The Following Notices Were Issued From the Office of the Postmaster General

FRANK C. WALKER, POSTMASTER GENERAL

TEN PERCENT DISCOUNT TO BE ALLOWED FOR MONEY ORDERS DRAWN FOR PAYMENT IN CANADA

MARCH 9, 1942.

ORDER No. 17257.

It is ordered that on and after March 13, 1942, in the issue of postal money orders for payment in Canada, the money of the United States shall be converted into that of the foreign country at the rate of 90 cents United States money to the Canadian dollar.

Postmasters shall use the 10-percent conversion table which appeared in the Postal Bulletins of November 24, 1939, and July 16, 1940, and the Supplements of December 1939 (p. 13) and August 1940 (p. 22).

The discount of 9 percent for money orders payable in Newfoundland remains unchanged.

ISSUE OF MONEY ORDERS PAYABLE IN MALAYA FORBIDDEN

ORDER No. 17206.

In compliance with the regulations and instructions prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury under the authority given by Executive Order No. 8998 of December 26, 1941, which amends Executive Order No. 8389 of April 10, 1940, it is hereby ordered that, until further instructed, postmasters shall decline to issue international postal money orders payable in Malaya. (See instructions on p. 10 of this Supplement.)

RETIREMENT

With reference to the notice in the Postal Bulletin of January 29, 1942, concerning the amendment of the Civil Service Retirement Act, approved January 24, 1942, the attention of postmasters and other postal officials is directed to the following:

The possibility of partial refund upon the separation of an officer or employee at some time in the future will make it necessary to record and report retirement deductions on Form 1280 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1942, in two amounts, namely: from July 1, 1941, to January 23, 1942, and from January 24, 1942, to June 30, 1942.

NOTE.—Form 1551, Report of Separation, should show a complete record of all creditable service. Creditable service includes temporary, unclassified, excepted, and military or naval service as well as service in another Government establishment and service for which a refund of retirement deductions has been received.

In the case of any employee separating from the service after January 23, 1942, it will be necessary for the postmaster or other postal official to show under item No. 6 on Form 1551, Report of Separation, salary, retirement deductions, and tontine as indicated by the following illustration:

The above form which should be fastened or pasted over item No. 6 on the report, is being mimeographed and an initial supply of these forms will be furnished each office without requisition.

Effective July 1, 1942, retirement deductions will be made at the rate of 5 percent instead of 3½ percent.

Instructions in connection with the use of present pay-roll forms and vouchers, together with revised salary tables will be furnished before the close of the current fiscal year.

General instructions covering this act will be published at an early date. Requests for interpretation of the act should be withheld pending the publication of such instructions.

RESERVE OFFICERS

Effective January 15, 1942, deferments of Reserve officers were canceled by the War Department and all affected Reserve officers were considered as available for active duty at any time thereafter.

The Secretary of War has now requested that the following be brought to the attention of postal employees who hold commissions as Reserve officers:

"Reserve officers will be considered available for call to active military service, on and after April 1, 1942. Those employed in key positions in which their continued services beyond March 31, 1942, is deemed necessary to the maintenance of the national health, safety, or interest, may, before the date indicated, tender resignation of their Reserve appointment. Such tender will be made with the express understanding that the War Department may decline, as a military necessity, any resignation so tendered."

In this connection, the Secretary of War has advised that voluntary resignations, signed by the officers, should be addressed to The Adjutant General,

Washington, D. C., Attention: Reserve Division, and should be accompanied with the following information if not previously submitted:

- a. Name of the officer in full (initials should not be used).
- b. Rank and branch in which commissioned.
- c. Home address as last reported to the War Department.
- d. Date of birth.
- e. Title of present position (governmental pay-roll designation).
- f. Salary or wages.
- g. Civil-service rating, if any.
- h. Length of time in present position.
- i. Total time in the employ of the present department or agency.
- j. Total time in Federal employ.
- k. Detailed description of present duties. (Include information as to the availability of a replacement or the time required to train one.)

Although such resignations should be addressed to The Adjutant General as indicated above, they should be submitted to him through the proper Bureau head in the Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Such resignations should be accompanied with a full explanation as to why the employee tendering the resignation of his commission is regarded as being of more value in his postal position than he would be in the military service.

Inspectors in charge, postmasters, and Superintendents of the Railway Mail Service shall submit immediately to their Bureau heads in Washington, D. C., lists of all postal employees under their jurisdiction who hold commissions as Reserve officers, showing the rank of each and the branch of the military service in which commissioned. Those who desire to resign should be indicated on the lists.

PREPARATION OF VOUCHERS COVERING PURCHASES OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES RENDERED

ORDER NO. 17188.

FEBRUARY 25, 1942.

