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

The Following Notices Were Issued from the Office of the Postmaster General

HARRY S. NEW, POSTMASTER GENERAL

CONDITIONS UPON WHICH MAILINGS OF CERTAIN MATTER WILL BE ACCEPTED UNDER PERMIT WITHOUT STAMPS AFFIXED AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 452, POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

(Effective April 1, 1927)

Permits will be issued to those whose mail is to be sent, and the matter will be accepted for mailing, including that addressed to all foreign countries in the Universal Postal Union, under the provisions of the regulation above mentioned and under the following conditions:

1. *All matter permit matter.*—All matter mailed without stamps affixed under this section is permit matter, regardless of the device by means of which the indicia are printed thereon. The indicia required on such matter may be printed by means of a printing press, multigraph, or other device. For convenience in referring to the different kinds of permit matter, that on which the indicia are printed by means of a device having recording mechanism to be set by the postmaster for a given number of impressions and which automatically locks when such impressions have been exhausted is commonly referred to as "Metered permit mail," while that on which the indicia are printed by means of a printing press or other device not set by the postmaster is called "Nonmetered permit mail." The following conditions apply to both kinds of permit mail except where otherwise specifically indicated.

2. *Application for permit.*—Persons or firms desiring permits for mailing without stamps affixed first, third, or fourth class matter, or second-class matter chargeable with the transient rate or the rates applicable to copies mailed for local delivery by carrier at letter-carrier offices should apply to the postmaster personally or through a representative who is thoroughly informed as to the matter to be mailed and authorized to act for the applicant.


When it is desired to use for printing the indicia, a device having recording mechanism to be set by the postmaster for a given number of impressions, and which automatically locks when such impressions have been exhausted, the application must give the name of and full particulars concerning the device and be accompanied with a sample of the envelopes to be used.

All applications for permits for first-class matter must be sent to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification, and be accompanied with a specimen imprint of the indicia to be used on the mailings.


3. (a) *Indicia.*—In the upper right corner of the face or address side of the envelope, wrapper, address label, or tag of each separately addressed piece mailed under the provisions of this section must be printed the indicia in the form and within the sizes prescribed below, and such indicia must not be obstructed or confused with any other matter whatever.

(b) On first-class matter the amount of postage paid in money, permit number, name of the post office, and date of mailing shall be printed in one of the Forms, A, B, or C, and approximately of the size indicated below, the diameter of the outer circle to be not less than $1\frac{1}{16}$ inches and the entire indicia to extend over not more than 4 inches nor less than 3 inches.

FORM A, FOR DEVICE NOT SET BY POSTMASTER




FORM B, FOR DEVICE NOT SET BY POSTMASTER





(c) On matter of the second, third, or fourth class the forms prescribed for first-class matter may be used by omitting the date and, in the case of Form A, omitting the words "First-class mail," or the form may be as indicated in D. In case Form D is used the figure representing the amount paid in money shall be printed from type whose face is not smaller than 14 point nor larger than 36 point and the other indicia not smaller than 10 point nor larger than 24 point:

(d) The indicia for first-class matter shall be in red, or, at the mailer's option, of a color corresponding to that of a postage stamp of the denomination representing the amount of postage shown in the indicia.

The indicia for matter of the second, third, and fourth classes shall be in black or, at the mailer's option, of a color corresponding to that of a postage stamp of the denomination representing the amount of postage paid.

In all cases the permit indicia on matter addressed to those countries of the Universal Postal Union to which matter is not mailable under the domestic conditions and rates of postage must be in red.

(e) The name of the postal station of the mailing office at which the matter is presented for mailing may, if desired, be shown in the outer circle in connection

with the name of the post office; also an hour may be shown in the indicia in connection with the date of mailing of first-class matter, and in such case the matter should be presented for mailing in ample time to be dispatched at the hour so indicated.

4. (a) *Preparation and presentation of matter for mailing.*—Each separately addressed piece should bear, in the upper left corner of the address side, the name and address of the sender, including the street address or number of his post-office box when the office is one having letter-carrier service. If, however, the sender does not desire to show his name or street address, or either, in the return card, the number of a post-office box rented by him may, in the case of ordinary mail, be shown in lieu thereof in connection with the name of the post office and State. When the sender desires to omit the return card from third-class matter and does not care to have the matter retained if undeliverable, the matter may be so accepted provided it is not inclosed in window envelopes, but this practice is discouraged since it is desirable to have the return card in all cases. Matter other than that of the first class must be wrapped or enveloped so as to be easy of inspection by postal officials.

(b) To facilitate the handling of such matter in the mails, the mailer must in all cases face the matter, and in the case of matter of the second, third, or fourth class must comply with requests of the postmaster for the separation thereof into States, cities, etc. Matter of the first class, especially large mailings of identical pieces, should, as a means of cooperation, also be so separated by the mailer in cases where this is practicable, and such separation will expedite its handling and dispatch.

(c) The matter, regardless of its class or kind of device used in printing the indicia, must be presented at the post office or station thereof designated by the postmaster. In no case may such matter be deposited in street letter boxes.

In a few unusual situations where it seems to be advantageous to the post office itself, certain "pick-up" arrangements exist. While the department does not favor the "pick-up" system as applied to private mailing, and aims eventually to eliminate this entirely, nevertheless, where such cases exist and the mailer desires to change from the stamp system to the permit system, the "pick-up" privilege may be continued in the discretion of the department under such arrangements and precautions as may be prescribed in each case, but in no instance may the matter be picked up unless turned over to the "pick-up" carrier by the mailer or his representative together with the statement of mailing provided for herein.

Matter of the second and third classes must be presented in quantities of not less than 300 identical pieces and matter of the fourth class in quantities of not less than 250 identical pieces.

It is not required that the individual pieces of first-class matter be identical as to contents or weight.

In the case of first-class matter on which the indicia are printed by means of a device set by the postmaster, each mailing should consist of not less than 100 pieces.

Each mailing of first-class matter on which the indicia are printed by some other means should, in order to make it advantageous to the postal service as well as the mailer, consist of not less than 300 pieces. When, however, in occasional instances a mailer whose mailings of such first-class matter ordinarily consist of 300 pieces or more may have a smaller quantity, or when in order to cooperate with the Postal Service a mailer whose total daily mailings may not be much in excess of 300 pieces, presents a portion thereof early in the day, such mailings will be accepted, provided it will be to the mutual advantage of the mailer and the Postal Service to do so.

The pieces comprising a mailing of first-class matter must be separated according to postage paid—i. e., those subject to 2 cents each to be in one lot, those subject to 4 cents each in another lot, and so on.

Each mailing, regardless of the kind of device used in printing the indicia, must be accompanied with a statement on Form 3602 for nonmetered permit mail and on Form 3602-A for metered permit mail, signed by the person to whom the permit is issued, showing the permit number, the class of matter, the number of pieces then presented, and when the pieces are identical the weight of a single piece.

When a mailing of first, second, third, or fourth class matter extends over two or more consecutive days and the number of pieces presented on the last day to complete the mailing is less than above prescribed, or in the case of first-class matter a day's mailing may, for the reasons above set forth, consist of less than the minimum number of pieces prescribed, such number will be accepted, and, in

the case of matter on which the indicia are printed by a device not set by the postmaster, an explanatory indorsement made on receipt Form 3603, as contemplated by paragraph 6, section 452, Postal Laws and Regulations.

(d) Each separately addressed package may contain a number of different pieces, but every package in a mailing of second, third, or fourth class matter must contain exactly the same matter; that is, be "identical." The parcels in a mailing of identical pieces of fourth-class matter may be addressed to different zones.

(e) When matter of the first, second, or third class mailed without stamps affixed, either of the metered or nonmetered kind, is accepted for registration it shall bear on the address side the complete indicia prescribed in paragraph 3 of these conditions, except that in the case of first-class matter the date of mailing shall be omitted from the circle containing the name of the post office and State, and it shall be postmarked on the back of the envelope as provided by paragraph 3, section 874, Postal Laws and Regulations.

5. (a) *Verification of mailer's statement.*—Mailings of second, third, and fourth class matter, regardless of the means by which the indicia are printed thereon, must be verified by one of the methods set forth on the front cover page of the book of receipts, Form 3603, preferably by the weight and ratio process.

(b) In the case of first-class matter where the indicia are printed by means of a device having recording mechanism set by the postmaster and the statement of the mailer shows the readings of the ascending and descending registers, together with the number of pieces, such examinations shall be made as will enable the receiving employees to ascertain that the particular mailing presented is from an authorized metered permit holder, that the impressions of permit indicia on individual pieces are of the requisite denomination to pay the full postage chargeable, that the date and hour of mailing indicated in the indicia are right and that the matter otherwise complies with the postal requirements. Each mailing shall be examined to such extent as may be necessary to satisfy the postmaster or the employees designated to receive the matter that the number of pieces as shown by the statement is correct. At least once a week all the pieces comprising such a mailing shall be carefully verified by applying the weight and ratio process or, if this is not sufficiently accurate, by making a hand count or by running the pieces through a canceling machine after removing the canceling device.

