WALTER F. BROWN, POSTMASTER GENERAL

FLORIDA QUARANTINED ON ACCOUNT OF THE MEDITERRANEAN FRUIT FLY

To every Postmaster in Florida:

In order to prevent the spread of the Mediterranean fruit fly, a dangerous insect recently discovered in the State of Florida, the Secretary of Agriculture has promulgated Quarantine Order No. 68 quarantining that State. Under this quarantine order the acceptance for mailing in Florida of citrus fruits, noncitrus fruits, and certain "host" vegetables is absolutely prohibited, both to places in Florida and to points outside that State.

A copy of the order and instructions pertaining thereto have been sent to every postmaster in Florida by the Third Assistant Postmaster General and all postmasters and other postal employees are directed to cooperate in the enforcement of Quarantine Order No. 68, so that no parcel of fruits or vegetables covered by the order may be accepted for mailing or delivered in violation of the quarantine.

THIS IS A SERIOUS EMERGENCY. CONSTANT VIGILANCE MUST BE EXERCISED TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE MEDITERRANEAN FRUIT FLY.

MARKING ROOFS AS GUIDE TO AERIAL NAVIGATION

On page 2 of the October, 1928, and on page 1 of the February, 1929, Supplements to the Postal Guide, postmasters were urged to cooperate with the Daniel Guggenheim Fund for the Promotion of Aeronautics in its campaign for the painting of the names of cities and towns on the roofs of one or two prominent buildings in all communities with a population ranging from 1,000 to 50,000, and a letter outlining the plan was addressed to each postmaster involved by the Guggenheim Fund.

While the number of responses received was gratifying, and the cooperation extended highly appreciated, it develops that the postmasters of 1,900 towns coming within the group have failed to give this matter any attention, notwithstanding four letters have been sent to each of them by the Guggenheim Fund.

In view of the national interest in the development of aerial navigation, and its invaluable aid to the Government in times of emergency, such delinquency on the part of postmasters is inexcusable. All that is necessary is to bring the matter to the attention of local business and civic organizations, such as chambers of commerce, boards of trade, etc., or, in the absence of such organizations, to confer with the prominent citizens of the community with a view to creating such interest as will result in the marking of one or two roofs and, whether or not anything is accomplished, report the facts to the Guggenheim Fund.

It is therefore directed that all postmasters who have not done so immediately give this matter their attention and communicate the result of their action to the Daniel Guggenheim Fund for the Promotion of Aeronautics, 598 Madison Avenue, New York. Should any postmasters within the group mentioned still fail to cooperate in this matter within a reasonable time, it will be necessary to publish the list of delinquents in the Postal Guide Supplements.

PERMIT NUMBER MAY BE OMITTED FROM METERED PERMIT INDICIA

In connection with the mailing of metered permit matter postmasters are advised that the permit number may be omitted from the permit indicia at the option of the mailer, provided the indicia show the number of the meter by means of which they are printed and the matter bears the return card of the sender.

CHANGE IN CONVERSION RATES

ORDER No. 8804.

APRIL 29, 1929.

It is ordered that on and after May 2, 1929, in the issue of postal money orders the money of the United States shall be converted into that of the Netherlands and the Netherland East Indies at the rate of \$0.41 to the florin and into that of Spain at the rate of \$0.15 to the peseta.

CONVENTION OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LETTER CARRIERS

ORDER No. 8847.

MAY 11, 1929.

Postmasters at post offices having city delivery and village delivery service are authorized to grant city and village delivery carriers leave of absence without pay for such number of days as may be necessary, not exceeding 30, to enable them to attend the convention of the National Association of Letter Carriers, to be held in Minneapolis, Minn., from August 26 to 31, 1929. Such carriers may be allowed all or a portion of their annual leave with pay as a part of the leave of absence herein authorized. Postmasters will exercise their discretion as to the number of carriers that can be spared without detriment to the service.

SPLENDID LOYALTY SHOULD CONTINUE

As I intend very shortly to leave the Postal Service, I desire to thank all postal workers for their splendid loyalty and cooperation, and to ask them to transfer the same without stint to my successor.

QUESTIONING THE PUBLIC

In questioning patrons with a view to ascertaining the contents of parcels presented at the post office for mailing, utmost tact is required. The reason should be obvious to all employees having daily contact with the public.

Suggestion is, therefore, made that the question: "What does this package contain" or something similar, sometimes used unthinkingly in the stress of business, hereafter be scrupulously avoided and that there be substituted therefor questions such as: "Merchandise?" "Wearing apparel?" "Hardware?" "Candy?" "Glassware?" etc.

This is not in any way intended to annul the instructions contained on page 136, article 93 of the July, 1928, Postal Guide. It is still imperative that such questions be asked as may be necessary to determine the character of the contents of parcels with respect to mailability, perishability, insurance, etc. However, if a clerk knows that a package is merchandise and contains wearing apparel, that is sufficient without ascertaining the character of the apparel.

COMPENSATION TO POSTMASTERS, PRESIDENTIAL OFFICES, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1929

Under date of May 1, 1929, a notice was sent to each postmaster where a change in salary is to be made July 1, 1929. Postmasters not receiving such a notice will continue to claim credit for salary in accordance with the rate now in effect. DIVISION OF INTERNATIONAL POSTAL SERVICE

AIR MAIL ROUTE—ADELAIDE TO PERTH, AUSTRALIA

Effective with the flight from Adelaide on Sunday, June 2, the weekly air mail service between Adelaide (South Australia) and Perth (Western Australia) will be available for the dispatch of articles in the regular mails, ordinary and registered, posted in this country for delivery in Western Australia. The service will be of the greatest utility when the steamers conveying the articles to Australia arrive in Sydney either on Thursdays or Fridays as the planes leave Adelaide on Sunday morning immediately after the arrival of the mail train from Melbourne and arrive at Perth on Monday.

Articles intended for dispatch by the above-mentioned air mail route should have affixed the blue label "Par avion—by air mail" (or, until a supply of such labels is available at the post office of mailing, be marked, "Par avion—by air mail") and be marked underneath "From Adelaide, Australia."

The air mail fee, *in addition to the regular postage*, applicable to such articles is 6 cents for each half ounce or fraction, which fee must be fully prepaid.

AIR MAIL SERVICE TO COLOMBIA

Articles in the regular mails, ordinary and registered, addressed for delivery in Colombia may be accepted for dispatch thereto by air on F. A. M. Route No. 9.

The rate (postage plus air-mail fee) *per half ounce or fraction*, which must be fully prepaid, is:

15 cents from Cristobal to Colombia.

40 cents from Miami to Colombia.

The first rate applies to articles to be dispatched by sea from the United States to Critobal and from that place by F. A. M. Route No. 9, and includes dispatch by the United States domestic air mail service, when practicable, to the port of dispatch by steamer.

Articles prepaid at the last rate is given dispatch by the United States domestic air mail service to Miami, when practicable, or from San Juan to Miami on F. A. M. Route No. 6, as well as dispatch from Miami to Cristobal by F. A. M. Route No. 5, and thence by F. A. M. Route No. 9 to Colombia.

Articles prepaid at the foregoing rates should have affixed the blue label "Par avion—By air mail" (or, until a supply of such labels is available at the post office of mailing, be marked "Par avion—by air mail"), and be marked underneath "From Miami" or "From Cristobal," as the case may be.

The service on this route is weekly.

INTERNATIONAL AIR MAIL SERVICE—ROUTE F. A. M. No. 5 TO DELIVER MAILS IN CENTRAL AMERICA

On route F. A. M. No. 5, deliveries of air mail dispatches are being made at Belize, British Honduras, Tela, Republic of Honduras and Managua, Nicaragua, as well as at Cristobal, Canal Zone.

The rates (postage plus air mail fee) *per half ounce or fraction*, which must be fully prepaid, are as follows:

Articles prepaid at the above rates are given dispatch by the domestic air mail service to Miami when practicable, or from San Juan to Miami on route F. A. M. No. 6, as well as dispatch from Miami by route F. A. M. No. 5. They should have affixed the blue label "Par avion—By air mail" (or, until a supply of such labels is available at the post office of mailing, be marked "Par avion—By air mail") and be marked underneath "From Miami."

A special cachet is used at the Miami office on all articles dispatched by the flight mentioned to British Honduras, Republic of Honduras, and Nicaragua.

INTERNATIONAL AIR MAIL SERVICE—ROUTE F. A. M., NO. 9, CRISTOBAL, CANAL ZONE, TO SANTIAGO, CHILE

Air mail service has been established on that part of route F. A. M., No. 9, between Cristobal, Canal Zone, and Mollendo, Peru, by planes leaving each of those points.

Mail is carried to and from Esmeraldas and Guayaquil, Ecuador, and Talara, Truxillo, Lima, and Mollendo, Peru. Service is provided to points in Colombia and will be extended to Chile as soon as operating arrangements are completed.

Service is confined to a frequency of one round trip a week for the present by a schedule to leave Cristobal and Mollendo every Friday, with four days flying time each way, and connects at Cristobal with route F. A. M., No. 5, Miami to Cristobal, for air mails to and from the United States.

The rates (postage plus air mail fee) *per half ounce or fraction*, which must be fully prepaid, on articles carried southbound are as follows:

From points in the United States to Ecuador, 40 cents.

From points in the United States to Peru, 55 cents.

Articles prepaid at the above rates are given dispatch by the domestic air mail service to Miami where practicable as well as dispatch from Miami to Cristobal by F. A. M. route No. 5. Articles so prepaid in Porto Rico will also be given air service from San Juan to Miami.

From the Canal Zone to Ecuador, 15 cents.

From the Canal Zone to Peru, 30 cents.

These rates may apply to articles to be dispatched by sea from the United States to Cristobal and from that place by route F. A. M., No. 9, and will include dispatch by the domestic air mail service in this country where practicable to the port of dispatch by steamer, as well as articles mailed in the Canal Zone.

