HARRY S. NEW, POSTMASTER GENERAL

SURREPTITIOUS REMOVAL OF POSTAGE STAMPS FROM MAIL IN TRANSIT

Notwithstanding previous warnings against the removal of postage stamps from matter while in the mails, the practice has not been stopped. A number of instances have just come to attention where the stamps affixed to letters sent by air mail on first flights over contract air mail routes were removed, apparently by employees interested in philatelic work or who sell the stamps to philatelists.

Thousands of letters are sent by air mail, particularly on first flights over new routes, merely in order to obtain the envelopes with attached stamps for their philatelic or historical value. The department desires to cooperate with persons interested in this work, not only because of the pleasure and satisfaction they get out of it, but for the reason that the business increases the postal revenues and is quite profitable.

The unlawful removal of stamps from mail, whether foreign or domestic, and regardless of the manner in which the mail is sent, will not be tolerated. The penal statute, embodied in section 522, Postal Laws and Regulations, makes it an offense punishable by a fine or imprisonment, or both, to remove postage stamps from mail. All instances coming to attention will be thoroughly investigated with the view of taking such action against the guilty parties as will lead to the application of the penalty prescribed by law for such offense.

THE PRACTICE MUST BE STOPPED. Let all concerned cooperate in eliminating the abuse and thus maintain the integrity of the postal service.

ANNUAL ENCAMPMENT UNITED SPANISH WAR VETERANS, DEPARTMENT OF CALIFORNIA

APRIL 28, 1926.

ORDER No. 4138:

All employees of the Postal Service who are members of the United Spanish War Veterans, Department of California, whose services can be spared without detriment to the service, may be allowed leave of absence upon application in the usual manner, for as many days as may be necessary, not to exceed 30, to enable them to attend the annual encampment of such organization, to be held at Yosemite National Park, May 24 to 26, 1926, inclusive. Such absence may be charged to the employees' annual leave, or, if necessary, leave without pay may be granted.

SPECIAL FORMS

Except in most extreme emergencies, when necessary to handle some new work or in other like conditions, new or special forms—that is, forms not approved by the department or in addition to the regular stock forms furnished upon request—must not be improvised and used in post offices.

When a new form is considered necessary, or some deviation from the regular stock form is deemed advisable, the matter should be submitted to the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies, who will refer it to the bureau and division having jurisdiction over the matter to which the form pertains. Each request should contain a full explanation showing the need of the new or special form and why it is not practicable to utilize a standard form.

AUXILIARY CLERK AND CARRIER HIRE ALLOWANCES

Attention of Postmasters of the First and Second Classes

On or about the close of the March quarter (March 31) and since that date numerous requests by letter and telegram have been received from postmasters for additional auxiliary clerk and carrier hire allowances for the March quarter, the reason given in practically all cases being an excessive amount of sickness.

While it is appreciated that the March quarter usually entails large expenditures for sick leave, yet these requests indicate that some postmasters still fail to follow the instructions contained in my letter of December 31, 1924, which have been repeated from time to time in the quarterly estimate letter, relative to apportionment of allowances when received. It would seem that a large number of postmasters do not understand that the apportionment of allowances means the whole allowance, *including that required on account of sick leave*. Sick leave must be estimated for in advance and the amount authorized for this purpose apportioned just the same as for any other item.

A close check must be kept on expenditures at all times, and just as soon as it is apparent that the amount authorized will not be sufficient a request for a supplemental allowance should be submitted, together with a full statement of conditions and the reasons why an additional allowance is necessary. If there has been an unusual amount of sick leave this fact should be set forth, but you should also state the names of the clerks and carriers who have been sick and the number of days of sick leave used by each.

This same rule likewise applies to all requests for additional allowances, it being necessary not only to give general reasons but also to enumerate in detail just why the allowance granted is inadequate. For example, an additional allowance is requested to handle special mailings. The explanation accompanying such request should not only specify the item of special mailings, but it should also indicate the kind and quantity of this class of mailings, the name or names of the mailers, the reason why these special mailings could not be handled by the regular force without additional expense, and the number of hours of auxiliary assistance or overtime that will be required to handle this mail. It should also be explained why you did not secure this information in advance as to these mailings so that provision for handling them could have been made in your quarterly estimate. This advance information can usually be secured from your large mailers if you go about it in a diplomatic manner. We do not want poor or curtailed service at any office. Additional allowances will readily be granted if the need therefor is clearly shown. It is up to postmasters to prove its need to us. This can only be done by furnishing specific data and information.

My object in writing this is to again impress upon all postmasters at first and second class offices that auxiliary and overtime expenditures (except as provided in paragraph 11, page 58, annual Postal Guide of July, 1925) may not be made without securing authority in advance from this bureau, and that sick leave is included in the category of expenditures for which allowances must be secured in advance.

I trust that this notice will have the desired effect, so that at the end of the June quarter there will not again be a large number of postmasters who have exceeded their authorized allowances.

Every request for an additional allowance should state the amount *in dollars and cents*.

TELEGRAMS

The telegraph should never be used except in real emergencies. Many postmasters have fallen into the habit of telegraphing the department on petty matters which could have been anticipated and a letter written instead. Considering the fact that we have some 51,000 post offices this is a highly expensive proposition.

It has been noted in particular that many postmasters are resorting to the telegraph for additional overtime or auxiliary allowances when there seems to be no good reason why they should not have anticipated the need for such allowances and submitted their requests by letter.

It is appreciated that in real emergency periods this sometimes can not be done, but ordinarily the postmaster who is thoroughly familiar with the work of his office and its requirements will know a sufficient length of time in advance that additional funds will be required to enable him to write the facts fully instead of sending a telegram.

This is not only a distinct economy but is much more satisfactory to the department, as detailed information can be given.

FAILURE TO PROPERLY POSTMARK MAIL MATTER

The attention of all postmasters is again specifically directed to the matter of distinct and legible postmarking.

Notwithstanding frequent and definite notices covering this subject appearing in the *POSTAL BULLETIN* and the monthly supplements to the July Postal Guide, numerous complaints are reaching the department to the effect that postmarks are blurred and in some cases practically illegible, thereby rendering it impossible in many instances to identify the post office from which the mail matter emanated.

This condition must not be permitted to continue. Postmasters, especially at the smaller post offices, are expected to give their personal attention to this important feature of the service and see to it that their postmarking equipment is adequate, that the type is inspected and cleaned daily, and that employees are carefully instructed and required to postmark all outgoing mail matter clearly and legibly, the entire impression to be shown distinctly. This is especially applicable to hand stamps.

Individual cases of dereliction along this line coming to the attention of the department will be given careful consideration hereafter, and postmasters found to be willfully disregarding these instructions will be subject to severe disciplinary action.

CARRIERS' KEY CHAINS

For the past several years the department has been furnishing carriers' key chains with round wire links in lieu of flat link chains.

In this connection it is proposed to issue, for use by carriers, flat link chains instead of round wire link chains, when the present supply of the latter becomes exhausted.

It is directed that postmasters issue specific and emphatic instructions to all carriers, city and village, that carriers must examine chains frequently for wear on links and have them repaired, or, if this is not possible, obtain a new chain and not wait until the link breaks, resulting in a loss of the key.

CARRIER CAP BADGES

The attention of the department has been called to the fact that many city letter carriers and a few postmasters have been writing manufacturers of uniforms as to where they may obtain cap badges.

In order to avoid unnecessary correspondence and to expedite the obtaining of these badges, the attention of all concerned is invited to the fact that they may be obtained from N. C. Walter & Son, 3 Park Row, New York, N. Y.

POSTAGE RATES—AIR-MAIL SERVICE

The rate of postage on air mail is 8 cents an ounce or fraction thereof for each zone of the transcontinental route and 10 cents per ounce for the overnight service between New York and Chicago.

On contract air-mail routes the rate of postage is 10 cents per ounce or fraction thereof on each route or part thereof not exceeding 1,000 miles in length, with 5 cents per zone additional for each zone traveled over the transcontinental route. For example the postage rate from St. Louis to New York is 15 cents per ounce, being 10 cents for the contract route to Chicago and 5 cents for one zone of the transcontinental route from Chicago to New York. When the Boston to New York contract route is in operation the postage rate from St. Louis to Boston by air mail will be 25 cents per ounce made up as follows: 10 cents for contract route, St. Louis to Chicago; 5 cents for one zone, Chicago to New York; and 10 cents for contract route, New York to Boston.

