The Following Notices Were Issued From the Office of the Postmaster General

FRANK C. WALKER, POSTMASTER GENERAL

WASHINGTON, MAY, 27, 1942.

With the Nation at war, the cost of which has reached staggering and unprecedented proportions, the over-all objective of the Treasury Department is to have at least 10 percent of the national income invested in war bonds and stamps.

This means that war-bond sales must be increased to 1 billion dollars a month or twice the present rate. This goal has been fixed for July and is to be attained on a graduated scale. The May quota has been fixed at \$600,000,000 and the quota for June has been set at \$800,000,000.

In his message to the Congress on April 27, the President recalled the urgings from many quarters for the Government to adopt a plan of compulsory savings. Under a compulsory plan a certain percentage of every person's income would be withheld at the source for payment at some time in the future. But the President made it emphatically clear that he prefers "to keep the voluntary plan in effect as long as possible" and he further expressed the hope that there will be such a response under the voluntary plan in effect that we can continue it indefinitely as a major method of financing the war effort.

The response of the Postal personnel in the war bond and stamp campaign thus far has been wholehearted, but we must now double our efforts as to achieve the objective stated by the Treasury Department the Postal Service must double its purchases.

The armed forces have already set a splendid example for the Nation by their response to the accelerated war bond program. In addition to the sacrifices these fighting men are making as active participants in the war, they are buying bonds and stamps on such a scale as to set outstanding standards for those on the home front. Several days ago I had occasion to read a letter from an Army officer who said in part: "If the people back home think they are working and buying bonds, they should see these boys over here. Already there are five companies in my regiment in which 100 percent of the men buy bonds every pay day."

It is my hope that the increased purchases of war bonds made necessary by the tremendous and increasing cost of the war, a war which is so vital to every one of us, will be met by the Postal Service generally, which means that on a voluntary basis we must attain the 10-percent-of-income goal which has been fixed by the Treasury Department.

We should all buy these securities of our country to the fullest possible extent. The minimum of purchases should be on the basis of at least 10 percent of income when possible. Many are so situated that they can buy a considerably greater percentage, and they should do so.

To this end, I ask your whole-hearted cooperation and response.

*To Postmasters, Officers, and Postal Personnel:***VIGILANCE OUR WATCHWORD**

The Secretary of War on May 28, 1942, stated that the War Department considered enemy air raids on the United States to be "almost inevitable," and cautioned that:

**"We Must Set Our House in Order"**

The Post Office Department is confident that at both Washington and in the field every part of its household is in order; prepared for any eventuality; and that every postmaster, every officer, and every member of the personnel is on the alert to see that the part of the Government and its operations entrusted to our care is prepared for the assault which the Secretary of War warns us is "inevitable."

I now call upon every man and woman in the Postal Establishment through the exercise of the utmost caution to justify the confidence that the Post Office Department has in them. The carefully developed plans for Post Office preparedness should be reviewed by you daily in order that you may see to it personally that full compliance is being had with the Orders and Instructions published in the *POSTAL BULLETINS* and Monthly Supplement, especially those of December 18 and 20, 1941, entitled:


**"Wartime Postal Instructions—Duties, Obligations, and Responsibilities of Every Postal Employee"**

My personal investigations and the reports which I have been receiving periodically concerning your individual offices and units, both from yourselves and from post office inspectors, have been most gratifying. But it is still "ETERNAL VIGILANCE" that is the price of our safety and the watchword for the success of the Post-Office Department in the "inevitable" emergency which confronts us.

The communications system of the United States is in a great part made up of the Postal Establishment, which is a very nerve center of our wartime business and personal activities. Remember that the communications system is the first thing that our enemies endeavor to destroy in each country they invade so that they may bring consternation to and divide the people.

Do not be lulled into inaction by depending wholly upon our Army, our Navy, or Defense Councils to protect us, but rather let us relieve such organizations from assisting us and "by keeping our own house in order" assist them in their responsibilities.

I, as Postmaster General, ask you, each and every one, to review carefully your own responsibilities and the plans you have made to meet emergencies. Be alive to your duties, discuss your common problems with each other, with post-office inspectors, and with the officers of the coordinate branches of the Post Office Department. Be united. Let each and every one be energetic, active, alert, so that the plans which we have initiated and developed during the past 6 months will not bog down when the emergency comes. I have the fullest confidence you will not fail your Government, your Department, or the people of the United States.

## NEW RATING SYSTEM

WASHINGTON, MAY 29, 1942.

As a means of providing a more fair and equitable rating system for post offices, I have directed that a new rating system be placed in effect immediately. In recent months there has been made, under my direction, a comprehensive study of the present rating method and, as a result of this survey, the new rating system is being placed in operation for the purpose of eliminating misunderstandings as to the purpose of post-office inspections and ratings and, also, with a view to making them more simplified and effective.


The forms heretofore used by post-office inspectors examining a post office have been revised and several chargeable items of noncompliance have been eliminated where their existence does not affect the financial integrity of a post office or the service rendered to the public.

Under the new rating system, items on the inspection form have been rearranged in order that those of related significance be grouped together. The double-penalty provision now in effect, because of failure to correct noncompliances noted at a previous examination, has been eliminated in the new system, although these will continue to be marked as an indication that they existed at a prior examination.

The new rating system for post offices will not, as in the past, be a percentage rating in any sense. It will be a total of the assessments charged against each irregular practice existing in the office. The manner in which an office is being conducted short of perfection, as disclosed by the examination and audit under the new rating system, will be reflected in the total of the assessments noted on the examination form. This total may then be used in comparing a post office with other post offices with respect to conduct and efficiency.

The new rating system for post offices, it is believed, is absolutely fair. Care will be exercised by post-office inspectors making the inspections not to make deductions for errors as distinguished from chargeable noncompliances. Non-chargeable errors, however, will be listed for the information of the respective postmasters, as it is the opinion of the Department that these often lead to serious deficiencies. Postmasters should not take the noting of these errors as a desire to stress trivial mistakes or oversights when the applicable instructions are being substantially observed. The examination, audit, and rating of post offices are duties charged by the Postmaster General to the Inspection Service and must, of necessity, be carried out with exactness and care.

The active and wholehearted cooperation of each postmaster and supervisor must be had in the effort to improve the service to the public and to operate our post offices in a manner which the Post Office Department, through long experience, has found to be the most advantageous from the standpoint of the public as well as the Government.

LIMITS IN WEIGHT AND DIMENSIONS OF MAIL FOR DELIVERY OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES

Shipments of Packages of Second-Class Matter (General Permit B)

1. The following is a general exception, effective immediately, to Order No. 17471 of April 20, 1942.

2. Shipments of newspapers and other periodical publications entered as second-class matter presented for mailing, either by the publisher or by a distributor and intended for delivery outside the continental United States within the meaning of Order No. 17471, shall be accepted for mailing provided—

(a) The shipment is addressed to a customer to whom shipments were mailed prior to April 20, 1942, and

(b) The shipment contains no greater number of copies than were mailed to the customer prior to April 20, 1942, and

(c) A certification is filed by the mailer with the first shipment mailed under this authorization that said shipment complies with (a) and (b) above; that all future shipments will be in compliance therewith; and that any violations of (a) or (b) will automatically nullify the privilege of the shipper to mail under General Permit B.

3. It will not be necessary for postmasters to endorse shipments showing acceptance under General Permit B, as the acceptance itself will be considered *prima facie* evidence thereof.