Articles from Peru and Ecuador for dispatch northbound must bear postage as may be required by those countries.

Articles prepaid at the foregoing rates should have affixed the blue label "Par avion—By air mail" (or until a supply of such labels is available at the post office of mailing, be marked "Par avion—By air mail"), and be marked underneath such label "From Miami," or "From Cristobal," as the case may be.

A special cachet will be used at the Cristobal office on all articles dispatched on the first southbound flight. First flight covers addressed to the offices named in Ecuador and Peru may be mailed in due time for dispatch by air from Miami, or may be sent for mailing at Cristobal. If sent to the postmaster at Cristobal, funds should be furnished to purchase the necessary Canal Zone stamps.

While no arrangements have yet been made, it is assumed that the postmasters at the offices named in Ecuador and Peru will return by ordinary mail first flight covers upon request of senders who will furnish international reply coupons to pay postage.

PARCEL POST SERVICE TO ITALY

Information has been received that mailers in this country are not properly preparing parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Italy to withstand the many handlings to which such parcels are subjected, with the result that many parcels are received at destination with the contents damaged or lost.

In view of the above, it is suggested that parcels be either securely wrapped or placed in wooden boxes whenever this latter method is practicable.

INCREASED PARCEL-POST FACILITIES WITH NORWAY

A parcel-post convention has been concluded with Norway, effective June 1, 1929, which provides for the exchange of insured as well as ordinary but not registered parcels, and for the payment of indemnity in the event of loss, rifling, or damage of insured parcels in the actual amount, based on the actual value at the time and place of mailing, but not exceeding \$100 for parcels mailed in the United States, including Alaska, Hawaii, Porto Rico, Guam, Samoa, and the Virgin Islands of the United States and kr. 373 (gold) for parcels mailed in Norway, provided that the indemnity shall not exceed the sum for which the required insurance fee was paid in the country of origin. Note thereof should be made

in connection with the information covering the parcel-post service with Norway on page 399 of the current annual Postal Guide, and in section 63 on page 204, section 101, on page 216, and section 129 on page 221.

No indemnity will be paid in the case of loss or damage through force majeure, as that term is defined by the legal decisions or rulings of the country in the service of which the loss or damage occurs; or when loss, rifling, or damage has arisen from the fault or negligence of the sender or the addressee or of the representative of either or from the nature of the article.

Effective on the date named, postmasters will accept and insure, at the request of the senders and on payment of the required insurance fee in addition to the postage and transit charge, mailable parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Norway.

The limits of indemnity payable and the insurance fees chargeable will be as follows:

LIMIT OF INDEMNITY	Cents
For value not over \$10.....	20
From \$10.01 to \$25.....	25
From \$25.01 to \$50.....	35
From \$50.01 to \$100.....	55

Parcels addressed for delivery in Norway which contain coin, bullion, jewelry, or any other precious article must be insured. If a parcel for delivery in Norway which contains coin, bullion, valuable jewelry, or any other precious article is mailed uninsured, it shall be placed under insurance by the post office which first observes the fact of its having been mailed uninsured and shall be treated accordingly.

There will be no change in the postage rate, weight limit, dimensions, number of customs declarations, and prohibitions (except as set forth in the next preceding paragraph) now applicable to parcel-post packages for Norway.

As is the present practice, ordinary parcels for Norway may continue to be closed by means of wax, lead seals, or otherwise, at the option of the sender. Insured parcels for Norway must in all cases be securely closed by means of wax or otherwise. The country of destination has the right to open sealed parcels (including the right to break the seal) as well as unsealed parcels, in order to inspect the contents. Parcels which have been so opened shall be closed again and officially resealed, except in the case of ordinary parcels which need not be sealed if they were not sealed by the sender in the first instance. Section 66 on page 204 of the annual Guide should be modified accordingly.

The senders of parcels (ordinary and insured) addressed for delivery in Norway may give instructions at the time of mailing for other disposition to be made of them if they are undeliverable as ordinarily addressed, as set forth in section 53 on page 201 of the annual Postal Guide.

Senders' return receipts for insured parcels mailed in the United States for delivery in Norway will be furnished only upon request therefor by the sender and upon payment of a fee of 5 cents in stamps affixed, in addition to the postage and insurance fee, for each receipt requested at the time of mailing. A fee of 10 cents will be charged for return receipts requested subsequent to mailing. When a return receipt is desired the article shall be marked in a conspicuous manner, "Return receipt requested," "Advice or delivery requested," or with the letters, "A. R." (See instructions in paragraphs n, o, and p, section 129, on page 222, of the July, 1928, Postal Guide, which are equally applicable to return receipts for insured parcels addressed to Norway.)

Insured parcels for and from Norway will be handled in transit between the United States post offices of origin and delivery and the authorized United States exchange office of dispatch or receipt without being recorded or receipted for in transit between such offices, and, except as may be otherwise stated herein, will be treated in other respects in the same manner as has been prescribed for insured parcels exchanged with other foreign countries, as set forth in the current annual Postal Guide.

If they can be sent as insured mail, insured parcels exchanged with Norway may be returned to the sender in a third country, in accordance with a return address on the parcel, or they may be forwarded to a third country. Senders may indorse insured parcels for Norway, "Do not forward to a third country," in which event the parcels shall not be forwarded to any other country.

In case of the loss, rifling, or damage of an insured parcel exchanged with Norway which is forwarded or returned to a third country, the rightful claimant

shall be entitled to only such indemnity, if any, as the country in which the loss, rifling, or damage occurred is willing or obligated to pay under any agreement in force between the countries directly involved in the forwarding or return.

Refused parcels (ordinary and insured) from Norway must be returned at once from the post office of destination to the United States exchange office from which they were received, marked "Refused," while other parcels which can not be delivered must be returned at the expiration of 30 days (as at present), after being marked to show the cause of nondelivery, as "Unclaimed," etc., unless the parcels were marked by the senders to be otherwise disposed of, as "Abandon" or "If not deliverable as addressed, deliver to -----," in which case the parcels must be disposed of as instructed by the senders.

Parcels for Norway may not be accepted for registration after June 1, 1929.

The attention of postmasters is directed to the necessity of keeping such separate records of the number of insured parcels addressed to Norway originating at their offices, and of the insurance fees applicable to the parcels, as will enable them to render a report upon request, showing, as separate items, the number of insured parcel-post packages, with their respective fees, accepted for mailing to Norway during any fiscal year.

Postmasters are requested to give as much publicity to the insurance service with Norway as is practicable without expense to the department.

PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO PERSIA

The Postal Administration of Persia advises that parcel-post packages originating in this country are being received in that service unsealed.

As the sealing of parcels addressed for delivery in Persia is now compulsory, as explained in Change No. 122 on page 61 of the February Supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1928, postmasters will see that all parcels are properly prepared before acceptance for the country mentioned.

REGISTERED PARCELS FROM MEXICO TO BE CAREFULLY EXAMINED FOR C. O. D. INDORSEMENTS

It has come to the attention of the department that registered C. O. D. parcels from Mexico are being delivered without collection of the C. O. D. charges, indicating, in most cases, that sufficient care is not being exercised by postal employees to ascertain whether registered parcels from Mexico bear COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY charges.

Postmasters are therefore requested to see that all registered parcels received at their offices from Mexico are closely examined for C. O. D. indorsements so that the parcels bearing such indicia may be accorded the proper C. O. D. treatment on delivery.

Postal employees are cautioned that failure to observe the foregoing may result in being held financially responsible to the senders for any loss caused by the improper delivery of the parcels without collection of the C. O. D. charges.

ARTICLES FOR DELIVERY IN NEWFOUNDLAND AND ST. PIERRE AND MIQUELON NOT TO BE INCLUDED IN SACKS FOR CANADIAN OFFICES DURING STATISTICAL PERIOD

A report received from Canada indicates that United States exchange offices are not complying with the instructions contained in the notice captioned "Postal Union Transit Statistics," reading as follows:

"A statistical count will be taken of regular (Postal Union) mails dispatched during the period of May 1 to 28, 1929, which are not forwarded direct from the United States to the country of destination without the intervention of a foreign country or service.

"As Newfoundland and St. Pierre and Miquelon are not parts of Canada, mails intended for the places mentioned should not be included in the sacks labeled to Canadian offices.

"The regular mail articles for Newfoundland and St. Pierre and Miquelon should, during the statistical period of May 1 to 28, 1929, be sent to the office of New York or to the office of Boston according to which office offers the more expeditious means of onward forwarding to destination."

PHILATELIC MATERIALS IN THE MAILS TO THE UNION OF SOCIALISTIC SOVIET REPUBLICS

The Postal Administration of the Union of Socialistic Soviet Republics advises that although specific information respecting the method of transmitting philatelic materials to that country is outlined on page 454 of the United States Official Postal Guide for 1928, such articles continue to be received not addressed and prepared in the manner prescribed.

Postmasters will caution prospective mailers to observe the instructions referred to above, in order to eliminate the receipt of similar reports in the future.

SPECIAL PACKING INSTRUCTIONS FOR INSURED PARCELS ADDRESSED TO GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND CONTAINING LIQUIDS OR ANY SUBSTANCE WHICH EASILY LIQUEFIES

On page 17 of the May, 1927, Postal Guide, the following notice, under the above heading, was published:

"It has come to the attention of the department that, although improperly prepared for mailing, postmasters are accepting for insurance to Great Britain and Northern Ireland parcels containing liquids or any substance which easily liquefies.

