

CIRCULATION OF SECOND-CLASS PUBLICATIONS TO BE IN HARMONY WITH REQUIRE-MENTS OF THE LAW

ORDER No. 1003.

APRIL 14, 1931.

In order to conform to the requirements of the law with respect to a legitimate list of subscribers and not come within the prohibition of the statute against publications primarily for free circulation, and continue to be mailable at the publications primarily for free circulation, and continue to be mailable at the second-class pound rates of postage, the circulation of a publication entered as second-class matter under the act of March 3, 1879, must consist in the main of copies supplied, by mail or otherwise, to persons who have themselves subscribed and paid or promised to pay for the publication at not less than 50 per cent of its regular subscription price. (See sec. 400, P. L. and R.) Publications which are primarily for free circulation are not entitled to be mailed at the publishers' second-class pound rates of postage. All copies of a publication printed, whether circulated through the mails or otherwise, and at whatever rate of postage, are taken into consideration in determining whether the circulation conforms to the requirements of the law for second-class matter. When an extraordinary number of copies of a publication are paid for by advertisers or other persons, or, under some other arrangement, are supplied persons not or other persons, or, under some other arrangement, are supplied persons not ordering the copies, such copies are free to the recipients and the practice raises the question as to whether the publication is designed primarily for advertising purposes or for free circulation and therefore not entitled to the second-class

When an extraordinary number of copies over the usual circulation are presented for mailing as to subscribers, the postmaster shall request the publisher to submit a sworn statement showing in what manner the claimed extra subscriptions were obtained and, if paid for by others than the persons to whom the copies are sent, who paid for them, the amount paid, the purpose for which the copies are sent, and whether the person paying for the copies is an advertiser in the publication, together with such additional information as there may be concerning the arrangement under which the copies are being circulated. tiser in the publication, together with such additional information as there may be concerning the arrangement under which the copies are being circulated. As set forth in paragraph 4, section 419, Postal Laws and Regulations, copies paid for by an advertiser or other interested party are chargeable with postage at the transient second-class rate as stated in section 420 of the Regulations. When a postmaster is in doubt as to whether any particular copies of a publication are entitled to be mailed at the publishers' second-class pound rates, he shall require a deposit of money sufficient to cover postage thereon at the transient second-class rate and hold such deposit pending submission of all the facts together with a copy of the publication to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification, for instructions.

TERMINATION OF THE AUTHORITY OF THE FEDERAL SURETY CO., OF DAVENPORT, IOWA

Notice is hereby given that the certificate of authority issued by the Secretary of the Treasury to the Federal Surety Co., of Davenport, Iowa, under the provisions of the act of Congress of August 13, 1894 (28 Stat. 279), as amended by the

act of March 23, 1910 (36 Stat. 241), to qualify as sole surety on recognizances, stipulations, bonds, and undertakings permitted or required by the laws of the

LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR CONVENTIONS

ORDER No. 1008.

APRIL 21, 1931.

Postmasters are hereby authorized to grant leave of absence upon proper application to employees who may be spared without detriment to the service, to attend the association meetings of their service organizations, such absence to be charged to annual leave or, if necessary, leave may be granted without pay. This may be considered also as authority for postmasters to be absent from their offices to attend conventions of their associations, such absence to be reported to the inspectors in charge in the usual way.

Notices of national conventions may appear in the Bulletin as heretofore.

This order will remain in effect during the calendar year 1931 and will make unnecessary the frequent publication in the Bulletin of orders authorizing postmasters to grant leave for particular conventions.

MONEY AND STAMPS FOUND LOOSE IN THE MAILS

The attention of all postmasters is directed to the provisions of amended paragraph 4, section 641, Postal Laws and Regulations (insert No. 672, in this Supplement), regarding the disposition of stamps and money found loose in the mails. It will be noted that loose stamps and money shall be remitted weekly, properly listed on Form 1522 (do not list both stamps and money on the same bill), to the Division of Dead Letters and Dead Parcel Post, Washington, D. C. Information at hand justifies the belief that a number of post offices which have either failed to forward any loose stamps and money, or have done so in small quantities and at irregular intervals, have made some other disposition of them.