4. The restriction in paragraph 2 of Order No. 17471 that not more than one parcel or package shall be accepted for mailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or for the same addressee, does not apply to parcels mailed pursuant to paragraph 2.

5. Postmasters will inform publishers and news agents that it may become necessary later to restrict further the volume of newsdealers' mailings. (Postal Bulletin No. 18437, May 15, 1942.)

CREDIT UNION ACTIVITIES

Transferred to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation

Under date of April 27, 1942, the President by Executive Order 9148 transferred from the Farm Credit Administration to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation all functions, records, and property of the Federal Credit Union, effective, May 16, 1942. (Postal Bulletin No. 18434, May 8, 1942.)

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RURAL MAIL BOXES

Because of the need for steel and other metals in the production of war equipment, it appears that it will shortly become necessary for manufacturers of rural mail boxes of approved type to greatly curtail, and possibly discontinue, the construction of such boxes. Therefore, if a patron or prospective patron of rural delivery service finds it impossible to obtain a mail box of approved type he will be permitted during the national emergency to use any suitable receptacle which will properly protect the mail from the weather. It will be necessary that the receptacle be equipped with a signal device. (Postal Bulletin No. 18439, May 20, 1942.)

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PHILIPPINE ISLANDS

Mail Service Suspended

Effective at once, and until further notice, the United States mail service to the Philippine Islands is suspended. No mail matter of any kind addressed to those islands shall be accepted or dispatched.

Any such mail on hand and any hereafter received, whether in transit or otherwise, shall be returned to the sender marked "Returned to Sender—Service Suspended." (Postal Bulletin No. 18435, May 11, 1942.)

#### SATURDAY SERVICE—OVERTIME REPORT

##### Assistant Postmasters and Supervisors

In connection with Order No. 17351 of the Postmaster General published in the POSTAL BULLETIN of April 1, 1942 (republished in the April 1942 Supplement to the Postal Guide), it is desired that any amounts paid as overtime for Saturday service of assistant postmasters be reported on the monthly reports, as a separate item.

Therefore, beginning with the reports for the period ending May 31, 1942 and thereafter, interline the title and amount paid to assistant postmasters for Saturday overtime, in the blank space above item 34 on Forms 1550-A and 1550-D. Overtime payments to all other supervisors should be included in amount paid regular clerks, in item 3. (Postal Bulletin No. 18442, May 27, 1942.)

**RETIREMENT****Verification of Service Claimed**

In accordance with the Civil Service Commission's Retirement Circular No. 105, dated May 19, 1942, when a person, who is appointed, reinstated, or transferred to a position within the Postal Service, claims any service in another Government establishment, request for the verification of the service will be made ONLY when the employee indicates that retirement deductions were made for such service.

Therefore, officials responsible for the preparation of Form 2806 for new appointees will record pertinent details for all prior service claimed in another Government establishment in the spaces provided therefor on the service history side of the card. Where the service is prior to August 1, 1920, or where no retirement deductions were taken, for service after that date, the notation "NOT VERIFIED," will be made following the entry. If deductions were taken, notation thereof and verification of the service will be made in accordance with existing instructions. Upon receipt of the verified service, the record shall be entered on Form 2806 for the period involved.

Not less than 6 months prior to the date the employee will reach the statutory retirement age, the responsible official shall submit a request for the official record of all unverified service so recorded, note being made on the request of date set for retirement. (Postal Bulletin No. 18445, June 3, 1942.)

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**RETIREMENT****Extension of Privileges**

This is to inform all concerned that Public Law 411, effective January 24, 1942, an amendment to the act of May 29, 1930, as amended, extended retirement privileges to clerks at third-class post offices and to special delivery messengers at first-class post offices.

In due time postmasters and clerks at third-class post offices and special delivery messengers at first-class post offices will be informed of the procedure to be followed; this is now being prepared in cooperation with the Comptroller General of the United States. (Postal Bulletin No. 18442, May 27, 1942.)

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**OVERTIME**

Reference is made to Postmaster General's Order No. 17531 "Compensatory Time for Saturday Service," and Order No. 17539 "Saturday Service—Supervisors," appearing in the Postal Bulletins of April 1 and May 1, respectively.

Instructions regarding estimates for auxiliary and overtime will accompany forms to be furnished shortly covering requirements for the September and December quarters, and likewise regarding expenditures to be reported at the close of the June quarter and subsequent quarters.

These instructions will provide that the amounts required for overtime quarterly shall be estimated and reported separately as follows:

1. Assistant postmasters' overtime in lieu of compensatory time up to a maximum of 8 hours on Saturdays.
2. Supervisors' overtime in lieu of compensatory time up to a maximum of 8 hours on Saturdays.
3. Regular employees' overtime in lieu of compensatory time up to a maximum of 8 hours on Saturdays.
4. Regular employees' overtime, except village carriers, for service in excess of 8 hours a day, including Saturdays.

Postmasters requesting additional allowances for overtime for the June quarter should itemize such requests in the same manner.

When overtime is requested, explain what effect it will have upon estimated auxiliary hours. (Postal Bulletin No. 18440, May 22, 1942.)

### SALARIES OF FIRST-, SECOND-, AND THIRD-CLASS POSTMASTERS

On or about May 15, 1942, a notice will be sent to each postmaster where a change in salary is to be made July 1, 1942. Postmasters not receiving such a notice will continue to claim credit for salary in accordance with the rate now in effect.

The salaries of all postmasters of first-, second-, and third-class post offices will be published in the July 1942 SUPPLEMENT TO THE POSTAL GUIDE. When the Supplement is received it should be consulted immediately by each Presidential postmaster to determine whether the correct salary is shown. If the salary shown in the Supplement does not agree with the notice received, or with the salary now in effect, the matter should be brought to the attention of this Bureau immediately. (Postal Bulletin No. 18437, May 15, 1942.) \*

### ENEMY ALIEN REGISTRATION Disposition of Doctors' Certificates

In connection with the recent registration of aliens of enemy nationalities, postmasters should forward all doctors' certificates submitted by persons unable to register to the Alien Registration Division, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice, 15th and Chestnut Streets, Philadelphia, Pa. (Postal Bulletin No. 18438, May 18, 1942.)

### ALIEN REGISTRATION Monthly Report of Expenditures

Reference is made to paragraphs 22 and 30 of the Instructions to Postmasters issued July 31, 1940, requiring postmasters to submit monthly reports of expenditures incident to the Alien Registration on Forms POS-1 and POS-2.

Postmasters are now informed that it is not necessary to continue to submit a monthly report on this form. Where expenditures are involved incident to the registration of aliens the amount should be shown on Form 1525 at first-class post offices or 1909 at second-class offices. (Postal Bulletin No. 18436, May 13, 1942.)

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### UNDELIVERABLE MATTER

#### Failure of Postmasters to Delete "Deceased" from Composite Stamps

Reference is made to the instruction following the Postmaster General's Order No. 17412 amending section 806, Postal Laws and Regulations, to provide for eliminating the endorsement "deceased" on undeliverable mail other than that containing veterans' checks. See Postal Bulletin of April 13, 1942.

It has come to the Department's attention that many postmasters have not complied with the instruction to delete the word "deceased" from composite rubber stamps used in endorsing mail with the reason for its return to the sender. It is requested that the word "deceased" be cut out of the stamps immediately.

Attention is also invited to the fact that while amended section 806 of the Postal Laws and Regulations refers only to veterans' checks whose handling is covered by instructions in section 784, Postal Laws and Regulations, postmasters should endorse other Federal and State pension mail "deceased" when applicable and when the printed instructions appearing thereon request such action. (Postal Bulletin No. 18447, June 8, 1942.)