"The Parcel Post Convention between Great Britain and Northern Ireland and this country, under the provisions of which mailable parcels are accepted for insurance, provides: 'Any liquid or any substance which easily liquefies shall be packed in a double receptacle. Between the first receptacle (bottle, flask, pot, box, etc.), and the second (box of metal or of strong wood) shall be left a space which shall be filled with sawdust, bran, or some other absorbent material in sufficient quantity to absorb all the liquid contents in the case of breakage.'

"Postmasters are requested to take the necessary steps to have the above-cited requirements strictly complied with.

"Failure to observe the requirements with regard to packing insured parcels not only jeopardizes the other mail in case of breakage of the containers of liquids but also deprives claimants of the right to indemnity in case of damage to the improperly packed articles."

The Postal Administration of Great Britain and Northern Ireland has recently complained to the department of the receipt from this country of parcels containing liquids which were not prepared for mailing according to the requirements, as outlined above, and which, consequently, caused damage to other parcels included in the same dispatch.

All postal employees concerned are again cautioned to comply strictly with the above-cited requirements by requiring the senders to present such parcels for mailing in accordance with the regulations.

Failure on the part of accepting employees to use utmost care in seeing that such parcels are properly prepared for mailing in the manner specified may result in a collection being made from the postal employee at fault to cover any damage sustained by reason of such negligence.

MATTER ENTITLED TO ADMISSION IN THE INTERNATIONAL MAILS FREE OF POSTAGE

As the postal administration of Colombia has granted the franking privilege to the official correspondence of United States consuls and vice consuls when acting as consuls, the second paragraph of section 13 on pages 175 and 176 of the July, 1928, Postal Guide as modified by the notices of this office, dated April 3 and April 18, 1929, is further modified as follows:

The words "except Colombia" appearing in the tenth and seventeenth lines should be stricken.

NO C. O. D. SERVICE WITH CANADA

The postal administration of Canada has reported the receipt of several C. O. D. parcels from this country.

Inasmuch as no arrangement exists for the exchange of C. O. D. parcels between Canada and this country, postmasters are requested to refrain from accepting C. O. D. parcels for delivery in Canada.

DIVISION OF FINANCE

NEW COUNTERFEIT

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

“\$10 NATIONAL-BANK NOTE

“On the First National Bank of Santa Ana, Santa Ana, Calif.; 1902 series; check letter ‘J’; charter No. 3520; serial No. 2467; backplate No. 179; J. W. Lyons, Register of the Treasury; Charles H. Treat, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of McKinley.

“This note is the handiwork of the counterfeiters responsible for the counterfeit \$10 national-bank note described in Circular Letter No. 621 under date of February 21, 1929, being printed on two sheet of papers from photomechanical plates, with pen and ink lines imitating the genuine silk fiber. Fictitious names have been executed by hand in India ink, the specimen at hand being inscribed ‘C. M. Smith, Cashier’ and ‘W. N. Reedy, President.’ The serial numbers are crudely etched, the figures being out of line, and the note has a yellow-green cast, having been purposely discolored by chemical application to produce an aged effect.

“This counterfeit will deceive the unwary handler of currency.”

PAY TELEPHONES IN POST OFFICE LOBBIES

Instructions under this caption printed on page 26 of the August, 1928, Supplement to the Official Postal Guide, directing that commissions collected on calls through public telephones in lobbies of post offices, branch post offices, and stations located in leased premises shall be accounted for in the blank line following item 11 of the quarterly postal account is modified to require such collections at first and second class post offices to be entered in the account on the blank line following item 13 of the account describing the entry, thus: “Commissions, telephone calls.”

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

RETURN CARD ON AIR MAIL

Attention has frequently been called to the importance of having the return card of the sender in the upper left corner of the address side of each piece of mail. This is especially desirable with respect to air mail, and postmasters are urged to make every effort to have their patrons place a proper return card on all air mail, whether inclosed in ordinary envelopes or envelopes of the special designs approved by the department for air mail use.

POSTAGE ON MAGAZINE COVERS RETURNED TO PUBLISHERS

Packages containing covers of unsold magazines returned to the publishers by agents are being accepted for mailing by some postmasters at the transient second-class rate of postage.

Such covers in packages weighing 8 ounces or less are third-class matter and chargeable with postage at the rate of 1½ cents for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, while parcels exceeding 8 ounces in weight are embraced in mail of the

fourth class and chargeable with postage at the parcel-post zone rates shown in the table on page 12 of the July, 1928, Postal Guide.

There may be written on the magazine covers or on a slip inclosed therewith figures indicating the number of covers and the dates of issues of the magazines from which taken without subjecting the packages or parcels to a higher rate of postage.

NOTICES AND UNDELIVERABLE COPIES OF SECOND-CLASS PUBLICATIONS TO BE SENT TO BRANCH OFFICE OF PUBLISHERS WHEN REQUESTED

When the wrappers of publications mailed by the publishers at the second-class pound rates of postage or free in the county of publication bear a request that notices on Form 3578 and undeliverable copies be sent to a branch office of the publishers, as provided in article 225 on page 32 of the July, 1928, Postal Guide, such request should be complied with. Many complaints have been received that this is not being done, and postmasters should take the necessary action to see that all undeliverable second-class matter receives proper treatment.

IMPROPER ACCEPTANCE OF MATTER WITHOUT POSTAGE STAMPS AFFIXED

It has come to attention that some business concerns supply their agents in other places with advertising literature, envelopes, wrappers, etc., bearing printed permit indicia of the home office. The words "U. S. postage —c. paid" printed in such indicia lead such agents to believe that the postage has already been paid and that the matter may, therefore, be mailed by them at any post office, which is not the case.

This practice not only leads to confusion and misunderstanding but is liable to result in loss of postal revenue, since no postage whatever would be received by the Government for matter mailed by agents under such conditions.

Therefore, when matter is presented for mailing at any post office with the name of any other post office shown in the permit indicia the facts should be reported to this office, Division of Classification, and the matter itself should not be accepted for mailing unless the permit indicia are completely obliterated and proper postage is prepaid by stamps affixed.

No person or concern may mail matter without stamps affixed under permit (secs. 435½ and 452, Postal Laws and Regulations) unless special authority has been given such person or concern, and they should be advised that their permits are liable to be revoked, if it is found that matter bearing their permit indicia is distributed outside the mails to agents or others, or is furnished in bulk to their agents for distribution at other places. (See par. 7, p. 8, March, 1929, Supplement to the Postal Guide.)

INQUIRIES CONCERNING NUMBER OF BOXHOLDERS ON RURAL ROUTES, ETC., FOR PURPOSE OF ADDRESSING ADVERTISING AND OTHER MATTER

The attention of postmasters is renewed to the provisions of paragraph 6 (c), section 457, Postal Laws and Regulations, with reference to the acceptance of advertising and other matter addressed to boxholders on rural routes, or to post-office boxholders at offices not having city letter-carrier service, from which it will be seen that requests of mailers for the number of such boxholders accompanied with the necessary postage for reply should be given prompt attention.

ATTENTION ALL FLORIDA POSTMASTERS: NURSERY STOCK AND PLANTS OF ANY KIND AND FRUITS AND "HOST" VEGETABLES MUST NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR MAILING IN FLORIDA

Notwithstanding a copy of quarantine order No. 68 of the United States Department of Agriculture on account of the Mediterranean fruit fly was sent to every postmaster in Florida on April 30 with specific instructions not to accept for mailing to points within or without that State any citrus fruits, noncitrus fruits, or "host" vegetables enumerated in the quarantine order; that supple-

mental instructions were sent on May 3 to such postmasters, and a notice headed "FLORIDA QUARANTINED ON ACCOUNT OF THE MEDITERRANEAN FRUIT FLY" was published in this bulletin on May 10, postmasters in Florida are again cautioned not to accept for mailing fruits and vegetables prohibited by the quarantine order.

The Mediterranean fruit fly is a most destructive pest of fruits and vegetables and if it is permitted to spread will cause incalculable damage and loss, not only to the State of Florida but to a large number of other States.

Millions of dollars are being spent to stamp out this pest, and all postmasters in Florida are again admonished to exercise constant vigilance to prevent the spread of the MEDITERRANEAN FRUIT FLY.

ALL POSTMASTERS IN FLORIDA ARE THEREFORE DIRECTED NOT TO ACCEPT FOR MAILING NURSERY STOCK OR PLANTS OF ANY KIND, NOR ANY FRUIT OR "HOST" VEGETABLES.

FORMS 3540 AND 3548 NOT BEARING NAMES OF POST OFFICES FROM WHICH SENT

Form 3540 has been sent to the Battle Creek Food Co., Battle Creek, Mich., concerning an undeliverable parcel of fourth-class matter mailed by them, which is held for 9 cents return postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office sending it, nor the State in which located, and it is so carelessly postmarked that the postmark is illegible.

Form 3548 has been sent to Miss Addie Sanders, 824 Central Avenue, Hot Springs, Ark., advising her that a piece of mail addressed to her is being held for postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to the H. W. Buckbee Co., Rockford, Ill., advising them that a parcel addressed to them is being held for 33 cents postage. The card does not bear the name of the post office sending it, nor the State in which located, and it is not postmarked.

Form 3548 has been sent to Henry Voegeli, Hennepin County treasurer, Minneapolis, Minn., advising him that matter is being held for postage. The card does not state the kind of matter, the amount of postage required, the name of the postmaster, the name of the post office and State, or bear any postmark.

The postmasters sending these notices will communicate with the respective addressees and inclose other forms completely and properly filled out.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

THOMAS ALVA EDISON COMMEMORATIVE STAMP

Postmasters and others connected with the Postal Service are notified of the issuance of a new 2-cent postage stamp to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the production of the first incandescent lamp invented by Thomas Alva Edison.

