

SUSPENSION OF MONEY-ORDER BUSINESS WITH THE BAHAMAS

DECEMBER 8, 1931

ORDER No. 2054.

It is ordered that on and after January 1, 1932, the issue of money orders in the United States for payment in the Bahama Islands, West Indies, shall be suspended until further notice.

STORAGE OF NO. 1 LOCKING SACKS

In order to relieve congestion in the several mail-bag depositories immediately after December 25, all postmasters at first-class offices are hereby directed to store in their offices, so far as facilities will permit, all No. 1 sacks equipped with locking-cord fasteners received by them and not actually needed for use at their offices.

Bundles of surplus No. 1 sacks must be opened and assorted by them, the No. 1 sacks equipped with locking fasteners to be packed 20 to the bundle, the twentieth sack to be used as a packer, and the No. 1 nonlocking sacks promptly dispatched to their nearest depository, together with other surplus sacks and pouches of various sizes which should also go forward to their depository. Postmasters at first-class offices, other than depositories, shall not store any of the No. 1 sacks equipped with nonlocking cord fasteners.

Careful examination must be made of sacks before they are placed in storage to see that no mail matter is left therein and also that no defective sacks are included with those placed in storage.

Semimonthly reports in the form of a letter are to be addressed to the General Superintendent, Railway Mail Service, reporting the number of sacks stored during the year. Only such post offices as store these sacks need make these reports, and the reports may be discontinued after October 15.

Storage of these sacks is to commence immediately after Christmas and should continue until all available storage space is filled.

OVERTIME PAY TABLES

The following table shows the hourly amounts to be paid post office employees for overtime service the last three Saturdays and for the last three Sundays in December and for Christmas Day, *when specifically authorized by the department*, in the salary grades *not* covered by the United States Post Office Department Salary Tables of 1926.

Particular attention is invited to the fact that while the act of February 28 1925, provides for overtime in lieu of compensatory time only in the cases of foremen, special clerks, clerks, carriers, etc., for the last three Sundays or on Christmas Day, the act of February 17, 1931, provides overtime in lieu of compensatory time for Saturday service to *all* employees only for the last three Saturdays in the year.

NAMES OF POSTMASTERS ON ACCOUNTS AND ALL RELATED PAPERS

In the examination of postal and money order accounts, vouchers, and papers pertaining thereto, it has been disclosed that the names of postmasters appearing thereon do not agree in many instances with the records of the department, such differences consisting principally in the omission or addition of middle initials or the omission of first names or initials. To correct such discrepancies, it is directed that hereafter the names of postmasters on vouchers and their signatures on accounts, *issued money orders*, and related papers, whether made by them personally or for them by employees authorized to do so, agree exactly with their names as they appear in their commissions as postmasters.

REDEPOSIT OF FUND FOLLOWING REINSTATEMENT IN SERVICE IS REQUIRED TO OBTAIN RETIREMENT ANNUITY

There appears to be a widespread misunderstanding among postal employees with reference to the matter of redepositing retirement deductions previously refunded, upon reinstatement in the service.

Section 12 of the act of May 29, 1930, in reference to deductions which have been refunded to employees separated from the service or transferred to positions not within the purview of the act, provides that, "* * * all money so returned to an employee must, upon reinstatement, transfer, or reappointment to a position coming within the purview of this act, be redeposited with interest before such employee may derive any benefit under this act, * * *."

Many employees have apparently been erroneously informed that the redeposit is not necessary and that failure to make such redeposit will result merely in loss of credit for the period of service covered by the refund. This is not in accordance with the law; redeposit with interest of the amount withdrawn from the retirement fund must be made before the benefits of the retirement act may be allowed, or, in other words, before an annuity may be granted.

The Pension Bureau has ruled that redeposit may be made at any time up to the date of filing application for annuity. However, it will be noted that interest is charged (at the rate of 4 per cent per annum) from the date of reinstatement, retransfer, or reappointment to the date such redeposit is made.

NOTE.—In this connection it should be emphasized that the word "redeposit" as used in the foregoing must not be confused with a voluntary deposit to purchase retirement credit for temporary or unclassified service performed after Aug. 1, 1920, which is entirely optional with the employee and in no way affects his right to annuity if otherwise earned under the provisions of the law.

It is suggested that this information be given publicity among postal employees subject to the retirement act.

ANNUAL REPORTS OF EXCESS LEAVE IN CONNECTION WITH RETIREMENT ACT

The attention of postmasters is called to the First Assistant Postmaster General's letter of March 10, 1927, subject, "Leaves of absence so far as relates to the retirement act," which required that reports of excess leave be forwarded to the Civil Service Commission at the beginning of each calendar year.

The commission hereafter expects to obtain information regarding leave from the individual retirement accounts on Form 2806. Postmasters will, therefore, continue to compile reports of excess leave in accordance with the present practice, but will hereafter submit them to the Comptroller of the Post Office Department, Division of Retirement Records, in order that the information may be recorded on Form 2806.

These reports are to be made as promptly as possible after January 1, and as directed in the letter of March 10, 1927, a report must be furnished by every office where there are employees subject to the retirement act, whether or not any such employees had leave of absence during the calendar year aggregating six months.

In the Railway Mail Service, division superintendents will continue to follow instructions in departmental Circular Letter No. 3010, dated April 16, 1927, and forward their reports of excess leave in duplicate to the general superintendent, who will retain one copy and transmit one to the Comptroller of the Post Office Department, Division of Retirement Records.

