

The Following Notices Were Issued From the Office of the Postmaster General

Washington, April 6, 1942.

With the United States at war, it is of the utmost importance that absolute secrecy regarding military information and the movements of troops, planes, trains, and vessels on the high seas be maintained at all times.

Postal employees in various branches of the service necessarily must possess such information for the proper dispatch and routing of the mails. It is this type of information which can give aid and comfort to the enemy and, for this reason, of information which can give aid and comfort to the enemy and, for this reason, I cannot emphasize too strongly the necessity of every postal employee maintaining strict secrecy about such information which, if divulged even indirectly, may result in the loss of thousands of lives and the destruction of ships, cargoes, and military equipment. Every postal employee must be keenly aware of the responsibility which is his in treating such knowledge in a most confidential manner. We in the Postal Service must be constantly on the alert with ourselves to prevent the disclosing of this military information through a slip of the tongue or a seemingly innocent phrase in a letter to a relative or friend.

The whole-hearted cooperation of every postal employee is demanded in order that we give neither aid nor comfort to our common enemies through the inadvertent dissemination of any information of this character.

LIMITS IN WEIGHT AND DIMENSIONS OF MAIL FOR DELIVERY OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES

ORDER No. 17471.

To assure to our armed forces that all available ocean and air transportation space is devoted to war essentials and to prevent congestion at ports of embarkation and debarkation, the War and Navy Departments are directing and supervising shipping facilities used in ocean and air transportation to and from our

territories and bases, and to foreign countries.

The War and Navy Departments have informed the Post Office Department, and the Post Office Department realizes, that large quantities of second-, third-, and fourth-class (parcel post) mail matter addressed for delivery outside the continental United States, and of similar matter in the international mails, are seriously interfering with and delaying the expeditious movement of vital war supplies, and that merchandise and printed matter not absolutely essential to the war effort which were formerly transported by other means, are now being placed in the mails. Therefore, as a military necessity, the following restrictions shall become effective immediately:

(1) No parcel or package of any class of mail, including air mail, addressed for delivery outside the continental United States shall be accepted for mailing if it exceeds 11 pounds in weight, or 18 inches in length, or 42 inches in length and girth combined; provided that these restrictions shall not apply to matter addressed to Canada or Mexico, nor to official matter of the United States Government on which postage is paid or which is entitled under section 618, Postal Laws and

Regulations, to be mailed free of postage under the penalty privilege.

Mail addressed for delivery "outside the continental United States" as herein

used shall include:

a. All mail for Alaska, the Canal Zone, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the island possessions of the United States;

b. All mail addressed to Army Post Offices (A. P. O.'s) in care of the Postmaster

at New York, N. Y., San Francisco, Calif., or Seattle, Wash.;

c. All mail for naval forces addressed in care of the Postmaster at New York, N. Y., or San Francisco, Calif.;

d. All international mail except that addressed to Canada and Mexico.

(2) Not more than one such parcel or package shall be accepted for mailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or for the same addressee.

(3) Perishable matter regardless of weight or size addressed as set forth in

paragraph I above shall not be accepted for mailing.

(4) No exceptions to paragraphs 1 and 2 above shall be made by postmasters unless the mailer presents a permit issued under regulations of the Post Office, War, or Navy Department authorizing the acceptance of the articles or matters mentioned in such permit when presented for mailing in a parcel or package weighing in excess of 11 pounds, or exceeding 18 inches in length, or exceeding 42 inches in length and girth combined. But in no case shall such parcel or package be in excess of the limits of weight and dimensions in existence prior to the effective date of this order. Parcels or packages accepted under such permit shall be endorsed by the postmaster "Acceptance for mailing authorized by Permit dated."

(5) The foregoing shall not be construed to increase the limits of weight or dimensions in the international mails in those cases where the present limits of

weight or dimensions are less than those above prescribed.

It is essential to the war effort that the spirit of these regulations be observed by all mailers. If a postmaster has good reason to believe that any person or concern is violating or evading any of the above restrictions, he should report the matter promptly to the Third any of the above restrictions, he should report the matter promptly to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification, in the case of domestic mails or to the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service, in the case of international mails

Postmasters should give wide publicity to these regulations in order that all persons and concerns in the community may be informed of this necessity to conserve shipping and forces (Postal conserve shipping space for the greater needs of our armed forces. LIMITS IN WEIGHT AND DIMENSIONS OF MAIL FOR DELIVERY OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES-SHIPMENTS TO MILITARY AND NAVAL AGENCIES OR MEMBERS OF ARMED FORCES

(General Permit A)

ORDER No. 17559.