The new stamp is the same size as the 2-cent ordinary stamp, $7\frac{5}{100}$ by $8\frac{7}{100}$ inch, and is printed in red ink. The central design is a picture of the original lamp with rays issuing therefrom. Immediately above and partly encircling the lamp is a ribbon with the words "Edison's First Lamp"; above this and reaching the top of the stamp is a semicircular panel with the words "United States Postage" in white Roman letters. In both upper corners are ribbon scrolls with the year "1879" at the left and "1929" at the right. On either side of the lamp and through the rays of light appears the following legend: "Electric Light's Golden Jubilee." The white numeral "2" appears in both lower corners within dark circles which are connected by a dark panel forming the base of the stamp and containing the word "Cents" in white Roman letters.

The new Edison commemorative stamp was first placed on sale June 5, 1929, at the post office at Menlo Park, N. J. The stamps will be available at other post offices and at the Philatelic Agency, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C., as soon after that date as production will permit.

This stamp will also be issued in coils of 500, sidewise perforated. The coils will not be available on the first day of sale, but will be issued to postmasters having need for that variety as soon as they can be manufactured.

Central and direct accounting postmasters desiring a supply of the new stamps may draw requisitions for limited quantities on Form 3201, the words "Edison Commemorative Stamp" to be written plainly on the blank. District postmasters may obtain small quantities of this stamp to meet the local demand by requisition on their central accounting postmasters.

SULLIVAN EXPEDITION COMMEMORATIVE STAMP

Postmasters and employees of the Postal Service are notified that a special 2-cent postage stamp has been issued to commemorate the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the Sullivan expedition in New York State during the Revolutionary War. The new stamp is the same size as the regular issue, $\frac{7}{100}$ by $\frac{8}{100}$ inch, and is printed in red ink.

The central design is a three-fourths length portrait of Major General Sullivan in Continental uniform over which in a semicircular panel appear the words "United States Postage" in white Roman letters, on a dark background with white edges. This panel is supported on either side by brackets of scroll work forming the upper part of a narrow panel and ending at the base in dark circles with white borders. Within the circles in each lower corner appears the numeral 2 in white Roman letters. Across the top of the stamp is a ribbon bearing the title "Sullivan Expedition" in dark architectural Roman letters. Below, in similar lettering, on either side on extensions of the ribbon panel are the dates 1779 at the left and 1929 at the right. A dark panel with white edges bearing the word "Cents" in white Roman letters connects the circles inclosing the denomination numerals. Above this base in a ribbon panel appears the wording "Maj. Gen. Sullivan" in dark Gothic letters. The entire stamp is inclosed in a narrow white border.

The new Sullivan expedition commemorative stamp was first placed on sale June 17, 1929, at the post offices of Auburn, Binghamton, Canandaigua, Canajoharie, Elmira, Geneseo, Geneva, Horseheads, Owego, Penn Yan, Perry, Seneca Falls, Waterloo, Watkins Glen, and Waverly, N. Y. The stamp will be placed on sale at other post offices and the Philatelic Agency, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C., as soon thereafter as production permits.

Postmasters at direct and central accounting post offices may submit requisition to the department for a limited supply of this stamp, using Form 3201 indorsed across the face "Sullivan Expedition Stamps." Postmasters at district post offices may submit requisition on Form 3338 to their central accounting postmasters for a small quantity as required to meet the local demand.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

CHANGE IN CONVERSION RATES

The gradual increase in the market rate for the florin has made it necessary to raise the conversion rate from 40 to 41 cents. The peseta, on the other hand, has declined, and it is therefore possible to reduce the conversion rate of 16 cents for that currency to 15 cents. The Postmaster General's Order No. 8804, printed on page 2 of this supplement, therefore directs that effective May 2, 1929, the rate for the Netherlands and the Netherland East Indies shall be 41 and for the Spanish peseta 15 cents.

For the Netherlands and the Netherland East Indies Table No. 83 should be used and for Spain Table No. 55.

Postmasters and postal employees are cautioned to guard against errors by consulting conversion tables in connection with the last notice of change received, since any loss imposed upon the remitters or payees by lack of care will be charged against the postal employees at fault,

IRREGULARITIES IN DATING MONEY ORDERS

A number of cases have been recently reported to the department where the date impressed by the M. O. B. stamp on the money-order coupon differs from the written or stamped date in the body of the order. This discrepancy causes confusion at the central and general accounting offices.

The date of the actual issue of the order must be shown in both the spaces provided on the money order and coupon, and postmasters are urged to use the utmost care to insure accuracy and to avoid discrepancies.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

EXTENSION OF COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY SERVICE TO DOMESTIC REGISTERED AND UNREGISTERED SEALED DOMESTIC MAIL OF ANY CLASS BEARING POSTAGE AT THE FIRST-CLASS RATE

The following detailed instructions are issued in connection with Order No. 8949 of the Postmaster General dated June 7, 1929, effective July 1, 1929, covering the extension of the collect-on-delivery service to registered and unregistered *sealed domestic mail of any class bearing postage at the first-class rate*:

1. The extension of the domestic collect-on-delivery service to any class of mail sealed against postal inspection and bearing the first-class rate of postage does not limit nor change the privileges of utilizing the C. O. D. service already in effect for *unregistered* third and fourth class matter unsealed or sealed subject to postal inspection, prepaid at the third or fourth class rate of postage.

2. Both registered and unregistered domestic C. O. D. articles may be mailed at and addressed to *money-order post offices* in the United States and its possessions but not to or from the Philippine Islands or the Canal Zone. They can not be accepted for mailing to or from United States naval vessels, but they may be sent to the United States naval station at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, for delivery through the station. (See art. 79, p. 133, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE.)

3. The C. O. D. fees and limits of indemnity already prescribed for third and fourth class mail will also apply to C. O. D. mail of any class sealed against postal inspection and prepaid at the first-class rate of postage, *except* when C. O. D. mail is registered. (See sec. 1071½, Postal Laws and Regulations.)

4. The amount of the C. O. D. charges will govern the amount of C. O. D. fee to be paid by the sender. For example, the sender of a domestic registered C. O. D. article shall not be allowed to pay a fee of 25 cents when the charges are in excess of \$10 merely because he may be willing to accept indemnity in the amount of \$10 or less in the event of loss, rifling, or damage. However, when the C. O. D. charges are less than the value, the sender may pay a higher fee in order to obtain indemnity for the full value within the limit of indemnity allowable for the fee paid.

5. Except as otherwise prescribed the provisions of the Postal Laws and Regulations and the instructions in the POSTAL GUIDES governing C. O. D. service for domestic third and fourth class mail are extended to cover sealed domestic C. O. D. mail of any class bearing postage at the first-class rate.

6. Domestic *C. O. D. mail sealed against postal inspection and bearing postage at the first-class rate may also be registered* upon the application of the person posting the same, under the same rules and regulations, unless otherwise stipulated, as apply to other domestic collect-on-delivery and other domestic registered mail.

7. The maximum amount of charges collectible on domestic *registered* C. O. D. mail is \$100, regardless of the amount of C. O. D. fee paid, but the maximum amount of indemnity payable for the loss, rifling, or damage of domestic registered C. O. D. mail is \$1,000, the limit fixed for other domestic registered mail; and when indemnity in excess of \$100 is desired for the loss, rifling, or damage of domestic *registered* C. O. D. mail a graduated scale of fees is chargeable ranging from 50 cents to \$1.20.

8. Except as otherwise prescribed the rules and regulations governing the payment of indemnity in connection with domestic registered mail not sent C. O. D. and domestic *unregistered* C. O. D. mail shall govern in connection with registered C. O. D. mail.

9. Domestic registered and unregistered C. O. D. articles must in all cases be based on bona fide orders for contents of articles or be mailed in conformity with agreements between the senders and addressees.

10. All indemnity claims covering domestic *registered* C. O. D. mail are to be adjusted by the Third Assistant Postmaster General (Division of Registered Mails). Claims involving domestic *unregistered* C. O. D. articles on which the first-class rate of postage has been paid are to be adjusted by postmasters or the department the same as claims involving other domestic unregistered C. O. D. mail.

11. Claims for indemnity covering both registered and unregistered domestic C. O. D. mail must be filed within six months from the date of mailing.

12. No senders' return receipts will be furnished for domestic registered C. O. D. mail, notwithstanding the fact that return receipts are furnished on request for registered mail not sent C. O. D.

13. All employees accepting domestic registered or unregistered C. O. D. mail bearing postage at the first-class rate, shall make the same inquiries as to contents and manner of packing as are required in connection with other domestic C. O. D. mail. Any necessary special indorsements should be placed on C. O. D. mail. (See par. 44 of these instructions.)

14. The seals of domestic registered or unregistered C. O. D. articles on which the first-class rate of postage has been paid should not be broken for the purpose of postal inspection.

15. Rural carriers shall accept domestic unregistered and domestic registered articles bearing postage at the first-class rate to be sent C. O. D. when requested to do so by the senders. City carriers are not required to accept any mail to be sent C. O. D.

16. When mail presented to rural carriers or at contract stations for registration to be sent C. O. D. is of such value that it can not be accepted by carriers or at such stations without unusual risk the senders shall be requested to present the matter at a classified station or at the main office, as designated by the postmaster.

17. When firm mailing sheets are not used, the sender's receipt portion of the C. O. D. tag is to be issued to the sender for sealed domestic *unregistered* C. O. D. mail the same as is done for other domestic unregistered C. O. D. mail.

18. The regulation C. O. D. tag must be filled out by the sender and securely affixed, preferably by means of adhesive tape, to each C. O. D. article (unregistered or registered) sent at the first-class rate. The face side of unregistered C. O. D. articles must bear an impression of the C. O. D. stamp showing the number of the article, the amount due the sender, the money-order fee, and the total amount to be collected. Registered C. O. D. articles must bear on the face side impressions, in close proximity to each other, of both the registry and C. O. D. stamps, which shall show the number of the article, the amount due sender, the money-order fee, and the total amount to be collected.

