## MARKING ROOFS AS GUIDE TO AERIAL NAVIGATION

### *Postmasters:*

On page 2 of the supplement to the Postal Guide for October, 1928, postmasters of cities and towns with a population ranging from 1,000 to 50,000 were requested to confer with local civic organizations, such as chambers of commerce, boards of trade, etc., with a view to having the names of such cities and towns painted on the roofs of one or two prominent buildings so that such cities and towns may be immediately identified by aerial navigators passing over them, and to communicate the result of their efforts to the Daniel Guggenheim Fund for the Promotion of Aeronautics, 598 Madison Avenue, New York City. This bulletin notice was followed by a letter from the Guggenheim Fund explaining in detail what was desired and how postmasters could render effective assistance.

It is gratifying to know that this appeal met with prompt response and that postmasters throughout the country are giving this project splendid support, but in some instances postmasters have failed to communicate with the Guggenheim Fund.

The Post Office Department is vitally interested in the promotion of aeronautics, and particularly in the proper and adequate identification of communities, as such identification is of invaluable aid to pilots and navigators of airships.

It is therefore urged not only that those postmasters who failed to communicate with the Guggenheim Fund do so at once, explaining fully what action, if any, has been taken, or, if nothing has been done, why it is not feasible to have their communities identified by roof markings, but that postmasters who have responded to the Guggenheim Fund continue to use their earnest efforts to have their communities properly and adequately identified in all cases where it has not yet been accomplished.

Postmasters are urged to give this matter their immediate, personal attention.

## PROTECT AIR MAIL IN CASE OF ACCIDENT

In connection with airplane accidents resulting in damage to the mail by fire or crash, it is necessary that the mail be guarded and not disturbed or withdrawn from the plane until the arrival of a postal official. When a pouch of air mail is damaged, it sometimes happens that the contents are covered with ashes and are subject to depredation if not properly removed under supervision of a postal official.

In order that mail carried by airplane may be safeguarded in case of accident, it is directed that any postmaster or postal employee upon learning of an accident to an air mail plane in the particular vicinity in which he is located immediately visit the scene of such accident, arrange for the guarding of the plane and its contents in conjunction with air mail contractor's representative, if he is present, pending instructions from the nearest official of the Railway Mail Service, assistant superintendent, Air Mail Service, or post-office inspector, any or all of whom should be notified by telephone or telegraph.

In those cases where a mail plane makes a forced landing and the pilot is injured or otherwise incapacitated but the mail is not damaged at all, in addition to extending any relief possible to the pilot and guarding the mail, the pouches and outside parcels should be promptly taken to the nearest post office and a record made of the origin and address as shown on the label of each pouch. One of the officials mentioned in the above paragraph should be communicated with by telephone for instructions as to the dispatch of the mail.

A strict compliance with these instructions is expected and every postmaster within whose postal district an airplane accident occurs will submit a full report of the steps taken to guard the plane and its contents pending arrival of one of the aforementioned officials, or receipt of instructions from them.

Authority for any necessary expenditures of funds incident to compliance with the above instructions is hereby given, provided, of course, such expenditure is promptly reported to the department with detailed explanation.

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#### EXPEDITE ADJUSTMENT OF INDEMNITY CLAIMS

Numerous complaints received at the department indicate delays in the adjustment of indemnity claims involving domestic insured and C. O. D. mail.

It is believed that most of the delays occur in procuring the essential evidence upon which final action is based.

All postmasters who are in any way involved in the handling of indemnity claims are enjoined to give prompt attention to all such claims and to take any action required of them as expeditiously as possible.

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#### BLANK WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES, ETC., TO BE DESTROYED

ORDER No. 8590.

Paragraph 6, Order No. 8056 of July 28, 1928, is hereby rescinded. All blank war savings certificates, blank thrift cards, and blank Treasury savings stamp cards in the hands of postmasters, branches, and stations will be immediately destroyed and no further distribution of such blank certificates will be made through the Postal Service.

**COURTESY AND EFFICIENCY PAY**

The satisfaction growing out of the courteous and efficient performance of duty is evidenced by the following unsolicited commendation addressed to a postmaster by a patron who uses the mails extensively:

"I have been intending to write you for a long time, and must not delay any longer in telling you that the clerks in the parcel post station are *wonders*. In all the years that we have been shipping parcels we have never once found them anything but pleasant and agreeable and always anxious to help one out. We have numerous small shipments to every corner of the world, and these, as you know, are difficult to fulfill all the requirements, which are constantly changing. Even during the Christmas rush there was a smile on their faces every time I saw them."

**OPERATORS' PERMITS, PENNSYLVANIA, 1929**

The State highway department, automobile division, of the State of Pennsylvania, has deposited in the Harrisburg (Pa.) post office, approximately 1,800,000 pieces of mail containing applications for operators' permits, all of which will be returned to the department of highways in due time.

This mail is postmarked December 31, 1928, in accordance with a previous agreement with the State highway department and was to have been released on that date.

However, due to excessive illness in the personnel of the State highway department it has requested the postmaster of Harrisburg to delay dispatching the mail referred to until January 7, and this request will be complied with.

This matter is brought to the attention of all postmasters in Pennsylvania in order that a suitable explanation may be made to any patron who may complain to him of the apparent delayed receipt of a letter from the State highway department in Harrisburg postmarked as of December 31, 1928, when as a matter of fact it was not dispatched until January 7, 1929.

#### SAVING LABOR—SEPARATION BULK MAILINGS OF THIRD-CLASS MATTER

In connection with inquiries of the department concerning requests of postmasters for increased auxiliary allowances due to increases in the volume of the mails, postmasters are reporting that notwithstanding a decrease in revenues, or in the rate of increase in revenues as compared with corresponding periods in the previous year, the volume of mail of the third class is much greater, and this is attributed to the reduction in the rate of postage on matter of the third class, as provided in the act of May 29, 1928, regulating postal rates. Attention is invited to the fact that this law provides for the transmission of matter of this class at reduced rates of not less than 1 cent per piece, "under such regulations as the Postmaster General may establish for the collection of the lawful revenue and for facilitating the handling of such matter in the mails" without postage stamps or with precanceled stamps affixed. (See sec. 435½, P. L. and R.)

The conditions under which matter of the third class may be accepted for transmission in the mails at the lower rates have been set forth in instructions issued from time to time by the Third Assistant and published in the supplements to the Postal Guide. Your particular attention is directed to the notice of the Third Assistant, appearing on page 20 of this supplement, compliance with which should materially reduce the cost of handling matter of the third class mailed at the lower rates provided in the law.

Instances have come to the attention of this office where postmasters are not requiring compliance with section 435½, Postal Laws and Regulations, and the instructions of the department, and are unnecessarily utilizing clerical help in the separation of third-class matter for transmission in the mails. For example, on recently visiting an office of the first class through which considerable quantities of advertising are mailed as third-class matter at the reduced rates inspectors found that two clerks were being employed in separating this mail into directs for post offices and by States—work which under the regulations of the Postmaster General should have been done by the mailer.

In pursuance of the instructions of the Third Assistant, you should refuse to accept any mailings offered without separations being made into directs for post offices for which there are as many as 15 pieces in any mailing, and by States if there are as many as 15 pieces, tied out in packages, properly labeled. This also applies to post-office stations and branches if the names of such stations or branches are a part of the address. Such refusal must be contingent, of course, upon the mailer having had due advice as to the requirements of the regulations.

In order that mailers may be properly advised and assisted, a competent supervisor should be designated to see that the postage on these bulk mailings has been provided for and that they have been separated in accordance with the instructions of the department. This supervisor, or competent clerks under his direction, should personally confer with and assist mailers whenever it is necessary in order that they may be thoroughly informed as to the instructions of the department and as to the proper methods of making and tying out the separations required.

