The following orders were issued from the office of the Postmaster General — G. v.L. Meyer, Postmaster General.

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

DEDUCTIONS — FAILURES OF TRAIN SERVICE.

Order No. 1637.

AUGUST 6, 1908.

Paragraph 6, Section 1334, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1902, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6. Unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Post Office Department that the failure to operate a train or trains was unavoidable, the deduction will be made at pro rata, or 100 per cent of the amount due to be earned by them between the points of failure. If the failure was unavoidable, the route reopened without unnecessary relay and the mails not diverted, the mail service being re-established promptly, 50 per cent of said amount will be deducted. Where, however, there has been a total suspension of mail service over all or any part of a route for a period of six days or more, deduction will be made for the entire period at 100 per cent of pro rata, without regard to the cause of the failure or diversion of mails.

PERMITTING USE OF PENALTY ENVELOPES FOR RETURN OF PENSION VOUCHERS.

Order No. 1670.

AUGUST 21, 1908.

Section 512, Postal Laws and Regulations, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:

4. The Secretary of the Interior shall furnish free to all pensioners * * * penalty envelopes, properly addressed, to be used by said pensioners only for the return of their pension vouchers. (Act of May 28, 1908.)

Paragraph 14, Section 281, Postal Laws and Regulations, is hereby revoked.

COMPENSATION TO EMPLOYEES FOR INJURIES SUSTAINED.

Order No. 1676.

AUGUST 24, 1908.

Ordered: On May 30, 1908, Congress passed an Act, which became effective August 1, 1908, granting to certain employees of the United States the right to receive from the government compensation for injuries sustained in the course of their employment.

The classes of employees covered by this Act are artisans and laborers in arsenals, navy yards, river and harbor construction, government manufacturing establishments, etc. The only persons connected with the Post Office Department or the Postal Service who come within the scope of the Act are employees in the Mail Bag Repair Shop and the Mail Lock Repair Shop; but as the Department of Commerce and Labor has undertaken to keep complete statistics of accidents to all civilian employees of the government, including those not entitled to compensation under the terms of the law, reports should be made covering all officers and employees of the Post Office Department and the Postal Service who may be injured while performing their official duties.

In the case of any injury due to an accident occurring in the course of official duty, where the nature of the injury is such as to prevent the injured person from performing work for one day or longer, a report will be made on Form C.A.-1. When a person who has been reported disabled by an accident returns to work, a report thereof will immediately be made on Form C.A.-2. Cases of death occurring either immediately or within one year after an accident will be reported on Form C.A.-3.

Upon the occurrence hereafter of accidents such as are herein referred to, or if such accidents have occurred since August 1, 1908, the proper reports must be submitted as promptly as possible. All branches of the service except post offices of the third and fourth classes have been furnished with copies of the necessary forms. Forms will be furnished these offices when needed; immediately after the occurrence of an accident, requisition must be made upon the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Supplies, for the necessary forms, and a report submitted as early as practicable.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY OF FEDERAL EMPLOYEES.

Order No. 1679.

AUGUST 25, 1908.

To officers and employees of the Post Office Department and the Postal Service:

Attention is directed to the following orders of the Postmaster General:

" Order No. 407.

" WASHINGTON, D. C., June 6, 1907.

" Under date of June 3, 1907, the President amended Rule I of the Civil Service Rules to read as follows:

" No person in the Executive civil service shall use his official authority or influence for the purpose of interfering with an election or affecting the result thereof.

" Persons who by the provisions of these rules are in the competitive classified service, while retaining the right to vote as they please and to express privately their opinions on all political subjects, shall take no active part in political management or in political campaigns.

" It is hereby ordered that all employees of the Post Office Department and the postal service shall govern themselves accordingly."

" WASHINGTON, D. C., March 30, 1908.

" Order No. 1221.

" The attention of all officers and employees of the Post Office Department and Postal Service is directed to the following letter addressed to the President by the Civil Service Commission:

" UNITED STATES CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

" WASHINGTON, D. C., March 25, 1908.