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### WAR SAVINGS BONDS AND STAMPS

#### Quarterly Report of Expenditures (Form SR-5) Discontinued

Reference is made to this Bureau's letter of September 10, 1941, requesting postmasters to submit quarterly reports of expenditures on Form SR-5 incident to the handling of United States War Savings bonds and stamps.

Postmasters are now informed they may discontinue submitting this report immediately. No report is required for the June quarter and any records postmasters are keeping in preparing these reports may be discontinued. (Postal Bulletin No. 18445, June 3, 1942, and Postal Bulletin No. 18447, June 8, 1942.)

INTERNATIONAL MAILS

Shipments by Mail to Foreign Countries of Articles and Materials Under Control of the Board of Economic Warfare

Previous announcements appearing in the Postal Bulletins of July 24 and November 4, 1940, and on pages 11 to 13 of the August and on pages 16 and 17 of the November 1940 Supplements to the Postal Guide, under the caption "Shipments under licenses to foreign countries by parcel post of articles and materials designated in the President's Proclamation of July 2, 1940," are superseded by the following instructions:

ALL ARTICLES AND MATERIALS OF ANY CHARACTER OR DESCRIPTION WHATSOEVER are now under control of the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, except gold and narcotics which are licensed by the Treasury Department; arms, ammunition, implements of war, helium, and tin plate scrap licensed by the State Department.

Four types of licenses are issued by the Board of Economic Warfare for articles and materials for exportation abroad, namely, general licenses, individual licenses, unlimited licenses, and special licenses.

1. GENERAL LICENSES.—(a) General licenses are not issued to individual exporters, but are licenses which have been issued by the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, to cover the exportation of certain articles and materials to specific countries of destination. The list below marked "Exhibit A" shows the numbers assigned to the various countries which have received general licenses or which may receive them in the future.

(b) All forms of articles and materials may be shipped under general license to destinations numbered 1 through 81, when the value of the individual shipment is \$25 or less, except those articles listed in exhibit B below. The value of \$25 shall be construed to mean the total value of the items (including metal containers of all types, but exclusive of nonmetallic packaging) contained in any shipment which is exported under a general license. (See notice appearing in the Postal Bulletin of April 13, 1942, under the caption "SHIPMENTS IN INTERNATIONAL MAILS—Export License Necessary—Mailcerts Discontinued" regarding forms of articles and materials to destinations numbered 82 through 99.)

(c) When articles and materials are presented for mailing under general license, the sender must endorse the general license number (consisting of the letter G followed by the number assigned to the country in exhibit A) in a conspicuous place on the address side of the wrapper. Examples: "G-1" for articles destined to Canada, "G-26" for articles destined to Australia.

(d) Shipments valued in excess of \$25 may be shipped under general license to some of the countries listed in exhibit A. In view of the diversity of articles, it is not practicable to list them in this notice, but attention is directed to the current Comprehensive Export Control Schedule (obtainable by exporters from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., at 20 cents per copy) which contains a list of all outstanding general licenses. If there is a doubt on the part of the postmaster as to whether a shipment is acceptable under a general license, the shipment is to be refused acceptance until it has been definitely established by the sender that it is acceptable under general license.

2. INDIVIDUAL LICENSES.—(a) Articles and materials not covered by general licenses, unlimited licenses, or by special licenses require individual licenses from the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare. Individual licenses are issued to cover the exportation of a specific commodity as indicated in the license by one licensee to one addressee only. Application forms and information may be ob-

tained by prospective mailers of articles and materials under individual licenses from the following:

Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, Washington, D. C.  
Assistant Chief, Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, 500 Fifth Avenue, New York, N. Y.  
Collectors of Customs.  
District offices of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce.

(b) After completion, the application forms must be submitted by the prospective mailer to the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, Washington, D. C. When countersigned and impressed with the seal of the Board of Economic Warfare, the application becomes a license and is returned to the applicant.

(c) Responsibility for obtaining individual licenses to export articles and materials not covered by general, unlimited, or special licenses rests with the prospective mailers, and postmasters are not to accept any such articles or materials for mailing unless properly licensed.

(d) When a parcel accompanied by an individual license is presented for mailing, it will be the duty of the accepting postmaster to check the contents as described on the Customs Declaration (Form 2966) and on the Shipper's Export Declaration (Commerce Form 7525) against the information shown in the license. The same information concerning the nature and value of the articles and materials to be exported must appear in each of the above documents. The mailer must endorse the wrapper to show the individual license number. (Example: Individual License No. 00000.) This number appears in the upper right-hand corner on the face of the license. If the parcel appears to be in order, it is to be accepted for mailing and forwarded to the appropriate exchange office. The original license is to be taken up by the postmaster. After being completed to show the quantity, description, value, date of mailing, etc., it is to be transmitted in a penalty envelope to the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare, Washington, D. C.

3. UNLIMITED LICENSES.—(a) Certain commodities are authorized for exportation under unlimited licenses held by the—

Amtorg Trading Corporation.  
Belgian Congo Purchasing Commission.  
British Purchasing Commission.  
Netherlands Purchasing Commission.  
Universal Trading Corporation.

(b) Exporters desiring to send commodities authorized by such unlimited licenses may do so without obtaining an individual license provided:

(1) The commodity desired for exportation is covered by an unlimited license, and

(2) Request has been made to the appropriate Commission or Corporation for the privilege of making exportations under their unlimited license, and

(3) A Release Certificate issued by one of the Commissions or Corporations is presented with each shipment.

(c) Parcels presented for mailing under unlimited licenses may be accepted subject to the same general conditions as are prescribed in paragraph 2 (d) for shipments under individual licenses, the wrappers of such parcels being marked "UNLIMITED LICENSE No. 00000."

(d) The release certificate referred to above is to be taken up by the postmaster, postmarked to show the date of mailing and forwarded in a penalty envelope to the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service, Washington, D. C.

4. SPECIAL LICENSES.—(a) Special licenses are issued under the symbols S, SP, or WP to companies which have contracts which contribute directly to the war effort. These licenses involve any commodities to be shipped over a period of time for use in a single project or undertaking.

(b) The licensee must endorse each shipment with the license number. He must also file an additional copy of the shipper's export declaration, Commerce Form 7525, bearing a statement substantially as follows:

"The articles and materials described in this export declaration are shipped to \_\_\_\_\_ under special license number \_\_\_\_\_ and will be used by  
(destination) \_\_\_\_\_ (WP)  
for the development, construction, maintenance, repair  
(name of consignee) \_\_\_\_\_ and operation of the consignee's properties located at \_\_\_\_\_, and

will not be resold or otherwise disposed of except when consigned to a destination in the United States of America."

(c) Licensee should on demand be able to exhibit a photostatic copy of the original license. The additional copy of the shipper's export declaration is to be taken up by the postmaster at office of mailing, postmarked in lower left-hand corner and forwarded in penalty envelope to the Board of Economic Warfare, Washington, D. C.

5. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.—(a) The above instructions apply equally to articles and materials for transmission by parcel post, in letter packages or small packets, or in 8-ounce merchandise packages.

(b) Articles and materials which are prohibited transmission through the mails or which are specifically prohibited importation into any particular country, as indicated in Part II of the Postal Guide, shall not be accepted for mailing even though accompanied by a license from the Office of Exports, Board of Economic Warfare. Licensed articles and materials may not be accepted for mailing to countries where the mail or parcel post service is not in operation.

