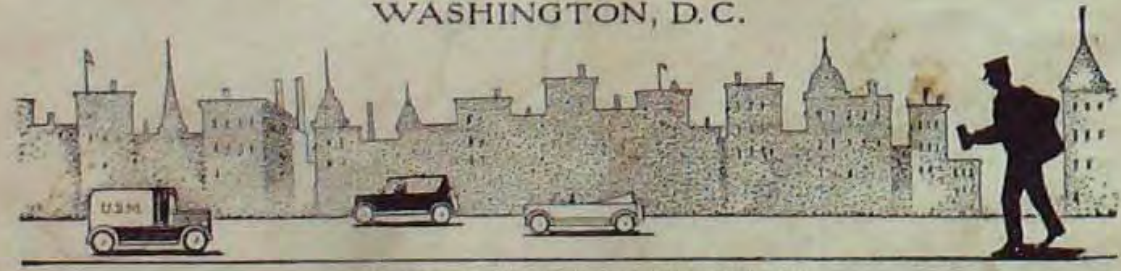

PREPARING FOR MAIL CHRISTMAS

OFFICE OF THE

To Postmasters:

The greatest task in the year in the Postal Service, is as you are aware, the problem of properly handling what is known as the Christmas mail. This has become increasingly important as the service increases in volume and as parcel post has taxed all our resources to handle.

The way to successfully cope with this extraordinary volume of mail, which in the ordinary course of events would center itself upon a few days just preceding Christmas, is to inaugurate a policy whereby this Christmas peak will be leveled down and extend over a longer period of time. It should begin to be felt by the middle of November at the latest, and should flow more evenly until Christmas.

This can only be accomplished by carefully laying your plans and particularly by interesting the mailing public in the problem. This means an active and strenuous campaign of publicity. Mailers have a tendency to delay until too late a date. They must be made to see that for the safe and expeditious handling of their own mail it is to their advantage to mail early. You will find the chambers of commerce, newspapers, theaters, picture houses, and practically all agencies for publicity ready to cooperate in this great undertaking if you but begin your campaign in season.

All work in post offices, including carrier service, shall be discontinued at 11 o'clock on Christmas morning, except such as is absolutely necessary for dispatching outgoing first-class mail and newspapers and receiving but not

working incoming mail. There will be no rural delivery service on that day.

This message is sent to you for the purpose of impressing upon you the importance of making your plans early and pursuing them vigorously to the end that Christmas mail may be handled to the satisfaction of all.

SALE OF TUBERCULOSIS SEALS IN POST OFFICE LOBBIES

During the Christmas holiday period the National Tuberculosis Association is engaged in the very meritorious work of selling tuberculosis seals.

The department is desirous of cooperating in this work to the very fullest extent, consistent with the performance of its own service, and to this end it gives its consent to the reasonable use of post-office lobbies subject to proper regulations on the part of postmasters, except at post offices located in Federal Buildings, which are under the jurisdiction of the Treasury Department.

MISTREATMENT OF MAIL

During the last few weeks the attention of the Post Office Department has been directed to a few cases in which postal employees have mistreated the mail sent out by the Literary Digest in its straw vote contest. The mistreatment complained of consisted generally in employees taking the straw ballots from undeliverable envelopes and voting the ballots themselves. The cases were not many in number. Inspectors were detailed to an examination of each and everyone of them and their reports have been received.

In addition to the offense of mistreating mail, it is found that the ballots were post cards bearing an unused 1 cent stamp, and under the regulations they should have been treated as undeliverable third-class mail and therefore destroyed. When the employee made use of these cards it was equivalent to using the mail without affixing postage.

The entire mistreatment was not only in violation of postal rules, but imposed an improper postage burden upon the service and can not be construed as other than a dishonest act toward the mailer. The offenses were pretty evenly distributed among the partisans of at least four of the candidates for the presidency. All the offenders have been disciplined and no favoritism has been shown. It is deemed wise to inform those in the service of this fact in order that they may understand that similar infractions of the regulations will not be lightly regarded nor permitted to go unpunished.

RECALL OF WANTED CIRCULARS ON AVIS AND BRENT GLASSCOCK

On or about September 30, 1924, "Wanted" circulars describing Avis and Brent (Claude) Glasscock, alias C. P. Reese et al., were forwarded to certain postmasters by the post-office inspector in charge at Chicago, Ill., to be posted in the lobbies of post offices. As both Avis and Brent Glasscock were apprehended at Battle Creek, Mich., and formally arrested on Octo-

ber 29, 1924, at Chicago, Ill., the circulars in question are no longer applicable and all postmasters having such notices posted should remove and destroy them. It is suggested also that postmasters notify police officers and others to whom the circulars may have been furnished.

SUSPENSION OF BUSINESS IN CERTAIN CASES

Numerous inquiries, telegraphic and otherwise, are being received daily by the department from postmasters relative to the observance of local or State holidays. In this connection attention is invited to Order No. 8187, published on page 24 of the November, 1922, Supplement to the Postal Guide under the heading "Suspension of business in certain cases." This November, 1922, Supplement should be on file in all post offices. However, I am quoting below for the information of all postmasters the order mentioned above:

"Whenever there is a total suspension of business in a State, city, or town, or whenever there is a substantial suspension of business so that the requirements and demands upon the Postal Service on the part of the patrons are very materially reduced, a postmaster may curtail and reduce the service of the office to an extent reasonably commensurate with such suspension of general business; provided always that the Postal Service at all places shall be adequate to meet the reasonable requirements of the public on such days. The release of employees from work resulting from such curtailment of the Postal Service on such days should be distributed as equitably as practical among them, because compensatory time may not be granted to those who of necessity can not be released from duty in such cases.

"This order is not intended as adopting or sanctioning the observance of State holidays, as such, because the department has no legal power to do that; but is intended rather to allow postmasters discretionary authority to reduce postal service to the extent of the public requirements on such days, and other days when general business is suspended.

"Postmasters should at all times carefully exercise their discretion as to the day on which the permission given in this order may reasonably apply, always considering the service needs of each particular office.

