The following orders were issued from the office of the Postmaster General — Frank H. Hitchcock, Postmaster General:

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

PENSION VOUCHERS.

Order No. 3351.

AUGUST 12, 1910.

ORDERED, That section 281 of the Postal Laws and Regulations be, and it hereby is, amended. Strike out the entire section and substitute the following:

Section 281. Fourth-class postmasters of the United States are hereby required, empowered, and authorized to administer any and all oaths required to be made by pensioners and their witnesses in the execution of their vouchers, with like effect and force as officers having a seal, and such postmaster shall affix the stamp of his office to his signature to such vouchers, and he is authorized to charge and receive for each voucher not exceeding twenty-five cents, to be paid by the pensioner.

2. * * * Hereafter, in addition to the officers now authorized to administer oaths in such cases, rural free-delivery carriers of the United States are hereby required, empowered, and authorized to administer any and all oaths required to be made by pensioners and their witnesses in the execution of their vouchers, with like effect and force as officers having a seal, and they are authorized to charge and receive for each voucher not exceeding twenty-five cents, to be paid by the pensioner.

3. A pensioner within the meaning of said acts and as referred to throughout this section may be any person to whom pension is due and payable from the United States and who is required to execute and present a voucher for the payment thereof to a United States pension agent, whether such person be in fact a pensioner, or the wife of a pensioner, or the guardian of a pensioner or of his wife or minor children, or a payee of pension as reimbursement on account of expenses of last sickness and burial of a pensioner. The term "voucher" applies not only to the form commonly so designated, but to any and all sworn statements required by a pension agent in connection with such form, such as depositions of two witnesses, oaths of identity, affidavits of inability to surrender pension certificates, etc. These and any other papers required by a pension agent for the purpose of payment of pension collectively constitute the voucher proper in the agent's accounts and are transmissible under cover of the penalty envelope provided for the purpose. A witness for a pensioner within the meaning of said acts may be any person who is called upon to subscribe under oath to a statement in the voucher form, or in any paper attached thereto or to be used in connection therewith. A person whose signature is called for merely as an attesting witness to the signature of another person is not required to be put under oath.

4. A postmaster or rural letter carrier may demand and receive but one fee for each voucher as prescribed by the acts, whether the voucher should include one or several papers or involve the administration of an oath to one or several persons, but he is entitled to the fee if called upon to authenticate any one of the papers necessary to complete a voucher where the others are required to be or have been executed elsewhere; and he can not refuse to authenticate a voucher or any paper necessary to its completion if the lawful fee be tendered. The acts do not empower postmasters or rural letter carriers to administer oaths in any other matters relating to pensions, within the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Pensions or any other Federal officer, such as declarations or affidavits in claims for pension, application for duplicates of lost pension certificates, or checks, or for payment of unindorsed checks in the cases of deceased pensioners, etc.

5. No report of the money received by postmasters or rural letter carriers as fees for authenticating pension vouchers need be made to the Department.

6. Any one may be sworn by requiring him or her to hold up his or her right hand. Persons having religious scruples against taking an oath may affirm. No particular set of words need be employed in administering the oath or taking the affirmation. It will be sufficient, in substance, to charge the persons swearing or affirming: "You do solemnly swear (or affirm) that the statements contained in the vouchers signed by you are to your knowledge true." But neither the oath nor affirmation should be administered or taken unless there shall have been strict compliance with the following regulations of the Department of the Interior governing the execution of pension vouchers:

7. In all cases where the voucher form calls for statements of possession and exhibition of the pension certificate, it must be exhibited to the postmaster or rural letter carrier at the execution of each and every voucher for the payment of any pension, and such exhibition of the certificate shall be primary evidence of the pensioner's identity. When the certificate is lost or cannot for any other reason be exhibited, the voucher may be executed only upon the exhibition to the postmaster or rural letter carrier of a permit duly issued by the Commissioner of Pensions, and, in such event, the postmaster or rural letter carrier must be careful to cancel the words stating possession and exhibition of the pension certificate in the pensioner's statement and in the jurat, and such permit must be securely attached to the voucher.

8. When the pensioner's signature to the sworn statement in the voucher is by mark or is illegibly written, it must be attested by two witnesses who write. If the name can not be deciphered from the written signature, letter for letter as given in the head of the voucher, it

should be regarded as illegible. And in cases where two deposing witnesses are required to appear the signature by mark of either or both witnesses must be attested by a third person who writes and who is neither the pensioner nor the officiating officer. The pensioner's signature at the bottom of the voucher does not need to be attested in any case. In sworn statements attached to the voucher form or to accompany the same, signatures by mark only need to be attested.

9. A fourth-class postmaster or rural letter carrier can not authenticate his own vouchers or appear as a deposing witness in a voucher executed before him, not being competent to administer an oath to himself.

