## CHRISTMAS MAILS—A CHALLENGE

The Christmas season for domestic mails begins December 1. The exigencies of war are bringing many and varied problems. These will tax to the utmost the ingenuity, the resourcefulness, and the ability of every postmaster, every postal official, and every member of the Postal Establishment if we are to maintain the enviable record of the past. The difficulties we face constitute a challenge to our energy and skill.

The demands upon the Postal Service are greater today than ever before. We are confronted with the gigantic task of handling the mails, both personal and official, for the members of our armed forces, and for business enterprises engaged in the production of war matériel—ships, tanks, planes, and guns. This task cannot and must not be neglected. Current trends indicate, furthermore, that Christmas mailings will be the heaviest in many years.

Thousands of our experienced employees are in the military or naval forces, more will be called, and replacements, when they can be secured, must be trained. There is already an acute shortage of personnel in many post offices. Trucks and other essential equipment are difficult, if not impossible, to obtain. Train service is irregular and railroad storage cars, in which the parcel-post mail is usually transported, are now largely diverted to war needs. These conditions will be aggravated by added traffic during the Christmas season.

In the past it has been necessary to recruit more than 200,000 additional persons, and to obtain some 12,000 additional motor vehicles to handle the Christmas mails. To meet successfully the difficult task we are about to undertake demands intelligent planning and efficient organization. Postmasters, supervisors, and all others must study carefully, understand thoroughly, and comply fully with the instructions of the Department heretofore issued.

It is most important that, commencing at once, postal patrons be urged repeatedly to mail gifts and cards at least from 20 to 25 days before Christmas, depending upon distance. Postmasters, supervisors, and employees have rendered excellent service in previous years in giving publicity to the need for cooperation by and with the public. This year our efforts must be extended. It is vitally necessary that every available avenue of publicity be used, to the end that patrons will be reminded constantly to SHOP EARLY, WRAP SECURELY, ADDRESS MAIL COMPLETELY, and MAIL EARLY. Postmasters must seek through a well-organized publicity campaign the assistance

of newspapers, radio stations, chambers of commerce, schools, theaters, and motion pictures.

There must be careful preparation, thoughtful study, constant attention to supervision and to details, and an unusual exercise of ingenuity and initiative by all officials and personnel of the Postal Service. These things must be done and the full cooperation of the public must be obtained if the mails are to be handled and delivered on time. Notwithstanding the problems and obstacles confronting us, I am confident the time-honored tradition of the Postal Service, THE MAIIS MUST GO THROUGH, will prevail. I bespeak your wholehearted cooperation.

#### TRAVEL EXPENSES FOR WITNESSES IN UNITED STATES COURTS

##### ORDER No. 18846—EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 6, 1942.

The Department of Justice has instructed all United States attorneys and marshals that employees of the United States who perform travel in order to appear as witnesses on behalf of the United States in any case involving the activity in connection with which such persons are employed will no longer be paid by that Department for travel expenses in connection therewith.

Accordingly, whenever an employee of the Post Office Department or of the Postal Service not holding a travel commission issued by the Postmaster General complies with a subpoena requiring travel to appear as a witness on behalf of the United States in any case involving the activity in connection with which such person is employed he should transmit to the bureau of the Department having jurisdiction over the service in which he is employed Standard Form No. 1012 (VOUCHER FOR PER DIEM AND/OR REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES INCIDENT TO OFFICIAL TRAVEL), which should be accompanied by subpoena and court attendance certificate, for his travel expenses and subsistence in connection therewith.

Upon receipt of the completed official travel voucher in proper form the bureau of the Department having jurisdiction over the service to which the employee is assigned will cause to be issued an official travel order authorizing the travel expenses and per diem at the rate of \$6 per day for subsistence. #### LIMITS IN WEIGHT AND DIMENSIONS OF MAIL FOR DELIVERY OUTSIDE THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES

##### Shipments for Nicaragua (General Permit G)

##### ORDER No. 18884; EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 8, 1942.

1. Inasmuch as arrangements have been made for the forwarding of mail matter (including parcel post) overland via Mexico to Nicaragua, the application to parcels and packages addressed for delivery in Nicaragua, of the restrictions imposed by Order No. 17471 of April 20, 1942, is no longer required. Therefore, the following general exception is effective at once:

2. Until further notice, mail shipments addressed for delivery in Nicaragua are not subject to the restrictions of Order No. 17471 of April 20, 1942.

3. It will not be necessary for postmasters to endorse shipments showing acceptance under General Permit G, as the acceptance itself will be considered *prima facie* evidence thereof. (Postal Bulletin No. 18500, October 9, 1942.)

#### INTERNATIONAL MAIIS

##### Restriction of Printed Matter for Dispatch to Neutral European Countries

##### ORDER No. 18935; EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 15, 1942.

The new regulation (Order No. 18599, published in the Postal Bulletin of September 2, 1942), governing the mailing of printed material to neutral European countries, has been revised to permit banks and brokerage houses which act as

trustees and agents to mail certain types of printed financial information to clients in those countries. Therefore, Order No. 18599 is amended to read as follows:

1. With the view of controlling the exportation to neutral countries in Europe of matter that may be released by publishers for purely domestic distribution; of alleviating the possibility of transmission by individuals of harmful messages through such medium, and of relieving as much as possible the transportation problem of handling international mails under present conditions, the following restrictions shall become effective immediately:

2. Printed matter originating in the United States or Canada, addressed to European neutral countries, will not be permitted to go forward to destination unless mailed by—

- (a) The publishers or registered news agents;
- (b) Firms or organizations for which the material is published;
- (c) The publisher's distributing agency;
- (d) Banks and brokerage houses which act as trustees (see paragraph 5).

3. Individuals and concerns not within the above groups will be permitted, under certain conditions, to export printed matter under license to be issued by the Office of Censorship or the Board of Economic Warfare. Printed matter, the exportation of which is licensed, will bear notation, including the license number, on the outer wrapper. Printed matter not bearing appropriate license indicia on the outer wrapper from individuals and concerns not classified within groups (a), (b), (c), and (d), when mailed in the United States, United States possessions, and the Canal Zone, will be appropriately endorsed by the Censorship authorities and returned to the sender. Such printed matter, when mailed by individuals and concerns in Canada, will be forwarded under cover to the Chief Postal Censor, Ottawa, Canada, by the Censorship Station.

4. Except as stated in the next paragraph, printed matter as referred to herein will include books, magazines, pamphlets, booklets, circulars, catalogs, news letters, newspapers, and advertising material, whether printed, mimeographed, or otherwise mechanically duplicated, and clippings therefrom. It does not include securities, bills of lading, invoices, statements of accounts, or other business forms of a similar nature used in commerce and exchange. It does not include A. P. O. mail and mail of Government agencies.

5. Banks and brokerage houses which act as trustees and agents may mail to their clients in neutral European countries such printed material as annual or periodic reports to stockholders, annual meeting notices, proxies (forms to be signed), notices of reorganizations, receiverships, mergers, stock split-ups, and conversion privileges on bonds and preferred stocks. They will not be allowed to forward newspaper clippings, financial news letters printed by other firms, or any material not related directly to the business between the financial institution and the client.

6. Post offices will please advise interested patrons as far as practicable of these restrictions and decline to accept the prohibited printed matter for mailing. Should such unacceptable articles of printed matter be received in the mails, the post office of mailing should return them to the senders appropriately marked. Any of such prohibited articles as may reach the exchange office shall be submitted to the Censorship Station and after examination shall be returned to the senders. (Postal Bulletin No. 18503, October 16, 1942.)

#### REQUESTS FOR OCCUPATIONAL DEFERMENT FROM SELECTIVE SERVICE

ORDER No. 19025; EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 23, 1942.

1. Pursuant to Directive No. XI of the War Manpower Commission, no requests for occupational deferment from military service may be made by any person connected with the Postal Establishment except as follows:

2. **Departmental Service.**—Requests shall not be made except by the heads of the various bureaus and offices of the Department and will be considered by them only in the case of supervisors who have passed their thirty-sixth birthday.

3. **Post Office Inspection Service.**—Requests shall not be made except by the Chief Inspector and will be considered by him only in the case of (a) post-office inspectors; and (b) chief clerks, assistant chief clerks, and clerks in charge of sections, who have passed their thirty-sixth birthday.

4. **Railway Mail Service.**—Requests shall not be made except by division superintendents of the Railway Mail Service. Requests will be considered only in the case of (a) supervisors from the rank of clerk in charge to the rank of division superintendent, inclusive; and (b) experienced mail distributors. In each of these

groups consideration will be given only when the individual has passed his thirty-sixth birthday.