The use of this reduced rate of postage on matter of the third class is of material advantage to the mailer. For instance, on a mailing of 10,000 pieces the postage cost is reduced by \$50 under the regular rate. By making the separations required by the department the mailer also secures a greatly facilitated dispatch, as such matter after proper checking for the collection of the lawful revenue may be dispatched with a minimum of handling in post offices.

Upon the receipt of this letter a careful canvass of the situation in your office must be made under your direction and a report made to this office as to the reduction in expenditures which may be made as the result of compliance with the instructions of the department. If the mail has not been separated hereto-

fore by the mailer, as required by the regulations, a material reduction should be reported. A report should be transmitted to the department not later than February 5, 1929, showing the reduction in the number of hours of auxiliary and overtime service required during the remainder of this quarter, and the deductions which may be made from the allowances granted for clerical and laborer auxiliary and overtime work.

**DISCONTINUANCE OF BACKSTAMPING AIR MAIL**

Effective immediately, the practice of backstamping ordinary air mail will be discontinued, except mail carried on first flights on newly established air mail routes under such instructions as may be issued at the time by this office.

Registered, special-delivery, and special-handling mail and motion-picture films sent by air mail will continue to be backstamped in accordance with the provisions of section 567 of the Postal Laws and Regulations as amended January 18, 1928, by Order No. 7212.

The necessity for the discontinuance of backstamping ordinary air mail has arisen through the great increase in the volume of such mail and the additional time required to backstamp it, which has frequently resulted in delay to such mail, not only in delivery at point of destination, but through failure to make train connections at points of landing.

The foregoing cancels and supersedes all previous instructions regarding the backstamping of air mail.

**PERSONNEL—SICK AND ANNUAL LEAVE OF ABSENCE WITH PAY**

The act of May 17, 1928, relating to annual and sick leave for postal employees does not provide for prorating such leave, but it is believed equitable to continue the department's policy of prorating such leave under certain conditions. For that portion of the year up to June 30 after an employee is advanced from the position of substitute to a regular position sick leave with pay will be prorated on the basis of ten-twelfths of a day for each month of service and annual leave with pay will be prorated at the rate of one and one-fourth days for each month of service. From and after the 1st of July next succeeding their advancement regular employees are entitled to full 10 days' sick leave, if sick, and full 15 days' annual leave of absence with pay.

Substitute employees are not entitled, under the law, either to sick leave of absence with pay or to annual leave of absence with pay.

## INTERNATIONAL AIR MAIL SERVICE

In connection with announcement on page 10 of the January, 1929, supplement to the Postal Guide, notice is hereby given of postponement from January 11 to February 4, 1929, of the beginning of air mail service on route No. 5 between Miami, Fla., and Cristobal, Canal Zone.

Any mails already received at Miami for first flight will be retained and dispatched February 4 in the absence of instructions from senders for other disposition.

In connection with the above notice, air mail service on route No. 5 between Miami, Fla., and Cristobal, Canal Zone, will begin with flights from Miami February 4 and from Cristobal February 10, 1929. For the present two round trips a month will be made and mails will be carried *only* between the *terminal points of Miami and Cristobal*. No exchange of mails will be made at intermediate points until further notice.

Postage either way will be 25 cents for each half ounce or fraction in addition to regular postage. Canal Zone stamps must be used for mails on northbound flights. First flight covers for the northbound flight may be sent to the postmaster at Cristobal with funds by money order for purchase of stamps. Covers for first flight must be addressed so as to admit of dispatch over the route toward destination; that is, covers for first flight from Miami must be addressed to Cristobal or point beyond, while covers sent for mailing at Cristobal may be addressed to points in this country or beyond. If such covers are addressed in care of the postmaster at Cristobal, communication should be sent him (in advance) requesting remailing to the sender and inclosing amount by money order for purchase of Canal Zone postage therefor. Air mail in being sent to or from this route will receive air mail dispatch also by domestic air mail routes in this country where practicable.

Special cachet will be used on first flight mails from Miami.

## ROUTE F. A. M. 1

From January 15, 1929, all regular mail articles (ordinary, registered, and insured) will be accepted for transportation on this route from New York via Albany to Montreal, at rates of 5 cents for the first ounce or fraction, and 10 cents for each additional ounce or fraction, including regular postage, but in addition to registry or insurance fee.

Delivery of mails at Port au Prince, Haiti, will begin by planes leaving Miami and San Juan January 21 on Route No. 6.

**INTERNATIONAL AIR MAIL SERVICE—PROPER FEES MUST BE FULLY PREPAID IN ALL CASES**

According to reports reaching the department, there is considerable misunderstanding with respect to the proper air-mail fees applicable to articles for foreign countries intended for transmission by the United States domestic air mail service to the dispatching exchange offices, to articles intended for dispatch by air from Miami, Fla., to Cuba and the Bahamas, from Miami to Porto Rico, the Dominican Republic, and Haiti, and from Miami to the Canal Zone (inauguration of service postponed to February 4), as well as to articles for transmission by air in this country and in Mexico.

The air-mail fees applicable for the various services are therefore restated as follows:

For any article addressed to a foreign country (except Canada and Mexico) and intended to be transmitted by air in this country exclusively, the air-mail fee, in addition to the ordinary postage and registry or special-delivery fees, if any, is 4 cents for the first ounce or fraction and 8 cents for each additional ounce or fraction.

For articles addressed for delivery in Canada the fee (which in this case includes the ordinary postage but not the registry or special-delivery fees) for air mail service in the United States and in both the United States and Canada is 5 cents for the first ounce or fraction and 10 cents for each additional ounce or fraction. These same fees have now been extended to articles for Mexico intended for transmission by air in the United States or in both the United States and Mexico, as stated in the department's announcement of the 19th instant.

For transmission by air from Miami to Havana or Nassau, the air mail fee (in addition to the ordinary postage and the registry or special-delivery fees) is 5 cents for each half ounce or fraction thereof. This includes air mail service in the United States.

For transmission by air from Miami to Porto Rico, the Dominican Republic, and Haiti, the air mail fee (in addition to the ordinary postage and the registry or special-delivery fees) is 10 cents for each half ounce or fraction. This includes air mail service in the United States.

For air mail service from Miami to the Canal Zone, the air mail fee (in addition to the ordinary postage and the registry or special-delivery fees) is 25 cents for each half ounce or fraction. This includes air mail service in the United States.

Postmasters will see to it that all employees concerned in the handling of air mail articles for abroad are thoroughly familiar with the various air mail fees set forth above, and will give thereto the widest possible publicity without expense to the department. These employees should likewise be required to familiarize themselves with the various fees to be charged for air mail service in foreign countries as set forth on pages 171 to 174 of the current annual Postal Guide and with the changes therein and additions thereto as published from time to time in the monthly supplements.

**UNITED STATES-MEXICO AIR MAIL SERVICE**

Effective at once, articles in the regular mails posted in this country and addressed for delivery in Mexico which are to be dispatched by air will be subject to the United States domestic air mail rate, that is, 5 cents for the first ounce or fraction and 10 cents for each additional ounce or fraction.

This rate includes the postage and the air mail fee and articles prepaid thereat will be dispatched by air service in Mexico, where available, as well as in this country.

Articles which, though marked to be dispatched by air, are not fully prepaid at the rate given in the first paragraph shall be treated as ordinary articles and shall be dispatched by the ordinary means from the office of mailing to the Mexican office of destination if properly prepaid therefor.

The Mexican domestic air mail rate, that is, 35 centavos for each 20 grams (about three-fourths ounce) or fraction, is likewise applicable to articles mailed in Mexico and addressed for delivery in this country which are to be dispatched by the Mexican and United States air mail services.

