MAIL DOOR SLOTS—OFFICE BUILDINGS

ORDER NO. 9905.

FEBRUARY 12, 1930.

In order to adequately provide for the safe delivery to suites in office buildings of not only letters but other mail of larger size when the entrances are locked, it is ordered that hereafter door slots for the delivery of mail in office buildings shall conform to the following specifications:

(1) The clear opening in the outside slot plate shall be $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide and 7 inches in length. The size of the chute shall conform to the slot-plate opening.

(2) The horizontal center line of the outside plate shall be located not less than 30 inches from the finished floor line.

(3) If the slot is placed horizontally in the door the chute shall be placed at an angle of not less than 12° and not more than 35° from the horizontal, downward from the outside of the door; and if the slot is placed vertically in the door, the chute shall be at an angle of not less than 12° and not more than 35° toward the hinged side of the door.

(4) The outside slot plate shall be equipped with a spring flap hinged at the top if the slot is placed horizontally, and hinged at the side nearest the center of the door if the slot is placed vertically. When hinged flap is pushed back into chute there shall be a clear unobstructed passage for mail.

(5) In case it is desired in order to insure greater privacy, it is permissible to attach a hinged flap on the inside plate, providing such an arrangement will not obstruct the passage of mail as ordered above.

PROPER FILLING OF FORM 1516

It has been brought to the attention of the department that many offices in filling out Form 1516 for the purpose of making inquiry about an article reported lost in the mails frequently write the word "merchandise" in the space marked "contents." In view of the fact that more than one-third of all articles lost in the mails are without address or "loose in the mails," it is apparent that describing the contents as "merchandise" would in a proportionately large number of cases be of no assistance in locating the missing articles.

Postmasters and postal employees using Form 1516 are therefore instructed to definitely name or describe the articles inquired about.

CREDIT FOR PERMIT MAILINGS IN DETERMINING SALARIES OF STATION SUPERINTENDENTS

Postmasters frequently ask whether a station handling permit matter where the postage for such mailings is deposited at the main office should be given credit for the amount of such deposit.

The station superintendent should be credited in determining his compensation, with the postage on all mailings of permit matter provided the mailings are actually distributed in the station. However, the fact that a patron within a district makes a deposit at the main office does not entitle the superintendent to credit in that amount if the superintendent simply accepts the mailing and verifies the statement of mailing and then dispatches the mailing to a centralized unit for distribution and dispatch.

C. A. M. Route 27

POST OFFICES AND RAILWAY POST OFFICES AUTHORIZED TO EXCHANGE PARCEL POST WITH CANADA RAILWAY POST OFFICES WILL DISPATCH ONLY

For the information of postmasters and railway postal clerks, there is shown below a list of those post offices and railway post offices which are authorized to participate in the exchange of parcel post with Canada.

All other post offices will send parcel-post packages for Canada to or in the direction of a post office or railway post office indicated in the following list. Should direct closed sacks containing parcel mails be received from Canada at any post office not named below, such closed sacks should be forwarded intact at the first opportunity to the nearest authorized exchange post office indicated in the list, and a bulletin of verification sent to the Canadian dispatching exchange office advising of the irregular dispatch and of the corrective action taken. Should direct closed parcel mails from Canada be labeled to a railway post office, said sacks will be forwarded intact to the appropriate post office named hereunder and a similar bulletin of verification sent to the Canadian exchange office concerned.

COUNT OF PARCEL POST EXCHANGED WITH CANADA APRIL 1 TO 7, INCLUSIVE, 1930

To serve as a basis on which to adjust accounts between the United States and Canada covering parcel-post packages dispatched and received, a count will be made at all authorized United States exchange post offices and railway post offices named in the list published in the announcement immediately preceding, this count to be made during the period April 1 to 7, both dates inclusive. No post office or railway post office not named in the authorized list published in the announcement mentioned should participate in this count.

Only parcel-post packages (which must have customs declarations attached thereto), contained in direct closed dispatches from an authorized United States exchange post office or railway post office to a Canadian exchange post office, and in direct closed dispatches from a Canadian post office or railway post office to a United States exchange post office, shall be included in this count. In the first case the count must be made by the authorized United States post office or railway post office making up the parcel mail, while in the case of the

parcel mails received the count shall be made only by the authorized United States exchange post office to which the parcel mail is labeled or reforwarded (in the case of mislabeled sacks). The post office or railway post office making up direct closed sacks of parcel post for Canada should invariably mark the label of the sack with the words "Counted in U. S. A." in bold letters, so as to guard against the parcels being inadvertently counted a second time while en route to Canada.

In case any designated United States post office or railway post office has not received instructions with respect to the count and the report to be made in connection therewith, or for some reason does not clearly understand the instructions as furnished, such post office or railway post office should communicate at once with the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service, or with the appropriate superintendent, Railway Mail Service, for instructions, in order that all authorized post offices and railway post offices may be prepared to make the count during the period indicated.

All ordinary or insured parcel-post packages, including those sent outside of mail sacks containing bees or baby chicks, **MUST** be counted, and the number thereof for each dispatch advised on Form 2973. However, packages of books or miscellaneous printed matter paid at the rate of 1 cent for each 2 ounces; packages weighing 8 ounces or less paid at the rate of 1½ cents for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof; those weighing 8 ounces or less containing seeds, scions, plants, cuttings, bulbs, and roots paid at the rate of 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, and packages prepaid at the letter rate **MUST NOT** be included in the count.