5. **Post Office, Custodial, and Motor Vehicle Services.**—Requests shall not be made except by postmasters and will be considered only in the case of occupants of the following classes of positions: (a) supervisors from the rank of foreman to the rank of assistant postmaster, inclusive; and (b) experienced mail distributors. In each of these groups, consideration will be given only when the individual has passed his thirty-sixth birthday.

6. The term "experienced mail distributor" is defined, for both the Railway Mail Service and the Post Office Service, as a person who has pursued the study of schemes and schedules to the point where he has passed a case examination and is actually entrusted with the distribution of mail.

7. Request for deferment shall not be made in the case of every occupant of a position listed. The officer making the request will be obliged to certify to the local draft board that the employee to be deferred possesses special skills or abilities absolutely essential to the performance of his duties; that these skills or abilities have been acquired as a result of a considerable period of training or experience; and that the person to be deferred is employed in a position included in the Department's list of key positions as currently revised pursuant to War Manpower Commission Directive No. XI.

8. No request for an additional occupational deferment beyond the initial period of 6 months shall be made unless the officer making the request can again certify as required by paragraph 7 of this Order and in addition can certify that (a) the Department and the Civil Service Commission have agreed that any effort to recruit a replacement would be in conflict with the policies and directives of the Chairman of the War Manpower Commission, or (b) that vigorous efforts have been made, subject to the policies and directives of the Chairman of the War Manpower Commission, by the Department and by the Civil Service Commission to secure a replacement and that such efforts have been unavailing, or (c) a replacement has been secured but a further period of training is required before the trainee will be qualified to assume the responsibilities of the position, or (d) that the Postmaster General and the Chairman of the War Manpower Commission have determined that the officer or employee is engaged in an activity which is directly concerned with the war effort or with essential supporting activities and occupies such an extraordinary and unique relationship to the conduct of that activity that his separation from the activity would seriously impair, over a substantial period of time, the effective functioning of that activity.

9. In the event that a request, permitted under this order, is denied by a local board, the officer who made the request may file an appeal in the manner prescribed by the Selective Service regulations.

10. If the Board of Appeals affirms the action of the local board in denying the request for deferment, the postmaster or division superintendent who made the request should notify the proper Assistant Postmaster General, promptly by air mail, informing him of all the facts and circumstances and enclosing copies of any written statements which have been filed with local or appellate boards. Such notification should be sent by air mail at the earliest possible moment for the reason that unless the Department submits the appeal to the Director of Selective Service within 10 days from the action of the appellate board, the employee may be inducted.

11. If pursuant to the requirements of the War Department or the Navy Department, the occupant of a key position listed in this order presents a request for a release in order to enlist or to secure a commission in any branch of the armed forces other than the Army Postal Service or the Navy Mail Service, the request shall be denied, and that fact with a statement of the reasons for such refusal shall be certified to the appropriate local draft board.

12. If the occupant of a position herein listed as a key position shall present a request for a release in order to enlist or to secure a commission in the Army Postal Service or the Navy Mail Service the postmaster, division superintendent, or, in the case of departmental personnel, the bureau head, shall forward such request to the Chief Post Office Inspector with a detailed statement of the experience, skills, and abilities of the applicant and the Chief Inspector shall determine whether the request should be granted or denied and shall advise the applicant through official channels of the decision and of any further action to be taken. (Postal Bulletin No. 18507, October 26, 1942.)

## CONTRIBUTIONS TO COMMUNITY CHEST WAR FUNDS AND OTHER RELIEF AGENCIES

ORDER No. 19026; EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 23, 1942.

*To Officers and Employees of the Postal Service:*

The time of the year is again at hand when various welfare agencies and community chest war funds throughout the country are making their annual appeal for financial aid to carry on their work for social welfare.

## PREPARATION FOR CHRISTMAS MAILING

SHOP NOW and MAIL EARLY for Early Delivery

*Post offices will make every effort to handle the Christmas mails without congestion and delay, but owing to the enormous volume this can be done only with the cooperation of the public. Compliance with the following suggestions will greatly aid the post office and insure the prompt handling of your mail*

## USE SPECIAL DELIVERY FOR URGENT MAIL

## EARLY MAILING

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During the holiday time the volume of mail increases approximately 200 percent. Post offices will make every effort to handle these Christmas mails without delay, but this will be possible only with the cooperation of the public. Therefore, to assure delivery of Christmas presents, cards, and letters by Christmas Day, the public should *shop and mail early*. Gifts, greetings, and letters should be mailed *at least 20 or 25 days before Christmas*, according to the distance to be transported. Compliance with the following suggestions will greatly aid the post office and assure the prompt handling of this mail:

Large advertisers should be requested to withhold heavy mailings of catalogs, calendars, etc., during December. Calendars should be mailed sufficiently in advance of December 1 to permit delivery before that date. This does not apply to current advertising pertaining to holiday sales.

## WRAPPING AND PACKING

Pack articles carefully in strong, durable containers. Wrap parcels securely, using strong paper and heavy twine, but do not seal them except when bearing a printed label or endorsement, reading: "Contents, merchandise—Postmaster: This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary," together with name and address of sender, as sealed parcels not so labeled or endorsed are subject to postage at the letter rate. The name and address of the sender may be handwritten or typewritten on the labels.

## SPECIAL PACKING

Umbrellas, canes, and golf sticks, should be reenforced their full length by strong strips of wood tightly wrapped and tied or otherwise sufficiently wrapped to withstand transportation. When three or more are tied together, wrapped and tied, no reenforcement is necessary.

Hats: Pack in strong wooden or solid fiberboard or double-faced fiberboard boxes. Ordinary pasteboard hat boxes must be crated. Ladies' hats and stiff hats, easily damaged, must be marked "FRAGILE."

Shoes: Pack in strong container, such as double-faced corrugated fiberboard box, or wrap in tough paper securely tied with strong twine.

Cut flowers: Wrap in tissue paper to retain moisture and then place in a strong, suitable box of wood or solid fiberboard or double-faced corrugated fiberboard.

Candies: Enclose in strong outside boxes or containers.

Drawings, paintings, unmounted maps, etc.: Pack or wrap in strong material to avoid damage. When not flat, roll around a wooden core and then wrap and tie carefully or place in strong pasteboard tube.

Sharp-pointed or sharp-edged instruments or tools must have points and edges fully guarded to prevent injury to clerks in handling or damage to other mail. Crate suitably or thoroughly wrap so that they cannot cut through the wrapping.

Books must have the edges well protected with stiff material and be packed in a wooden or strong double-faced, corrugated fiberboard box, double-lined with the same material.

#### FRAGILE ARTICLES

Articles easily broken or crushed must be securely packed and crated or boxed. Use liberal quantities of excelsior or like material in, around, and between the articles and the outside container.

Glassware, fragile toys, or crockery must be packed so as to prevent the escape of particles or pieces if broken in transit.

Cigars: Ordinary boxes of cigars wrapped in paper only will not be accepted. Pack in a manner to prevent damage by shock or jar. Wrap in corrugated pasteboard or similar material. Cigars must be in good shipping condition.

All articles easily broken or damaged must be plainly marked "FRAGILE."

#### PERISHABLE MATTER

Parcels containing perishable articles shall be marked "Perishable" and packed in suitable container, according to contents. Articles likely to spoil within the time reasonably required for transportation and delivery will not be accepted for mailing. Use special-delivery stamps to expedite delivery.

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#### ADDRESSES

Addresses should be complete, with house number and name of street, post-office box, or rural-route number, and typed or plainly written in ink. A return address should be placed in the upper left corner of every piece of mail. If a tag is used, the address and return address should also be written on the wrapper for use if tag is lost, and a copy of the address should be enclosed inside the parcel. DO NOT MAIL CHRISTMAS GREETING CARDS IN RED, GREEN, OR OTHER DARK-COLORED ENVELOPES OR IN VERY SMALL ENVELOPES.

#### POSTAGE

Prepay postage fully on all mail matter. The rates are as follows:

*First class.*—Letters and written and sealed matter, 3 cents for each ounce, except when addressed for local delivery; local letters, 2 cents an ounce at letter-carrier offices, and 1 cent an ounce at other offices unless collected or delivered by rural or star-route carriers, in which case the rate is 2 cents an ounce; Government postal cards, 1 cent each; private mailing or post cards, including greeting cards in this form, 1 cent each. GREETING CARDS ENCLOSED IN ENVELOPES SHOULD BE SENT BY FIRST-CLASS MAIL FOR BEST RESULTS.

*Second class.*—Newspapers, magazines, and other periodicals containing notice of second-class entry, 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, except when the postage at the rates prescribed for fourth-class mail is lower, in which case the latter rates apply.

