The Following Notices Were Issued From the Office of the Postmaster General

VOLUNTARY PURCHASE PLAN OF DEFENSE SECURITIES

To All Officials and Employees of the Postal Establishment:

A plan for voluntary participation in the purchase of Defense Securities by those in the Postal Establishment was inaugurated last October. The instructions were reprinted in the November Supplement to the Postal Guide.

Some 225,000 of the Postal personnel, embracing both departmental and field employees, are participating in the program. It is gratifying that the number of officials and employees taking part has increased with each monthly report.

Our participation plan was adopted before December 7. The declaration of war imposes a new and added responsibility upon us as good citizens, and is an added incentive to greater effort and a larger and growing part in the program ahead of our country—the program of winning this war.


The Government's plans for financing the war are based on the belief that if their own free will the American people want to assume a big share in its cost. In this effort no group should be more active than the employees of the Government. They should be in the front ranks of that vast army of wage earners throughout the country who are so generously supplying fighting dollars for fighting men. In every community pay days are fast becoming "bond" days for more and more of those receiving regular income.

Apart from the patriotic standpoint, we should remember that we are not asked to make a contribution or a donation of money, but are given an opportunity to participate in a plan of systematic savings for our own benefit. While helping to our country through purchase of bonds, we will at the same time be helping to safeguard our financial future. By so diverting a substantial portion of current earnings to savings we will also help to prevent inflation with its attendant evils.

It is my hope that each official and employee who has not as yet signified intention to participate in the program will now carefully consider the matter, and if circumstances permit will sign a purchase pledge and thereafter report purchases under the plan. It should be understood that the pledge may be amended or canceled at any time if necessity should require.

Let us make certain, all of us, that we do our utmost in this program. We should all re-examine our affairs and arrange to buy these Defense securities regularly, to the limit of our ability.

Again, I bespeak the wholehearted cooperation of all postal employees in the Voluntary Purchase Plan and in the program for financing the war.

COMPENSATORY TIME FOR SATURDAY SERVICE

ORDER No. 17351.

The Congress has amended the act entitled, "An act to fix the hours of duty of postal employees, and for other purposes," approved August 14, 1935, so as to permit payment for overtime for Saturday service in lieu of compensatory time. Effective March 27, 1942, this act as amended is as follows:

"When the needs of the service require supervisory employees, special clerks, clerks, laborers, watchmen, and messengers in first- and second-class post offices, and employees of the motor-vehicle and pneumatic-tube services, and carriers in the City Delivery Service and in the Village Delivery Service, and employees of the Railway Mail Service, clerks at division headquarters of post office inspectors, employees of the stamped envelope agency and employees of the mail equipment shops; cleaners, janitors, telephone operators, and elevator conductors, paid from appropriations of the First Assistant Postmaster General; and all employees of the Custodial Service except charwomen and charmen and those working part time, to perform service on Saturday they shall be allowed compensatory time for such service on one day within five working days next succeeding the Saturday on which the excess service was performed: *Provided*, That employees who are granted compensatory time on Saturday for work performed the preceding Sunday or the preceding holiday shall be given the benefits of this section on one day within five working days following the Saturday when such compensatory time was granted: *Provided further*, That the Postmaster General may, if the exigencies of the service require it, authorize the payment of overtime for Saturdays in lieu of compensatory time, except cleaners, janitors, telephone operators, and elevator conductors paid from the appropriation of the First Assistant Postmaster General, and custodial employees who shall be given compensatory time in lieu of overtime pay within 30 days next succeeding. This amendment shall be in effect only during the present war and for 6 months thereafter: * *"

In order to make effective the provisions of this act, you shall make an immediate survey of your office with a view of adjusting your schedules to conform with the intent of the act. **Where the exigencies of the service require**, you will require and use the services of such regular employees for Saturdays and pay for such service overtime in lieu of compensatory time.

Heretofore you have received your official allowances for overtime for the June quarter. You are authorized to use such part of this allowance as may be necessary to pay overtime in lieu of compensatory time for Saturday work without regard to the monthly apportionment. When you are in a position to determine the additional overtime necessary in lieu of compensatory time, you will submit revised estimates of auxiliary and overtime allowances for the June quarter explaining fully how the additional overtime allowance requested is to be utilized.