(c) If it is observed that any appreciable number of packages valued at \$25.00 or less are being mailed under general licenses by the same sender or are being mailed to the same addressee by different licensees, the fact should be brought immediately to the attention of the Department.

(d) In the event a parcel is received at an exchange office without bearing a license number and it is determined that the contents are admissible under a general license, it may be endorsed by the exchange office with appropriate general license number. However, should the contents not be admissible under general license the parcel is to be held and a letter sent to the postmaster at the office of mailing instructing him to communicate with the sender in order to obtain the required export license, or the parcel may be returned to the office of mailing at the expense of the sender.

(e) Particular attention is directed to the Orders of the Postmaster General appearing in the Postal Bulletin of April 20 and May 6, 1942, under the heading "Limits in Weight and Dimensions of Mail for Delivery Outside the United States." The instructions set forth therein are applicable to shipments to foreign countries of articles and materials under control of the Board of Economic Warfare.

Postmasters will cause due notice to be taken of the foregoing in order to insure compliance therewith. Any questions arising at the mailing offices regarding the acceptance of articles or materials subject to export control are to be communicated to the Office of the Second Assistant Postmaster General, Division of International Postal Service, Washington, D. C.

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**FORM 3578 REGARDING UNDELIVERABLE SECOND-CLASS PUBLICATIONS ADDRESSED TO MEN IN ARMED FORCES**

Although under the provisions of paragraph 10, section 769, Postal Laws and Regulations, second-class matter addressed to a person in the United States service is transmitted until it reaches the addressee without requirement of postage when his change of address is caused by official orders, the postmaster at the office of original address must, nevertheless, under the law embodies in section 808, Postal Laws and Regulations, furnish the publisher a notice on Form 3578, charged with 2 cents postage due, giving the necessary information for the publisher to correct his subscription list.

It appears that many postmasters do not send these notices to publishers when copies of their publications are undeliverable as addressed to men in the United States service. Postmasters are requested, therefore, to comply with this requirement, special attention being given this matter at offices and branches serving the personnel of our armed forces, particularly when the copies are undeliverable as addressed because of transfer by official order of such men from one station of duty to another. (Postal Bulletin No. 18439, May 20, 1942.)

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**MAIL—ARMED FORCES IN ICELAND**

**Domestic Rates Apply—Customs Tags Not Required**

It appears some postmasters are charging postage at the international rates and requiring customs declaration tags on mail matter addressed to the personnel of our armed forces in Iceland.

The domestic rates apply to mail matter addressed in the prescribed manner to the personnel of the armed forces of the United States stationed in Iceland, and no customs declaration tags are required in connection with parcels of merchandise sent to such forces.

All postmasters are, therefore, requested to govern themselves by the foregoing. (Postal Bulletin No. 18442, May 27, 1942.)

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**REPORTS OF CERTAIN MAILINGS OF OFFICIAL MATTER PERTAINING TO ALIEN REGISTRATION AND IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATES**

With reference to outstanding instructions regarding parcels of official matter weighing more than 4 pounds pertaining to Alien Registration or to Certificates of Identification for Aliens of Enemy Nationalities, it will no longer be necessary when such parcels are mailed under penalty envelopes or labels of the Post Office Department or Postal Service to submit to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification, monthly reports of the postage chargeable on such mailings.

However, postmasters shall continue to submit reports of the postage chargeable on parcels of such matter weighing more than 4 pounds when mailed without prepayment of postage under penalty envelopes or labels of any other Department of the Government pursuant to the instructions mentioned.

When any official matter pertaining to alien registration under the instructions referred to is sent via air mail without prepayment of postage thereon at the air-mail rate, such mailings, together with the postage chargeable thereon at the air-mail rate, shall in all cases be reported to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification. (Postal Bulletin No. 18445, June 3, 1942.)

### ADDITIONAL CHARGE ON SHORT-PAID MAIL

The additional charge of 1 cent per ounce required under the provisions of section 513, Postal Laws and Regulations, on first-class matter when it reaches the office of address and is short paid more than one rate does not apply to air mail. Only the amount of postage due at the air-mail rate should be collected thereon. However, the additional charge of 1 cent per ounce does apply to first-class matter addressed for local delivery when such matter is short paid more than 1 ounce. (Postal Bulletin No. 18444, June 1, 1942.)

### DAY-OLD CHICKS

#### Two Address Labels To Be Placed on Boxes

In addressing parcels it is ordinarily contemplated that they shall be addressed on one side only, as will be seen from the notice entitled "Addressing of Parcels on More Than One Side To Be Discouraged" which appeared in the Postal Bulletin of July 2, 1940, and on page 13 of the July 1940 Supplement to the Postal Guide.

However, as parcels of baby chicks must always be placed right side up, it will be seen that when a number of boxes are stacked and the only address is that on the top of each box, repeated rehandling is necessary in order to ascertain the addresses on the respective boxes. Therefore, to facilitate the handling of parcels of baby chicks it is desirable that an exception be made to the practice referred to above, and postmasters should endeavor to obtain the cooperation of shippers of baby chicks by using two address labels on the boxes, one to be placed on the top where the postage and postmark will appear and the other on the side (or on the narrow end when the boxes are oblong) to permit the reading of the addresses either from the side or top, both to be in the same general reading position. This will eliminate unnecessary handling and, therefore, result in the chicks arriving at their destination in better condition. (Postal Bulletin No. 18439, May 20, 1942.)

### DIVISION OF FINANCE

#### CASHING HOME OWNERS' LOAN CORPORATION BOND COUPONS

All outstanding Home Owners' Loan Corporation 2½-percent bonds, Series G, 1942-44, dated July 1, 1935, have been called for redemption on July 1, 1942, and will cease to bear interest on that date. Therefore, postmasters should not cash with official funds coupons of this Series dated subsequent to July 1, 1942 (Postal Bulletin No. 18436, May 13, 1942.)

### DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

#### INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDER BUSINESS (GREAT BRITAIN)

##### Name and Address of Payee in Full Detail

A letter has been received from the Postal Administration of Great Britain in which it is reported that considerable delay in payment and inconvenience to payees have resulted from incomplete particulars being given on the advices of international money orders.

The foreign office states that to enable it to handle the remittances expeditiously it is necessary for remitters to furnish in detail the following information:

The full name of the *payee*.

The name of the *street or road* and the *number of the house*.

The name of the *city or town*, the *district* and *postal area*.

The name of the *county or province*.

Postmasters are requested to examine the applications carefully and obtain from the remitters any of the needed information that may not appear thereon for all ordinary money-order remittances. For instructions covering orders intended for payment to members of the British or Canadian Military Forces, see page 17 of the June 1940 Supplement, page 26 of the August 1941 Supplement, and page 8 of the April 1942 Supplement to the Official Postal Guide. (Postal Bulletin No. 18444, June 1, 1942.)

**INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDER BUSINESS (MEXICO)**  
**Mexico Resumes Issue of Money Orders Payable in United States**

The Mexican Postal Administration has informed the Department that the circumstances which made it necessary in January 1940 to suspend the issue of money orders in that country for payment in the United States, with the exception of those drawn in payment of c. o. d. parcels, have now been removed and complete service was resumed on June 10, 1942.

Therefore, reissued money orders representing those purchased in Mexico on or after that date, the advices of which are on file, should be paid. (Postal Bulletin No. 18444, June 1, 1942.)