1. The following are general exceptions, effective immediately to Order No. 17471 of April 20, 1942.

SHIPMENTS TO MILITARY AND NAVAL AGENCIES

Parcel post within the limits of size and weight in effect prior to April 20, 1942, presented by a private mailer and intended for delivery outside of the continental United States within the meaning of Order No. 17471, shall be accepted for mailing and endorsed "Mailed Under General Permit A," provided

(a) The parcel is addressed to a military or naval agency (subject to the exceptions in paragraph 4 hereof), or to an officer of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps,

or Coast Guard at a ship or station by official title, and

(b) The mailer either (1) exhibits an order or a request, showing that the parcel is intended for use of the United States and is mailed pursuant to a bona fide Government order or contract, or (2) the parcel is accompanied with a certification signed by the mailer that the shipment is for use of the United States and in response to a bona fide Government order or contract; such certification to be filed by the postmaster.

PRIVATE SHIPMENTS TO MEMBERS OF ARMED FORCES

3. Parcel post within the limits of size and weight in effect prior to April 20, 1942, presented for mailing by a dealer or member of an individual's family and intended for delivery outside of the continental United States within the meaning of Order No. 17471, shall be accepted for mailing and endorsed "Mailed Under General Permit A," provided

(a) The parcel is addressed to a member of the armed forces, and the mailer dealers a that the gentants consist of military elething or equipment only and

declares that the contents consist of military clothing or equipment only and exhibits the order or request of the member of the armed forces to whom the shipment is addressed, or

(b) The parcel is accompanied with a certification signed by the mailer that the shipment is in response to a bona fide order or request from the member of the armed forces to whom it is addressed, and that the parcel contains only military clothing or equipment; such certification to be filed by the postmaster.

4. The foregoing does not permit shipments in excess of weight, dimension or frequency set forth in Order No. 17471 when such shipments are addressed to

Army post exchanges, ships' service stores, canteens or to any activity wherein the contents of such shipments are intended for sale.

5. The restriction in paragraph 2 of Order No. 17471 that not more than one parcel or package shall be accepted for mailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or for the same addressee, does not apply to parcels mailed pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 3 above. (Postal Bulletin No. 18433, May 6, 1942.)

SATURDAY SERVICE—SUPERVISORS

ORDER No. 17539.

Reference is made to Order No. 17351 amending the shorter work week law. Where it is necessary to require any services of Assistant Postmasters and other supervisors in the postal service on Saturdays, and where it is not practical to grant compensatory time for such services, payment for overtime may be made in lieu of compensatory time. Postmasters, assistant postmasters and all other supervisors in the Postal Service will be held strictly responsible for the proper administration of this order and see to it that there are no abuses. Under no circumstances should overtime be paid when compensatory time can be granted without impairment to the service.

Order No. 17492 is hereby revoked. (Postal Bulletin No. 18431, May 1, 1942.) Note.—Order No. 17492 was published in Postal Bulletin No. 18427. April

EMPLOYEES ENTERING MILITARY SERVICE, PAYMENT FOR ACCUMULATED LEAVE AUTHORIZED

ORDER No. 17524.

Referring to previous notices relative to employees on military duty, an act of Congress approved April 7, 1942, provides in effect that all employees who enter the military service subsequent to May 1, 1940, regardless of the method of induction are entitled to receive pay for accumulated leave. Therefore, the procedure which has been followed in the cases of those employees in the past who have been ordered to duty will obtain where employees voluntarily enlist. (Postal Bulletin No. 18430, April 29, 1942.)

TRANSFER AND RELEASE OF EMPLOYEES UNDER WAR SERVICE REGULATION IX

In connection with requests for transfer or release of employees to other departments and agencies or outside war industries, under war service regulation 1X, the Post Office Department has entered into an agreement with the Civil Service Commission to the effect that all requests for such transfers and releases will be handled through the Post Office Department and the Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C. Postmasters and other officials in the field will not, therefore, approve or take action on any such requests but will forward all communications received by them to the proper bureau of the department with appropriate comment concerning the availability of the employee for transfer or release. (Postal Bulletin No. 18432, May 4, 1942.)

