in question as the basis for the preparation of accounts against the above-named countries, which are the only countries requiring an accounting of the storage charges accumulated on undeliverable parcels returned to the United States.

Postmasters will cause careful notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices.

CHANGE No. 180 (pp. 194, 198-199).

The information shown in the subjoined list with regard to Bolivia should be substituted for that now appearing on page 194 and that shown with regard to the Spanish Colonies should be inserted between the headings "Spain, including Balearic, etc." and "St. Christopher (St. Kitts)," on page 198, while the following modifications should be made on page 199 of the annual Postal Guide for 1927: Delete the information appearing under the character ⊕, and substitute therefor: 5 centimos per 1,000 grams.

Add the following at the bottom of page:

NOTE 11.—In Bolivia letters are prepaid 15 centavos for the first 30 grams and 10 centavos for each additional 20 grams.

Magazines, publications of general interest, free of postage.

Books and pamphlets, national or foreign editions, 5 centavos for 50 grams.

Circulars, engravings, prospectuses and catalogues, 2 centavos for 20 grams.

Commercial papers, guides, invoices, and waybills, 5 centavos for 50 grams.

Samples without value, 8 centavos up to 50 grams and 4 centavos for each additional 50 grams.

Tracers, 10 centavos.

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Insert No. 327. ORDER No. 7364.

MARCH 3, 1928.

The first paragraph of section 511, Postal Laws and Regulations, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 511. Mail matter of the first class deposited in or received at any post office unsealed or in a mutilated or otherwise bad condition shall be stamped or marked with the words 'Received unsealed' or 'Received in bad condition' as the case may be, and shall be officially sealed and postmarked before being forwarded or delivered."

INSERT No. 328. ORDER No. 7387.

MARCH 10, 1928.

Paragraph 2 of section 760, Postal Laws and Regulations, is amended to read as follows:

"(2) All ordinary parcel-post packages for patrons of rural routes shall be carried out on the routes on the first trip after their receipt at the post office. Where a patron does not live within hailing distance of the route, and is not at the box to receive a parcel that is too large to be placed therein, a notice on Form 4233 shall be left in the box, requesting that the patron meet the carrier on the next trip unless the parcel is called for at the post office in the meantime. A parcel that is too large to be placed in the box of the addressee shall *not* be left outside of the box unless the patron shall, by written request filed in the post office, direct that parcels be delivered in this manner, with the express proviso that the department and the carrier are relieved of all responsibility in case of loss or depredation. (See secs. 781, 1046, 1072, and 1074 as to delivery of special-delivery, registered, insured, and C. O. D. parcels.)"

INSERT No. 329. ORDER No. 7396.

MARCH 14, 1928.

Paragraphs 2, 3, and 4 of section 883 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 are amended to read as follows:

"(2) When not impracticable on account of size or shape, registered matter dispatched in iron or brass lock pouches shall be placed at the top of the local or No. 1 working package, immediately under any special-delivery letters dispatched. The facing slip should be placed atop the package immediately over the registry dispatch receipt card or manifold bill in the manner prescribed by paragraph 3. In the absence of a local or No. 1 working package, any registered matter which ordinarily would be included in such a package shall be placed in an unsealed jacket used as a container and the registry card or manifold bill describing the matter securely attached to the outside of the jacket.

"(3) The word 'Registers' appears prominently on the registry dispatch receipt card and manifold bill. The card or bill must be placed on the local or No. 1 working package, immediately under the facing slip, with the word 'Registers' prominently exposed. The facing slip should be placed across the package with the lower half of the slip turned under the registered letters and special-delivery letters, if any, thereby exposing the registry card or bill and the word 'Registers' on the card or bill to view at all times. While, because of its size or shape, it may at times be impracticable to place registered mail on top of the local or No. 1 working package, the registry dispatch receipt card or manifold bill must always be placed on such package; in the absence of such a package, the card or bill should be treated as provided in paragraph 2. Registered letters must, when practicable, be placed on top of the local or No. 1 working package, if there is such a package, regardless of the fact that there is other registered matter for dispatch which can not be conveniently included in that package.

"(4) Registered matter shall not be included in city packages unless inclosed in direct pouch for city addressed, nor in 'State packages of ordinary mail.'"

The Postal Laws and Regulations, edition of 1924, are hereby amended by the addition of section 1405 $\frac{1}{2}$, as follows:

"SEC. 1405 $\frac{1}{2}$. Unless otherwise specially provided, the sums to be allowed for the transportation by railroad across the Isthmus of Panama of United States and foreign-transit closed mails shall be \$0.0657 per pound (75 centimes per kilogram) for letters and postcards and \$0.0087 per pound (10 centimes per kilogram) for other articles, including parcel post."

APRIL 4, 1928.

Section 70 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended by the addition of the following paragraph:

"3. The payment and acceptance of the annual premium on corporate surety bonds furnished by postal officers and employees constitute a compliance with the requirement of paragraph 2 of this section for the renewal of such bonds. (Act approved March 8, 1928.)"