As the parcel-post service with Canada is limited to packages weighing over 8 ounces and not more than 15 pounds, it will be noted that only those packages weighing more than 8 ounces should be included in this count.

Should direct-closed sacks containing parcel mails from Canada be labeled to an unauthorized exchange office during the period April 1 to 7, inclusive, the count of the parcels contained in such sacks is to be made by the authorized exchange post office to which the sacks are forwarded intact by the office to which erroneously addressed and not by this latter office. Likewise, parcels contained in direct closed sacks from Canada erroneously labeled to a United States railway post office will be counted by the authorized exchange post office to which forwarded intact and not by the railway post office to which the sacks were erroneously labeled.

INSUFFICIENTLY PREPAID ARTICLES FOR FOREIGN COUNTRIES WHICH ARE INTENDED TO BE DISPATCHED BY AIR

Registered air mail articles of any kind for any foreign country shall not be dispatched unless fully prepaid.

Unregistered letters for delivery in Spain and its colonies, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras (Republic of), Newfoundland, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Salvador, Uruguay, Venezuela, which are intended by the senders to be dispatched by the United States domestic air mail service to a coast exchange office (for instance, New York, New Orleans, or a Pacific coast exchange office) and thence by steamship shall be forwarded by air if the air mail fee (4 cents for the first ounce or fraction and 8 cents for each additional ounce or fraction) and one rate of postage is fully prepaid.

Unregistered letters and also single post cards (except those mailed with the intention of avoiding prepayment of postage) for delivery in all other foreign countries which are intended by the senders to be dispatched by the United States domestic air mail service to a coast exchange office and thence by steamship shall be forwarded by air if the air mail fee (4 cents for the first ounce or fraction and 8 cents for each additional ounce or fraction) is fully prepaid.

All other unregistered articles which are intended by the senders to be dispatched by the United States domestic air mail service to a coast exchange office and thence by steamship, and all articles, including articles for delivery in Canada and Mexico, for dispatch by the United States international (F. A. M.) air mail routes (in connection with the United States domestic (C. A. M.) air mail routes where practicable) shall be forwarded by air only if fully prepaid. It is to be noted in this connection that all classes of articles (letters, post cards, commercial papers, printed matter, samples, and merchandise) to be sent to any particular

country, including Canada and Mexico, by an F. A. M. route are subject to the same rate and that merchandise may be sent only to those countries that accept merchandise in the letter mails.

Unregistered articles intended for dispatch by air which are not sufficiently prepaid for such dispatch as stated above shall be subject to the treatment prescribed for ordinary articles. (In this connection, see sec. 14 on p. 187 of the July, 1929, Postal Guide, relative to the optional and compulsory prepayment of postage on ordinary articles for foreign countries.)

When articles marked to be sent by air mail are sent forward by the ordinary means, either because they are not sufficiently prepaid for dispatch by air or when the transmission by air is ended (as when articles are sent to New York by air for dispatch therefrom by steamship) and they are to be dispatched onward to destination only by the ordinary means, every annotation relative to the transmission by air must be canceled officially by means of two heavy transverse lines.

CANADIAN AIR MAIL

The Canadian administration announces that the experimental air mail service between Montreal, Quebec, Moncton, and St. John will be operated in two distinct and separate sections—that is, between Montreal, St. John, and Moncton and return and between Montreal and Quebec and return.

On the route between Montreal, St. John, and Moncton, the schedule is as follows:

The Canadian Administration has instructed its pilots flying between Montreal and St. John in the event of a forced landing in the State of Maine to convey the mail to the nearest United States post office for dispatch to destination and to obtain the signature of the United States postmaster on the duplicate waybills in their possession, in receipt for the mail sacks handed over to him.

In the event of such forced landing in Maine, the Canadian mails shall be dispatched by the first available train service to destination.

NO C. O. D. SERVICE WITH CANADA

On page 12 of the June, 1929, Postal Guide, the following notice, under the above caption, was published:

"The Postal Administration of Canada has reported the receipt of several C. O. D. parcels from this country.

"Inasmuch as no arrangement exists for the exchange of C. O. D. parcels between Canada and this country, postmasters are requested to refrain from accepting C. O. D. parcels for delivery in Canada."

In view of the fact that the department is still receiving from Canada reports of the receipt of C. O. D. parcels from this country, postmasters are again requested to take the necessary corrective action to prevent the acceptance of such mail for delivery in Canada.

Failure to observe the foregoing, resulting in the loss, rifling, or damage of the parcel or nonreceipt of the C. O. D. charges, may be made the basis of a collection from the postal employee at fault to cover any loss sustained as a result of the improper acceptance of the parcel.

NO AIR MAIL SERVICE TO BRAZIL

Many articles addressed for delivery in Brazil are being prepaid and marked by the senders for dispatch to Brazil by air via different South American countries.

As the quickest mail service now available from this country to Brazil is via steamship from New York, all articles for delivery in that country should be sent to New York for such dispatch even though prepaid for dispatch by air via a South American country served by an F. A. M. route.

Postmasters will give to the above as much publicity as possible without expense to the department.