" THE PRESIDENT:

" The Commission in recommending punishments for violations of Subdivision 1 of Civil Service Rule I has heretofore been guided by the fact that the rule was one only adopted in June, 1907; and that while the President's instructions prohibiting political activity on the part of competitive classified employees have been public ever since 1902, yet in actual practice the effective and thorough enforcement of the President's instructions in this connection has only dated from the adoption of the rule in June last, which gave the Civil Service Commission the right to investigate and report on charges of improper political activity on the part of those in the competitive classified service. For this reason the Commission has heretofore been lenient in recommending punishments. But a sufficient time has now elapsed for us to assume that the Civil Service Rules are understood thruout the service, and we believe therefore that the time has also come for a somewhat greater degree of severity for the penalty inflicted, at least in aggravated cases. We recommend therefore that the several Departments be requested to publish to their employees in the competitive classified service the fact that any man violating the provisions of the rule in question renders himself liable to punishment by removal. We desire that the subordinates in the several Departments be acquainted with this recommendation so that in the event of any misconduct by them in the future, the Commission may feel at liberty to recommend their removal.

In view of the violations of the civil service law which have occurred in connection with political campaigns in the past, the Civil Service Commission has furnished the following memorandum, which is published for the information and guidance of officers and employees of the Post Office Department and the postal service:

WARNING AGAINST POLITICAL ASSESSMENTS AND PARTISAN ACTIVITY OF OFFICE-HOLDERS.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY.

ACTIVITY OF COMPETITIVE EMPLOYEES AND LABORERS FORBIDDEN.

On May 14, 1908, the Navy Department issued the following circular letter to commandants of navy-yards and naval stations:

Laborers and mechanics at the yard or station under your command will be subject to discharge for political activity in the same manner as competitive classified employees.

Similar instructions have been issued by other Departments placing the same limitations in regard to political activity on laborers in the unclassified service as are applied to competitive employees.

The following forms of activity have been held to be forbidden by this provision: Service on political committees; service as delegates to county, State, or district conventions of a political party, although it was understood that the employees were not "to take or use any political activity in going to these conventions, or otherwise violate the civil-service rules;" continued political activity and leadership; the publication of a newspaper in the interests of a political party; holding office in a club which takes active part in political campaigns and management; the circulation of petitions having a political object; service as a commissioner of election in a community where it was notorious that a commissioner of election must be an active politician; accepting nomination for a political office with intention of resigning from the competitive service if elected; recommendation by clerks and carriers of a person to be postmaster; activity in local-option campaigns; service as inspector of election.

POLITICAL COERCION.

The civil-service act contains the following provisions:

"* * * no person in the public service is for that reason under any obligations to contribute to any political fund, or to render any political service, and * * * he will not be removed or otherwise prejudiced for refusing to do so." (Sec. 2, clause 2, par. 5.)

"* * * no person in said service has any right to use his official authority or influence to coerce the political action of any person or body." (Sec. 2, clause 2, par. 6.)

POLITICAL ASSESSMENTS.

The following are provisions of the civil-service act:

OFFICIALS NOT TO SOLICIT OR RECEIVE POLITICAL ASSESSMENTS FROM OTHER OFFICIALS.

* * * no Senator, or Representative, or Territorial Delegate of the Congress, or Senator, Representative, or Delegate elect, or any officer of employee of either of said Houses, and no executive, judicial, military, or naval officer of the United States, and no clerk or employee of any department, branch, or bureau of the executive, judicial, or military or naval service of the United States, shall, directly or indirectly, solicit or receive, or be in any manner concerned in soliciting or receiving, any assessment, subscription, or contribution for any political purpose whatever from any officer, clerk, or employee of the United States, or any department, branch, or bureau thereof, or from any person receiving any salary or compensation from moneys derived from the Treasury of the United States. (Sec. 11.)

DISCRIMINATION NOT TO BE MADE ON ACCOUNT OF POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS.

* * * no officer or employee of the United States mentioned in this act shall discharge, or promote, or degrade, or in any manner change the official rank or compensation of any other officer or employee, or promise or threaten so to do, for giving or withholding or neglecting to make any contribution of money or other valuable thing for any political purpose. (Sec. 13.)

OFFICIALS NOT TO CONTRIBUTE TO OTHER OFFICIALS FOR POLITICAL OBJECTS.