19. The firm registration sheet and other post-office registration records take the place of the mailing office portion and the sender's receipt coupon of the C. O. D. tag, and therefore those portions of the tag should be detached when used in connection with a domestic *registered* C. O. D. article.

20. Each domestic *registered* C. O. D. article must be given only *one original number*, which shall be the *registration number*. Where advisable a separate series of numbers may be assigned for domestic C. O. D. registered articles, and separate registration records may be maintained for such articles. Where the quantity of such mail is limited it may be registered in the same series as is assigned for other registered articles. Registered C. O. D. mail must not be recorded or given a number in the series applicable to unregistered C. O. D. mail, but the record of registered C. O. D. articles may be mixed with the record of other registered mail.

21. A receipt on a form prescribed for registered mail shall be issued to the sender of domestic registered C. O. D. articles. This receipt and the office registration records covering domestic registered C. O. D. articles must be marked "Collect on delivery" or "C. O. D." and show separately the amount of the C. O. D. charges, the C. O. D. fee, the amount (not the class) of postage paid, and amount of special delivery fee, if any, in addition to the other particulars required to be kept of *registered* mail.

22. Because of the C. O. D. indicia required to be added to the registration receipts issued for domestic registered C. O. D. mail and to the office registration records of such mail, at those offices where firm mailing sheets (Forms 3882, 3877, or 3881) are already used, such sheets should be used instead of the individual

registration receipts (Forms 3805 and 3806). Postmasters who do not now use firm mailing sheets should not make requisition for such sheets merely for domestic registered C. O. D. articles unless the quantity of such articles justifies their use, but at offices where firm mailing sheets are already in use such sheets (small Form 3882) may be used in the acceptance of individual domestic registered C. O. D. articles. When the individual receipts (Forms 3805 and 3806) are issued for domestic registered C. O. D. mail the back of such registration receipts should be utilized on which to enter the C. O. D. data required to be kept in connection with the acceptance of domestic registered C. O. D. articles.

23. Each domestic registered and unregistered C. O. D. article in the form of an envelope must also have a C. O. D. tag attached. The C. O. D. tag should be affixed to the face of the envelope if this can be done without detrimentally obscuring any portion of the address or the return card and directions of the sender. If the tag will detrimentally obscure any portion of the address or the return card of the sender the tag will be affixed to the back of the envelope. When the tag is attached to the back of a domestic registered C. O. D. article in the form of an envelope only one end of the tag should be attached to the envelope, so that the other end of the tag may be raised for inspection of the registry postmark on the back of the envelope. Because of the necessity of affixing a C. O. D. tag to each C. O. D. article, when envelopes are used for such articles the envelopes must be of sufficient size to allow adequate space for affixing the tag. For this reason the envelopes used as covers for domestic C. O. D. mail should not be smaller than 4 by 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches. The original number which will be the registration number on a registered C. O. D. article is required to be placed on each C. O. D. tag and each tag coupon. The delivery office portion and the delivering employee's coupon of the C. O. D. tag attached to registered articles must be conspicuously stamped "Registered."

24. C. O. D. mail *not registered* should be prepared for dispatch in a manner similar to that prescribed for the dispatch of special-delivery letters *not registered*, as outlined in section 836 of the Postal Laws and Regulations. Unregistered C. O. D. letters should be placed together in the dispatch and the bundle or package marked "C. O. D." When domestic C. O. D. letters, ordinary or registered, are dispatched in a bundle of mixed mail the arrangement should be in the following order: (1) Special delivery; (2) registered mail not C. O. D.; (3) registered C. O. D. mail; (4) unregistered C. O. D. mail. (See par. 26 of these instructions as to dispatch of domestic registered C. O. D. mail.)

25. Upon receipt at destination, domestic *unregistered* C. O. D. mail bearing postage at the first-class rate shall be treated in the same manner as C. O. D. mail of the third and fourth classes. At first and second class post offices such mail must be immediately turned over to the recording clerk for listing and appropriate disposition. (See art. 154, pp. 148 and 149, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE.)

26. Domestic registered C. O. D. articles shall be included with other registered mail and made up for dispatch in the manner outlined for other registered articles not sent C. O. D. (See sec. 883, Postal Laws and Regulations as amended, par. 24 of these instructions concerning the dispatch of registered matter with other mail, and secs. 894 to 915 of the Postal Laws and Regulations concerning the dispatch of registered mail exclusively.)

27. Domestic registered C. O. D. mail shall be billed and recorded under the same particulars as other domestic registered mail not sent C. O. D.

28. When the quantity or bulk of domestic registered C. O. D. articles is sufficient to warrant the use of a separate pouch, sack, or jacket, the bill should be headed to indicate that the articles described thereon are C. O. D. articles.

29. The *dispatching* records of domestic registered C. O. D. articles need not have the amount of the C. O. D. charges entered therein, but when the entire dispatch is not composed exclusively of C. O. D. mail the indorsement "C. O. D." should appear opposite the entry of each registered C. O. D. parcel dispatched with the other registered mail.

30. For the present at least it appears advisable to have domestic *registered* C. O. D. articles retained and delivered, forwarded or returned, by the registry sections of post offices instead of such articles being turned over to the C. O. D. sections for handling in connection with domestic C. O. D. articles which are not registered. It is contemplated that the domestic registered C. O. D. articles will be included with the other registered articles received for delivery at post offices and be handled in accordance with the methods prescribed for handling other registered mail. Care should be exercised, however, to maintain on the

office records of domestic registered C. O. D. articles such additional data as is required to be kept in connection with domestic unregistered C. O. D. mail.

31. In opening pouches at offices of address all mail received should be carefully examined in order that C. O. D. mail may be properly segregated and treated as such. All registered mail should be scrutinized in the same manner in checking it, in order to note whether any of it is C. O. D. matter. (See art. 144, p. 146, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE.)

32. Notices of the arrival of domestic registered C. O. D. mail are to be issued on the form for "Notice of Arrival of Insured or C. O. D. Mail" (Form 3849-b) instead of the form for "Notice of Arrival of Registered Mail" (Form 3849) but the Form 3849-b should be conspicuously indorsed "Registered." The C. O. D. form is better adapted than the registry form for registered C. O. D. mail because all the information on the C. O. D. form is applicable to registered C. O. D. mail, whereas part of the information on the registry form is inapplicable and would be misleading.

33. If any domestic registered C. O. D. articles are received mixed with unregistered C. O. D. articles steps should be immediately taken to place the registered C. O. D. mail under the protection of the registry service.

34. The instructions in articles 115 and 116, page 139, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE, relative to the efforts which are to be made to effect delivery of C. O. D. mail, and the instructions in article 123, page 140, and article 127, pages 141 and 142, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE, relative to the notification of the sender are equally applicable to domestic registered C. O. D. mail.

35. The delivery-office portion of the C. O. D. tag is to be used at all post offices instead of Form 3849 on which to take the receipts of the addressees for domestic registered C. O. D. articles whether delivery is made at the desk or by carrier.

36. Examination of the contents of a domestic registered C. O. D. article before the addressee or his authorized agent has receipted for the article and paid all the charges shall not be permitted. (See art. 145, p. 146, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE.)

37. All employees at first and second class post offices making delivery of domestic registered C. O. D. articles, whether at the main office or at the stations, shall enter daily on the "Consolidated Daily Report to Bookkeeper or Designated Supervisory Official of all C. O. D. Funds Collected" (Form 3814-d) the information called for thereon. The Form 3814-d used for C. O. D. registers should be separate from the 3814-d used for other C. O. D. articles, the form being indorsed "Registered." The clerk in the registry section assigning registered C. O. D. articles for delivery by carrier shall not have custody of or access to Form 3814-d. After being properly filled out by all employees effecting delivery of registered C. O. D. mail such form shall be sent daily to the bookkeeper, if the post office is organized on the 2-division plan, otherwise to such supervisory official as may be designated to receive it, to be checked with the record of C. O. D. money orders issued for registered articles. The daily report of the money-order section of C. O. D. money orders issued should show separately the record of money orders issued for registered and unregistered C. O. D. articles. At third and fourth class offices the *C. O. D. charges collected* in connection with domestic registered C. O. D. articles should be handled in the same manner as the *charges* for domestic unregistered C. O. D. articles.

38. At first and second class post offices the registry section shall transfer daily to the money-order section all C. O. D. funds collected for domestic registered C. O. D. articles, together with the receipted C. O. D. tags, and obtain receipt therefor, showing the individual article number and total number of registered C. O. D. articles represented thereby and the individual C. O. D. charges and total amount of money turned over for the issuance of the money orders corresponding thereto. The "C. O. D. receipt" (Form 3815) is specially designed for this purpose, and when used for registered C. O. D. articles each receipt should be indorsed across its face at the top with the word "Registered." When the money orders are issued, which shall be the same day if practicable, they should be turned over, together with the C. O. D. tags, to either the registry section or to the recording clerk or C. O. D. delivery section charged with the checking of money orders issued for unregistered C. O. D. articles for verification with the entries on Form 3815 before the money orders are actually mailed. If the verification is made by the recording clerk or C. O. D. delivery section instead of the registry section, Form 3815 should be made out in the registry section in duplicate, the original receipt being retained in the registry section and

the duplicate being transferred direct by the registry section to the recording clerk or C. O. D. delivery section for use in verification of the issue of the money orders the same as is now required for the checking of the issue of money orders covering unregistered articles. (See art. 154 (g), p. 149, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE.) The C. O. D. tags should be returned to the money-order section for filing, and the remitters' receipts detached from the money orders issued will be retained in the registry section by the recording clerk or in the C. O. D. delivery section, depending upon where the issue of the money orders was verified, to be attached to and filed with the related "C. O. D. receipt," Form 3815. In making out the "C. O. D. receipt" in the registry section those offices which use an inward number should place both the original number and the inward number on Form 3815.