Postmaster General's Order No. 11842, dated June 29, 1938, is hereby amended as follows:

Subpar. 6 of par. 3. "I certify that the above bill is correct and just; that I hereby acknowledge receipt of payment in full in the total amount shown hereon; that payment therefor has not heretofore been received; that all statutory requirements as to American production and labor standards, and all conditions of purchase applicable to the transactions have been complied with; and that State or local sales taxes are not included in the amounts billed."

Subpar. 9 of par. 3. "I certify that the above bill is correct and just; that payment therefor has not been received; that all statutory requirements as to American production and labor standards, and all conditions of purchase applicable to the transactions have been complied with; and that State or local sales taxes are not included in the amounts billed."

The attention of postmasters is directed to the fact that the certificate appearing on voucher Form 1526-P has been revised to conform with the above quoted order. Until the new supply of Form 1526-P has been furnished the certificate heretofore approved by the Comptroller General will be acceptable. Paragraph 6 of the instructions appearing on the quarterly postal account, Form 1550-C, will be revised in accordance with the above order in the next print.

BOOKS FOR SERVICE MEN AND WOMEN, MAILING OF

Postmasters are hereby notified that BOOKS addressed to individuals in the different branches of the Armed Forces of the United States, or to any point for use of our Armed Forces, are acceptable for mailing at the special book rate without boxing or wrapping, merely secured with cord or twine twice around the two ways crossing in the center with address label securely fastened by glue, mucilage, paste, or other good adhesive to the flat outside binding.

Books prepared in this manner shall not be accepted as insured or c. o. d. mail. Books may be insured or sent c. o. d. when packed in accordance with existing requirements.

In order to be accepted at the rate of 1½ cents per pound or fraction thereof the books must contain no advertising matter other than incidental announcements of books, and they must otherwise conform to the conditions governing the acceptance of books at this rate.

UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT MANUAL

The United States Government Manual for the spring of 1942 has just been released. It is a 700-page reference book wherein will be found the answers to hundreds of questions asked daily of postmasters and other postal employees regarding the functions, activities, and personnel of our Government.

The spring edition of the manual contains complete, concise, authoritative information on the Government's national defense activities, with statements about the agencies created during the emergency as well as material on the defense functions of the 10 executive departments and independent establishments and bureaus. Following this, is material on the day-to-day functions of all the Government departments and agencies and 35 organization charts.

Preliminary pages in the Manual contain the President's message to Congress asking for declarations of war against the Axis powers, the declarations of war, and the Declaration by the United Nations. Included for ready reference are a subject matter index, an index of Government officials, a list of several hundred representative publications, and a list of abbreviations commonly used to designate Federal agencies.

This Spring 1942 edition of the Manual is 75¢ a copy; subsequent issues will cost \$1.00; annual subscriptions, three editions, \$2.75. The Manual is for sale by the Superintendent of Documents and the United States Information Service in Washington, and by the field offices of the Office of Government Reports.

AMENDMENTS TO POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

REVOCATION OF FRAUD ORDER

All mail matter hereafter received for Joseph Blanchard at Chicago, Ill., Philadelphia, Pa., and Long Beach, Calif.; and C. E. Blanchard, at Philadelphia, Pa., should be delivered in the regular way.

ENDLESS CHAIN SCHEMES SOLICITING DEFENSE SAVINGS STAMPS

To All Postmasters:

The mails in all parts of the country are still being flooded with letters relating to so-called endless chain schemes soliciting defense savings stamps.

The Bulletin of July 22, 1941, and the August, 1941 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE contained a notice regarding the legality of such schemes. Nevertheless, patrons of the various post offices are depositing in the mails matter relating to schemes of this nature. They should be warned that the sending of such matter through the mails is a violation of the postal fraud and lottery statutes. Notices are served upon persons participating in such schemes whose names come to the attention of the Post Office Department requiring them to show cause why fraud orders should not be issued against them. Such orders forbid the delivery of any mail to the persons named therein.

In order that the attention of the public be called to the illegal character of the scheme, it is suggested that local newspapers be requested to give publicity to this notice.

DEAD MAIL MATTER

Reports have been reaching this Bureau indicating the mishandling of dispatches of dead parcel-post matter intended for dead parcel-post branches. It is apparent from the information received that numerous dispatches of dead mail matter are broken up in transit, resulting in many parcels returning to the offices of address and others becoming lost, while Form 1522 goes on to the designated dead parcel-post branch accompanied with only part or possibly none of the parcels listed thereon as having been originally dispatched with it. The confusion and unnecessary work caused by this mishandling can be readily understood. It also results in justifiable complaints from patrons on account of the delay in delivery of parcels involved.

Postmasters, therefore, at offices of origin should see to it that clerks who make dispatches of dead mail matter to the dead letter and dead parcel-post branches are properly instructed relative to the use of correct labels or facing slips provided for this purpose; namely, Form 1504, white, for returns of unclaimed matter; Form 1505, pink, for returns of unmailable matter; and Form 1506, yellow, for returns of dead parcel-post matter; with special emphasis on the importance of always using the yellow sack label, Form 1506, in making dead parcel-post dispatches. See paragraph 11 on page 50, Postal Guide, 1941.