"A record should be kept of the extent of the curtailment of the service on all such days to the end that the department and the public may have such information available."

A close observance of this order will eliminate much unnecessary correspondence and expense on the part of postmasters and department.

In all cases where a postmaster is in doubt as to the extent to which service may be curtailed, he should bring

the matter to the attention of the department and request full information and instructions as to the observance of this order.

CHRISTMAS POSTERS AND PLACARDS

The supply of Christmas posters in colors, on white oilcloth, size 40 by 30 inches; Christmas mail placards, printed in red on cardboard, size 30 by 16½ inches; and small posters printed in red on white paper have been completely exhausted.

Postmasters should govern themselves accordingly and not make requests for additional posters or placards.

CHRISTMAS PLACARDS—MAIL EARLY

Cardboard placards urging upon postal patrons to shop and mail early for Christmas, etc., have been furnished all first and second class offices.

While it is realized that in some instances these placards will become so soiled or mutilated as not to permit future use, it is desired that they be so used as to avoid soiling and mutilation so far as possible, and that on December 24 they be collected and all that are fit for future use preserved for next year.

TIME CARDS ON STREET LETTER BOXES

It has been noted through observation in several cities throughout the country that there has been failure to keep street letter boxes supplied with legible time cards showing the hours at which collections are made therefrom. The regulations provide (sec. 699) that letter boxes shall be kept in repair and in neat condition. This includes the time cards. This regulation also provides that letter carriers should report to the postmaster any defacement of time cards observed from time to time, and at the end of each month should report on the general condition of letter boxes and time cards on their districts.

To be of any value at all time cards should be legible and should be in such condition as to reflect credit upon the service. It is directed that an immediate inspection of the street letter box equipment be made, with a view to taking such steps as may be necessary to put such equipment in first-class condition. If new time cards are necessary, requisition should be made on the Fourth Assistant, Division of Equipment and Supplies. In this connection attention is invited to the instructions of August 6, 1924, providing that time cards shall bear the signature of the postmaster.

APARTMENT HOUSE MAIL RECEPTACLES

Referring to the instructions of March 14, 1924, relative to making requisitions for inside letter box arrow locks to be used on apartment house mail receptacles, postmasters are informed that while only the new style arrow lock is now being manufactured by the mail equipment shops there are on hand and are being furnished some offices, where they are already in use, some old-style locks. The difference in the locks is that the old-style lock is in a brass case which projects beyond the under side of the lock. It is possible that in view of the difference in construction the old-style lock will not permit the master door to close fully. If such is the case, the matter should be taken up with the mail equipment shops with a view to securing the new-style locks for such apartment house mail receptacles.

Manufacturers have been instructed to modify the construction of the boxes so as to permit of the use of either style lock.

MANUFACTURERS OF APARTMENT HOUSE MAIL RECEPTACLES

The name of the Standard Electric Manufacturing Co., of 925 Wrightwood Avenue, Chicago, Ill., should be added to the list of manufacturers of apartment house mail receptacles published in the October Supplement, their design of receptacle having been recently approved by the department.

HAND STAMPING POST CARDS

The old maxim to the effect that there is nothing new under the sun, as applied to hand canceling of post cards, seems to have been shattered.

In the April, 1924, Supplement to the Postal Guide there appeared a notice under the heading "Hand stamping facilitated," suggesting the use of a piece of twine as an aid in canceling post cards. Another postmaster now submits a plan which appears very practicable and is as follows:

"Take a small clean blotter (3 by 9 inches), fold it up to the size of the length and width of your four fingers, dip blotter in clean water and fasten it to the palm side of the left hand with rubber bands. The blotter will absorb considerable water, thus keeping the side of the blotter next to the cards always moist, the surface of the blotter being so much greater than the surface of a damp thumb, used in the ordinary course of the handling of these cards,

that there is a slight suction created between the blotter and the card, thus making it unnecessary to bear down on the cards very hard, and with a little practice they will slip readily. If too much pressure is brought to bear against the cards portions of the blotter will be rubbed off and form little rolls. This is an indication that too much pressure is being used."

The postmaster submitting this suggestion says that he has tried the method outlined in the April Supplement under the heading "Hand-stamping facilitated," and that while he can make very good speed using the string method, he can make greater speed with the use of the wet blotter as outlined above.

The department will be pleased to hear of the results obtained through the use of this method of handstamping.

EXAMINE ALL EMPTY POUCHES AND SACKS

Notwithstanding repeated instructions concerning the careful examination of all empty equipment, mail continues to be found in supposedly empty pouches and sacks.

This fact is evidence of willful violation of instructions and gross neglect of duty, not only on the part of subordinate employees but of supervisors who permit such condition to continue. Therefore all postal employees are again directed to carefully examine all mail bags as they are emptied and are cautioned to exercise the utmost care to see that no mail matter of any character remains in any pouch or sack emptied. . . . Both pouches and sacks must be held upside down and carefully shaken, and then further examination made by running the hand over the bottom of the pouch or sack before it is finally discarded.

In this connection attention is invited to the notice appearing in the August supplement, under the caption "Mail left in pouches," to the effect that all *pouches* sent to mail-bag depositories and to the mail-equipment shop for repair shall be *turned inside out* when the pouches are made up for such dispatch.

Merely to shake the bags as they are emptied is not considered an examination under these instructions, but the mouth of the sacks must be held open so that the whole interior can be seen, and carefully examined, to insure that no mail is left therein.

As a further precaution, examination shall also be made of all sacks prior to their reuse, or before forwarding to

another office, depository, or the mail equipment shops.

At depository offices a thorough examination will be made of all empty equipment as soon as received and incident to sorting and sacking for storage or reissue to other offices or to publishers.

Postmasters will give this matter their close personal attention to the end that these instructions are rigidly followed in the future, and will hold responsible for any violation thereof the supervisors, as well as the employees, directly involved.

SIMILAR POST-OFFICE NAMES

The attention of the service is called to the importance of reading addresses carefully so as to avoid missending.