* * * no officer, clerk, or other person in the service of the United States shall, directly or indirectly, give or hand over to any other officer, clerk, or person in the service of the United States, or to any Senator or Member of the House of Representatives, or Territorial Delegate any money or other valuable thing on account of or to be applied to the promotion of any political object whatever. (Sec. 14.)

SOLICITATION OR RECEIPT OF POLITICAL ASSESSMENTS IN PUBLIC BUILDINGS PROHIBITED.

* * * no person shall, in any room or building occupied in the discharge of official duties by any officer or employee of the United States mentioned in this act, or in any navy-yard, fort, or arsenal, solicit in any manner whatever, or receive, any contribution of money or any other thing of value for any political purpose whatever. (Sec. 12.)

MISDEMEANOR TO VIOLATE THE FOUR FOREGOING SECTIONS.

* * * any person who shall be guilty of violating any provision of the four foregoing sections shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years, or by such fine and imprisonment both, in the discretion of the court. (Sec. 15.)

SOLICITATION BY LETTER.

In the case of *U. S. v. Edward S. Thayer*, the Supreme Court, on March 9, 1908, held that solicitation by letter or circular addressed and delivered by mail or otherwise to an officer or employee of the United States at the office or building in which he is employed in the discharge of his official duties is a solicitation "in a room or building," etc., within the meaning of section 12 of the civil-service act, the solicitation taking place where the letter was received.

AUTHORITY OF THE COMMISSION.

It is the duty of the Commission to see that the provisions of the civil-service act and rules are strictly enforced, and it will employ every legitimate and available means to secure the prosecution and punishment of persons who may violate them. The Commission requests any person having knowledge of any such violation to lay the facts before it that it may at once take action thereupon.

8 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON POLITICAL ACTIVITY IN FEDERAL SERVICE.

The following statement indicates what the Commission believes to be its jurisdictional limitations in regard to cases of improper political activity:

First, and broadly, the Commission has authority to investigate (a) all acts of alleged improper political activity contrary to the statute of January 16, 1883, and the rules thereunder, such acts embracing, among others, those of any improper political activity upon the part of all competitive classified employees of the United States, and unclassified laborers; (b) violation of the statute in any particular, as, for instance, the provision that no person in the service of the Government shall solicit or receive political contributions in any room or building occupied by any officer or employee of the United States in the discharge of official duties; and the provision against political coercion.

Second, the Commission, upon direction of the President, investigates any other cases of alleged improper political activity, reporting to him the results of such investigations, but having no power to enforce its conclusions, that resting with the President.

Third, cases of alleged improper political activity upon the part of employees (other than unclassified laborers) outside of the competitive classified service but within the Departmental or Executive civil service, as declared by Executive orders, are properly subject to the consideration of the President or the heads of Departments, independent offices, and commissions under which they serve.

The foregoing indicates the main distinction between the cases in which the Commission has jurisdiction and those in which it has not.

The Commission does not define nor describe the wrongdoing; that is done by the statutes and by competent authority.

This notice shall be printed and posted conspicuously in all the offices of this Department, in classified post offices and in offices of the division superintendents of Railway Mail Service; and, for the information of officers and employees at post offices that are not classified, it shall be published in the Daily Bulletin and in the Postal Guide.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE SUBJECT OF POLITICAL ACTIVITY IN THE FEDERAL SERVICE.

On June 13, 1902, referring to a previous Executive order issued by President Cleveland on July 14, 1886, President Roosevelt addressed the Civil Service Commission as follows:

"GENTLEMEN: As the greater includes the less, and as the Executive order of President Cleveland of July 14, 1886, is still in force, I hardly think it will be necessary again to change the postal regulations.

"The trouble, of course, comes in the interpretation of this Executive order of President Cleveland. After sixteen years' experience it has been found impossible to formulate in precise language any general construction which shall not work either absurdity or injustice. Each case must be decided on its merits. For instance, it is obviously unwise to apply the same rule to the head of a big city Federal office, who may by his actions coerce hundreds of employees, as to a fourth-class postmaster in a small village who has no employees to coerce, and who simply wishes to continue to act with reference to his neighbors as he always has acted.