**PROPER DISPATCH OF ARTICLES PREPAID FOR TRANSMISSION BY AIR IN TRANSATLANTIC COUNTRIES BUT NOT IN THIS COUNTRY**

In connection with report made to this office that articles prepaid for dispatch by air in trans-Atlantic countries but not in this country are received at New York by United States air mail, postmasters will instruct all concerned at their offices that articles so prepaid should be forwarded by the ordinary means under a "New York—Foreign" facing slip. If there are 10 or more such articles, they should be forwarded under a separate "New York—Foreign" facing slip, boldly indorsed "Foreign Air Service." Such articles should not be included in "Country packages" such as "New York Foreign—England," "New York Foreign—Germany," etc.

**DISPATCH OF MAILS FROM FORCED LANDINGS ON CANADIAN AIR MAIL ROUTES IN THE UNITED STATES**

The Canadian Administration has instructed its air mail pilots flying between Montreal and St. John in the event of a forced landing in the State of Maine to arrange for the conveyance of their mails as promptly as possible to the nearest post office for dispatch by train to destination.

In the event of any such forced landing on the route in Maine or any other route, the Canadian mails shall be given train dispatch by the first available service for destination.

**DISPATCH NOTES ACCOMPANYING PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FROM FOREIGN COUNTRIES**

This office has been informed that postmasters are detaching "Dispatch notes" accompanying parcel-post packages received from foreign countries and returning them to the countries of origin after signature by the addressees.

It is evident that these forms are being confused with registry receipts and postmasters are hereby instructed not to detach dispatch notes (Bulletin d'expédition) from parcel-post packages of foreign origin, as such forms should be permitted to remain with the parcel and delivered to the addressees, or, in case the parcel becomes undeliverable, the forms should accompany the parcel back to origin.

**PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO COLOMBIA**

The postmaster at New York advises that a number of parcel-post packages are being received at his office addressed to offices in Colombia other than Barranquilla, Buenaventura, Cartagena, Riohacha, Santa Marta, and Tumaco, on which the transit charges have not been prepaid.

Postmasters should carefully note that parcel-post packages addressed to Barranquilla, Buenaventura, Cartagena, Riohacha, Santa Marta, and Tumaco are subject only to the postage rate of 13 cents for the first pound and 12 cents for each additional pound plus a surcharge of 5 cents per parcel, while parcels destined to other offices in Colombia must be prepaid at the postage rate of 13 cents for the first pound and 12 cents for each additional pound plus a surcharge of 5 cents per parcel in addition to the following transit charges:

**PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO BOLIVIA**

Information has been received that mailers in this country are not properly preparing parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Bolivia, to withstand the many handlings to which such parcels are subjected, with the result that many parcels are received at destination with the contents damaged or lost.

As it is stated that the twine used in securing parcels frequently cuts through the wrapping paper employed, it is suggested that parcels be wrapped and sewed in burlap using a continuous cord or twine which should be sealed at the knot with sealing wax or otherwise.

**DIVISION OF FINANCE****NEW COUNTERFEITS**

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

**\$5 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE**

On the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, Ill.; 1914 series; check letter B; face plate No. 987; back plate No. 3645; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Lincoln.

This is a photomechanical production printed on two sheets of paper without any attempt to imitate the genuine silk fiber. The portrait is too black and the fine lines in the border are not clearly defined. The numbering and seal are so poorly executed as to attract the attention of the wary handler of currency, the coloring being off tone and printed imperfectly. In the seal the circular lettering is illegible. The black is printed in a shade of yellow green. Specimen at hand bears serial number G37801590B.

**\$20 GOLD CERTIFICATE**

Series of 1922; check letter C; face and back plate numbers indistinct; H. V. Speelman, Register of the Treasury; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Washington.

This is an extremely poor photomechanical production printed on two sheets of paper without any attempt at imitating the silk fiber in the genuine. The workmanship is so crude that the fine lines in the design on both face and back are entirely invisible, and the note as a whole has a blurred appearance which should immediately excite suspicion. The seal and numbering are printed in a bright orange tone which gives off a faded effect. Specimen at hand bears serial number K74854211.

**POSTAGE STAMPS MUST NOT BE USED IN PAYMENT FOR MERCHANDISE**

Several instances have been reported recently where postmasters have sent postage stamps to other towns in payment for merchandise purchased. Attention is invited to the law embodied in section 146, Postal Laws and Regulations, which makes it an offense punishable by fine or imprisonment or both for a postmaster or any employee of the Postal Service intrusted with the sale or custody of postage stamps, stamped envelopes, or postal cards to use or dispose of them in payment of debts or in payment of merchandise or other salable articles.

Postmasters are cautioned to be careful not to violate the provisions of this section and to prevent as far as possible infractions by employees of their offices

**DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION****BULK MAILINGS OF THIRD-CLASS MATTER UNDER SECTION 435½, POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS, MUST BE SEPARATED BY PERMIT HOLDERS INTO STATES, CITIES, ETC.**

The attention of postmasters is again called to the following requirement set forth in paragraph 4, section 435½, Postal Laws and Regulations, governing the acceptance of bulk mailings of third-class matter at the rates prescribed in that section:

"To facilitate the handling of such matter the mailer must comply with all reasonable requests of the postmaster for the separation thereof into States, cities, etc."

It has been brought to attention that, in many instances, postmasters are not requiring mailers to make separation of this mail into States, cities, etc., as required by this section.

In every instance mailers must be required to separate and tie out mailings of third-class matter in bulk under the provisions of section 435½, Postal Laws and Regulations, whether mailed without stamps affixed or under precanceled stamps, into directs for post offices whenever there are as many as 15 pieces for any post office in any mailing and to separate and tie out the pieces or packages into properly labeled State packages whenever there are as many as 15 pieces or packages for any State. Mailers must also be required to make separations of such mail for post-office stations and branches if the name of a post-office station or a post-office branch forms a part of the address.

When a permit is granted under the provisions of this section, the mailer must be instructed as to the separation of the mail that will be required and any mailings offered without the separations being made as outlined must be refused.

From the foregoing it will be seen that it is the duty of the mailers to make the separations and tie out the packages of bulk mailings of third-class matter under the provisions of section 435½, and postmasters must not relieve the mailers of this duty by permitting post-office clerks to make such separations and tie outs either in the post office or in the place of business of the mailer.

Postmasters should give this matter their personal attention and see that bulk mailings of third-class matter under the provisions of section 435½ are not accepted from mailers unless the pieces are made up by States and cities in accordance with these instructions. Whenever it appears that a mailer needs information as to how to make the required separations and tie outs the postmaster will see that such information is promptly given him.

Postmasters should also see that the mailers are informed that they can facilitate the required separation by arranging their mailing lists according

to States and cities, since when this is done it eliminates the necessity of sorting the mailings and it is merely necessary to keep the matter segregated by States and cities as it is being prepared for mailing.

Persons buying mailing lists can facilitate their work with respect to the required separation of their mailings by insisting that the person or concern who sells the list shall deliver it arranged according to States and cities.

In order that this office may be fully informed as to whether these instructions are being carried out, each postmaster at whose office permits have been authorized for the acceptance of bulk mailings of third-class matter under section 435½ is requested, after making a personal review of the handling of such mailings in his office, to advise this office, Division of Classification, whether he is actually requiring such separations in each and every instance.

#### TREATMENT OF UNDELIVERABLE SECOND-CLASS MATTER

There have been submitted to this office by the publishers of a publication of national circulation notices and correspondence relating to undeliverable copies of the publication from which it appears that in some instances the postmasters did not treat the copies properly or did not give correct or complete information on the notices, Form 3578.

In some of the instances at hand the notices on Form 3578 have been indorsed "Removed—left no address," whereas it appears that the new addresses were in possession of the postmasters. In other cases the notices were indorsed "No such number," while the subscriber actually lived next door to the number given on the copy and the publishers should have been given the correct address.

It appears that the improper treatment of some of the copies was due to the fact that substitute letter carriers were on duty at the time the copies were received for delivery.