(c) When the indicia on first-class matter are printed by means of a device not having recording mechanism to be set by the postmaster each mailing shall be examined to see that it is from an authorized permit holder, that the impressions of permit indicia are of the requisite denomination to pay the full postage, that the date and hour of mailing shown in the indicia are right, that the matter otherwise complies with postal requirements, and each mailing shall be carefully verified in such manner as may be necessary in order to determine the number of pieces therein and whether they correspond with the number shown in the mailer's statement so as to ascertain the proper amount of postage to be collected or charged against the mailer's deposit. If the pieces comprising such mailings are approximately identical as to weight, they may be verified by the weight and ratio process set forth in the instructions on the front cover page of the book of receipts, Form 3603. When the pieces comprising such mailings are not approximately identical as to weight, they may, nevertheless, be verified by the weight and ratio process if by reason of the fact that they run approximately uniform it is practical to verify them in such manner. If it is not practical so to verify them, they shall be verified by such means as will establish the correctness of the mailer's statement either by actual count of the pieces or by running them through a canceling machine after removing therefrom the canceling device.

(d) For the purpose of making such examinations and verifications provided for herein the postmaster shall designate some convenient place in his office to which all such mailings shall be brought; and he shall place in charge of such work some responsible employee or employees whose duty it shall be to personally receive such mailings and make such examinations and verifications thereof.

The purpose of such examinations and verifications is to determine the accuracy of the count, to detect possible frauds, and, in short, to secure fully paid and prepaid postage.

(e) All first-class matter, irrespective of the kind of device by means of which the indicia are printed, should be handled and dispatched as promptly as the facilities available will permit.

(f) The attention of postmasters is directed to their full responsibilities in these respects.

6. (a) *Postage.*—The postage at the rate applicable to the class to which the particular matter belongs is chargeable upon each piece or package for a separate address, the same as if paid by stamps affixed thereto. Postage in full on the entire quantity must be paid at or before the time the matter is presented for mailing, either in money, or, at the option of the postmaster and at his risk, by check drawn to his order. The postmaster may in the case of matter on which the indicia are printed by a device not to be set by the postmaster receive from the mailer a deposit of money in advance (for which a special receipt shall be given) sufficient to pay for more than a single mailing. The deposit shall be charged with the proper amount of each mailing, but if the amount on hand is not sufficient at any time to cover the postage due on the entire mailing, the excess shall be held until an additional deposit is made. Credit for postage shall never be allowed.

(b) When, after special authority to do so has been obtained in the manner indicated in paragraph 2, the indicia required on first-class matter mailed under permit without stamps affixed are printed on the matter by means of a device having mechanism that may be set for a designated number of impressions showing the amount of postage paid and which, after the exhaustion of such number of impressions, automatically locks itself so that no further impressions can be made until reset, the mailer must bring the printing or numbering head to the post office and have the postmaster set it for a given number of impressions, the amount of postage to cover the number of such impressions to be paid at the time the device is set. All the keys to the device must remain in the custody of the postmaster. In such case a receipt for the amount so collected will be issued to the mailer on Form 3603 instead of a receipt for each mailing as presented; but the mailer must submit with each mailing a "statement of mailing" on Form 3602-A, such statement to be verified in the manner set forth in paragraph 5 (b).

(c) The postage must be fully prepaid and the indicia should show the correct amount, but when in the case of mail on which the indicia are printed by a device set by the postmaster there is an occasional instance in which through inadvertence or unavoidable cause the indicia do not show the full amount chargeable on the matter, the additional postage may be paid with stamps affixed. The senders should not, however, intentionally prepare matter for mailing with postage prepaid by two methods, as this is objectionable and not sanctioned.

7. *Improper use of permit indicia.*—Envelopes, wrappers, labels, or tags bearing permit indicia must not be used for distributing matter OTHERWISE THAN THROUGH THE MAIL, AND MAY NOT BE USED AT A POST OFFICE OTHER THAN THE ONE THE NAME OF WHICH APPEARS IN THE INDICIA. Permits will be revoked in cases of the misuse of such envelopes, wrappers, etc.

8. *Monthly statement to mailer.*—A monthly statement showing the number of mailings during the month and the amount of postage paid thereon will be sent TO THE HOLDER OF EACH PERMIT. This provides the sender of the mail with a means of checking and verifying the sums charged him for postage. If no mailings were made during the month, the statement should be so indorsed.

9. *Refunds.*—When impressions paid for in connection with a device set by a postmaster can not be used because of misprints, spoiled envelopes, or cards, etc., an application for a refund of the postage to the extent of 90 per cent of the face value of such impressions up to and including the 2-cent denomination and to the extent of 95 per cent of the face value of impressions of greater denominations, if accompanied with the envelopes or cards bearing complete impressions, will be considered under the provisions of section 456, Postal Laws and Regulations.

10. For any further information or instructions regarding the acceptance of permit matter postmasters should address the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification.

AMENDMENT TO FEDERAL COMPENSATION ACT

The following notice has been received from the United States Employees' Compensation Commission, which is published for the information of all postal employees:

UNITED STATES EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION COMMISSION,
Washington, March 11, 1927.

To the Heads of all Departments and Establishments:

The commission desires to call attention to the amendment to the Federal compensation act, which amendment was approved February 12, 1927, Public No. 603. A copy of same is inclosed herewith.

It will be noted that the following changes are made: Compensation on account of total disability is two-thirds of employee's monthly pay, not to exceed a maximum of \$116.67, instead of \$66.67 as formerly, and not less than a minimum of \$58.33, instead of \$33.33 as formerly, except that compensation can not exceed the monthly pay.

In computing compensation on account of death the pay must be considered to be not more than \$175 per month, instead of \$100 as formerly nor less than \$87.50, instead of \$50 as formerly, but the total monthly compensation must not exceed the pay of deceased at the time of injury. The percentage rates of compensation to dependents in death cases remain the same, but such percentages now apply to the increased bases.

Burial expenses, in case where death results from the injury within six years, are now payable, in a sum not to exceed \$200, in the discretion of the commission, instead of the sum of \$100 as formerly.

The only other change contained in the amendment is the definition of the term "widow," the new language in this definition now including, "or living apart for reasonable cause or by reason of his desertion."

All of the above changes are effective on and after February 12, 1927, the date of approval.

The commission would appreciate your advising all of the bureaus and services in your department or establishment, including the officials in the field service, of these changes in the law.

The amendment above referred to is as follows:

[PUBLIC—No. 603—69TH CONGRESS]

[H. R. 11325]

AN ACT To amend an act entitled "An act to provide compensation for employees of the United States suffering injuries while in the performance of their duties, and for other purposes," approved September 7, 1916, and acts in amendment thereof.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section 6 of the act entitled "An act to provide compensation for employees of the United States suffering injuries while in the performance of their duties, and for other purposes," approved September 7, 1916, and acts in amendment thereof, is amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 6. That the monthly compensation for total disability shall not be more than \$116.66, nor less than \$58.33, unless the employee's monthly pay is less than \$58.33, in which case his monthly compensation shall be the full amount of his monthly pay. The monthly compensation for partial disability shall not be more than \$116.66. In the case of persons who at the time of the injury were minors or employed in a learner's capacity and who were not physically or mentally defective the commission shall, on any review after the time when the monthly wage-earning capacity of such persons would probably, but for the injury, have increased, award compensation based on such probable monthly wage-earning capacity. The commission may, on any review after the time when the monthly wage-earning capacity of the disabled employee would probably, irrespective of the injury, have decreased on account of old age, award compensation based on such probable monthly wage-earning capacity."

Sec. 2. That subdivision H of section 10 of the act entitled "An act to provide compensation for employees of the United States suffering injuries while in the performance of their duties, and for other purposes," is amended to read as follows:

"(H) As used in this section, the term 'child' includes stepchildren, adopted children, and posthumous children, but does not include married children. The

terms 'brother' and 'sister' include stepbrothers and stepsisters, half brothers and half sisters, and brothers and sisters by adoption, but do not include married brothers or married sisters. All of the above terms and the term 'grandchild' include only persons who at the time of the death of the deceased employee are under eighteen years of age or over that age and incapable of self-support. The term 'parent' includes step-parents and parents by adoption. The term 'widow' includes only the decedent's wife living with or dependent for support upon him at time of his death or living apart for reasonable cause or by reason of his desertion."

SEC. 3. That subdivision K of section 10 of the act entitled "An act to provide compensation for employees of the United States suffering injuries while in the performance of their duties, and for other purposes," is amended to read as follows:

"(K) In computing compensation under this section the monthly pay shall be considered not to be more than \$175 nor less than \$87.50, but the total monthly compensation shall not exceed the monthly pay computed as provided in section 12."

SEC. 4. That section 11 of the act entitled "An act to provide compensation for employees of the United States suffering injuries while in the performance of their duties, and for other purposes," is amended to read as follows:^B

"Sec. 11. That if death results from the injury within six years the United States shall pay to the personal representative of the deceased employee funeral and burial expenses not to exceed \$200, in the discretion of the commission. In the case of an employee whose home is within the United States, if his death occurs away from his home office or outside of the United States, and if so desired by his relatives, the body shall, in the discretion of the commission, be embalmed and transported in a hermetically sealed casket to the home of the employee. Such funeral and burial expenses shall not be paid and such transportation shall not be furnished where the death takes place more than one year after the cessation of disability resulting from such injury or, if there has been no disability preceding death, more than one year after the injury.

Approved, February 12, 1927.

LISTING VOUCHERS OF SUBSTITUTE CLERKS AND CARRIERS

In submitting their December quarter accounts it is noted that some first and second class postmasters omitted to list the vouchers of substitute clerks and carriers paid at 100 per cent on Forms 1500 and 1501.