All postal employees must be instructed relative to the proper method of disposing of loose money and uncanceled postage stamps found in the mails, as provided by the Postal Laws and Regulations. Under no circumstances shall money found loose in the mail be placed in the change drawer at stamp or money order windows, nor shall uncanceled postage stamps be returned to stock for resale.

Postmasters are therefore instructed to make it their personal business to ascertain at once just what is being done with loose stamps and money found or received in their offices, and to issue such instructions as will insure their being properly accounted for and disposed of as provided in the regulation cited.

QUARTERLY REPORTS, FORMS 1525, 1525A, 1809 AND 1909

It is noted that many postmasters who show excess expenditures over authorized service allowances in their quarterly reports, Forms 1525, 1525A, 1809, and 1909 fail to submit any explanation covering the reason for the unauthorized expenditures. This is a specific requirement, and where it is not complied with much avoidable correspondence ensues, and postmasters are incurring a definite risk of the suspension of their accounts and the payment of the unauthorized amounts from their personal funds. All postmasters concerned must explain unauthorized or excess expenditures. It should not be necessary to refer to this matter again. See the instructions on the reverse side of Forms 1525, 1525A, 1809, and 1909.

APARTMENT HOUSE RECEPTACLE

Pursuant to the provisions of the order of the Postmaster General, No. 3979, dated March 9, 1926, Mr. Henry Wilhelm, 70–72 Frost Street, Brooklyn, N. Y., has submitted application, accompanied by blue prints, for approval of "Wilhelm's No. 2" apartment-house mail receptacle manufactured by him.

As the construction of this receptacle conforms to the requirements of the above-mentioned order, it is hereby approved for the delivery of mail in apart-

ment houses, family hotels, and flats.

POSTMASTERS MUST GIVE GREATER ATTENTION TO PROPER LOCATION OF RURAL MAIL BOXES ALONG IMPROVED HIGHWAYS

The regulations of the department have provided for several years that the boxes of rural patrons shall be so placed that they may be conveniently served by the carriers without the necessity for their leaving their conveyances, and that they shall be located on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of travel of the carriers in all cases where the traffic conditions are such as would make it dangerous for the carriers to drive to the left in order to reach the boxes or their doing so would constitute a violation of the traffic laws or regulations. It is a requirement that on new rural routes all boxes shall be located on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of travel of the carrier.

Because of the development and improvement of highways by the several States and the increase in the traffic over such highways, much of which moves at a high rate of speed; of the more stringent and more rigidly enforced traffic regulations; because rural carriers have no special privileges in the use of the roads and are amenable to the traffic laws and regulations; and in the interest of the safety of the traveling public, of the rural carriers and of the mails, it is the department's desire that postmasters give greater attention to the location of rural mail boxes along hard-surfaced roads, or those on which the traffic is unusually heavy, and for that reason driving to the left is more than ordinarily objectionable, with a view to enlisting the interest of the box owners in this important subject of the location of the boxes on the proper side of the road. The boxes must be placed to conform with the laws of the State or the regulations of the officials having supervision over the highways, and where they will be accessible to the carriers without the need of leaving their conveyances.

It is expected that postmasters will give this matter the serious consideration its importance demands and make an immediate and continued effort to secure definite and general cooperation of rural patrons in this needed improvement. In event of the failure of any patrons to change the location of their boxes when called upon to do so, where such change is necessary under these instructions, report of the facts should be submitted to this bureau, such reports to include the

names of the patrons and the routes by which they are served.

DIVISION OF INTERNATIONAL POSTAL SERVICE

DUTIABLE ARTICLES INCLUDED IN "PRINTS" MAILS TO GREECE

The Postal Administration of Greece has advised that various pieces of cloth, handkerchiefs, gloves, pens, and other articles of merchandise are being inclosed with packages transmitted in the "prints" mails to that country.

Postmasters are directed to issue instructions at their offices that a careful watch be kept to prevent the inclosure of such articles in packages of printed matter for foreign countries prepaid at the printed matter rate of 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction of 2 ounces.