Excess leave is defined as "so much of any leaves of absence as may exceed six months in the aggregate in any calendar year." In determining excess leave, therefore, all leave should be totaled, i. e., sick leave with pay, annual leave or leave without pay, and that part of the total which is in excess of six months is the "excess leave." However, where the total leave in the calendar year aggregates more than six months, if any part thereof covers a period during which the employee was carried on the United States Employees' Compensation Commission rolls, the report must so state and must show the inclusive dates of such period.

HANDLE PARCEL POST CAREFULLY

The patrons measure the value of the Parcel Post Service by the condition of parcels when delivered, in addition to the expedition with which they are handled.

When parcels are received in a damaged condition, the post office is severely criticized.

Therefore it is necessary that all post-office employees exercise the greatest care in the handling of parcels in order that the public may have confidence in our service and continue the use of parcel post.

Do not place fragile articles in the bottom of sacks or hampers or on the bottom of mail trucks. Do not deliver damaged parcels to patrons until the parcels, received in bad condition, are rewrapped with the proper indorsement by a supervisor.

RURAL CARRIERS AND OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT

In a time of unemployment such as is now existing when persons who are out of work and in need of it to earn a livelihood for themselves and their dependents earnestly seek an opportunity to obtain employment, even if of a temporary character, we believe that those who are so fortunate as to have positions giving them a compensation that is regularly received and in an amount sufficient for their needs, should refrain from engaging in other work or from filling additional positions, leaving these opportunities to others less favorably situated.

Rural carriers for the most part receive good salaries, while their hours of work are short. This latter circumstance gives them ample time in which to engage in outside work, and this has not been forbidden where it was not in conflict with the provisions of law or regulations prohibiting them from acting as agents, soliciting, holding political or elective offices, etc., or where there were no sustained charges of unfair competition, except in particular cases in which for special reasons it has been deemed inexpedient to allow carriers to enter upon or continue in certain work or business enterprises.

However, as stated, rural carriers are generally well paid, and while we esteem among postal employees the qualities of initiative, ambition, and a desire to advance their financial condition in every proper way, where it does not infringe upon the rights of others, it is our view that at least under the existing conditions they should confine their activities, so far as gainful pursuits are concerned, to their official duties.

Many rural carriers have expressed their willingness to contribute of their salaries for the relief of the unemployed. By confining their work for pay to their duties as carriers, and leaving outside employment to others who need it and may thereby earn a living, instead of being under the necessity of accepting assistance, they will extend aid in a very helpful way.

Until the return of normal conditions rural carriers are requested to govern themselves in the spirit of these comments, by refraining from engaging in outside work, or occupations for wages, salaries, or pecuniary gain, and, where they can do so without undue personal or financial sacrifice, to discontinue work of such character in which they may now be engaged.

AIR MAIL SERVICE IN CHINA

The Postal Administration of China advises that the air-mail route operating between Manchouli and Shanghai has been discontinued until further notice.

CUSTOMS DECLARATIONS AND DISPATCH NOTES ACCOMPANYING PARCEL-POST PACKAGES ADDRESSED FOR DELIVERY IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES SHOULD BE PROPERLY COMPLETED

The attention of this department has been directed to the circumstance that a large number of parcel-post packages destined for delivery in foreign countries are being received at exchange offices accompanied by customs declarations and dispatch notes which have not been completed by the mailers and the offices of origin.

Inasmuch as the improper preparation of customs declarations and dispatch notes results in considerable delay in dispatch and frequently results in collection of fines in the country of destination, attention of all postmasters and others concerned is directed to the instructions contained in section 61 on page 236 and sections 82, 83, and 84 on page 241 of the current Official Postal Guide, which outline the manner in which the documents in question should be prepared.

Postmasters will cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices.

C. O. D. SERVICE WITH GERMANY

An agreement has been made, effective January 1, 1932, for collect-on-delivery service in connection with registered parcel-post packages exchanged (through the office of New York only) between Germany and this country (including Alaska, Hawaii, Porto Rico, Guam, Samoa, and the Virgin Islands of the United States). Note to this effect should be made in connection with the information concerning the parcel-post service with Germany which appears on pages 388 to 391 of the July, 1931, Postal Guide and in section 77 on page 240.

C. O. D. registered parcels for delivery in Germany are subject to the same postage rate, size and weight limits, prohibitions, conditions of mailing, and other formalities, so far as applicable, as are prescribed for registered parcels for Germany which are without trade (collect-on-delivery) charges.

The maximum amount to be collected on delivery shall, for the present, be \$45. The amount to be collected on delivery is required to be expressed in dollars and cents in connection with parcels mailed in Germany as well as in connection with parcels mailed in this country.

The C. O. D. fees as well as the postage charges must be prepaid at the time of mailing. When the C. O. D. charges are less than the value, the sender may pay a higher fee in order to obtain indemnity for loss, rifling, or damage within the limit of indemnity allowable for the fee paid. The fees are as follows:

C. O. D. fee	Covers collection of—	Covers indemnity
35 cents.....	Not over \$10.....	Not over \$10.

Each registered C. O. D. parcel for Germany must be given only one original number, which shall be the registration number. Where advisable, a separate series of numbers may be assigned for registered C. O. D. parcels for Germany, and separate registration records may be maintained for such parcels. Where the quantity of such mail is limited, it may be numbered in the same series and recorded on the same forms as other registered parcels for Germany.

The usual registration receipt will be issued for C. O. D. registered parcels addressed for delivery in Germany, and, in addition to the data ordinarily placed upon such receipts, there must be added a notation showing the amount of charges to be collected and the amount of the C. O. D. fee paid, exclusive of the postage. The mailing office record kept of each C. O. D. registered parcel addressed to Germany must also bear an entry showing the amount of charges to be collected and the amount of C. O. D. fee paid, exclusive of the postage. Firm mailing records may be used when desired. Postmasters shall be prepared to furnish at the end of each fiscal year, and at such other times as they may be called upon, separate statistics showing the number of parcels sent as C. O. D. registered mail to Germany at each fee prescribed.