All vouchers of substitutes should be listed. Those showing payments at 96½ per cent should be listed first, and under a separate heading "Salary at 100 per cent—Not within act July 3, 1926," there should be listed those showing payments at 100 per cent. A separate total for each group should be made.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR THE ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE ARIZONA ASSOCIATION OF POSTMASTERS

Leave of absence is granted, without application therefor, to postmasters who desire to attend the annual convention of the Arizona Association of Postmasters at Mesa, Ariz., on April 15 and 16, 1927. Offices must be left in charge of competent and duly sworn employees.

The actual time required to attend the convention, including traveling time both ways, will be allowed with pay and not charged against annual leave, but upon a postmaster's return to his office he must promptly report to the inspector in charge of the division in which his office is located the number of days absent.

FORM 3548—NOTICE OF MAIL HELD FOR POSTAGE

Despite specific instructions in the March Supplement to stamp or write legibly the name of their post office and State in the space provided therefor on Form 3548, "Notice of mail held for postage," and other notices citing irregularity in the use of this form, postmasters continue to mail these cards to patrons of the service without giving the name of the post office and State on the form. Frequently there are no check marks in the spaces provided to show the kind of mail held for postage.

Postmasters who are not personally seeing to it that the order above referred to is being complied with are neglecting their duty.

Form 3548, without legible postmark or name of the office from which it was sent and without indicating the kind of mail held for postage, was recently sent from some post office in Illinois to John Doorley, 310 Court Street, Streator, Ill. The post office sending this card will communicate with Mr. Doorley at once, explaining the error and inclosing another Form 3548, completely and properly filled out.

A card without the name of the office and postmarked "Newton," but with the State so blurred that it can not be read, was recently addressed to

The John Bond Tailoring Company,
710 West Jackson Boulevard,
Chicago, Illinois.

The post office from which this card was sent will immediately communicate with the Bond Tailoring Co., explaining the error and inclosing another Form 3548 properly postmarked and filled out.

TELEPHONES

Postmasters at all offices where pay telephones have been installed, except in Federal buildings, where collections have not been made of commissions from the telephone company furnishing these telephones are requested to at once communicate with this Bureau, Division of Post Office Quarters and Engineering, and state fully why such commissions are not being received or collected. These data should also cover telephones located in post-office stations or branches.

CORRECTION

The notice appearing in the March Supplement under the heading "Forms for recording and reporting long-distance telephone calls," is corrected to read as follows, the correction being in the gross annual receipts of offices which will use Form 1706:

FORMS FOR RECORDING AND REPORTING LONG-DISTANCE TELEPHONE CALLS

Postmasters First and Second Class Offices:

The attention of all postmasters having official telephones is called to the fact that new Forms 1706 and 1707, upon which to keep a record and make report of long-distance telephone calls have been placed in stock by the Fourth Assistant, Division of Equipment and Supplies.

Form 1706 is for use in post offices where the gross annual receipts are \$600,000 and over, whereas Form 1707 is for use in all other first and second class offices.

An initial supply of these forms was recently issued by the Fourth Assistant to all first and second class offices having official telephones.

These forms will hereafter be carried in stock by the Fourth Assistant, Division of Equipment and Supplies, upon whom requisition should be made in the regular manner when a new supply is necessary.

DISPLAY OF POSTERS AND CIRCULARS ADVERTISING CITIZENS' MILITARY TRAINING CAMPS

The department is cooperating with the War Department in connection with the display in post offices of advertising literature and posters promoting interest in the citizens' military camps.

Postmasters at offices located in leased and rented buildings will display such matter in a conspicuous place in the lobby. This does not apply to offices in Government-owned buildings, which come under the jurisdiction of the Treasury Department.

ORDINARY PARCELS NOT TO BE DISPATCHED IN DIRECT SACKS WITH SPECIAL-HANDLING PARCELS

It has come to the attention of the department that ordinary parcel post is being dispatched in direct sacks, with special-handling tags attached, containing special-handling parcels.

While all sackable parcels should be sacked, it is not the purpose in order to conserve sacks to include ordinary parcels in special-handling sacks.

All postmasters (except at the smaller offices which make up sacks or pouches for local R. P. O. trains) are directed to issue emphatic instructions to all concerned that no ordinary parcel post may be dispatched in sacks containing special-handling mail with special-handling tags attached.

The smaller offices may include special-handling parcels in working sacks or pouches for R. P. O. trains, but such sack or pouch must bear a special-handling tag.

UNSIGHTLY BOXES

To Postmasters:

At the point on streets in cities where the city delivery carrier ends his route there are in many instances throughout the country a number of individual street boxes owned by patrons who live farther out on the street where the rules of the service do not permit foot carriers to go on account of the fact that there are no street improvements.

Where this condition exists and can not be properly remedied by a mounted carrier or otherwise, we suggest that you use your personal influence to get the owners of these boxes, or public-improvement agencies if necessary, to collect those boxes into one group in such a way as to present a neat and tidy appearance.

Most of those we have seen have been extremely unsightly and in a certain sense seem to reflect upon the Postal Service, although we do not erect these boxes officially.

A nice thing to do would be to have a very firm, narrow wooden bench constructed about $3\frac{1}{2}$ or 4 feet high and firmly fastened in the ground, and then these boxes all placed on this bench side by side in a row and fastened to it, thus making a symmetrical, sightly appearance. Any arrangement which puts them together in orderly fashion would be a great improvement. As these boxes are owned by the patrons, it would have to be done either by them or by some one who is willing to put a little time, labor, and perhaps money into the enterprise for the sake of pride in public improvement. I have heard of a postmaster and a carpenter who went out voluntarily and made a very unsightly situation of this kind look tidy and neat. You are authorized to go ahead and do it as you see fit if you can get the material or have the material on hand.

We are sending this out merely as a suggestion, not as compulsory. You are authorized also to assist the rural patrons or rural carriers, if you will, in relieving similar situations in the country. Anything which you may do to help any of these cases, while it has to be without expense to the department under present circumstances, will be very much appreciated by the department. And when you have done this in your town or city if you will let us know or send us a picture, we will acknowledge it in the Bulletin. This is done in complete cooperation with the Fourth Assistant.

WINDOW ENVELOPES NOT TO BE TORN WHEN MARKED UP FOR FORWARDING OR RETURN TO SENDER

In canceling the original address on window-envelope mail which is to be forwarded or returned to the sender, a soft pencil should be used with such care that the transparent paper of the window is not torn. This is necessary to avoid defacing the contents, and supervisors in charge of forwarding and returning mail are charged with the responsibility of seeing that due care is exercised by clerks.

The postmaster at Dry Ridge, Ky., reports that mail reaches his office intended for Knoxville, Tenn., instead of Knoxville, Ky., the latter office being served from the Dry Ridge post office.

The service will please exercise care in the distribution of mail to and from these offices in order that the missending of mail may be minimized.

CONTRACT AIR MAIL SERVICE

A contract has been awarded for service on route C. A. M.-19, from New York, N. Y., by Philadelphia, Pa.; Washington, D. C.; Richmond, Va.; and Greensboro, N. C., to Atlanta, Ga., to begin when necessary lights for night flying have been set up.

On March 6 service between New York, N. Y., and Chicago, Ill., via Cleveland, Ohio, was readvertised.

Ponca City, Okla., has been embraced for supply on route No. C. A. M.-3, between Wichita and Oklahoma City.

Service over route C. A. M.-11, from Cleveland, Ohio, by Youngstown, Ohio, to McKeesport and Pittsburgh, Pa., will be inaugurated April 21, 1927.

DIVISION OF FOREIGN MAIIS

SPECIAL-DELIVERY SERVICE WITH MEXICO

Ordinary (unregistered) articles in the regular mails (letters, post cards, printed matter, commercial papers, and samples) addressed for delivery in Mexico will be given the benefit of special-delivery service *when prepaid 20 cents, in addition to the regular postage*, by United States special delivery or other stamps affixed to each article.

The envelopes or covers of articles intended for special delivery in Mexico should have affixed labels reading "Expres (special delivery)." However, until a supply of the said labels can be secured from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies, the articles should in all cases be marked in red ink "Expres" directly below but never on the stamps.

Insufficiently prepaid articles intended by the senders for special delivery in Mexico, posted in letter boxes and drops, should be marked by postmasters "Not in special-delivery mail" and be dispatched onward to destination as ordinary mail matter whenever such articles can not be returned to the senders for the deficiency in fee without seriously delaying the dispatch thereof.

Articles mailed in Mexico which are intended for special delivery in this service will be marked "Expres" or have labels affixed bearing that word.

Special-delivery articles received from Mexico will be subject to the same conditions in their delivery as special-delivery articles in the domestic service, attention being invited especially in this connection to section 1043, Postal Laws and Regulations, 1924, concerning the holding at the post office, to be called for by the addressee, of special-delivery mail believed to contain large sums of money or securities which can not be delivered without unusual risk.

SENDERS OF PARCELS FROM THE UNITED STATES TO MOZAMBIQUE HAVE THE OPTION OF ATTACHING A SINGLE CUSTOMS DECLARATION TO ONLY ONE PARCEL COMPRISED IN A SHIPMENT MAILED SIMULTANEOUSLY BY THE SAME SENDER TO THE SAME ADDRESSEE AT ONE ADDRESS

Pursuant to an agreement between this department and the postal administration of Mozambique, effective at once, senders of parcels from the United States to Mozambique have the option of attaching a single customs declaration to only one parcel comprised in a shipment consisting of any number of parcels mailed simultaneously by the same sender to the same addressee at one address.

Under this arrangement each parcel in a shipment should be clearly marked with a fractional number, the numerator of which will indicate in Arabic figures the number of the parcel and the denominator the number of parcels comprising the shipment. For example, if a single shipment were composed of 12 parcels, each parcel would be numbered respectively, $\frac{1}{12}$, $\frac{2}{12}$, $\frac{3}{12}$, etc.