PROPER ADDRESS FOR MAIL MATTER INTENDED FOR DELIVERY IN NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE IRISH FREE STATE, RESPECTIVELY

This department has been advised that mail matter intended for delivery in Northern Ireland is being included in closed mails addressed to exchange offices in the Irish Free State, thereby subjecting the articles concerned to an unnecessary delay. This is due to the fact that "Northern Ireland" is not included in the address of the mail matter concerned. It is likewise true that "Irish Free State" is not included in the address of articles intended for delivery in the last-named country.

With the view to preventing irregularities in the dispatch of the articles involved there are listed below the names of the counties and principal towns in Northern

Ireland

and the names of the counties in the Irish Free State as follows: Carlow, Cavan, Clare, Cork, Donegal, Dublin, Galway, Kerry, Kildare, Kilkenny, Kings (or Offaly), Lietrim, Leix (or Queens), Limerick, Longford, Lough, Mayo, Meath, Monaghan, Offaly (or Kings), Queens (or Leix), Roscommon, Sligo, Tipperary, Waterford, Westmeath, Wexford, and Wicklow.

It is reported that the name of the country is shown simply as "Ireland" in the case of many articles received at exchange offices for dispatch to Northern

Ireland as well as to the Irish Free State.

Postmasters at offices of origin are, therefore, requested to induce mailers to include "Northern Ireland" in the address of articles destined for delivery in that portion of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in order that United States exchange post offices may inclose such articles in the closed mail for Belfast, the appropriate exchange office in Northern Ireland, which belongs to a postal administration separate from that of the Irish Free State; and to include "Irish Free State," as well as the name of the county and the office of destination, in the address of articles intended for delivery in that country, in order that such articles may be included in the closed mails for the appropriate exchange office in the Irish Free State.

SHORTAGES IN REMITTANCES ON REGISTERED C. O. D. ARTICLES TO MEXICO RESULT-ING FROM ERRONEOUS INFORMATION FURNISHED BY ACCEPTING EMPLOYEES REGARDING VALUE OF MEXICAN PESO

The department is continually receiving complaints of shortages in remittances on registered C. O. D. articles to Mexico as a result of erroneous information furnished by accepting employees as to the value in United States money of the Mexican peso.

It is invariably stated by the complainant that in accordance with the informa-

tion furnished by the accepting employee to the effect that the Mexican peso is considered as the equivalent of 50 cents in United States money, the rate of 50 cents to the peso was used in computing the C. O. D. charges in pesos and centavos. Since the inauguration of the C. O. D. service with Mexico, the money-order conversion rate of the peso has varied considerably, conversions during the last few months having been made at a rate as low as 37.7 cents to the peso. Also, attention is called to the feet that the conversion is made by the Mexico. attention is called to the fact that the conversion is made by the Mexican exchange office to agree approximately with the market rate and that no notice is given when the rate is changed.

As the C. O. D. agreement with Mexico provides that the Mexican postmaster can collect only the exact amount entered in pesos and centavos on the wrapper of the parcel, it is obvious that in cases where the peso is reckoned as worth 50 cents, the shipper, until the market rate again reaches 50 cents, will probably receive a money order for a less amount than expected; therefore, it is requested that the attention of all patrons of the C. O. D. service be invited to the fact that the money-order conversion rate, which is controlled entirely by the Mexican Administration, is subject to frequent fluctuations, as stated in Change No. 95, page 47, of the December, 1930, Postal Guide. Inasmuch, therefore, as neither the department nor the postmaster at the office of mailing is in a position to say what the value of the peso will be on the date the orders are issued, this condition should be taken into consideration by the shippers when computing charges, and a sufficient addition made to the total to insure the receipt of a money order for the

full amount of the charges in United States currency.