*Third class (limit 8 ounces).*—Circulars and other miscellaneous printed matter, including Christmas cards sent in unsealed envelopes and bearing no unauthorized writing, also merchandise, 1½ cents for each 2 ounces; books (including catalogs) of 24 pages or more, seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions, and plants, 1 cent for each 2 ounces; bulk lots of identical pieces of third-class matter may be mailed at special rates under conditions which may be ascertained from the postmaster. For special rate on certain books see exception (d) below.

*Fourth class (over 8 ounces).*—Merchandise, books, printed matter, and all other mailable matter not in first, second, or third class.

NOTE.—A fraction of a cent in the total postage on any parcel is counted as a full cent.

## EXCEPTIONS

- (a) In the first or second zones, where distance by shortest practicable mail route is 300 miles or more, the rate is 9 cents for first pound and 2 cents each additional pound.
- (b) On parcels collected on rural routes the postage is 2 cents less per parcel than at rates in table when for local delivery and 3 cents less per parcel when for other than local delivery.
- (c) Parcels weighing less than 10 pounds but exceeding 84 inches in length and girth combined are subject to 10-pound rate.
- (d) Books consisting wholly of reading matter or reading matter with incidental blank spaces for students' notations, and containing no advertising matter, other than incidental announcements of books, may be mailed at the rate of 3 cents a pound or fraction thereof, irrespective of zone. This rate applies to parcels weighing 8 ounces or less as well as to those weighing more than 8 ounces.

*Permissible additions and enclosures.*—Parcels may be marked "Do not open until Christmas," this being permitted in order to encourage early mailing.

Written greetings, such as "Merry Christmas," "Happy New Year," "With Best Wishes," and names, numbers, or symbols, for the purpose of description, may be enclosed with third- or fourth-class (parcel-post) mail. Books may bear simple dedicatory inscriptions not of a personal nature. Other written additions subject parcels to letter postage.

Written matter in the nature of personal correspondence cannot be enclosed in parcels.

Communications attached to parcels: A letter placed in an envelope, addressed to correspond with the address on the parcel and fully prepaid at the first-class rate, may be tied or otherwise securely attached to the outside of the parcel in such manner as to prevent separation therefrom and not obscure the address on the parcel.

*Seals.*—Christmas seals or stickers should not be placed on the address side of mail.

*Stamps.*—Mailers may save time by buying postage stamps in advance.

## LIMIT OF WEIGHT AND SIZE

No parcel may be more than 100 inches in length and girth combined nor exceed 70 pounds in weight.

## REGISTER OR INSURE YOUR GIFTS

## AIR MAIL SERVICE

The domestic air-mail rate of postage is 6 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof on the mainland of the United States, and to Alaska and Canada. Consult postmaster for rates to other places. The regular air-mail envelopes are preferred for air mail; plain envelopes with the proper amount of postage may be used but must be conspicuously endorsed near the address "VIA AIR MAIL," or "SPECIAL DELIVERY—AIR MAIL," as the case may be.

Air mail to members of our armed forces outside continental United States is 6 cents per half ounce or fraction thereof.

## SPECIAL DELIVERY SERVICE

The use of a SPECIAL-DELIVERY stamp will assure delivery on Christmas Day, if mailed at the proper time. SPECIAL DELIVERY SERVICE means expeditious treatment en route and immediate delivery at office of address. It is obtained by affixing a SPECIAL-DELIVERY stamp of the proper denomination, or its equivalent in ordinary stamps, in addition to the regular postage. When ordinary stamps are used, the words "SPECIAL DELIVERY" must be written or printed on the envelope or wrapper immediately below but never on the stamps. It is urged that all mailers desiring immediate delivery of any matter mailed by them affix SPECIAL-DELIVERY stamps thereto. SPECIAL DELIVERY is for speed and not for safety.

## SPECIAL HANDLING—FOURTH-CLASS MATTER ONLY

Parcels of fourth-class matter, endorsed "Special Handling" will be given the most expeditious handling and transportation practicable (but not special delivery) upon payment, in addition to the regular postage of the following charge: Up to 2 pounds, 10 cents; over 2 pounds, up to 10 pounds, 15 cents; over 10 pounds, 20 cents.

## WHERE TO MAIL PARCELS

Uninsured parcels 8 ounces or less in weight may be mailed in street letter or package boxes, at all classified stations and branches, and at such numbered stations as are designated to receive parcels. Parcels weighing over 8 ounces cannot be mailed in street boxes, but must be taken to the main post office or classified station or branch. Parcels containing meat, food products, cut flowers, or other perishable matter should be mailed only at the main post office or one of the large classified stations.

## INSURE OR REGISTER VALUABLE MAIL

For Your Protection, All Gift Packages Should Be Registered or Insured

Patrons should send, as SEALED FIRST-CLASS REGISTERED MAIL, valuable matter such as coin and currency (when money orders are not available or desired), jewelry, precious stones, and articles of similar nature, as well as any valuable merchandise or matter for which the greatest protection available in the mails is desired. Indemnity up to not exceeding \$1,000 is paid in connection with registered mail. (Consult postmaster as to fees and limits of indemnity for such mail.)

INSURE all shipments of general merchandise, farm and factory products, etc.

Insurance fees: Value not exceeding \$5, 5 cents; not exceeding \$25, 10 cents; not exceeding \$50, 15 cents; not exceeding \$100, 25 cents; not exceeding \$150, 30 cents; and not exceeding \$200, 35 cents. This receipt furnishes advice to the sender that his Christmas mailing was received by the addressee or his authorized representative, all in addition to the regular postage.

**PAY ROLL ABSTRACTS TO BE SUBMITTED IN DUPLICATE**

Some postmasters have misconstrued the instructions in the Postal Bulletin of September 25, 1942, relative to obtaining, for submission to this office, extra copies of Form 513.

That part of the instructions which concerned the submission of Form 513 applied only to the 15 offices at which Division Headquarters of the Inspection Service are located.

The list of forms to be submitted in duplicate should have included Form 1906. (Postal Bulletin No. 18501, October 12, 1942.)

**PAY-ROLL ABSTRACTS TO BE SUBMITTED IN DUPLICATE**

Beginning with the quarter ending September 30, 1942, all pay-roll abstracts including follow sheets, should be submitted to this office in duplicate. This will include Forms 1500, 1500-A, 1501, 1501-G, 1501-V, 1592-X, 1623, 1850-A, 1850-J, 1858, 1906-A, 4260, and 4260-Q/S.

Disbursing postmasters should obtain from inspectors in charge, for submission to this office, an extra copy of Form 513. Consideration is being given to the revision in the near future of all pay-roll abstracts so as to provide columns for showing retirement deductions and tontine. Until the revisions are made, it is requested that the tontine chargeable against the deductions from each individual employee be inserted immediately following the employee's name on the pay-roll abstract. The tontine may be recorded in the following manner: "John Jones (3)." The amount chargeable to tontine should be shown on Forms 1592-X and 513 when those forms are prepared for the last pay period in each month.

**Tontine**

In the case of annual-salary employees, tontine in the amount of \$1 should be entered for each month in which more than one-half of a full month's salary is earned. No tontine is chargeable when one-half or less than one-half of the monthly salary is earned. In the case of substitute employees, \$1 is chargeable to tontine each month in which an employee works more than 102 hours. No tontine is chargeable when the total hours worked in any month is 102 or less. In the case of custodial charmen, the tontine is figured in accordance with the total scheduled working hours in the month on the basis of 3 hours per day, 5 hours per day, etc., as the case may be. Tontine of \$1 is chargeable for each month in which a custodial charman works more than one-half of the total number of scheduled working hours that month. In the case of special-delivery messengers within the purview of the Retirement Act (first-class offices only), tontine of \$1 is chargeable each month in which special-delivery service is rendered on more than 15 days, except when the retirement deductions amount to less than \$1 in any month the entire amount is chargeable as tontine.

The maximum amount chargeable as tontine against the retirement deductions is \$1 per month or \$3 per quarter for each employee.

**Offices Maintaining Own Retirement Records Excluded**

The above instructions do not apply to those offices which now maintain their own retirement records. With the exception that they should obtain and forward to this office an extra copy of Form 513, the offices listed below should continue the procedure now followed in preparing and submitting pay-roll abstracts:

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**TEMPORARY VACANCIES INCIDENT TO EMPLOYEES ABSENT ON MILITARY DUTY**

Effective October 1, 1942, the instructions issued in the Postal Bulletin of March 11, 1941, under the caption "Additional Positions Incident to Employees Absent on Military Duty," are changed to read as follows:

The attention of postmasters of first- and second-class post offices, and of third-class city and village carrier offices, with personnel under the jurisdiction of this Bureau, is invited to the **military duty notices** appearing in the **following Supplements to the U. S. Official Postal Guide**:

September 1940 (p. 1), "Leave of Absence—Military Duty."