The customs declaration should be *securely* attached to one of the parcels, *as much as*, in the event that the single customs declaration was lost, advice as to the entire shipment would be unavailable in the absence of the consular invoice, which is not required in case of shipments to Mozambique.

The total number of parcels comprised in a shipment should also be invariably indicated on the customs declaration.

The postal administration of Mozambique will continue to require the customs declaration to be attached to each parcel for the United States.

PARCELS COMPRISED IN A SHIPMENT REPRESENTED BY A SINGLE CUSTOMS DECLARATION OR A SINGLE SET OF CUSTOMS DECLARATIONS SHOULD BE FORWARDED BY THE OFFICE OF ORIGIN AND DISPATCHED TOGETHER AS FAR AS PRACTICABLE

Referring to the notices of this office allowing senders the option of attaching a single customs declaration or a single set of customs declarations to only one parcel comprised in a shipment mailed simultaneously by the same sender to the same addressee at one address, postmasters at the mailing offices, railway postal clerks, and dispatching exchange offices are requested to dispatch all parcels comprised in such a shipment in the same sack, if possible; and if not, by the same mail in order that all the parcels concerned may, as far as practicable, arrive at destination at the same time.

With this end in view postmasters at mailing offices will keep intact parcels composing group shipments for foreign countries and indorse the labels of the sacks in which the parcels are sent to the proper United States exchange office to indicate that the sacks contain group shipments, the labels of the sacks in such cases to be numbered consecutively when more than one sack is used for the shipment and the label of the last sack made up to be indicated by an "X" following the number thereof, for example:

New York Foreign—Parcel Post
(Barbados) G S 7x
From Detroit, Michigan

Post offices and railway post offices will please cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken.

PACKAGES OF NEWSPAPERS ARE UNMAILABLE TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES AT THE PRINTED-MATTER RATE WHEN THEY CONTAIN MERCHANDISE OR WRITING IN THE NATURE OF PERSONAL CORRESPONDENCE

A considerable number of packages of newspapers addressed to foreign countries and prepaid at the reduced rate applicable to this class of mail are received at United States dispatching exchange offices with merchandise or writing in the nature of personal correspondence concealed therein.

These packages are unmailable at the rate of postage applicable to printed matter in Postal Union mails and when observed at dispatching exchange offices are returned to the post offices of mailing. Should they go forward unobserved to the country of destination, the packages are liable to confiscation.

Postmasters are directed, therefore, to cause greater care to be exercised at their offices with the view to preventing the acceptance for mailing and the dispatch of packages of this character.

SPECIAL-DELIVERY ARTICLES FOR CUBA

In connection with report made to this office that many letters addressed for delivery in Cuba which are intended by the senders to be specially delivered to the addressees are prepaid only 10 cents in addition to the regular postage, postmasters will give as much publicity as possible without expense to the department to the fact that the fee for the special delivery of letters and other articles in the regular mails to Cuba is the same as that to all other foreign countries, that is, 20 cents in addition to the regular postage.

Letters and other articles in the regular mails to Cuba which are marked for special delivery but are not prepaid the full special delivery fee, if they can not be returned to the senders for the deficient postage without seriously delaying the dispatch thereof, are marked "Not in special-delivery mail" and dispatched onward to Cuba as ordinary mail matter.

With Canada and Newfoundland, the special-delivery service applies only to letters or articles prepaid at the letter rate, ordinary or registered. With the other countries shown in the above list, the special-delivery service applies to letters, post cards, printed matter, commercial papers, and samples, ordinary and registered, except that to Mexico the said special-delivery articles may be sent only in the ordinary mails.

An article intended for special delivery in any of the countries mentioned above must be prepaid 20 cents, in addition to the regular postage, by United States special delivery or other stamps affixed to the cover. There should also be affixed to the cover an "Expres (special delivery)" label (Form 2977), or the cover must be marked boldly in red ink "Expres" directly below but never on the stamps.

Delivery is effected in the various countries according to the special-delivery regulations in force in the country of destination.

Information in detail concerning the service to Canada and Newfoundland, including a list of the cities to which the service is limited in Canada, is published on pages 208 and 218, respectively, of the July, 1926, Postal Guide, and information concerning the service to each of the other countries mentioned has been published in the Postal Bulletin from time to time and in the monthly supplements to the aforesaid Guide, beginning with the supplement of September, 1926, attention being invited especially to the list on pages 12 to 16 of the February, 1927, supplement of Chinese special-delivery offices.

AIR MAIL FEES ON LETTERS TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES

The entire postage, including air mail fees on letters from the United States for the following foreign countries, and making use of the United States Air Mail Service in conjunction with the London to Continental Europe Air Mail Service and the Cairo-Bagdad-Basra Air Mail Service, when available, is as follows:

The above information is furnished in connection with notice of July 29, 1926, relative to air mail service from London to continental Europe; notice of January 7, 1927, relative to air mail fees over the United States air mail service; and notice of January 22, 1927, appearing as Change No. 122, on page 51 of the Postal Guide for February, 1927, relative to Cairo-Bagdad-Basra air mail service.

The air mail fee and postage must be fully prepaid by United States postage stamps affixed to each piece.

Air mail letters for European points should be marked on the upper left-hand corner of the envelope "Air Mail—London to Continent," so that letters in assorting may not be overlooked.

Letters for Morocco and western Algeria should, in addition, be plainly marked immediately below the above-mentioned marking with the indication "Par avion de Toulouse" (by airship from Toulouse), and letters for Dakar should be marked in the same place on the cover with the indication "Par avion de Toulouse à Dakar" (by airship from Toulouse to Dakar).

Letters intended for dispatch by the Cairo-Bagdad-Basra air mail service should bear in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope, a blue label with the words "By air, Cairo-Bagdad," or, in lieu of the label, be prominently marked as indicated.

DIVISION OF FINANCE

BOX RENTS

The attention of postmasters is called to paragraph 2, section 369, Postal Laws and Regulations, as amended by Order No. 5251. This amendment is made to permit postmasters to use as a notification of box rent due, to be placed in post-office boxes 10 days before the end of each quarter, card Form 1551, which may be obtained from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies. Postmasters should see to it that the cards are taken up when presented at the window at the time the rent is paid, so they can be reused as long as they are serviceable. Postmasters who find that the use of Form 1538 is satisfactory may continue to use that form as a notice of box rent due.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS

FORM 6684 TO BE SENT TO EXCHANGE OFFICES

It is regretted that it again becomes necessary to direct the attention of postmasters at international money-order offices to section 1156, Postal Laws and Regulations, relative to the inquiries as to payment of international money orders, Form 6684.

Although such inquiries should always be addressed to the exchange offices by which the orders were certified, a large number of them are sent to the department. This practice results not only in serious delay in the dispatch of the inquiries to foreign administrations, but in additional work on the part of clerks in the Postal Service and in the department.

Postmasters at all international money-order offices should therefore cause very definite instructions in regard to this matter to be given the employees of their offices.

MONEY-ORDER BUSINESS WITH GREECE RESUMED

On April 1, 1927, money-order service between the United States and Greece was resumed.

The amount of orders drawn for payment in that country is to be expressed in dollars and cents only. The order is to be marked "Canceled," the receipt handed to the remitter, and the advice and coupon dispatched to the New York exchange office.

Remitters must be required to furnish the given names of payees as they are known to the Greek postal authorities—i. e., as Panagiotis, Demetrius, or Athanasius, etc. The Americanized versions of these names which are frequently used by Greeks here, as "Pete," "Jim," or "Tom," will result in delay in payment and occasion much unnecessary correspondence between the foreign office and this department.

Payment in this country of orders drawn in Greece will be made by means of money orders reissued by the New York exchange office.

B

THE "BELGA" THE NEW MONETARY UNIT OF BELGIUM

At the request of the Brussels office, it has been decided to express in "belgas" and "centiemes" instead of francs and centimes the amounts of money orders issued in the United States for payment in Belgium.

Postmasters at all international money-order offices will therefore please explain to intending remitters of such orders that the "belga," the new monetary unit adopted by Belgium, is invariably reckoned as the equivalent of 5 Belgian francs, and that the centieme is the one-hundredth part of the belga.

If, notwithstanding this explanation, an intending remitter expresses the amount in his application for the issue of a Belgian money order in francs and centimes the postmaster will divide the sum by 5 to ascertain the correct amount in belgas and centiemes and will then consult the table in Pamphlet 6749a prescribed by the department for the conversion of belgas into dollars (at present Table No. 42, 1 belga = 14 cents) to ascertain the amount to be collected for the issue of the order.

It is to be understood, of course, that in the issue of money orders for Belgium the amount is also to be stated in dollars and cents as heretofore.

WRONG OFFICE NUMBER ON MONEY-ORDER FORMS

It is reported that money-order forms supplied for use of the post offices named below and supposed to have been issued and paid bore incorrect office numbers. Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful to avoid being misled by such errors in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants, or in answering inquiries regarding payment.

Miami, Station 8, Fla. Serial Nos. 1 to 98, inclusive, and 201 to 286, inclusive. Correct office number is 78946 and not 78951.

Hanover, Mont. Serial Nos. 9801 to 10000, inclusive. Correct office number is X8174 and not 08174.

Gabriels, N. Y. Serial Nos. 33001 to 34160, inclusive. Correct office number is 22785 and not 22875.