DIVISION OF FOREIGN MAILS

AIR MAIL SERVICE, LONDON TO CONTINENTAL EUROPE

Pursuant to recent advices from the postal administration of Great Britain, the air mail service mentioned in the notice of this office, dated January 6, 1926, is restated as follows:

- A. Leave London daily except Sunday at 11 a. m. for France, offering delivery in Paris the same evening, and in most of France the next morning.
- B. Leave London daily except Sunday at 6.15 a. m. for Belgium and Germany, offering delivery at Brussels and Antwerp the same afternoon or evening and at Cologne the same afternoon.

C. Leave London daily except Sunday at 6.15 a. m. for The Netherlands and Germany, offering delivery at Rotterdam and Amsterdam the same afternoon and in the remainder of The Netherlands the same evening or first delivery next morning; at Hanover and Berlin same afternoon or evening, if an additional express fee of 12 cents per letter is prepaid and the cover is prominently marked with the word "Express," and at Dresden and Breslau by first post next morning.

D. Leave London daily except Sunday at 6.15 a. m. and at 12 noon on Saturdays for the Union of Socialistic Soviet Republics (Russia), Memel, Latvia, Esthonia, and Lithuania, offering delivery at Moscow on the morning of the second day from London, at Memel, Riga, and Revel, evening of day after dispatch from London, and in Lithuania, Latvia, and Esthonia on the morning of the second day after dispatch.

E. Leave London daily except Sunday at 6.15 a. m. for Germany, Denmark, Sweden, and Norway, offering delivery at Hamburg same evening, if an additional express fee of 12 cents per letter is prepaid and the cover is prominently marked with the word "Express"; at Copenhagen the same evening, at Stockholm next morning, and at Oslo next afternoon.

F. Leave London daily except Sunday at 6 p. m., and Sunday at 7 a. m., for Morocco and Western Algeria, offering delivery at Tangier and Casablanca on the evening of the second day from London, at Oran on the evening of the second or morning of the third day, and at Algiers on the morning of the third or fourth day from London.

The air-mail postage required, in addition to the international letter rate of postage, is as follows:

On letters to France, 4 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof; to Belgium, The Netherlands, and Germany (occupied), 4 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof; to Germany (unoccupied), 6 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof; to Denmark, Sweden, and Norway, 8 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof; to Memel, Latvia, Lithuania, and Esthonia, 12 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof; to the Union of Socialistic Soviet Republics, 16 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof, and to Morocco and Western Algeria, 5 cents an ounce or fraction thereof; *the air mail fee and the postage to be fully prepaid by postage stamps affixed to each piece.*

Mail matter intended for dispatch by the above-mentioned air-mail service *should be prominently marked in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope or cover with the words "Air Mail—London to Continent,"* so that the articles in assorting may not be overlooked.

Articles for Morocco and Western Algeria should, in addition be plainly marked immediately below the above-mentioned marking with the indication "Par avion de Toulouse" (by airship from Toulouse).

All mail articles for this service will be dispatched to New York for onward transmission from that exchange post office.

Postmasters will please cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices, and the widest publicity, without expense to the Department, to be given thereto.

POST CARDS FOR CANADA

In connection with reports made to this office that many post offices are dispatching 1 cent Government postal cards bearing written communications to Canada as fully prepaid, attention is called to the fact that the postage rate applicable to post cards, Government postal cards, or private mailing cards, bearing written messages and addressed for delivery in Canada, is 2 cents for each single card and 4 cents for each reply-paid card. This latter rate is applicable to reply-paid cards whether printed or written.

Post Cards (not reply-paid) for Canada, or for any other foreign country, which have only printed information thereon or otherwise comply with the conditions set forth in section 29 (see subdivision (g) especially) on pages 164 and 165 of the July, 1925, Postal Guide, are subject to the international printed matter rate of 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof and if sent singly need be prepaid only 1 cent.

POSTAGE PAID IN CASH ON ARTICLES OF THIRD-CLASS MATTER AND PARCEL POST

This office is in receipt of the following copy of an order issued by the Canadian postal service with respect to articles of third-class matter and parcel post mailed in the Dominion of Canada and addressed for delivery in the United States:

"In order to facilitate the handling and dispatch of parcels posted at the larger centers where extensive mailings are made for delivery at places within the Dominion of Canada or in the United States, the postage-paid-in-cash system has been extended to parcels of third-class matter and parcel post.

"Each parcel mailed under the postage-paid-in-cash system will have affixed to it, at the upper right-hand corner of the address where stamps are usually placed, an impression showing the amount of postage paid at third-class matter or parcel-post rates, thus:

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"As the postage, including the registration fee, or insurance fee, as the case may be, on such a parcel will have been prepaid in cash, the parcel is to be forwarded and delivered free of charge.

All articles of third-class matter and parcel-post packages received in the United States bearing an impression similar to the one indicated will be treated by postmasters and railway postal clerks in the same manner as if they bore postage stamps sufficient to prepay transmission to destination.

The above supersedes the information contained in the announcement published by this office on page 43 of the September supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1925.

POSTAL SERVICE OF NEWFOUNDLAND SEPARATE FROM THAT OF CANADA

This department has been advised of the receipt at the office of Detroit, Mich., from various United States post offices of mail articles for Newfoundland labeled "Detroit, Dis. Canada."

By reference to the general foreign separating scheme on page 188 of the Postal Guide for July, 1925, it will be seen that the postal administration of Newfoundland is separate and distinct from that of Canada.

EGGS IN THE MAILS TO CANADA

The postal administration of Canada has advised that parcel-post packages containing eggs are being received in that service outside of mail sacks.

In this connection attention is drawn to the item "Canada" on page 215 of the annual Postal Guide for 1925, from which it will be seen that only those parcels containing baby chicks sent during the period allowed, and packages of bees, may be forwarded outside of sacks; and appropriate action should be taken at all authorized United States exchange post offices in the future to see that parcels containing eggs are properly prepared for mailing as outlined in section 204 on page 254 of the annual Postal Guide for 1925, and then placed inside of sacks for onward transmission to destination.

SEALING OF PARCEL-POST PACKAGES TO CUBA

The following modification with respect to the sealing of parcel-post packages for Cuba should be made to the first paragraph of the announcement under the caption "Improved parcel-post service with Cuba," appearing on pages 6 and 7 of the December supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1925:

"All registered parcels must be sealed with wax, adhesive tape, or in some other acceptable manner, but in the country of destination they may be opened by customs officers for examination and appraisal of their contents, such parcels to be thereafter officially sealed by the customs officers. The matter of sealing ordinary parcels however, is optional with the mailer, who may either seal such articles or prepare them according to the regulations governing the acceptance of parcel-post packages destined for delivery in those countries which do not require the sealing feature."

RESUMPTION OF MAIL SERVICE BETWEEN MIAMI, FLA., AND NASSAU, BAHAMAS

Effective May 5, mail service between Miami and Nassau will be resumed and mails dispatched under the same conditions as existed prior to the issuance of the notice of this department of January 23 last announcing the temporary discontinuance of the service.

PARCEL-POST CONVENTION WITH IRISH FREE STATE

A parcel-post convention has been entered into with the Irish Free State providing for the exchange of ordinary and insured parcels, effective May 1, 1926.

The only changes made in the service as it is now conducted, in so far as concerns *ordinary* parcels, are as follows:

The parcels may be closed by means of wax, lead seals, or otherwise, but the country of destination has the right to break the seals in order that the parcels may be opened for customs inspection. After such inspection, the parcels must be closed again and officially sealed.

Refused parcels must be returned at once from the post office of destination to the United States exchange office from which they were received, marked "Refused," while other parcels which can not be delivered will be returned at the expiration of 30 days (as at present), after being marked to show the cause of nondelivery, as "Unclaimed," etc., unless the parcels were marked by the senders to be otherwise disposed of, as "Abandon" or "If not deliverable as addressed, deliver to _____," and in such cases the parcels will be disposed of as indicated by the senders.