In reports for the month of April and each month thereafter on Form 1550-A and Form 1550-D enter in items 3, 14, and 25 the amount of overtime paid to regular clerks, watchmen, messengers, and laborers, and city carriers for Saturday service during the month. Enter in items 9, 20, and 31 the amounts paid for substitute clerks, watchmen, messengers, and laborers, and city carriers service performed in replacing regulars granted compensatory time for Saturday service during the month; do not enter any amount for substitute service performed in replacing regulars granted compensatory time for Saturday service in items 7, 18, and 29.

The amount of overtime paid for Saturday service for railway postal clerks should be entered in item 72 on Form 1550 R./M; for motor vehicle service in item 52 on Form 1550 M/V; and for village delivery service in item 95 on Form 1550 V/S.

POSTAL SERVICE ON MEMORIAL DAY

In view of the present war conditions and demands made on the postal service, it is directed that regular Saturday service, except rural delivery, be accorded at all post offices and branches of the postal service on Memorial Day, May 30, 1942.

Service performed on May 30, 1942, will be considered as Saturday service and compensation therefor will be treated accordingly.

MONEY-ORDER BUSINESS WITH NETHERLANDS INDIES SUSPENDED

ORDER No. 17281.

Effective this date it is ordered that the transaction of money-order business between the United States and the Netherlands Indies be suspended.

All parts of money orders now at or hereafter received by the New York exchange office will be returned to the issuing postmasters with instructions that

they be treated as "not issued" and the amounts plus fees will be refunded to the remitters with the information that no service is now available.

CENSORSHIP OF INTERNATIONAL MAIL

RULES GOVERNING PREPARATION OF CORRESPONDENCE

Director of Censorship Byron Price, has issued the following rules for the guidance of persons corresponding with foreign countries and has requested that postmasters and postal employees familiarize themselves with these regulations that patrons may be advised and helped in these matters.

"1. Postal communication with enemy or enemy occupied countries is illegal, and will not be permitted, except:

"a. Through the agency of the American Red Cross, which will transmit short messages of a personal nature.

"b. Communications with prisoners of war.

"2. In order to make the censorship of international mail as effective and economical as possible, the public is earnestly requested to conform to the following rules in regard to correspondence with persons in foreign countries, other than enemy or enemy occupied countries:

"a. The name and full address of the sender must be stated both on the outside of the envelope and in the letter itself.

"b. Correspondence should be in English if possible; the letters should be legible, clear, and brief. Avoid use of abbreviations, nicknames, phrases or codes in place of customary reference or descriptions of any person, firm, location, or other information.

"c. If English is not used the name of the language should be written in English on the face of the envelope.

"d. No mention should be made of defense matters, shipping, or weather conditions.

"e. Firms employed on munitions or other Government work should not mention that fact in writing abroad.

"f. Firms and individuals, except as indicated in g below should refuse to act as intermediaries or agents for the receipt and transmission of postal correspondence on behalf of persons in foreign countries.

"g. A member of the Army corresponding with foreign countries will not give the name of his post, camp, or station, but should give as his address the Army post office number of his unit in care of Postmaster New York or San Francisco or the address of a friend or relative in the United States, to whose care a reply can be sent for forwarding.

"3. Failure to comply with these rules may lead to delay in transmission or to the return of correspondence to the sender."

DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS AND STAMPS—DISTRIBUTION OF "OUR AMERICA" CIRCULAR

The second edition of rotogravure circulars entitled "Our America" prepared by the Treasury Department relative to the Defense Savings program is being mailed. The circulars will be in bundles of 50, 100, 500, and 1,000 copies to the bundle.

The individual circulars will not be addressed, but postmasters are directed to deliver them through lock boxes and general delivery windows and by city, village, star route, and rural carriers. It is intended that they be delivered to approximately 25 million homes in the United States. **They should not be delivered to offices, stores, factories, or to any place of business.**

The distribution should be made in a way not to interfere with the ordinary functions of the Postal Service, but it is expected that delivery will be completed within 10 days following receipt. Delivery by carriers may be spread over this period by having part deliveries made on each of several days. **Delivery should not be made by carriers on the first 2 days or the last 2 days of the month.**

The circulars will be mailed without requisition to each first- and second-class post office. Each central accounting office will be furnished a supply of the circulars in bundles of 50 copies for distribution to district post offices on the basis of 50 or more copies for each fourth-class office and 300 or more copies for each third-class office. Central accounting postmasters will estimate the needs of each district office and make the distribution accordingly, in original unbroken bundles.