While the postal employees may acquaint the public, upon request, with the information published by the department from time to time regarding the rate of conversion of the Mexican peso, it should be made clear to the public that, due to the frequent fluctuations in the conversion rate, no responsibility will be assumed by the Postal Service for any quotations furnished and that, as stated above, the fluctuations in the rate of conversion should be taken into consideration by the senders when computing the C. O. D. charges to be collected on delivery so as to insure the receipt of the full amount desired. It should also be made clear that the responsibility of properly indorsing on registered C. O. D. parcels to Mexico the amount in pesos and centavos to be collected rests with the sender and that no indemnity is payable to cover any shortage in the remittance received when such remittance represents the equivalent of the pesos and centavos indorsed on the parcel by the sender. The question of the shortage is then one for adjustment between the sender and the addressee of the C. O. D. parcel involved.

In connection with the foregoing, particular attention is directed to the relative notice published in the April, 1931 supplement, containing the latest information available with regard to the conversion of Mexican pesos in money-order transac-

tions.

The department can not stress too strongly the importance of a strict compliance with the foregoing and all postmasters and other employees concerned are cautioned to govern themselves accordingly.

MAIL FOR EAST COAST OF NICARAGUA

The Postal Administration of Nicaragua advises that because of the infrequent service available by which mail sent to Managua by air may be reforwarded to the east coast of Nicaragua, mail for the east coast should be sent by the ordinary means via New Orleans (from which city it will be forwarded by direct steamers to the Nicaraguan east coast) instead of by air to Managua.

RESUMPTION OF SHIP-TO-SHORE SERVICE OF STEAMSHIP "BREMEN" AND STEAMSHIP "EUROPA"

The ship-to-shore service of the North German Lloyd steamships Bremen and Europa will be resumed in connection with the sailings of these steamships from Bremerhaven on May 4 and 10, respectively, and from New York on May 13

and 19, respectively.

The flights on the voyages from New York to Europe will be made on week days to Southampton, from which place the mails will be forwarded to London and sent by London-Cologne-Hannover-Berlin night flights the same date. The night flights reach Cologne at 12.45 a.m., Hannover at 4 a.m., and Berlin at 6 a.m. the next day. The time saved will be from one and one-half to two days.

On Sundays the flights will be made to Amsterdam, if possible, from which eity the mails will be forwarded by the night express trains for Germany, so that the time saving will not be much less than in the case of transmission by the night flights from London.

Articles sent by the catapult flights will receive a special cachet, the same as in

previous years.

Ordinary and registered letters and post cards for delivery in Germany and countries beyond will be accepted for dispatch by the steamships Bremen and Europa and their ship-to-shore services, subject to a total charge of 20 cents for each unregistered letter not exceeding one-half ounce in weight, 35 cents for each unregistered letter exceeding one-half ounce up to 1 ounce in weight, and so on in progression (15 cents to be added as air mail fee for each additional half-ounce of weight and 3 cents to be added as postage for each additional ounce of weight). The total charge for an unregistered post card is 18 cents (15 cents air mail fee plus 3 cents regular postage). If registration is desired, the registry fee is 15 cents additional for each article. This mail will be forwarded onward by the connecting air lines in Germany.

Unregistered parcel-post packages of acceptable merchandise for delivery in Germany will also be accepted for dispatch by this service subject to the air mail fee of 10 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof in addition to the regular postage of 14 cents a pound. Due to lack of space on the planes, the parcel-post packages must be limited to 20 pounds in weight and maximum dimensions of 12 by 12

Mail matter for this special airplane service should be marked conspicuously "Via S. S. Bremen (or S. S. Europa) and Airplane Ship-to-Shore" and bear the

"Par Avion" air mail label. If air mail service in this country en route to New York (the port of dispatch) is desired also, letters must be prepaid in addition to the charges stated above the air mail fee of 4 cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof and 8 cents for each additional ounce or fraction thereof, and post cards 4 cents each. articles must be marked in addition "By Air to New York."

As yet no provision has been made for the dispatch by the United States domestic air mail service of parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Germany or any other foreign country.

AIR MAIL SERVICE—THE NETHERLANDS TO DUTCH EAST INDIES

In connection with the notice concerning the Netherlands to Dutch East Indies Air Mail Service which was published on pages 8 and 9 of the March, 1931, Postal Guide, note should be made that temporarily stops will be made at Rangoon, Burma, and Alorstar in the Nonfederated Malay State of Kedah, instead of at Akyat, Burma, and Bangkok, Siam.