39. Form 3868, "Carrier's receipt for undelivered registered mail returned and receipts for registered mail delivered," may be utilized in receipting to carriers for undelivered domestic registered C. O. D. articles returned, and the same form may be used in receipting to carriers for C. O. D. charges turned in for registered mail, any necessary minor changes in the wording on the form being made to cover the receipt of the C. O. D. charges.

40. Claims for indemnity for the loss, rifling, or damage of domestic registered C. O. D. mail or of alleged failure to receive the C. O. D. charges on such mail should be filed on Form 565, "Application for indemnity for loss, damage, or rifling of registered mail," which should be marked "Collect on delivery" or "C. O. D." In addition to the data required to be furnished on Form 565 such of the information called for under items 3, 6, 7, 11, 23, 25 (b), 25 (c), and 29 on Form 3812, "Application for indemnity for loss, rifling, or damage of insured and C. O. D. parcel," as may be applicable should be furnished either on Form 565 or on Form 3812 attached thereto.

41. No additional postage is chargeable for forwarding or returning domestic registered or unregistered C. O. D. mail on which the first-class rate of postage was fully prepaid at the time of mailing, but if through inadvertence such mail is accepted not fully prepaid any deficiency in postage or fee should be collected upon delivery. After proper delivery has been made of domestic registered or unregistered C. O. D. mail it can not be forwarded or returned unless remailed anew and upon payment of additional postage. Matter subject to the first-class rate of postage remailed after delivery may not be insured but may be registered if indemnity is desired, in which event additional fee as well as postage is required.

42. Postmasters shall keep such records as will enable them to report promptly at the close of each fiscal year, as separate items, the number of C. O. D. *domestic unregistered* articles mailed at each of the several fees on which the first-class rate of postage is paid and the number of such articles sent as *registered* C. O. D. mail at each of the several prescribed fees.

43. The initial and final records of domestic *registered* C. O. D. articles are to be held for four years and intermediate records of such mail for two years before being disposed of, the same as is required in the case of *other registry records*. (See art. 33, p. 98, of the July, 1928, POSTAL GUIDE.)

44. Too much stress can not be laid upon the requirement that articles sent C. O. D. at the first-class rate of postage must be based upon bona fide orders for the contents or in conformity with agreements between senders and addressees. (See sec. 1074, par. 2, Postal Laws and Regulations.) It must be distinctly understood that the extension of the C. O. D. service to mail matter prepaid at the first-class rate of postage does not mean that the C. O. D. service beginning July 1, 1929, will be available for use in the collection of debts, whether just or unjust. Legislation extending the C. O. D. service to sealed matter bearing first-class postage was recommended as the result of considerable demand upon the part of mailers of deeds, abstracts of title, insurance policies, bills of lading representing freight shipments, valuable light-weight merchandise, etc. It will not be permissible for patrons to send bills or statements of indebtedness by unregistered or registered C. O. D. mail, even though the sender may allege that the addressee has agreed to the collection of the amount involved in this manner. The department does not contemplate or countenance the misuse of the C. O. D. service for the collection of debts. In order to prevent the C. O. D. service on mail matter bearing postage at the first-class rate from being misused as an agency for the collection of debts, inquiry shall be made of persons presenting such articles to be sent C. O. D. as to the contents and whether the addressee had consented to the shipment being sent as C. O. D. mail except that inquiries of this kind need not be made in connection with C. O. D. shipments presented for mailing by patrons shipping articles

properly entitled to be sent C. O. D. as first-class mail and who are known to obtain bona fide orders for such shipments. If upon inquiry it is ascertained that the mailer intends to use the C. O. D. service for the collection of a debt, the matter should not be accepted as C. O. D. mail.

45. Postmasters will give as wide publicity as possible, without expense to the department, to the extension of the domestic C. O. D. service to mail matter of any class which is sealed and bears first-class postage and to the arrangement which has been made for the registration of such matter on the application of the sender.

The Following Notice Was Issued from the Bureau of the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General

RURAL AND STAR ROUTE CARRIERS REQUESTED TO MAKE REPORT OF FOREST FIRES DISCOVERED BY THEM ALONG THEIR ROUTES

In accordance with the request of the Secretary of Agriculture, this department has arranged a plan of cooperation with the State and national forest officers whereby rural and star route carriers shall report forest fires discovered by them along their routes to persons designated by the State and national authorities to receive such intelligence.

Cooperation with State officers will be given in all States containing national forests.

It is desired that rural and star route carriers shall afford the utmost assistance to the State and national forest officers in reporting forest fires which shall come to their attention, the Department of Agriculture having stated that this assistance has been a very essential part of the efforts made to reduce the usual heavy losses from forest fires.

The State and national authorities will inform postmasters as to whom the discovery of fires should be reported, and each rural carrier should be directed by the postmaster to cooperate to the fullest extent with such authorities in the matter agreed upon, namely, that the carrier shall report a fire to the nearest State fire warden or national forest officer on his route, or if no such warden or officer lives on the route, to arrange through some responsible citizen to have him notified, by telephone if possible. Star-route contractors and carriers are included in the plan of cooperation and should be requested to report the discovery of fires in the same manner as will be done by the rural carriers.

RURAL CARRIERS MAY NOT SERVE AS CENSUS ENUMERATORS

The laws governing dual employment in the classified service prohibit rural carriers and other postal employees from receiving pay for additional service of any kind under any other department of the Federal Government. Therefore, rural carriers, regardless of salary, may not serve as census enumerators.

NOTICE OF IMPORTANT CORRECTION TO BE MADE IN THE COPIES OF THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS AND GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS APPLICABLE TO THE RURAL MAIL SERVICE IN POSSESSION OF RURAL CARRIERS

The postmaster at every office from which rural routes are operated is directed to instruct the rural carriers at his office to note the following correction of section 1074 as it appears in the volume of the Postal Laws and Regulations and General Instructions Applicable to the Rural Mail Service:

"Sec. 1074. (a) Third and fourth class (parcel post) matter may be sent collect on delivery between money-order offices of the United States and its possessions, but not to or from the Philippine Islands, the Canal Zone, or United States naval vessels, on payment of the following fees in addition to the postage:

“(b) The fee for collect-on-delivery service shall be 12 cents for collections not to exceed \$10; 15 cents for collections not to exceed \$50; and 25 cents for collections not to exceed \$100. (Act of February 28, 1925.)

“(c) Parcels on which the remittance is \$10 or less or \$50 or less, but on which, because of the value of the inclosure, insurance exceeding \$10 or \$50 is desired, may have a 15 or 25 cent fee paid thereon, at the option of the sender, but the sender shall not be permitted to pay a fee of only 12 or 15 cents when the amount to be remitted is greater than \$10 or \$50, respectively, although willing to accept indemnity for only \$10 or \$50 as the case may be. Both postage and fee shall be prepaid with stamps affixed. The collect-on-delivery fee shall cover also insurance against loss or irreparable damage of entire contents include postage (exclusive of fee), rifling, damage, and nonreceipt of returns up to \$10, \$50, and \$100, respectively, according to the fee paid. (See sec. 525 as to postmarking collect-on-delivery mail with date of mailing.)”

Compliance with this instruction is important in order that carriers may know the proper fees to be charged for C. O. D. matter mailed on rural routes.

Attention is called also to paragraph 70 on page 131 of the Postal Guide for July, 1928.

Postmasters are authorized to grant to rural carriers who are members of these organizations, leave of absence, upon application in the usual manner, for as many days as may be necessary, not exceeding 15 days in the case of the national convention and not exceeding 6 days in the case of State conventions, to attend these meetings.

Such leave of absence will be charged to the annual leave of the carriers, if they have sufficient annual leave to their credit; otherwise leave without pay will be granted.

The services of the bonded substitute will be utilized in the performance of service over a route in the absence of the regular carrier. In cases where there is no bonded substitute or the bonded substitute is not available, the postmaster will secure some suitable person to act as temporary carrier, administering to him the required oath of office.

CHANGES TO BE INSERTED IN THE JULY, 1928, GUIDE

CHANGE No. 171 (Quarterly payment letters from Indian agencies, p. 30).

Page 30, paragraph 189, of the current Postal Guide should be amended by the addition of the following:

"Letters mailed by the Osage Indian Agency, Pawhuska, Okla., bearing the above-mentioned indorsement, must be delivered in person to the addressee, unless he has on file with the postmaster a written order designating some other person to act as his agent and receive this mail, in which case it must be delivered personally to the designated agent. These letters must not be delivered to a post-office box, private mail receptacle, door slot, or rural box. When the addressee receives mail through a post-office box, a notice should be placed in his box requesting that he call at the window for this mail. In case the addressee receives delivery of his mail either by city or rural carrier, a notice should be placed in his mail receptacle requesting him to meet the carrier on his next regular trip or to call at the office for this mail."

CHANGE No. 172 (Canada, p. 260).

The following should be added to the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Canada—Regular Mails" on page 260:

Market Financial Service, published at 40 Exchange Place, New York, N. Y.

CHANGE No. 173 (El Salvador, p. 192):

Postmasters in the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, and fourteenth divisions of the Railway Mail Service will send letter mail, prints, and samples for El Salvador via New Orleans and parcel-post packages by way of San Francisco, Calif., except that parcel post originating in the fifth, sixth, seventh, tenth, and fourteenth divisions should be dispatched by way of New York, when it can be advanced in delivery by such dispatch.

Postmasters in the eighth and thirteenth divisions will send letter mail for El Salvador to New Orleans, and other mail to San Francisco or San Pedro, Calif.

The foregoing supersedes the item "Salvador (El)" on page 192 as modified by the announcement issued by this office under date of February 28 and published as change No. 134 on page 61 of the March Supplement.