Section VI on page 198 of the July, 1925, Postal Guide, and section 210 on page 254, section 214 (last paragraph) on page 255, and section 230 on page 257 are modified accordingly.

See the notice of the Third Assistant Postmaster General concerning the handling of insured parcels sent to and from the Irish Free State.

ALL REMITTANCES OF CUSTOMS DUTIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY CUSTOMS FORM 3437

The notice under the above heading, which was printed on page 11 of the April supplement is modified to the extent that only those postmasters who have had occasion in the past to remit to collectors of customs duties collected on mail articles should make requisition on the division of printing, Treasury Department Washington, D. C., for a supply of Customs Form 3437.

Postmasters who are called upon to collect duty on a mail article for the first time subsequent to these instructions should make prompt requisition on the Treasury Department for a supply of Form 3437. However, the postmasters who have not, as yet, received a supply of Form 3437 should not retain the duty collected awaiting receipt of the form but should remit it to the collector of customs unaccompanied by the form. However when the customs form is received it should be unvariably used when transmitting duty to collectors of custom.

Postmasters who have already made requisition for a supply of Form 3437, but who have not had occasion to use it in the past, should cancel their requisitions immediately until such time as they are called upon to deliver a dutiable foreign mail article.

ADDITIONAL STATISTICS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION WITH CERTIFICATES OF MAILING (FORM 2965), TAG FORM OF RECEIPT (FORM 3817), AND FIRM MAILING BILLBOOK (FORM 3877), ISSUED IN CONNECTION WITH ORDINARY PARCEL-POST MAILED FOR COUNTRIES ABROAD

Postmasters are hereby informed that it will be necessary to report to the office of the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails, on Form 3848, under the caption "Total certificates of mailing for ordinary international parcel-post packages paid for at 1 cent each," appropriate statistics with regard to certificates of mailing (sheet Form 2965), tag form of receipt (Form 3817), and receipts from firm mailing books (Form 3877), as issued to senders requesting such forms, when forwarding ordinary parcels in the foreign (international) parcel-post mails.

Inasmuch as tag form of receipt (Form 3817) and receipts from firm mailing books (Form 3877) are employed with respect to parcels sent in the international parcel-post mails, as well as those forwarded in the domestic service, a separate record should be kept when these forms are issued in connection with parcels sent abroad, and added to the number of sheet Form 2965 when submitting the information on Form 3848.

Full information concerning the issuing of the three forms mentioned to mailers requesting them is set forth in section 221, page 255 of the annual Postal Guide for 1925, and the report as submitted to the Division of Registered Mails should include statistics as from May 1, 1926.

In order that the revenue derived from the issuance of the forms in question may be correctly determined, it is very important that postmasters shall carefully maintain the required statistics and that the figures should be kept current so that the desired report may be rendered promptly at the end of the fiscal year, or at such other time as may be requested.

NEW COUNTERFEIT

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

\$10 United States note (Buffalo head).—Series 1901; check letter "D"; face plate number indistinct; back plate number not discernible; H. V. Speelman, Register of the Treasury; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; portraits of Lewis and Clark.

This counterfeit is printed from poorly etched plates on one sheet of paper on which a few ink lines have been traced to imitate the genuine silk fiber, being similar in workmanship to the \$10 notes described on page 12 of the March, 1925, and page 8 of the January, 1926, supplements to the Postal Guide except that the check letter has been changed from "A" to "D." The seal and serial number are printed in dull red and the general appearance of the note is smudgy, face and back, the finely etched lines in the portraiture and scroll work being destroyed in the printing process. The specimen at hand bears serial number E59570136.

This counterfeit should be readily detected by careful handlers of currency.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

WRONG OFFICE NUMBER ON MONEY-ORDER FORMS

It is reported that money-order forms supplied for use of the post offices named below and supposed to have been issued and paid bore incorrect office numbers. Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful to avoid being misled by such error in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants or in answering inquiries regarding payments.

Wilson, Miss. Serial numbers 2001 to 2100, inclusive. Correct office number is 97468 and not 07468.

Mottville, N. Y. Serial numbers 25001 to 26279, inclusive. Correct office number is 23478 and not 23487.

Shadehill, S. Dak. Serial numbers 201 to 548, inclusive. Correct office number is 29601 and not 29610.

Bryson, Tenn. Serial numbers 4001 to 4287, inclusive. Correct office number is 58777 and not 59777.

C. O. D. NUMBER MUST APPEAR ON APPLICATION FOR DUPLICATE OF MEXICAN C. O. D. ORDER

In preparing applications for duplicates of reissued Mexican money orders drawn for payment of C. O. D. charges on registered parcel-post articles, postmasters fail to enter the C. O. D. number on the application.

As the C. O. D. number is one of the essential particulars for the identification of such remittances, it is highly important that this item be written in a conspicuous place on the application before it is forwarded to the department.

Postmasters are directed, therefore, to instruct all employees who handle such cases to make sure that the C. O. D. number is plainly designated on every application for a duplicate of a Mexican C. O. D. money order.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

IMPORTANCE OF PREPAYMENT OF PROPER POSTAGE ON AIR MAIL

Although short-paid air mail may, if it bears at least 8 cents postage, be rated with the deficiency and dispatched and the amount due collected upon its delivery, postmasters should nevertheless impress upon patrons that it is of the highest importance that the postage on such mail be fully prepaid in order to avoid the delay necessarily incident to the special treatment which must be given short-paid mail, both at the office of mailing and that of address, in connection with the rating of the matter and collecting the postage due.

In view of the variation in the rates of postage on air mail because of the establishment of contract air-mail routes in addition to the Government-operated air-mail service, special efforts should be made to inform patrons with respect to such rates and at the same time they should be encouraged to prepay the full amount of postage chargeable on air mail. As set forth in amended section 385, Postal Laws and Regulations, the rate on mail carried over the Government-operated air-mail routes is 8 cents an ounce or fraction thereof for each air-mail zone, except that on mail carried over the New York-Chicago night route the rate is 10 cents for each ounce or fraction of an ounce, while the rate on mail carried on contract air-mail routes is 10 cents, 15 cents, or 20 cents an ounce or fraction thereof, according to the length of the particular route involved, with an additional charge of 5 cents an ounce or fraction thereof for each air-mail zone the mail is transported on a Government-operated air-mail route.

In connection with the foregoing postmasters should also advise patrons that air mail should be properly indorsed to indicate how it is to be sent. For example, a letter mailed at San Francisco addressed to Detroit intended for transmission

all the way by air mail should be indorsed "Via air mail to Detroit" and prepaid at the rate of 20 cents an ounce or fraction thereof. If intended to be carried by air mail to Chicago only and thence by railroad, the letter should be indorsed "Via air mail to Chicago" and prepaid at the rate regular of 16 cents for each ounce or fraction of an ounce. An air-mail letter originating at a place adjacent to or on a contract air-mail route which would naturally be sent over such route for connection with a Government-operated air-mail route but which the sender desires carried over the latter route only should be indorsed to that effect, as for instance in the case of a letter mailed at or near Detroit, "Via air mail from Chicago."

Letters indorsed merely "Via air mail" when addressed to or in the direction of places served by contract air-mail routes in connection with Government-operated air-mail routes will, if they bear at least 8 cents postage, be treated as intended for transmission over both routes and if not fully prepaid will be rated with postage due to cover the amount chargeable for their transportation over the combined Government-operated and contract air-mail routes. This should be given the widest possible publicity so that patrons may be informed as to the correct rates and the desirability of fully prepaying the same in order to prevent the delay entailed in handling short-paid matter. When there is doubt concerning the rating of air mail which is not indorsed to show how it is to be sent and there is sufficient time to ascertain the sender's wishes without delaying dispatch of the matter this should, of course, be done.

IMPROPER MUTILATION OR DEFACEMENT OF ADDRESS LABELS OF UNDELIVERABLE MATTER RETURNED TO THE SENDER

Complaint is made that in some instances undeliverable catalogues returned to the senders rated with the return postage in accordance with the provisions of section 614, Postal Laws and Regulations, have the address labels torn off or mutilated. This prevents the mailers from ascertaining to whom the matter was addressed or why it was returned, and, of course, makes it impossible for the senders to correct their mailing lists, which is the principal reason for having it returned charged with the return postage to be collected on delivery of the matter.