October 1940 (p. 1), "Leave of Absence, Selective Training and Service Act of 1940".

October 1941 (p. 51), "Annual Leave Credit for Employees Ordered to Military Duty" and (p. 2) "Instructions."

November 1941 (p. 6), "Military Duty."

May 1942 (p. 4), "Employees Entering Military Service, Payment for Accumulated Leave Authorized."

When an employee under the jurisdiction of this Bureau enters the military or naval service, the postmaster should make a report thereof after the expiration of 30 days if it is then definitely known that the employee is to be retained in the military service. A report should be submitted on Form 1532 as instructed hereinafter, giving the date the employee was inducted into the military service. It is important that great care be exercised to report the exact date; otherwise any improper payments of salary would be suspended by the General Accounting Office.

The records of the Department will show that the employee is on military leave without pay and his position will be treated as a temporary vacancy. The employee's roster card will be withdrawn from the active roster cards and held in a special separation with caption "Temporary Military Vacancies." Post office records should be arranged accordingly.

Recommendation for filling a temporary military vacancy should be submitted on Form 1532, "Changes in Clerks, Carriers, and Substitutes," the form to be modified as follows:

To fill the vacancy I recommend the following changes in this office, to take effect.		
(LEAVE BLANK)		

**Caution.**—Substitutes MUST NOT be employed or paid as regular employees until approved Forms 1532 or 1533 are received from the Department. This applies to filling all vacancies. An employee who enters any branch of the armed forces must not be employed in a post office when on military furlough with pay.

The senior substitute clerk, carrier, or laborer, as the case may be, even though absent on military duty, should be recommended for promotion when any vacancy in the regular force is to be filled. This will create an opening for the next senior substitute who should be recommended.

If a postmaster recommends the filling of a temporary military vacancy, certification shall be made on Form 1532 that regular clerks, carriers, or laborers, as the case may be, are paid overtime for all Saturday service in lieu of compensatory time, that utility employees have been relieved of granting compensatory time and are assigned to regular tours or routes, and that regular employees are scheduled to perform the necessary service on Saturdays; also, that forty hours auxiliary assistance weekly on a regular basis is required for replacement and will be surrendered effective from the date the vacancy is filled.

It should be understood that this procedure does not increase the complement of the office. When employees return to duty in the post office, after being released from military duty, the necessary number of regular employees who were promoted last will be reduced to the substitute roll. In the circumstances, postmasters should obtain from all substitutes promoted or regulars transferred to fill temporary military vacancies, a statement which should read substantially as follows:

In accepting promotion to regular clerk (or regular carrier) I understand that if it should be necessary to reduce the force incident to employees returning from military duty, and I am the last appointed regular clerk (or regular carrier) at that time, I will accept reduction to the position of substitute or will accept the status for reduction of employee with whom I exchanged in a mutual transfer.

Statements of this character should be kept on file in the post office for future reference and should not be forwarded to the Department.

Where it is necessary to employ auxiliary assistance between the time the employee leaves for military duty and the filling of the temporary military vacancy, postmasters should submit an estimate of the amount of auxiliary assistance needed.

Where vacancies occur in the quota of substitutes incident to the advancement of employees to fill temporary military vacancies or incident to substitute employees on military leave, postmasters may submit Form 1531, in triplicate, to their Regional Civil Service Directors for endorsement and transmission to the Department for the appointment of substitutes for a probational indefinite period, the form to be specifically endorsed by postmaster to show appointment as probational indefinite substitute.

At post offices where additional positions have been authorized incident to the absence of employees on military leave without pay, the records of the Department have been changed, effective October 1, 1942, to show the regular complement of post offices by deducting the number of positions allowed for military replacements from the number of positions authorized. Post-office records should be changed accordingly.

Attention is invited to paragraph (b), section 3, of the act of Congress approved August 27, 1940, appearing in the September 1940 Supplement to the U. S. Official Postal Guide under the caption "Leave of Absence—Military Duty." Without advance authority from the Department, postmasters should reassign an employee to duty upon making application therefor within 40 days after he is relieved from active duty or service, provided the employee presents the required military certificate of service and he is still qualified to perform the duties of his position. Report covering each reassignment should be submitted on Form 1533, the form to be endorsed—"Incident to return of employee from military duty."

(Postal Bulletin No. 18508, October 28, 1942.)

#### CAR FARE NOT ALLOWED FOR SPECIAL-DELIVERY MESSENGERS

In connection with tire and gasoline shortages, some postmasters are arranging with special-delivery messengers for the use of public transportation facilities, involving car or bus fare, in the delivery of special-delivery articles.

It must be understood that, under the provisions of section 1103 of the Postal Laws and Regulations, the use of streetcars or buses will not be authorized in lieu of privately owned vehicles which special-delivery messengers are required to furnish and bear all expenses in the operation thereof.

Accordingly, allowances will not be granted by this Bureau to cover expenditures for car or bus fare incurred by special-delivery messengers. (Postal Bulletin No. 18496, September 30, 1942.)

#### MISCELLANEOUS RULES OF DELIVERY

##### Delivery of Government Checks

In view of the complications arising in the handling of the greatly increased number of Government checks, it has become necessary to amend Articles 77 to 83, inclusive, pages 44 and 45 of the July 1941 Official Postal Guide under the caption, "Miscellaneous Rules of Delivery," and rescind previous POSTAL BULLETIN instructions insofar as restrictions in delivery or forwarding are concerned, except that no change is involved in the return card instructions or in the handling of letters mailed quarterly by certain Indian agencies or those containing Veterans' pension checks. (See art. 75 and 76.)

Accordingly, it has been agreed with the various disbursing officers that the printed instructions on the envelopes of Government checks will read as follows:

X Postmaster:

If the addressee is deceased or has failed to file regular change of address upon removal, this letter should be returned immediately WITHOUT RECOURSE TO DIRECTORY SERVICE.

The printed instructions now appearing on the envelopes of Government checks with the exceptions stated in articles 75 and 76, should be disregarded when calling for delivery to addressee only or to another person on written authority only; moreover, such mail should be placed in the usual mail receptacle in which the addressee receives other ordinary mail, and written change of address orders furnished by the addressee should be honored, even though the printed instructions on the envelope may be worded to the contrary.

However, such mail when not deliverable under the instructions in this notice shall be returned at once to the sender without recourse to directory service, with reasons noted as required by section 806, Postal Laws and Regulations.

At post offices provided with mimeographing or other duplication equipment, additional copies of this notice shall be made and one copy placed in the hands of each delivering employee, including substitutes. At other offices, each delivering employee shall be required to read and initial this notice. (Postal Bulletin No. 18496, September 30, 1942.)

#### Forms 1529-1, 1529-2, and 1529-3

While it has heretofore been the practice to transmit forms to postmasters to submit quarterly estimates for auxiliary hire and overtime, forms must hereafter be obtained on requisition from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Building Operations and Supplies, Equipment and Supplies Branch.

However, without requisition, an initial supply of Forms 1529-1, 1529-2, and 1529-3 will be furnished postmasters of first- and second-class post offices and third-class city and village carrier offices, respectively. The forms must be preserved and used at the appropriate time to submit the required quarterly estimate for auxiliary hire and overtime, beginning with the March quarter 1943.

The forms should be executed in duplicate, the original forwarded to the Bureau of the First Assistant and the copy retained for the postmaster's files.

**CORRECTIONS:**—The first and second paragraphs on the reverse side of the forms under the caption, "How to COMPUTE TOTAL MANPOWER HOURS—FIRST-CLASS OFFICES ONLY," are changed to read as follows:

"To obtain the manpower hours of regular employees for 'same quarter last year,' the number of authorized positions at that time should be multiplied by the total working hours in the quarter (not including Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays). From these totals should be deducted the 'hours absent' during same quarter last year of regular employees on military leave with pay, civil service, court and jury duty, vacancies, detail of regulars to post office inspector, absence without pay, military leave without pay, detail of regulars to military unit, sick leave, vacation, and Saturday, Sunday, and holiday compensatory time. The same procedure should be followed in computing manpower hours estimated for 'this quarter' except that the total 'estimated absence' will be deducted from the total regular manpower hours for 'this quarter.' Auxiliary hours under this caption will be the total of items 15 and 33."

"In computing regular manpower hours in the column 'Clerks,' the number of authorized clerical positions, including the assistant postmaster and all supervisors, should be counted."

The item "Military leave without pay" under the caption "Instructions—Estimated Hours of Absence" is changed to read as follows:

"Military leave without pay.—Positions of employees on military leave without pay, either by induction or enlistment, will be carried in the records as temporary vacancies. Show total hours of absence until filled." (Postal Bulletin No. 18500, October 9, 1942.)