Mails for Siam and Straits Settlements will be unloaded at Alorstar.

CHANGE IN FOREIGN AIR MAIL ROUTE NO. 5

Air mail service on the direct flights between Miami, Fla., and Cristobal, Canal Zone, will be changed to be from Miami by Kingston (Jamaica) and Barranquilla (Colombia) to Cristobal, and return, twice a week, effective with the flight due to leave Cristobal April 29 and the flight due to leave Miami May 1, 1931. This will supersede the present once a week service between Cristobal and Barranquilla after the flight leaving Cristobal April 23 and leaving Barranquilla April 25, and will omit direct supply of Cartagena, that point to be served by the Colombian service.

NEW COUNTERFEITS

The Treasury Department furnishes the following descriptions of new counterfeit notes:

\$5 Federal reserve note.—On the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, Va.; 1928 series; check letter "A," face plate No. 12; back plate number missing; H. T. Tate, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Lincoln.

This is a fairly deceptive counterfeit printed on one sheet of paper from photoetched plates which have been retouched by hand. The Lincoln portrait is poorly engraved in a manner denoting the work of an amateur, the beard having a stubby appearance and the delicate shading about the eyes, cheeks, and ears being coarse and rough. The vertical and horizontal lines forming the oval background are unevenly and irregularly executed. In series of 1928, the numerals 9 and 8 are out of line and imperfectly formed, and the period has been omitted after States under the Treasurer's signature and also after Treasury under the Secretary's name. The seal and numbering are embossed in dark grass green, the back being printed in the same shade which is decidedly off-color. Although this counterfeit will deceive the unwary handler of currency, it should be detected readily by reason of the poorly executed portrait which is the outstanding charac-

teristic. Specimen at hand bears serial No. E05097476A.
\$20 gold certificate.—Series of 1928; check letter "H," face plate No. 28; back plate No. 74; W. O. Woods, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Jackson.

This counterfeit is a photomechanical production printed on one sheet of paper of poor quality. Like most counterfeits produced by this process, the delicate detail involved in the engraving of a genuine note is not disclosed due to faulty etching and printing, this being particularly true of the portrait which is not clearly defined. However, notwithstanding these discrepancies, this note is calculated to deceive the average person who fails to scrutinize currency carefully. Specimen at hand bears serial No. A20797433A.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

PLANTS AND PLANT PRODUCTS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN MISSISSIPPI

Postmasters in the State of Mississippi are informed that facilities for the terminal inspection of plants and plant products at Greenwood and Holly Springs have been discontinued and, therefore, such material should not be sent to those places in future, but to the point at which inspection is maintained nearest to the office of address upon payment of the required postage, as prescribed by section 468, Postal Laws and Regulations.

PLANTS AND PLANT PRODUCTS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN OREGON

It has come to attention that some postmasters in the State of Oregon fail to carry out the provisions of section 468, Postal Laws and Regulations, requiring the submission to a proper terminal inspection point of parcels containing bulbs (dahlias, peonies, etc.) received at their offices through the mails. The attention of all postmasters in Oregon is, therefore, invited to the list of plants and plant products required to be sent for terminal inspection, such list being as follows:

"All florists' stock, trees, shrubs, vines, cuttings, grafts, scions, buds, fruit pits and other seeds of fruit and ornamental trees or shrubs, and other plants and plant products in the raw or unmanufactured state, except vegetable and flower seeds.' The term "and other plants and plant products in the raw or unmanufactured

state" includes all blubs and roots intended for propagation.

FORMS 3540 AND 3548 NOT BEARING THE NAMES OF POST OFFICES FROM WHICH SENT

Form 3540 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to Mr. Walter Cannon, route B, Anson, Tex., advising that a piece of mail is being held at his office for postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent, nor the amount of postage due, and it bears no

Form 3548 has been sent by some postmaster in the State of Colorado to the Simonsen Iron Works, Sioux Rapids, Iowa, advising that a letter is held at his office for 2 cents postage. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office, and the postmark is so imperfect that the name of the State only can be read.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster to the Equitable Life Insurance Co. of Iowa, Roanoke, Va., advising that a letter is being held for 2 cents postage.