In view of the foregoing it is requested that all postmasters at once look into the conditions surrounding the handling of undeliverable second-class matter at their post offices and take such steps as will assure the sending of correct notices on Form 3578 in all instances and the proper treatment of the undeliverable copies. This will not only result in saving labor and expense to the Postal Service but will also result in better service to the publishers and obviate many complaints received by the department.

#### SIMPLIFIED ADDRESSES ON MAIL FOR BOX HOLDERS

With reference to paragraph 6, section 457, Postal Laws and Regulations, under which advertising or other matter may be sent as ordinary mail to box holders on rural routes when addressed in the simplified manner therein prescribed, postmasters are advised that matter similarly addressed to box holders on star routes may be accepted under the same arrangement.

#### FORMS 3540 AND 3548 NOT BEARING NAMES OF POST OFFICES SENDING THEM

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster to Mr. and Mrs. Willis Birgstrom, 104 South Main Street, Phillipsburg, N. J., advising them that a letter addressed to them is being held for 2 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster to Mr. Jas. R. Laury, 2112 Lenox C. H., Cleveland, Ohio, informing him that a piece of printed matter addressed to him is being held for 3 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office from which it was sent and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Martha Wagner and family, 3667 Kettner Boulevard, San Diego, Calif., advising them that a letter addressed to them is being held for 2 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Miss Beatrice M. Wolfe, 154 Marion Street, Oak Park, Ill., advising her that matter addressed to her is being held for postage. The form does not state the kind of mail nor the amount of postage due, and the form does not bear the name of the post office sending it nor the State in which located, and is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Miss L. Thieman, 178 McClellan Street, Schenectady, N. Y., advising her that a letter addressed to her is being held for 2 cents

postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Mr. and Mrs. E. Maichele, 206 Union Street, Schenectady, N. Y., advising them that a letter addressed to them is being held for 2 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Mr. L. E. Britton, post-office box 1523, Raleigh, N. C., advising him that a letter addressed to him is being held for 2 cents postage. The form does not bear the name of the post office from which it was sent, only the letters "N. C.," indicating the State, being legible in the postmark.

Form 3540 has been sent to J. Haynie, Williamstown, Ky., but it does not bear the name of the post office from which it was sent nor any information with respect to the reason for its being sent.

Form 3540 has been sent to Mrs. P. A. N., 201 Potomac Avenue, Terre Haute, Ind., regarding an undeliverable piece of mail addressed to K. Breuer, 140 Melrose, which is held for 10 cents return postage. The card does not bear the name of the office and State from which it was sent and is illegibly postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Mr. and Mrs. George Gingras, 2417 Otis Street NE., Washington, D. C., advising them that a letter addressed to them is being held for 2 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent, and it is illegibly postmarked.

The postmasters at the offices from which the notices above described were sent will promptly communicate with the respective addresses and inclose new notices completely and properly filled out.

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## DIVISION OF STAMPS

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### BLANK WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES, ETC., TO BE DESTROYED

Pursuant to the order, No. 8590, on page 2 of this supplement, which repeals paragraph 6, section 166, of the Postal Laws and Regulations, as amended by Order No. 8056 of July 28, 1928, the postmaster at every first and second class post office is instructed to appoint a committee consisting of three employees, which committee shall immediately destroy by burning all blank war-savings certificates of any and all series, all blank thrift stamp cards and all blank Treasury-savings stamp cards that may be on hand at the main post office or at any branch or station, and submit a written report to the postmaster that all such blank certificates have been completely destroyed by burning. Such reports need not be sent to the department.

The postmaster at every third and fourth class post office is instructed to personally see that all blank certificates referred to in paragraph 1 hereof are completely destroyed by burning.

Any and all unaffixed war-savings stamps, thrift stamps, and Treasury-savings stamps presented at any post office for redemption, shall be accepted by the postmaster in accordance with paragraph 7 of the Postmaster General's Order No. 8056 on page 85 of the August, 1928, Supplement to the Postal Guide and transmitted by official registered mail to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, War Savings Section, Division of Stamps, Washington, D. C., with a letter of transmittal in substantially the same form as provided in paragraph 108, page 47, of the 1928 Postal Guide.

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### WAR-SAVINGS STAMPS FORWARDED TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR PAYMENT

Order No. 8056, printed on page 85 of the August, 1928, supplement to the Postal Guide, provides that when registered war-savings certificates are presented at the office of registration for payment such certificates shall be taken up and forwarded to the department accompanied by the corresponding registration cards.

On account of the great number of registered certificates which have been received without the corresponding registration card it is deemed necessary to bring this matter again to the attention of all postmasters concerned.

Postmasters are also enjoined to see that all certificates, whether registered or unregistered, are receipted by the owners before forwarding them to the department.



### PRECANCELED STAMPS

For the information of postmasters at direct and central accounting post offices requiring large quantities of precanceled stamps, who have not yet been so advised, attention is called to the fact that precanceled stamps in sheets from 1 to 10 cents, inclusive, and in coils of any denomination now issued in this form, will be furnished on requisition to the department under the following conditions:

1. The minimum quantity is 500,000 stamps in sheets and 250,000 in coils of 500 or 1,000 stamps of a single denomination. The minimum quantity for coils of 3,000 is 300,000 stamps.

2. Precanceled coils are available in the "sidewise" variety only.

3. Requisitions for precanceled stamps should be submitted to the department well in advance of the date the stock will be needed. Not less than 40 days should be allowed for an initial order and not less than 25 days for subsequent orders.

4. Requisitions for precanceled stamps on Forms 3201 (sheets) and 3201-A (coils) must be plainly indorsed "Precanceled."

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### AIR MAIL STAMPED ENVELOPES

For the information of those who may be interested, postmasters and employees of the postal service are notified that 5-cent stamped air mail envelopes of distinctive design, referred to in notice on page 12 of the January supplement, in size No. 13, were first placed on sale January 12, 1929, at the post office in Washington, D. C., and on the same date at the philatelic agency for the benefit of stamp collectors. The manufacture of 5-cent air mail envelopes in the two additional sizes, Nos. 5 and 8, will be begun shortly and postmasters may, therefore, now submit requisitions for special-request, office-request, and unprinted air mail envelopes in the three sizes as desired with assurance that shipment will be made without unreasonable delay. It is advisable, however, for postmasters to limit requisitions for unprinted air mail envelopes to not more than an estimated two months' supply until production can be placed on a normal basis.

The following description of the new 5-cent air mail envelopes is given:

The envelopes are embordered with red and blue parallelograms approximately  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch apart and extending about  $\frac{3}{16}$  inch over the edge of the front and back of the envelopes. The stamp, circular in design, is printed in blue and shows a monoplane and the denomination "5¢" embossed in white over a blue background. A white panel encircles the stamp within which, printed in blue, appears the following: U. S. Postage \* Via Air Mail.

Postmasters at district post offices having a local demand for air mail envelopes will submit requisition for needed quantities to their central-accounting offices.

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the one surrendered shall show, as the date when interest begins, the date to which interest was paid on the one surrendered—that is, the interest date of the new certificate shall be the first day of the month in which the transaction occurs instead of the first day of the next succeeding month. Just above this date on the certificate, the notation "*Int. paid to*" shall be written to explain the unusual association of dates. On the depositor's card (Form PS 600), the date when interest begins, together with the symbol "I P," shall be written in the "Remarks" column opposite the serial number, and, when applying on Form PS 607 for the reissue of any certificate issued in this manner, both the date of issue, and the date when interest begins, together with the symbol, must be given.

This privilege of dating certificates back shall not be construed to apply when the surrender of a certificate for interest only is made during the first interest year or during the second or third month of an interest quarter of any succeeding year.