"As Civil Service Commissioner under Presidents Harrison and Cleveland I found it so impossible satisfactorily to formulate and decide upon questions involved in these matters of so-called pernicious activity by officeholders in politics that in the Eleventh Report of the Commission I personally drew up the paragraph which you quote. This paragraph was drawn with a view of making a sharp line between the activity allowed to public servants within the classified service and those without the classified service. The latter under our system are as a rule chosen largely with reference to political considerations, and as a rule are and expect to be changed with the change of parties. In the classified service, however, the choice is made without reference to political considerations and the tenure of office is unaffected by the change of parties. Under these circumstances it is obvious that different standpoints of conduct apply to the two cases. *In consideration of fixity of tenure and of appointment in no way due to political considerations, the man in the classified service, while retaining his right to vote as he pleases and to express privately his opinions on all political subjects, should not take any active part in political management or in political campaigns, for precisely the same reasons that a judge, an army officer, a regular soldier, or a policeman is debarred from taking such active part.* This of course applies even more strongly to any conduct on the part of such employee so prejudicial to good discipline as is implied in a public attack on his or her superior officers or other conduct liable to cause scandal.

"It seemed to me at the time, and I still think, that the line thus drawn was wise and proper. After my experience under two Presidents—one of my own political faith and one not—I had become convinced that it was undesirable and impossible to lay down a rule for public officers not in the classified service which should limit their political activity as strictly as we could rightly and properly limit the activity of those in whose choice and retention the element of political considerations did not enter; and afterwards I became convinced that in its actual construction, if there was any pretense of applying it impartially, it inevitably worked unevenly, and as a matter of fact, inevitably produced an impression of hypocrisy in those who asserted that it worked evenly. *Officeholders must not use their offices to control political movements, must not neglect their public duties, must not cause public scandal by their activity; but outside of the classified service the effort to go further than this had failed so signally at the time when the Eleventh Report, which you have quoted, was written, and its un wisdom had been so thoroughly demonstrated, that I felt it necessary to try to draw the distinction therein indicated.*

"Sincerely, yours,

THEODORE ROOSEVELT."

The Postmaster General, on October 1, 1902, issued the following instructions to the officers and employees of the Post Office Department:

"As to political activity, a sharp line is drawn between those in the classified and those in the unclassified service. Postmasters or others holding unclassified positions are merely prohibited from using their offices to control political movements, from neglecting their duties, and from causing public scandal by political activity.

"A person in the classified service has an entire right to vote as he pleases, and to express privately his opinions on all political subjects, but he should take no active part in political management or in political campaigns."

The Attorney General, in a letter dated November 22, 1901, addressed to all officers and employees of the Department of Justice, said:

"The spirit of the civil service law and rules renders it highly undesirable for Federal officers and employees to take an active part in political conventions or in the direction of other parts of political machinery. Persons in the Government service under this Department should not act as chairmen of political organizations, nor make themselves unduly prominent in local political matters. It is expected and required that all officers and employees of this Department shall act in entire conformity with the views herein set forth."

PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FOR GERMANY.

Order No. 1587½.

JULY 18, 1908.

1. The Postmaster General's orders No. 529, dated June 12, 1903, reducing the weight of a parcel-post package for Germany to 2 kilograms, and No. 1132, dated Oct. 6, 1904, restricting the value of a parcel to \$50, are hereby rescinded.

2. On and after August 1, 1908, parcel-post packages for and from Germany may weigh not to exceed 5 kilograms or 11 pounds, without regard to the value of the contents.

PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FOR CHILE OR ECUADOR.

Order No. 1622.

JULY 31, 1908.

The Postal Administrations of Chile and Ecuador having concurred therein:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That commencing on the 1st day of August, 1908, the postage rate applicable to parcel-post packages mailed in the United States, addressed for delivery at any place in Chile, or Ecuador, shall be twelve (12) cents a pound or fraction of a pound, instead of twenty (20) cents a pound as heretofore.

PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FOR GREAT BRITAIN.

Order No. 1642.

AUGUST 11, 1908.

The Postal administration of Great Britain having concurred therein:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That commencing on the 15th day of August, 1908, there shall be admitted to the parcel-post mails exchanged between the United States and Great Britain, parcels without regard to the value of the contents, which do not exceed eleven (11) pounds, or five (5) kilograms, in weight, nor measure more than three feet six inches in length, and six feet in length and girth combined.