## INTERNATIONAL POSTAL SERVICE

Official Mail From the Director of Public Information, Ottawa, Canada

It has been brought to the attention of this Office that some confusion results from the arrival at United States post offices of mail matter from Canada bearing the return card of the Director of Public Information, Ottawa, the printed inscription "On His Majesty's Service," and a postage meter impression. Inasmuch as the metered impression indicates that no postage was prepaid, the relative articles have been treated as entirely unpaid and postage due collected accordingly. The matter was taken up with the Postal Administration of Canada, which advises as follows:

The frank appearing in the left of the postage meter impression is that of Associate Deputy Minister of the Department of National War Services, which Department includes the Office of the Director of Public Information under its administration.

There are a few Dominion Government Departments operating postage meter machines for the prepayment of certain portions of their mail which is not entitled to the franking privilege. These Departments have been authorized by the Post Office to place the facsimile of the official frank of their Department on any mail left of the postage meter die and use their postage meter machine on any mail which they desire to send out under the frank. In such instances, the meter is set to record a zero impression.

Accordingly, postmasters are instructed to cause such articles which may be received at their offices from Canada to be delivered as fully prepaid matter, without collection of postage thereon. (Postal Bulletin No. 18503, October 16, 1942).

### DELIVERY FEE AND CUSTOMS CLEARANCE CHARGE

Under Public Law 635 free customs entry may be accorded articles imported into the United States, as well as its territories or possessions, when consigned or addressed to members of the armed forces of the United Nations other than those of the United States, who are on duty therein, provided the articles are intended for their personal or official use. In those cases where articles and parcels are received from foreign countries addressed to such members of the armed forces of the United Nations other than those of the United States and are accorded free customs entry under the provisions of Public Law 635, postmasters at exchange offices shall not endorse those articles and parcels for collection of the delivery and customs clearance charge referred to in sections 43 and 44 on page 29 and in sections 96 and 97 on page 65 of Part II of the Official Postal Guide for July 1941.

Articles and parcels received at offices of destination in this country addressed to members of the armed forces of the United Nations other than those of the United States, which have been passed free of duty pursuant to Public Law 635 but were erroneously endorsed by the exchange office for the collection of a fee for customs clearance and delivery shall be delivered to the addressee without the collection of such charge and a report of the matter forwarded to this Office.

(Postal Bulletin No. 18508, October 28, 1942.)

### MAILS FOR ALASKA

Winter restrictions upon mail for interior Alaska become effective November 1, 1942.

The Postal Guide, July 1941, page 127, article 25, and page 180, article 30, fully covers the dispatch of mail, articles transmissible, and articles excluded from the mails during the closed season for offices designated "R" under Alaska in the State list of post offices.

Postmasters will immediately give this matter their personal attention and see to it that all employees concerned fully understand the foregoing mentioned instructions and that all articles excluded are not accepted for mailing for transmission of post offices designated "R" during the winter period stated.

In this connection postmasters are informed that the affixing of special-handling stamps to the mail matter excluded under the instructions referred to above will not entitle it to preferred treatment, and if such matter with special-handling stamps affixed is offered for mailing it should not be accepted for dispatch during the closed season.

Inquiries or tracers should not be sent without first allowing a reasonable length of time for transmission, delivery, and response. In this connection see section 805, paragraph 8, Postal Laws and Regulations, concerning notices of undeliverable matter. (Postal Bulletin No. 18496, September 30, 1942.)

### MISSENDING OF MAIL TO CENSORSHIP STATIONS

It has come to the attention of the Department that considerable domestic and precensored mail is being mis-sent to censorship stations, with the result that such mail is delayed in reaching addressees.

As examination of the mis-sent mail in question indicates either carelessness or lack of understanding of instructions, all postal employees must see to it that extreme care is exercised in the distribution and dispatch of mails with a view to preventing the forwarding to a censorship station of domestic mail or mail which has been previously censored at another station. (Postal Bulletin No. 18505, October 21, 1942.)

### RAILWAY MAIL SERVICE

#### HANDLING HOLIDAY MAILS

##### Instructions to Third and Fourth-Class Postmasters

During a period of approximately 3 weeks preceding Christmas the mails increase to several times the normal volume.

Special preparations are made in railway post offices and terminal railway post offices to handle these mails, and postmasters, particularly at offices of the third

and fourth-classes, are urged to do their share in meeting the unusual conditions in order to prevent avoidable delays.

Work ordinary mails, letters, and papers, in accordance with the usual practice.

The manner of making up direct and State packages and sacks is explained in sections 734, 735, 737, and 741, Postal Laws and Regulations 1940. Review these sections carefully.

Postmasters are urged to familiarize themselves with current instructions concerning the dispatch of parcel-post mails outside mail sacks, and in forwarding outside packages, which according to the regulations should be included in sacks. (See secs. 590 and 591, Postal Laws and Regulations, 1940 and Pt. 1, Postal Guide, 1941.)

Please give special attention to the following:

(a) Urge the public to carefully pack, label, and tie parcels and refuse packages not properly prepared.

(b) Make up parcel post mail separately, and by States and directs as far as practicable.

(c) Make up letter mail by States and directs as far as practicable.

(d) Military mail should not be included with civilian mail in direct packages, but should be made up separately and properly labeled.

(e) Dispatch "Special Handling," "Special Delivery," and "Perishable" parcels with pouch mail.

(f) Place air mail on top of the No. 1 or working package for connecting line or office.

(g) Mark labels of all sacks of parcel post plainly "Parcel Post." For example: "Illinois—Parcel Post." Followed by your postmark. Make up as many states as practicable.

(h) Do not include paper mails or third-class mails with parcel post.

(i) Use No. 1 sacks equipped with locking cord fasteners, closed with ordinary mail locks, for dispatching parcel post.

(j) Prepare labels in advance as far as practicable. Printed labels or labels clearly written in ink should be used.

(k) Tie packages of letters and cards very firmly. Large packages of letters and cards of odd size require an extra wrap of twine to hold securely.

(l) Return every day in accordance with latest instructions all *surplus empty mail bags and mail locks* on hand. Each bag and lock is needed to handle the holiday mails. Such equipment must not be hoarded for holiday use.

If any further detailed information is desired, correspond with the Chief Clerk, Railway Mail Service, having charge of the transportation service in your locality.

#### DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

#### RATE OF POSTAGE ON AIR MAIL SENT THROUGH ARMY AND NAVY POST OFFICES OUTSIDE THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES

Order No. 18989, dated October 21, 1942 (Insert No. 103), amending paragraph 3½, section 511, Postal Laws and Regulations, extends to air mail sent to or by contractors and civilian employees receiving mail through Army or Navy post offices outside the continental United States the air-mail rate of 6 cents for each half ounce or fraction thereof which heretofore was applicable only to air mail to and from the personnel of the armed forces of the United States stationed outside the continental United States.

Air mail sent by or to contractors and civilian employees under this regulation must show in the return card or address, as the case may be, that it is sent from or to an Army or Navy post office. Such mail sent by or to the personnel of the armed forces must show in the return card or address either the Army or Navy post office through which the member sends or receives his mail, and the matter should continue to show in the return card or in the address the rank or rating of the individual member of the armed forces sending or receiving the matter. (Postal Bulletin No. 18506, October 23, 1942.)

### CHRISTMAS SEALS OR STICKERS ON MAIL MATTER

As has been customary each year during the Christmas holidays, the requirement that domestic mail, including that for all the possessions of the United States, bearing on the address side adhesive seals or stickers other than lawful postage stamps, shall be treated as unmailable, is suspended from December 1, 1942, to January 1, 1943. Postmasters shall, however, inform their patrons that such seals or stickers should not be placed on the address side of mail.

### USE OF PRECANCELED STAMPS ON HOLIDAY MAIL

In order to facilitate the handling of mail at first-, second-, and third-class post offices during the Christmas holidays, postmasters at such offices are authorized at their option to precancel and affix stamps of the necessary denominations for the payment of postage on matter of the second, third, and fourth classes offered for mailing at their offices during the month of December, the stamps not to be delivered to the persons presenting the parcels for mailing, but to be affixed to the parcels by the postmaster or an employee of the post office after the proper postage has been paid. Stamps used in this manner shall be precanceled in accordance with the conditions governing the precancellation of postage stamps. Such stamps may not be precanceled by ordinary canceling devices, but only with special equipment furnished for that purpose which prints the name of the post office between two heavy parallel lines.

This general authority to use precanceled stamps is for the month of December only, and applies only to post offices which have already been authorized to use precanceled stamps.

Postmasters are strictly enjoined to observe the greatest possible precautions to prevent the misuse of such stamps and shall exercise careful supervision over their use, and the employees handling them, in order that the postal revenues may be properly safeguarded. To this end, postmasters should cause parcels to which stamps are affixed by receiving clerks to be examined and weighed at variant intervals after the receiving clerks turn them over to the dispatching clerks, in order to make certain that the proper amount of postage stamps has been affixed to the parcels.