POSTAL SERVICE ON MEMORIAL DAY

In view of the present war conditions and demands made on the Postal Service, it is directed that regular Saturday service, except rural delivery, be accorded at all post offices and branches of the postal service on Memorial Day, May 30, 1942. Service performed on May 30, 1942, will be considered as Saturday service and compensation therefor will be treated accordingly. (Postal Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR ENCAMPMENTS

Postmasters, and all other officials of the Postal Service with employees under their supervision, are hereby authorized to grant leave of absence, upon proper application, to employees who are members of war veteran associations or organizations, and who may be spared without detriment to the service, to attend the annual encampments of their organizations, such absence to be charged to annual leave, or, if necessary, leave may be granted without pay. (Postal Bulletin No. 18423, April 13, 1942.)

DRAFT REGISTRATION

Notice to postmasters and other postal officials in the field having personnel

under their jurisdiction.

Wherever necessary due to hours of schedule, regular postal employees shall be granted sufficient leave of absence with pay, in addition to their annual leave, in order that they may register on April 27, 1942, as provided for in the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, as amended. (Postal Bulletin No. 18422, April 10, 1942.)

ACCIDENT PREVENTION—CITY DELIVERY AND MOTOR VEHICLE SERVICES

ORDER No. 17436.

Referring to previous notices of this Department, relating to the promotion of safety upon the highways, and the reduction and prevention of accidents in connection with the operation of motor vehicles in the Postal Service: It is hereby ordered, That each employee operating a motor vehicle in the city delivery and motor vehicles services, to the extent of not less than 750 hours during each 6 months' period ending December 31 and June 30 of each year, who has not had

an accident or has not been responsible for an accident, be awarded 75 merits as

a reward for careful driving.

It is further ordered: That an employee who operates a vehicle in the city delivery and motor vehicle services and has not less than 1,500 driving hours to his credit during a fiscal year, and has not had an accident or has not been responsible for an accident, be awarded a "Safe-driving medal."

Any act of an employee contributing to an accident such as failure to observe all traffic regulations, or improper operation of the vehicle, will make him en-

eligible to receive such recognition.

This order will be retroactive to January 1, 1942, and supersedes all previous instructions relating to the issuance of merits for safe driving. (Postal Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

RETIREMENT

The attention of all postmasters and other postal officials is directed to the notice in the Postal Bulletin of February 25, 1942, under "Retirement." Therein is shown the necessity for the separation of the retirement records for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1942, into two periods; first, from July 1, 1941, through January 23, 1942; second, from January 24, 1942, through June 30, 1942.

For convenience in preparing Form 1280, the Annual Report of Retirement Deductions for fiscal year 1942, there appears below a table showing salary grade, salary at 96½ percent, retirement deductions at 3½ percent, tontine, and net deductions by the periods as above, for employees paid full time during the entire fiscal year. Form 1550 R/Q may be used for the computation of retirement equivalents for part-time service.

Complete instructions relative to the detailed preparation of Form 1280 will

be forwarded with the supply of the form on or about June 30, 1942.

It is to be noted by all concerned that this notice applies only to the fiscal year 1942 and that commencing July 1, 1942, for the fiscal year 1943, retirement deductions will be at the rate of 5 percent, for which new tables will be supplied at a later date.

POSTMASTERS' RETIREMENT DEDUCTIONS

Under the provisions of an act approved January 24, 1942, which amended the Civil Service Retirement Law, postmasters not theretofore within the scope of the Retirement Act automatically obtained a retirement status on that date and have since been subject to its benefits and obligations. This does not include acting postmasters, except those having a civil-service status when appointed

acting postmaster.

Regular retirement deductions at the rate of 3½ percent must be withheld from compensation from January 24 to June 30, 1942, and at the rate of 5 percent commencing July 1, 1942. Therefore, all such postmasters will pay themselves at 100 percent to January 23, 1942, and at 96½ percent from January 24 to March 31, 1942, interlining both amounts as two totals under the proper account number on cash books and quarterly reports. For the June quarter all payments will be at 961/2 percent only, and at 95 percent thereafter.