AIR MAIL SERVICE—THE NETHERLANDS TO DUTCH EAST INDIES

Referring to the two notices of this office bearing the above caption, one of which was published on page 6 of the September, 1929, Supplement and the other on page 19 of the November, 1929, Supplement, postmasters will give as much publicity as possible without expense to the department to the fact that the air-mail service, referred to in those notices, from the Netherlands to the Dutch East Indies, has been discontinued until further notice.

CIGARETTES IN THE MAILS TO GREAT BRITAIN

In view of the existing prohibition in Great Britain against the importation of sweetened cigarettes, numerous reports of the seizure of parcels containing these articles are received from the Postal Administration of that country.

As practically all brands of cigarettes manufactured in the United States contain a certain percentage of sweetening properties, postmasters will advise mailers that cigarettes addressed for delivery in Great Britain will be accepted only at their risk.

PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO ITALY

Information has been received from the Postal Administration of Italy that postmasters are accepting parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in that country, unaccompanied by the required dispatch notes and not sealed in the manner prescribed in the announcement issued by this office under date of November 29, 1929, and published on pages 12 and 13 of the December Supplement to the current Official Postal Guide.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that the insurance number given the parcel must invariably be indicated on the wrapper and the relative dispatch note.

Postmasters will instruct all clerks at their offices to familiarize themselves with the announcement mentioned in order that parcels may be properly prepared and future reports of irregularities eliminated.

REGISTERED C. O. D. PARCELS TO MEXICO MUST BEAR C. O. D. CHARGES EXPRESSED IN MEXICAN MONEY

It has come to the attention of the department that, contrary to instructions, registered C. O. D. parcels bearing C. O. D. charges *expressed in United States money* are being accepted for delivery in Mexico, and that it is the practice of some postmasters or accepting employees to convert the C. O. D. charges into Mexican money (pesos and centavos).

The agreement between this country and Mexico for the exchange of C. O. D. parcels specifically provides that the amount to be collected on delivery *shall invariably be expressed in the money of the country of destination of the article*. Also, postal employees in this country are expressly forbidden to fill in the C. O. D. charges on such parcels, *although requested by the sender to do so*, or to alter the C. O. D. charges originally indorsed on the parcel by the sender.

The responsibility of properly indorsing on C. O. D. parcels to Mexico the amount in pesos and centavos to be collected on delivery rests with the senders, and no indemnity is payable to cover any shortage in the remittance received when the remittance represents the equivalent of the pesos and centavos indorsed on the parcel by the sender to be collected upon delivery in Mexico. The question of the shortage is then one for adjustment between the sender and the addressee.

Postmasters are, therefore, requested to be governed accordingly and to take such corrective measures as may be necessary to prevent the acceptance of registered C. O. D. parcels addressed for delivery in Mexico, when the C. O. D. charges are improperly stated in United States money. In rejecting such parcels for mailing, it should be courteously explained to the sender that the C. O. D. agreement between this country and Mexico requires that C. O. D. parcels sent to Mexico bear C. O. D. charges expressed in pesos and centavos.

All accepting employees concerned are cautioned that any shortage in remittance received by the sender in consequence of the improper acceptance of the parcel bearing C. O. D. charges expressed in United States money, instead of in pesos and centavos, may result in a collection being made from the postal employee at fault to cover the shortage.

PREPARATION AT THIRD-CLASS OFFICES OF RETURN RECEIPTS FOR INTERNATIONAL MAIL

Postmasters at third-class offices will, when requested by patrons of the Postal Service, prepare Form 2865 (old Form 3870) as return receipts for mail addressed to foreign countries.

This notice modifies paragraph 1 of the notice published on page 13 of the January, 1930, Supplement, under the caption, "Return receipts for international mail and fees therefor."

A supply of Forms 2865 may be obtained by making requisition upon the Fourth Assistant, division of equipment and supplies.

STATISTICS OF INTERNATIONAL MAILS

The attention of all postmasters is directed to the necessity of being prepared to submit on July 1, 1930, reports of all foreign mail transactions conducted at their offices during the period July 1, 1929, to June 30, 1930, as outlined in section 94 on pages 226, 227, and 228.

Since the publication of the current Official Postal Guide, new parcel post conventions have been concluded between the United States and the following countries:

French Indo-China (insured service). (See pp. 22 to 24 of the August, 1929, supplement.)

Leeward Islands (insured service). (See pp. 10 and 11 of the September, 1929, supplement.)

Italy (insured service). (See pp. 12 and 13 of the December, 1929, supplement.)

Austria (collect-on-delivery service). (See pp. 15 to 18 of the December, 1929, supplement.)

This matter is called to the attention of postmasters for the reason that difficulty has heretofore been experienced in obtaining completed reports immedi-

ately after the close of the fiscal year. Postmasters are requested to return the cards transmitted to them even though no foreign mail transactions have been conducted at their offices, in order that the statistics may be compiled at this office in sufficient time to be included with other data prepared for the Postmaster General's annual report.

DIVISION OF FINANCE

NEW COUNTERFEIT

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

“\$20 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE (NEW ISSUE)

“On the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, N. Y., 1928 series; check letter ‘K’; face plate No. 7; back plate No. 45; H. T. Tate, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Jackson.