UNITED STATES EMPLOYEES COMPENSATION COMMISSION

CHANGE IN ADDRESS

The offices of the United States Employees Compensation Commission have removed from Washington, D. C., to **285 Madison Avenue, New York, New York**. Suitable notation of this change in address should be made on page 100, article 105, paragraph 4 of the United States Official Postal Guide, July 1941. (See Change No. 21, p. 33.)

AMENDMENTS TO POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

ALIEN REGISTRATION EXPENDITURES

ITEMS MUST BE REPORTED SEPARATELY

Examination of reports on Form 1550-A (transcript of post office cash book) and on Form 3961-C/A (copy of bookkeeper's report) for February 28, 1942, discloses that postmasters are not claiming alien registration expenditures separately.

In order that accounts for the March quarter, 1942, and subsequent periods will be correctly reported, the blank line below A/C No. 86 on Forms 1550-A and 1550-C should be used; and the blank line below A/C No. 96 on Form 3961-C/A should be used, with the proper title inserted in each instance.

DIVISION OF INTERNATIONAL POSTAL SERVICE

INSURED PARCEL POST SERVICE TO SWITZERLAND DISCONTINUED

At the request of the Postal Administration of Switzerland, insured parcel-post service to Switzerland (including Liechtenstein) is suspended. Due note thereof should be made under the subitem "Parcel Post" of the item "Switzerland (including Liechtenstein)" on page 299 of Part II of the Guide.

Accordingly, postmasters will refuse to accept parcel-post packages to be sent to Switzerland insured. Ordinary parcel-post packages for delivery in Switzerland may be accepted and handled as heretofore.

Any insured parcel-post packages for Switzerland that have been mailed and failed of dispatch, or which may be mailed inadvertently hereafter, will be returned to the senders.

INSURED PARCELS FOR ARGENTINA TO BE LEGIBLY NUMBERED

The Postal Administration of Argentina has advised that insured parcels from the United States are continually being received with the insurance number illegible.

Attention is directed to section 107, paragraph 2 (h), page 70 of Part II of the Guide, from which it will be seen that the insurance number shall be *legibly* written immediately below the endorsement "Insured."

Postmasters are directed to take the necessary corrective action to assure strict observance of the above-mentioned provisions.

PARCEL POST TO PALESTINE

The Postal Administration of Palestine has advised that goods may be imported into that country by parcel post without import license only when the value of the goods contained in any one parcel or consignment of parcels (from the same sender to the same addressee) does not exceed one pound sterling (\$4.05) in value. Any parcel, or consignment of parcels from the same sender to the same addressee, exceeding one pound sterling in value requires the production by the addressee of an import license issued by the customs authorities of Palestine. If the addressee does not produce the import license, when required, the parcel or parcels involved will be confiscated. Mailers must endorse parcels exceeding one pound sterling in value to indicate that the addressee has obtained the import license. Parcels exceeding one pound sterling in value not so endorsed must be refused.

Postmasters are directed to bring the above requirements to the attention of the senders of parcels for Palestine.

DIVISION OF RAILWAY MAIL SERVICE

PARCELS FOR THE PERSONNEL OF OUR ARMED FORCES

It is necessary again to call the attention of postmasters and receiving clerks at parcel-post windows to the necessity for seeing that all parcels presented for mailing are properly wrapped and packed for safe transmission in the mails.

The postmaster at New York, N. Y., reports that a large number of parcel-post packages addressed to the personnel of our armed forces is being received in damaged condition. This applies to parcels addressed for delivery on board United States Naval vessels and to our Defense Bases. In many cases the damage is so extensive that it is difficult to identify the name of either the sender or the addressee. Parcels for our armed forces are often subjected to considerable handling, as they may be originally addressed for delivery to a camp in the United States and later forwarded to a United States port for transportation overseas where the vessel or military unit may be located.

The above shows the absolute necessity for substantial packing and of course includes parcels which may properly be accepted for insurance or to be sent as c. o. d.