10. Postmasters should add after their names, when signed to vouchers, the words "Fourth-class Postmasters."

Rural letter carriers will attach their signatures to vouchers written in the same manner as signed to their official bonds, adding thereafter the words "Rural Carrier No. —," the name of the post office and the State.

11. Neither acting postmasters, assistant postmasters, temporary nor substitute rural letter carriers are qualified by the acts of August 23, 1894, and June 25, 1910, to authenticate pension vouchers. Vouchers authenticated by any such officials will not be accepted by the United States pension agents.

12. After the execution of vouchers, rural letter carriers will take them to the post office, together with the official penalty envelopes in which they are to be transmitted to pension agents, and imprint on the vouchers in the space marked "(L. S.)", and above the line indicated, the postmarking stamp of the post office. The postmarking stamp must not be placed on a voucher before its execution and must not show a prior date to that indicated in the jurat or certificate. After postmarking stamp has been affixed the voucher should be inclosed in the penalty envelope furnished for the purpose and mailed to the pension agent.

13. Information has been received from the Commissioner of Pensions that in some cases the impressions made by the postmarking stamps on pension vouchers are indistinct, illegible, and otherwise unsatisfactory, which necessitates the return of the vouchers for proper authentication, thus causing delay in their payment and reflecting upon the service. Postmasters and rural letter carriers will be held responsible for carelessness in this respect, and they are informed that the postmarking stamp plainly impressed, showing the date, name of the post office and State, must in every case appear thereon.

14. To authenticate a voucher prior to the fourth day of the last month of the quarter for which the pension is payable, and postdate the jurat or certificate to make it appear that the voucher was executed on the fourth day of the last month of the quarter for which the pension is payable; or to authenticate a voucher without the pensioner being present and duly sworn, or in the absence of witnesses where witnesses are required; or to wilfully aid or assist in the making, or in anywise procure the making or presentation of any false or fraudulent affidavit, declaration, certificate, voucher, or paper, or writing concerning any claim for pension, renders the offender liable to a fine not exceeding \$500, or to imprisonment for a term of not more than three years. (See R. S. 4746, as amended 1898, July 7, ch. 578, 2 Supp. R. S., 886.)

15. As many postmasters authenticate pension vouchers without using a postmarking stamp, they are hereby informed that such vouchers will not be accepted by the pension agent. Postmasters not having postmarking stamps must make immediate application to the Post Office Department, Division of Supplies, therefor.

16. Inquiries concerning the execution of pension vouchers should be addressed to the Commissioner of Pensions, Washington, D. C.

ROTARY REGISTRY MAIL LOCKS.

AUGUST 18, 1910.

Order No. 3375.

Modify section 1372, Postal Laws and Regulations, edition of 1902, so as to read as follows:

"Postmasters and transfer clerks must not keep more rotary registry mail locks on hand than required for the proper transaction of registry business, but must promptly forward the same by mail, duly registered, to their respective mail bag and lock depositories. Defective rotary registry locks are, as heretofore, to be forwarded by registered mail to the Second Assistant Postmaster General (Division of Equipment)."

PROTECTION TO OWNERS OF PATENTS.

AUGUST 16, 1910.

Order No. 3373.

The following Act of Congress, approved June 25, 1910, is hereby promulgated for the information of officers and employees of the Post Office Department and Postal Service:

AN ACT to provide additional protection for owners of patents of the United States, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That whenever an invention described in and covered by a patent of the United States shall hereafter be used by the United States without license of the owner thereof

or lawful right to use the same, such owner may recover reasonable compensation for such use by suit in the Court of Claims: *Provided, however,* That said Court of Claims shall not entertain a suit or reward compensation under the provisions of this Act where the claim for compensation is based on the use by the United States of any article heretofore owned, leased, used by, or in the possession of the United States: *Provided, further,* That in any such suit the United States may avail itself of any and all defenses, general or special, which might be pleaded by a defendant in an action for infringement, as set forth in Title Sixty of the Revised Statutes, or otherwise: *And provided further,* That the benefits of this Act shall not inure to any patentee who, when he makes such claim, is in the employment or service of the Government of the United States, or the assignee of any such patentee: nor shall this Act apply to any device discovered or invented by such employee during the time of his employment or service.

BACKSTAMPING IN ALASKA.

AUGUST 15, 1910.

Order No. 3371.

The Department's attention having been directed to the fact that patrons of Alaskan offices, who often come from considerable distances to meet the relatively infrequent and heavy mails, are subjected to long delays in the receipt of their letters through the practice of backstamping, the operation of section 611 of the Postal Laws and Regulations, so far as it applies to ordinary mail received at Alaskan post offices is hereby suspended.