Complaint is also made that in returning undeliverable matter to the sender some postmasters do not indorse thereon the reason why it can not be delivered, as is required by section 615, Postal Laws and Regulations.

These features should be carefully looked into by every postmaster and special efforts made to have undeliverable matter properly indorsed and to prevent the mutilation or defacement of the address labels thereon.

Let all concerned cooperate in this respect and turn the complaints into compliments.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

NEW COMMEMORATIVE STAMP FOR THE SESQUICENTENNIAL EXPOSITION

Postmasters and postal employees are notified of the issuance of a new 2-cent postage stamp in connection with the Sesquicentennial Exposition to be held in Philadelphia, Pa., this year, commemorating the anniversary of American independence.

The new stamp is a horizontal rectangle of the same size as the present special delivery stamps, $1\frac{4}{8}$ by $\frac{5}{8}$ inches. It is printed in red ink of the same shade as the current 2-cent stamp of the regular issue. The central design of the stamp is the Liberty Bell which swings from the tops of four flat ornamental columns that rest on the lower panel. The words "Sesquicentennial Exposition" appear across the top of the stamp in straight white letters, with a ruled shadow background. Under these in a flat arch appear the words "United States Postage." This arch is supported at either end by a curved scroll, extending out of circular panels at either lower corner. Within these circular panels appears the numeral "2." Across the bottom of the stamp are the words "Two cents" within a horizontal panel. In either upper corner under the words "Sesquicentennial Exposition" appear the dates "1776-1926." All the lettering on the stamp is white-faced roman.

The new sesquicentennial stamp was first placed on sale on May 10, 1926, at the post offices at Philadelphia, Pa., Boston, Mass., and Washington, D. C., and, for the benefit of collectors and stamp dealers, it was also placed on sale the same date in the philatelic agency, Division of Stamps, Post Office Department.

As soon after May 10 as production will permit, the department will send an initial supply of the new stamps to all direct and central accounting post offices *without requisition*. Postmasters will therefore please refrain from submitting requisitions until after their initial order is received.

The department will furnish central accounting postmasters with a sufficient stock of the new 2-cent stamps to meet the local requirements, as well as to fill requisitions from district post offices. Postmasters at district offices will withhold the forwarding of requisitions on Form 3338 to the central accounting office for a supply of the new stamps until after June 1, unless notified prior thereto by the central accounting postmaster that the stamps are available for distribution.

CHANGES IN PACKING OF STAMPED ENVELOPES

For the purpose of reducing the damage to the flaps of envelopes that are used as markers in boxes of standard-quality stamped envelopes that have for several years been sent unbanded, the department has authorized the separations in the boxes hereafter on a basis of 100 envelopes instead of 50 as heretofore. The number of envelopes required for marking purposes, with the possibility of damage to the exposed flap, will under the new arrangement be reduced from nine to four envelopes in boxes of 500 standard-quality envelopes and from four to two in boxes of 250, the latter to show two separations of 100 envelopes each and one separation of 50.

All postmasters and postal employees will please note this new arrangement in order to avoid any irregularities in the handling of standard-quality envelope stock. These changes will affect both printed and unprinted standard-quality envelopes hereafter manufactured, but postmasters will continue to receive unprinted envelopes separated in lots of 50 until previously packed stock is exhausted.

Extra-quality envelopes will continue to be banded in packages of 25 envelopes as heretofore.

LEGIBLE PRINTER'S COPY TO BE FURNISHED WITH REQUISITIONS FOR SPECIAL-REQUEST ENVELOPES

The attention of postmasters and requisition clerks in post offices is again specifically called to the need for greater care in the preparation of requisitions for special-request envelopes to provide a legible printer's copy in every case in order to prevent irregularities in the printing and the resultant delay in the delivery of satisfactory envelopes to the purchaser.

Every letter and character in the return card should be made *plain* and *unmistakable* to facilitate the setting of the type and to insure the accuracy of the printing, necessitating that special effort be made in every instance to provide a printed slip from a previous lot of special-request envelopes or from printed matter to be furnished by the purchaser, to be used on the printer's copy. When a printed slip can not be made available, the printer's copy should then be prepared on a typewriter, but in this event precaution must be exercised to keep the type clean, otherwise certain letters may be confused and result in a misprint. Pen-written printer's copy should be resorted to only when it is *entirely impossible* to provide a printed or typed copy, as they are the cause of approximately 90 per cent of the irregularities in printing. When pen-written copies can not be avoided, every letter and numeral composing the purchaser's name and local address must be distinct and readily distinguishable from others of similar form. In practically every case postmasters should be able to furnish either a printed or typed copy and the department will expect their cooperation to the fullest extent possible.

Postmasters will issue the necessary instructions to postal employees concerned which will cause strict observance of these rules hereafter.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

ESTABLISHMENT OF INSURED MAIL SERVICE WITH THE IRISH FREE STATE

In accordance with Order No. 4142 of the Postmaster General dated April 28, 1926, printed in this Guide as inserts Nos. 219 and 220, the following detailed instructions are issued, effective May 1, 1926, covering the insurance of international *parcel-post* packages exchanged between the United States (including Alaska, Hawaii, Porto Rico, Guam, Samoa, and the Virgin Islands of the United States, but excluding the Philippine Islands and the Canal Zone) and the Irish Free State, which embraces the counties of Carlow, Cavan, Clare, Cork, Donegal, Dublin, Galway, Kerry, Kildare, Kilkenny, Kings County (or Offaly), Liestrin, Leix (or Queens County), Limerick, Longford, Louth, Mayo, Meath, Monaghan, Offaly (or Kings County), Queens County (or Leix), Roscommon, Sligo, Tipperary, Waterford, Westmeath, Wexford, and Wicklow.

(1) Commencing May 1, 1926, postmasters will accept and insure *available* international parcel-post packages for the Irish Free State.

(2) The following amounts of indemnity payable and the insurance fees chargeable in connection with insured parcel-post packages for the Irish Free State have been fixed:

Limit of indemnity:	Fee, cents
For value not over \$10.....	15
From \$10.01 to \$25.....	20
From \$25.01 to \$50.....	30
From \$50.01 to \$100.....	50

(3) Every insured parcel must be packed in a manner adequate for the length of the journey and for the protection of contents. Any liquid, or any substance which easily liquefies, shall be packed in a double receptacle. Between the first receptacle (bottle, flask, pot, box, etc.) and the second (box of metal or of strong wood) shall be left a space which shall be filled with sawdust, bran, or other absorbent material in sufficient quantity to absorb the liquid contents in the case of breakage. Powders and dyes in powder form must be packed in lead-sealed metal containers, which containers must be inclosed in substantial outer covers, so as to afford the utmost protection to the accompanying mail matter.

(4) The responsibility of properly inclosing, packing, and sealing insured parcels rests upon the sender and the Postal Service will not assume liability for loss, rifling, or damage arising from defects which may not be observed at the time of posting.

(5) Parcels containing fragile articles shall be indorsed "Fragile." (See arts. 107, p. 19, and 158, 159, and 160, p. 131, July, 1925, Postal Guide.)

(6) All insured parcel-post packages exchanged with the Irish Free State must be closed and securely sealed, but the country of destination has the right to open them, including the right to break the seals, in order to inspect the contents. Insured parcels that have been so opened shall be closed again with official seals.

(7) Except in case of returned or redirected parcels, postage and fees must be prepaid.

(8) No insured parcel shall have written on it information as to the value of contents, although this may be stated in the accompanying customs declaration.

(9) The condition of each parcel at the time of receipt or dispatch shall be carefully noted and appropriate action taken if the article is not in good condition or other irregularities are noted.

(10) The labels or stamps on insured parcels must be so placed that they can not serve to conceal injury to the cover. They must not be folded over two sides of the cover so as to hide the edge.

(11) The name and address of the sender and of the addressee must be legibly and correctly written in every case when possible on the parcel itself, or on a label gummed thereto. Parcels will not be accepted when sent by or addressed to initials, unless the initials are the adopted trade name of the senders or the addressees. Addresses in ordinary pencil are not allowed, but copying ink or indelible pencil on a surface previously dampened may be used.