Medina, N. Y. Serial Nos. 290001 to 290178, inclusive. Correct office number is 23376 and not 28376.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

IMPROPER USE OF FORWARDING ORDERS

It is the practice of some individuals and concerns located in certain cities to have mail addressed to them at other post offices where they have no personal or business identification whatsoever and to request the different postmasters involved to forward indefinitely such mail to them.

The Postal Laws and Regulations extend to the public the benefit of forwarding certain classes of mail under certain conditions, but the term "forwarding" is intended to cover only the mail of transients or persons who remove from one city to another.

Postmasters will make a check-up, and wherever it is found that any individual or firm located in another city has arranged for an indefinite period to have mail addressed to the office making the check and then forwarded to the offices at which they reside such individuals or firms will be promptly notified of the purpose of the privilege of forwarding certain classes of mail, that the mail involved can not continue to be forwarded, and that they should arrange to have their mail properly addressed to the city in which they actually reside, with street and number, or post-office box if they prefer.

Should they decline or fail to do this, in order to assure the receipt of mail addressed to post offices other than where they actually reside, it will be necessary for them to arrange for its delivery to some person or firm within the city to which it is originally addressed, such person or firm to attend to the matter of forwarding and make the new prepayment of postage, which must be required on matter of all classes remailed under these conditions.

To enable the patrons involved to make the necessary adjustments with respect to their mail, 60 days should be allowed, after which there should be no further forwarding of mail of this character, but it should be returned to the sender properly indorsed.

For any further information or instructions concerning this subject, postmasters will address the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification.

REVISED CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE ACCEPTANCE OF PERMIT MATTER

The revised conditions which appear on pages 1 to 5 of this Supplement governing the acceptance of matter of the first, second, third, and fourth classes for mailing under permit without stamps affixed under the provisions of section 452, Postal Laws and Regulations, supersede those heretofore issued.

The revised conditions cover in a more specific manner a number of features, including the requirements with respect to the verification of mailings, concerning which there appears to have been more or less lack of understanding. They also modify the former conditions in some other respects.

Postmasters at offices authorized to accept matter for mailing under permit are, therefore, directed to take the necessary precautions to see that the conditions and requirements set forth in the revised conditions with respect to its preparation, presentation, verification, and acceptance are fully complied with in all cases. They are also instructed to see that all employees assigned to receive such matter thoroughly acquaint themselves with the revised conditions regarding its acceptance and that the procedure set forth in such conditions is carefully observed and carried out.

For any further information or instruction in connection with the revised conditions governing the acceptance of matter for mailing under permit inquiry, should be made of the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification.

NAME OF POST OFFICE AND POSTMARK TO BE PLACED ON NOTICES ON FORM 3578 CONCERNING THE UNDELIVERABLE SECOND-CLASS PUBLICATIONS

Complaint is made that many postmasters neglect to insert the name of their post office or insert the postmark thereof on Form 3578 sent publishers concerning undeliverable copies of their publications.

It should be apparent to postmasters that publishers can not correct their mailing lists unless this information is furnished. The failure to furnish the name of the post office results in the mailing of many copies which can not be delivered and the consequent needless return to the publishers of copies under label Form 3579.

The name of the post office and postmark must be placed on all notices on Form 3578 even though they may be sent under cover of penalty envelopes bearing the name of the post office of origin.

Postmasters should at once take up this matter with their clerks preparing these notices and impress upon them the necessity of furnishing the above-mentioned information as well as all the other information contemplated by the form, and that such notices be legibly prepared.

UNDELIVERABLE SECOND-CLASS PUBLICATIONS IMPROPERLY SENT TO SPRINGFIELD, MASS., INSTEAD OF SPRINGFIELD, OHIO

The postmaster at Springfield, Mass., reports that undeliverable copies of second-class publications intended to be returned to the publishers at Springfield, Ohio, are frequently sent to his office because the labels, Form 3579, are addressed to the wrong State.

Care must be exercised by all concerned to see that label Form 3579 is in each instance correctly addressed. B

REUSE OF OLD CONTAINERS FOR MAILING FOUNTAIN PENS WITHOUT REMOVING OLD LABELS, STAMPS, ETC., CAUSES CONFUSION AND IS OBJECTIONABLE

Complaints continue to be received that tubes or containers originally used by manufacturers of fountain pens for mailing their pens to customers are frequently reused by such customers for returning pens to the manufacturers for repairs, etc., without removing the old address labels, postage stamps, and postal indorsements.

This causes much confusion, inconvenience, and delay, the old postage stamps, postmarks, and other postal indorsements making it difficult to determine whether proper postage has been paid as well as whether the parcels are to be treated as ordinary mail or entitled to special treatment.

When reused containers of this objectionable character are presented for mailing the senders should be requested to remove the old labels, stamps, indorsements, etc., and affix properly prepared new address labels, or use new containers. Patrons should be advised that their cooperation in this respect will not only materially aid the postal service, but redound to their own advantage.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

POSTMASTERS NOT TO FORWARD MISPACKED PLAIN OR SPECIAL-REQUEST ENVELOPES TO DEPARTMENT OR ENVELOPE AGENCY WITHOUT INSTRUCTIONS

The attention of postmasters is directed to the provisions of section 153 and 159, Postal Laws and Regulations, relating to irregularities in the packing of plain and special-request envelopes requiring that a report be submitted to the department and the envelopes held for instructions. This applies to instances where wrong size or denomination plain envelopes are received as well as when return-card envelopes in full box lots or less for a patron of another post office are found mispacked in a case of plain envelopes or in a shipment of special-request envelopes for a local patron. Many postmasters have been disregarding these rules by making immediate shipment of the mispacked envelopes to the department or the United States Stamped Envelope Agency, Dayton, Ohio, with the result that salable envelopes are frequently destroyed, causing loss that will be avoided in many instances if the irregularity is reported and the envelopes held for advice.

Hereafter, postmasters will be expected to comply explicitly with the regulations requiring that a prompt report shall be submitted to the department when mispacked plain or special-request envelopes, such as have been described above, are received, the envelopes meantime to be retained in the post office until instructions with regard to their disposition are issued.

UNREGISTERED WAR-SAVINGS CERTIFICATES NOT PAYABLE AT POST OFFICES

All postmasters, especially at the smaller offices, will please see that all employees concerned are cautioned not to pay unregistered war-savings certificates of any series. Many postmasters, especially at offices where certificates are seldom presented, refer to the instructions in the last Annual Postal Guide, overlooking the instructions on pages 42 and 43 of the September Supplement, providing that postmasters shall no longer pay unregistered certificates of the 1920 and 1921 series, but shall forward them, properly signed, by official registered mail, to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Stamps, for reference to the Treasurer of the United States and payment by the Treasurer direct to the owners. Cases of erroneous payment of unregistered certificates by postmasters require special attention, both in this department and in the Treasury Department, and it is desired to avoid the delays and difficulties incident to these adjustments.

Postmasters should observe with great care all the instructions concerning payment of war-savings certificates on pages 42 to 47 of the 1926 Postal Guide, applying to all four series of war-savings stamps the procedure therein indicated for stamps of the 1918 and 1919 series.

Special attention is directed to the necessity of inclosing, with all certificates sent to the department, a letter of transmittal in the form prescribed in section 115, showing that no payment has been made, and giving the owners' correct present addresses.

Special attention is also directed to the fact that registered certificates should not be forwarded to the department, if otherwise regular, unless they have one or more unregistered stamps affixed, and that when a registered certificate bearing any unregistered stamps is forwarded it should be accompanied by the registration card and a statement by the postmaster certifying that the signature in the receipt form on the certificate is that of the registered owner.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAIIS

ADDITION TO LIST OF OFFICES AUTHORIZED TO EXCHANGE C. O. D. ARTICLES WITH MEXICO

As the postmasters at New Orleans, La., and New York, N. Y., have been authorized, effective April 1, 1927, to exchange C. O. D. registered mail with Campeche, Cam., Mexico, the following items should be added to the "Complete list of offices authorized to exchange C. O. D. articles with Mexico," printed on page 23 of the November, 1925, Postal Guide:

Between New Orleans, La., and Campeche, Cam.

Between New York, N. Y., and Campeche, Cam.

C. O. D. NUMBERS MUST NOT BE OMITTED FROM C. O. D. MONEY ORDERS FOR MEXICO

The attention of this office has been called to the fact that postmasters in the United States frequently omit the C. O. D. numbers from money orders issued in payment of C. O. D. charges on registered parcel-post articles mailed in Mexico and delivered at offices in the United States, or place incorrect numbers thereon.

The C. O. D. number on collect-on-delivery parcels both in Mexico and in the United States is the original registration number placed on the article at the time of mailing. This number is required to be placed immediately below the indorsement on the parcel "REEMBOLSO," or "COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY," or "C. O. D.," or otherwise in close proximity thereto.

Occasionally, more than one number will be placed on a C. O. D. parcel from Mexico. Sometimes this additional number is placed on the article by the postmaster at the office of address in the United States, or it may represent the sender's order or invoice number.

When more than one number appears on a C. O. D. parcel received from Mexico the number which is required to be placed on the C. O. D. money order issued in payment of the charges on the parcel is the number which immediately follows, or is otherwise in close proximity to, the indorsement, "REEMBOLSO," "COLLECT-ON-DELIVERY," or "C. O. D."

As the C. O. D. number is of vital importance in the identification of remittances of this character, postmasters are cautioned and directed to see that the correct C. O. D. number; that is to say, the original registration number, as shown on the wrapper of the parcel is correctly recorded and legibly entered on all money orders and advices issued in payment of the charges on C. O. D. parcels from Mexico.