The following are examples of post-office names of such similarity as to be confusing, especially if carelessly written:

Rocky Face and Rocky Ford, Ga.

Thomson and Thomaston, Ga.

Le Roy, Luray, and Lucas, Kans.

Conneautsville and Connellsville, Pa.

The service will please exercise care in distinguishing between these names.

The Following Notices Were Issued from the Bureau of the Second Assistant Postmaster General

DIVISION OF FOREIGN MAILS

MISCELLANEOUS

PARCEL POST FOR SOVIET RUSSIA

A large number of notices have been received from Moscow calling upon this department to notify senders of parcel-post packages that the contents of the packages are subject to customs duty, the duties amounting to many times the sums placed on the customs declarations by the senders in this country. The dutiable articles, as a rule, consist of old clothes, shoes, and different articles of merchandise, including foodstuffs.

As some of the senders declared that the clothing mailed was valued at from \$10 to \$25 and the duty assessed on such was, in most cases, near \$100, and in some cases more than that amount, it is requested that postmasters furnish information of these facts to the senders of parcels to Russia, pointing out the possibility that on account of the customs duties the addressees may not be able to secure delivery of the parcels on arrival in Soviet Russia.

In expectation of the sending of a number of packages for delivery at Christmas and New Years, postmasters should give this announcement as much publicity as practicable so as to prevent parcels from being mailed to Soviet Russia at a subsequent loss to the senders of the postage concerned if the parcels are marked to be abandoned in case of nondelivery.

Parcels for Soviet Russia must be marked for alternative disposition in case of nondelivery, as required by section 205, on page 193 of the annual Postal Guide for 1924.

CHRISTIANIA, NORWAY, CHANGED TO OSLO

The name of the capital of Norway will be changed from Kristiania (Christiania) to Oslo on and after January 1, 1925.

Postmasters will give publicity to this change and observe that all sack labels and facing slips in their post offices are modified accordingly.

OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE OF CONSULATES EXCHANGED BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND SPAIN TO BE ACCEPTED FREE OF CHARGE FOR POSTAGE

Under the provisions of article 6 of the Pan American Principal Convention of Buenos Aires, freedom of postage is granted, effective immediately, to the official correspondence of the consulates of Spain in the United States when addressed for delivery in Spain or to a Pan American consulate in any other country which has ratified the convention in question. These countries are Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil,

Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico, Paraguay, El Salvador, and Uruguay.

Likewise, freedom of postage is granted by the postal administration of Spain to the official correspondence of the consulates of the United States in Spain when addressed for delivery in the United States or to a Pan American consulate in any of the countries named in the foregoing.

In order to secure the benefit of the above provision, the envelopes, labels, etc., of the correspondence must show over the words "Official correspondence," in the upper left-hand corner of the address side, the name and address of the consul or consulate, as well as the name of the country represented, while in the upper right-hand corner of the address side should appear the inscription "Consular Mail" over the word "Free." Correspondence when sent from Spain or to Spain must in addition be signed on the reverse side by the mailing consul.

DUTIABLE ARTICLES IN THE REGULAR (LETTER) MAILS TO MARTINIQUE

All articles containing dutiable matter in the regular (letter) mails to Martinique must bear a label showing the following notation:

To be submitted to the customs authorization of the Direction of the Customs, No. _____ of _____
 Nature of the merchandise _____
 Origin _____
 Weight _____ Value _____

The label must be green in color and not less than $2\frac{3}{8}$ by $1\frac{1}{8}$ inches.

It is necessary that the addressee obtain a permit for importation from the customs authorities in Martinique and furnish the sender with the number thereof for placing on the label.

The above modifies the notice issued by this office, dated October 10, under the caption "Dutiable articles in the regular (letter) mails to Martinique," and published on page 10 of the November, 1924, Postal Guide.

LIQUIDS IN THE MAILS TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES

The domestic regulations of the United States specify that articles containing liquids in quantities weighing more than 16 ounces must be forwarded outside of mail bags, and as articles excluded from the domestic mails are likewise excluded from transmission in the mails to foreign coun-

tries, it is necessary to prohibit the transmission of liquids in quantities weighing more than 16 ounces, as there is no provision for the transmission of articles to foreign countries outside of mail bags. It is to be understood that the liquid may be 16 ounces in weight, exclusive of the bottle or container. However, no parcel-post package may contain liquids in excess of 16 ounces.

Section 207, on page 233, of the annual Postal Guide for 1924, is modified as follows:

"(d) Add '(up to 16 ounces)' after the words 'It is permissible to accept liquids' in the first line of the second paragraph.

"(e) Change the words 'liquids and oils' in the first line to read 'liquids (including oils) up to 16 ounces.'"

NONPOSTAGE STAMPS ON MAILS FOR FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Attention is invited to section 39 on page 154 of the Postal Guide for July, 1924, from which it will be seen that "Christmas" stamps or other adhesive stamps or labels in aid of charitable objects, may be affixed to the back of all mail articles for foreign countries and not to the address side of the covers; and that unless the foregoing condition is complied with, articles bearing nonpostage stamps will not be dispatched from this country, but will be returned to the senders, if known; or sent to the Division of Dead Letters, if the sender is not known.

CUSTOMS DECLARATIONS MUST BE SECURELY ATTACHED TO PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FOR FOREIGN COUNTRIES

A considerable number of parcel-post packages for foreign countries continue to be received at dispatching exchange offices without any customs declarations affixed thereto or without the required number. This is due either to the failure of the declarations to be affixed to the parcels when mailed or to the circumstance that the declarations were insecurely affixed and became detached en route.

When the declarations accompany the parcels to the exchange offices, they are sometimes so loosely attached that it is necessary for employees at the exchange offices to further secure them in order to assure the declarations remaining affixed to the parcels during the remainder of their journey to destination.

In view of the approach of the holiday season, postmasters are directed to take prompt action to prevent the acceptance at their offices of parcel-post packages for abroad unless the customs declarations in the number required are securely fastened thereto by means of strong twine. By so doing dispatching exchange offices will be relieved of considerable additional work and the country of destination of the inconvenience resulting in the receipt of parcels without the necessary customs declarations affixed, while the parcels themselves will be expedited in handling and delivery.