All such postmasters who have reached the age of 70 years or will attain that age on or before April 30, 1942, and who have rendered at least 15 years' service for the United States Government, will be compulsorily retired for age on April

30, 1942.

Optional retirement is provided at the age of 60 years if 30 years' service has been rendered, and at 62 years if 15 years' service has been completed. Postmasters desiring to exercise either option should advise this office. (Postal Bulletin No. 18418, April 1, 1942.)

DISCONTINUANCE OF THE USE OF THE SR-2 SERIES OF FORMS

The information furnished on the SR-2 series of forms is no longer required by this Bureau. Accordingly, postmasters at first- and second-class post offices and third-class village delivery offices should immediately discontinue the use of this form. A report for the month of March will not be required and should not

be furnished to the central accounting postmaster.

Central accounting postmasters will no longer be required to compile reports based on the SR-2 series of forms heretofore received from first- and second-class

post offices and third-class village delivery offices.

The supply of these forms on hand may be disposed of as waste material. (Postal Bulletin No. 18417, March 30, 1942.)

MAILS AND PARCELS FOR PRISONERS OF WAR AND FOR DETAINED OR INTERNED CIVILIANS

Existing instructions on the sending of regular mail articles and parcels to prisoners of war free of postage (those relating to regular correspondence in section 32 and those relating to parcels in section 71 of Part II of the Postal Guide), are changed and supplemented so as to extend the privilege of free postage to civilians detained or interned by the civil or military authorities (unless held on criminal charges), whether detained in the United States or other belligerent countries, to be effective during the continuance of the present war or until otherwise ordered, such privileges have are not to apply to people as a the former official wise ordered, such privileges however not to apply to members of the former official missions of enemy belligerent countries awaiting repatriation or to persons whose

residence, for reasons of national security, is merely changed from one section of the country to another. (It is understood that there are no detained civilians as contemplated except in the United States, those in other countries being classed as interned civilians. While service is not now available for carrying parcels to prisoners in Japan and Japanese controlled countries, it is reported practicable to send letters to such prisoners in the manner hereinafter indicated.) Accordingly, sections 32 and 71 of Part II of the Postal Guide are to be modified as directed in Change No. 64 on pages 47 and 49 of this Supplement. (Postal Bulletin No. 18433. May 6, 1942.)

SHIPMENTS IN INTERNATIONAL MAILS

Export License Necessary - Mailcerts Discontinued

As a result of a recent agreement between the Governments of the United States and Great Britain, mailcerts are no longer issued. An export license, from the Board of Economic Warfare, for materials subject to license by that agency will now serve as a combined license and mailcert. The materials so subject to license include ALL ARTICLES AND MATERIALS OF ANY CHARACTER OR DESCRIP-TION WHATSOEVER, except gold and narcotics which are licensed by the Treasury Department; arms, ammunition, implements of war, helium and tin plate scrap licensed by the State Department, letters and other mail articles directly controlled by the Director of Censorship.

Effective April 1, 1942, all forms of the articles and materials subject to export

control (except those specifically listed below) may be shipped under general license to Iran, Iraq, Ireland (Eire), Liberia, Syria, and Turkey, only via mail in individual shipments not exceeding \$25 in value. The general license numbers

of these former mailcert destinations are as follows:

The value of \$25 shall be construed to mean the total value of the items (including metal containers of all types but exclusive of nonmetalic packaging) contained in any one shipment which is exported under general license. The same parcel may include other articles which raise the total value above \$25: Provided, That appropriate licenses for such other articles are presented at time of mailing. If an order for a product is in excess of \$25, no partial shipment of such order may be made under these general licenses.

Descriptions of general and individual licenses follow:

1. GENERAL LICENSES.

(a) General licenses are not issued to individual exporters but are licenses which have been issued by the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, to cover exportation of specified articles and materials to specified countries of destination.

(b) When articles and materials valued at \$25.00 or less, falling within the group of items permitted exportation under general license, are presented for mailing, the sender must endorse the general license number in a conspicuous

place on the address side of the wrapper, such as G-88, G-89, etc.