“This is a well-executed counterfeit printed from photomechanical plates on one sheet of crisp bond paper of good quality, being of the same workmanship as counterfeit \$10 Federal reserve note described in Circular Letter No. 634. The back of this counterfeit is particularly deceptive, although the fine white lines in the border engraving lose their identity in places on account of faulty etching. On the face, the Treasury seal, executed in green, does not show up clearly through the word TWENTY under the serial numbering, and the latter has a smudgy appearance due to heavy impress on the paper. Several of these notes have appeared with the same serial number—B60528403A.

“Care should be exercised in handling notes of this variety and denomination.”

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

ILLEGAL INCLOSURES WITH THIRD AND FOURTH CLASS MATTER

Reports received from postmasters at offices of address show that instructions for repairs, directions for making garments, etc., and other unauthorized written inscriptions are being inclosed with articles mailed at the third and fourth class rates of postage, although such illegal inclosures properly subject the parcels to the first-class rate.

The department has endeavored, through notices in the Postal Bulletin and monthly supplements to the Postal Guide, to have postmasters at the mailing offices use their best efforts to stop this practice, not only because of the loss of postage likely to result, but for the further reason that the acceptance of such parcels at the third or fourth class rates of postage at the mailing offices and the subsequent collection of postage due at the offices of address subjects the department to criticism from the addressees, who are compelled to pay the postage which should have been paid by the mailer.

The attention of patrons should be invited in this connection to section 455, Postal Laws and Regulations, and articles 55 and 56 on page 14 of the July, 1929, Postal Guide, setting forth the conditions under which a communication or other first-class matter prepaid at the letter rate may be attached to the outside of a parcel mailed at the third or fourth class rate of postage, and they should be encouraged to avail themselves of this provision when they desire to send with a

parcel of third or fourth class matter instructions or directions which constitute first-class matter and therefore are not permissible inclosures in the parcels.

Therefore, all postmasters are requested to give this matter personal attention and see if something can not be done to prevent the dispatch from their respective offices of parcels offered for mailing at less than the first-class rate of postage which contain written instructions or other written matter not permissible with the class of matter as offered, thus improving this situation and making the service more satisfactory to its patrons and at the same time avoiding unnecessary labor, expense, and criticism. Eternal vigilance at the office of mailing is the only way to stop this trouble-making practice.

FORMS 3548 NOT BEARING THE NAMES OF THE POST OFFICES SENDING THEM

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster in Massachusetts addressed to the Newport Trust Co., Newport, R. I., advising that a letter is being held at his office for 2 cents postage. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State and the name of the post office in the postmark is illegible.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to Mary E. Flemming, care of L. B. Flemming, Robersonville, N. C., advising that a piece of mail is held at his office. The card is not filled out to show the kind of matter, the amount of postage required or the name of the post office and State, and it does not bear a postmark.

Form 3548 sent to Benigno Moreno, 2323 Princeton Avenue, Chicago, Ill., advising him that a letter addressed to him is being held for 2 cents postage, does not bear the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and is not postmarked.

The postmasters at the offices from which the notices were sent will promptly send to this office (Bureau of the Third Assistant Postmaster General, division of classification) other Forms 3548 completely and properly filled out.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

NAME OF COUNTY ON STAMP STOCK REQUISITIONS

Many requisitions for postage stamps, postal cards, and stamped envelopes are being received in the department with the name of the county omitted from the space provided for it in the heading on requisition forms Nos. 3201, 3201-A, 3202, and 3202-d. Information in regard to the name of the county is needed in the department in the filling of requisitions, and it is desired that the headings of all stamp requisitions shall be completed in full in the future to include the name of the county as well as that of the post office and State.

Postmasters will please see that stamp requisitions are properly completed hereafter, whether prepared by themselves or subordinates.

ADJUSTMENT OF ERRORS MADE IN REPORTING ENVELOPE INCREASE

Many letters have been received from postmasters at first and second class post offices stating that the amount of envelope increase reported in their December quarter postage-stamp accounts was incorrect, due to errors made in computing the difference in value of the envelopes on hand December 31, 1929, at the old and new selling rates.

To avoid possible misunderstanding, it has not been considered desirable to make the requested correction in the postmaster's stamp account as rendered and it will be expected, unless the postmaster is advised to the contrary, that proper entry shall be made in the March quarter stamp account to correct the error in the envelope increase reported in the December quarter account.

If the envelope increase was undercharged in the December quarter stamp account, the amount still due shall be charged in item B-4 or, if overcharged, credit for the difference should be claimed in item E of the March quarter postage stamp account. In such cases care should be exercised by the postmaster to enter in item A of the March quarter stamp account the exact amount reported in item C of the December quarter stamp account as rendered.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

FORM 3540 COVERING AN INSURED PARCEL NOT BEARING NAME OF POST OFFICE SENDING IT

This office is in receipt of card Form 3540 addressed to Mr. M. S. Berny, 25 Easton Street, Allston Station, Boston, Mass., advising him that insured parcel No. 280508, addressed to Mrs. F. W. Remick, Lakeport, N. Y., is being held for 16 cents postage as there is no such post office as Lakeport in the State of New York. The card does not bear the name of the post office sending it nor the State in which located and the postmark is illegible.

The parcel involved was intended for Lockport, N. Y., but was not received at that office.

The postmaster holding the above-described parcel will advise this office, Division of Registered Mails, referring to file No. 29835-Y, and will continue to hold it pending receipt of advice as to its disposition.