PARCEL POST CHANGES

Czechoslovakia.—The weight limit applicable to parcel-post packages addressed for delivery in Czechoslovakia has been increased from 11 to 22 pounds, and acceptable parcels will be forwarded to the country mentioned when prepaid at the postage rate of 12 cents a pound or fraction of a pound, plus a transit charge of 10 cents per parcel up to a weight limit of 11 pounds, and 20 cents per parcel when weighing more than 11 pounds but not more than 22 pounds.

The above modifies the items "Czechoslovakia" appearing on pages 183 and 190 of the annual Postal Guide for 1924.

Great Britain and Northern Ireland.—Section 232 on page 235 of the annual Postal Guide for 1924, is modified by the addition of the following paragraph:

"Insured parcel post packages received from Great Britain and Northern Ireland, which are reforwarded through post offices in this country to a different addressee than originally indicated, or by return to origin, will be subject to additional postage and insurance fee equal to that originally paid, which amount will be collected by the delivering postmaster.

Siam.—Parcel-post packages for Siam will be subject to a transit charge of 20 cents per parcel regardless of weight, in addition to the postage rate of 12 cents a pound, or fraction of a pound, both the transit charge and postage rate to be prepaid by postage stamps affixed to the parcel at time of mailing.

The above modifies the item "Siam" appearing on pages 188 and 228 of the annual Postal Guide for 1924. Siam should be added to the list of transit rate countries between the items "Seychelles" and "Sierra Leone," on

page 192 of the above mentioned Guide.

The item "Siam" appearing on page 25 of the November supplement to the current annual Postal Guide should be modified in accordance with the above.

The Sarre Territory.—Unregistered parcel-post packages will be accepted for dispatch to the Sarre Territory up to a weight limit of 22 pounds when prepaid at the postage rate of 12 cents a pound or fraction of a pound, plus a transit charge of 12 cents for parcels weighing up to 2 pounds; 20 cents for parcels weighing more than 2 pounds but not more than 11 pounds; and 36 cents for parcels weighing more than 11 pounds but not more than 22 pounds.

The above modifies the item "Sarre Territory" appearing on page 192 of the annual Postal Guide for 1924, and on page 25 of the November supplement to the above-mentioned Guide.

PROHIBITIONS

Cuba.—Paragraph (c) under the item "Cuba" appearing on page 157 of the annual Postal Guide for 1924 should be modified to read as follows:

(c) Articles containing neo-salvarsan, salvarsan, arsenobenzol, sygmarsol, diarsenol, and luargol, as well as medicines of every nature invented to cure venereal diseases, can not be delivered to the addresses without previous authorization of the Secretary of Health and Charities.

Italy—Parcel post.—Arms or parts of arms, except by permission from a competent authority at office of destination; the border exchange offices notify the addressees of shipments and they must produce the necessary permit.

NEW COUNTERFEIT

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit \$10 Federal reserve note:

"On the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, Ohio; check letter D; face plate No. 149; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Jackson.

"This counterfeit is apparently printed from etched plates, on a single piece of paper, red and blue ink lines being used to imitate the silk fiber of

the genuine. The appearance of the face and head of the portrait of Jackson should determine the character of this bill at a glance. It is too white, lacking many of the fine lines of the genuine. The small letters in the titles of the Secretary of the Treasury and the Treasurer of the United States are very crudely and imperfectly made. The color of the seal is darker blue than the genuine. The number of the specimens at hand is D24251081A, and is the same on the several other bills discovered by the service."

DIVISION OF POSTAL SAVINGS

ERROR IN YEAR OF INTEREST DATE ON
POSTAL SAVINGS CERTIFICATES ISSUED
IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER

Postmasters and postal-savings clerks are particularly cautioned at this time to see that the "date when interest begins" on postal-savings certificates issued during the month of December, 1924, reads "January 1, 1925."

In years past many postmasters, at the close of business for the month of November, have changed their date stamp to show the month of January

but have failed to change the year, so that from the interest date on the certificate it would appear that almost a year's interest was due at the time of its issue. This has frequently been the cause of the payment of an excess amount of interest which was, of course, subsequently detected in the department, followed by a collection from the employee involved, and inconvenience and annoyance to the depositor concerned.

Particular care in this respect will be appreciated.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

CORRECTION TO BE MADE IN THE REGISTER OF MONEY-ORDER POST OFFICES

On page 1 of the 1924 edition of the Register of Money-Order Post Offices, the following sentence appears:

"Branch offices on which orders may be drawn and at which orders may be paid are given in alphabetical position in body of Register as well as in a separate list under main offices in this book."

To make the text conform to the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, postmasters are requested to strike out the words "*on which orders may be drawn and.*"

While money orders should not be drawn on branch offices, if so drawn, they should be paid and treated in all respects as if properly drawn on the main office.

WRONG OFFICE NUMBER ON MONEY-ORDER FORMS

It is reported that money-order forms supplies for use of the post offices named below and supposed to have been issued and paid, bore incorrect office numbers. Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful to avoid being misled by such error in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants or in answering inquiries regarding payment.

Tulsa, Okla. (station No. 5). Serial Nos. 1 to 400, inclusive, correct office number is 62326, and not 62310.

Wilmington, N. C. (C. O. D. station). Serial Nos. 1 to 10000, inclusive, correct office number is 75506, and not 75056.

JAPAN TO ACT AS INTERMEDIARY FOR THE CAROLINE ISLANDS, MARIANNE ISLANDS, AND THE MARSHALL ISLANDS

The Postal Administration of Japan reports that beginning November 19, 1924, it will act as intermediary for money orders payable in its mandated islands in the South Seas, i. e., the Caroline Islands, the Marianne Islands, and the Marshall Islands.

Postmasters will therefore draw as Japanese money orders payable in any one of these groups.

ERRORS IN APPLICATIONS FOR DUPLICATE INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDERS

Postmasters are requested to exercise greater care in completing Form 6753, when applying for a duplicate of an international money order.