As in the case of registered parcels for Germany without trade charges, return receipts will be furnished for C. O. D. registered parcels for Germany. (See sec. 126 on page 254 of the current annual Postal Guide.) Such return receipts shall be stamped or marked "Collect on Delivery," or "C. O. D."

Also, as in the case of registered parcels without trade charges, the responsibility of properly closing, packing, and sealing C. O. D. parcels for Germany rests upon the sender and the postal service of neither country will assume liability for loss arising from defects which may not be observed at the time of posting.

Requests for the return or change of address of C. O. D. parcels will be sent to the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service, the same as requests for return or change of address of parcels for Germany without trade charges.

No request for an increase in the C. O. D. charges may be made.

Requests for a reduction or cancellation of the C. O. D. charges must be made by senders, in writing, to their local postmasters, a complete description of the particular C. O. D. parcel involved being given. In each instance the postmaster at the office of mailing should make out a Form 3818 or a letter indicating the nature of the alteration of the C. O. D. charges, filling in all necessary particulars, and then transmit the Form 3818 or letter direct to the postmaster at New York. The letter of authorization from the senders should be filed by the postmaster at the office of mailing, with the mailing-office record.

Requests for a reduction or cancellation of the C. O. D. charges on parcels from Germany will be sent through the New York office. Postmasters receiving requests from the postmaster at New York for a reduction or cancellation of the amounts of the C. O. D. charges on C. O. D. parcels mailed in Germany will promptly comply with such requests. If such requests are received directly from Germany they should be referred to the postmaster at New York to have them verified. The C. O. D. parcels involved should in the meantime be held for reply from New York.

Each C. O. D. parcel (on the address side) and the relative dispatch note must bear the conspicuous impression of an official rubber stamp or label reading "Collect on delivery" (or "C. O. D.") or "Remboursement," according to whether the parcel is mailed in this country or in Germany, and in close proximity to these words there must appear the number (only one original number) given the parcel and after it must be shown in Arabic figures and in Roman letters the exact amount of collect-on-delivery charges (for instance, "\$25.75, Twenty-five Dollars and Seventy-five Cents"); in other words, the amount in letters is to be "printed" or typewritten and not written in the ordinary script. The amount of collect-on-delivery charges must be invariably expressed in dollars and cents and it shall not include the additional money-order fee that will be collected in the country making delivery of the parcel for making the remittance to the sender in the country of mailing.

Extreme care shall be exercised to see that the correct amount of C. O. D. charges is recorded in the office record before the parcel is sent out for delivery, as the Postal Administration of the United States will be responsible for any error in failing to collect the correct amount of C. O. D. charges as stated on the parcel. In this event, collection may be made from the employee responsible for the error if the collection can not be subsequently made from the addressee. Record of the amount of C. O. D. charges noted on the C. O. D. parcel must be kept even though the parcel is forwarded to the addressee at another office or returned to the sender.

Examination of the contents of a C. O. D. parcel from Germany by the addressee is prohibited until proper receipt therefor is obtained (on Form 3849b) and the C. O. D. charges and any other charges that may be due thereon have been collected even though the sender or addressee may make request that such action be permitted. Any postal employee permitting such preliminary examination by the addressee may be held personally responsible in case of financial loss to the sender resulting from such action.

C. O. D. registered parcels from Germany are subject to delivery fees and customs clearance and accounting charges (see secs. 92 and 93 on p. 246 of the current annual Postal Guide) and storage or demurrage charges (see sec. 100 on p. 247 of the same Guide), the same as other parcels from Germany.

DISPATCH AND HANDLING IN TRANSIT IN THIS COUNTRY

C. O. D. registered parcels for Germany are to be sent to New York for inclusion in the C. O. D. mails there made up for Germany.

Except as may otherwise be provided in these instructions, it is intended that C. O. D. registered parcels for and from Germany will be recorded, handled, and dispatched in transit between the offices of mailing or destination and New York in the same manner as other registered parcels exchanged with that country.

When the quantity or bulk of registered C. O. D. parcels for Germany available for dispatch from any United States post office or railway post office to New York is sufficient to warrant the use of a separate pouch or jacket, the bill should be headed to indicate that the articles described therein are C. O. D. parcels.

TREATMENT AT OFFICES OF ADDRESS

Collect-on-delivery registered parcels from Germany shall be delivered and recorded at the post office of address in the United States in the same manner and on the same records, in so far as practicable, as other registered parcels from Germany, such records to show the date of receipt, C. O. D. (registration)

number, post office of mailing in Germany, including the name of the state if available, the amount of C. O. D. charges to be collected on delivery, and disposition (including number and date of money order, if delivered, or date and to whom forwarded or returned).

When C. O. D. registered parcels from Germany are returned by carriers undelivered, or when they are delivered and the C. O. D. charges turned in by the carriers, the office record of the parcels must be checked in the carrier's presence and the entries as checked initialed by the post-office employee who accepts and assumes custody of the C. O. D. charges or of the undelivered C. O. D. parcels.

FORWARDING OR RETURN

C. O. D. parcels exchanged with Germany may not be forwarded to a third country. They may be forwarded within either country. Otherwise, senders of C. O. D. parcels for Germany may provide, in case they are undeliverable as originally addressed, or other disposition to be made of them. (See sec. 61 on pp. 236 and 237 of the current annual Postal Guide.)