The postage rate applicable in the United States to parcels for Great Britain is 12 cents a pound or fraction of a pound; and in Great Britain, to parcels for the United States:—
 For a parcel weighing not more than 3 pounds—1 shilling, 6 pence.
 For a parcel weighing between 3 pounds and 7 pounds—2 shillings, 6 pence.
 For a parcel weighing between 7 pounds and 9 pounds—3 shillings, 6 pence.
 For a parcel weighing between 9 pounds and 11 pounds—4 shillings, 6 pence.

PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FOR ITALY.

AUGUST 21, 1908.

The postage rate applicable to parcel-post packages for Italy is twelve (12) cents a pound or fraction of a pound.

The typographical error in the table on page 134 of the Postal Guide for July, 1908, which makes the rate eleven (11) cents for the first pound and twelve (12) cents for each additional pound, should be corrected accordingly.

PARCEL-POST CONVENTION WITH FRANCE.

AUGUST 4, 1908.

Referring to Order No. 1575, dated July 14, 1908, relative to the Parcel-Post Convention with France to take effect on the 15th instant, postal officials are informed: B

1. A bill or invoice may be included in a parcel.
2. Confections and pastes are not prohibited.
3. No limit of value is prescribed for the contents of a parcel.
4. Two copies of the Customs Declaration must accompany each parcel; each copy must indicate the gross weight of the parcel and the net weight of its contents.

The Postal Administration of Great Britain having concurred therein:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That commencing on the 1st day of October, 1908, the postage rate applicable to letters mailed in the United States, addressed for delivery at any place in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be two (2) cents an ounce or fraction of an ounce.

Letters unpaid or short-paid shall be dispatched to destination, but double the deficient postage, calculated at said rate, shall be collectible of the addressees upon the delivery of the unpaid or short-paid letters.

POSTAGE RATES ON LETTERS FROM GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND TO THE UNITED STATES.

AUGUST 24, 1908.

Referring to the Postmaster General's Order No. 1667 of the 21st instant, notice is hereby given that, commencing on the 1st of October, 1908, the rate of postage applicable to letters mailed in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, addressed for delivery in the United States, will be one penny for each ounce or fraction thereof. Unpaid or short-paid letters will be liable on delivery to a charge equal to double the amount of the deficient postage, calculated at the rate above named.

The item "Great Britain" in the table on pages 130-133 of the Postal Guide for July, 1908, should be modified in accordance with the foregoing.

in a letter addressed to the First Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Salaries and Allowances. The statement of such sales will be itemized by the postmaster as to dates, amounts of purchases, and business addresses of the purchasers, and must bear the following form of certificate:

"I hereby certify on my oath of office that the foregoing is a true and correct statement, and that to the best of my knowledge and belief it shows all the stamp supplies sold at this office for use elsewhere."

If postmasters and postal employees will address the various divisions of the Department in charge of the particular subjects under discussion, business will be expedited.

Attention is respectfully invited in this connection to page 6, July, 1908, Postal Guide, giving instructions relative to "Correspondence with the Department," also to page 7, in regard to "Communications for the Auditor's Office."

MONEY ORDER CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT ISSUED IN DUPLICATE.

The attention of postmasters at money order offices is called to Postmaster-General's Order No. 1373, dated May 13, 1908, (published in June Guide), amending Section 1119 of the Postal Laws and Regulations, and effective July 1, 1908.

The change was made in order to save time and labor in the office of the Auditor for this Department, and imposes little or no extra work on either depository or remitting postmasters. Carbon paper should be used by depository postmasters in issuing the certificates after the manner in which such paper is used in the issue of postal money orders.

The Postmaster - General's Order contains all necessary instructions governing the action to be taken by remitting postmasters, *who must carefully read and closely follow the directions which are printed on the new certificates.*

Certificates of Deposit should in each case be taken up in the statement corresponding to the date of the certificate.

The Auditor for this Department reports that in many instances remitting postmasters have failed to comply with the terms of the Postmaster-General's Order, and that in consequence serious delay has been experienced in the auditing of accounts. Further dereliction of duty on the part of postmasters in this respect will not be tolerated.