(12) Each insured parcel must be marked or labeled or stamped "Insured" in a conspicuous manner at the time of mailing. For this purpose the insurance

stamp used in the domestic parcel-post service should be used as far as practicable. The customs declaration, if not gummed to the parcel, must also be marked or labeled or stamped "Insured." Parcels marked "Insured" by other than the Postal Service, but not actually insured by the Postal Service, are not mailable.

(13) The insured parcels must bear consecutive insurance numbers. At the smaller offices the parcels can be numbered in the same series and recorded in the same Form 3813a (sender's receipt for insured mail) as the domestic insured parcels. At larger offices it will probably be advisable to use a separate series of numbers for insured parcel-post packages for the Irish Free State and to record them on a separate Form 3813, or firm mailing record if used, to facilitate rendition of statistical reports or for other reasons. The insurance number should be legibly written immediately below the indorsement "Insured."

(14) The same records of mailing and delivery of insured parcel-post packages exchanged with the Irish Free State will be kept and the same particulars of the parcels entered on these records as are required for domestic insured mail.

(15) Senders' return receipts for insured parcels mailed in the United States addressed to the Irish Free State will be furnished only upon request therefor by the sender and upon payment of a fee of 5 cents in stamps affixed, in addition to the postage and insurance fee, for each receipt requested at the time of mailing. A fee of 10 cents is charged for return receipts requested subsequent to mailing. When a return receipt is desired the article shall be marked in a conspicuous manner, "Return receipt requested" or with the letters "A. R." See instructions in paragraphs 15, 16, and 17, pages 35 and 36 of the November, 1924, Postal Guide, which are equally applicable to return receipts for insured parcels addressed to the Irish Free State.

(16) The insured parcels will be handled in transit between United States post offices of origin or delivery and the authorized United States exchange offices of dispatch or receipt in the same manner as domestic insured mail; that is, without being recorded or receipted for *in transit* between such offices. It is the intention that these insured parcel-post packages shall be dispatched in the same manner as ordinary (uninsured) international parcel-post packages for the Irish Free State, but that when they reach the United States exchange post offices which make up authorized direct dispatches of ordinary international parcel-post packages for parcel-post exchange offices in the Irish Free State the insured parcels will be billed to the Irish Free State by the United States exchange offices in the manner hereinafter prescribed.

(17) Parcels bearing evidence of violation or damage must have the facts noted on them and be postmarked with the stamp of the office making the note or a notice drawing attention to the violation must be forwarded with the parcel.

(18) Insured parcels from the Irish Free State shall be delivered in accordance with the domestic registry delivery regulations, a return receipt being obtained when requested by the sender or when the article is accompanied by a return receipt form.

(19) Return receipts or advices of delivery after being completed, shall be returned direct to the sender by ordinary mail without charge for postage.

(20) In the absence of a request by the sender to the contrary, an insured parcel which can not be delivered shall be returned to the sender without previous notification. New postage as well as new insurance fees, in the case of insured parcels (which must be returned in the same kind of mail as received) will be collected from the sender and retained by the country making the collection.

(21) Undeliverable insured parcels which the sender has marked "Abandon" may be sold at auction at the expiration of 30 days, but in case such disposition is made of insured parcels proper record will be made and the country of origin shall also be notified when for any reason an insured parcel which is not delivered is not returned to the country of origin.

(22) Records shall be kept showing dates and particulars of disposition of undelivered or redirected insured parcels. See amended section 1076½, paragraphs 12 and 13, regarding additional postage and insurance for the return and redirection of insured parcels exchanged between the United States and the Irish Free State.

(23) A fee of 10 cents to be paid by stamps affixed to the request shall be charged on a request for information as to the disposition of an insured parcel for the Irish Free State made after the parcel has been mailed if the sender has not already paid a fee for a sender's return receipt and the same charge shall be made for other inquiries or complaints in connection with such mail unless the sender is able to show *prima facie* loss or other irregularity through fault of the Postal Service. (See secs. 634, 1000 (h) and 1076¾.)

TREATMENT AT EXCHANGE OFFICES

(24) Insured parcels for the Irish Free State dispatched from exchange post offices in the United States authorized to make up direct parcel-post mails for authorized parcel-post exchange offices in the Irish Free State will be listed on manifold parcel-post bill book, Form 2968, to show the insurance number given the parcel at the office of origin and name of the United States post office and State of origin of each insured parcel, together with such other particulars as are required for ordinary (uninsured) international parcel-post packages dispatched to the Irish Free State. Insured parcels shall be entered on separate parcel bills and the insured parcels shall be listed individually. The entry on the bill of any returned parcel must be followed by the word "Returned."

(25) The heading of the bill (Form 2968) used for *insured* parcels should be changed to read "Insured parcels from the United States for _____" and the heading of the column provided for "Registered number" should be made to read "Insured number." The bills are to be consecutively numbered in the upper left-hand corner commencing each year a fresh series for each office of destination. The last number of the year shall be shown on the parcel bill for the first dispatch of the following year.

(26) The insured parcels shall be inclosed in separate sacks from the ordinary (uninsured). The labels of sacks containing the insured parcels shall be marked with the letter "V" to indicate that they contain insured (*valeur declaree*) parcels.

(27) The United States exchange offices making dispatch of the insured parcels direct to the Irish Free State are not required to affix an adhesive label bearing the word "Insured" to each parcel as is required in the case of insured parcels for Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

(28) On the receipt of a Parcel Mail the receiving office of exchange shall check it. The insured parcels must be carefully compared with the accompanying bills. Any discrepancies or irregularities noted shall be immediately reported to the dispatching office of exchange by means of a bulletin of verification. Such record will also be kept as will permit of the furnishing of information regarding the matter in connection with any subsequent investigation or claim for indemnity. If report is not made promptly, it will be assumed that the mail and the accompanying bills were in every respect in proper order. If a parcel bill is missing, a duplicate shall be made out and a copy sent to the dispatching office of exchange from which the dispatch was received.

(29) The records of mailing and delivery and the exchange office records of insured parcels exchanged with the Irish Free State shall be retained for at least three years before being disposed of.

INDEMNITY

(30) No indemnity will be paid for insured parcels which contain matter of no intrinsic value nor for perishable matter or matter prohibited transmission in the parcel-post mails exchanged between the United States and the Irish Free State or which did not conform to the stipulations of the convention between these countries or which were not posted in the manner prescribed.

(31) No indemnity will be paid for insured parcels which can not be accounted for in consequence of the destruction of official documents through causes beyond control.

(32) No compensation shall be given for loss, injury, or damage consequential upon, i. e., indirectly arising from, the loss, nondelivery, or misdelivery of any insured parcel transmitted under the convention between the United States and the Irish Free State.

(33) In case the sender, addressee, or owner of an insured parcel, or his representative, shall at any time knowingly allege the contents to be above their real value, or whenever any false, fictitious, or fraudulent evidence is knowingly and willfully introduced, the Postal Service responsible for the indemnity reserves the right without any refund of fee or postage to decline to pay indemnity or to pay such indemnity as may in its discretion be considered equitable in the light of the evidence procured. The enforcement of this rule shall not prejudice any legal proceedings to which such fraudulent evidence may have rendered the claimant liable.

(34) Neither the postal administration of the United States nor that of the Irish Free State is bound to pay indemnity in case of loss or damage due to force majeure under any particular definitions of that term unless the other administration will assume liability reciprocally under the same definitions of the term,

although either country may at its option and without recourse to the other country, pay indemnity for losses or damages occurring through force majeure under any definition of that term.

(35) The parcel-post convention between the United States and the Irish Free State stipulates that all matters concerning the exchange, the obtaining and disposition of return receipts for insured parcels and the adjustment of indemnity claims in connection therewith not covered by the convention shall be governed by the provisions of the Universal Postal Union Convention and the Detailed Regulations for its Execution in so far as they are applicable and not inconsistent with the provisions of the parcel-post convention between the United States and the Irish Free State, and then, if no other arrangement has been made the internal legislation, regulations, and rulings of the United States and the Irish Free State, according to the country involved, shall govern.