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## DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

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### USE OF PAPER STRIPS OR PAPER SEALS ON REGISTERED MAIL

The notice published by this office on pages 24 and 25, of the November, 1928, Postal Guide, under the caption, "Use of paper strips or seals in sealing registered mail," states that when paper seals or strips are used in connection with the sealing of registered mail, except third-class registered parcels sealed subject to postal inspection on which the senders have not paid more than a 20-cent registry fee the strips must have *printed thereon* the name and address of the sender corresponding with the return card on the envelope or wrapper.

Postmasters are now informed that when senders have on hand a supply of seals or paper tape which do not have the name and address of the senders printed thereon, but which they desire to use until their supply is replenished, a rubber-stamp impression showing the names and addresses of the senders on the paper strips or seals, in lieu of the names and addresses being printed thereon, will be accepted with the understanding that when the senders' supply of tape or seals is replenished, or not later than June 30, 1929, if their supply is not replenished before that time, any paper tape or seals used will bear, *in printing*, the names and addresses of the senders to correspond with the return cards on the envelopes or wrappers, in those cases where the seals or paper strips are required to be distinctive under the instructions published in the November, 1928, Postal Guide. The rubber-stamp impression showing the name and address of the sender is, when practicable, to be affixed in such a manner that the impression of the stamp will appear partly on the plain seals or paper strips and partly on the envelope or wrapper of the article.

Postmasters are further advised, however, that in those cases where the executive departments, Government bureaus, or their representatives in the field deem it necessary to use paper strips or paper seals to reinforce the sealing of *official* registered articles which are mailed without both postage and registry fee being prepaid and are therefore not indemnifiable in case of loss, rifling, or damage, it is preferred that the names (or titles when used instead of the names) and the addresses of the senders, corresponding with the return cards on the envelopes or wrappers, be printed on the strips or seals, but in those instances where it has not been considered practicable to provide the senders with paper strips or seals with the return addresses *printed* thereon, it will be permissible for the senders to use plain strips or seals, *provided*, a hand-stamped impression showing the names and addresses of the senders as they appear on the envelopes or wrappers of the articles is impressed over the strips or seals in such a manner that, when practicable, the impression will appear partly on the paper strip or seal and partly on the envelope or wrapper of the article. In the case of official matter of this character mailed by postmasters, an impression of the registry postmarking stamp is to be placed over the paper strips or seals so as to appear partly on the strip or seal and partly on the article, in lieu of the impression of the hand stamp showing the names and addresses of the senders, this impression of the postmarking stamp to be in addition to the impressions of the postmarking stamp placed twice on the back of each letter and other sealed article over the crossings of the upper and lower flaps required by section 874, paragraph 3, of the Postal Laws and Regulations.

It will be permissible for any of the executive departments or their representatives in the field to use a distinctive paper seal or distinctive paper tape (instead of plain paper seals or tape having printed thereon *the return card of the sender*) showing the particular branch of the Government service involved in the mailing provided the sender places over this distinctive seal or distinctive paper tape a rubber-stamp impression showing the name and address of the sender as it appears on the article.

The use of paper strips or paper seals on registered articles mailed either by the public or as official matter does not relieve the sender (except in case of unsealed third-class matter, or third-class matter *sealed subject to postal inspection*) from first sealing the registered matter in every part with mucilage or glue before affixing the paper strips or paper seals.

Particular attention is directed to the fact that paper strips or seals must not be affixed in such a manner as to cover the spaces to be reserved on each letter or other sealed article on which to place two impressions of the post-marking stamp across the upper and lower flaps as contemplated by section 874, paragraph 3, of the Postal Laws and Regulations.

The use of paper strips or seals by postmasters in connection with the sealing of remittances of postal or money order funds or parcels containing postage stamps should be avoided except in those cases where their use is necessary to reinforce the sealing because of the impracticability of adequately sealing the envelopes or wrappers of any particular package of this character with mucilage or glue.

As stated in the instructions printed on pages 24 and 25 of the November, 1928, Postal Guide, it is believed that the addition of paper strips or seals to otherwise properly prepared first-class registered articles which, under the regulations are required in the first place to be securely sealed in every part, affords little, if any, additional security but when they are used the instructions contained in this notice and in the one appearing in the November, 1928, Postal Guide, should be carefully observed.

#### IRREGULARITIES IN THE TREATMENT OF UNDELIVERABLE INSURED AND C. O. D. PARCELS

The department has continually brought to attention of the service irregularities in the treatment of undeliverable insured and C. O. D. parcels, and while this situation has been corrected to an appreciable extent, reports of the following irregularities still continue to be received in sufficient number to indicate that all postmasters have not given this matter the attention it warrants:

1. Insured and C. O. D. parcels are not being given the required delivery service. (See arts. 115 and 116, page 139, of the July, 1928, Postal Guide.)

(a) At offices not having carrier service postmasters are expected to use every means practicable, not involving expense to the department, to notify the addressees that insured and C. O. D. parcels are on hand for delivery, and delivery notices (Form 3849 or 3849-B) must in each instance be placed in the general delivery or post office box if one is rented by the addressee.

(b) At offices having carrier (city, village, or rural) service, insured and C. O. D. parcels must be taken out at once for delivery and if not accepted for any reason the addressee must be informed or a notice on Form 3849 or Form 3849-B left for him, to the effect that the parcel will be held at the post office.

2. Senders of undeliverable insured and C. O. D. parcels are not being notified to that effect on Form 3540. (See arts. 123 and 127, pages 140 and 141, of the July, 1928, Postal Guide.)

(a) The sender of each C. O. D. parcel must be notified on Form 3540 when the parcel is refused, or when the addressee is unknown or can not be found at the place to which the parcel was addressed, or when the parcel is addressed to a street address or locality that does not exist at the office of address.

(b) Undeliverable insured mail must be treated in the same manner *except that when an insured parcel is actually and unqualifiedly refused, and there is no request that the parcel be held a specific period of time, the parcel should immediately be returned to the sender, rated with the return postage.*

3. Undeliverable insured and C. O. D. parcels are being returned prematurely, or are being held for periods in excess of that indicated in the senders' return requests. (See art. 123, pages 140 and 141, of the July, 1928, Postal Guide.)

(a) All insured parcels, *except as noted in the paragraph numbered 2 (b) above*, and all C. O. D. parcels must be held for the exact period of retention specified in the senders' return requests, not exceeding 30 days under any circumstances,

or for 30 days when no retention periods are specified. *Requests of senders, senders' representatives or addresses that such matter shall be held in excess of 30 days must not be complied with.*

4. Undeliverable insured and C. O. D. parcels returned to the senders, postage collect, are not being legibly indorsed to show the reason for their nondelivery. (See sec. 615, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, and art. 124, page 141, of the July, 1928, Postal Guide.)

(a) In returning insured and C. O. D. parcels which are undeliverable to the addresses the reason for nondelivery must be legibly indorsed on the parcels, but at the same time care should be exercised to see that the original addresses on the parcels are not defaced or obscured. Light lines only should be drawn through the original addresses.

It should be obvious that the mistreatment of undeliverable insured and C. O. D. parcels, not only seriously inconveniences patrons of the service but also results in criticism being directed against it. Therefore it can not be too strongly urged that this matter be given immediate corrective attention so that proper and uniform treatment may be accorded undeliverable insured and C. O. D. parcels.

#### NEW FORMS 3816-c AND 3816-d, GUMMED LABELS FOR USE ON CERTAIN C. O. D. AND INSURED PARCELS

There are at present in stock supplies of two new Forms, 3816-c (for C. O. D. parcels) and 3816-d (for insured parcels) perforated gummed labels for use at offices of the first and second classes on insured and C. O. D. parcels on which clear indorsements by means of hand-stamps can not be obtained; that is, on soft, flimsy, fragile or irregularly shaped parcels upon which it is difficult to obtain a clear impression of the insured or C. O. D. stamp or a complete and legible postmark.