The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from

which sent and bears no postmark.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to "H. O. Brien, R. V. C. Golf Club, R. V. C., L. I.," advising that a piece of mail is being held at his office for postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent, nor the amount of postage due, and the postmark is illegible.

The postmasters at the offices from which the notices were sent will promptly send to this office (Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classifi-

cation) other forms completely and properly filled out.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

SEPARATE REQUISITIONS TO BE SUBMITTED FOR STAMP COILS

The attention of postmasters at direct and central-accounting post offices is called to the importance of strict compliance with the instructions on Form 3201–A to the effect that stamp coils shall not be included on the same blank with postal cards and unprinted stamped envelopes, but that a separate requisition blank shall be used for the coils alone. If a separate requisition for the coils is not furnished by the postmaster, it must be prepared in the department before the order can be filled. This entails extra work in the department and tends to delay shipments of stock to post offices.

Postmasters are, therefore, urged to see that requisitions for stamp coils are properly submitted in the future.

WAR SAVINGS SECURITIES

It has recently come to the attention of the department that war savings and thrift stamps are being held at some post offices for investigation, or other reasons, beyond the time limit authorized in paragraph 120 (b) and (c), page 53 of the 1930 Official Postal Guide.

In order to ascertain whether such stamps are being retained in post offices, for any purpose, in excess of the 10-day limit authorized for registered stamps, or the 48-hour limit authorized for unregistered stamps, it is desired that post-masters at all first and second class offices shall cause a careful examination to be made of their vaults and files and also the desks of officials and employees at the main office, branches and stations, who have any duty to perform in connection with the handling of these securities. If any such stamps are found they should be promptly transmitted to the department with a letter giving a complete statement of the facts in each case.

The postmaster at every third and fourth class post office shall personally make the examination required in the preceding paragraph in order to determine whether or not any war savings, thrift or Treasury savings stamps are being held in the post office, for any reason beyond the time limit authorized, and to send to the department any of such stamps that may be found, with a letter giving a complete statement of the facts in each case.

RED CROSS COMMEMORATIVE POSTAGE STAMP

Postmasters and employees of the Postal Service are notified of the issuance of a special postage stamp in the 2-cent denomination to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the American Red Cross.

The new stamp is printed in two colors, black and red, and is the same size as the regular issue, 75/100 by 87/100 inch, arranged as an upright rectangle. The stamp is inclosed in a border formed by a heavy black outer and lighter inner line slightly indented along the center on all four sides. Across the top of the stamp in two lines are the words "United States Postage" in white-faced Roman lettering. The central design of the stamp, printed in black, is the figure of a Red Cross Nurse kneeling before the globe with outstretched hands, reproduced from the 1930 poster entitled "The Greatest Mother." In the upper part of the stamp at the left of the figure is the Greek cross with five equal squares, the emblem of the organization, printed in red. Arranged vertically, opposite the indentation on either side, are the dates in black Gothic figures, "1881" at the left and "1931" at the right. In both lower corners within white-bordered ovals with black background appears the white numeral "2." The ovals are surmounted by acanthus scroll ornaments. Across the bottom of the stamp in a straight line between the ovals containing the denomination numeral is the word "Cents" in white Roman letters.

The Red Cross commemorative stamp will be placed on sale May 21, 1931, at the post offices in Washington, D. C., and Dansville, N. Y. For the benefit of stamp collectors the new stamp will also be placed on sale the same date at the Philatelic Agency.