In any case persons or concerns desire to purchase precanceled stamps for affixing by themselves on mailings of matter of the second, third, and fourth classes, postmasters shall require them to submit an application for such privilege, as prescribed in article 69, page 26, of the July 1941 Postal Guide, Part I.

### ENCOURAGE SENDING PRINTED CHRISTMAS GREETINGS AS FIRST-CLASS MAIL

Large numbers of Christmas greetings, mailed in unsealed envelopes at the third-class rate of postage, are disposed of as waste each year because they are undeliverable as addressed, due to removal of the addressee or other cause. Such greetings are not entitled to the free forwarding privilege accorded those mailed in sealed envelopes at the first-class rate and, consequently, the senders in many cases never know that the greetings were not received by the addressees. This would not occur if the greetings were mailed sealed at the first-class rate.

In view of the foregoing, postmasters should urge mailers to send their holiday greetings at the first-class rate, explaining that when so sent the greetings may be sealed and contain written messages not otherwise permitted, therefore having a personal appeal which is of course, more highly appreciated by the recipients; that such greetings are dispatched and delivered first, given directory service, and, if necessary, forwarded without additional charge; also, if undeliverable, they are returned without charge provided the sender's return card is shown on the envelope. On the other hand, greetings mailed at the third-class rate which cannot be delivered as addressed because of the removal of the addressee, or for some other reason, must often be destroyed as waste, thereby causing disappointment.

### AIR-MAIL PARCELS—CONTENTS MUST BE INSPECTED

#### INSTRUCTIONS

In connection with paragraph 6, section 511, Postal Laws and Regulations, as amended by Order No. 19008 of this date, which provides that no sealed

package, parcel or other sealed article (except letters in their ordinary and usual form, and official mail) shall be accepted for transmission by air mail unless endorsed as prescribed by this order, postmasters are directed to see that all such sealed articles are examined by a postal employee before dispatch in order to make sure no inflammable, explosive, or other unmailable matter is enclosed. Such examination shall be made in the presence of another postal employee, if available. If the matter is acceptable for mailing, the package, parcel, or other matter shall be resealed and endorsed: "Contents Examined at \_\_\_\_\_"

followed by the names of the examining employee and witness, together with the postmark of the post office where examined. After such endorsement examination is not to be made at any other office.

It is desirable that sealed articles intended for transmission by air mail be opened and resealed by the mailer in the presence of a postal employee, and when such articles are presented at a post office window this procedure should be followed where practicable. Provision should be made to do this at some suitable, convenient points without delaying other patrons or interfering with the regular handling of the mails.

When any sealed article (other than letters in their ordinary and usual form, or official mail) intended for transmission by air mail is deposited in any street collection box, or at any other point, without bearing the endorsement authorizing opening for postal inspection, the article shall be held and if the sender is known and can be promptly notified he shall be requested to place the required endorsement thereon. If the sender is unknown or cannot be contacted without delaying dispatch of the article, it shall not be sent by air mail but should be dispatched by surface transportation.

Every unsealed package, parcel, or other article of unsealed matter (except that in the ordinary and usual form of a letter, and official mail), intended to be sent by air mail, regardless of whether it bears the endorsement authorizing postal inspection, shall be examined and endorsed as herein directed before such unsealed matter is dispatched from the office of mailing.

In the event any sealed or unsealed article intended for transmission by air mail, which under these instructions is required to be examined and endorsed to that effect before being dispatched, is through inadvertence dispatched without being endorsed to show that the required examination has been made, the necessary examination shall be made to the first office in transit where such failure is discovered and the procedure herein prescribed shall then be followed at such office. A report of the case shall be submitted to the Third Assistant Postmaster General.

If any package, parcel, or other article examined in accordance with the foregoing is found to contain unmailable matter, it should be treated as prescribed by the postal laws and regulations pertaining to the treatment of such matter, according to its character. Of course, those containing explosives or other dangerous substances should be handled with care and disposed of in such manner as to prevent injury to postal employees, the mails, or premises. Prompt report of any instance of this nature should be submitted to the Inspector in Charge of the district where discovered.

#### REGISTERED, INSURED, AND C. O. D. AIR MAIL

Every article intended to be sent by registered air mail (other than letters in their ordinary and usual form, and official mail) must be presented for acceptance at the post office, or a station or branch thereof, and the contents exhibited to the accepting employee, who will, in the presence of another postal employee, if available, determine whether the article contains any unmailable matter which should not be admitted to the mails. This procedure will be facilitated if the sender will bring the matter to the post office in an unsealed condition, but if the package has been sealed before presentation at the post office the sender or his representative shall be required to open the package to permit examination of the contents and also to reseal it in the presence of the accepting postal employee if the article is acceptable for registration. The impressions of the postmarking stamp shall be affixed by the accepting employee in such a manner as adequately to cover the sealing flaps at essential points and the article endorsed in the manner required for ordinary air mail.

The postal employee witnessing the opening, examination, and resealing of a registered article of more than ordinary value should, if practicable, be a supervisory employee.

Insured and c. o. d. air-mail packages should be treated in a manner similar to that outlined for registered air-mail packages except as to postmarking the sealing flaps and the requirement that the witness to opening and examination of parcels be a supervisory employee.

Registered, insured, and c. o. d. air-mail packages mailed by firms using firm mailing bills should be listed on bills separate from other registered, insured, and c. o. d. mail so that the air-mail articles may be more expeditiously examined and handled at the post office. (Postal Bulletin No. 18506, October 23, 1942.)

## DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

### INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS ON AUSTRALIA

Several instances of failure to give complete necessary details in the advices of international money orders intended for payment in the various States of the Commonwealth of Australia have been brought to the attention of this office.

Postmasters are directed to instruct all employees assigned to the issue of international money orders that in making up the advices of orders for payment in the Commonwealth of Australia, the name **Australia** should be entered in the space provided for "Country" and on the next line over which is printed "The Postmaster at," should invariably be written the name of the paying **post office** followed by the name of the **State** in which it is located. They should also be reminded that it is important, when completing an application for repayment on Form 6759, that the name of the State in the Commonwealth of Australia be given as a part of the "**heading**" which denotes the nationality of the order. (Postal Bulletin No. 18513, November 9, 1942.)

### WRONG OFFICE NUMBER ON MONEY-ORDER FORMS

It is reported that the office number appearing on the money-order forms supplied for the use of the post office named below is incorrect, and some of the orders are supposed to have been issued and paid. Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants, or in answering inquiries regarding payment.

**Burbank, C. O. D., Calif.** Serial numbers 1 to 13200, inclusive. Reported as issued from May 1, 1941, to September 9, 1942. Correct office number is 80813 and not 80526. (Postal Bulletin No. 18505, October 21, 1942.)

**San Antonio, Brooks Field Branch, Tex.** Serial numbers 23001 to 24567, inclusive. Reported as issued from September 1 to October 24, 1942. Correct office number is 52286 and not 52268.

(Postal Bulletin No. 18511, November 4, 1942.)

## DIVISION OF POSTAL SAVINGS

### WAR SAVINGS BONDS

#### Authority to Furnish Information as to Volume of Sales to State Administrators Continued During October

A notice in the Postal Bulletin of September 2, 1942, provides that the authority for reporting bond sales quarter-monthly to State Administrators of the War Savings Staff or their authorized representatives be rescinded at the close of September. Such authority is hereby extended until October 31, 1942. It is not intended that this notice or previous notices regarding the furnishing of periodic reports to State Administrators be interpreted as prohibiting the giving of information orally on volume of bond and savings-stamp sales in response to oral, telephoned, telegraphed, or written request to local committee chairmen of the War Savings Staff, or to bona fide news-disseminating agencies. (Postal Bulletin No. 18499, October 7, 1942.)

## CANCELED WAR SAVINGS STAMPS

## Change in Instructions for Shipment

Reference is made to article 8 of the notice relative to the transfer of War Savings stamps to the Treasury Department, which appeared in the Postal Bulletin of September 21. The instructions in 1 (b) concerning the grouping of "albums partially filled containing the same number of stamps of the same denomination" may be disregarded for the time being, but, so far as practicable, the albums should be sorted by denominations. At offices where the quantity of albums handled is so large that a denominational sort causes a material increase in clerk hire, it will be acceptable for the present if the albums are packaged as is found most convenient, preferably in lots of 50. When completing the Advice of Shipment, Form 976, postmasters who are unable to make a denominational sort shall state on the line provided for "mixed" denominations the total number of packages in the shipment and the total value of the stamps.