C. O. D. parcels from Germany that bear an indorsement on the wrapper, or dispatch note, that they are to be delivered at another United States post office, if they are undeliverable as originally addressed, will be subject to the payment of additional postage when they are reforwarded. (See sec. 94 on pp. 246 and 247 of the July, 1931, Postal Guide.)

Undeliverable C. O. D. parcels for and from Germany are subject to the same conditions as are other undeliverable parcels for and from Germany. (See secs. 95-97 on p. 247 of the current annual Postal Guide.)

Record must be kept at the post office from which any C. O. D. parcel from Germany is forwarded or returned showing the office and State in the United States or in Germany to which the parcel is redirected or returned, and the date of forwarding or return.

The delivering post office shall collect from the addressee of a collect-on-delivery parcel from Germany the entire amount of the collect-on-deliver charges shown on the parcel, which entire amount, without any deduction for any charges of any kind, shall be remitted to the sender by means of an international money order. (See instructions of the Third Assistant Postmaster General in this bulletin in this connection.)

INDEMNITY

As in the case of other registered parcels exchanged with Germany, except in cases of loss or damage through force majeure, as that term is defined by the legal decisions or rulings of the country in the service of which the loss or damage occurs, when a C. O. D. parcel exchanged with Germany has been lost, rifled, or damaged, the sender or other rightful claimant is entitled to an indemnity corresponding to the actual amount of the loss, rifling, or damage, based on the actual value at the time and place of mailing, unless the loss, rifling, or damage has arisen from the fault or negligence of the sender or addressee or of the representative of either or from the nature of the article, provided that the indemnity shall not exceed the sum for which the required C. O. D. fee was paid in the country of origin.

Also when delivery has been made and the C. O. D. charges have not been remitted the sender or other rightful claimant is entitled to the amount of the C. O. D. charges, which shall not exceed the sum for which the required C. O. D. fee was paid in the country of origin.

When less than the proper amount is collected from the addressee on delivery through fault of the postal service of either country, the sender shall be entitled only to indemnity equal to the difference between the amount erroneously collected and the amount of collect-on-delivery (trade) charges which should have been collected as indicated by the sender at the time of mailing.

No indemnity will be paid for C. O. D. parcels which contain matter of no intrinsic value unless the articles were delivered and the charges not remitted nor for perishable matter or matter prohibited transmission in the parcel-post mails exchanged with Germany or which were not posted in the manner prescribed.

Responsibility for C. O. D. parcels ceases when the parcels have been delivered and receipt therefor given as well as when the parcels can not be accounted for in consequence of the destruction of official documents through force majeure.

No compensation will be given for loss, injury, or damage indirectly arising from the loss, damage, delay, misdelivery, or nondelivery of C. O. D. parcels exchanged with Germany.

Should a C. O. D. parcel for which a claim for indemnity has been made be recovered, the postmaster at whose office the parcel is recovered shall hold the parcel and request instructions from the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service.

Claims for indemnity involving loss, rifling, or damage of C. O. D. registered parcels addressed to Germany shall be filed on Form 565 and otherwise treated in the same manner as claims arising in connection with other international registered mail.

Claims for indemnity known to involve *failure to remit C. O. D. charges or an incorrect amount of C. O. D. charges*, shall be made on Form 3812 and sent direct to the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service.

MISCELLANEOUS

Dutiable or supposed dutiable C. O. D. parcels from Germany are subject to the treatment prescribed by the joint regulations governing the treatment of mail matter received from foreign countries involving the customs revenue, appearing in section 632, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924.

Inquiries and suggestions and other correspondence concerning the C. O. D. service with Germany and the payment of indemnity in connection therewith should be addressed to the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service.

Postmasters are requested to give as much publicity to the establishment of C. O. D. service with Germany as is practicable without expense to the department and to encourage the patronage of the service.

RATES OF POSTAGE APPLICABLE TO LETTERS FOR THE REPUBLIC OF HONDURAS AND BRITISH HONDURAS, RESPECTIVELY

This department has been advised that letters for the Republic of Honduras, prepaid 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof, are being rated as shortpaid, although fully prepaid as set forth under the item "Honduras (*Republic of*)" on page 412 of the Postal Guide for July, 1931.

By reference to the notice of this office printed on page 10 of the Postal Guide for October, 1931, it will be seen that the rate of postage applicable to letters for *British Honduras* is 5 cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof and 3 cents for each additional ounce or fraction thereof.

Postmasters will cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices, and the widest publicity, without expense to the department, to be given thereto.

DIVISION OF FINANCE

NEW COUNTERFEIT

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

\$10 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE

On the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, Ill.; series of 1928 A; check letter K; face plate No. 35; back plate No. 82; W. O. Woods, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Hamilton.

This production is printed on one sheet of paper from photomechanical plates of unusually good workmanship. Both face and back plates are one-fifth inch shorter than the genuine and the paper has been purposely soiled to lend to the counterfeit the appearance of age. The sharply defined details which distinguish the portrait engraving in the genuine are missing in the counterfeit, and the plate numbers are irregular in formation, due to faulty etching. Specimen at hand bears serial number G01847623A.

In view of the deceptive character of this counterfeit, care should be exercised in handling notes of this variety and denomination.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

UNDELIVERABLE THIRD OR FOURTH CLASS MATTER BEARING A PLEDGE TO PAY RETURN POSTAGE MUST BE INDORSED WITH REASON FOR NONDELIVERY WHEN RETURNED TO SENDER

It has been reported that some postmasters, when returning to the senders undeliverable catalogues bearing a pledge guaranteeing payment of return postage, fail to comply with the provisions of section 615, Postal Laws and Regulations, requiring that each undeliverable piece of returnable mail matter must be indorsed or stamped with the reason for nondelivery.