The forms are printed 20 stickers to a sheet, each sticker consisting of the facsimile reproduction of the insured or C. O. D. indorsement and sufficient space to the right of each indorsement to affix a postmark. The dimensions of each sticker are  $3\frac{5}{8}$  by  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inches. The indorsements are printed in red ink on white paper. The weight of the paper has been selected with care and it is sufficiently thin, but of good quality, to permit of effective adhesion to the most irregularly shaped parcels.

The proper use of these stickers will assure a complete and legible postmark and a clear insured or C. O. D. indorsement on those parcels, the physical characteristics of which preclude their clear indorsement by means of hand stamps and will also render more certain the immediate identification of such parcels during the course of their handling, in order that they may be treated in accordance with the existing instructions. Therefore, the department desires that these stickers be used on insured and C. O. D. parcels of this character. Postal employees should use the utmost care in affixing the stickers to the parcels so that they will not become detached in handling, since the insured parcels would thus lose their identity and the C. O. D. parcels would also be treated as ordinary mail, if the C. O. D. tags also became detached.

Postmasters at offices of the first and second classes should bear in mind that these stickers are *not* to be used on insured and C. O. D. parcels which present a good surface for indorsing and postmarking and should govern accordingly their requisitions on the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies, for a three months' supply of these forms.

#### FAILURE TO INDORSE C. O. D. MONEY ORDERS WITH THE NUMBERS OF THE RELATED C. O. D. PARCELS

The department is disappointed with the lack of response to its continued requests for cooperation in the matter of eliminating instances in which money orders issued in payment of the charges borne by C. O. D. parcels are not indorsed with the related C. O. D. parcels numbers. It should be obvious that this situation is causing the department considerable embarrassment, and it will be appreciated if postmasters will give this situation their personal attention so that each money order issued in payment of the charges on C. O. D. parcel-post matter will be indorsed with the number of the related parcel. An allotted space is specially provided on every domestic money order for this purpose. (See art. 148, p. 146, of the July, 1928, Postal Guide, and p. 17, of the December, 1928, Postal Guide.)

**VOUCHERS FOR PURCHASES OF SUPPLIES AND FOR PAYMENT FOR CERTAIN SERVICES**

The department is continuing to receive vouchers for purchases of supplies which have not been handled in accordance with Postmaster General's Order No. 3910, dated February 20, 1926. This order is again published below, and it is requested that the procedure contained therein be followed in the preparation and submission of vouchers covering payments for supplies and services other than personal.

**ORDER NO. 3910**

Order No. 3120, dated July 14, 1925, is hereby rescinded.

Hereafter the following procedure shall be followed in the preparation and submission of vouchers covering payments for supplies and services other than personal.

*Paragraph 1. Rental and contract service vouchers.*—The new "Voucher for rentals and services under contract," Form 1853, shall be used for payments made at first and second class post offices for the following classes of expenditures:

- (1) Rentals under lease.
- (2) Mail messengers.
- (3) Clerks, contract stations.
- (4) Vehicle service under contract at fixed monthly, quarterly, or annual rates.
- (5) All other expenditures under agreements providing for monthly, quarterly, or annual payments at specific contract rates.

*Par. 2. District office vouchers.*—District postmasters, when authorized to make such expenditures, should continue to take receipts for payments mail messengers, rent, and rent, light, and fuel in the space provided therefor at the top of page 2 of the quarterly account blanks, Forms 1545a, third class, and 1558, fourth class.

When light and fuel are furnished separately by other than the owner or lessor, itemized vouchers therefor should be taken on general voucher, Form 1526P, as directed below.

*Par. 3. Vouchers for supplies and services other than personal.*—All payments by postmasters for supplies or services other than personal not covered by paragraphs 1 and 2 shall be reported on general voucher Form 1526P. This includes payments for vehicle service at hourly and daily rates.

It is essential that these vouchers be fully itemized; that they be signed by the dealer or accompanied by a certified bill, as described in paragraph 4, and that the postmaster's certificate thereon be signed, and show the paragraph number of the "Method or absence of advertising" and the article letter of the "Form of agreement."

It is also essential that page 2 of the voucher be completed to show the "Method or absence of advertising" and the "Form of agreement."

Purchases without advertising or without a written contract being executed, or a written proposal obtained and accepted in writing by the postmaster, may be made only (1) in the rare cases where an exigency of the service exists prior to the order which will not admit of the delay incident to advertising, or (2) where prices or rates are fixed by law or by legal authority, or (3) in purchasing a patented or copyrighted article sold only at a uniform and fixed price.

In case of an exigency the nature of the emergency must be clearly and definitely set forth in writing on the voucher or an attached sheet. In case of payments for gas, electricity, telephones, water, and other public utilities where the rates for service are fixed by legal authority, and in cases where patented or copyrighted articles are purchased the words "Rates fixed by legal authority" or "Patented (copyrighted) article-fixed price," as the case may be, should be entered in the spaces following method of advertising No. 4 and form of agreement letter C on the reverse of the voucher.

*Par. 4. Dealers' bills.*—Where vendor's bills are received showing in detail the purchases or services to be paid for, the quantity and description of the articles purchased or services supplied and the detailed prices need not be entered on the face of the voucher, Form 1526P, and the certificate and receipt of the payee on the voucher need not be executed, but the certified and receipted bill

may be attached to the voucher and the words "See dealer's bill attached" entered on the voucher under the heading "Articles purchased or service performed." The total amount of the bill should be entered under the heading "Amount paid."

When a bill is rendered, the vendor should enter thereon "Certified correct, true, and payment not received," and sign.

When payment is made the vendor should receipt therefor on the bill.

When one payment includes settlement for more than one bill of the same vendor under the same agreement, one voucher, Form 1526P, shall be prepared covering the total payment.

The date and amount of each separate bill and the total payment shall be shown on the face of the voucher.

*Par. 5. Leases, contracts, agreements, and accepted proposals.*—These are necessary as supporting evidence in connection with the audit of vouchers covering expenditures thereunder, and consequently when executed by a postmaster should be forwarded by him with his quarterly account, attached to the voucher for the first payment under its terms, unless instructions require it to be forwarded in advance to the department, in which case the proper bureau officer will provide for its transmission to the General Accounting Office. Where written proposal and acceptance is so forwarded in advance the postmaster will show under item B, "Form of agreement," on the reverse of the voucher, to what office they have been forwarded.

*Par. 6. Discounts for prompt payment of bills.*—Attention is invited to the provisions of Order No. 36, January 3, 1924, published in the supplement to the Official Postal Guide for February, 1924.

*Par. 7. Abstracting of bids.*—With each agreement (whether forwarded with the account or transmitted in advance to the department), the postmaster shall furnish an abstract of all bids received or the bids themselves. If in an exceptional case a bid other than the lowest is accepted he will state his specific reason for accepting the higher bid. Abstracts will show the date bids are opened, the name of each bidder, the amount of his bid, and the discount offered, if any.

*Par. 8. Obsolete forms abolished.*—The following forms will no longer be used and all existing stocks should be disposed of at once as waste paper:

Form 1526R. Voucher for rent of post office (original and duplicate).

Form 2625. Monthly voucher for mail-messenger service.

Form 2625a. Quarterly voucher for mail-messenger service (original and duplicate).

Form 1502a. Quarterly voucher for clerk, contract station.

Form 1540a. Quarterly voucher for vehicle service.

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#### DUTY OF RURAL CARRIERS AS RESPECTS THE DELIVERY OF MAIL ADDRESSED TO "BOX HOLDER"

Postmasters and rural carriers are reminded that mail which is addressed to "box holders" for delivery on rural and star routes is entitled to the same prompt and careful handling as is required to be extended to other kinds of mail matter. The "box holder" mail must be delivered as soon as practicable after its receipt at the post office and one piece is to be deposited in each box on the route, if the number furnished is sufficient; otherwise, one piece will be delivered in each of the boxes as reached until the number furnished is exhausted. The fact that a carrier has no other mail for the box of a patron on his route does not justify him in delaying the delivery of a piece of "box holder" mail.