The particulars of the order appearing in the advice should be copied correctly especially the international number stamped on the reverse side of the advice. In many instances the original and international numbers are transposed, causing delays in obtaining correct particulars before the duplicate can be issued.

Attention is also especially directed to Table 2, page 95, of the Postal Guide, in which the states comprising

the Commonwealth of Australia are enumerated. Many applications are received at the department with the country of origin furnished as "Australia." The advice clearly indicates which state in the Commonwealth issued the order as "South Australia" or "New South Wales" and these countries should be specifically given in the space on the application provided for that purpose.

INQUIRIES AND REPLIES DIRECT BETWEEN POSTMASTERS AND CANADIAN DEPARTMENT

Arrangements have been made for direct correspondence between the Canadian postal administration and postmasters in this country with reference to the payment or repayment of money orders. Postmasters will receive certain inquiries from the central office at Ottawa, Canada, on forms provided with space for reply, which should be completed and returned direct to the Ottawa office. This applies only to such inquiries and printed forms as clearly indicate that a direct reply is appropriate. All other correspondence with reference to the money-order business between the United States and Canada will be conducted through the office of the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders.

MONEY ORDERS MUST NOT BE DRAWN ON DOMINICAN REPUBLIC OR ON HAITI

Postmasters at all money-order offices are again reminded that the United States has no money-order arrangement with either the Dominican Republic or Haiti, and that money orders must positively not be drawn on either country.

Disregard of these instructions results at intervals in inconvenience to individuals who are unable to obtain payment of such orders and in discredit to the money-order system.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

ENVELOPES OF DISTINCTIVE DESIGN FOR AIR MAIL

In order to facilitate the identification of matter to be carried by airplane, approval is hereby given to the use for air mail of envelopes of a distinctive design as illustrated and described below:

Envelopes used for this purpose must be white, no other color being permissible. Thus the outstanding and conspicuous feature of the envelope will be the red, white, and blue stripes. The stripes must not exceed approximately one-fourth inch in width and should extend entirely across the length of the envelope. The red stripe must be not less than $1\frac{1}{8}$ inches below the top of the envelope, in order that clear space may be left for the necessary postage stamps and postmark. The white space between the red and blue stripes should be approximately one-fourth inch in width, so that the three stripes will not cover more than approximately three-fourths inch in all.

Such envelopes are not furnished by the department, but any person may have his envelopes for air-mail use printed in the foregoing manner.

Envelopes having this special design may be used for air mail only. Their use for mail which is not intended to be carried by airplane will not be permitted.

All air mail should bear the sender's return card, which should appear in the upper left corner of the address side.

Postmasters will please advise their patrons in accordance with the foregoing.

**NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE SENDER
MUST BE PLACED ON FOURTH-CLASS
MAIL**

It is again necessary to call attention to paragraph 4, section 457, Postal Laws and Regulations, which provides that no parcel of fourth-class matter shall be accepted for mailing unless it bears the name and address of the sender.

Notwithstanding attention has been repeatedly called to this requirement, some postmasters continue to accept for mailing parcels which do not bear the sender's name and address. The failure to observe this requirement causes serious inconvenience and embarrassment and leads to much criticism of the Postal Service.

Postmasters should inform patrons with respect to this requirement and parcels presented for mailing should not be accepted unless they bear the sender's name and address. When parcels which do not bear this information are found in the drops and the sender is unknown, the parcels should be indorsed and treated as provided by paragraph 4, section 457, Postal Laws and Regulations.

NAME AND ADDRESS OF SENDER NOT TO BE PLACED ON BACK OF ENVELOPES

Attention has heretofore been called to the objectionable practice of some mailers who place their return card on the back of envelopes instead of in the upper left corner of the address side, which is the proper location for the sender's return card.

While the efforts to have this practice discontinued have met with a fine spirit of cooperation, it has been observed that certain persons and concerns engaged in the business of printing and selling letterheads and envelopes are furnishing envelopes having the return card printed on the back flap thereof.

This, of course, negatives to a considerable extent the good work that has been accomplished in educating users of mails as to the proper location of the return card.

Postmasters are therefore requested in every instance of this kind coming to their attention, to endeavor to have the objectionable practice discontinued and secure the cooperation of printers, dealers, and all others in the matter of having the sender's return card placed in the upper left corner of the address side of all envelopes, wrappers, labels, etc.

When doing this, postmasters should carefully explain the numerous objections to the placing of the return card on the back of mail, particularly the fact that it necessitates the expenditure of an unwarranted amount of time and labor in turning the mail over to ascertain the return address, and in many cases the return card will be overlooked entirely, and the matter not returned. The Postal Service would not justly be censurable for such matter not being returned, and the failure would be attributable to the return card not being placed where it properly belongs.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

PREPARATION OF REQUISITIONS FOR SPECIAL-REQUEST ENVELOPES

Regardless of detailed instructions heretofore published, the department continues to receive daily an unreasonable number of defective or incorrectly drawn requisitions for special-request envelopes. This condition can only be explained by carelessness on the part of postmasters and requisition clerks who fail to observe the explicit instructions which have been issued as applying to the preparation of requisitions for printed envelopes.

Attention is again called to the following particulars in the drawing of such requisitions:

1. *Requisition and printer's copy must agree.*—Numerous requisitions are received in which the items on the requisition and printer's copy do not agree as to quantity, size, number, denomination, or pattern. Such discrepancies are entirely due to lack of care in preparing requisitions and can be prevented if the items are properly verified before the requisition is transmitted to the department. This verification should also apply to the value of the envelopes extended and will thus serve to correct wrong sizes and denominations.

2. *Requisitions for window envelopes must be indorsed.*—Requisitions for

window envelopes should be indorsed "Window" in the columns under "Cut" on both requisition section and on printer's copy. The department can not accept requisitions for window envelopes without indorsement, even if the value extended indicates window envelopes are desired.