Postmasters are requested to give this matter their personal attention and to see that every undeliverable catalogue or piece of other third or fourth class matter bearing a pledge guaranteeing payment of return postage is indorsed or stamped to show definitely why it can not be delivered. Special care should also be exercised to see that the name and address of the addressee are not obliterated by the indorsement.

FORMS 3548 NOT BEARING NAMES OF POST OFFICES FROM WHICH SENT

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster to Miss Rose Amato, 403 Summit Avenue, Union City, N. J., advising that a letter addressed to her is being held at his office for 2 cents postage. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent, and it bears no postmark.

Form 3548 was sent by a postmaster in Michigan addressed to Miss Anna Robinson, 116 Highby Street, Reed City, Mich., advising that a piece of mail is being held for postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which sent and the postmark is not sufficiently complete to give this information.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to Miss Bessie Sickles, Council Grove, Kans., advising that a letter is being held at his office for 1 cent postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it bears no postmark.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to Mrs. George Keough, Watersmeet, Mich., advising that a letter is being held at his office for 2 cents postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it bears no postmark.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to Mr. Iver E. Thornton, 712 West Clay Street, Richmond, Va., advising that a piece of printed matter is being held at his office for one-half cent postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it bears no postmark.

Form 3548 has been sent by a postmaster addressed to Mr. Thomas Kjeer, Bode, Iowa, advising that a piece of merchandise is being held at his office for 11 cents postage due. The card is not filled out to show the name of the post office and State from which it was sent and it bears no postmark.

The postmasters at the offices from which these notices were sent will promptly send to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification, other Forms 3548 completely and properly filled out.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

POSTMASTERS TO FURNISH DATE OF REQUISITIONS

Regardless of the repeated instructions directed against the practice, telegrams and letters of inquiry are still being received in the department from postmasters concerning the filling of pending orders for postage stamps or other stamped paper that fail to state the date of the requisition, which is needed for identification purposes. The omission of the requisition date from such communications represents a serious disregard of departmental instructions which have been provided to facilitate the filling of post-office orders for stamp supplies at a minimum expense.

Postmasters are again cautioned to see that every letter or telegram sent to the department with reference to an unfilled order for postage stamps, postal cards, or stamped envelopes shall include the date of the requisition.

USE OF POSTAGE STAMPS AS REMITTANCES BY POSTMASTERS PROHIBITED

It has come to the notice of the department that some postmasters are using postage stamps in sending remittances through the mails in payment of merchandise or settlement of personal accounts. The practice is in direct violation of the law governing the sale and use of postage stamps and other stamped paper by postmasters and postal employees, as specifically stated in section 146, Postal Laws and Regulations, and must positively be discontinued immediately.

The department has also been advised that postmasters at some fourth-class post offices have been offering inducements to local patrons to increase their mailings by accepting parcel-post matter for dispatch at less than the lawful postage rate, the difference being paid by the postmaster from his cancellation receipts, for which the postmaster would receive reimbursement through the increased commissions on cancellations. Such practices are, likewise, contrary to the provisions of the law in section 146, Postal Laws and Regulations, and will not be permitted to continue.

All postmasters and postal employees who have custody of stamp supplies are hereby directed to read and become familiar with the provisions of section 146, Postal Laws and Regulations, for their future guidance. Postmasters or postal employees who fail to comply with the law relating to the sale and use of postage stamps hereafter will be subject to the penalties provided in the above section.

III OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES COMMEMORATIVE STAMP

Postmasters and employees of the Postal Service are notified that the department is preparing to issue a special postage stamp in the 2-cent denomination in honor of the international Olympic winter games to be held at Lake Placid, N. Y., in February, 1932.

The stamp is a horizontal rectangle $7\frac{5}{100}$ inch by $8\frac{7}{100}$ inch in dimensions, printed in red ink and inclosed in a single line border. Across the top of the stamp in a straight line are the words "United States Postage" in white Roman, and directly below in white Gothic lettering is the wording "III Olympic Winter Games."

The central design is a representation of a ski jumper in action, in the position of descent from right to left, with a background formed by a snow-covered mountain landscape and overcast sky. Across the base of the central design in two lines in dark Gothic lettering appear the wording "Lake Placid, New York," and the dates "February 4-13, 1932." In each lower corner is a large white numeral "2." Extending across the bottom of the stamp between the numerals are the words "Two Cents" in white Roman.

The new commemorative stamp will be first placed on sale at the post office in Lake Placid, N. Y., on January 25, 1932, and at other post offices and the Philatelic Agency beginning January 26.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancellations of the 2-cent Olympic winter games stamp may send a limited number of addressed covers, not to exceed 25, to the postmaster, Lake Placid, N. Y., with a cash or postal money order remittance to exactly cover the value of the stamps required for affixing; *other postage stamps will positively not be accepted in payment.* Covers will be accepted from bona fide subscribers only, and each cover must be properly and legibly addressed; covers bearing pencil addresses will not be accepted. Special care must be taken in addressing covers to bear blocks of four of the stamps to allow sufficient clear space for the attaching of the stamps. Compliance can not be made with unusual requests, such as for the affixing of stamps bearing plate numbers or the irregular placing of the stamps on covers, etc. Requests for a supply of uncanceled stamps must not be included in orders for first-day covers. If uncanceled stamps of the new commemorative issue are desired for collection purposes, a separate order should be sent to the Philatelic Agency, Division of Stamps, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C., and it will receive prompt attention.