(36) Postmasters are requested to give as much publicity to the establishment of this insured mail service with the Irish Free State as it is practicable to do without expense to the department, and postal employees should encourage the insurance of international parcel-post packages for the Irish Free State.

CUSTOMS DECLARATIONS ATTACHED TO PARCELS ACCEPTED FOR INSURANCE TO GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND MUST BE STAMPED "INSURED" BY THE MAILING OFFICE

Postmasters are reminded that it should not be understood that the instructions contained in article 13, page 35, of the November, 1924, Postal Guide, which state "The customs declaration, if not gummed to the parcel, must also be marked 'Insured,'" require exchange offices to stamp "Insured" on the customs declarations attached to insured parcels received for dispatch to Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

It is incumbent upon the offices of mailing to stamp "Insured" on the customs declarations at the time the parcels are so stamped, and it is requested therefore that all postmasters concerned be governed accordingly.

INSURED PARCELS ADDRESSED TO GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND MUST BE SECURELY SEALED

The postal administration of Great Britain has called the attention of the department to the fact that a large number of insured parcels merely tied with strings or sealed with gummed strips of paper have been received from this country, whereas the parcel-post agreement between Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States provides that all insured parcels exchanged must be closed and securely sealed with wax or otherwise.

It will be noted that the parcel-post agreement referred to, as well as article 6, page 35, of the November, 1924, Postal Guide, requires that all insured parcels exchanged between the United States and Great Britain be closed and securely sealed with wax or otherwise. It is requested therefore that all postmasters take appropriate steps to have this requirement strictly complied with.

USE OF SPECIAL-DELIVERY SERVICE INSTEAD OF REGISTRY SERVICE IN TRANSMITTING VALUABLE MATTER TO BE DISCOURAGED

It has come to the attention of the department that some patrons, being under the impression that special-delivery matter receives the same protection as registered matter, transmit valuable matter by special delivery instead of by registered mail.

Postmasters and postal employees are requested to give as much publicity as is practicable to the fact that the main object of the special-delivery service is speed in delivery, whereas the main object of the registry service is safety in transmission; that ordinary special-delivery mail does not receive the safeguard furnished registered mail, and that an article, where safety rather than speed is desired, should be registered instead of being sent special delivery.

PAYMENT OF POSTAGE AT THE LOCAL RATE IN CONNECTION WITH TELEGRAPHIC REQUESTS FOR THE ALTERATION OR CANCELLATION OF CHARGES ON DOMESTIC C. O. D. PARCELS

On pages 18 and 19 of the April, 1926, Postal Guide, a notice was issued under the heading "Requests for alteration or cancellation of charges on domestic C. O. D. parcels, or for delivery to other than the addressee, to be accompanied by postage at the local rate," calling the attention of the service to the provisions of article 203, page 137, of the July, 1925, Postal Guide. Since the issuance of that notice a number of inquiries have been received requesting advice as to the method to be followed in securing the payment of postage at the local rate in connection with telegraphic requests for the alteration or cancellation of the charges on C. O. D. parcels. The following instructions are furnished for the guidance of the service in such cases:

When authorization to alter or release the charges on C. O. D. parcels is made by telegraph it will be necessary for the sender to prepay the additional postage at the local rate for the second attempt at delivery which may be involved, or for such amount to be collected from the addressee upon delivery, except in those instances where the telegram is received by the postmaster at the office of address before one attempt at delivery has been made.

If the sender requests that the charges on a C. O. D. parcel be altered or released by telegraph, and does not desire that the addressee be required to pay the additional postage at the local rate involved in the event one attempt at delivery has been made before the receipt of the telegram, he should pay the local rate of postage to the postmaster at the office of mailing. In such cases, the telegram should include, in addition to the other essential matter, the following words: "Confirmation and postage follows." The postage at the local rate should then be sent to the postmaster at the address office, by means of uncanceled postage stamps, with the Form 3818 or letter confirming the telegram. As the parcel ordinarily will have been delivered before the postage at the local rate reaches the address office the postmaster at that office will be expected, in such cases, to affix postage stamps to the parcel and cancel the same to cover the charge for the second attempt at delivery, and then, when the postage stamps are received by him from the mailing office with the confirmation of the telegram he will place the same in his stamp stock to replace the stamps affixed to the parcel involved in the transaction.

REASONS FOR NONDELIVERY MUST BE SHOWN ON INSURED AND C. O. D. PARCELS RETURNED TO SENDERS

Postmasters should see to it that insured and C. O. D. parcels returned to senders are properly indorsed to show the reasons for their nondelivery as required by section 615 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924. Reports are continually being received indicating that postmasters frequently fail to comply with this regulation. Negligence in this respect brings forth bitter complaints from the senders and subjects the service to unfavorable criticism.

With a view to improving this feature of the service it is requested that postmasters report on Form 3826-A to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails, instances which come to their attention where returned insured or C. O. D. parcels were not properly indorsed with the reasons for their nondelivery.

LOSSES MINIMIZED BY CAREFUL PACKING AND ADDRESSING

A very gratifying report was recently received from the postmaster at Detroit, Mich., regarding the small number of losses or damages sustained by one of his large mailers in connection with their insured parcels. This report shows that the firm involved mails more than 5,000 insured parcels annually and that they have approximately only one case of loss or damage a year. The firm attributes the small percentage of packages lost or damaged to the care exercised by them in packing and addressing their parcels.

Such an unusual and remarkable record demonstrates the satisfactory results which may be obtained from adequate packing and careful addressing of parcels,

and is brought to the attention of the service in order that postmasters may mention it in commending careful packing and addressing of parcels to their patrons who may suffer numerous losses or damages because of their failure to exercise the proper degree of care in preparing their parcels for mailing.

RECORDS OF RETURNED C. O. D. PARCELS TO BE SEARCHED IN CONNECTION WITH ALL CLAIMS FOR INDEMNITY ON ACCOUNT OF THE ALLEGED LOSS OF SUCH PARCELS

There was recently reported to the department an instance in which a considerable number of claims for indemnity were paid covering the alleged loss of C. O. D. parcels, the postmasters at the offices of address claiming in each instance that there was no record of the receipt of the parcel at their offices. As the evidence on hand in these cases indicated that the parcels had been lost in transit between the post office of mailing and post offices of address, the claims were accordingly paid. Later, when a search was made by the postmaster at the office of mailing of the records of C. O. D. parcels returned to senders, it was ascertained that many of these C. O. D. parcels, for which indemnity claims had been filed and indemnity actually paid, had in fact been returned and delivered to the senders. The amount of indemnity erroneously so paid was, of course, recovered from the senders.

Because of this disclosure a 30-day test was instituted at several of the larger offices whereby search was made of the records of returned C. O. D. parcels in connection with each claim for indemnity filed on account of the supposed loss of a C. O. D. parcel, regardless of whether the postmaster at office of address had record of the return thereof. As a result of this search record was found of the return of many C. O. D. parcels for which there was no record of receipt and return at the post offices of address and which the senders claimed were not received back by them.

The results of this test indicate that the department would be justified in requiring a similar search to be made at all mailing offices in connection with claims for indemnity on account of the alleged loss of C. O. D. parcels. Therefore, when claims for indemnity are instituted on account of the supposed loss of C. O. D. parcels, the mailing offices should search their records of returned C. O. D. parcels for a possible record of the return of the parcels. Where the mailing offices are also central accounting offices, this search need not be made until the claims are returned from the other offices involved for adjustment.

The Following Notices Were Issued from the Bureau of the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General

FIREARMS MUST BE GIVEN PROPER CARE

Numerous pistols and equipment used in connection with firearms have been returned to the department on account of having become defective. Upon examination the pistols have been found to have broken parts, have been allowed to become rusty, and show a general lack of attention; and such equipment as belts, ammunition pockets, etc., indicate that the defective condition is not due solely to ordinary wear and tear. When this equipment is turned over to the War Department for replacement or repair it is very carefully examined and if in the opinion of the ordnance experts the poor condition is due to negligence, a demand is made upon this department for payment to cover the cost of placing the materials in first-class condition.

Postmasters and other officials to whom firearms are issued are held responsible for their safe-keeping and general condition. Any charges that are made by the War Department for the repair of firearms or equipment, where it is shown that the condition is due to carelessness or negligence, will be collected from the party responsible.