C. O. D. PARCELS NOT TO BE ACCEPTED FOR MAILING WHEN ADDRESSED TO OTHER THAN MONEY-ORDER POST OFFICES

Reference is made to section 1074, paragraph 1, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, and to article 73, page 153, of the July, 1929, Postal Guide, which provide that articles must not be accepted for collection on delivery unless addressed to post offices which transact money-order business. Notwithstanding the instructions on this subject, the department receives reports indicating that a great many C. O. D. parcels are accepted for mailing when addressed to non-money-order post offices.

Postmasters are requested to give this matter appropriate attention with a view to preventing the acceptance of C. O. D. parcels addressed to post offices which do not transact money-order business. Patrons who rate up their own parcels should be requested to exercise care to see that no parcels addressed to non-money-order post offices are prepared for transmission as C. O. D. mail. It should be explained to the patrons concerned that postmasters at non-money-order post offices are not permitted to deliver C. O. D. parcels and collect the charges thereon, and that when C. O. D. parcels are erroneously transmitted to non-money-order post offices, delivery can not be made unless the charges are released by the senders.

When a C. O. D. parcel is received at a non-money-order post office, the postmaster thereat shall notify the postmaster at the mailing office, who shall ascertain whether the sender desires the parcel returned or delivered without the collection of the charges. If the sender issues instructions in writing that the parcel be delivered without collection of the charges, the postmaster at the mailing office shall attach the order to the mailing office record and notify the postmaster at the office of address accordingly.

In every instance where a C. O. D. parcel is received at a non-money-order post office the postmaster at such office should, in addition to handling the parcel in the manner outlined above, make a report of the matter to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails, giving the full particulars of mailing of the parcel involved.

CHANGE No. 115 (sec. 54, p. 215).

Parcel-post packages should not be accepted for delivery in Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras (Republic of), Mexico, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, or Spain (in addition to Argentina, Brazil, and Salvador (El), to which this arrangement now applies), unless they bear an indorsement indicating the wishes of the sender concerning the disposition which is to be made in the event delivery can not be effected at the original address, as set forth in section 54, on page 215.

In view of the above, the words "compulsory requirement" should be inserted after each of the items mentioned in section 54 on page 215.

The senders of undelivered parcels addressed for delivery in the countries mentioned, who have indorsed the parcels to the effect that they are to be returned in the event of nondelivery, or when such parcels are returned through the failure of the sender to signify some other disposition, will be required to pay all charges which have accrued thereon. Parcels addressed for delivery in Argentina *must bear an indorsement* to the effect that these charges will be paid at the time of return.

CHANGE No. 116 (Greece, p. 346).

The offices mentioned below should be added to the list of those authorized to participate in the parcel-post service as shown on page 346.

The offices of Deskati, Eratira, Macrohorion, Nea Anchialos, Poros (Crete), and Mastamba have been designated to engage in the exchange of parcel-post packages between the United States and Greece.

CHANGE No. 117 (Par. II, sec. 53, p. 215, Hungary and Macao, pp. 356 and 387). Effective at once, the maximum length for parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Hungary and Macao will be increased from 3 feet 6 inches to 4 feet. However, parcel-post packages over 42 inches and not over 44 inches in length must not exceed 24 inches in girth, parcels over 44 inches and not over 46 inches in length must not exceed 20 inches in girth, and parcels over 46 inches and up to 4 feet in length must not exceed 16 inches in girth.

In view of the above, the words "Hungary" and "Macao" should be inserted in Paragraph II of section 53, on page 215.

Also the following should be added to the subheading "Observations" of the items "Hungary and Macao—Parcel Post" on pages 356 and 387.

"Parcels may be 4 feet long, provided that parcels over 42 inches and not over 44 inches in length do not exceed 24 inches in girth, parcels over 44 inches and not over 46 inches in length do not exceed 20 inches in girth, and parcels over 46 inches and up to 4 feet in length do not exceed 16 inches in girth."

CHANGE No. 118 (Italy, pp. 370 and 371).

The following changes should be made in the item "Italy (including Fiume)—Parcel Post" on pages 370 and 371.

Page 370.—Replace subheading Dodecanese Islands by the following:

"Islands in the Aegean Sea—Antimachia, Calchi (Karki), Calino (Kalymnos), Caso, Castello, Castelrosso, Cattavia, Coo (Cos), Lero, Lindo, Lisso (Lipso), Monolito, Nisiro, Patmo, Piscopi (Tilos), Rodi (Rhodes), Scarpanto (Carpathos), Simi, Stampalia, and Villanova."

Page 371.—In the list of offices in the Italian possessions to which parcel-post packages up to 22 pounds in weight may be sent, the names of the Provinces in which the following offices are situated should be changed as shown below:

CHANGE No. 119. (sec. 33, p. 196, sec. 34, p. 196, and Spain, p. 458).

Section 33, page 196.—Insert the word "Spain" between the words "Southwest Africa Protectorate" and "Sweden."

Section 34, page 196.—Delete the word "Spain."

Page 458.—Add the following subheading between the subheadings "Observations" and "Prohibitions":

"Dutiable articles.—Dutiable articles accepted, provided there is affixed to each letter or package prepaid at the letter rate a green label (Form Dquater), Form 2976, showing that the articles are to be submitted to the customs authorities for examination. A customs declaration properly completed or an invoice must also be inclosed in the package."