CHANGE No. 174 (Gold Coast Colony, p. 322):

A parcel-post agreement has been concluded with the Gold Coast Colony which provides for the direct exchange of parcel-post packages between that colony and this country, including Alaska, Hawaii, Porto Rico, Guam, Samoa, and the Virgin Islands of the United States. Note thereof should be made in connection with the information concerning the parcel-post service with that colony on page 322.

Beginning on the date named, parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in the Gold Coast Colony will no longer be subject to the payment of a transit charge, but will be subject to the payment of the postage rate of 14 cents a pound or fraction thereof, as at present.

The only other change in the existing parcel-post service with the Gold Coast Colony will be that refused parcels must be returned at once from the post office from which they were received, marked "Refused," while other parcels which can not be delivered must be returned at the expiration of 30 days (as at present) after being marked to show the cause of nondelivery, as "Unclaimed," etc., unless the parcels were marked by the senders to be otherwise disposed of, as "Abandon" or "If not deliverable as addressed, deliver to _____," in which case the parcels must be disposed of as instructed by the senders.

CHANGE No. 175 (Gold Coast Colony, p. 322):

The information appearing in the second paragraph under the parcel-post table on page 322 should be modified to read as follows:

"*Aboso, Aburi, Accra, Achiasi, Ada, Adawso, Adeiso, Akrofuom, Akrokeri, Akropong (Akwapim), Akuse, Anyinam, Apam, Asuboi, Atwabo, Axim, Bekwai, Bompata, Cape Coast, Denu, Dixcove, Dodowa, Dunkwa, Efiduasi, Ejisu, Elmina, Foso, Half Assini, Ho, Huhunia, Huni Valley, Juaso, Keta, Kibi, Kintampo, Koforidua, Konongo, Kpong, Kumasi, Kwanyaku, Mampong (Ashanti), Mangoase, Nkawkaw, Nkoranza, Nsawam, Nsuta, Nyakrom, Obuasi, Oda, Opon Valley, Otrokpe, Pakro, Prestea, Salaga, Saltpond, Sekondi, Shama, Somanya, Suhum, Sunyani, Swedru, Tafo, Takoradi, Tamale, Tarkwa, Winneba, Yeji."

CHANGE No. 176 (Iraq, p. 344, Persia, 406):

The transit charges applicable to parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Iraq and Persia for dispatch via the Desert Motor Service have been changed as follows:

The transit charges mentioned above are in addition to the postage rate of 14 cents for each pound or fraction of a pound; both postage rates and transit charges must be prepaid by postage stamps affixed to parcels at time of mailing.

The Desert Motor Service now operates from Damascus instead of Haifa.

CHANGE No. 177 (Air Mail Service, via France, sec. 9, pp. 173-174):

The air mail routes shown in the subjoined table are those available during the summer for the dispatch from France of articles in the regular mails posted in this country. Section 9, on pages 173 and 174 is modified accordingly.

Special attention is called to the fact that the air mail fee shown is *in addition* to the ordinary postage and special delivery or registration fee, or both.

Mail matter intended for dispatch by the above-mentioned air mail service should have affixed blue labels reading, "Par avion—by air mail" and be marked in addition, "From France," or should be marked in the upper left-hand corner of the envelopes or covers with the words "By air mail (Par avion) from France."

All articles for this service will be dispatched to New York for onward transmission from that exchange office.

CHANGE No. 178 (Central America, etc., p. 192):

Postmasters in the fourth, fifth, eleventh, and twelfth divisions of the Railway Mail Service will send all articles, including parcel post, for the Central American countries named above via New Orleans. Postmasters in the sixth, seventh, tenth, and fourteenth divisions will send all articles, including parcel post, via New Orleans, unless they can be advanced via New York, when they should be forwarded via the latter port.

Postmasters in the eighth and thirteenth divisions of the Railway Mail Service will send all articles, including parcel post, for the countries named by way of New Orleans, except that prints and parcel-post mails for Amapala, Choluteca, Nacaome, and Tegucigalpa, in Republic of Honduras, parcel-post mails for the west coast of Guatemala and Nicaragua, and all articles, including parcel post, for Corinto, Nicaragua, and offices in Nicaragua supplied from Corinto should be dispatched via San Francisco and San Pedro, Calif., unless specially addressed otherwise.

The notice of this office published on page 11 of the November Supplement, is modified accordingly.

CHANGE No. 179 (Change No. 121, p. 61, February Supplement):

The following supersedes the information appearing under the caption, Circulars Secured with Gummed Stickers Prohibited in Prints Mails to The Netherlands, and as Change No. 121 on page 61 of the February, 1929, supplement to the annual Postal Guide.

The Postal Administration of The Netherlands has now advised that circulars secured with gummed stickers will be delivered to addressees without collection of additional postage when prepaid at the postage rate applicable to printed matter.

CHANGE No. 180 (post office):

The post office at East Barnet, Vt., will be advanced from the fourth to the third class under the provisions of the unusual conditions clause in the act of February 28, 1925, and the salary of the postmaster fixed at the rate of \$1,900 per annum, effective July 1, 1929.

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

INSERT No. 459. ORDER No. 8812.

MAY 1, 1929.

Section 1405 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to omit the first paragraph as now stated and to restate paragraph 1 to read as follows:

“(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), for transportation of the mails, (1) between the United States or its Territories or possessions and any foreign country, (2) between the United States and its possessions or its naval or military forces abroad, or (3) between any such possession or naval or military forces and any other such possession or naval or military forces, the Postmaster General may allow, in the case of a vessel of the United States, compensation not in excess of 80 cents a pound for letters and post cards and 8 cents a pound for other articles (including parcel post), and in the case of a foreign vessel, compensation not in excess of the sea transit rates prescribed from time to time by the Universal Postal Union Convention: *Provided*, That nothing herein shall limit the authority of the Postmaster General to enter into contracts for the transportation of mails under the provisions of the merchant marine act of 1923 at the rates of compensation therein authorized. (Act of February 14, 1929.)

“(b) The provisions of subdivision (a) of this section shall not limit the compensation for transportation of mail which the Postmaster General may pay under contracts entered into in accordance with the provisions of section 4007 of the Revised Statutes (sec. 1401) or section 24 of the merchant marine act, 1920 (sec. 1407). (Act of July 3, 1926.)

“(c) In the case of mails transported between the United States or its territories or possessions and any foreign country and in the case of mails transported between the United States and its possessions or its naval or military forces abroad, or between any such possession or naval or military forces and any other such possession or naval or military forces, payment for such transportation shall be made out of the appropriation for the ‘transportation of foreign mails.’ (Act of July 3, 1926.)”

* * * * *

INSERT No. 460. ORDER No. 8812.

MAY 1, 1929.

Section 1409 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to add paragraph 2 as follows:

“2. Except as otherwise provided by treaty or convention the Postmaster General may require the transportation by any steamships of mail between the United States and any foreign port at the compensation fixed under authority of law. Upon refusal by the master or the commander of such steamship or vessel to accept the mail, when tendered by the Postmaster General or his representative, the collector or other officer of the port empowered to grant clearance, on notice of the refusal aforesaid, shall withhold clearance until the collector or other officer of the port is informed by the Postmaster General or his representative that the master or commander of the steamship or vessel has accepted the mail or that conveyance by his steamship or vessel is no longer required by the Postmaster General. (Act of February 6, 1929.)”

* * * * *

INSERT No. 461. ORDER No. 8812.

MAY 1, 1929.

Section 1410½ of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to read as follows:
“1. When in his judgment the public interest will be promoted thereby the Postmaster General is authorized to enter into contracts for air mail service on routes between the United States and possessions or Territories of the United States, between possessions or Territories of the United States, between the United States or possessions or Territories of the United States and foreign countries, and in and between foreign countries, for the transportation of mails

of the United States and its possessions or Territories both ways over the routes, and in addition thereto mails of other countries on the outbound or the inbound flights under arrangements he may make with such countries, for periods of not more than 10 years, and to pay for such service at fixed rates per pound and/or per mile; and the Postmaster General is hereby authorized to award such contracts to the bidders that he shall find to be the lowest responsible bidders that can satisfactorily perform the service required to the best advantage of the Government: *Provided*, That the rate to be paid for such service for the load of mails provided by the Postmaster General to be carried in a plane shall not in any case exceed \$2 per mile each way, plus not exceeding \$1 per pound per thousand miles, or pro rata thereof for greater or less mileage, for any mails required to be carried in the same plane in excess of the specified load, and that, at the request of the Postmaster General, domestic mail shall be conveyed without additional charge on that part of the route in the United States to the border of the United States and to intermediate points: *Provided further*, That the Postmaster General may make arrangements with concessionaires operating air mail service in foreign countries for transportation by their service of mails of the United States and its possessions or Territories: *And provided further*, That in the award and interpretation of the contracts herein authorized the decision of the Postmaster General shall be final and not subject to review by any officer or tribunal of the United States except by the President and the Federal courts.

"2. The Postmaster General shall make and issue such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.

"3. All contracts heretofore made by the Postmaster General under section 1 of the act of March 8, 1928, entitled 'An act to grant authority to the Postmaster General to enter into contracts for the transportation of mails by air to foreign countries and insular possessions of the United States for periods of not more than ten years and to pay for such service at fixed rates per pound or per mile, and for other purposes,' as originally enacted, may be amended under agreement of the parties thereto so as provide for the transportation of excess mails and for transportation not covered by the existing contract of mails of the United States and its possessions or Territories or of foreign countries, at not exceeding the contract rate per mile and not exceeding the rates per pound provided in section 1 hereof (par. 1 above) for excess mails. (Act of March 2, 1929.)"

MAY 1, 1929.

INSERT No. 462. ORDER No. 8812.