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**MONEY ORDERS DRAWN IN PAYMENT OF INCOME TAX**

The suggestion has been made that each postmaster be instructed to ascertain the address of the Collector of Internal Revenue for his district and to see that all money orders issued to pay income tax be properly drawn on the postmaster at that city. It is more important this year than ever before that such money orders shall be drawn on the post office at which they will be presented, and the cooperation of all postmasters in this matter will be greatly appreciated.

Occasionally an application will be presented by a person who is a resident of another collection district and must make his return to that district. In a case of that kind the money order should, of course, be drawn as indicated in the application. (Postal Bulletin No. 18446, June 5, 1942.)

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**WRONG OFFICE NUMBER ON MONEY-ORDER FORMS—OGEMA, MINN.**

It is reported that the office number appearing on the money-order forms supplied for the use of the post office named below is incorrect, and some of the orders are supposed to have been issued and paid. Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants, or in answering inquiries regarding payment.

Ogema, Minn. Serial numbers 78001 to 78128, inclusive. Reported as issued from April 28, 1942, to May 7, 1942. Correct office number is 28305 and not 28303. (Postal Bulletin No. 18439, May 20, 1942.)

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**DIVISION OF POSTAL SAVINGS****WAR SAVINGS BONDS****Information as to Volume of Sales**

The Treasury Department has requested that postmasters be authorized if requested by the State administrators of the War-Savings staff or their authorized representatives, to furnish a periodic report containing current information as to the sale of War Savings bonds. Postmasters are hereby authorized to comply with such request.

In order that there may be uniformity in the periods covered by reports furnished by postmasters the Department has agreed to conform to a schedule that will be observed by all other authorized issuing agents of savings bonds. The information as to the volume of bond sales shall cover the following periods, both dates to be inclusive: 1st to 8th; 9th to 15th; 16th to 23d; and the 24th to the last day of the month. When such report is requested to be made in writing it shall be made on a special post card form provided by the War Savings staff of the Treasury Department and sent to the State administrator or to the authorized agent designated by him to receive such report. Written reports should be confined strictly to the form and to the periods above outlined.

This periodic information may also be furnished in response to oral, telephoned, telegraphed, or written request to local committee chairmen of the War Savings staff, or to bona-fide news-disseminating agencies, newspapers, periodicals, and broadcasting stations or to the authorized representatives of any of these.

At first- and second-class offices, where Form 950, daily savings-bond cash book and stock summary is used, the postmaster shall compute the total sales by adding the figures entered opposite items 2 and 2a. At offices operating under special financial instructions of July 1, 1939, postmasters should use figures recorded on Form 940-A or 940-C/A, items 401 and 402. At district savings-bond offices the postmaster should use figures recorded after item 2, Form 950-T/F, of the savings-bond cash and stock summary for third- and fourth-class offices.

This authorization is effective at once. It permits the giving of definitely described information with respect to bond sales. Requests for additional information should not be complied with and if in writing should be referred to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Postal Savings. (Postal Bulletin No. 18434, May 8, 1942.)

There is quoted below an amendment to Treasury Department Circular No. 530, Fourth Revision:

#### To Owners of United States Savings Bonds, and Others Concerned:

1. Section 315.11 (a) of Department Circular No. 530, Fourth Revision, dated April 15, 1941, is hereby amended by adding thereto a subparagraph numbered 4, reading as follows:

(4) *Reissue to add co-owner.*—A savings bond registered in the name of one person alone in his own right, or to which one person is shown to be entitled in his own right, under these regulations, upon appropriate request (Form PD 1762) by such person may be reissued in whole or in part (but only in authorized denominations) in the name of the owner together with that of another individual as co-owner: *Provided, however,* That if a bond is so reissued in the names of two individuals as co-owners, the registration may not thereafter be changed so long as both co-owners are living: *And provided further,* That no such reissue will be effective which results in any one person holding bonds in excess of the limitation set forth in section 315.4 hereof, and that bonds reissued in accordance with this subparagraph will be considered for the purposes of computation of holdings as originally issued in both names. Reissues under the provisions of this subparagraph may be made only at a Federal Reserve bank or at the Treasury Department, Washington, D. C.

2. Section 315.12 (b) of Department Circular No. 530, Fourth Revision, dated April 15, 1941, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(b) *Reissue during lifetime of registered owner.*—A savings bond registered in the name of one person payable on death to a designated beneficiary may not be reissued during the lifetime of such beneficiary so as to eliminate his name. If such beneficiary should predecease the registered owner, the bond may, upon appropriate request by the registered owner, and proof of the death of the beneficiary, be reissued in the name of the registered owner, alone, or in his name payable on death to a new beneficiary. A bond registered in the beneficiary form may be reissued upon appropriate request (Form PD 1762) by the registered owner with the name of the designated beneficiary as co-owner, with the same restrictions and provisions set forth in section 315.11 (a) (4) of this circular as amended; such reissue may be made only at a Federal Reserve bank or at the Treasury Department.

## WAR SAVINGS BONDS

### Registered Mailings to Hawaii, Alaska, Puerto Rico and Canal Zone

Postmasters were advised by the Postal Bulletin of March 10, 1942, that the privilege of allowing purchasers of War Savings bonds to name an address for delivery by registered mail outside of the continental United States was suspended.

Information has now been received from the Treasury Department that the suspension no longer applies to addresses in Hawaii, Alaska, Puerto Rico, and the Canal Zone. (Postal Bulletin No. 18439, May 20, 1942.)

## WAR SAVINGS STAMPS

### Scrap Metal Checks to be Used in Payment

The Work Projects Administration has been collecting scrap metal throughout the country and is about to start mailing checks in payment. The recipients will be urged to convert them into war savings stamps. Many of the checks will be sent to rural communities and they will be presented at post offices or to rural carriers. Postmasters are authorized to accept in payment of war savings stamps Government paper from responsible persons whose endorsement the postmaster is willing to guarantee and the stamps may be delivered to the purchasers immediately.

If a satisfactorily identified or personally known patron presents to a rural carrier a properly endorsed check in payment for stamps and the carrier's supply of stamps is not enough to make the sale, he shall arrange with the purchaser for delivery of the stamps on a subsequent trip, meanwhile accepting the check and giving a receipt on Form 6387, which he will modify to show plainly that it covers war-savings stamps. A separate pad of Form 6387 should be used, as receipts covering purchases of savings bonds and savings stamps must not be issued from the pad used for money-order business. However, in many communities postmasters or rural carriers will be in a position to estimate the probable increase in war-savings stamp sales and fixed credits may be adjusted accordingly.

If a check is brought in by a rural carrier, or presented by the owner, at an office not designated as a savings-stamp office, the postmaster shall send the check to the central savings-bond depository of his district with a letter of transmittal giving the name and address of the person to whom the savings stamps are to be sent; and the postmaster at the central depository office shall send the stamps direct to the purchaser by official registered mail.

Reprints of this notice will be sent to all central savings-bond depositaries and it is requested that one copy be sent to every fourth-class tributary office having one or more rural routes. (Postal Bulletin No. 18434, May 8, 1942.)

## WAR SAVINGS BONDS AND STAMPS

### Pledge Campaign of Treasury Department

The Treasury Department is engaged on a campaign to obtain pledges from the general public for purchases of War Savings bonds and stamps. The question has been raised whether postal employees participating in the voluntary-purchase plan of the Postal Service should sign pledges in connection with the general campaign of the Treasury Department. There is no objection to this. These programs are not in conflict. Postmasters and heads of other offices of the Postal Establishment will not institute arrangements to obtain these pledges but individual employees may feel free to make such pledges even though they are participating in our voluntary-purchase plan. In such cases, pledges under the Treasury Department's general campaign simply duplicate those made under the Postal Service plan. Purchases should be reported as heretofore under our voluntary-purchase plan.