Postmasters at direct and central-accounting post offices may obtain a limited supply of the new stamps by special requisition on the department, using Form 3201, indorsed "Olympic Winter Games." Postmasters at third-class and fourth-class post offices may submit requisitions on Form 3338, with required remittance of postal funds, to the central-accounting postmaster for needed supplies of the new stamp.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

METHOD OF PLACING ROTARY LOCKS ON POUCHES AND SACKS TO FACILITATE READING AND CHECKING OF LOCK NUMBERS AND LABELS

It has been reported that postal employees are not carefully observing the instructions previously published on page 28 of the June, 1928, Postal Guide, regarding the method to be used in placing rotary locks on pouches and sacks to facilitate reading and checking of lock numbers and labels.

The instructions previously issued on this subject are reprinted below for the information of all employees:

"The attention of this office has been called to difficulty experienced in reading numbers on rotary locks attached to pouches and sacks, mostly due to the fact that the locks are attached to the pouches or sacks with the windows down.

"To secure uniformity in the locking of rotary-locked pouches and to facilitate the reading and checking of lock numbers and labels, it is requested that in closing rotary-locked pouches and sacks the shackle or hook of the lock be placed in the top of the staple extending downward, rather than attaching the lock from the bottom of the staple upward. The placing of rotary locks on pouches and sacks in this manner will bring the windows of the locks exposing rotary numbers on the top and also bring the fixed numbers of the locks in front of the employee recording or checking the same.

"If all registered pouches and sacks are locked in this manner employees will be able to check the lock numbers quicker than if attached in the opposite manner, and time will be saved in close connections.

"It has been noted that while a number of employees are now locking rotary-locked pouches in the manner herein requested, there are a number who do not do so, and those who do not will doubtless realize the advantage of doing so in regular practice.

"The method of placing rotary locks on pouches and sacks applies to both railway-mail employees and post-office employees. It is just as simple as the opposite method and whether the locks are recorded as the pouches are closed with the rotary locks or recorded and checked after the closing of the pouches, either in the original make-up or in transit, the advantages in uniformity secured and the facility of handling of rotary-locked pouches and sacks will be apparent to all involved."

DEFECTIVE ROTARY LOCKS, SACKS, AND POUCHES NOT TO BE USED IN DISPATCHING REGISTERED MAIL

Reports indicate that postal employees are not carefully observing the instructions given in article 40, page 130 of the July, 1931, Postal Guide, to the effect that equipment used in dispatching registered mail must be thoroughly examined before being used.

The attention of all postmasters and postal employees concerned is directed to the necessity of carefully examining rotary locks, pouches, and sacks, to be used in connection with making dispatches of registered mail, for the purpose of ascertaining that the equipment is in good condition. Any rotary locks which appear to be defective in any way, and any pouches or sacks found to be in other than good condition, should be withheld from use and transmitted to the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Mail Equipment Shops, Washington, D. C., with appropriate letter of transmittal.

In this connection see section 1453, of the Postal Laws and Regulations, as to the disposition of defective mail locks, sections 930 and 1442 as to defective mail bags, and sections 1454 and 1455 as to the disposition of surplus locks, and section 1443 as to disposition of surplus mail bags.

SENDERS' RETURN RECEIPTS FOR REGISTERED MAIL TO BE PROPERLY COMPLETED AND PROMPTLY RETURNED TO THE SENDERS

Notwithstanding the repeated publication of instructions cautioning postal employees to exercise care to see that senders' return receipts are properly completed and promptly returned, this office continues to receive reports indicating that proper care and attention is not being given this matter.

The majority of complaints indicate that restrictive indorsements on registered mail are not always observed and that information showing address at which

registered articles were delivered is not added to the return receipts when delivery of the registered matter is effected and when the sender has paid the fee of 23 cents required for a return receipt showing address where delivery is effected. In this connection see the instructions printed on pages 191 to 194 of the July, 1931, Postal Guide.

Postal employees are therefore again enjoined to see that properly completed return receipts are promptly furnished in all cases where such receipts have been requested by the senders.

All requests for return receipts requested at the time of mailing, but which were not received by the senders, or for return receipts requested after mailing, must also be given careful attention. Such receipts, when obtained, are to be mailed under cover to the postmaster making request for same in order that he may clear his files of the item.

Care must be exercised to see that all return receipts are legibly postmarked and that date of delivery of the registered article is correctly noted on each return receipt. The foregoing is equally applicable to return receipts for insured mail.

GASOLINE PURCHASES—USE OF FORMS NOS. 44 AND 1066

Postmasters at offices having Government-operated motor vehicle service who are using standard Forms 44 and 1066 in connection with the purchase of gasoline should observe the following instructions and institute the following-described procedure, beginning Jan. 1, 1932:

1. The standard Form 44 constitutes a part of the payment for gasoline and is not an incident of partial deliveries under a contract.

2. Where local conditions demand the use of more than one standard Form 44 per month, a brief outline of such conditions should be attached to each requisition for additional forms.

(a) One standard Form 44 should be issued the contractor, or vendor, covering the total amount paid for at one time.

(b) The corresponding Form 1066 should be forwarded to the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies, preferably under separate cover.

(c) When forwarding the first 1066 covering purchases on or after January 1, 1932, a report of the serial numbers of forms then on hand should be inclosed. (The serial number is the "D" number appearing in the upper right-hand corner of the form.)

3. A requisition for additional forms should not be submitted more than three months before the contemplated date of exhaustion of present stock, unless such date so nearly coincides with the next requisition period that there is imminent danger of stock becoming exhausted before the next requisition can be filled.

CHANGE No. 99 (Australia, p. 270).