Information has been received that the following articles are now prohibited in the regular and parcel-post mails to Palestine:

Advertisements concerning any treatment or preparation intended to prevent venereal diseases; arms (except sporting rifles, which may be imported by permission of the police authorities); salt; any preparation of hashish; any preparation of cannabis indica of the same nature as hashish; preparations of heroin containing more than 0.1 per cent of heroin; all derivatives of morphine, cocaine, or their salts; codeine, and any other alkaloid of opium which may be prescribed by order of the high commissioner; tinctures and extracts or other medicinal preparations of cannabis indica; shaving brushes exported from Japan, China, Manchuria, and Korea (Chosen); all essences and all extracts of oils destined or suitable for use in making adulterated or imitated beverages; carbon papers (same as Great Britain).

Articles admitted conditionally.—Saltpeter is admitted by permission of the police authorities. Preparations containing more than 0.2 per cent of morphine or more than 0.1 per cent of cocaine, including antiopium remedies, are admitted by authorization of the health department. Plants and live bees must be accompanied by a certificate signed by a competent agronomist of the country of origin, attesting that they are free from all maladies.

CHANGE No. 189.

The item "Switzerland" appearing on page 179 is modified by the following:
Information has been received that articles of gold and silver, precious stones, and jewels are now admissible in the regular (letter) mails to Switzerland.

CHANGE No. 190.

The following information supersedes that shown under the item "Tunis" on page 204 of the annual Postal Guide for 1925 and on page 81 of the October supplement.

The following transit rates will apply with respect to parcels addressed for delivery in Tunis:

CHANGE No. 191.

Customs declarations accompanying parcel-post packages destined for delivery in the Union of the Socialistic Soviet Republics must indicate in the proper columns information with respect to the commercial designation of the contents (individually for each article), quantity, and market value of the contents (each article), gross weight of the parcel, the exact address of both the sender and the addressee, and a statement as to whether or not the parcel is sent for commercial purposes.

Failure to observe the above-mentioned requirements will either result in the return of the parcel to the mailer or subject the addressee to a fine.

CHANGE No. 192.

The following should be added to the item "Greece," appearing on pages 172 and 227:

Effective at once, the following articles are prohibited in the regular and parcel-post mails to Greece:

Chocolate in any form, with or without cream; sweetmeats, with or without chocolate; iced fruits.

Furs (coats and other garments of any fabric, wholly or partly covered with fur on the inside or outside; boas, tippets, muffs, caps, and similar articles).

Artistic or decorative articles; Chinese or Japanese articles of any plastic material.

Decorative articles; small parlor articles of simple glass or combined with other common materials, mounted or unmounted.

Silk fabrics not specially named, weighing more than 45 grams per meter, of pure silk; fabrics of unbleached silk, natural color; embroideries, laces, edgings, ribbons, braids, fringes, galloons, cords, tassels, combined or separated of pure or mixed silk; hosiery and understockings, of pure or mixed silk; table covers, bed covers, curtains, and similar articles not otherwise specified, or pure or mixed silk or other materials; straps, garters, corsets, and similar articles, not otherwise specified, of pure silk or other materials; underclothing, handkerchiefs, gloves, and in general, any sewed article not otherwise specially named, of pure or mixed silk; garments of pure or mixed silk, for men, boys, women, and girls.

Ornamental feathers.

Artificial flowers, fruits, and foliage.

Umbrellas and parasols, of pure or mixed silk fabrics, with or without lace or embroidery.

CHANGE No. 193.

The following should be added to the item "China" appearing on pages 169 and 216:

The importation of bank notes, signed or blank, is admitted only with the special permission of the Ministry of Finance and the Customs Administration, communicated to the customs office of the port of entry by the Inspector General of Customs.

The Bank of China, the Bank of Communications, and foreign banks are, as an exceptional measure, authorized to import their own bank notes, signed or blank, without any special permission from the Ministry of Finance.

The importation of Russian bank notes, new or old, is strictly prohibited.

The importation of counterfeit bank notes is strictly prohibited.

CHANGE No. 194.

Effective at once, the following articles are prohibited in the regular (letter) mails to Italy:

Alkaloids of all kinds (salts of quinquina, etc.); albums of all kinds (of photographs, cards, postage stamps, etc.); apparatuses for lighting (tinder boxes, cigar lighters, gaslighters, etc.) and their parts, including flint stones for tinder boxes; arms of all kinds and detached parts of such arms; toys not made entirely of wood; roasted or ground coffee and its substitutes; footwear of all kinds; hair and articles made of hair; salted, smoked, or otherwise prepared meats; fats and bacon; playing cards of all kinds; torrefied chicory, ground or unground, and any other substance intended to replace coffee; ready-made clothes and sewed articles of all kinds, including lace and embroidery, handkerchiefs, mufflers, shawls, scarfs, sashes, needle work (including stockings and gloves), caps, head dresses, and hats of all kinds; cravats, and, in general, all articles of fashion; coral, mounted in any style; artificial flowers and fruits and their trimmings; phosphorus.

Compound medicines (including serum, vaccine, etc., and all other synthetic medicinal products of the same kind) and medicinal specialties (tablets, pills, capsules, syrups, and elixirs containing medicinal substances; salves, balms, tapers, etc.). These articles may be admitted to importation only by observing the provisions laid down by the Directorate General of Public Health (Ministry of the Interior), when the authorized firms or other persons, under truly exceptional circumstances, make the request.

Tobacco, except shipments addressed to the Ministry of Finance (Directorate General of Monopolies) at Rome.

Morocco leather goods (portfolios, cigar cases, bill folds, and other small articles made of various materials); measuring instruments; coins of all kinds; nutmegs; volatile oils and essences of all kinds; gold, silver, and platinum, in cylinders, in sheets, polished, carved or otherwise worked; timepieces and their parts or accessories; worked skins and furs; feathers, skins, and worked plumage of all kinds; plants, vines, vine cuttings with or without roots, vegetable and mixed composts; vegetable molds; precious stones; chemical products (acetic acid, salicylic acid and salicylates, nitrate of silver, nitrate of mercury, nitrate of bismuth, bromides and iodides). See also under saccharine; perfumery of all kinds (except soap); saccharine (benzoic sulphinide), products replacing saccharine (dulcina or sucrolo, cristalloso, zuecherin No. 20, etc.), and all products containing saccharine; sea salt and rock salt; musical instruments and their detached parts; vanilla; fans, saffron; empty receptacles, envelopes, labels bearing inscriptions relative to foreign medicinal specialties; foodstuffs of all kinds addressed to pupils in institutions for military instruction; unauthorized foodstuffs, liquids and clothing, addressed to prisoners in penal institutions, houses of correction, etc.

Wrongly admitted articles are returned to origin, except articles subject to high duties, which are confiscated under the domestic laws and regulations.

CHANGE No. 199.

The first sentence of section 23 on page 163 of the July, 1925, Postal Guide should be changed to read as follows:

Option and compulsory prepayment.—In order to be dispatched, letters for Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Mexico, Newfoundland, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Republic of Honduras, Salvador (El), Spain and its colonies, and Uruguay, must be prepaid one rate and other articles for those countries must be prepaid in full.

CHANGE No. 200.

Section 17 on page 161 of the July, 1925, Postal Guide should be changed to read as follows:

Pan American Union—Mails admitted free.—Mail matter originating at the Pan American Union, bearing the card of the Union and weighing not over 4 pounds 6 ounces, is admitted to the mails free of postage when addressed for delivery in Venezuela. Such mail matter may be sent under the same conditions but up to a weight limit of 8 pounds 12 ounces when addressed for delivery in Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Republic of Honduras, Salvador (El), and Uruguay.

AMENDMENTS TO POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

INSERT NO. 214. ORDER NO. 4042.

MARCH 27, 1926.

Paragraph 2, section 1223, Postal Laws and Regulations, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"2. Certificates thus numbered when issued shall bear the name of the issuing office, the date of issue, the name of the depositor, the number of his account, and the date on which interest begins. The stub of each certificate besides the serial number shall show the depositor's account number, date of issue, and initials of the issuing clerk. In entering dates on certificates, the month, day, and year shall be written or stamped in the spaces provided, thus: August 1, 1917. The name of the month may be abbreviated, but should not be indicated by figures. The depositor's name shall be written as signed on the application (Form PS 600). No entries shall be made on certificates except as authorized by these regulations. (For correction of errors see sec. 1225.)"