PARCEL-POST MAIL

DISPATCH OF PARCELS WEIGHING 50 POUNDS OR MORE—TYING OR FASTENING PARCELS WEIGHING 30 POUNDS OR MORE

The order of August 31, 1939, which appeared in the Postal Bulletin of September 5, 1939, under the above head is modified to permit the use of gummed paper tape $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide made of No. 1 Kraft paper 60-pound test where 3-inch wide gummed paper tape has heretofore been required.

This modification is to be effective until further notice.

AIR MAIL TO AND FROM PERSONNEL U. S. ARMED FORCES OUTSIDE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES

The last sentence of the instructions published in The Postal Bulletin of December 26, 1941, and on page 15 of the January 1942 Supplement to the Postal Guide, in connection with Order No. 16604, concerning the acceptance of air mail at the rate of 6 cents per half ounce to and from the personnel of the United States armed forces outside the continental United States is amended to read as follows:

In order, therefore, that mail sent to and from the personnel of the armed forces may be recognized as entitled to the new rate, it must show in the address or in the return card, as the case may be, the rank or rating of the individual member of the armed forces receiving or sending such matter and either the military or naval unit to which he is assigned or his APO number.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

POSTAL MONEY ORDERS IN PAYMENT OF OBLIGATIONS TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO BE PAID WITHOUT EXACTION OF FEE WHEREVER PRESENTED

Federal Reserve banks are no longer accepting for collection and credit, either as cash items or as noncash items, out-of-town postal money orders drawn for commercial purposes. Provision has, however, been made for cashing at par at the local post office out-of-town money orders which are deposited in Federal Reserve banks by United States Government agencies.

The agreement with the Treasury Department is that, within 30 days after issue, money orders issued at and drawn on other post offices which are deposited

in Federal Reserve banks by officers of the Federal Government acting in their official capacity, are to be cashed at par at the local post office. Money orders endorsed by individuals in favor of Federal agents or agencies are, of course, included.

Only the fee provision of section 1429 of the Postal Laws and Regulations is being relaxed to accommodate Government agencies, and the restriction against payment elsewhere of money orders of Territorial (Alaskan, Hawaiian, etc.) origin or destination is still in force. Such money orders presented should be returned to the Federal Reserve bank or branch. The bank will have recourse to its depositor (the Government officer) who may send the item by mail to either the issuing or paying postmaster for collection in the manner provided by section 1431 of the Regulations.

Money orders cashed at par under this agreement are to be sent to the post office on which they were drawn. The postmaster there shall draw a check on his money-order credit with the Treasurer of the United States *for the face value of the money order, in favor of the postmaster* in the Federal Reserve city from whom he received it.

A postmaster who must draw such a check but has no credit should write to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders, for a special check, *sating the amount for which the check is to be drawn and the name of the post office to which it is to be sent.* (See section 1512 of the Regulations.)

Postmasters not already having a credit on money-order account with the Treasurer of the United States should write for a special check for this purpose *only as it is needed*, and should not fail to give the amount and the name of the postmaster in whose favor it is to be drawn.

Postmasters shall not send money by registered mail or use bank paper for this purpose, and postmasters in Federal Reserve cities should report to this Bureau those who use either of these means.

Postmasters should not confuse these instructions with those appearing in section 1431 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1940 and paragraph 30, page 156 of the Official Postal Guide for 1941. The latter refer only to money orders sent by banks or Government officers *direct to the issuing office or the office on which drawn.*

MONEY ORDER SERVICE FOR THE ARMED FORCES

This notice supersedes all prior notices appearing in the POSTAL BULLETIN and Monthly Supplements to the Postal Guide in regard to money orders bought by and drawn in favor of members of the Armed Forces.

CASHING OF MONEY ORDERS PRESENTED BY SOLDIERS, SAILORS, AND MARINES

A SOLDIER, SAILOR, OR MARINE SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO PAY A FEE WHEN HE PRESENTS A MONEY ORDER WHICH IS DRAWN ON ANOTHER POST OFFICE IF THE ORDER IS NOT MORE THAN 60 DAYS OLD. The rule in regard to the collection of such a fee is suspended and the paying period lengthened for the men in uniform for the duration of the war. This applies to those sent to territorial possessions, to bases on foreign territory, and to duty in a war zone, as well as to those transferred from one base camp or shore station to another in the United States.