Page 458.—Delete the words "Dutiable articles" in the seventh paragraph of the subheading "Prohibitions."

CHANGE No. 120 (Haiti, p. 179; Sec. 15, p. 187; p. 351).

Haiti has put into effect the provisions of the Pan American Principal Convention of Mexico. Accordingly, the following changes become effective at once in connection with regular mail service to Haiti:

Ordinary post cards which have not been delivered for any reason will be destroyed in the country of destination unless they bear a request for return and the name and address of the sender, in which case they will be returned to the country of origin.

It is prohibited to inclose money in cash or values payable to the bearer in ordinary or registered correspondence.

Unsealed packages of merchandise weighing 8 ounces or less may be sent to Haiti at the domestic third-class rate.

Correspondence (this is held to include all articles in the mails except parcel-post packages) of members of the diplomatic corps of Haiti mailed in any of the Pan American countries or Spain and addressed for delivery in the United States, and vice versa, is granted freedom from postage. The correspondence of the members of the diplomatic corps of this country accredited to Haiti is granted a similar franking privilege.

The item "Regular Mails" under the heading "Haiti" on page 351, and the item "Merchandise" on page 179 are modified accordingly. Also "Haiti" should be added after "Guatemala" in the third line of the second paragraph of section 15 on page 187, and "except Haiti" should be added after the words "those countries" in lines 7 and 11 of the same paragraph.

CHANGE No. 121 (sec. 68, p. 218).

The following should be added to section 68 on page 218 and under each of the country headings concerned:

The postmarking stamp of the office of mailing must appear at all breaks (cut or torn ends) of the gummed paper strips employed in the sealing of insured parcel-post packages for Austria, Ecuador, French Indo-China, Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Hungary, Irish Free State, Italy, Leeward Islands, Macao, Norway, Portugal, including Madeira and the Azores, Straits Settlements and The Netherlands and registered parcel-post packages for Ecuador, Germany, Macao, Mexico (C. O. D. parcels), Portugal, including Madeira and the Azores, and The Netherlands.

CHANGE No. 122. (Newfoundland, p. 410.)

The first two paragraphs of the subheading *Insurance*, of the item "Newfoundland—Parcel Post," on page 410, is superseded by the following:

Mailable "prints" and parcel post for and from Newfoundland may be insured under the same conditions as apply to domestic insured mail, subject to the following limits of indemnity when prepaid at the postage rate applicable, in addition to the insurance fees mentioned hereunder:

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

INSERT No. 565. ORDER No. 9862.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634, paragraph (c), of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) A complaint of the loss of registered mail addressed to any foreign country except Canada, or of the failure to receive a return receipt therefor, if made to a postmaster at a first or second class office, should be made on Form I (Form 542) prescribed by the Universal Postal Convention, the answers to the questions on the form to be made in accordance with the instructions printed thereon. The particulars of dispatch within the United States should be inserted by the postmaster and the form forwarded to the postmaster at the exchange office to which the registered article was dispatched if known, and if not known the form should be forwarded direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the post office of origin is located. The postmaster at the exchange office when Form I is received shall insert the particulars of dispatch of the registered article from that office and forward the form to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of origin is located. If the complaint is made to the postmaster at a third or fourth class office, it should be made on Form 1510 and the form forwarded direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of origin is located."

INSERT No. 566. ORDER No. 9863.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634, paragraph (d), of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"(d) Inquiries received at any post office in this country for registered and ordinary (not insured) mail addressed to Canada shall be procured on Form 1510, the particulars of dispatch from the office of origin and other appropriate data entered on the back, and the form forwarded by the postmaster to the postmaster at the office of address in Canada. The usual official penalty envelope furnished postmasters should be used in sending inquiries to Canada, and particular care taken to enter thereon the name of the Province in Canada in which the office of address is located. If the complaint relates to registered mail, and it has not been delivered in Canada, all papers must be forwarded by the postmaster to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of mailing is located for further attention. Claims involving damage or partial loss (rifling) of insured parcels mailed in the United States addressed for delivery in Canada will be filed on Form 3812 and sent direct by the postmasters to the proper district superintendent of Postal Service in Canada for completion and transmission to the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service), and at the time the Form 3812 is filled out, in a case of partial loss, a Form 1510 covering the parcel should also be filled out, with a notation thereon showing the date Form 3812 was sent to Canada, and the Form 1510 sent to the United States inspector in charge of the division, in which the office of mailing is located. Upon receipt of complaints relative to loss of insured mail, which should be accepted only after the sender has ascertained that the article was not received by the addressee, or has submitted other evidence reasonably indicating the nonreceipt of the insured parcel by the addressee, or after proper efforts without results have been made by the sender to determine whether the article has been received, a Form 3812 should be filled out and sent to the proper Canadian district superintendent of postal service as shown in the Postal Guide, and at the same time a Form 1510 covering the article should also be filled out with a notation thereon showing the date Form 3812 was sent to Canada, and the Form 1510 sent to the United States inspector in charge of the division in which the office of mailing is located, in accordance with the procedure mentioned below. If inquiry in the Canadian service shows that an insured parcel has been delivered intact, the Form 3812 indorsed to that effect will be returned to the postmaster in this country by the Canadian district superintendent; but if the parcel has been lost, rifled, or damaged, the latter official will secure the execution of the declaration of the addressee and forward the Form