At post offices where dead parcel-post branches are located, supervisors should bring sharply to the attention of clerks and laborers charged with opening sacks or pouches of incoming mail the necessity of being constantly on the alert to avoid opening and dumping sacks or pouches addressed to the Dead Parcel Post Branch, which if properly dispatched, should be readily identified by the yellow label.

DISPOSITION OF MAILS FROM AXIS AND AXIS-CONTROLLED COUNTRIES

In connection with previous instructions, postmasters and others concerned shall forward promptly under cover to the nearest censorship station, in care of the postmaster at that place, all mails reaching them without United States or British censorship endorsements that originated in Axis countries or countries under their control.

There are given below a list of the countries mentioned and a list of the censorship stations.

AXIS COUNTRIES

Japan, Chosen (Korea), Taiwan (Formosa), Bokoto (Pescadores) Islands, Karafuto (Japanese Sakhalin), Marianne (Ladrone) Islands, Marshall Islands, Caroline Islands (Mandates under Versailles Treaty), Leased Territory of Kwantung, Manchuria, occupied China, Thailand, French Indochina, Hong Kong, Germany, Italy, and all other countries of continental Europe except Gibraltar, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and unoccupied France.

SUSPENSION OF MAIL SERVICE TO FRENCH INDOCHINA, THAILAND (SIAM), AND HONG KONG

No letters, packages (including parcel post), or other mail matter originating within the United States, or its possessions, and destined for French Indochina, Thailand (Siam), and Hong Kong, shall be dispatched from the United States, or its possessions, to their respective destinations. Any mails that may be posted for those countries shall be sent by the mailing post offices as usual to United States exchange offices, which will be given appropriate instructions with respect to disposition of such mails.

PARCEL POST SERVICE TO CHINA SUSPENDED

The parcel post service from the United States to unoccupied China is suspended. (Service to occupied China was suspended by Postmaster General's Order No. 16547 dated December 10, 1941, and appearing on page 1 of the December 1941 Supplement.)

Postmasters will refuse to accept parcel-post packages for mailing to any place in China whether in the occupied or unoccupied zone. Such parcels as have been mailed (and failed of dispatch), or which may be mailed inadvertently hereafter, will be returned to the senders.

MERCHANDISE FOR YUKON TERRITORY RESTRICTED DURING WINTER SEASON

The announcement under the above heading on page 7 of the October 1941 Supplement, with respect to parcels destined for points in the Yukon Territory to be carried during the winter by the air-stage route from White Horse to Dawson, is modified so as to state the postage rates applicable in the United States as 30 cents for the first pound and 25 cents for each additional pound. Such parcels will be sent by ordinary means to White Horse for onward air connection.

RESTRICTION ON THE IMPORTATION OF MERCHANDISE AND OTHER ARTICLES INTO THE UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA

Reference is made to the announcement appearing under the above caption on pages 15 and 16 of the November 1941 Supplement, relative to the restriction on the importation of merchandise and other articles into the Union of South Africa.

Information has now been received to the effect that the articles listed below may be imported into the Union of South Africa without being required to meet the import regulations of that country.

Samples of no commercial value.

Printed books, catalogues, periodicals, newspapers, and advertising matter.

Paper patterns.

Cut flowers.

Flower bulbs.

Flower seeds.

Motion-picture films.

Goods imported for repair and return.

Containers previously exported and subsequently imported empty.

Packages accepted for mailing containing any of the above-named articles should be endorsed "Import license not required."

Postmasters will cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices.

MAIL FOR UNITED STATES NAVAL VESSELS, UNITED STATES NAVAL UNITS, AND UNITED STATES DEFENSE BASES, VIA SAN FRANCISCO

Owing to the increased volume of mail for United States naval vessels, United States naval units, United States defense bases, etc., and in order to expedite distribution and dispatch of this mail at San Francisco, Calif., post offices and railway post offices will, when the quantity warrants, make up separate packages and pouches of letters and separate sacks of "prints" and parcel post as follows:

BABY (DAY OLD) CHICKS TO CANADA

Live baby (day old) chicks will be accepted for mailing to Canada during the period from March 1 to June 15, 1942, under the same conditions as were in force last year. See pages 5, 6, and 7 of the March 1941 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE.

Postmasters will cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices.

DIVISION OF RURAL MAILS

RURAL AND STAR ROUTE CARRIERS REQUESTED TO MAKE REPORT OF FOREST FIRES
DISCOVERED BY THEM ALONG THEIR ROUTES

In accordance with a request of the Secretary of Agriculture, a plan of cooperation with State and National forest officers has been arranged whereby rural and star-route carriers shall report forest fires discovered by them along their routes to persons designated by State and National authorities to receive such intelligence.