If the number of pieces of mail of this kind addressed to box holders on a rural or star route is in excess of the number of boxes maintained by the patrons, the undelivered pieces are to be returned to the postmaster to be disposed of in accordance with the regulations, and under no circumstances are to be destroyed by the carrier.

## CHANGES TO BE INSERTED IN THE JULY, 1928, GUIDE

CHANGE No. 102 (Gambia, p. 317; sec. 32, pp. 181 and 182; sec. 33, p. 183).

Dutiable articles are now admitted in letters and letter packages addressed for delivery in Gambia, under the conditions set forth in section 32 on pages 181 and 182. Accordingly, "Gambia" should be added to the list in that section and deleted from the list in section 33, on page 183.

Also, "Dutiable articles" should be deleted from the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Gambia—Regular mails" on page 317, and the following should be added between the subheadings "Air mail service" and "Prohibitions":

"*Dutiable articles.*—Dutiable articles accepted, provided there is affixed to each letter or package prepaid at the letter rate a green label (Form D-quater), ties for examination. A customs declaration properly completed or an invoice must also be inclosed in the package."

CHANGE No. 103 (Great Britain and Northern Ireland, p. 325).

The following should be added to the last paragraph of the subheading Prohibitions of the item "Great Britain and Northern Ireland—Regular mails" on page 325:

"However, as an exception, sample articles containing bona-fide trade, samples of buttons, duly provided with a description of the contents, may be imported on condition:

"(1) That the packet contains only one sample of each kind, size, or color of button, or

"(2) That the packet does not contain more than 24 samples of each kind, size, or color of button, having an intrinsic value not exceeding 6 pence."

CHANGE No. 104 (Hejaz and Nejd and Dependencies, p. 336).

The following information supersedes that now appearing under the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Hejaz and Nejd and Dependencies—Regular mails and parcel post" on page 336.

## REGULAR MAILS

Dutiable articles.

*Samples.*—Samples containing articles liable to customs duty or samples having a salable value.

*Registered articles.*—Registered articles containing coins, gold and silver bullion, precious stones, jewelry, and other precious articles. Those which contain bank notes and paper money are admitted at the risk of the sender.

*General.*—Arms, books, prints, and cards contrary to the Islamic faith.

Those articles prohibited in the form of parcel post are also prohibited in the regular mails.

## PARCEL POST

*Arms, etc.*—Arms, munitions, war material, and the nonexplosive elements of artillery fuses.

*General.*—Books and prints contrary to the Islamic faith.

CHANGE No. 105 (Hejaz and Nejd and Dependencies, p. 336; Sec. 32, p. 182; sec. 33, p. 183).

Dutiable articles are now prohibited in the letter mails to Hejaz and Nejd and Dependencies.

In view of the above, Hejaz and Nejd and Dependencies should be eliminated from section 32 on page 182 and added in alphabetical order in section 33 on page 183, and "Dutiable articles" should be added to the subheading Prohibitions of the item "Hejaz and Nejd and dependencies—Regular mails," on page 336.

CHANGE No. 106 (Republic of Honduras, p. 337; sec. 32, pp. 181 and 182; sec. 33, p. 183).

Dutiable articles are now admitted in letters and letter packages addressed for delivery in the Republic of Honduras, under the conditions set forth in section 32 on pages 181 and 182. Accordingly, "Republic of Honduras" should be added to the list in that section and deleted from the list in section 33, on page 183.

"Dutiable articles" should be deleted from the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Honduras, Republic of—Regular mails" on page 337, and the following should be added between the subheadings "Money-order service" and "Observations" of that item (regular mails):

*"Dutiable articles.*—Dutiable articles accepted, provided there is affixed to each letter or package prepaid at the letter rate a green label (Form D-quater), Form 2976, showing that the articles are to be submitted to the customs authorities for examination. A customs declaration properly completed or an invoice must also be inclosed in the package."

CHANGE No. 107 (Japan, pp. 357 to 359).

The following should be added to the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Japan—Regular mails and parcel post" on pages 357 to 359, inclusive.

Page 357, third paragraph, after the words "Counterfeit coins, bank notes, and securities," add "as well as machines, utensils, or materials for making such counterfeits."

In the last paragraph on this page, commencing with the words "medicines considered," insert, after the words "above-mentioned products" in the first line, "except those imported by authorized persons." At the end of this paragraph replace the words "imported by Government permission" by the following: "Must be accompanied by a certificate of origin issued by the Japanese consul at the place of exportation, and, if there is no Japanese consulate at that place, by the customs or other competent authorities."

At the end of the first paragraph on page 358, commencing with the words "Green fruits," add "as well as their receptacles and articles used for packing them."

In the second paragraph, commencing with the words "Fresh apples," replace the words "as well as nuts" by "and fresh walnuts and their kernels, as well as their receptacles and articles used for packing them." Add after this paragraph the following two new paragraphs:

"Live and dead animals, as well as meats, bones, skins, and hair, with the exception of those which have passed thorough inspection for diseases of animals.

"Skins of sea otters and seals, except those imported by persons authorized by the relative ministerial decree."

Page 358, title "Korea (Chosen)," in the second line of the second paragraph, after the word "securities," insert "as well as machines, utensils, or material for making such counterfeits; securities bearing any false indication; postage stamps or other stamps representing counterfeit or altered postage rates, and those on which the traces of previous use have been obliterated, except those which are not intended to be used; articles which may be confused with the receipt stamps issued by the Government or imprints representing the nominal value of those receipt stamps, except those imported with permission of the Government."

In the next to last line of the same paragraph, before the word "tobacco," insert "machines, utensils, and paper destined solely for the manufacturing of tobacco."

Replace the next paragraph, beginning with the words "Fruit trees," by the following text:

"Fruit trees intended for planting or grafting, and cherry trees, as well as their branches, stems or roots, with the exception of those which have passed the customs inspection."

"Articles whose importation is absolutely or temporarily prohibited by the Governor General of Korea in order to prevent contagious diseases of man or animals."

"Drugs and medicines not entered in any official pharmacopœia or not used as remedies which are considered by the police authorities as subject to import prohibition."

"Soils, except those imported by soil merchants and by other persons for personal use or with permission."

"Skins of sea otters and seals, except those imported by persons authorized by the relative ministerial decree."

"Dyes extracted from coal-tar and other chemical products, except those imported by Government permission."

Same page, replace the entire subdivision "Taiwan (Formosa) and Karafuto (Japanese Sakhalin)" by the following:

"*Taiwan (Formosa)*.—The articles prohibited importation into Japan proper, except green fruits and vegetables originating in or unloaded at Hawaii, fresh apples, pears, quinces, plums, and apricots, and fresh walnuts and their kernels, as well as the receptacles and articles used for packing them."

"Ferments and other materials for the manufacture of spirits, except those imported with the permission of the competent office of the Monopoly."

"Weights and measures."

"Materials for making paper hats coming from Taiwan, except those which have passed the inspection of the Government General of Taiwan."

"Plants, seeds, stems, leaves, and roots of sugar cane, except those which have passed the inspection of the Government General of Taiwan."

"Perforated coins of poor quality."

"Silver 1-yen coins and foreign silver coins of a value of more than 100 yen; auxiliary foreign coins and silver ingots of a value of more than 3 yen; silver 1-yen coins and foreign silver coins whose total value exceeds 100 yen."

"Receipt stamps from which the trace of the stamp has been removed."

"Skins of sea otters and seals."

"Drugs, except those imported with permission of the Governor General of Taiwan."

"The articles enumerated above may be sent in transit through Taiwan."