3812 to the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service). If the Canadian official should inadvertently return to the postmaster a Form 3812 showing that a parcel had not been received by the addressee, or was received in a damaged or rifled condition, the postmaster shall forward the Form 3812 to the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service), but if the form has not been properly completed, the postmaster will return it to the proper Canadian district superintendent for that purpose. If information is not received within a reasonable time, in response to inquiry, showing what disposition has been made of the insured parcel, and the parcel has not been otherwise accounted for, the postmaster should take the matter up with the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service), giving the names and addresses of the sender and addressee of the parcel, its number, date of mailing, and date Form 3812 was sent to Canada. When a postmaster receives a reply to an inquiry concerning ordinary, registered, or insured mail addressed to Canada the complainant should be appropriately advised. The Canadian service will use a form similar to Form 1510, and the forms should be returned with reply to the point in Canada from which received. Form 1510, covering insured parcels addressed to Canada, and reports received from Canada to the effect that ordinary mail has not been delivered to the addressee, shall be jacketed by first and second class post offices on Form 651 and forwarded to the inspector in charge of the division in which the post office where the article was mailed is located. Third and fourth class post offices shall forward Form 1510 and other papers, if any, to the inspector in charge of the division in which the post office where the article was mailed is located. Inspectors in charge shall give the cases the same treatment accorded complaints of losses of ordinary mail in the domestic service."

INSERT No. 567. ORDER No. 9864.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634, paragraph (f), of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(f) Complaints of the rifling, wrong delivery of, delay or damage to, foreign registered mail should be made in all instances on Form 1510 and the form forwarded direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the American post office of origin or destination is located. With all complaints of the rifling, delay of, or damage to, mail, the envelope or wrapper should be submitted, if possible."

INSERT No. 568. ORDER No. 9865.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634, paragraph (g), of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(g) Postmasters at exchange offices shall report to the inspector in charge of the division in which they are located, with full particulars of the mail involved where upon the exchange of bulletins of verification it is determined that a loss of or damage to mail matter dispatched from the United States has occurred."

INSERT No. 569. ORDER No. 9866.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634, paragraph (l), of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"(l) Complaint of the loss, except to Canada, rifling, wrong delivery, delay, or damage of ordinary foreign mail should be made on Form 1510 and the form forwarded direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the American post office of origin or destination is located. (See par. (d) concerning ordinary mail to Canada, and par. (h) as to withdrawal in transit of parcels entirely devoid of contents.)"

INSERT No. 570. ORDER No. 9867.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634, paragraph (o), of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(o) Postmasters (except postmasters at United States exchange offices when specifically authorized) shall refrain from addressing inquiries to postmasters or other postal officers in the Philippine Islands regarding the alleged loss, rifling, delay, wrong delivery, or other improper treatment by postal employees of or damage to any article of mail matter, registered or ordinary. All losses or mistreatment of mail matter passing between this country and the Philippine Islands should be reported to the inspector in charge of the division in which the American post office of origin or destination is located."

INSERT No. 571. ORDER No. 9868.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634½ (added by Order 3991, insert No. 212), paragraph 1, of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 634½. If a postmaster at an office of the first or second class receives an inquiry concerning the disposition of an insured parcel (as distinguished from an inquiry where prima facie loss has occurred), complaint of failure to receive a return receipt which was requested at the time of mailing, or a request for a return receipt after mailing, in connection with insured mail addressed to Great Britain and Northern Ireland, or to any other country, excepting Canada, with which insured mail is exchanged, he should send a Form I (Form 542), filled out in accordance with instructions printed thereon (after changing the word "Registered" on the Form to "Insured," and adding in the space headed "Dispatch within the United States," particulars of dispatch if available), to the postmaster at the United States exchange office through which the parcel was dispatched if known; if not known, the form should be forwarded direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of origin is located. When the inquiry is for a return receipt, the foreign form of registry return receipt (old Form 3870 or new Form 2865) should accompany the Form 542 (after changing the word "Registered" on the return receipt form to "Insured"). The form should be indorsed at the top "duplicate advice of delivery" if it relates to failure to receive a return receipt which had been requested at the time the parcel was mailed. If the request is for a receipt which was not asked for at the time of mailing, Form 3870, or new Form 2865, should be indorsed, "Request for advice of delivery made after mailing." When Form 542 is received, the postmaster at the exchange office shall insert the particulars of dispatch of the insured parcel from that office, and if a bulletin of verification was received concerning the parcel or the dispatch in which it was included, an indorsement covering such bulletin should be made on the form which should then be forwarded to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of origin is located."

INSERT No. 572. ORDER No. 9869.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634½ (added by Order 3991, insert No. 212), paragraph 2, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"2. Inquiries as to the disposition of, and request for return receipts for, insured parcels addressed to Great Britain and Northern Ireland, or to any other country, excepting Canada, with which insured mail is exchanged, filed at an office of the third or fourth class shall be made on Form 1510, which shall be forwarded direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of origin is located, and if they relate to return receipts, it should be stated on the form whether the receipt was requested at the time of mailing or after the parcel was mailed. When such inquiries or complaints develop into cases of loss, rifling, or damage, they shall be promptly referred to the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service), with such information as has been obtained regarding the articles involved. (Consult current Postal Guide and supplements regarding charges for return receipts and inquiries or complaints.)"

INSERT No. 573. ORDER No. 9870.