The State and National authorities will inform postmasters as to whom the discovery of fires should be reported, and each rural carrier should be directed to cooperate to the fullest extent with such authorities in the manner agreed upon, namely, that the carrier shall report a fire to the nearest State fire warden or national forest officer on his route, or, if no such warden or officer lives on the route, to arrange through some responsible citizen to have him notified, by telephone if possible. Star-route contractors and carriers are included in the plan of cooperation and should be requested to report the discovery of fires in the same manner as the rural carriers.

Postmasters are also directed to report forest fires to the nearest State or National forest officer.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

DOMESTIC POSTAGE RATES APPLICABLE TO MAIL ADDRESSED TO PERSONNEL OF
UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES IN ICELAND

It appears some postmasters are charging postage at the international rates on mail matter addressed to the personnel of our armed forces in Iceland.

The domestic rates apply to mail matter addressed in the prescribed manner to the personnel of the armed forces of the United States stationed at leased bases, or on naval vessels, or at other places outside the continental United States where the domestic mail service is in operation, whether the matter is addressed in care of the postmaster of New York, N. Y., or San Francisco, Calif., or to the A. P. O. number of the particular base, without mention being made of the location of the base.

Postmasters are, therefore, requested to take steps to see that the domestic and not the international rates are charged on mail matter addressed to our armed forces stationed at places outside the continental United States where the domestic mail service is in operation.

MODIFICATION OF POSTAGE RATES ON PUBLICATIONS WEIGHING OVER EIGHT
OUNCES WHICH ARE NOT ENTERED AS SECOND-CLASS MATTER

In connection with Order No. 17122, dated February 13, 1942, amending paragraph 1, section 573, Postal Laws and Regulations (Insert No. 55), it is to be noted that the postage on so-called "controlled circulation" publications referred to in that section shall be computed on the bulk weight of each mailing at the rate of 8 cents for each pound or fraction of a pound, but in no case at less than 5 cents on each individually addressed copy.

All of the other requirements embodied in section 573, Postal Laws and Regulations, remain in effect as well as the instructions relative to the acceptance of mailings of these publications issued under date of July 13, 1934, except, of course, the inscription "Section 573, P. L. & R.," is to be shown instead of the old section number, namely, 574½. This inscription should be included in or printed adjacent to the postal indicia which such publications should bear on

the cover to the right and above the address when mailed unwrapped, or in the upper right corner of the address side of envelopes or wrappers. It is not necessary that the amount of postage paid appear in the indicia.

FORM 3547

Under paragraph 5, section 769, Postal Laws and Regulations, and the instructions in article 12, page 46, of the July 1941 POSTAL GUIDE, provision is made for sending a notice on Form 3547 to the senders when ordinary mail of the third or fourth class is undeliverable due to the removal of the addressee. In this way mailers are enabled to keep mailing lists current and eliminate the sending of matter which cannot be delivered, this being advantageous both to the mailers and the Post Office Department. This arrangement has been in effect for many years and was extended some time ago to cover cases where the matter is undeliverable for some reason other than removal of the addressee. For convenience the instructions published from time to time have been consolidated and are embraced in the following summary:

The sender's request for the notice on Form 3547, which applies only to matter of the third and fourth classes, should be printed in the lower left corner of the address side of the matter. The request should show the particular kind of service desired, as indicated in the following examples, and each mailer should use the one which will best serve his particular purpose.

(1) "Postmaster: If addressee has removed and new address is known, notify sender on FORM 3547, postage for which is guaranteed."

(2) "Postmaster: If addressee has moved and new address is known, notify sender on FORM 3547, postage for which is guaranteed. In case of removal to another post office, do not notify the addressee, but hold the matter and state on FORM 3547 amount of forwarding postage required, which sender will promptly furnish."

(3) "Postmaster: If undeliverable FOR ANY REASON, notify sender, stating reason, on FORM 3547, postage for which is guaranteed."

(4) "Postmaster: If undeliverable FOR ANY REASON, notify sender, stating reason, on FORM 3547, postage for which is guaranteed. In case of removal to another post office, do not notify the addressee, but hold the matter and state on FORM 3547 amount of forwarding postage required, which sender will promptly furnish."

It is contemplated that the notice on Form 3547 will be furnished in case of a local change from one point to another in the same city as well as a change to another post office. If the sender, in addition to being notified on Form 3547 in the case of removal of the addressee, desires that the matter be immediately forwarded to the new address and not held until forwarding postage is furnished, he may place the words "Forwarding Postage Guaranteed" under the return card in the upper left corner of the address side, as prescribed by section 769, Postal Laws and Regulations, in which case the matter will be forwarded and the forwarding postage collected from the addressee on delivery.