2. Individual Licenses.

(a) Articles and materials not covered by general licenses or by unlimited licenses require individual licenses from the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare. Individual licenses are issued to cover the exportation of a specific commodity as indicated in the license, by one licensee to one addressee only. Application forms and information may be obtained by prospective mailers of articles and materials under individual licenses from the following:

Collector of Customs.

District Offices of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce. *

When a parcel accompanied by an individual license is presented at the post office for mailing, the accepting postmaster will check the contents as described on the customs declaration and the shipper's export declaration against the information shown in the license. The same information concerning the nature and value of the articles to be exported must appear in each document. The mailer must endorse the individual license number on the wrapper. If it appears to be in order, the parcel is to be accepted for mailing and forwarded to the appropriate dispatching exchange office. The original license is taken up by

appropriate dispatching exchange office. The original license is taken up by the postmaster. After completion the license is to be transmitted to the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, Washington, D. C.

Postmasters will cause due notice to be taken of the foregoing in order to assure compliance therewith. Part II of the Postal Guide for July 1941 is amended by eliminating section 62-A on page 53, and by deleting the references to section 62-A under the subheading "Observations" of the various countries mentioned in the first paragraph of the said section.

INTERNATIONAL MAILS

Matches of Every Description Prohibited

Numerous complaints have been received in the Department from abroad advising that matches are being sent in the international mails by mailers in the

By referring to paragraph (f) of section 22 and paragraph (a) of section 61, United States. pages 17 and 49, respectively, of Part II of the Official Postal Guide, it will be noted that matches, including safety matches, are prohibited in the international mails. Matches come within the category of dangerous or explosive articles.

Postmasters are directed to issue to those concerned at their offices the additional instructions necessary to assure that no matches of any description are contained in any article accepted for mailing to a foreign country. This should be done by examination of customs declarations or by inquiry of prospective (Postal Bulletin No. 18426. April 20, 1942.) mailers.

AIR MAIL SERVICE TO NEWFOUNDLAND

Effective May 1, 1942, through air mail service of a frequency of daily except Sunday will be available to Newfoundland, The postage required on civilian mail posted in continental United States and Alaska to be carried by this service to Newfoundland, and civilian mail posted in Army post offices in Newfoundland for the United States and Alaska, shall be 15 cents per half ounce or fraction. The postage required on civilian mail posted in Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and Hawaii for Newfoundland, shall be the air-mail postage from those points to the United States, plus 15 cents per half ounce, and the postage required on civilian mail posted in Army post offices in Newfoundland for points beyond the United States, shall be 15 cents per half ounce, plus the prescribed postage from the United States to the respective destinations. Articles addressed to personnel of the armed forces of the United States in Newfoundland for delivery at Army post offices, and articles mailed by such personnel at those offices, destined to United States post offices, will of course be subject to the 6 cents per half ounce rate under Order No. 16604. Mails continued to be received at the rate of 6 cents per ounce, should be sent by air to Moneton (New Brunswick) for onward dispatch by ordinary means. (Postal Bulletin No. 18431, May 1, 1942.)

MAIL BAGS AND LOCKS

Proper Treatment and Disposal of Defective Equipment

Reports have been received from the Fourth Assistant that mail sacks and pouches have been received in the mail equipment shops, with ripped seams, lacing cords cut, and defective locks and cord fasteners. It is believed that the damage has been caused because of the use of defective locks or cord

fasteners which could not be opened.

This equipment should be carefully examined before being used, and if locks or cord fasteners are found to be defective they should be withdrawn immediately from service and turned in to the mail equipment shops in accordance with the provisions of section 1884, Postal Laws and Regulations. When a lock attached to a pouch or a lock or cord fastener attached to a sack cannot be opened, the cords or collar fasteners should not be cut but the seam of the bag should be ripped in accordance with the provisions of section 1883, Postal Laws and Regulations. Division Superintendents of the Railway Mail Service and postmasters should advise all concerned accordingly. (Postal Bulletin No. 18426, April 20, 1942.)

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

CHANGE IN DOMESTIC MONEY ORDER FORM

On and after May 6, 1942, a new plate is to be used in the printing of domestic money-order forms. The principal change is that the coupon portion will be

% inch longer and the order portion correspondingly shorter.