3. *Local address in return cards.*—The department requires a definite local address in the return cards on all envelopes printed returnable to a post office having city or village delivery service. The local address may consist of one or more of the following items: (a) Name of street and number; (b) post-office box number; (c) name of building and room number therein, if the building is sufficiently well known to be listed in the city directory; and (d) approximate location, as northeast corner, Fifth and Main Streets, Adams Street between First and Second, etc. The local address on envelopes for free-delivery post offices will be omitted only upon the receipt of a satisfactory explanation with the requisition that the purchaser has no definite local address and the approximate location can not be given.

4. *Local address on window envelopes.*—The above rules for local address apply also to window envelopes, except that "name of building and room number therein" will not be

accepted as the local address without the name of street and number or approximate location in addition thereto.

5. *Envelopes of different patterns not to be included in same requisition.*—Separate requisitions must be submitted for low-back, high-back, extra-quality, and window envelopes.

6. *Guaranty pledge on 1-cent envelopes for third-class matter.*—The return card on 1-cent envelopes for third-class matter must include the pledge "Return postage guaranteed" and requisitions shall be so drawn. The pledge will be omitted only on condition the postmaster submits a statement on behalf of the purchaser that the return of undeliverable third-class matter is not desired, in which case the request line in the printer's copy shall also be eliminated. The pledge will be omitted from return cards for 1-cent special-request envelopes desired exclusively for inclosing first-class matter at the drop-letter rate at post offices not having free delivery, service, provided the requisition is indorsed "For first-class matter."

7. *Indorsement of requisitions for return cards that disclose purchaser's business.*—The department is prohibited by law from printing advertising matter in return cards for purchasers, but firm names that may incidentally disclose the nature of the business will be printed provided the postmaster, after investigation, is satisfied the name is bona fide and makes proper indorsement to that effect in the space provided on the requisition. The proper indorsement for ordinary business concerns, such as Washington Drug Co., R. S. Boyd Coal Co., etc., is "Firm name," "Incorporated," etc., but where the nature of the business is merely associated with the purchaser's name, as "Brown's garage," "Hall's grocery," etc., or where such names are used as "The Flower Store," "The Style Shop," etc., and the business is not incorporated, the postmaster must assure himself that all business with the public is actually transacted under the name and that all letters and checks are so signed. The proper indorsement in such cases is "Business name, used in all signatures to letters and checks." If the business is incorporated the requisition should be indorsed "Incorporated" or "Corporate name." Postmasters will be held responsible for the careless and perfunctory indorsement of requisitions.

Postmasters hereafter will be personally charged with the responsibility

of submitting correctly prepared requisitions, and are directed to issue the necessary instructions to requisition clerks that will insure proper compliance with the rules stated in this notice.

REQUESTS FOR COPIES OF THE STAMPED ENVELOPE PRICE LIST, FORM 3200, TO BE SUBMITTED TO PROPER OFFICE

Postmasters requiring additional copies of Form 3200, "Price-list of Printed and Unprinted Stamped Envelopes and Newspaper Wrappers," should submit their requests to the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies, Washington, D. C., or other designated distributing office for postal supplies, and *not* to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps.

POSTMASTERS TO DISPOSE OF STAMP SUPPLIES IN ORDER OF RECEIPT

The attention of postmasters is called to the instructions in paragraph 36, page 66, of the July, 1924, Postal Guide, requiring the disposition of the oldest stock on hand when withdrawing stamps, postal cards, stamped envelopes, and newspaper wrappers from post-office stock for sale to the public, using proper care to prevent the delivery of damaged supplies. From reports received it appears that some postmasters are disregarding these rules which leads to the deterioration of stock with subsequent losses to the department when the spoiled stamped paper is redeemed. These instructions apply particularly to postal cards and stamped envelopes, which must often be stored under less favorable conditions than postage stamps.

When new shipments of cards and envelopes are received, the shipping containers should be arranged so that cases of like stock remaining on hand from a previous order will be made accessible for the next withdrawal, so that the old stock will be used before that received on the new invoice. The same rules should be followed with respect to postage-stamp supplies as necessary to insure a proper rotation of stock to prevent possibilities of deterioration.

Postmasters will be expected to comply with these instructions hereafter. Failure to do so will be considered a delinquency against the postmaster.

PAYMENT OF 1918 AND 1919 WAR-SAVINGS STAMPS

1. By direction of the Postmaster General, postmasters will no longer make payment of any unregistered war-savings stamps of the matured series of 1918 and 1919. When unregistered 1918 or 1919 certificates are presented at a post office for payment, properly signed and otherwise conforming to the regulations, the postmaster shall issue to the owner a memorandum receipt showing the name of the owner, the series, serial number and value of the certificate, and shall keep a copy of the receipt on file. The postmaster shall forward the certificate to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, Washington, D. C., by official registered mail. The Third Assistant Postmaster General will refer such certificates to the Treasurer of the United States, who will, if the certificates are found in order, mail checks in payment direct to the owners. No printed form will be provided by the department for the memorandum receipt, for the present. The interim receipt, Form W. S. 3370, should not be used for this purpose unless marked plainly with the added words "For payment by Treasury." The memorandum receipts will not be taken up after payment.

2. Postmasters sending war-savings certificates to the department in the manner indicated in paragraph 1 shall prepare a letter of transmittal in triplicate for each shipment. The original letter shall accompany the certificates dispatched by official registered mail. The duplicate, which should be plainly marked "Copy," shall be forwarded to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, by ordinary mail. The registry number of the dispatch should be shown on the duplicate copy as well as on the original. The triplicate copy should be kept on file. This instruction is in pursuance of an arrangement with the Treasury Department for insurance of all such shipments of unpaid and unregistered war-savings certificates. It is of great importance and postmasters are expected to see that it is invariably followed. No printed form will be provided by the department for the letter of transmittal at present, but postmasters must not fail to prepare such letters in substantially the following form:

3. Postmasters must use the utmost care to see that the name and present address of each owner is clearly and correctly given in the letter of transmittal, and to see that the receipt on the certificate is properly dated and signed in accordance with sections 155 and 156 on page 48 of the 1924 Postal Guide.