Where the request for Form 3547 follows either of the examples 1 and 2 above the matter may also bear a return postage guarantee in the upper left corner in connection with the return card. As this will result in some cases in the return of the undeliverable matter and also a notice on Form 3547 with respect thereto, senders who do not desire both may omit the pledge to pay return postage from the upper left corner and in lieu thereof add the following to the request for Form 3547 in the lower left corner: "If Form 3547 is not sent, return the undeliverable matter. Return Postage Guaranteed."

In cases where the request follows either of the arrangements shown in examples 3 and 4, it is not contemplated that the matter shall bear a request for its return or a return postage guarantee, so that the matter, if not forwardable to the addressee, may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as provided by the postal laws and regulations.

Postmasters should use care in filling out notices on Form 3547 in order that they will be legible and accurate. When the matter bears a request similar to examples 1 and 2 above shown, Form 3547 should be filled out as called for by the printing thereon. When the matter bears a request like example 3 or 4 and the new address is not known or the matter is undeliverable for some reason other than removal, postmasters should show the actual reason clearly by writing or handstamping the words "Moved—Left No Address," "No such address,"

"Unknown," "Deceased," "Refused," "Unclaimed," or other reason, in the blank line ordinarily used to show the new address on Form 3547. See section 806, Postal Laws and Regulations.

It should be clearly understood that the foregoing provisions for furnishing Form 3547 apply only to third and fourth-class matter sent out in the regular course of business for purposes other than obtaining the address of the person to whom the matter is sent. This facility may not be used on first-class matter, nor in connection with mail matter sent out primarily for the purpose of collecting past-due accounts.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

BRITISH MONEY ORDERS

Notwithstanding the clear and complete instructions published on page 17 of the January Supplement to the Official Postal Guide, calling attention to the changed procedure in the issue of money orders intended for payment in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, many issuing clerks are still delivering the original money-order portions of such orders to the remitters to be dispatched by them to the payees.

Postmasters and all employees assigned to the issue of international money orders are hereby warned that should failure to observe the regulations cited above result in a double payment and it is not possible to recover the amount from either the remitter or the payee, it will be collected from the employee responsible for the error.

Attention is specifically called to the fact that *no change* has been made in the method of issuing money orders intended for payment in *Ireland* (Eire)—the original money-order portion is to be completed as heretofore and handed to the remitter.

MONEY ORDERS ISSUED IN GUAM NOT TO BE PAID

Postmasters are requested to defer payment of money orders which may be presented that are issued at Guam, Guam. The patron presenting such an order should be asked to surrender it for inspection, and the postmaster should give a receipt for it. The money order should then be forwarded at once to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders, where it will be carefully examined to determine if it was regularly issued. Upon that fact being ascertained, the order will be returned to the postmaster with instructions to take up the receipt and pay the amount to the patron.

INSTRUCTIONS—ISSUE OF MONEY ORDERS PAYABLE IN MALAYA

Notice has been received from the Treasury Department that the provisions of Executive Order No. 8389 of April 10, 1940, have been automatically extended to all of British Malaya to the same extent as the provisions of that Order apply to any other blocked country.

In accordance with Postmaster General's Order No. 17206 quoted on page 1 of this Supplement, postmasters are directed until further instructed to decline to issue postal money orders for payment in Malaya, informing those who apply for them that such transactions are prohibited.

Under instructions from this Bureau the New York exchange office has been withholding dispatch of money-order lists to Malaya for the past few weeks. All advices of money orders payable in Malaya now retained in New York or which may reach the exchange office will be returned to the issuing postmasters with instructions to refund the amounts and the fees to the remitters and to treat the money orders as "not issued."

Where it is possible to do so, the postmaster should recover the original order. In any event, payment will, of course, not be made in Malaya, since the advices were not certified.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

INQUIRIES CONCERNING DOMESTIC REGISTERED AND INSURED MAIL ADDRESSED TO MILITARY CAMPS OR POSTS AND C. C. C. CAMPS

The fourth paragraph of the above-captioned instructions, published on pages 34 and 35 of the August 1941 Postal Guide, is hereby modified to read as follows:

"If the registered or insured article was delivered in good condition to, and signed for by, an authorized mail orderly, or other authorized person, the Form 1510 shall be endorsed to show the date the article was delivered and the *complete name* of the designated mail orderly or other authorized person whose receipt is held therefor. In each such instance the postmaster at the office of delivery will make inquiry along the following lines of the Army postal officer or other designated officer, *through the commanding officer*:

"1. If the article was delivered to the addressee or some one authorized in writing by the addressee to receive it, show to whom delivered and the date.

"2. If the article was returned to the Postal Service for any reason, show the date of return and the name of the postal employee whose receipt is held therefor.

"3. If there is no record of final disposition, ascertain from addressee whether the article was received by him and, if he acknowledges receipt, a brief statement to that effect signed by him should be submitted.