Some employees have inquired about window stickers provided by the Treasury Department to signify participation in purchases of War Savings bonds and stamps. These stickers are not being distributed through Postal Service channels. It is understood that individual employees buying War Savings securities may obtain the stickers from local War Savings committees. (Postal Bulletin No. 18440, May 22, 1942.)

**DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS****OFFICIAL FREE REGISTERED MAIL****Statistical Reports**

Registered mailings of the matter listed below mailed under penalty envelopes or labels of the Post Office Department or Postal Service are to be included as official free registrations, under separate items, in the annual report on Card Form 3848 for the fiscal year 1943. All postmasters will take the necessary steps to record such mailings made on and after July 1, 1942, so that they may be in position to furnish the information desired:

- War savings bonds.
- War savings stamps.
- Motor vehicle tax stamps.
- Documentary stamps.
- Migratory bird stamps.
- Civil Service matter mailed under sec. 1211, par. 5, P. L. & R.

Commencing July 1, 1942, postmasters will discontinue making monthly reports to central savings bond depositary post offices of registered mailings of war savings bonds. Central savings bond depositary post offices will discontinue making such reports to the Third Assistant Postmaster General (Division of Registered Mails). (Postal Bulletin No. 18445, June 3, 1942.)

**PREMATURE INQUIRIES FOR REGISTERED AND INSURED MAIL**

Care should be exercised to see that premature inquiries are not made for registered or insured mail, particularly when addressed to personnel connected with military or naval organizations. In all such cases the inquiries shall not be made until ample time has elapsed for the articles to have reached their destinations and reports of nonreceipt by the addressees to have been received by the senders. See article 53, page 187, and article 114, page 229, of the July 1941 Postal Guide. (Postal Bulletin No. 18435, May 11, 1942.)

**REGISTERED AND INSURED MAIL ADDRESSED TO NAVAL VESSELS****Inquiries and Claims To Be Addressed to Navy Mail Clerks**

The postmaster at San Francisco, Calif., has reported the receipt of a considerable number of inquiries addressed to his office involving domestic registered and insured mail addressed for delivery on board United States naval vessels, instead of the inquiries being addressed to the Navy mail clerks of the particular vessels involved "c/o Postmaster, San Francisco, Calif."

Postmasters are therefore advised that inquiries or indemnity claims intended for Navy mail clerks on board United States naval vessels should be inclosed in envelopes addressed as follows:

**NAVY MAIL CLERKS****Numbering of Registered Articles**

All Navy mail clerks will discontinue the practice of commencing the series of registration numbers anew on July 1 of each year and in lieu thereof continue the numbers consecutively until otherwise advised. In rendering any required

statistical reports of the number of registrations, care should be exercised to include only the articles registered during the period for which the report is rendered. (Postal Bulletin No. 18440, May 22, 1942.)

## DIVISION OF STAMPS

### COMMEMORATIVE POSTAGE STAMP

#### Sesquicentennial Anniversary of Statehood of Kentucky

Postmasters and employees of the Postal Service are hereby notified of the issuance of a special postage stamp in the 3-cent denomination, commemorating the sesquicentennial anniversary of the admission of Kentucky to Statehood. The stamp was first placed on sale at the Frankfort, Ky., post office, on June 1, 1942.

The new stamp is  $5\frac{1}{100}$  by  $14\frac{1}{100}$  inches in dimensions, arranged horizontally. It is printed in purple by the rotary process and issued in sheets of 50. The central design is a reproduction of the Gilbert White mural in the State Capitol at Frankfort, depicting Daniel Boone and three companions standing on a promontory and gazing across the Kentucky River to the land on the opposite shore where the city of Frankfort now lies. The design is enclosed in an arch. In the upper left corner is the inscription "United States" in two lines. In a corresponding position in the upper right corner is the inscription "Postage 3c" also in two lines. Across the bottom of the stamp is the wording, "Sesquicentennial of the Statehood of Kentucky," with the dates "1792" and "1942" appearing in the lower left and right corners, respectively. All lettering is in dark gothic.

Postmasters at direct and central-accounting post offices may submit requisition on form 3201-A, endorsed "Kentucky Statehood," for a limited supply of the new stamp. Postmasters at district-accounting post offices may obtain small quantities of the new postage stamp by requisition on the central-accounting postmasters. (Postal Bulletin No. 18436, May 13, 1942.)

### DISCONTINUANCE OF PHILATELIC CANCELLATION AT NAVAL POST OFFICES

Instructions were issued in the Postal Bulletin of April 10, discontinuing the furnishing of philatelic cancellations at Army post offices, for the military and service reasons enumerated therein.

It has now been disclosed that the same conditions apply to the handling of requests for the postmarking of philatelic covers at Naval Post Offices and, at the suggestion of the Navy Department, the forwarding of philatelic mail to such post offices for cancellation is hereby suspended until further notice, effective immediately.

Future applications of this character will be returned to the senders without the desired action. (Postal Bulletin No. 18434, May 8, 1942.)

### SALE OF MOTOR VEHICLE TAX STAMPS IN POST OFFICES

1. *Law.*—There shall be imposed upon the use of motor vehicles \* \* \* a tax, with respect to each year in which such use occurs, at the following rates: (1) Motor vehicles, \$5 \* \* \*. The payment of the tax \* \* \* shall be evidenced by such suitable stamp, sticker, or tag of such form, which shall be affixed to the motor vehicle \* \* \* in such manner, as the Commissioner (Bureau of Internal Revenue), with the approval of the Secretary (of the Treasury), may by regulations prescribe. \* \* \* The Commissioner (Bureau of Internal Revenue) shall furnish to the Postmaster General without prepayment a suitable quantity of stamps, stickers, or tags to be distributed to and kept on sale by postmasters in the United States. The Postmaster General may require each such postmaster to give additional or increased bond as postmaster for the value of the stamps, stickers, or tags furnished to him, and each such postmaster shall deposit the receipts from the sale of such stamps, stickers, or tags to the credit of and render accounts to the Postmaster General at such times and in such form as he may by regulations prescribe. The Postmaster General shall at least once

monthly transfer all collections from this source to the Treasury as internal-revenue collections. \* \* \* The tax imposed by this section shall not apply to the use of a motor vehicle \* \* \* by the United States, a State, Territory, the District of Columbia, or a political subdivision of any of the foregoing. (Act of September 20, 1941.)

#### Revised Instructions

**2. Sales in post offices.**—Motor vehicle tax stamps shall be kept on sale at post offices of the first and second classes and at such post offices of the third and fourth classes as are located in county seats only, except the July issue of \$5 stamps, representing the tax for the ensuing year, which shall be kept on sale at all post offices. Postmasters at such offices shall maintain an adequate supply thereof and have the stamps on sale at one window at least at the main office and at each branch and classified station.

Since the law provides for the collection of the motor vehicle tax on the basis of the fiscal year, a separate denomination stamp will be issued and sold each month to cover the tax until the end of the year (June 30) as follows: \$5 for July; \$4.59 for August; \$4.17 for September; \$3.75 for October; \$3.34 for November; \$2.92 for December; \$2.50 for January; \$2.09 for February; \$1.67 for March; \$1.25 for April; \$0.84 for May; and \$0.42 for June.