The following orders and notices were issued from the bureau of the Second Assistant Postmaster General — Joseph Stewart, Second Assistant:

PARCEL-POST.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH JOINT CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.

JULY 28, 1910.

The Secretary of the Treasury has advised this Department as follows:

"This Department is in receipt of a communication from the Auditor for the Treasury Department calling attention to the fact that many postmasters, a number of them in the larger cities, fail to state on the Label Form B, authorized by the Joint Regulations of the Treasury and Post Office Departments, either the location of the customs officer to whom the package has been sent or the name of the office of delivery, and also that it frequently occurs that the said postmasters fail to submit packages to customs officers before delivery to the addressees. These errors cause a great deal of correspondence and in a number of instances have resulted in loss of revenue."

Referring to the "Joint Regulations," printed on pages 5-14 of the Postal Guide for March, 1907, postmasters are instructed to see to it that the irregular practice brought to notice is discontinued, and that all of the stipulations of said regulations are strictly complied with at their offices.

AUGUST 11, 1910.

The Postal Administration of Mexico has advised this Department that, commencing on the 1st of September, 1910, parcels weighing up to eleven (11) pounds (5 kilograms) may be sent to the Mexican post offices of —

Olnala.....	State of Guerrero
Cuitzeo del Porvenir.....	State of Michoacan

Consequently, parcel post packages weighing not more than eleven pounds may be accepted for mailing on and after the date named to the Mexican post offices above mentioned, as well as to the Mexican post offices named on pages 225-228 of the United States Official Postal Guide for July, 1910.

SPECIALY ADDRESSED ARTICLES MUST BE DISPATCHED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SPECIAL ADDRESSES.

AUGUST 3, 1910.

It has come to the notice of this office that all articles for Australasia specially addressed for dispatch via Vancouver, British Columbia, and all articles for other foreign destinations specially addressed to be dispatched via a certain route or by a certain steamer indicated in the special addresses are not dispatched in accordance with such special addresses. Postmasters and all other postal officials concerned are directed to observe proper care in complying with such special indications, as required by paragraph 15 of Section 693, Postal Laws and Regulations.

MAIL EQUIPMENT.

AUGUST 17, 1910.

Sub-paragraphs "d" and "h" of the article entitled "Mail Equipment," printed on page 18 of the Official Postal Guide for July, 1910, are hereby modified so as to read as follows:

(d) From post offices in Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana (with the exceptions noted in sub-paragraph "b") to the transfer clerk, Railway Mail Service, at Atlanta, Ga.

(h) From post offices in Missouri, Arkansas, Texas (with the exceptions noted in sub-paragraph "b"), Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, and from post offices in the following counties in California: Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, and Imperial, to the postmaster at Saint Louis, Mo.

The following notices and instructions were issued from the bureau of the Third Assistant Postmaster General — A. L. Lawsha, Third Assistant.

POSTAL CARDS IN PACKAGES OF 50.

AUGUST 25, 1910.

Postmasters are notified that the No. 4 1c postal cards will be issued in *packages of 50* instead of 25 cards each when the supply of 25-card packages is exhausted. The attention of purchasers should be specially directed to that fact when full packages of 50 cards are sold.

MONEY ORDER SYSTEM.

MONEY ORDERS ISSUED IN THE UNITED STATES FOR PAYMENT IN THE CANAL ZONE.

AUGUST 18, 1910.

Postmasters are cautioned in drawing money orders for payment in the Canal Zone not to add the word "Panama" after Canal Zone. The office and the Zone only should be given. For example, "Ancon, Canal Zone," "Culebra, Canal Zone," etc. Panama is a republic, and has no political connection with the Canal Zone.

DIRECT EXCHANGE OF MONEY ORDERS WITH THE REPUBLIC OF URUGUAY, SOUTH AMERICA, IN EFFECT OCTOBER 1, 1910.

AUGUST 25, 1910.

On October 1, 1910, a convention for the direct exchange of money orders between the United States and the Republic of Uruguay, South America, will go into effect, and will be operated in a manner similar to that with Bolivia, Chili, and Peru.

Money orders intended for payment in Uruguay are to be drawn on the regular international form and the amounts are to be expressed in United States money.

No paying office is to be designated in the orders, but the payee's precise address must be entered in each case in the advice. See models of Austrian orders printed on page 12 of the International List, Edition of 1908.

The fees to be collected for money orders drawn on Uruguay are those printed in Table 2, page 4 of the Register of Money Order Post Offices in the United States, in operation July 1, 1910, and on page 24 of the United States Official Postal Guide for July, 1910.