4. War-savings certificates of the 1918 and 1919 series on which all stamps were registered at a post office prior to maturity shall be paid from postal funds, or forwarded to the central accounting postmaster or State depository postmaster for return of funds, in accordance with the existing regulations. Registered 1918 or 1919 certificates that have any unregistered stamps affixed shall not be paid but shall be forwarded by the postmaster at the office of registration to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, in accordance with the foregoing instructions concerning unregistered certificates, together with the registration cards, Form W. S. 110, and a statement by the postmaster certifying that the signature in the receipt form is that of the registered owner.

5. When application is made for payment of unregistered 1918 or 1919 certificates belonging to deceased owners, infants, or incompetents, and in any other cases requiring the submission of evidence to the department, the certificates should be forwarded with the necessary evidence in accordance with the foregoing instructions. In any such case the receipt on the certificate should be signed in the name of the owner, by the person applying for payment, who should add his own signature, except that in the case of

a deceased owner the special receipt, Form W. S. 3365, will be furnished by the department for the signature of the claimant.

6. The foregoing instructions do not apply in any respect to war-savings certificates of the 1920 and 1921 series, nor to thrift stamps, which shall continue to be paid under the existing regulations. A special notice concerning payment of 1920 war-savings certificates at maturity, January 1, 1925, is published separately.

PAYMENT OF 1920 WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES AT MATURITY

1. War-savings certificates bearing war-savings stamps of the series of 1920 will be payable at the maturity value of \$5 for each stamp on and after January 1, 1925. The special procedure adopted in connection with the payment at maturity of 1918 and 1919 war-savings certificates will not be followed. Postmasters shall not send any war-savings certificates of the 1920 series to Federal reserve banks for payment at maturity. Such certificates will be paid at post offices and handled after payment in accordance with the existing regulations as outlined on pages 48 to 51 of the 1924 Postal Guide.

2. Registered certificates of the 1920 series will be payable only through the post offices of registration. Unregistered 1920 certificates will be payable at post offices, but will also be generally accepted by banks and trust companies for payment at maturity value,

as in the case of the matured unregistered 1918 and 1919 certificates.

3. War-savings certificates, series of 1920, may be presented at post offices before the date of maturity for payment to be made on January 1, 1925, or as soon thereafter as may be practicable, at maturity value. No payment shall be made at maturity value before January 1, 1925. When certificates are so presented in advance, postmasters must use great care to see that the receipt forms on the certificates are signed as of January 1, 1925, and that the maturity value of \$5 for each stamp is inserted in the proper place.

4. No post office is required to make payment until 10 days after written notice has been given, but such written notice may be waived and immediate payment made on certificates presented at or after maturity in any case where surplus funds can be used immediately without embarrassment to the finances of the post office, as provided in section 154, page 48, of the 1924 Postal Guide.

INFORMATION CONCERNING DOCUMENTARY REVENUE STAMPS

The department has under consideration the recall, for credit, of excess stocks of documentary revenue stamps held by central and direct-accounting postmasters. Instructions, however, will not be issued until after January 1, 1925. In the meantime central and direct-accounting postmasters will hold their entire stocks of documentary revenue stamps pending receipt of the instructions.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILES

LIMIT OF SIZE OF REGISTERED MAIL CARRIED BY AIRPLANE

Because of the amendment of section 450, paragraph 6, of the Postal Laws and Regulations, which stipulates that mail carried by airplane shall not exceed 84 inches in length and girth combined, the instructions in article 36, page 102, of the July, 1924, Postal Guide, to the effect that the size of airplane registered mail shall not exceed 30 inches in length and girth combined, are modified to read as follows:

"Except as herein stated, sealed first-class mail not exceeding 84 inches in length or girth combined will be accepted for registration and dispatch

by airplane service upon the prepayment, by postage stamps affixed, of a registry fee of 10 or 20 cents, as may be required, in addition to the airplane postage. (See secs. 385 and 450, as amended, secs. 861 (par. 4) and 1330, as amended, Postal Laws and Regulations.) *Nonnegotiable* securities and commercial paper which is not indorsed, or if indorsed is not indorsed in blank, is accepted without regard to the value involved. Coin and currency in large amounts, *negotiable* securities, and commercial paper in large amounts which may easily be negotiated or readily realized upon by other than the rightful owners must not be accepted for registration and transmission by airplane service."

INSURED MAIL SERVICE WITH CANADA

The words "including coins not current" should be added following the word "coin" in the seventh line of paragraph 1 (b), appearing under the item "Canada" printed on page 116 of the annual Postal Guide of 1924.

BETTER PROTECTION FOR REGISTERED MAIL

With a view to obtaining greater protection for registered mail, postmasters are reminded that valuable registered parcels, including payroll funds and bank shipments, should immediately be placed either in vaults or safes upon receipt, and kept there while awaiting delivery or dispatch; that these packages should not be handled within the sight of patrons or unauthorized persons and that loose conversation regarding shipments should be prohibited.

NUMBERING OF REGISTERED MAIL

Information has been received indicating that in some instances larger numbers than are necessary are being used in numbering registered mail, and that suffixes and prefixes consisting of one or two letters are also frequently used. This results in the expenditure of additional time on the part of the postal employees in recording registered articles.

Postmasters are requested to give this matter their attention with a view to restricting the registration numbers to as few figures as possible and to eliminating the use of prefixes and suffixes in every instance practicable. See Article 44, page 103 of the July, 1924 Postal Guide.

At the larger offices the numbers may be commenced anew as frequently as may be found desirable in order to use as small numbers as practicable. The smaller numbers are more desirable with regard to registered mail than is necessary for insured or C. O. D. mail because of the necessity for recording in transit, the registry numbers assigned. The use of prefixes and affixes in connection with the numbers assigned registered, insured and C. O. D. mail is undesirable, and unnecessary either to the senders or to the Postal Service and should be avoided whenever practicable.