The amount of these stamp sales at a post office shall not be considered as forming any part of the "Gross Postal Receipts" under section 424, Postal Laws and Regulations.

To avoid congestion, the July issue (\$5) of motor vehicle tax stamps will be placed on sale in post offices on June 10. The stamps for subsequent months will be placed on sale in post offices authorized to sell such stamps on the first day of the respective month. All unsold stamps remaining on hand at the close of business on the last day of each month will be withdrawn from sale and disposed of as directed in paragraph 5 (a), (b), and (c). Applicants for motor vehicle tax stamps of a prior month's issue, no longer on sale in post offices, should be directed to obtain the same from the nearest collector of internal revenue.

**3. Method of distribution.**—Motor vehicle tax stamps will be issued by the Department to all central-accounting post offices for local sales purposes and for distribution on a fixed-credit basis to all post offices authorized to sell such stamps, which offices will be known as district-accounting offices, located within the territory of the central-accounting office. Central-accounting post offices will submit advance requisition to the Department on Form 3337 for required quantities of each month's issue of motor vehicle tax stamps. These requisitions must not be delayed as it is imperative that the stamps shall be available for sale in post offices on the first day of the month, except the July issue which will be placed on sale June 10.

**4. Fixed-credits.**—(a) Central-accounting postmasters shall issue the required motor vehicle tax stamps to district post offices in their territories without pre-payment, to be charged on fixed-credit receipt, Form 3367, suitably altered to denote motor vehicle tax stamps, the amount of which, with respect to the July issue (\$5) shall be based on the number of stamps sold of the February issue.

Not later than the 20th of July and each succeeding month of the fiscal year, postmasters at first- and second-class post offices, and at third-and fourth-class post offices located at county seats, will submit requisition to the central-accounting postmaster on Form 017-FC, suitably altered to denote motor vehicle tax stamps, for the required quantity of the next month's issue of these stamps, to be in even multiples of 10 in each instance. Central-accounting postmasters may increase or decrease fixed-credits in motor vehicle tax stamps as may be required to conform to the local demands at district-accounting post offices.

(b) Postmasters shall issue to superintendents of branches and classified stations and stamp clerks a sufficient supply of motor vehicle tax stamps to meet the local public demand, on fixed-credit receipt, Form 3367-B, suitably altered.

(c) Under no circumstances shall motor vehicle tax stamps be included in fixed-credits of postage stamps, documentary, internal revenue, or migratory-bird hunting stamps.

**5. Settlement of fixed-credits.**—(a) All outstanding fixed-credits in motor vehicle tax stamps in the possession of stamp clerks and superintendents of post office branches and classified stations shall be accounted for by the return of unsold stamp and cash to the postmaster, to balance the account, at the close of business on the last day of each month.

(b) District-accounting postmasters shall return all unsold stamps and cash to balance their fixed-credits in motor vehicle tax stamps for the preceding month, in time to reach the central-accounting postmaster not later than the third of the following month.

(c) Central-accounting postmasters will render a final account to the Department of the motor vehicle tax stamps of each monthly issue not later than the 10th of the following month, except where territorial post offices are involved, by returning all unsold stamps by official registered mail to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, accompanied with letter of transmittal on Form 3206. The value of the unsold stamps returned, added to the deposits, must equal the total accountability of the office for the respective month. In cases where money for a succeeding month is deposited for the current month's issue, causing an "overdeposit" of funds for a particular stamp, such transaction should be shown in Item 19 of the current account and in Item 25 of the succeeding month's account.

(d) Stamps found in the possession of postmasters or retail clerks after the fixed-credit has been surrendered will not be considered unless received in the Department within thirty days after the close of the month in which the particular stamp was on sale. After the expiration of thirty days, such claims shall be submitted to the Collector of Internal Revenue of the local district on Internal Revenue Form 843.

6. *Remittance of cash.*—(a) All funds received from the sale of motor vehicle tax stamps at district-accounting post offices shall be remitted to the central-accounting postmaster not less often than once each week at offices of the first class and not less often than twice monthly at post offices of the second and third classes. Postmasters at fourth-class post offices will remit the accumulated funds from the sale of these stamps at the close of each month accompanied by the unsold stamps to balance the fixed-credit. Postmasters at fourth-class post offices will, however, make remittance at any time during the month when the accumulated funds from the sale of motor vehicle tax stamps amount to \$50. All remittances of cash within the month will be credited to the fixed-credit account of the district postmaster at the central-accounting office unless additional stamps are required, in which case the remittance will be accompanied with a requisition for the desired stamps on Form 017-FC.

(b) Central-accounting postmasters will deposit the funds received from the sale of motor vehicle tax stamps at district post offices, together with the funds received from the sale of these stamps to local patrons, not less often than twice monthly, in the local Federal Reserve bank or branch or General Public Money Depository Bank, as "P. O. Dept. Motor Vehicle Tax Stamp Collections," to the credit of the Postmaster General. The postmaster will prepare and the bank will sign receipts on Treasury Department Form 1 (revised), Division of Bookkeeping and Warrants, in triplicate, on each copy of which shall be plainly stamped or written "P. O. Dept. Motor Vehicle Tax Stamp Collections." The original certificate will be sent by the bank to the Treasurer of the United States; the duplicate and triplicate will be delivered by the bank to the depositing postmaster who will forward the duplicate to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, with Form 3346, at the close of each month. The triplicate will be retained by the postmaster as an office record. Additional receipt forms when required should be requested by letter addressed by the central-accounting postmaster to the Treasury Department, Division of Bookkeeping and Warrants, Washington, D. C.

7. *Accounts.*—Every central-accounting postmaster and the postmaster at Washington, D. C., will render a monthly account on Form No. 3346, on the order of the present internal revenue stamp account, to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, on or before the 10th day of each calendar month, covering all motor vehicle tax stamp transactions of the preceding month. The account shall be sent by ordinary mail in a "penalty" envelope, plainly marked "Motor Vehicle Tax Stamp Account" accompanied with receipts covering deposits made for the total sales reported during the month, and the duplicate invoice, Form 3337, signed and dated to show date stamps ordered were received. Each account rendered must cover a particular stamp. Different denomination stamps must not be included in the same account.

8. *Supplemental Accounts.*—Every central-accounting postmaster and the postmaster at Washington, D. C., must submit a supplemental account or accounts for each denomination stamp charged, pending adjustment of outstanding claims and the receipt of credit notice for unsold stamps returned to the Department for redemption.

9. *Washington, D. C.*—The Postmaster, Washington, D. C., will be supplied with motor vehicle tax stamps by the Department. He shall establish fixed credits of the stamps at the main office and at classified stations. He shall submit to the Department a monthly stamp account on Form No. 3346. He shall deposit all funds received from the sale of motor vehicle tax stamps twice monthly in the United States Treasury, to the credit of the Postmaster General. In making such deposits, he will use Treasury Department (Division of Bookkeeping and Warrants), Form 1 (revised), in triplicate, plainly marked "P. O. Dept. Motor Vehicle Tax Stamp Collections." The duplicate copy shall accompany the monthly stamp account to the Department. The Postmaster, Washington, D. C., will close out each monthly account in motor vehicle tax stamps by the return of all unsold stamps as specified in paragraph 5 (c).

10. *Redemption or exchange from public prohibited.*—Postmasters shall not redeem, repurchase, or exchange any motor vehicle tax stamps from any person, firm, company, or corporation. Persons desiring to redeem, sell, or exchange motor vehicle tax stamps held by them, shall be advised to make application for relief to the nearest Collector of Internal Revenue.