"If the information received from the Army postal officer or other designated officer shows that the article was returned to the post office, the Form 1510 and related papers shall be transmitted to the postmaster at the office to which the Postal Service had forwarded or returned the article for a statement showing the disposition made of the article if received. If the addressee advised receipt of the article, the papers shall be transmitted to the postmaster making the inquiry on Form 1510, so that the complainant may be appropriately advised in the matter. *In the event there is no trace of the article after proper delivery by the Postal Service, and the addressee denied receipt thereof, the Form 1510, together with any related papers, shall be forwarded direct to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails and the postmaster at the office of mailing advised of the disposition made of the delivered registered or insured article. Form 1516, appropriately modified, can be used for the purpose.* The postmaster at the mailing office will advise the sender that proper delivery of the article was effected to the designated mail orderly or other authorized person, but that the Army authorities have not established the subsequent disposition made of the article. The sender should also be informed that the Department will refer his inquiry to The Adjutant General, War Department, for consideration, and that any further inquiry regarding the article should be addressed direct to the War Department."

SHIPMENTS OF POSTAGE STAMPS ADDRESSED TO INDIVIDUALS OR CONCERNS NOT TO BE SENT AS OFFICIAL REGISTERED MAIL

Reports continue to be received indicating that postmasters in many instances are sending, under official registered cover, postage stamps purchased by persons or concerns located in other cities. Such mailings are not entitled to free registration, and postmasters should require the purchasers of the stamps to pay the proper mailing postage, in addition to the prescribed registry fee and any surcharge applicable.

AUTHORIZED USE OF COMPLETE METERED IMPRESSIONS ON CERTAIN REGISTERED ARTICLES MAILED BY FEDERAL RESERVE BANKS

In order to expedite the handling of large quantities of Defense Bonds and Tax Anticipation Bonds sent as registered mail by various Federal Reserve Banks, permission is given to the mailers to include in the metered impressions on such matter the name of the mailing office and date of mailing so as to make it unnecessary to cancel the metered indicia with the hand stamp. Authority is also given for the postmarking of these particular registered articles but once on the back.

All postal employees handling these articles are instructed to examine them where sealed on the back to ascertain whether the articles are in good condition.

See the notice published on page 23 of the January 1942 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE under the caption "Authorized Use of Complete Metered Impressions On Certain Registered Mailings."

TREATMENT OF C. O. D. PARCELS CONTAINING NURSERY STOCK

With the approach of the spring nursery stock shipping season, postmasters are urged to take advance steps to see that all c. o. d. nursery stock shipments received at their offices are held for the full retention periods specified by the shippers, regardless of any requests to the contrary which may be made by the addressees or the shippers' agents, and that the senders of these shipments are *immediately* notified on Form 3849-d if the shipments fail of delivery *for any reason*. When c. o. d. shipments of nursery stock are disposed of as undeliverable matter, in accordance with the shippers' instructions, the shippers must also be notified of such final disposition.

General instructions relative to the treatment of c. o. d. parcels containing nursery stock appear in article 92, pages 224 and 225 of the July 1941, Postal Guide, and all concerned are enjoined to strictly comply therewith.

RUBBER DATING STAMP FOR MONEY ORDERS, REGISTERED AND PARCEL POST MAIL

Postmasters are advised that in the future the word "Registered," the letters "M. O. B." and the words "Parcel Post" will be omitted from the rubber dating stamps so that the same stamp may be used in connection with registered mail, money orders, and parcel-post mail.

USE OF MOST ECONOMICAL SIZES OF DOMESTIC REGISTRY, INSURANCE, AND C. O. D FORMS

The attention of postmasters and of postal employees involved is directed to the instructions published on page 32 of the November 1940, Postal Guide, under the caption "Use of Most Economical Sizes of Manifold Books in the Domestic Registry and Insurance Services." In view of the necessity for conservation of postal supplies, it is essential that the most economical sizes of the various domestic registry, insurance, and c. o. d. forms be used at all times. Firm mailing and firm delivery books and sheets and manifold registry dispatch books and sheets are furnished in several sizes. Registry jackets are furnished in two sizes.

The manifold books and sheets should not be used for any purpose other than that for which they are intended and care should be exercised to see that patrons are not furnished an excessive supply of the firm mailing books or sheets.

DIVISION OF POSTAL SAVINGS

COUPONS OF GOVERNMENT BONDS NOT TO BE CASHED UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY OWNERSHIP CERTIFICATES

The Bureau of Internal Revenue of the Treasury Department amended the Federal income tax regulations effective January 1, 1942, prohibiting the cashing of coupons of Government bonds by fiscal agents of the Treasury Department unless accompanied by a certificate of ownership. Information in regard to this amendment reached the Post Office Department when postmasters complained about Federal Reserve banks rejecting coupons included in deposits.