Postmasters at direct and central-accounting post offices may obtain a limited supply of the new commemorative stamp by requisition on the department, using Form 3201, indersed "Red Cross." Postmasters at third and fourth class post offices may obtain needed quantities by requisition on the central-accounting postmaster.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

INQUIRIES CONCERNING DOMESTIC REGISTERED, INSURED, OR COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY MAIL

Referring to Order No. 876 of the Postmaster General published in the April, 1931, Supplement, under the heading "Return Receipts for Domestic Registered and Insured Mail—Increased Fee When Requested After Mailing—Separate Additional Fee When Requested to Show Address Where Mail Is Delivered, postmasters are informed that inquiries concerning domestic registered, insured, or collect-on-delivery mail should not be sent without charge, at the request of the sender, until the sender has submitted evidence indicating that the addressee had not received the article after a reasonable time had elapsed since its mailing, or the sender is able to show that efforts made by him to obtain information from the addressee as to the receipt or nonreceipt of the article involved have been

If the sender desires inquiry sent without compliance with these conditions, he should be required to pay the 5-cent fee for a return receipt requested after mail-Patrons should not be permitted to obtain without cost information furnished on return receipts, for which charge is made, through the subterfuge of making inquiry instead of a request for a return receipt showing signature.

RECEIPTS OR CERTIFICATES OF MAILING FOR DOMESTIC ORDINARY MAIL OF ANY CLASS AND ADDITIONAL RECEIPTS OR CERTIFICATES OF MAILING FOR DOMESTIC ORDINARY REGISTERED, INSURED, AND COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY MAIL

The attention of postmasters is directed to Order No. 961 of the Postmaster General dated April 8, 1931, inserts Nos. 663 to 668, inclusive, in this Supplement, adding a new section, 1071¾, to the Postal Laws and Regulations, and making certain changes in connection with sections 448 and 449, to cover the issuance of receipts or certificates of mailing for ordinary mail of any class and additional certificates of mailing for domestic ordinary, registered, insured, and collect-ondelivery mail.

Postmasters should particularly note that:

1. The act of February 14, 1929, embodied in paragraph 1 of section 10713/4, makes provision for the furnishing of a receipt showing the mailing of ordinary mail of any class, and the act of January 13, 1931, embodied in paragraph 2 of section 1071¾, makes provision for the issuance of additional receipts or certificates of mailing to senders of domestic ordinary, registered, insured, and collect-

2. The original receipts issued for domestic registered, insured, and collect-ondelivery mail establish the registration, insurance, or the acceptance of mail to be sent collect-on-delivery and the regular registry, insurance, and collect-ondelivery fees collected also provide for indemnity in case of loss or rifling of, or damage to, such mail. The additional charge of 1 cent for each additional receipt issued as a certificate of mailing only, covering registered, insured, and collect-ondelivery mail, is the same as is charged for each certificate of mailing covering domestic ordinary mail of any class.

3. The following illustrations are cited to show the proper charges to be collected for receipts issued as certificates of mailing for domestic ordinary,

registered, insured, and collect-on-delivery articles:

(a) If a sender presents 10 ordinary articles with request for two certificates of mailing for each article and the articles are listed on firm mailing sheets, 10 cents should be charged for the 10 entries on the original firm mailing sheet and

10 cents for the 10 entries on the duplicate sheet.

(b) If a sender presents 10 articles for registration, insurance, or to be sent collect-on-delivery and requests one additional receipt as a certificate of mailing for each article and the articles are listed on firm mailing sheets, the charge for the original receipt is included in the prescribed registration, insurance, or collecton-delivery fees but in addition thereto 10 cents should be charged for the 10 entries on the duplicate sheet. If the sender requests two additional certificates of mailing for each of the articles listed, the charge would be 20 cents for the 20 certificates of mailing.

4. The forms to be used in issuing certificates of mailing are (a) Form 3817 when only 1, 2, or 3 pieces of mail of any kind are involved at one time and the senders do not already use firm mailing books; and (b) firm mailing books, Forms 3882 (5 entries), 3877 (15 entries), and 3881 (30 entries) when senders use firm mailing books. When such books are already in use by the sender, they may be used in issuing certificates of mailing even though less than three articles may be involved at one time.

5. When senders request certificates of mailing with sufficient frequency for an average of three or more pieces of mail at one time they may be furnished firm

mailing books for the purpose.