11. *Change in postmaster.*—Upon the death, resignation, removal, or suspension of a postmaster, or whenever a new bond is required, the provisions of sections 272 and 417, Postal Laws and Regulations, are applicable to postmasters who render to the Department monthly motor vehicle tax stamp accounts and to all other postmasters who are accountable for the stamps on a fixed-credit basis. Divided accounts must be submitted by the postmaster who renders accounts to the Department for the parts of the month served by each postmaster or acting postmaster or for the parts of the month covered by different bonds, accompanied with Form 3235 duly executed by the outgoing and incoming postmaster.

12. *Damaged, spoiled, or unsalable stamps.*—(a) Damaged, spoiled or unsalable motor vehicle tax stamps in the stock at any post office except Washington, D. C., and the various central-accounting post offices (not purchased, exchanged, or redeemed from any individual, firm, company, or corporation) shall be sent to the respective central-accounting office from which the stamps were originally obtained in exchange for new stamps.

(b) Damaged, spoiled or unsalable motor vehicle tax stamps in the stock of the central-accounting office (or the Washington, D. C., office), as well as such stamps received from other offices furnished on fixed-credits by the central-accounting office, shall be included with the unsold stamps returned to the Department for credit at the close of the month in settlement of the monthly account.

13. *Unavoidable losses.*—When the postmaster, at an office furnished motor vehicle tax stamps on fixed-credit by the central-accounting office, suffers a loss of stamp stock or funds by fire, burglary, or other unavoidable casualty, he shall file a claim with the Solicitor, Post Office Department, for credit on account of such loss, and shall immediately notify the central-accounting postmaster the amount of the loss. The central-accounting postmaster shall then prepare an emergency claim pending receipt in triplicate on Form 3367-A for the amount of the loss and send the original and duplicate with the amount of stamps reported lost to the postmaster who suffered the loss. The receipt shall be signed in duplicate by the postmaster and the original returned to the central-accounting postmaster. The triplicate signed by the central-accounting postmaster, but not by the receiving postmaster, shall be sent to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, Washington, D. C.

14. The central-accounting postmaster shall carry the amount of the loss in Items 13 and 14 on Form 3346 as stock charged to other postmasters until notified by the Department that the claim has been settled. If the claim is allowed, the amount shall be subtracted from items 13 and 14 and entered in items 16 and 23. If disallowed, the amount shall be collected in cash from the postmaster involved and treated as cash sales.

Items 17 and 22 on Form 3346 should be used only when the loss is at a central-accounting office and then only when there is a change in postmaster. Losses at the central-accounting office, for which claims have been filed with the Solicitor, if still pending, shall be reported in item 22 of the final account of the outgoing postmaster and shall not be taken up by the incoming postmaster.

15. All Postal Laws and Regulations relating to the safety of public funds and postage stamps, not inconsistent with any specific provision of these instructions apply to, and are binding upon, all postmasters and employees of the Postal Service in handling, safeguarding, and accounting for adhesive motor vehicle tax stamps and funds.

16. All shipments of motor vehicle tax stamps between post offices shall be made by official registered mail and the number of stamps therein shall be witnessed by two employees at the sending and receiving post offices.

17. Postmasters and postal employees are accountable under their official bonds for all motor vehicle tax stamps and funds in their custody.

18. *Advice to the public.*—Postmasters and postal employees shall not, in their official capacity, attempt to instruct local patrons with regard to the application of this law other than to advise that the tax is collectible on all motor vehicles, including passenger cars, trucks, and motorcycles that are in use on the highways.

19. *Loss of stamps.*—Postmasters are not authorized to make any adjustment with patrons in connection with motor vehicle tax stamps reported lost or stolen. Such claimants should be advised to report the matter to the Collector of Internal Revenue in the form of an affidavit setting forth the date or approximate date on which stamp was purchased, office at which purchased, make, model and State license number of the vehicle and a brief statement of the facts and circumstances surrounding the loss or theft.

20. *Serial numbers.*—Future issues of motor vehicle tax stamps will bear serial numbers. Such serial numbers will not, however, have any significance to the Postal Service and should be disregarded by postmasters in making sales to the public. Postmasters will keep no record thereof in the accounting and sale of the stamps.

21. *Correspondence.*—All correspondence from postmasters in relation to the issuance, sale, and accounting of motor vehicle tax stamps should be directed to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, Washington, D. C. (Postal Bulletin No. 18443, May 29, 1942.)

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## MOTOR VEHICLE TAX STAMPS

### **Discontinuance of Report Cards, Form M. V. 1.**

By order of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, effective immediately purchasers of Motor Vehicle Tax stamps are no longer required to make report thereof on card form, M. V. 1, to the Collector of Internal Revenue of the local district.

Postmasters will not, therefore, make further distribution of report cards (M. V. 1) to patrons in connection with the sale of Motor Vehicle Tax Stamps.

Remaining stocks of these report cards on hand in post offices will be disposed of as waste. (Postal Bulletin No. 18437, May 15, 1942.)

### **Truck Display of Poster—“Keep It Up”**

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## DISPLAY OF MATTER IN PUBLIC LOBBIES

### **Posters Not Approved by Department Should Not Be Displayed**

Attention is invited to notice in POSTAL BULLETIN of March 16, 1942, instructing Postmasters not to display in Post Office lobbies any posters or notices not specifically approved by the Department.

It has come to our attention that posters are being distributed to Postmasters by Government agencies even though their display has not been approved by this Department.

Postmasters are therefore again cautioned not to permit the display in lobbies of any poster or notice unless specific authority has been received from the Department covering that particular item, except those mentioned in the Postal Bulletin of March 16, 1942. (Postal Bulletin No. 18437, May 15, 1942.)

#### "FIGHT FOR FREEDOM" POSTER

##### Display in Lobbies Authorized

The Office of Facts and Figures of the Executive Office of the President will distribute about June 1 next a poster entitled "The United Nations Fight For Freedom."

Postmasters are authorized to display this poster in available space in the public lobby for a reasonable period, in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork. (Postal Bulletin No. 18440, May 22, 1942.)

#### DISPLAY OF PROCLAMATION OF COMMANDING GENERAL EASTERN DEFENSE COMMAND

*To All Postmasters in Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, and the District of Columbia:*

You will receive within the next few days copy of a proclamation issued by Lt. Gen. Hugh A. Drum, Commanding General of the Eastern Defense Command and First Army. This proclamation shall be displayed in a prominent location in the public lobby in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork. (Postal Bulletin No. 18439, May 20, 1942.)

#### NAVY DEPARTMENT POSTER ("FLY WITH THE NAVY")

##### Display on Trucks and in Public Lobbies Authorized

The Navy Department is preparing to distribute to offices of the first and second class a poster entitled "High School Grads 18 to 26—Fly With the Navy." Posters for both trucks and lobby display are being furnished.

Postmasters are authorized to display these posters on Post Office trucks and in the public lobby for a period of 15 days from May 15, 1942, or date of receipt. The lobby posters should be displayed in such manner as not to deface the walls or woodwork. At the end of this period the poster "Keep It Up" should be returned and displayed on the trucks. (Postal Bulletin No. 18436, May 13, 1942.)

This list, taken in connection with the post offices designated as postal-savings depositories in the State List in Part I of the Postal Guide for 1941, shows the offices, branches, and stations at which postal-savings business may be transacted. Former monthly lists should be disregarded. The radical sign (✓) before the name of an office indicates information not previously furnished.