It is believed that satisfactory arrangements can be made so that no postmaster will suffer loss for coupons cashed prior to the receipt of this notice for which he is unable to obtain a certificate of ownership; but, **EFFECTIVE NOW AND CONTINUING UNTIL OTHER INSTRUCTIONS ARE RECEIVED, NO POSTMASTER SHALL CASH FROM OFFICIAL FUNDS ANY COUPONS OF GOVERNMENT BONDS NOT ACCOMPANIED BY CERTIFICATES OF OWNERSHIP. INCLUDED AMONG SUCH BONDS ARE THE POSTAL SAVINGS BONDS WHICH WERE ISSUED SEMIANNUALLY UP TO AND INCLUDING JULY 13, 1935.**

Patrons presenting coupons should be advised that ownership certificates Treasury Department Form 1000, may probably be obtained from local banks, and if not, then by addressing the Bureau of Internal Revenue, Treasury Department, Washington, D. C., or a Federal Reserve Bank.

INADEQUATE STOCK OF DEFENSE SAVINGS STAMPS IN POST OFFICES *

Complaints are being received that in some localities, particularly in rural districts, postmasters' stock of Defense Savings stamps are not sufficient for local needs. It is apparent that fixed credits in these stamps in some offices are too small or that the postmasters delay sending requisitions to replenish the fixed credits in Defense Savings stamps.

Sales of Defense Savings stamps were three times greater in December and four times greater in January than in November. Further increases are expected.

Postmasters should immediately consider whether their fixed credits in these stamps are adequate. At any office where an increase in the fixed credit is needed, the postmaster should immediately apply to the central postal-savings depository postmaster direct for such increase as is required. It is imperative that central depository postmasters give such requests prompt attention. See the instructions on pages 26 and 27 of the November 1941 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE.

Postmasters should keep in touch with local Defense Savings staff committees, school authorities, institutions, or business concerns to obtain advance notice of any sales plans or drives which will require unusual amounts of these stamps so arrangements may be made in advance to have sufficient stock on hand.

Particular attention is invited to the Defense Bond and Stamp Instructions reprinted on pages 6 to 9, inclusive, of the January 1942 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE.

ACCEPTANCE OF SMALL COINS IN POST OFFICES

The Department is receiving complaints that post-office employees refuse to accept pennies and other small coins for the purchase of Defense Savings stamps and bonds. In instructions in the Postal Bulletin of December 23, 1941, reprinted on page 8 of the January 1942 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE, the following instructions were issued:

Postmasters must not decline to accept any United States coin in any denomination, for the purchase of bonds or stamps, regardless of amount, and shall not require that such coins be wrapped.

The act of Congress approved June 5, 1933, makes all United States coins legal tender, and there is now no restriction on the acceptance of minor coins in any amount. Postmasters should see that employees are suitably instructed to the end that there may be no further cause for complaint in this respect, not only with reference to transactions in connection with sale of Defense securities but including any other class of business in post offices.

DEFENSE SAVINGS STAMPS—MODIFICATION OF CANCELATION REQUIREMENTS

The instructions contained in the Postal Bulletin of April 10, 1941, require that redeemed postal-savings stamps be canceled with an imprint of the special date stamp bearing the word "Canceled," and that, in addition, each surrendered stamp be perforated.

Effective at once, these instructions are modified to the extent that only one of these methods of rendering a redeemed stamp unfit for further negotiation shall be necessary. In other words, postmasters may perforate redeemed stamps if proper facilities are available and that method is deemed more expeditious, or the stamps may be canceled with a canceling stamp. In the latter method of cancelation, a nonwashable black ink *must* be used. The ink furnished for canceling postage stamps is suitable. The Department will not insist that postmasters use exclusively the special rubber stamp furnished for canceling postal-savings stamps, Item 1300, No. 237, of the Supply Schedule. If any other canceling stamp is found to be more effective or easier to operate, it may be used. These redeemed stamps must be thoroughly canceled, but should not be so defaced as to make it difficult to determine the denominations.

DEFENSE SAVINGS STAMPS—BANKS SHOULD ENTER REASON FOR REDEMPTION ON ALBUMS

In the notice which appeared in the Postal Bulletin of August 7, and on page 28 of the August, 1941, SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE, postmasters were instructed to enter on the back cover page of redeemed savings-stamp albums the

purpose for which they were surrendered—that is, whether for bonds, postal-savings certificates, or cash.

Since banks handle a considerable portion of this business, the requirement should be brought to their attention; and they should be requested to assist to the extent of placing the appropriate notations on the stamp albums accepted by them.

DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS—DELIVERY OUTSIDE THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES

Postmasters are hereby informed that the privilege of allowing purchasers of Defense Savings bonds to name an address for delivery by registered mail outside of the continental United States is suspended until further notice. Accordingly, if bonds are issued and this restriction prohibits requested delivery, an address within the continental United States should be obtained, or if the purchaser is agreeable, the bonds may be sent to the nearest Federal Reserve bank, for safekeeping. Savings bonds issued by the postmaster at Washington, D. C., under these conditions may be forwarded to the Treasury Department for safekeeping.

These provisions do not affect stock shipments of Defense Savings bonds to authorized issuing agents.

DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS—HOW TO ADDRESS REPORTS

Postmasters at first and second class offices were instructed in my letter (CI 1120) to forward their United States Savings bond accounts, Form 904, with accompanying abstracts and all vouchers, to the Savings Bond Examiners (Postal Section), Room 423, Division of Loans and Currency, 13th and C Streets, SW., Washington, D. C.

Effective with the report for February, the address shall be shown as SAVINGS BOND EXAMINERS (POSTAL SECTION), 13th AND C STREETS, SW., WASHINGTON, D. C. Some confusion has resulted from our having included "Division of Loans and Currency" in the address, and it is requested that, hereafter, reference to that Division be omitted.

TELEGRAMS CONCERNING DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS AND STAMPS

In the notice which appeared in the Postal Bulletin of January 15, 1942, postmasters were informed that telegrams addressed to the Post Office Department concerning Defense bonds and stamps should be sent "Official business, collect, Government rate, special bill."

Official messages between postmasters concerning Defense Savings bonds and stamps should be sent "Official business, Government rate, charge Post Office Department, special bill."

The branch of the telegraph company transmitting the message should refer the bill to its Washington, D. C., office for collection.

DELIVERY OF TREASURY DEPARTMENT CIRCULAR "OUR AMERICA"

It is reported that in some post offices the distribution to be made of the circular "Our America" prepared by the Treasury Department relative to the Defense Savings Program was not understood. Any postmaster still having on hand the supply of "Our America" sent his office should deliver them immediately to patrons, through lock boxes, general delivery windows, and by carriers, one copy for each home as far as the supply will permit. The instructions for handling these circulars appeared in the Postal Bulletin of December 29 and are reprinted on page 22 of the January 1942 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

MOTOR VEHICLE TAX STAMPS AND REPORT CARDS

Supplementing the instructions in the notice under the heading "Sale of Motor Vehicle Tax Stamps in Post Offices" in the Postal Bulletin of January 13,

and on page 23 of the January 1942 Supplement, the following additional information is furnished for the guidance of postmasters and post-office employees:

Report Cards (MV-1) Lost or Spoiled.—Postmasters are permitted to furnish new cards in exchange for those spoiled by the patron upon surrender of the original card, but not otherwise. Patrons reporting the loss of cards prior to filling out of same and mailing to the designated office should be advised to submit a full statement of the facts in the case to the Collector of Internal Revenue of the local district. Postmasters are not authorized to replace cards reported as lost.

Loss of Stamps.—Postmasters are not authorized to make any adjustment with patrons in connection with motor vehicle tax stamps reported lost or stolen. Such claimants should be advised to submit a statement concerning the loss to the Collector of Internal Revenue of the local district, who will issue such instructions as may be found desirable.

Correspondence.—All correspondence from postmasters in relation to the issuance, sale, and accounting of motor vehicle tax stamps, should be directed to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, Washington, D. C.

SALVAGING RUBBER BANDS AND WIRE CLIPS

In keeping with the Wartime Conservation Instructions for the Postal Service as published in the Postal Bulletin of January 14, 1942, the attention of postmasters, other postal officials and employees of the Postal Service, is invited to the need for conserving the available stocks of rubber bands and wire clips, as it is very possible that no further supply of either of these items will be obtainable when the present stocks become depleted. Instructions should be issued immediately to save and reuse rubber bands and wire clips, and to salvage and use rubber bands removed from mail deposited for dispatch. Any surplus accumulation of these items should be forwarded to the Division of Equipment and Supplies of this Bureau.

The cooperation of all postmasters, other postal officials, and employees of the Postal Service is expected in this regard.

BEWARE OF IMPOSTOR POSING AS POST OFFICE CLERK AND BORROWING MONEY THROUGH SUCH FALSE REPRESENTATION

During the past 3 years numerous postal employees have been defrauded by one Radford C. East. East's scheme is to borrow money, alleging that he is on vacation, financially embarrassed and in need of funds to return to Greensboro, N. C., to resume his duties as a post-office clerk. This man is not and has never been a postal employee.

East is about 45 years of age, height 5 feet 7 inches; weight 130 pounds; hair brown, almost bald on top of head. Several front teeth are missing. He is under indictment in the eastern district of South Carolina and the United States marshal, Charleston, S. C., holds warrant for his arrest. If East is located, cause his arrest and wire Post Office Inspector in Charge, Atlanta, Ga., immediately, Government rate, collect.