Failure to diligently comply with these instructions causes unnecessary inconvenience and delay to payees of the orders and brings discredit to the Postal Service.

In this connection please note the article printed on pages 22 and 23 of the February, 1927, Postal Guide under the heading: "Original C. O. D. numbers (not sender's invoice or order numbers or inward registry numbers at larger offices) to be entered on money orders issued for charges on C. O. D. parcels from Mexico."

UNSIGHTLY BOXES

To Rural Carriers:

The department desires that the suggestions published on page 9 of this Supplement apply also to the Rural Delivery Service and that rural carriers co-operate with postmasters and the patrons of their routes, with a view to effecting the grouping of boxes (without expense to the department), wherever possible at crossroads and at other points on their routes, thereby improving the general appearance of the boxes and at the same time making the boxes a credit to the service and to the community.

It has been shown that the most practicable and simple arrangement is to place the boxes side by side on a horizontal board supported at either end by posts firmly placed in the ground and extending $3\frac{1}{2}$ or 4 feet above the surface.

Postmasters will please report to the department the names of rural carriers who are particularly successful in grouping boxes on their routes, so that these employees may be properly commended in the Bulletin.

CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE OF RURAL CARRIERS TO BE CAREFULLY PREPARED AND SENT TO THE POSTMASTERS AT DISBURSING OFFICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH INSTRUCTIONS OF FEBRUARY 1, 1927

Reports from disbursing postmasters indicate that some postmasters at certifying offices do not fully understand or do not comply with the instructions contained in the letter of February 1 from this Bureau regarding the preparation of the certificates of the services of the rural carriers attached to their respective offices.

The irregularities most commonly occurring and resulting in delay in payment of the carriers are:

Certificates not signed by postmasters.

Certificates not signed by carriers.

Period of service covered by certificates not correctly given.

Absence of regular carrier during part of pay period not shown, although certificate in favor of substitute submitted.

Complete or partial failures of service not reported, or reasons for failures not stated.

Failure to submit properly prepared applications of carriers for sick leave.

Failure to submit certificates of service performed by substitute carriers.

Certificates not submitted on dates specified.

The instructions regarding the preparation and submission of the certificates must be strictly observed.

**FORMS PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT, AND NOT THOSE PURCHASED BY CARRIERS,
TO BE USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE RURAL DELIVERY SERVICE**

It has come to the attention of the department that some of the rural carriers are using forms purchased by them from publishers, stationers, or others to notify patrons of the arrival of packages too large to be placed in boxes; of mail held for postage; of the need for the relocating of mail boxes; that mail should be stamped before being deposited for collection; that the department desires all mail boxes and their supports painted white; and others.

Forms for these and similar purposes are furnished by the department, and the departmental forms should be used by postmasters and carriers as occasion may require. The substitution of forms obtained from other sources should be discontinued forthwith.

REPORT OF MAIL HANDLED ON ALL RURAL ROUTES TO BE SUBMITTED IN MAY

The attention of postmasters at offices having rural delivery service is called to the provisions of section 790, Postal Laws and Regulations, as amended October 20, 1926, as follows:

"During the first 15 days in the month of May of each year a count shall be kept and record made on Form 4240, in duplicate, of the number of pieces of mail delivered and collected on every rural route on which the service is daily except Sunday; also account shall be kept of the number and weight of lock pouches carried to intermediate post offices and the weight of mails carried for delivery to carriers on loop routes, and of the number of pouches and weight of mails received from intermediate offices and the carriers on loop routes; and of the value of stamps canceled on mail collected, and the value of stamps, stamped paper, etc., sold by carriers. One copy of the report shall be promptly forwarded to the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Rural Mails, the other shall be retained in the files of the post office."

It should be borne in mind that on all triweekly routes the mail delivered and collected is to be counted each schedule day and appropriate entries made on Form 4240, the record to be retained in the files of the post office, copy of report for May to be submitted to the department.

Postmasters will see to it that the count and weight of mails are kept, as well as note made of the value of stamps canceled and stamps, etc., sold, and the required report submitted promptly after the close of the 15-day period.

LETTER BOXES NOT TO BE USED FOR ADVERTISING PURPOSES

According to an article appearing in the current edition of a magazine, a postmaster in Massachusetts granted permission to a local druggist to place advertisements on the sides of a combination letter and package box which is located in front of his store.

Postmasters have no authority to grant such permission. Letter boxes must not be used as billboards to advertise commercial concerns or activities, nor shall any advertisement regarding governmental matters be placed thereon without authority having first been obtained from the department.

FORM 21

Postmasters:

The Division of Equipment and Supplies of this bureau is receiving quite a number of emergency requisitions made up on stock Form 21, which is contrary to existing instructions and is certainly not the purpose for which the form in question was devised.

All requisitions for postal supplies must be prepared and submitted on the proper requisition forms, or on letterheads in cases of extreme emergency.

Hereafter requisitions for supplies written on stock Form 21, plain facing slips, or other miscellaneous scraps of paper will be returned to office of origin, unfiled, for proper preparation.

PARCEL-POST ZONE KEYS

The zone key some time ago superseded the zone map. This zone key used in connection with the Postal Guide is all that is necessary to determine the zone in which a post office is located. Each post office is furnished with a zone key for the unit in which such office is located. Parcel-post maps are no longer used and requests for same should not be made on the Fourth Assistant.

As an illustration of the use of the zone key, Chicago, Ill., is taken as an example. The Chicago parcel-post unit number is 2115, which is opposite the name Chicago in the Postal Guide. Using zone key No. 2115 to find the parcel-post zone in which New Orleans, La., is located, it is necessary first to ascertain from the Postal Guide the unit number for New Orleans, which is 2389. The Chicago zone key is then consulted for information as to the zone in which unit No. 2389 is located, which is the fifth zone.

Any postmaster not having a zone key of the unit in which his post office is located will immediately advise the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Topography, to that effect.

DIRECT EXCHANGE OF MONEY ORDERS BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND GREECE

Beginning April 1, 1927, the direct exchange of international money orders between the United States and Greece will be resumed.

The amount of orders drawn for payment in that country is to be expressed in dollars and cents only. The order is to be marked "canceled," the receipt handed to the remitter, and the advice and coupon dispatched to the New York exchange office.

Remitters must be required to furnish the given names of payees as they are known to the Greek postal authorities, i. e., as Panagiotis, Demetrius, or Athanasius, etc. The Americanized versions of these names which are frequently used by Greeks here, as "Pete," "Jim," or "Tom," will result in delay in payment and occasion much unnecessary correspondence between the foreign office and this department.

Payment in this country of orders drawn in Greece will be made by means of money orders reissued by the New York exchange office.

CHANGES AFFECTING THE OFFICIAL POSTAL GUIDE FOR JULY, 1926

CHANGE No. 263.

The following articles are prohibited in the regular (letter) mails to Cuba and supersede those now shown in the first three paragraphs (a, b, and c) of the item "Cuba," on page 209:

Tobacco seeds.

Fruits, vegetables, seeds, live plants or parts of plants coming from Porto Rico, Jamaica, the Bermudas, Mexico, Central and South America, Hawaii, Australia, the Philippines, Spain, France, Italy, and other countries of the Mediterranean region, as well as from all tropical and subtropical countries comprised between the fortieth degree of north latitude and the fortieth degree of south latitude.

Banana stocks and plants not accompanied by a certificate of origin establishing their source and their receipt from a region free from diseases.

Fruits and seeds of the alligator pear originating in Mexico and all other countries of Central America.

Cotton plants, cocoons, seeds, and unworked fibers.

Leaves and shoots of pineapples coming from the island of Jamaica.

Grains of corn, ears, plants or parts of plants coming from Japan, the Philippines, India, Australia and adjacent countries, affected by the disease known as Mildius Physoderma, as well as certain fruits indicated by the Vegetable Health Office which may contain larvae of the Mediterranean fly (*Ceratitis-Capitata*), or coming from Africa (Cape Colony, Congo, Delagoa, Dahomey, Nigeria, Transvaal, and Uganda), Argentina, Australia, the Azores, the Bermudas, Brazil, Cape Verde Islands, Europe (Italy, France, Malta, Spain, and Sicily), Hawaii, Madeira, and New Zealand, unless accompanied by a sterilization certificate.

There are admitted temporarily, subject to previous inspection, potatoes from the Canary Islands and fruits or other vegetable products coming from the United States of America not subjected to previous quarantines, as well as the seeds of vegetables. Plants, fruits, etc., addressed to the agronomic experiment station are also admitted.

Arms of all kinds are delivered to addressees only by special authorization from the Ministry of War and the Navy. However, this permission is not needed for the importation of machetes used for agricultural work, rifles of small caliber, and the cartridges intended for them.

Alkaloids and their salts are placed at the disposal of the director of health.

CHANGE No. 264.

The following should be added to the item "Guatemala" appearing on pages 213 and 289:

The postal administration of Guatemala has advised this department that a certificate of inspection is required on each shipment to that country of plants or parts of plants destined for propagation or cultivation.

Previous authorization to send samples of coffee affected by harmful diseases or insects must be obtained from the Ministry of Agriculture of Guatemala, to which, when making application for such authorization, the sample whose shipment is contemplated shall be submitted.

Seeds and plants of coffee, as well as ornamental plants known as gardenias or cape jasmines, are prohibited importation into Guatemala.

Postmasters will, before forwarding articles containing seeds, plants, or parts of plants subject to inspection, require the sender to produce the corresponding certificate of health and permission to ship issued by the Ministry of Agriculture of Guatemala.