Within a period of 60 days from the date of issue they may have their money orders cashed at post offices other than the office of issue or the office on which drawn. A money order may be paid under this arrangement ONLY if the soldier, sailor, or marine presenting it IS NAMED AS THE REMITTER OR PAYEE. Endorsed money orders are not included. If he is not known to the postmaster, he (the remitter or payee) should be identified by an officer of his organization who should sign the order and give his military rank.

The postmaster cashing such a money order shall not treat it as paid at his office. He shall back-stamp it on both order and coupon and send it either to the issuing office or to the office on which it is drawn and ask to be reimbursed for the full amount by a check on the Treasurer of the United States. If such an order is cashed at an A. P. O. attached to one of the United States post offices or by a Navy mail clerk aboard ship or at one of the naval shore stations, he (the clerk cashing the order) shall observe the same identification requirements, back-stamp it on both the order and coupon, and send it to the main office with his remittance of money-order funds. A postmaster finding any such money orders in station remittances shall treat them in the same manner as those paid at the main office.

Postmasters receiving an order of this kind should—

- (1) Note whether it is properly back-stamped by the postmaster who cashed it and who is responsible for its correct payment;
- (2) Treat it as paid (or repaid) and claim credit in the usual manner;
- (3) Draw a check on his money-order credit with the Treasurer of the United States FOR THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE MONEY ORDER (or orders) in favor of the postmaster who cashed it; and
- (4) Send the check to the postmaster in a penalty envelope.

A postmaster who must draw such a check but has no credit should write to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders, for a special check, stating the amount for which the check is to be drawn and the name of the post office to which it is to be sent.

This will mean that applications for duplicates of money orders which were originally bought by or drawn in favor of members of the Armed Forces cannot be acted upon as promptly as before. It has been decided that not less than 2 weeks' time should be allowed for the orders that are paid under this arrangement to reach the issuing or paying office and, therefore, APPLICATIONS FOR DUPLICATES OF ALL MONEY ORDERS BOUGHT BY OR DRAWN IN FAVOR OF MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES SHALL NOT BE CERTIFIED UNTIL AFTER 75 DAYS FROM THE DATE OF ISSUE. (In special cases the remitter or payee may give bond of indemnity for the immediate issue of a duplicate, as provided in par. 2, sec. 1447 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1940.) Before certifying to an application for a duplicate of any money order, the application shall be checked carefully to be sure that it does not belong in this class of cases and, if it does, certification shall be withheld for 75 days.

Because of great distances or lack of frequent mail service at the points where some of the money orders will be paid, this precaution may not in all cases prevent double payment. Therefore all postmasters are asked to cooperate by—

- (1) Forwarding such money orders as soon as possible to the issuing or paying post office (whichever is the nearer if the time is short), and
- (2) When such a money order is received for reimbursement, making an immediate search of the records if more than 75 days have passed and notifying the Department at once if it is found that a duplicate has already been applied for or issued.

This arrangement applies to money orders issued at ALL United States post offices, including the A. P. O.'s located on foreign soil and the mobile branches on the high seas. IT DOES NOT APPLY TO CANAL ZONE POST OFFICES, which are a part of a separate postal administration.

THIS ARRANGEMENT DOES NOT APPLY TO MONEY ORDERS PRESENTED BY CIVILIANS, even if they were bought by soldiers, sailors, or marines. All money orders presented by civilians shall be governed by the usual regulations regarding payment within a period of 30 days after issue in the United States proper. In those cases, the usual fee shall be deducted and Form 6126 sent to the issuing office.

ISSUING OF MONEY ORDERS IN FAVOR OF SOLDIERS, SAILORS, AND MARINES

In issuing money orders payable to soldiers, sailors, and marines, WHEN THE LOCATIONS MUST BE KEPT SECRET AND DEFINITE ADDRESSES CANNOT BE GIVEN, postmasters shall draw the money orders on "NEW YORK, N. Y."

If at a later date it is necessary to inquire about the payment of such an order or to certify to an application for a duplicate, the correspondence should be addressed to the postmaster at New York, N. Y.