The fourth and fifth paragraphs appearing under the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Australia—Parcel Post," on page 270 of the current Official Postal Guide, are superseded by the following:

"Second-hand carpets and similar articles, unless disinfected to the satisfaction of the quarantine officer, from Asia, all parts, and neighboring islands, including Japan, East Indies, and Philippine Islands; Egypt; Hawaiian Islands; Madagascar; Mauritius; Polynesian Islands; West Indies; Russia; Central, North, and South America; Africa, all parts; Austria-Hungary; Turkey."

CHANGE No. 100 (Belgian Congo (via Belgium), p. 282).

A new route via Portuguese West Africa has been opened for the dispatch of ordinary parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Katanga Province, Belgian Congo, up to a weight limit of 11 pounds when prepaid at the postage rate of 14 cents a pound or fraction thereof, in addition to the transit charges indicated below:

<i>1 to 2 pounds</i>	<i>3 to 11 pounds</i>
\$0.48	\$0.78

Although parcels intended for dispatch via this new route, which is in addition to the one now shown on page 282 of the current Official Postal Guide, are restricted to 11 pounds in weight, mailers are offered this additional facility for the reason that parcels so dispatched are forwarded from Antwerp every 12 days direct to Bukama, Dilolo, Elisabethville, Kamina, or Likasi, thus permitting parcels to be delivered in Belgian Congo from 7 to 9 days earlier than when forwarded via the regular route.

Appropriate addition should be made to the item "Belgian Congo—Parcel post (via Belgium)" shown on page 282.

CHANGE No. 101 (Bulgaria, p. 299).

Each parcel-post package or group of parcels when sent under the group shipment arrangement, addressed for delivery in Bulgaria, must be accompanied by three customs declarations.

The above modifies the information now shown in the fifteenth column of the parcel-post table appearing on page 299.

CHANGE No. 102 (Cuba, pp. 332 to 334).

Consular invoices relating to parcel-post shipments mailed at localities where no Cuban consul is stationed, need no longer be forwarded to Cuban consuls for visa, as required in the case of parcels mailed in cities where such consuls are located.

In such a case, the sender should complete the regular consular invoice forms, send two exact copies by registered mail to the collector of customs, Habana; or to the chief of the customs section, Treasury Department, Habana, if the shipment is addressed to a place other than Habana; and should inclose the original invoice in the parcel, also inclosing the registry receipt issued by the post office at the time of mailing the two copies. The following declaration should appear *in Spanish* on the reverse side, in lieu of the consular visa:

CHANGE No. 105 (sec. 39, p. 215; sec. 40, p. 216; French Establishments in Oceania, p. 382).

Articles transmitted under the classification of "small packets" are prohibited importation by the Postal Administration of the French Settlements in Oceania.

In view of the above, the following changes should be made:

Page 382.—Add the following to the subheading "Prohibitions":

CHANGE No. 106 (Greece, pp. 404 and 405).

The offices of Katastarion, Machairadon, Kosma Kynourias, Paloumba, and Monastirakion are designated to engage in the exchange of ordinary parcel-post packages between the United States and Greece.

The offices mentioned above should be added in alphabetical order to the list of those authorized to participate in the parcel-post service shown on pages 404 and 405.

Note 16 should be added on page 235 to read as follows: "Rates of postage applicable to raised prints for the blind mailed in British India and addressed for delivery in the United States: 9 pies up to 2 pounds avoirdupois; 9 pies for each additional 2 pounds up to 10 pounds; 4 annas 6 pies from 10 to 11 pounds."

The item "India, British" on page 232 is modified accordingly.

CHANGE No. 108 (sec. 39, p. 215; sec. 40, p. 216; Niger, p. 495).

Articles transmitted under the classification of "small packets" are prohibited importation by the Postal Administration of Niger.

In view of the above, the following changes should be made:

Section 39, page 215: The word "Niger" should be deleted from the list of those countries for which "small packets" may be accepted.

Section 40, page 216: Insert the word "Niger" between "New Zealand" and "Norway."

Page 495, regular mail table: The information now shown in the second, third, and fourth columns of the subheading "small packets" should be superseded by the words "No service."

Page 495: Eliminate the subheading "small packets."

Page 495: Add the following to the subheading "Prohibitions":

"Articles transmitted under the classification of 'small packets'."

CHANGE No. 109 (Union of Socialistic Soviet Republics, p. 567).

The following supersedes the information now appearing in the list under the caption "List of Articles Allowed to Enter Without a Permit When Intended for Personal Use" now appearing on page 567.

Add the following new paragraph:

"Films, celluloid, etc."

CHANGE No. 111 (France, pp. 371 and 372).

The item "France—Parcel Post," subheading "Prohibitions," on pages 371 and 372, should be modified as follows:

Eliminate the last paragraph on page 371 and the first paragraph on page 372.

In the first line of the fourth paragraph on page 372 eliminate the words "and plants in general."

CHANGE No. 112 (Greece, p. 405).

At the end of the subheading "For sanitary reasons" of the item "Greece—Parcel Post—Prohibitions," on page 405 (Change No. 78 in the November Supplement), add the following new paragraph:

"The importation of gluten-flour biscuits and gluten flour is permitted on condition that they contain nitrogenized substances, at least 60 per cent for biscuits and at least 80 per cent for flour. Parcels containing such products must be accompanied by a certificate issued by a chemical laboratory in the country of origin."

At the end of the subheading "For the protection of animals or plants," on the same page, add "Unseeded cotton."

CHANGE 113 (Greece, p. 405).