Shipments of coffee, seeds or plants of gardenias will be immediately destroyed or returned, notice of which will be given to those concerned. The importation of coffee seeds may be effected only through the Ministry of Agriculture.

The above modifies the information contained in (Change No. 160), advising that sponges are not transmissible to Mexico.

CHANGE No. 268.

The following modifies the information concerning such articles prohibited in the mails to New Zealand, as shown on pages 218 and 301 of the annual Postal Guide, and announcements issued subsequent thereto.

The postal administration of New Zealand advises that flower, vegetable, grass, clover, and tree seeds are prohibited importation into that country unless the following conditions are complied with:

(a) That if the said seeds were grown in States other than the States of California and Texas, a certificate signed by the consignor showing the States in which the said seeds were grown is produced to the collector of customs.

(b) That if the seeds were grown in the State of California or in the State of Texas, a certificate signed by the consignor to the effect that the said seeds were grown in California or Texas, as the case may be, but that they were not harvested prior to the 1st day of April, 1926, is produced to the collector of customs.

Oats, barley, maize, wheat, or other grain may be forwarded without restriction.

Fruit, plants, bulbs, etc., may now be transmitted to New Zealand provided that each consignment is accompanied by a certificate of freedom from disease duly signed by a responsible officer of the department of agriculture of the State of origin.

A copy of the certificate is shown below for the information of postmasters accepting such articles addressed for delivery in New Zealand:

Grapes may be transmitted in the mails to New Zealand from the United States provided that every shipment is accompanied by a certificate as set forth in Form No. 1 signed by the shipper setting forth the number and kind of packages, the shipping marks, the name of the grower of such grapes, the locality of the vineyard, and the State where such grapes were grown, and certifying that no downy mildew or phylloxera is known to exist within 5 miles of the vineyard where such grapes were grown, that no grapevine foliage or wood is attached to such grapes, that no grapes from any other vineyard than the one specified have been mixed with the consignment, and that such grapes are contained in clean new packages not previously used for any purpose; also by a certificate, as set out in Form No. 2, signed by an officer of the department of agriculture in the State where such grapes were grown, certifying that such grapes are clean and free from disease, that no downy mildew or phylloxera is known to exist within 5 miles of the vineyard where such grapes are certified by the shipper to have been grown, and that no grapevine foliage or wood is attached to such grapes.

The introduction into New Zealand of grapevines or portions thereof, except grapes is prohibited, except that the director of the horticulture division, department of agriculture, may, with the prior consent of the minister of agriculture, import grapevines or portions thereof of special varieties.

The postal administration of Peru has advised that consular invoices required on shipments of parcel-post packages to that country must not be placed in the parcels but should be forwarded by letter mail to the addressee.

CHANGE No. 271.

The Postal Administration of the Union of South Africa has informed this office that it has decided to return immediately to the old system of allowing the importation of articles liable to customs duties in letters and packages paid at the letter rate. Sections 28 and 29 on pages 205 and 206, respectively, are modified accordingly.

CHANGE No. 272.

The following modifies sections 41 and 42 on pages 226 and 227:

REGULATION 1.—*Plant products permitted entry.*—Broomcorn for manufacturing brooms or similar articles made of broomcorn, clean shelled corn, and clean seed of the other plants covered in this quarantine may be imported under permit upon compliance with the requirements of these regulations, except as restricted as to certain countries and districts by special quarantines and other orders now in force and by such restrictive orders as may hereafter be promulgated.

REGULATION 2.—*Application for permits.*—Persons contemplating the importation of any of the articles the entry of which is permitted under regulation 1 shall first make application to the Federal Horticultural Board for a permit, stating in the application the name and address of the exporter, the country and locality where grown, the port of arrival, and the name and address of the importer in the United States to whom the permit should be sent. A separate permit will be required for each shipment of broomcorn or brooms, and the quantity of broomcorn or the number of brooms must be stated in the application. A continuing permit will be issued for the importation of corn and the other seeds.

Applications for permits should be made in advance of the proposed shipments; but if, through no fault of the importer, a shipment should arrive before a permit is received, the importation will be held in customs custody at the risk and expense of the importer for a period not exceeding 20 days pending the receipt of the permit.

Applications may be made by telegraph, in which case the information required above must be given.

REGULATION 3.—*Issuance of permits.*—On approval by the Secretary of Agriculture of an application for the importation of any of the articles the entry of which is permitted under regulation 1, a permit will be issued in quadruplicate. One copy will be furnished to the applicant for presentation to the customs officer at the port of arrival. One copy will be mailed to the collector of customs one to the inspector of the Department of Agriculture at the port of arrival, and the fourth will be filed with the application. The permit will be addressed to the collector of customs at the port for which it is issued.

For broomcorn and brooms or similar articles made of broomcorn permits will be issued for the ports of Boston and New York and such other ports as may from time to time be approved by the Federal Horticultural Board: *Provided*, That entry at the port of New York of unmanufactured broomcorn will be limited to the period November 1 to January 31, inclusive, and that the bringing of broomcorn to New York for transshipment to Boston or other port during the remainder of the year is prohibited. A similar limitation may be placed on any other port of entry later approved.

For shelled corn and for seeds of the other plants listed in this quarantine permits will be issued for ports where the Federal Horticultural Board maintains an inspection service, and for such other ports as may be designated by the Federal Horticultural Board.

REGULATION 4.—*Notice of arrival by permittee.*—Immediately upon arrival of the importation at the port of arrival the permittee shall submit in duplicate notice to the Secretary of Agriculture, through the collector of customs, on forms provided for that purpose, stating the number of the permit, date of entry, name of ship or vessel, the country and locality where grown, name of the foreign shipper, quantity or number of bales or other containers, and marks and numbers on containers, the port of arrival, and the name of the importer or broker at the port of arrival.

REGULATION 5.—*Conditions of entry.*—The articles permitted entry under regulation 1, shall be subject to inspection at the port of first arrival in the United States by an inspector of the Department of Agriculture and to such sterilization or other treatment as shall be required by the inspector. Should any importation prove, on inspection, to be so infested with the European corn borer or other insect pest or with plant diseases that in the judgment of the inspector it can not be freed from such infestation by sterilization or other treatment, the entire shipment may be refused entry.

When entry under sterilization or other treatment is permitted the importation will be released to the permittee upon the filing with the collector of customs of a bond in the amount of \$5,000, or in an amount equal to the invoice value if such value be less than \$5,000, with approved sureties, the conditions of which shall be that the importation shall be sterilized or otherwise treated under the supervision of the inspector; that no bale or other container thereof shall be broken, opened, or removed from the port of arrival unless and until a written notice is given to such collector by the inspector that the importation has been properly sterilized or treated; and that the importation shall be redelivered to the collector of customs within 30 days after its arrival.

If an infested shipment arrives at a port where facilities for sterilization or other treatment satisfactory to the inspector are not maintained and in his opinion its movement to a port where such facilities are maintained involves danger, its entry shall be refused.

Other conditions of entry as applying to the different classes of articles enumerated in regulation 1 are given in the following paragraphs:

Broomcorn.—All importations of broomcorn shall be baled in such manner and by such method as shall be determined by the inspector of the Department of Agriculture as adequate to prevent breakage and scattering in connection with the necessary handling in landing and sterilization. If not so baled entry may be refused.

Articles made of broomcorn.—Brooms or similar articles made of broomcorn shall be subject to sterilization unless their manufacture involves the substantial elimination of stems or such treatment of the included stems as in the judgment of the inspector shall preclude such articles from being the means of carriage of the European corn borer and of other dangerous insects and plant diseases.

Corn and other seeds.—Shipments of shelled corn and seed of the other plants covered in this quarantine which, upon inspection at the port of arrival, are found to be fouled with cobs or other portions of the plants may be refused entry.

Importation of shelled corn from Canada.—The importation of shelled corn from Canada will not be allowed unless the invoice is accompanied by an original certificate issued by a duly authorized official of that country stating that the article in question covered by the certificate was thoroughly inspected by him or under his direction at the time of shipment and was found, or is believed to be, free from infestation with the European corn borer and other insect pests and plant diseases and free from admixtures of cobs or other portions of the plant. Such certificate shall give the date of inspection, name of the grower or exporter, and the district or locality where grown: *Provided*, That such certification may be waived as to Provinces or districts on the presentation of evidence satisfactory to the United States Department of Agriculture that such Provinces or districts have not been reached by the corn borer, such waiver to become effective at any authorized entry port (see regulation 3) upon the receipt of notification of such waiver from the Department of Agriculture by the customs collector of that port.

REGULATION 6.—*Importation of shelled corn from Mexico.*—On account of the frequent presence of cottonseed in shelled corn from Mexico and the attendant risk of such seed carrying the pink bollworm of cotton, the entry of all shelled corn from that country, in addition to the other requirements of these regulations, shall be conditioned upon its being ground or sterilized, including the sterilization of the bags or other containers with such apparatus and in such a manner as shall be satisfactory to the inspector of the Department of Agriculture.

For such grinding or sterilization the corn will be released to the permittee under bond, as provided in regulation 5, second paragraph: *Provided*, That the grinding or sterilization of corn required in this regulation as a condition of entry may, at the option of the importer, be carried out on the Mexican side of the border opposite the proposed port of arrival into the United States under the full conditions indicated in this regulation except as to the bond, but with the requirement that such corn must be rebagged in new or sterilized bags and promptly offered for entry.