Each package of albums shall be securely bound with a manila strap or cord and an adding-machine tape of the album values shall be enclosed. The number of albums and total value thereof shall be noted on the strap or on a facing slip, together with the clerk's initials. A master tape of the package values shall be attached to the triplicate Advice of Shipment and certificate or certificates of deposit and enclosed in the shipment. Arrangements have been completed in Chicago to verify stamp shipments promptly and it appears that nothing would be gained by receiving and returning the triplicate Advice of Shipment as stated in article 9 of the bulletin notice. Accordingly, for the present the notification to postmasters that their stamp shipments have been received will be confined to the signed duplicate certificate of deposit—Form 6815 if the canceled stamps are deposited as savings-stamp funds or 5560 if deposited as savings-bond funds.

In packaging albums, substantial cartons that are suitable for the purpose may be used, if available, and the number of albums per package will be governed by the size of the carton. If each package of albums is securely tied or if reasonable quantities are placed in strong cartons and the packages or cartons then placed in pouches or boxes that are not too large, they may be confidently expected to arrive intact. (Postal Bulletin No. 18499, October 7, 1942.)

## WAR SAVINGS BONDS

## No Change in Central Depositories

Reference is made to the Postmaster General's Orders printed in the POSTAL BULLETIN of September 14 and to the notice concerning the transfer of war savings stamps to the Treasury Department in the Bulletin of September 21, informing postmasters that effective October 1 the central accounting post offices listed on pages 58, 59, and 60 of the Postal Guide would be the sole depositaries for surplus postal, money-order, and postal-savings funds in their respective States or districts, and for the proceeds of War Savings stamp sales, except the part represented by canceled War Savings stamps. Some postmasters have concluded that these instructions apply also to savings-bond funds. No change has been made in the instructions as to the disposition of savings-bond funds nor in central savings-bond depositaries, as listed on pages 148, 149, and 150 of the Postal Guide.

**Postmasters at central accounting offices that act also in the capacity of central depositaries for savings-bond funds** should receipt for in the usual manner and retain savings-bond remittances from direct accounting offices located in the district of another central savings-bond depository, but they should instruct those postmasters where to send future savings-bond remittances. Remittances of savings-bond funds received from third- and fourth-class postmasters in the district served by another central savings-bond depository office should be transmitted by registered mail to the other central depository postmaster, together with the stubs, spoiled bonds, and letters of transmittal. If receipts have already been sent to the remitting postmaster and the remittances recorded in the daily records, current funds for the total amount involved should be withdrawn from the account and sent to the other central savings-bond depository. All such transfers of funds may be made by check.

**Postmasters at central accounting offices that have not functioned as central savings-bond depositaries** should return to the remitting postmasters all savings-bond funds received, together with the letters of transmittal and any stubs and spoiled bonds.

Central savings-bond depositary postmasters receiving remittances of bond funds through a central accounting office shall inform the direct or district accounting postmaster by letter of the receipt of the remittance or remittances and shall include in the letter instructions as to how savings-bond funds should be disposed of in the future.

A supply of reprints of this notice will be sent without request to central accounting and central savings-bond depositary postmasters in California, Connecticut, Florida, Idaho, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Montana, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Vermont, Washington, and West Virginia. (Postal Bulletin No. 18500, October 9, 1942.)

### WAR SAVINGS STAMPS

#### Money Order Cashier Charged with Stock and Funds

The transfer of war savings stamps to the Treasury Department, information concerning which appeared in the Postal Bulletin of September 21, does not relieve the money-order cashiers at offices operating under the joint finance letter, amended July 1942, of responsibility for savings-stamp funds and stock; and no deviation from the instructions in the letter with respect to that responsibility is authorized. At central accounting offices or at other large offices having branches and stations, the money-order cashier should grant to the wholesale stamp clerk a fixed credit in war savings stamps for filling requisitions. (Postal Bulletin No. 18501, October 12, 1942.)

### Requisitions by Postmasters at First-Class Offices

Postmasters at first-class offices (all of whom, in accordance with the instructions in the Postal Bulletin of September 21, now requisition War Savings stamp stock direct from the Department) should arrange to order stamps quarterly and to submit their requisitions while they still have from 2 to 4 weeks' stock on hand. The requisition should be submitted on Form PS 311-B, the address on which should be changed to read "Division of Stamps" instead of "Division of Postal Savings." If the vault capacity is too small to accommodate a 3 month's supply, it will, of course, be necessary to order smaller amounts. Four days are required to fill requisitions after they are received in the Department and, in addition, allowance must be made for the time both the requisition and the stock are in transit. It is not practicable to cut down this time, and it is always necessary for this office to arrange by telegram to have emergency requisitions filled by postmasters who have adequate stock.

Books of War Savings stamps of the 10-cent and 25-cent denominations are packaged in lots of 10 and should be requisitioned in quantities of 10 or some multiple of 10.

Postmasters can assist greatly by maintaining close contact with local War Savings Staff committees and other sales promotional organizations so that they will learn about contemplated drives or sales campaigns and be able to send in special requisitions, if necessary, far enough in advance to insure receipt of the stock in time. (Postal Bulletin No. 18502, October 14, 1942.)

### WAR SAVINGS BONDS

#### Prompt Mailing of Quarter-Monthly Reports of Sales

The Treasury Department advises that quarter-monthly reports of War savings-bond sales authorized by the notice in the Postal Bulletin of September 2,

1942, are not being promptly received at Federal Reserve banks. It is realized that in certain instances the blank preaddressed report forms may be late in reaching postmasters. However, it is most desirous that no delay in rendition ensue at post offices. Consequently, when the form is at hand, correct entries should be made thereon and mailed, if possible, at the close of business on the date for which the report is rendered.

Postmasters at central-accounting offices are further advised that this report should cover sales only at the main office and branches and stations, if any, and that sales at district offices should not be included. (Postal Bulletin No. 18503, October 16, 1942.)

#### Transmittal for Safekeeping

Bonds issued by postmasters in response to mail orders, according to lists tendered by business firms, or when issued by such concerns and submitted to the post office for verification and authentication may now be shipped to the Treasurer of the United States or Federal Reserve banks for safekeeping when it is indicated that such is the desire of the purchasers. In such instances the shipment should be accompanied by an appropriate communication from the postmaster stating that the bonds are forwarded for safekeeping in accordance with the wishes of the purchaser. Completed request for safekeeping, Form P. D. 1423, is not necessary. The shipment should be made by ordinary official mail.

This authorization does not apply to bonds purchased through window transactions. (Postal Bulletin No. 18504, October 19, 1942.)

### DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAIIS

#### REGISTERED MAIL

##### Indorsing and Postmarking

It has been brought to attention that registered mail of the first class frequently is not properly postmarked or indorsed with the impression of the official "Registered No." stamp, and in other respects not prepared in accordance with existing instructions.

All concerned are requested to give this matter appropriate corrective attention. (Postal Bulletin No. 18505, October 21, 1942.)

### The Following Notices Were Issued From the Bureau of the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General

### THE DELIVERY OF MAIL BY VEHICLES DURING CHRISTMAS SEASON

A circular letter of instructions was issued by the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General on August 25, 1942, and mailed to all postmasters who utilized automobiles belonging to other departments and agencies of the Government to deliver mail during the Christmas season last year, with the object of again securing the use of such vehicles to assist the Department on the delivery of mail this year.

Copies of the letter were sent to the heads of all the executive departments and agencies who loaned automobiles to the Postal Service in previous years soliciting their cooperation in making available for that special purpose the maximum number of suitable automobiles this year because of the anticipated greater demand for vehicles created by the existing national emergency. The reports thus far received in response to our appeal have been very encouraging.

The letter of August 25th above referred to has been supplemented by a letter dated October 5, 1942, in view of the receipt of advice from The Adjutant General assuring the Department of the cooperation of the War Department by the loan of motor vehicles for use during the Christmas season.

The instructions issued by the War Department leave to the discretion of Commanders the determination of availability of vehicles, a provision which it is stated is necessary in order that the loans do not interfere with the War Department's intensive training and supply programs in connection with the war effort.

All postmasters concerned will take due notice of the instructions and take such steps as may be necessary to avail themselves of the use of all suitable and available Government-owned automobiles. Postmasters at city delivery offices who have not heretofore used such equipment for the delivery of Christmas mail and have knowledge of their availability in proximity of their offices, are directed to immediately furnish the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Motor Vehicle Service, full details in that respect.

It is desired to emphasize that automobiles borrowed from other Departments and Governmental Agencies shall be utilized to the fullest possible extent before resorting to the use of equipment on an hourly contract basis upon proper authorization; that if vehicles are required in addition thereto for the maintenance of necessary and satisfactory city delivery service, then trucks may be hired at the lowest obtainable hourly rate as the result of advertising; that if the needs of the service cannot be met adequately by the two preceding methods, consideration next will be given to engaging horse-drawn vehicles, and as a last resort passenger type vehicles—all on an hourly contract basis as the result of competitive bidding as required by law.