Until such time as the new money-order form is in general use, postmasters will need to use care in separating the coupons. If the new form is used as the guide in cutting, the coupon line will fall across the serial number and amount in the order portion of the old forms in the bundle. On the other hand, if the old form is used as the guide, part of the names of remitter and payee will be cut from the coupon of the new forms. At offices having special cutters, the gauge should be set midway between the two coupon lines. Other changes are:

 Spacing as well as length of writing lines for names of remitter and payee increased.

Extra space (taken from receipt) provided between staple and amount block in stub.

3. Marginal check (logotype) printed to show figures in blue on black background, instead of black on blue background.

 The words, "Identification Required" given greater prominence.
 Larger clear space on order, coupon and receipt for impression of M. O. B. stamp.

6. Shield reduced in size to give more space for writing the name of the paying office.

7. On reverse of form, position of spaces for bank stamps and instructions reversed, thus insuring the maximum clear space on the order portion of endorsements.

8. Instructions on reverse revised.

Postmasters will, of course, use the stock of money-order forms on hand and not make requisition for the new forms until 60 days before the present supply will be exhausted. (Postal Bulletin No. 18431, May 1, 1942.)

DISTINCTION BETWEEN TREATMENT OF MONEY ORDERS PRESENTED BY FEDERAL RESERVE BANKS AND UNITED STATES AGENCIES AND THOSE PRESENTED BY PRIVATE

Some postmasters have confused the directions relative to the treatment of a money order presented at other than the office on which drawn by a Federal Reserve bank which appeared in the POSTAL BULLETIN of March 12, 1942, with the instructions regarding payment to banks generally which are stated in paragraph 30, page 156, of Part I of the Postal Guide of July 1941.

In the first instance, provision is made for cashing at par postal money orders used in payment of obligations to the Federal Government. Such orders are to be paid for full face value by a check on the Treasurer of the United States and, if mailed, the check is to be sent in a penalty envelope. This treatment also applies to orders sent by United States agencies direct to the office on which drawn and to orders cashed for members of the armed forces and sent for reimbursement to the office on which drawn or the isoning office. the office on which drawn or the issuing office.

In the other case, money orders cashed by banks for the public generally may be sent to the office on which drawn for reimbursement by a check on the Treasurer of the United States for the full amount, but postage for mailing the check is to be furnished by the bank or deducted from the face value of the money order.

In either instance, if the postmaster at the office on which the order was drawn does not have a money-order credit with the Treasurer of the United States, he should apply to the Third Assistant Postmaster General for a special check. (See section 1512 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1940.) (Postal Bulletin No. 1849) 18429, April 27, 1942.)

MONEY ORDERS INCORRECTLY DRAWN ON ARMY POSTS

(Payment Authorized)

Money orders intended for soldiers at military eamps or forts are frequently drawn through error to show as paying office the local name of the post instead of the main office to which such post is tributary. For example, the orders are sometimes drawn on Camp Funston which is served by an A. P. O. unit of Junction City, Kans. The postmasters at post offices from which such units are served should effect payment of the orders for the full amount instead of returning them because they are drawn on a place not a post office. Credit for payment should then be claimed as though the orders were actually drawn on the main office. (If there is a post office in the State bearing the same name as the Camp or Fort, the order should be cashed for full face value and returned to the issuing office for a new order correctly drawn.) (Postal Bulletin No. 18430, April 29, 1942.)

INQUIRIES CONCERNING MONEY ORDERS ISSUED BY OR DRAWN ON A. P. O. OR SHIP BRANCHES OF NEW YORK, SAN FRANCISCO, OR SEATTLE TO BE SENT TO THE MAIN POST OFFICE

Many postmasters cashing money orders for members of the armed forces send Forms 6126 to the A. P. O. (military) or Naval address instead of to the main post office of New York, San Francisco, or Seattle. This also applies in cases where a separate advice is needed by the paying postmaster (Form 6006). Consequently sometimes the inquiry does not reach the main office for a month or more. As the records of these branches are at the main post office, postmasters are informed that all inquiries or notices of payment of orders shall be sent to the postmaster at the main post office to which the branch, station, money order unit, or A. P. O. is attached. The money-order applications or the paid orders, concerning which the inquiries are made, may be delayed in arriving at the respective main offices, but as soon as these records are received by the postmaster, the inquiries will be answered. Pending that time postmasters cashing such orders should retain them in the suspended files. (Postal Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

MONEY ORDERS INTENDED FOR PAYMENT AT CAMP CROWDER, MISSOURI, MUST NOT BE DRAWN ON CROWDER, MISSOURI

A large number of money orders intended for payment at the Camp Crowder Branch of Neosho, Mo., are erroneously drawn on Crowder, Mo., a post office in a different county and entirely across the State from Neosho. Such procedure involves unnecessary work and necessitates that such orders be treated as suspended items.