MONEY-ORDERS—MAXIMUM LIMITED TO ONE ORDER NOT IN EXCESS OF \$10 IN ANY ONE DAY TO MEMBERS OF THE BRITISH AND CANADIAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCES

On page 17 of the June 1940 SUPPLEMENT TO THE OFFICIAL POSTAL GUIDE a notice was published announcing the inauguration of a special money-order service for the delivery of United States money orders through the Postal Administration of Great Britain to members of the British and Canadian Expeditionary Forces by means of British postal drafts, which instructions were supplemented and explained in a notice appearing on page 26 of the Supplement for August 1941.

The maximum amount for a single order in such cases was fixed at \$10 or its equivalent in sterling at the prevailing official money-order exchange rate. However, some postmasters in order to make up a larger amount have issued a series of money orders for this maximum in favor of the same payee.

The British Department points out that this action is not in accord with the original intention of this special service, which was adopted to expedite payment of small amounts to members of the military forces through army post offices. It is further stated that as the army post offices are subject to movement with the military units to which they are attached, only a limited amount of funds is available with which to pay money orders; consequently when orders for larger amounts are presented the facilities for payment are severely taxed.

Postmasters are, therefore, directed hereafter to limit the issue of each money order to be paid by a postal draft to a maximum of \$10 and to not more than the above maximum from one remitter to the same payee in a single day.

Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants, or in answering inquiries regarding payment.

DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS—DUPLICATE STUBS TO BE RETAINED

Effective upon receipt of this notice *duplicate* stubs of Defense Savings bonds shall be numbered to agree with the corresponding issued or spoiled bonds and filed in numerical order at the office of issue.

The instructions which appeared in the Postal Bulletins of July 22 and August 1, 1941, requiring postmasters to record on depositors' applications the serial numbers of bonds issued and memoranda covering replacements for bonds spoiled or canceled remain unchanged. The applications should be filed in alphabetical order; and to reduce the work of maintaining this alphabetical file, each month's applications may be filed separately.

The duplicate stubs of bonds issued and spoiled in March prior to the receipt of this notice cannot be filed since they have not been numbered. They should be disposed of either by burning or as waste postal material. In the event the latter method is used, they should be mutilated in such manner that the information thereon will not be legible. Duplicate stubs sent to the Department prior to the receipt of this notice will be appropriately disposed of here.

The Department will send copies of this notice to all fourth-class savings-bond offices, and central savings-bond depositaries may obtain additional copies from the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Postal Savings.

DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS

LABELS FOR TRANSMITTING BULKY REPORTS

Official labels (Form 907-A) have been printed for use by first- and second-class postmasters in submitting monthly Defense savings-bond reports (Form 904, accompanying abstracts and stubs) that are too large for enclosure in envelope (Form 907). Postmasters whose reports are bulky should requisition a supply of these labels from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Building Operations and Supplies, Equipment and Supplies Branch, Washington, D. C.

DEFENSE SAVINGS STAMPS—RESTRICTIONS ON REPRODUCTION

Postmasters receiving inquiries regarding the reproduction of Defense Savings stamps by photograph or any other method are directed to inform the inquirer the Treasury Department has informed this Department that such stamps are clearly obligations of the United States and their reproduction a violation of section 150 of the Criminal Code, except when specific authority has been obtained from the Secretary of the Treasury.

ALBUMS FOR DEFENSE POSTAL SAVINGS STAMPS

FURTHER DISTRIBUTION COMPLETED

The Treasury Department has completed a further distribution of albums for 10-cent, 25-cent, and 50-cent savings stamps to all first-class post offices. In view of this distribution the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Building Operations and Supplies, Equipment and Supplies Branch, will now fill from the requisitions on hand only those where first-class postmasters have reported their allotments to be inadequate. Postmasters at second-, third-, and fourth-class offices selling Defense stamps should, as heretofore, obtain albums by requisition on their designated central postal-savings depositary offices.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAIIS

DEFENSE SAVINGS BONDS SERIES E

RETURN OF STUBS AND BONDS BY AUTHORIZED ISSUING AGENTS

The Federal Reserve Bank has designated certain banks, firms, corporations, and others as Authorized Issuing Agents for United States Defense Savings Bonds Series E and under Treasury Regulations these Authorized Issuing Agents are required to return the stubs of all bonds sold, spoiled or canceled bonds, and unissued or excess stock to the appropriate Federal Reserve Bank.