#### The Employment of Temporary Substitutes—Motor Vehicle Service—During Christmas Period

In the event it becomes necessary to employ additional help for the transportation of the mails (depot and station service) at offices where such service is now being performed by Government-owned mail trucks manned by Motor Vehicle Service employees from December 1, 1942 to January 15, 1943, recommendation should be submitted to this Bureau, Division of Motor Vehicle Service, through the Civil Service Regional Director on Form 4831, in triplicate, for the appointment of temporary substitute garagemen-drivers (driver-mechanics) at the rate of 65¢ an hour, in accordance with the instructions contained in this Bureau's letter dated October 27, 1941. It will be noted from those instructions that the 65¢ hourly rate applies only to the substitutes who actually drive trucks and pass the prescribed tests. The actual date each appointee satisfactorily completes the tests must be shown on Form 4831, such date to be prior to the date of appointment. All other services of temporary substitute garagemen-drivers (driver-mechanics) will be paid at the rate of 55¢ an hour and a full explanation regarding the necessity for such employment must accompany the appointment form.

Under the heading "Remarks" should be stated the expiration date, which should not be later than January 15, 1943. If it is absolutely necessary to employ a temporary substitute garageman-driver (driver-mechanic) beyond December 31, 1942, a full statement of the reason therefor must be submitted with an application for an allowance to cover.

The appointment form should show whether or not the appointee had been employed previously in the Motor Vehicle Service. Under no circumstances is a former employee who was separated from the service for cause to be reemployed without prior Departmental approval.

No appointments of any other class of substitutes in the Motor Vehicle Service may be made without the prior approval of this Bureau, Division of Motor Vehicle Service.

It should be understood that additional temporary substitutes are not to be employed incident to the handling of the Christmas mails, unless the exigencies of the service are such that satisfactory service cannot be maintained with the regular authorized force.

Greatest care should be exercised to see that each employee selected to drive Government-owned trucks and contract vehicles possesses an operator's permit, and is thoroughly experienced in the operation of the vehicle to which assigned. These requirements are essential in guarding against the employment of incompetent drivers.

Each temporary employee assigned to operate a truck should be furnished a copy of Form 4504, Safety Pamphlet; and Form 4597, Instructions for Operating Motor Vehicle Service, with the request that he familiarize himself with the contents.

All persons selected for employment must execute Form 47, Personnel Affidavit, and must be fingerprinted on Form 2390.

The fullest cooperation of all concerned to see that these instructions are carefully observed will be greatly appreciated.

#### Contract Vehicle Service

In transmitting vouchers covering payment for temporary vehicle hire during the quarter ending December 31, 1942, to the Bureau of Accounts, Post Office Department, postmasters should exercise caution to see that such vouchers are supported by quarterly proposals at hourly rates.

The instructions of this Bureau furnished with quarterly proposal and estimate forms for temporary vehicle hire should be carried out explicitly.

Particular attention is invited to the necessity of postmasters indicating acceptance of the lowest bid, as required by law, the acceptance to be dated and SIGNED BY THE POSTMASTER IN INK, AND NOT BY RUBBER STAMP OR AN ASSISTANT POSTMASTER FOR THE DULY COMMISSIONED POSTMASTER.

It is important that these instructions be carefully observed with a view to obviating unnecessary delay in handling postal accounts, as well as inconvenience to this Bureau when bids have not been properly signed and endorsed by postmasters.

#### Accident Prevention—Motor Vehicle Service

The attention of postmasters, supervisors, and employees is again called to the necessity of exercising extraordinary care in the operation of motor vehicles during the fall and winter months when the prevalence of snow and ice places additional burdens and responsibilities upon drivers.

To cope with these conditions requires alertness and close observation of traffic laws and regulations; that the brakes of vehicles be equalized and otherwise in satisfactory condition; that the tires be properly inflated; that the trucks be equipped with serviceable tire chains, and full use made of them as the needs of the service require, and that due allowance be made for the adverse conditions when bringing the vehicle to a stop, especially at street intersections.

The wholehearted cooperation of all concerned in the prevention of accidents is earnestly solicited. (Postal Bulletin No. 18500, October 9, 1942.)

#### POSTER ENTITLED "SAVE WASTE FATS"

##### Display in First and Second Class Post Offices Authorized

Postmasters of offices of the first and second class are authorized to display in available space in the post office lobby upon its receipt a poster entitled "Save Waste Fats" issued by the Bureau of Industrial Conservation of the War Production Board.

The poster should be displayed in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork and it should be removed not later than November 1 next as it will have served its purpose by then. (Postal Bulletin No. 18504, October 19, 1942.)

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#### POSTER ISSUED BY THE OFFICE OF WAR INFORMATION

##### Display in Post Office Lobbies Authorized

The Office of War Information will furnish postmasters in the near future with a poster entitled "Strong in the strength of the Lord, we who fight in the people's cause will never stop until that cause is won." Postmasters are author-

ize to display this poster in available space in post-office lobbies for a reasonable period in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork. (Postal Bulletin No. 18497, October 2, 1942.)

### FUEL OIL FOR HEATING POST OFFICE QUARTERS

Attention is directed to notice in the *POSTAL BULLETIN* of July 24, 1942, quoting in part Limitation Order L-56 of the War Production Board.

Paragraph (e) of this order has been amended effective September 15, 1942, and the following pertinent provisions of the amended order are quoted for the information of postmasters in the specified area who have jurisdiction over leased or rented quarters heated by fuel oil:

(e) Limitation on deliveries of fuel oil—

\* \* \* \* \*

(2) Within Area Four, on and after September 16, 1942, no supplier shall deliver or cause to be delivered, and no person shall accept delivery of fuel oil, except in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (e) (3), (e) (4), (e) (5), and (e) (6).

\* \* \* \* \*

(4) For use in heating equipment in premises other than private dwellings.

(i) Within Area Four, during the period from September 16, 1942, to September 30, 1942, inclusive, a supplier may, subject to the provisions of subdivision (ii) of this subparagraph (4), deliver to or for use in premises other than a private dwelling the amount of fuel oil necessary to fill to fifty percent (50%) of capacity the fuel-storage tanks or tanks of space and central heating and cooling equipment and of domestic and commercial water-heating equipment serving such premises.

(ii) In the event that no storage tanks are maintained for such equipment a supplier may, during the period specified in subdivision (i) of this subparagraph (4), deliver to or for use in such premises only the amount necessary to bring the total supply of fuel oil on hand for the operation of such equipment to two hundred and seventy-five (275) gallons.

(iii) After delivery to or for use in premises other than a private dwelling of the quantity of fuel oil permitted by subdivision (i) or (ii) of this subparagraph (4) no supplier shall deliver or cause to be delivered and no person shall accept delivery of fuel oil for the operation of such equipment in such premises except as provided in paragraph (e) (5).

(5) Within Area Four on and after October 1, 1942, a supplier may deliver fuel oil for the operation of space and central heating and cooling equipment and domestic and commercial water heating equipment only if the person to whom or for whose account delivery is made agrees in writing to surrender to such supplier within fifteen (15) days after the effective date of any fuel-oil ration order issued by the Office of Price Administration, coupons representing the amount of fuel delivered. Within fifteen (15) days after the effective date of any fuel-oil ration order issued by the Office of Price Administration, any person accepting delivery of fuel oil pursuant to this paragraph shall surrender to such supplier coupons equal in gallonage value to the number of gallons of fuel oil so delivered. Any supplier who makes delivery pursuant to this paragraph shall keep a record of such delivery, showing the name and address of the premises to which delivery was made, the name and address of the purchaser, and the date and amount of the delivery. Within twenty (20) days after the effective date of any fuel-oil ration order issued by the Office of Price Administration, such supplier shall surrender to the regional office of the Office of Price Administration having jurisdiction over the area in which he does business, all coupons received by him representing deliveries made between October 1, 1942, and the effective date of such order; at the time of surrendering such coupon he shall also report to such office the name and address of each person who has failed to surrender coupons to him as required by this paragraph, the amount of fuel oil delivered to such person and the address of the premises to which such delivery was made.

## EXHIBIT B

Area Four: The States of Connecticut, Delaware, Florida (east of the Apalachicola River), Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and the District of Columbia.

Affected postmasters should take prompt steps to have fuel oil supplied as provided in subdivision (i) of subparagraph (4) quoted above by (a), contacting the owner of the quarters if fuel oil is supplied by him as a part of the rental consideration, or (b), by purchasing the fuel oil in the usual manner if the cost thereof is paid under Departmental authorization. (Postal Bulletin No. 18494, September 25, 1942.)