6. Certificates of mailing whether issued on Form 3817 or firm mailing sheets are to be filled out by the senders and presented with the mail at the post office.

7. When firm mailing books are used in issuing certificates of mailing covering any kind of domestic mail (ordinary, registered, insured, or collect-on-delivery) and one or more additional certificates of mailing for each article listed at the same mailing is requested, as many copies of the firm mailing sheets as may be necessary to accomplish this purpose at one writing should be used, but when additional receipts or certificates of mailing are desired for less than the total number of articles listed on the firm mailing sheets a separate firm sheet should be used for those articles which are less in number than the total entered on the original receipts. To illustrate: If a firm sheet contains 10 entries representing 10 articles and additional receipts are desired for the entire 10 entries, additional copies of the firm mailing sheet containing the original write-up may be made by the senders with one writing to meet the demand; but if a firm mailing sheet contains 10 entries representing 10 articles and additional certificates of mailing are desired for less than the entire number a separate firm sheet should be used for the lesser number of articles.

8. The only entries necessary to be made on Form 3817 or on firm mailing sheets issued as certificates of mailing for ordinary, registered, insured or collecton-delivery mail are the name of sender, class of mail, the name and address of the addressee, and the number of the article if registered, insured, or sent collecton-delivery. Of course, when certificates of mailing are requested for all of the entries on firm mailing sheets covering registered, insured, and collect-on-delivery mail being written at one time all of the receipts or certificates should cover what is required on the original receipt covering the registration, insurance, or

acceptance of the collect-on-delivery matter for mailing.

9. Uncanceled postage stamps to cover the charge for the certificates of mailing shall be affixed to the certificates and canceled by the postmark of the mailing office. Written signatures of accepting employees are not required on Form 3817, nor on firm mailing sheets when used only for certificates of mailing, the postmark affixed to the forms showing the genuineness of the certificates, but this does not prohibit the appearance of signatures on additional receipts issued as certificates of mailing when the original receipts and additional copies are signed by carbon process at the same time.

 The following statistics shall be kept in connection with receipts or certificates of mailing issued to the sender under the provisions of section 1071% of the Postal Laws and Regulations in order that the information may be available at any time and especially in order that the information may be included in the annual statistical report rendered to the Third Assistant Postmaster General,

Division of Registered Mails, on July 1, each year:

(a) Total number of receipts or certificates of mailing issued for domestic ordinary mail and paid for at 1 cent for each receipt or certificate of mailing furnished for each piece of ordinary mail described.

(b) Total number of domestic ordinary articles covered by such receipts or certificates of mailing.

(c) Total number of additional receipts or certificates of mailing issued for domestic registered mail and paid for at 1 cent for each receipt or certificate of mailing furnished for each piece of registered mail described. scribed

(d) Total number of domestic registered articles covered by such additional receipts or certificates of mail-

(e) Total number of additional receipts or certificates of mailing issued for domestic insured mail and paid for at 1 cent for each receipt or certificate of mailing furnished for each piece of insured mail described.

(f) Total number of domestic insured articles covered by such additional receipts or certificates of mail-

(g) Total number of additional receipts or certificates of mailing issued for domestic collect-on-delivery mail and paid for at 1 cent for each receipt or certificate of mailing furnished for each piece of C. O. D. mail

of mailing.

11. The usual record of original acceptance of registered, insured, and collecton-delivery mail at offices of mailing shall continue to be kept but no additional copies of the firm mailing sheets or Form 3817 are to be made for the sole purpose of keeping an office record of certificates of mailing or of any additional certificates of mailing issued for ordinary, registered, insured, or collect-on-delivery mail.

12. The record of the number of certificates of mailing issued for ordinary, registered, insured, and C. O. D. mail and of the number of articles represented

by such certificates may be kept on some convenient form improvised for the purpose, such as the registry dispatch book Form 3851 or sheet record of registered matter received for delivery, Form 3867, the most economical form being used for the purpose. If loose sheets are used as an improvised record, the sheets should be consecutively numbered so that all of them will be accounted for.