Issuing employees are cautioned to use extra care in their work and in case it is intended that an order be made payable to a soldier at Camp Crowder to see that the application Form 6001 is correctly filled in by the remitter. (Postal

Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

NO MONEY ORDER SERVICE AVAILABLE WITH BRITISH NORTH BORNEO OR SARAWAK

The Postal Administration of Great Britain, which acts as intermediary in the transaction of money order business between the United States and British North Borneo and with Sarawak, has notified this office that the forwarding of money orders for payment in those places has been discontinued.

Postmasters and employees assigned to the issue of international money orders will take due notice of the foregoing and decline applications for money orders to be paid in British North Borneo or Sarawak. (Postal Bulletin No. 18420, April

6, 1942.)

DIVISION OF POSTAL SAVINGS

UNITED STATES SAVINGS BONDS

Additional Officials and Employees Authorized to Certify Requests for Payment

In addition to post office personnel previously authorized to certify requests for payment of United States savings bonds, the Treasury Department has granted similar authority to the following:

 At first-class offices, the Assistant Superintendent of Mails; and
 At first- and second-class offices and at classified stations and branches, those clerks specially designated in writing by the postmasters for the purpose provided that such specially designated clerks shall in all cases sign in the form: 'Richard Roe, postmaster, by John Doe, designated clerk," and that their signature be authenticated by the dating stamp of the office. (Postal Bulletin No. 18418, April 1, 1942,)

WAR SAVINGS BONDS

REGISTERED MAILINGS WITHOUT PREPAYMENT OF FEES

Postmasters are authorized and instructed to use registered mail service, without prepayment of the registry fee (or postage, when required), in the shipment of War savings bonds when the bonds are issued at their offices in accordance with lists tendered by business firms, or when issued by such concerns and submitted to the post office for verification, authentication by an impression of the official post office stamp, and mailing.

Postmasters should include all mailings of this character, on which the registry fee and any required postage were not paid at the time of mailing, in their monthly report to their respective central savings-bond depositary offices as provided by the instructions appearing in the October 1937 Supplement to the Postal

All registered mailings of these bonds should also be included in the number of paid registrations submitted by postmasters rendering reports on card Form 3848 at the close of the fiscal year, in accordance with the instructions in section 1379 of the Postal Laws and Regulations. (Postal Bulletin No. 18430, April 29, 1942.)

WAR SAVINGS BONDS AND STAMPS

Distribution of Our America

A notice appeared in the Postal Bulletin of March 25 concerning distribution of the second edition of "Our America." It was intended to furnish a sufficient quantity to provide one copy for each home. The postmaster at any first- or second-class office not receiving sufficient copies to make distribution on this approximate basis should promptly advise the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Postal Savings, of the additional quantity needed.

Likewise, any postmaster who received an excess supply of "Our America," and has a surplus on hand, should advise the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Postal Savings, and await instructions for disposition of the surplus. (Postal Bulletin No. 18422, April 10, 1942.)

WAR SAVINGS STAMPS

Receipt Must Be Furnished Newspaper Publishers for Purchases

Postmasters, in many instances, are not complying with the instructions in the Postal Bulletin of December 24, 1941, directing that a receipt on Form 1096 be given newspaper publishers for savings stamps purchased. Such receipt showing the value of each purchase must be given. If Form 1096 is not available, a supply should be obtained from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Building Operations and Supplies, Equipment and Supplies Branch. In the interim, improvised receipts should be used. (Postal Bulletin No. 18425, April 17, 1942.) 1942.)