"*Karafuto (Japanese Sakhalin)*.—The articles prohibited importation into Japan proper, except dyes extracted from coal-tar and chemical products derived from the fractional distillation of coal tar."

"The articles enumerated above may be sent in transit through Karafuto."

Leased territory of Kwantung: Same page, eliminate the words "or imported by permission from the authorities" in the last line.

Add the following new paragraphs:

"Postage stamps and other stamps representing postage rates, counterfeit, or altered, and those from which the traces of use have been removed, except those not intended to be used."

"Fruit trees and cherry trees (including grafts and stems) infected by any disease or contaminated by harmful insects."

"The articles enumerated above may be sent in transit through the leased territory of Kwangtung."

South Pacific islands under Japanese mandate: Same page, word as follows: "Same prohibitions as Japan, except machines, utensils, and paper for manufacturing tobacco, raw camphor and camphor oil; minerals containing over 40 per cent of sodium chloride; green fruits and vegetables from Hawaii; fresh apples, pears, quinces, plums, apricots, and walnuts or their packing; live or dead animals, meats, bones, skins, and hair; skins of sea otters and seals."

Page 358, Parcel-post prohibitions, under the subdivisions "Taiwan (Formosa) and Karafuto (Japanese Sakhalin)," replace "Same as Japan" by "Same as regular mails, with the exception of weights and measures imported by the Government or authorized persons."

CHANGE No. 108 (Mexico, change No. 1, p. 51, of the August supplement, and change No. 26, p. 41, of the October supplement).

The postal administration of Mexico has advised that the restrictions applying to the proprietary articles mentioned in change No. 1 on page 51 of the August supplement and change No. 26 on page 41 of the October supplement have been rescinded and such articles may now be accepted for onward transmission to addressees in Mexico.

CHANGE No. 109 (Mexico, p. 378).

The following should be added to the subheading "Collect-on-delivery service" of the item "Mexico—Parcel post" on page 378.

Ordinary, registered, and collect-on-delivery parcel post service is suspended, until further notice, with the following offices in Mexico:

CHANGE No. 110 (Mexico, pp. 378-381).

The following should be added to the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Mexico—Regular mails and parcel post" on pages 378 and 381:

"With a view to preventing the disease called 'wheat smut,' it is absolutely forbidden to import any kind or variety of wheat (*Triticum Spp.*) raised in India, Japan, China, Australia, South Africa, Italy, Spain, and the States of Illinois, Kansas, and Missouri in the United States of America.

"The introduction of the wheat above mentioned may be authorized only by special permission, when it is intended for scientific study and when the precautions prescribed by the Secretariat of Agriculture and Fomento, Bureau for Agricultural Defense, are taken.

"Wheat coming from places other than those mentioned above will be admitted by permit from the Bureau for Agricultural Defense when the importation is effected through the respective ports, and after fumigation or other treatment approved by the said bureau.

"In connection with the fumigation, the Secretariat of Agriculture and Fomento, through the Bureau for Agricultural Defense, may accept certificates issued by foreign countries with which there is a commercial exchange of agricultural products, when those certificates are visaed by Mexican Consuls.

"Violations of the regulations will be subjected to the agricultural Sanitary Police Regulations."

CHANGE No. 111 (Mexico, pp. 377 and 380).

The following should be added to the subheadings "Prohibitions" of the item "Mexico—Regular mails and parcel post" on pages 377 and 380:

"Vegetables may be accepted for transmission in the mails to Mexico subject to sanitary inspection upon receipt in that country. The Mexican Government imposes a fee for the inspection mentioned and in those instances where parcels are addressed to offices at which no customs officer is located, senders must indicate on the parcel the name and address of a representative at the Mexican exchange office who will pay the fee for this service. Parcels addressed to those places at which a Mexican customs official is stationed need not designate such a representative, as the addressee may pay this charge at time of delivery."

The words "hides, skins, or hair" should be eliminated from the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "New Zealand—Parcel Post" on page 393.

CHANGE No. 114 (Nigeria, p. 396):

The first paragraph after the parcel-post table of the item "Nigeria-Parcel Post," on page 396 is superseded by the following:

"\* Parcels exceeding 11 pounds in weight may be accepted for the following offices only: Aba, Abeokuta, Benin City, Bonny, Burutu, Calabar, Degema, Ebute Metta, Enugu, Forcados, Ibadan, Ijebu-Ode, Ilorin, Itu, Jos, Kaduna, Kano Lagos, Lokoja, Makurdi, Minna, Obubra, Onitsha, Opobo, Oshogbo, Port Harcourt, Sapele, Umuahia, Warri, and Zaria."

CHANGE No. 115 (Change No. 65, p. 37 December Supplement):

Information has been received that the articles mentioned in Change No. 65 on page 37 of the December Supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1928 are admissible in the parcel-post mails to Great Britain and Northern Ireland

In view of the above, Change No. 65 is canceled.

CHANGE No. 116 (Nyasaland Protectorate, p. 400).

The words "plants, seeds, or roots, except by permission from the director of agriculture at Zomba" should be eliminated from the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Nyasaland Protectorate—Parcel post" on page 400.

CHANGE No. 117 (Australia, p. 233; France, p. 306).

The sentence "'window' (panel) envelopes, unless the transparent panel forms an integral part of the envelopes," appearing under the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Australia—Regular mails" on page 233, and the clause "is an integral part of the envelope" of the second paragraph of the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "France—Regular mails" on page 306 should be deleted.

CHANGE No. 118 (Kingdom of the Serbs, Croats and Slovenes, p. 57 of November supplement).

The information appearing in the announcement issued by this office under date of October 24 and published on page 57 of the November supplement regarding the certificates mentioned is modified by the following:

"Copies of certificates of origin and certificates of health required in connection with certain parcels addressed for delivery in the Kingdom of Serbs, Croats and Slovenes should, in addition to being inclosed in the parcel, be attached to the outside of the parcels to which they relate. A notation should be placed on the customs declaration and the wrapper indicating that the duplicate copies of the certificates mentioned are inclosed in the parcel."

CHANGE No. 119 (Persia, p. 407).

The following supersedes the information now appearing under the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Persia—Parcel post" on page 407:

"Coin, except of gold or silver; artificial silk thread; tobacco stalks; and, except under permit from the Persian Government, arms (not including sporting guns or saloon carbines); saccharine; wireless telegraph and telephone apparatus.

"Carbon papers (same as Great Britain). As to paints, varnishes, turpentine, lacquer, and similar substances, see item 'Great Britain and Northern Ireland.' Information as to dyes admissible by mail can be obtained from the Persian customs authorities."

CHANGE No. 120 (India, British, p. 343).

The words "parts of arms and accessories" should be added after the word "Arms" in the first line of the second paragraph of the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "India, British—Parcel post" on page 343.

CHANGE No. 121 (Netherlands, The, p. 385).

The following should be added to the subheading "Prohibitions—Regular mails" of the item "Netherlands, The" on page 385:

"Advertising circulars which are fastened by means of a gummed sticker label when received in the prints mails in that country will be delivered to the addressees only upon payment of the charge for short-paid letters."

CHANGE No. 122 (Persia, p. 406; sec. 66, p. 204).

Parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Persia *must* be sealed with wax, lead seals, or otherwise.

In view of the above, section 66 on page 204 should be changed as follows:

The word "Persia" should be deleted in the list for which parcels *may* be sealed and placed in alphabetical order in the list of countries for which parcels *must* be sealed.

The information appearing immediately after the parcel-post table of the item "Persia—Parcel post" on page 406 should be changed to read as follows: "\*Compulsory."

CHANGE No. 123 (post offices).

The advancement of the post office at Avondale Estates, Ga., from the fourth to the third class under the provisions of the unusual-conditions clause in the act of February 28, 1925, is hereby ordered effective February 1, 1929, and the salary of the postmaster is fixed at the rate of \$1,600.