Section 1418 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended so as to add paragraph 3, as follows:

"3. The Postmaster General is authorized to assign railway postal clerks and substitute railway postal clerks to temporary employment as substitute sea-post clerks, whenever, in his opinion, such employment is necessary. Such employees shall receive credit on their Railway Mail Service records for the time employed in the sea-post service, but shall be allowed the salary and expenses of a class 1 sea-post clerk, payable out of the appropriation available for maintaining sea-post service, in lieu of any other salary and expense. (Act of February 14, 1929.)"

MAY 2, 1929.

INSERT No. 463. ORDER No. 8813.

Effective July 1, 1929, section 448 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 is amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 448. The Postmaster General may provide by regulation for furnishing to the sender a receipt showing the mailing of ordinary mail of any class, and for the payment of such fee as he may prescribe for such receipt: *Provided*, That the furnishing of such receipt shall not place any liability on the Post Office Department or its revenues." (Act of February 14, 1929.)

2. Upon request and the payment of 1 cent for each piece of mail involved, the postmaster at the mailing office shall furnish a receipt (certificate of mailing) to the sender of domestic ordinary mail of any class, and shall furnish the sender as many additional receipts (certificates of mailing) for the same article as may be requested upon payment of 1 cent for each piece of mail described on each

receipt. Uncanceled postage stamps to cover the charge for the receipts shall be affixed to the receipts and canceled by the postmark of the mailing office.

3. Record shall be kept showing the number of senders' receipts (certificates of mailing) issued for domestic mail and the number of articles covered by such receipts.

INSERT No. 464. ORDER No. 8858.

MAY 10, 1929.

Paragraph 2, section 484½, Postal Laws and Regulations, is amended to read as follows:

"2. The matter that may be sent free of postage in the domestic mails under the provisions of this section embraces all correspondence of the members of the Diplomatic Corps of the Pan American countries and Spain; and it likewise embraces the official correspondence exchanged between the consulates of such of these countries as have put this provision into effect in their own countries and that which is directed by such consulates to the Government of the United States. (See current annual Postal Guide for list of these countries.) These provisions do not apply to merchandise (fourth-class or parcel-post matter) or to articles other than written or printed correspondence within the usual meaning of that term. Such correspondence shall not exceed 4 pounds in weight. (Sec. 450.)"

MAY 15, 1929.

Paragraph 5, of section 609, Postal Laws and Regulations, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"5. First-class, ordinary mail, bearing the senders' return requests, which is not deliverable at the street or post-office-box addresses placed thereon by the senders shall be given directory service; and if addresses the correctness of which is reasonably certain are not found, such mail shall be returned at once to the senders without regard to the number of days specified or implied by the return cards thereon. Such mail shall not be placed in the general delivery nor held to await call."

MAY 28, 1929.

The first paragraph of section 610, Postal Laws and Regulations, is amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 610. Ordinary mail of the first class (except that described in paragraph 5 of section 609 and single postal cards and post cards), bearing the name and address of the sender without a request specifying a number of days, which after proper service remains undelivered shall not be advertised but shall be returned to the sender at the expiration of—

"Five days if intended for delivery by village or rural carrier.

"Ten days if intended for general delivery service at an office having city carrier service.

"Fifteen days from offices not having city carrier service unless intended for delivery by village or rural carrier."

MAY 24, 1929.

Section 1016 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 1016. When a short-paid or unpaid registered article in the regular or parcel-post mails (except when it has been forwarded as provided in sec. 1010) is received at an exchange office for dispatch to a foreign country, the postmaster at such exchange office shall attach ordinary postage stamps sufficient to cover the deficiency, forward the letter or parcel to its destination, and notify the postmaster at the mailing office, on Form 3847, of the amount of such deficiency. On receipt of such notice the postmaster at the mailing office shall immediately remit this amount, in uncanceled ordinary postage stamps, to the postmaster at the exchange office, with the return of the notice. (See secs. 217 and 863.)"

If the postmaster at the mailing office fails to make such remittance, the postmaster at the exchange office shall report the matter to the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service."

JUNE 7, 1929.

Effective July 1, 1929, the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 are modified by further amending sections 1072 and 1070 and adding a new heading and a new section 1071 $\frac{1}{2}$, as follows:

The first paragraph of section 1072 is further amended by the addition of the following subparagraphs (c) and (d):

SEC. 1072.

"(c) 'That the provisions * * * with respect to the insurance and collect-on-delivery services * * * are hereby extended so as to authorize the Postmaster General, under such rules and regulations as he may prescribe, to provide collect-on-delivery service for sealed domestic mail matter of any class bearing postage at the first-class rate and to fix the fees and limits of indemnity for such service.' (Act of February 14, 1929.)

"NOTE.—The omitted portions of this act refer to previous legislation which directed the establishment of insurance and collect-on-delivery services for fourth-class (parcel-post) mail, extended such services to third-class mail, and prescribed insurance and collect-on-delivery fees.

"This law simply extends the domestic collect-on-delivery service to any class of mail sealed against postal inspection bearing the first-class rate of postage. It does not limit or change the privilege of utilizing the collect-on-delivery service already in effect for unregistered third and fourth class matter unsealed or sealed subject to postal inspection prepaid at the third or fourth class rate of postage.

"The collect-on-delivery fees and limits of indemnity already prescribed for the third and fourth classes of mail will also apply to domestic collect-on-delivery mail of any class sealed against postal inspection and prepaid at the first-class rate of postage, *except* when collect-on-delivery mail is *registered*, concerning which see section 1071 $\frac{1}{2}$.

"(d) Except as otherwise prescribed the provisions of the Postal Laws and Regulations and the instructions in the Postal Guides governing collect-on-delivery service for domestic third and fourth class mail are extended to cover sealed domestic collect-on-delivery mail of any class bearing postage at the first-class rate. (See sec. 1071 $\frac{1}{2}$ as to domestic *registered* collect-on-delivery mail.)"

Section 1070 is amended by inserting the words "see sec. 861" in lieu of the words "see sec. 863" in the first line of the first paragraph and by adding a cross reference after paragraph 8, reading as follows:

Add a new heading and a new section 1071½, reading as follows:

“DOMESTIC REGISTERED COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY MAIL

“SEC. 1071½. Domestic collect-on-delivery mail sealed against postal inspection and bearing postage at the first-class rate may also be registered upon application of the person posting the same. The rules and regulations applicable to other domestic collect-on-delivery and other domestic registered mail will also apply to domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail unless otherwise stipulated. (See amended sec. 1072, par. 1 (c), citing the act of February 14, 1929, authorizing the Postmaster General to extend the collect-on-delivery service to sealed domestic mail of any class bearing postage at the first-class rate and to fix the fees and limits of indemnity for such service.)

“2. Domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail must be sealed and bear postage at the first-class rate.

“3. The maximum amount of charges collectible on domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail is \$100 regardless of the amount of C. O. D. fee paid in excess of that required for the collection of \$100, but the maximum indemnity payable for the loss, rifling, or damage of domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail is \$1,000, the limit fixed for other domestic registered mail.

“4. The amounts to be collected upon delivery, not exceeding \$100, the limits of indemnity payable covering the amounts collectible, and the fees chargeable therefor in addition to the postage on domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail, are as follows:

Amount of C. O. D. charges and limits of indemnity payable up to \$100	C. O. D. fee (including registration)
Not over \$10	\$0. 25
From \$10.01 to \$50	. 30
From \$50.01 to \$100	. 40

“5. When indemnity in excess of \$100 is desired for the loss, rifling, or damage of domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail, the following collect-on-delivery fees, which include registration, are chargeable in addition to the postage:

Amount of indemnity desired regardless of amount of C. O. D. charges	C. O. D. fee (including registration)
For indemnity exceeding \$100 and not exceeding \$200	\$0. 50
For indemnity exceeding \$200 and not exceeding \$300	. 60
For indemnity exceeding \$300 and not exceeding \$400	. 70
For indemnity exceeding \$400 and not exceeding \$500	. 80
For indemnity exceeding \$500 and not exceeding \$600	. 90
For indemnity exceeding \$600 and not exceeding \$700	1. 00
For indemnity exceeding \$700 and not exceeding \$800	1. 10
For indemnity exceeding \$800 and not exceeding \$1,000	1. 20

“6. Except as otherwise prescribed, the rules and regulations governing the payment of indemnity in connection with domestic registered mail not sent collect on delivery and domestic unregistered collect-on-delivery mail shall govern in connection with domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail. (See secs. 1070 and 1075.)

“7. Domestic registered collect-on-delivery articles shall in all cases be based on bona fide orders for their contents, or be mailed in conformity with agreements between the senders and the addressees. (See amended sec. 1074, par. 2.) The department reserves the right to decline to pay any indemnity involved in connection with domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail not ordered by the addressees or not sent in conformity with bona fide agreements between the senders and the addressees.

“8. Each domestic registered collect-on-delivery article must be given one original number, which shall be the registration number.

“9. No senders' return receipts will be furnished for domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail.

“10. No indemnity will be paid on account of the loss, rifling, or damage of domestic registered collect-on-delivery mail if claim is not made within six months from the date of mailing of the article, unless it is established to the satis-

Rural Mail Boxes

The No. 2 (Large Size) Mail Box Only Shall be Provided and Erected by Patrons of Rural and Star Routes on and After July 1, 1929

All approved rural mail boxes now in use on rural and star routes may be continued in use so long as they remain weatherproof and serviceable.

Patrons on new routes, new patrons on existing routes or extensions thereof, or patrons desiring to provide boxes of sufficient capacity to contain parcel-post mail, will be required to furnish the No. 2 (large size) box on and after July 1, 1929.

A list of the names and addresses of the authorized manufacturers of the new type No. 2 box which was recently approved by the Postmaster General will be found on page 23 of this Supplement, and will be published in the Postal Guide for July, 1929.