The corn shall not be removed from the port of arrival nor shall any bag or other container thereof be broken or opened, except for the purpose of grinding or sterilization, until a written notice is given to the collector of customs by an inspector of the Department of Agriculture that the corn has been properly ground or sterilized and released for entry without further restrictions so far as the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture extends thereto.

REGULATION 7.—*Restrictions governing the entry of shelled corn from Imperial Valley, Lower California, Mexico.*—Shelled corn produced in the Imperial Valley of the State of Lower California, Mexico, may be imported under permit and on compliance with the other conditions of these regulations except as to the requirements of regulation 6 as long as it shall be determined by the Federal Horticultural Board that the pink bollworm does not exist in the State of Lower California and that effective quarantine measures are being maintained by the proper Mexican authorities prohibiting the entry into Lower California of cottonseed, seed cotton, cottonseed hulls, and lint cotton, baled or unbaled, grown in other parts of Mexico or in foreign countries other than the United States.

REGULATION 8.—*Penalties for violation of regulations.*—Permits may be revoked and other permits refused if the permittee or his agent fails to submit the notice of arrival or gives a false notice or in any other way violates the quarantine.

The entry of the following plants and plant products is prohibited or restricted by specific quarantines and other restrictive orders now in force:

(a) Living canes of sugar cane, or cuttings or parts thereof, from all foreign countries.

(b) Seed and all other portions in the raw or unmanufactured state of Indian corn or maize (*Zea mays* L.), and the closely related plants, including all species of Teosinte (*Euchlaena*), Job's tears (*Coix*), *Polyteca*, *Chionachne*, and *Sclerachne* from southeastern Asia (including India, Siam, Indo-China, and China), Malayan Archipelago, Australia, New Zealand, Oceania, Philippine Islands, Formosa, Japan, and adjacent islands.

CHANGE No. 273.

The following should be added to the item "Greece" on page 287:

Effective at once, cans of condensed milk are admitted in the parcel-post mails to Greece only in those instances where they bear a label in the Greek language indicating the directions for use.

CHANGE No. 274.

The following should be added to the item "Sweden" on page 309:

The following articles are prohibited in the parcel-post mails to Sweden:

Nonexplosive elements of artillery fuzes, or of live animals other than bees.

Potatoes may be imported into Sweden only if it is proved by a certificate accompanying the dispatch note that they are not affected by the black scab (*synchytrium*), and that they are in a satisfactorily healthy condition. That in the country of origin the black scab does not exist at present, as far as is known, and has not existed during the past six years; that in the country of mailing it is forbidden to import potatoes coming from countries where the black scab exists; that the packing employed has not already been used.

This certificate must also indicate the quantity of the shipment, the name and address of the sender and addressee, the place of origin of the potatoes, the title of the author of the certificate. The certificate is valid only if the exportation takes place 14 days at the latest after it is delivered. It must be issued by an official plant inspector of the country of origin, or by another expert in the domain of plant diseases duly authorized to issue such certificates, whose competence to that effect is attested by the legation or consulate of Sweden in the country of exportation.

A copy of the certificate must be attached to the parcel by the seal of the author of the certificate.

CHANGE No. 277.

The item "Air mail service between Baranquilla and interior points of Colombia," printed on pages 208 and 209, is amended so as to state the air mail fees, in addition to the regular postage, as follows:

Letters: 30 cents for each 20 grams or fraction thereof.

Unsealed circulars, printed matter, and samples: 15 cents for each 20 grams or fraction thereof.

Parcel-post packages: 15 cents for each 20 grams or fraction thereof on parcels weighing not more than 1 kilogram (2 pounds 3 ounces); \$3 for each kilogram, and 75 cents for each additional one-fourth kilogram or fraction thereof on parcels weighing more than 1 kilogram.

CHANGE No. 278.

The following modifies Change No. 111 appearing on page 47 of the December Supplement to the annual Postal Guide for 1926:

Parcel-post packages containing merchandise addressed for delivery in Rumania, except those places shown below, must be accompanied by two commercial invoices, one of which must be attached to the customs declarations and the other placed inside the package. The invoice placed inside the package may be either a copy of the original invoice or a list of the contents, bearing the address of the sender.

When parcels are destined for the cities of Arad, Bacau, Botosani, Braila, Brasov, Bucuresti, Cernauti, Cetatea-Alba, Chisinau, Cluj, Constanta, Craiova, Focșani, Galati, Giurgiu, Iasi, Oradea, Ploesti, Satu-Mare, Sibiu, Targu-Mures, Timișoara, and Turnu-Severin, one copy of the invoice should be placed inside the parcel and the other forwarded under separate cover to the addressee.

AMENDMENTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

INSERT No. 363. ORDER No. 5188.

MARCH 2, 1927.

Section 1273½ of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended so as to add paragraph 13, as follows:

"13. *It appearing*, That by order entered in this proceeding on December 13, 1923, the commission, by Division 1, established fair and reasonable rates of pay for the transportation of mail matter by certain railway common carriers, including the Boston & Maine Railroad; that the Boston & Maine Railroad, prior to June 1, 1926, operated a line of railroad extending from Derby Line, Vt., to Newport, Vt., and transported thereon mail matter at rates of pay established by the commission in said order;

"*It further appearing*, That the Quebec Central Railway Co., a subsidiary of the Canadian Pacific Railway Co., a railway common carrier not included in that order, acquired on June 1, 1926, by sublease, control of the aforesaid line of railroad and since that date has rendered mail service thereon and is now rendering such service;

"*It is ordered*, That the rates of pay established for the transportation of mail matter by the Boston & Maine Railroad over the line of railroad from Derby Line, Vt., to Newport, Vt., be, and they are hereby, established as the fair and reasonable rates of pay for the transportation of mail matter over the said line by the Quebec Central Railway Co. on and after June 1, 1926. (Order of the Interstate Commerce Commission of February 17, 1927.)"

INSERT No. 364. ORDER No. 5222.

MARCH 15, 1927.

Section 1273½ of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended so as to add paragraphs 14 and 15, as follows:

"14. *It appearing*, That pursuant to the provisions of section 5 of the act approved July 28, 1916, 39 Stat. 412, 425, the Winston-Salem Southbound Railway Co., a railway common carrier engaged in transporting mail matter of the United States, filed its application on April 25, 1925, for reexamination of the facts and circumstances surrounding the transportation of mail upon its line;

"*It further appearing*, That a full investigation of the matters and things involved has been had, and that said division, on the date hereof, has made and filed a report containing its findings of fact and conclusions thereon, which said report is hereby referred to and made a part hereof;

"*It is ordered*, That the rates of pay for the transportation of mail matter by the Winston-Salem Southbound Railway Co. be, and they are hereby, established as the fair and reasonable rates to be received on and after April 25, 1925, as follows: For each mile of service by a 15-foot apartment car, 18.75 cents; for each mile of service by a 3-foot closed pouch space, 5.625 cents.

"*It is further ordered*, That the provisions of the orders entered in this proceeding on December 23, 1919, June 13, 1921, November 18, 1921, and May 18, 1922, except as herein modified, shall remain in full force and effect. (Order of the Interstate Commerce Commission of March 2, 1927.)

"15. The rates fixed in paragraph 14 of this section will be made effective from March 2, 1927, instead of the date the carrier filed its application for reexamination, in accordance with the ruling of the Comptroller General."

MARCH 22, 1927.

INSERT No. 365. ORDER No. 5240.

Section 293, paragraph 2, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is amended to read as follows, effective May 1, 1927:

"2. Persons under 21 years of age are not eligible for appointment as postmaster."

INSERT No. 366. ORDER No. 5251.

MARCH 21, 1927.

Paragraph 2, section 369, Postal Laws and Regulations, is amended to read as follows:

"2. Box rents shall be collected at the beginning of each quarter for the entire quarter, but no longer. Ten days before the last day of each quarter postmasters shall place a notice in each rented box that the rent is due and payable on or before the last day of the quarter. If a box holder fails to renew his right to his box on or before the last day of a quarter the box shall then be closed and offered for rent, and the mail placed in the general delivery."

MARCH 29, 1927.

Section 1418 of the Postal Laws and Regulations, edition of 1924, is hereby amended to read as follows, effective April 1, 1927:

"United States sea post clerks, in addition to one chief clerk, who shall receive pay at the rate of \$2,800 per annum, and one assistant chief clerk who shall receive pay at the rate of \$2,600 per annum, shall be of two classes; clerks of class 1 shall receive pay at the rate of \$2,300 per annum each; clerks of class 2, who shall be clerks in charge, shall receive pay at the rate of \$2,500 per annum each. In addition thereto they shall be entitled to first-class board on the steamships to which they are assigned and to commutation for board and lodging while in foreign countries or in Porto Rico at rates fixed by the Post Office Department. They are subject to the ship's discipline to the same extent as are passengers.

2. Vacancies in the sea post service shall be filled by transfer from the Railway Mail Service or from the classified personnel of first and second class post offices in accordance with the postal regulations and instructions of the Second Assistant Postmaster General. Each unsuccessful applicant should renew his application at the expiration of one year. If the application is not renewed it will be taken for granted that the transfer is no longer desired. Employees receiving a salary of less than \$2,100 per annum are not eligible for transfer."



A suitable supply of this card form should be stamped in advance with the name of the office and always kept on hand. See Postal Bulletins of January 12, 1925, December 31, 1926, and February 19, 1927.

Failure to stamp or write the name of the post office on these cards is attributed to nothing but gross carelessness and inattention to duty. Postmasters and supervisors will see that these instructions are carried out and that violations thereof meet with suitable disciplinary action.