INSERT NO. 215. ORDER NO. 4058.

APRIL 2, 1926.

Section 1273½ of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended so as to add paragraphs 6 and 7 as follows:

"6. *It appearing*, That pursuant to the provisions of section 5 of the act approved July 28, 1916 (39 Stat. 412, 425), the Canadian National Railway Company (as lessee of the Grand Trunk New England lines, namely, Atlantic & St. Lawrence Railway and Norway Branch, and Lewiston & Auburn Railway), and the Tonapah & Goldfield Railroad Company, railway common carriers engaged in transporting mail matter of the United States, filed their applications on October 25, 1924, and February 16, 1925, respectively, for reexamination of the facts and circumstances surrounding the transportation of mail upon their lines;

"*And it further appearing*, That a full investigation of the matters and things involved has been had, and that said division, on the date hereof, has made and filed a report containing its findings of facts and conclusions thereon, which said report is hereby referred to and made a part hereof:

"*It is ordered*, That the rates of pay for the transportation of mail matter fixed and determined by us and established by our order entered December 13, 1923, in *Railway Mail Pay*, 85 I. C. C. 157, for application to the New England lines named therein, be, and they are hereby, established as the fair and reasonable rates for the transportation of mail matter by the Canadian National Railway Company, lessee of the Grand Trunk New England lines as specified in the first paragraph hereof, on and after October 25, 1924.

"*It is further ordered*, That the rates of pay for the transportation of mail matter fixed and determined by us and established by our order entered January 22, 1925, in *Railway Mail Pay*, 95 I. C. C. 493, for application to intermountain and Pacific coast short lines named therein, be, and they are hereby, established as the fair and reasonable rates for the transportation of mail matter by the Tonapah & Goldfield Railroad Company on and after February 16, 1925.

"*It is further ordered*, That rates established by the supplementary orders entered herein on June 7, 1925, and September 26, 1925, be, and they are hereby established as the just and reasonable rates to be received by the Tonapah & Goldfield Railroad Company for the future for the units of space specified in said supplementary orders. (Order of the Interstate Commerce Commission of February 25, 1926.)

"7. The rates fixed in paragraph 6 of this section will be made effective from February 25, 1926, instead of October 25, 1924, and February 16, 1925, in accordance with the ruling of the Comptroller General."

APRIL 14, 1926.

INSERT No. 216. ORDER No. 4086.

Section 624, Postal Laws and Regulations, edition of 1924, is amended by adding the following as paragraph 3:

"3. Postmasters at ports of arrival of mail from foreign countries may deliver any matter in such mail directed to any other post office to the person addressed upon being satisfied of his identity."

INSERT No. 217. ORDER No. 4113.

Section 705, Postal Laws and Regulations, is amended to read as follows:
 "At second-class and third-class offices appointments of village carriers shall be made under the civil-service rules from the eligible list furnished by the Civil Service Commission. (See sec. 339.) Nominations shall be submitted on Form 1531, through the district civil-service secretary, to the First Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Post Office Service. All changes at second-class and third-class offices shall be reported on Form 1532 to the First Assistant Postmaster General. (See sec. 44 as to the removal of classified employees.)"

Section 706, paragraph 2, is rescinded.

INSERT No. 219. ORDER No. 4142.

A new international parcel-post convention has been concluded between the United States and the Irish Free State which makes provision for the insurance, reciprocally, of ordinary international parcel-post packages exchanged between the United States and the Irish Free State. This insured mail service is to become effective May 1, 1926. Detailed instructions for its conduct and for the treatment of indemnity claims in connection therewith will be issued by the Third Assistant Postmaster General (Division of Registered Mails).

Effective May 1, 1926, the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 are amended as indicated below:

Paragraph 2 of section 1072 is further amended to read:

2. Parcels addressed to foreign countries other than Mexico can not be sent collect on delivery. They can not be sent as insured mail to any foreign country other than Canada, Great Britain, and Northern Ireland, Newfoundland (including Labrador), and the Irish Free State. (For insurance service with Canada and Newfoundland, see sec. 1076; with Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Irish Free State, sec. 1076½; for C. O. D. service with Mexico, sec. 1074½.)

INSERT No. 220. ORDER No. 4142.

APRIL 28, 1926.

* * * * *
 Add a new subheading and the following paragraphs, Nos. 7 to 15, to section 1076½:

INSURED MAIL SERVICE WITH THE IRISH FREE STATE

7. Mailable international parcel-post packages exchanged between the United States (including Alaska, Hawaii, Porto Rico, Guam, Samoa, and the Virgin Islands of the United States, but excluding the Philippine Islands and the Canal Zone), and the Irish Free State may be insured.

8. The insurance of all parcel-post packages exchanged between the United States and the Irish Free State, containing coin, bullion, valuable jewelry, or any other precious article is obligatory. If a parcel containing such matter is mailed uninsured, it shall be placed under insurance by the post office which first observes the fact of its having been mailed uninsured.

9. The limits of indemnity payable and insurance fees chargeable in addition to the postage for insured parcel-post packages for the Irish Free State are as follows:

Limit of indemnity:	Cents
For value not over \$10.....	15
From \$10.01 to \$25.....	20
From \$25.01 to \$50.....	30
From \$50.01 to \$100.....	50

10. The limit of indemnity payable in connection with insured parcels mailed in the Irish Free State addressed to the United States is 20 pounds sterling.

11. A sender's return receipt for an insured parcel addressed to the Irish Free State may be obtained upon request therefor and payment of the required fee. (See sec. 1076¾ concerning charges for sender's return receipts and inquiries and complaints in connection with international insured parcels.)

12. When an insured parcel mailed in the United States is returned or redirected thereto, additional postage and a new insurance fee equal to that originally paid shall be collected upon delivery.

13. An insured parcel from the Irish Free State redirected to an address within the United States is subject to additional postage at the domestic parcel-post (zone) rate, and an additional insurance fee equal to the fee required in the domestic parcel-post service for a parcel of the value mentioned in the accompanying customs declaration, within the limit of indemnity payable. If the additional fee and postage are not prepaid, the parcel will be marked "Collect—postage and fee," and the amount due collected on delivery and recorded. When an insured parcel from the Irish Free State is delivered to an alternate addressee at the original office of address, additional postage (but not fee) computed at the domestic local rate, shall be collected.

14. Except in cases of loss or damage through force majeure (causes beyond control) as that term is defined by the legal decisions or rulings of the country in which the loss or damage occurs, when an insured parcel addressed to, or received from the Irish Free State, has been lost or damaged or all or part of its contents rifled, the sender or other rightful claimant shall be entitled to an indemnity corresponding to the actual amount, based on the actual value at the time of mailing, of the loss, rifling, or damage, unless the loss, rifling, or damage has risen from the fault or negligence of the sender or the addressee or the representative of either, or from the nature of the article, provided always that the indemnity does not exceed the sum for which the parcel was insured and for which the required insurance fee was paid in the country of origin.

15. No application for indemnity will be entertained unless a claim or an initial inquiry, oral or written, shall be filed by claimant or his representative within a year commencing with the day following the posting of the insured parcel.

NOTE.—See official Postal Guides for detailed instructions concerning the insurance service with the Irish Free State and indemnity in connection therewith.

97½ PER CENT BASIS

The 2½ per cent deducted for the retirement fund can not be expended, and must revert to the Department at the end of each quarter.

This is mandatory and must be followed in connection with the employment of substitute clerks and laborers in first and second class post offices and substitute carriers in city and village delivery services, except in the case of the employment of temporary substitutes, under Civil Service Rule VIII, who are not entitled to the benefits of the retirement law and their compensation is not subject to deductions for the retirement fund.

Read carefully and observe strictly instructions appearing in the November 5, 1925, issue of the *Postal Bulletin* and on page 6 of the November, 1925, Supplement to the *Postal Guide*, under the heading "Auxiliary Expenditures, Including Vacations, 97½ per cent."