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634½ (added by Order 3991, insert No. 212), paragraph 5, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"5. If complaint is made by the sender or addressee of loss, rifling, or damage in connection with an insured parcel for Great Britain or Northern Ireland (or to any other country, excepting Canada, with which insured mail is exchanged), but the sender *does not desire to file claim for indemnity*, Form 3812 need not be filled out, but report of the loss, rifling, or damage shall be sent direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of origin is located, Form 542 being used for the purpose by offices of the first and second classes, and Form 1510 by offices of the third and fourth classes, and the forms conspicuously marked at the top 'Indemnity not claimed.' If the complaint involved damage which was apparently due to improper packing, a copy of the Form 542 or 1510 shall be sent to the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service), with a statement of the facts in the case."

FEBRUARY 4, 1930.

Section 634½ (added by Order 3991, insert No. 212), paragraph 6, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"6. Inquiries as to the disposition of insured parcels mailed in Great Britain and Northern Ireland (or to any other country, excepting Canada, with which insured mail is exchanged), as distinguished from inquiries involving *prima facie* loss, rifling, or damage, will be transmitted direct to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office of destination is located. The Inspection Service will advise the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of International Postal Service) as to the result of any investigation made in order that the information may be available if indemnity is claimed."

However, every city and village delivery carrier shall keep a record of the new address of each patron who removes from his route as well as all changes of address on the route. Unlimited forwarding orders and permanent changes of address shall be observed for a period of two years."

Section 1127 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to read as follows:
 "When application for a duplicate of a money order alleged to be lost is received at the paying office, the postmaster, before executing the certificate as to nonpayment of the original, shall examine his file of coupons and advices of paid orders to ascertain whether or not payment has already been made on the original or a duplicate thereof. If he finds that the order has not been paid, he shall execute the required certificate to that effect and forward the application to the department. If it was issued in the United States, he shall, by copying from the application for duplicate and without making any payment on the application, prepare and file with his coupons of paid orders a description of the lost order on Form 6002-a or 6006, upon which he shall make a memorandum as follows: 'Duplicate applied for in favor of _____ (payee or remitter), _____, 19____,' the date to be inserted being that of the certificate. If the order was issued in any one of the foreign countries named in Schedule 1 of the register of money-order post offices, with which the United States transacts money-order business on the domestic basis, like memorandum shall be made. Particular care shall be taken to avoid mistakes in writing the amount on Form 6002-a or 6006. If it is found that the original order has been paid, the application shall be returned to the issuing postmaster with a statement to that effect, giving date of payment."

Section 1118 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to read as follows:
 "When a separate or second advice is received, correcting the name of payee or amount, it shall be attached to and filed with the coupon or original advice."

FEBRUARY 12, 1930.

Section 1133 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to read as follows:
 "Upon presentation of a duplicate of an order which was drawn on his office, the postmaster shall look for the description of the original order on Form 6002-a or Form 6006, filed as provided in section 1127, with the coupons of orders paid thereat, or for the advice; and upon effecting payment shall see that record of the number of the duplicate and date of payment be made on Form 6002-a or Form 6006, thus: 'Paid by duplicate No. _____, _____, 19____.' Similarly, when repayment is made on a duplicate order a note giving the number of the duplicate and the date of repayment shall be made across the face of the remitter's original application and in the register of orders issued. The coupon attached to the duplicate after being stamped with the date of payment or repayment shall be separated therefrom and filed in its proper place among other coupons of paid and repaid orders; and the duplicate order itself, stamped with the date of payment or repayment as voucher for the disbursement, must be forwarded by the postmaster, with his next money-order account, to the Comptroller, Bureau of Accounts, Post Office Department. The record kept on Form 6002-a or Form 6006 or the advice, as the case may be, should be attached to the coupon and filed therewith when payment of duplicate is made at the office on which the original was drawn. Before payment or repayment is made on the duplicate particular care should be taken to see that it agrees with the record as to amount. In taking credit for such payment or repayment in the money-order account at first and second class offices the number of the duplicate as well as the number of the original shall be written."

NOTE.—See section 1135 as to payment by warrant when duplicate has become invalid by reason of age.

FEBRUARY 12, 1930.

Paragraph 1, section 1134, of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended to read as follows:

"When a money order more than a month old is presented at the paying office, the postmaster shall examine his file of coupons of paid orders to see if he has any record of the order, and if he finds that an application for a duplicate of the order has already been certified and forwarded he shall follow directions given in section 1129. Similarly, when an order more than a month old is presented for repayment the postmaster shall examine the application on which it was issued, also the register of orders issued. If a duplicate has been applied for, neither payment nor repayment shall be made on the original without special authorization from the department as provided in section 1129. Postmasters and paying clerks generally shall take like precaution whenever circumstances render it advisable in the case of money orders presented within one month from date of issue. Clerks in charge of contract stations should be careful in this respect and should, in case of presentation of a money order more than a month old, make inquiry of the main office as to whether or not an application for a duplicate has there been certified, and may do so in the case of any money order of more recent issue if the interval between the date of issue and date of presentation has been of such length as to suggest the possibility that such an application has been filed."

An order so paid shall not be entered in the cashbook or money-order account, as paid, nor shall it be stamped 'as paid, until the sum of the entries on the debit side of the money-order account is large enough to cover the amount thereof."