The advices issued in this country must be sent to the exchange office at New York, N. Y., for certification. They will there be listed, and the lists dispatched to Montevideo, which is the exchange office for Uruguay. That office will convert the amounts of orders entered in the lists into Uruguayan currency at the rate of exchange prevailing there on the day of the arrival of the lists; draw reissued orders in favor of the payees named in the lists for the amounts payable in Uruguayan money; dispatch such reissued orders to their proper destination, and provide for their payment.

The amounts deposited by remitters in Uruguay for money orders payable in the United States will be converted into United States money by the exchange office at Montevideo at the rate prevailing on the day of the receipt there of the corresponding advice. That office will prepare and send to the exchange office at New York, N. Y., a descriptive list of money orders issued in Uruguay on the United States, and from such lists the New York exchange office will draw and dispatch reissued orders and advices.

Money orders issued in either country will remain valid for twelve months from the last day of the month of issue. At the expiration of that period, postmasters should send to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders (not to the Auditor), all advices of money orders originating in Uruguay which have not been paid during the period of their validity.

REGISTRY SYSTEM.

DISCONTINUANCE OF ALL TEMPORARY HOLIDAY EXCHANGES AND DISPATCHES OF REGISTERED MAIL.

AUGUST 24, 1910.

Because of the additional facilities afforded for the dispatch of registered mail by the extension of the authorization for not-regular dispatches of inner registered sacks to all post offices, railway post office trains, terminal railway post offices, branch post offices and stations which are now or hereafter may be supplied with rotary-lock keys, published on page 14 of the August, 1910, Postal Guide, all authorizations for temporary holiday exchanges and dispatches of registered mail in through registered pouches or inner registered sacks, whether R. P. O. or ordinary, are hereby revoked; and those temporary holiday exchanges and dispatches are not to be resumed hereafter in any case without specific instructions from this office, which will be issued only in special cases where the necessity therefor is clearly shown.

It is the intention of the Department that postmasters and railway postal clerks shall avail themselves of the facilities for not-regular dispatches of inner registered sacks so fully that there will be no need for any temporary holiday exchanges or dispatches in the future; and all postmasters and others concerned will govern themselves accordingly.

The following instructions were issued from the bureau of the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General —

RURAL LETTER CARRIERS AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE PENSION VOUCHERS.

By provision contained in the Pension Appropriation Act, approved June 25, 1910, rural letter carriers (but not substitute or temporary rural letter carriers), are authorized to execute vouchers for United States pensioners.

The attention of postmasters at rural delivery offices and rural letter carriers is called to Order No. 3351, August 12, 1910, appearing on page 5 of this Supplement, which amends Section 281 of the Postal Laws and Regulations, 1902, pertaining to the execution of pension vouchers by fourth-class postmasters and rural letter carriers.

Postmasters will see that these instructions are accessible to rural carriers.

YEAR TYPE (1911) FOR POSTMARKING AND RATING STAMPS.

Postmasters at all post offices are notified that 1911 year type for postmarking, receiving, money order, registry and other dating stamps will be furnished on requisition after September 1, 1910. Form 1567 must be used for this purpose, and an impression shown of each style in use at the time of making requisition, using the 1910 type for this purpose; also state how many of each kind will be required.

Annual Registration Report

Important to all Postmasters

Many postmasters have not as yet rendered their annual report of registrations for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1910. A blank card, Form 3848, was sent to each postmaster for this purpose. Postmasters who have not received this form will promptly so advise the Third Assistant Postmaster General (Division of Registered Mails). Postmasters who have not rendered their annual registration report will please give the matter their prompt attention.

New Style Domestic Money Orders

New style domestic money-order forms have been furnished to postmasters upon requisitions made in usual course for additional supplies of blank orders since August 4, 1910. Such new style forms, therefore, without advice, will doubtless be in use at many offices before copies of this Guide are in the hands of postmasters.

Postmasters must understand, however, that domestic money order forms of the old style in their possession are to be issued to the public until the supply on hand in each case is exhausted, provided this does not occur subsequently to December 31, 1910, after which date orders of the new style only will be issued, and the stock of unused forms of the old style remaining in the hands of postmasters will be called in.

Postmasters at money-order offices have long since been furnished with the circular letter of instructions No. 6384, dated July 12, 1910, regarding processes of issue and payment of new style orders and the continued use of old style forms. It is not unlikely that in the issue of the new forms some errors of a kind not anticipated will be made, and that complications will arise requiring action by the Department. It is, however, requested that letters of inquiry with regard to new forms be not addressed to the Department until after the postmaster shall have carefully read the circular and shall have failed to find therein, or in the Postal Laws and Regulations, instructions covering the particular case as to which he is in doubt. In this connection, see also Register of Money Order Post Offices in operation July 1, 1910.

Postmasters issuing the new style forms must be careful not to separate the order from the coupon. The order, coupon and receipt must be handed together to the purchaser, who will detach the receipt form and mail the order and coupon to the payee.