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

C. O. D. MONEY ORDERS DRAWN ON WRONG OFFICES

An extensive user of the C. O. D. Service whose shipments have affixed thereto specially printed C. O. D. tags bearing its name and address at Chicago, Ill., has brought to attention the unnecessary annoyance and expense occasioned by the erroneous drawing of C. O. D. money orders on post offices where its branches are located. Postmasters are requested to caution employees issuing C. O. D. money orders that care must be exercised to draw such orders in strict conformity with the senders' directions on the C. O. D. tags. (Postal Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

REPORTS OF REGISTERED MAILINGS OF CERTIFICATES OF IDENTIFICATION FOR ALIENS OF ENEMY NATIONALITIES

The attention of all postmasters concerned is directed to paragraph 28, reading as follows in the instructions which were issued in connection with certificates of identification for aliens of enemy nationalities appearing in the Postal Bulletin

of January 23, 1942:

"All postmasters will report to the Third Assistant, Division of Registered Mails, Washington, D. C., promptly after the close of the application period, the number of registered articles (Form AR-AE-23) mailed by them. These registrations (including the fees for restricted delivery) should also be included in the statistical report of the number of paid registered articles submitted by post-masters at the close of the fiscal year."

Any postmaster who has failed to render a report in accordance with the instructions in paragraph 28 quoted above will please transmit such report to the Third Assistant Postmaster General (Division of Registered Mails) at the earliest

practicable date. (Postal Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

DIVISION OF STAMPS

DISCONTINUANCE OF PHILATELIC CANCELATIONS AT ARMY POST OFFICES

Since the establishment of the first Army post offices, it has been the policy of the clerks-in-charge to comply, so far as practicable, with requests for the can-celation of philatelic mail with the official postmark of the units, although identi-

fiable by number only.

On account of the increase in volume, the War Department advises that the handling of philatelic mail is overtaxing the facilities of overseas and other military installations, and is seriously interfering with prompt handling of mail for the armed forces. Postmasters at ports of embarkation also are receiving philatelic mail with requests for postmarks at military installations which may or may not be in existence.

In order to provide expeditious handling of regular mail to and from our armed forces, and to insure secrecy to military operations, the forwarding of philatelic mail for cancelation to Army post offices is hereby discontinued, effective immediately. Requests for the postmarking of philatelic covers will be returned to the senders without the desired treatment in the future. (Postal Bulletin No. 18422. April 10, 1942.)

SALVAGE OF UNSERVICEABLE PROPERTY AND WASTE MATERIALS

War conditions require that postmasters give more personal supervision to the accumulation, preservation, and disposition of unserviceable property and waste Carefully observe the standing instructions of the Post Office Depart-

ment on this subject (par. 4, sec. 98, P. L. & R. 1940).

The foregoing was published in column 1 of page 4, of the Postal Bulletin of January 14, 1942, "Wartime Conservation Instructions for the Postal Service." Reread this Bulletin.

Postmasters are requested to make surveys of their offices and see to it that unserviceable property is promptly disposed of in accordance with regulations. Where proposals are unobtainable the property should be disposed of without expense to the Department. (Postal Bulletin No. 18424, April 15, 1942.)

INDIAN SERVICE EXAMINATION NOTICES

Posting in Public Lobbies Authorized

Postmasters are authorized to display in available space in post-office lobbies all notices of Indian Service Examinations issued by the Office of Indian Service, United State Department of the Interior.

These notices should be displayed in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork and should be removed promptly after they have served their purpose. (Postal Bulletin No. 18427, April 22, 1942.)

FOREST FIRE PREVENTION POSTER

Display in Public Lobby Authorized

The Forest Service, Department of Agriculture, will distribute about May 1 next Forest Fire Prevention Posters entitled "Strike Down This Monster." Postmasters are authorized to display this poster in available space in the public lobby in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork. The poster should be displayed promptly upon receipt and throughout the summer or such portion of it as is found to be practicable. (Postal Bulletin No. 18421, April 8, 1942.)

POSTER-"THE ENEMY IS LISTENING"

Not for Lobby Display

It is understood that a poster entitled "The Enemy Is Listening" has been furnished postmasters by the Office of Emergency Management. This poster is not intended for display in the public lobby and should not be placed there. Where only one copy of the poster is available it should be displayed in the post-office workroom. If an additional copy is available it should be placed in the employees' swing room. (Postal Bulletin No. 18418, April 1, 1942.)