Mailings of stubs of sold United States Defense Savings Bonds Series E spoiled or canceled bonds, and unissued or excess stock, weighing in excess of 8 ounces, presented by an Authorized Issuing Agent and addressed to the appropriate Federal Reserve Bank, may be accepted, as insured mail to be treated as registered mail, at the fourth-class (parcel post) rate of postage in addition to an insurance fee of 15 cents on each shipping unit. A single article may not exceed 70 pounds in weight. Each article must be securely sealed.

Each such article accepted is to be marked "Insured No. —," but is to be treated as registered mail. The article must bear a notation placed thereon by the sender by rubber stamp impression, printed slip, by matter printed thereon, or by other means, reading as follows:

"This article is put up and mailed by authority of the Post Office Department upon prepayment of postage at the fourth-class (parcel post) rate and insurance fee. It must be recorded and handled as a registered article by postal employees."

RAMSEY S. BLACK,
Third Assistant Postmaster General."

Any such article weighing less than 8 ounces shall be accepted for registration at the first-class rate only in addition to the registry fee of 15 cents.

There will be no registry surcharge on any such article, whether mailed as insured mail to be treated as registered matter, or as registered mail.

In billing the articles which are accepted as insured mail to be treated as registered mail they should be listed on the same bill with the registered articles.

Postmasters should note that the fourth-class (parcel post) rate of postage applies only to mailings of these stubs, spoiled or canceled bonds, and unissued or excess stock, or to other special mailings where similar authority has been given.

Postmasters will maintain an accurate separate record of the number of articles of the character mentioned above mailed as insured mail treated as registered mail, and render an appropriate report thereof at the end of the fiscal year. Any of the mailings weighing 8 ounces or less and sent as registered mail should be reported at the end of the fiscal year by being included in the other 15-cent registrations.

CONSERVATION—SALVAGE AND DISPOSITION OF BRISTLE BRUSHES

Bristles used in various types of brushes have heretofore been imported. Sources of supply are now no longer available. It is incumbent upon postmasters and officers of the Postal Service to take immediate steps for the conservation and reclamation of these bristles.

To prolong the useful life of bristle brushes see to it that all of these brushes are properly cleaned after each operation and stored in an appropriate container in a cool and dry place. Under no circumstances shall these brushes be stored in water.

In order that bristles in unserviceable industry you are directed to forward all and turned back to the brush-making industry you are directed to forward all unserviceable and worn-out bristle brushes (paint, varnish, Fitch, etc., as distinguished from hair brushes, which are not included herein) to the Postmaster, General Custodial Supplies, Morgan Annex, West Thirtieth Street and Ninth Avenue, New York, N. Y.

The conservation and salvage of these bristles is of the utmost importance and you are admonished to give the foregoing immediate and personal attention.

DISPLAY OF WANTED CIRCULAR REGARDING PHILIP H. CHADWICK TO BE DISCONTINUED

A notice appeared in Postal Bulletin of October 6, 1941, authorizing the display of a wanted circular issued by the Bureau of Narcotics, Treasury Department pertaining to PHILIP H. CHADWICK.

The display of this circular should be discontinued as notice has been received from the Bureau of Narcotics that the fugitive named has been apprehended.

DISPLAY MATTER IN LOBBIES

MUST BE AUTHORIZED—CURRENT—ORDERLY ARRANGED

The bulletin boards and lobby walls in many post offices present a disordered appearance because they are cluttered up with displays many of which are not authorized and others that are soiled, torn, or obsolete.

Immediately every postmaster shall make an inspection and cause to be removed every bulletin, notice or poster which is not authorized or of no current value. Retained matter shall be orderly arranged. Soiled or torn matter shall be replaced with clean stock. So far as possible displays shall be posted on the regular bulletin board that walls may be protected and kept free from that cluttered-up appearance.

In addition to the authorized post office displays, Civil Service notices, "Wanted" circulars issued by the Department of Justice or Secret Service and notices advertising the needs of the several departments and agencies for local purchases are approved. No additional matter shall be posted without specific authority from the Department.

The postmaster personally or some responsible employee under his personal direction shall make such frequent observations and take such appropriate action that these instructions shall be complied with strictly at all times.