As worn shoes, sent under any conditions, are now absolutely prohibited in the parcel-post mails to Greece, the words "old shoes destined for commerce or if unfit for use" in the fourth and fifth lines of the first paragraph of the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Greece—Parcel Post," on page 405, should be changed to read "old shoes."

CHANGE No. 114 (Grenada and Grenadines, p. 231).

The rates of postage applicable to letters and post cards mailed in Grenada and the Grenadines and addressed for delivery in the United States are as follows:

CHANGE No. 115, Iraq (p. 426).

"Medicines, drugs, and chemical supplies."

CHANGE No. 116 (Japan, etc., pp. 441, 443).

In Change No. 79, published in the November Supplement, under the subheading "Prohibitions" of the items "Japan, Chosen (Korea), and Taiwan (Formosa)—Regular Mails," replace the three paragraphs beginning with the words "Rice, whether husked or not," by the following:

"Rice, except that imported by permission or order of the Government and that imported as specimens or samples, must be accompanied by a certificate of origin issued by the Japanese consul at the place of exportation; or, if there is no Japanese consul, by the competent authorities or the chamber of commerce and industry at that place."

The same modification should be made under the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Taiwan (Formosa)—Parcel Post," on page 443, as amended by Change No. 79 above referred to.

CHANGE No. 117 (Malta, p. 463).

Parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Malta are now subject to the following transit charges, which are in addition to the postage rate of 14 cents a pound or fraction thereof:

The above should be added to the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Mexico—Regular Mails" on page 471.

CHANGE No. 119 (Netherlands, pp. 483 and 484).

Pages 483 and 484, Netherlands—Parcel Post—Prohibitions, subheading "For sanitary reasons."

Replace the paragraphs beginning with the words "The following" and "Preparations" (including Change No. 23 in the August Supplement), as well as the tables "Model A" and "Model B," by the following:

"The following are admitted conditionally: Fresh or frozen meats, coming from solid-hoofed animals, from cattle, sheep, goats and pigs (including pigskins), as well as unmelted fat from those animals, must fulfill the requirements of the Dutch veterinary service. On entry, the shipments are subjected to an official examination.

"Preparations of meat are subject to veterinary inspection on entry. Their importation is generally prohibited. The following are admitted: Fats; meat salted, smoked, boiled, or preserved to the satisfaction of the minister; preserved meats in cans, glasses, or other hermetically sealed containers (with indication of the contents and the name and address of the maker); sausages (with the composition designated on the wrapper); entrails, bladders, and rennets, salted and dried.

"The following are admitted without veterinary inspection, and do not require the veterinary certificate: (1) Shipments of meat preparations not exceeding 5 kilograms in weight, on condition that they are intended for the use of the addressee himself and that his occupation has no connection with the slaughtering, conservation, preparation or sale of meats; (2) melted fats from animals used for meat; (3) organs used for the manufacture of organic preparations on a scientific basis, addressed to certain factories (designated by the minister). The shipments must be accompanied by a veterinary's declaration, certifying that the contents

have been inspected and found healthy; (4) meats prepared in such a way that they are no longer fit for human consumption; (5) game, fowl, pastes, or soups from game or fowl, as well as preserves consisting principally of other ingredients than meat, but to which a small quantity of meat has been added.

"Every shipment of preserved meat (with the exception of the articles mentioned under Nos. 1 to 5 above) must be accompanied, in order not to be rejected, by a veterinary certificate like the following model, *in Dutch*, with an interlineary authority."

Strike out the words "telephone and telegraph apparatus" in the first paragraph of the subheading "Prohibitions."

Add the following new paragraph at the end of the same subheading:

"Telephone and telegraph apparatus, except by special permission from the Nicaraguan Government."

CHANGE No. 121. (Portugal, p. 518.)

At the end of the subheading "For sanitary reasons" of the item "Portugal—Parcel Post—Prohibitions," on page 518, add the following new paragraph:

"It is forbidden to import medicinal specialties which are not addressed to wholesale firms, to pharmacists or laboratories, duly registered with the Directorate General of Health (*Direcção Geral de Saúde*); the wrappers and labels should in all cases bear clear, complete information, in the Portuguese language, concerning the name and composition of the medicine (Decree No. 19331)."

CHANGE No. 122 (Portuguese East Africa, p. 519).

Parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Portuguese East Africa (Mozambique) will be forwarded on direct steamers calling at Lourenco Marques and Beira, and the transit charges indicated on page 519 will no longer apply, parcels being subject only to the postage rate of 14 cents a pound or fraction thereof.

In view of the above, appropriate change should be made to the item "Portuguese East Africa (Mozambique)—Parcel post" on page 519.

CHANGE No. 123 (Southern Rhodesia, p. 525).

At the end of the first paragraph of the subheading "Prohibitions" of the item "Rhodesia, Southern—Regular Mails," on page 525, add the following sentence: "However, this does not apply to rough diamonds, the importation of which is not admitted either in the regular mails or in the form of parcel post."

CHANGE No. 124 (Trinidad and Tobago, p. 234).

The rate of postage applicable to letters mailed in Trinidad and Tobago, and addressed for delivery in the United States, is now 3 pence for the first ounce or fraction thereof and 1½ pence for each additional ounce or fraction thereof.

The item "Trinidad and Tobago" on page 234 is modified accordingly.

CHANGE No. 125 (Turkey, pp. 239, 562).

Parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Turkey must be sealed with wax, lead seals, or otherwise.

In view of the above, the following changes should be made:

Page 239, section 74: Insert the word "Turkey" in alphabetical order.

Page 562: In the eighteenth column of the parcel-post table, supersede the word "No" by "*".

Immediately below the table add: *Compulsory.