ALTERATION OF CHARGES ON C. O. D. TAGS

In connection with the general subject of the illegible manner of writing particulars on C. O. D. tags, which was last brought to the attention of postmasters on page 24, of the September, 1924, Postal Guide, it appears necessary to specially invite attention to the increasing practice of some mailers in altering of charges on C. O. D. tags, representing the amounts to be remitted.

As erasures and corrections in amounts representing C. O. D. charges on C. O. D. tags may result in errors and delays in the issuance of money orders at delivering post offices, it will be obvious that not only is it to the interest of the service to discourage this practice but also to its patrons. Therefore, when C. O. D. parcels presented for mailing have affixed thereto C. O. D. tags bearing indecipherable or altered amounts of C. O. D. charges, accepting postal employees should require new C. O. D. tags to be executed unless the corrected amounts are clear and unmistakable, in which event appropriate notations should be made on the tags to show that the alterations were made by the senders.

When C. O. D. tags are received at offices of delivery on which the charges are not clearly and unmistakably indicated, the necessary action should be taken to obtain confirmation of the amounts involved from the mailing post offices, and suitable reports made to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails.

In order to correct this situation, reduce to a minimum the difficulties and annoyance to the service and to its patrons, and to conserve the supply of C. O. D. tags, postmasters should immediately bring the matter to the attention of firms in such a manner as will result in obtaining their cooperation.

CORRECTION—INDEX TO POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

On page 686, Postal Laws and Regulations, the item indented under registered matter reading "Remailed after delivery" should refer to section 993, not 902.

LUBRICATING OIL FOR CANCELING MACHINES AND AUTOMATIC SCALES

The Division of Equipment and Supplies of this bureau is still receiving requests for lubricating oil for canceling machines and scales, notwithstanding the fact that instructions were issued as to the manner of ordering this material in the January, 1923, Supplement to the Postal Guide. Postmasters are again requested to make application for lubricating oil for the equipment mentioned in accordance with the following instructions.

At offices where Government-owned motor vehicle service is in operation, lubricating oil for canceling machines and automatic scales will be secured from their garages.

At offices where there is no motor vehicle service in operation, this material should be ordered from the nearest office indicated below, the necessary container to be forwarded with the requisition therefor.

MAIL EARLY FOR CHRISTMAS

CHRISTMAS A HOLIDAY ON RURAL ROUTES

Rural carriers are given holiday on Christmas and their routes are not served on that day.

Postmasters and postal employees are urged to give as much publicity as possible to this fact through local newspapers and otherwise, without expense to the department.

The public should be advised that parcels for delivery on rural routes should be mailed so as to reach the office of delivery at least three or four days before Christmas; also that there is no objection to placing upon the Christmas parcel the inscription "Please do not open until Christmas," or words to that effect.

NO HOLIDAYS ON STAR ROUTES

The carriers on star routes (those routes on which service is performed under contract) are not given holidays, service being required on every schedule day, except where routes are dependent upon rural delivery routes for their mail supply, no service is required on holidays.

AMENDMENT TO POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

NOVEMBER 6, 1924.

INSERT No. 42. ORDER No. 1193.

Paragraph 3, section 855, of the Postal Laws and Regulations is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Postmasters of the first and second class offices shall take receipts from each messenger or rural carrier acting as messenger, on a regular pay roll (Form 1594), showing the name of the messenger, number of pieces delivered or attempted to be delivered by him, as ascertained by the postmaster's record; but the aggregate of the pay roll shall not exceed 80 per cent of the total value of the special-delivery stamps on matter actually delivered or attempted to be delivered during the month. (See sec. 215.) The quarterly voucher will be detached and forwarded to the Comptroller General, Post Office Department Division, with the quarterly postal account."

NOVEMBER 22, 1924.

INSERT No. 43. ORDER No. 1255.

Section 1073, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph 4:

"4. Parcels containing matter offered for sale addressed to prospective purchasers who have not ordered same or authorized their sending will not be insured. Should such matter be received in the Postal Service, contrary to this regulation, indemnity for the loss or damage thereof will not be paid."

Should any be presented, refuse payment, wire the post-office inspector in charge of your division and also the Third Assistant. Similar action must be taken in case of the theft of forms.

When notice of the theft of money orders is received, immediately examine the coupons of paid orders to ascertain whether any orders bearing the numbers and name of the office advertised have already been presented and collected. If any are found, report the fact, without loss of time, to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, and await instructions. If the payment was recent, use the telegraph, stating the number of the order.

To provide against payment of stolen orders, postmasters should conspicuously post warning notices where they can be readily consulted by the paying clerks.

Exercise unusual caution in paying orders issued at any of the offices named on this card, even though numbers differ from those printed hereon.

Business men should be cautioned not to accept money orders from strangers without satisfactory reference.

PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS MAIL

To Postmasters:

The greatest task in the year in the postal service is, as you are aware, the problem of properly handling what is known as the Christmas Mail. This has become increasingly important as the service increases in volume and as parcel post has taxed all our resources to handle.

The way to successfully cope with this extraordinary volume of mail which, in the ordinary course of events, would center itself upon a few days just preceding Christmas, is to inaugurate a policy whereby this Christmas peak will be leveled down and extend over a longer period of time. It should begin to be felt by the middle of November at the latest, and should flow more evenly until Christmas.

This can only be accomplished by carefully laying your plans and particularly by interesting the mailing public in the problem. This means an active and strenuous campaign of publicity. Mailers have a tendency to delay until too late a date. They must be made to see that for the safe and expeditious handling of their own mail it is to their advantage to mail early. You will find the chambers of commerce, newspapers, theaters, picture houses and practically all agencies for publicity, ready to cooperate in this great undertaking if you but begin your campaign in season.

All work in post offices, including carrier service, shall be discontinued at eleven o'clock on Christmas morning, except such as is absolutely necessary for dispatching outgoing first-class mail and newspapers, and receiving but not working incoming mail. There will be no rural delivery service on that day.

This message is sent to you for the purpose of impressing upon you the importance of making your plans early and pursuing them vigorously to the end that Christmas Mail may be handled to the satisfaction of all.
