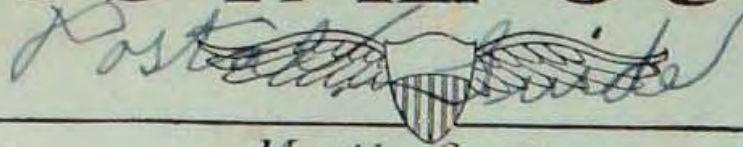

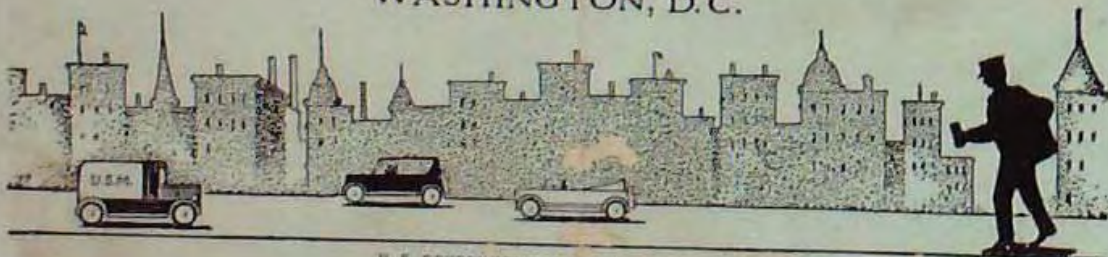

The Following Notices Were Issued from the Office of the Postmaster General

HARRY S. NEW, POSTMASTER GENERAL

COLLECTION OF PROPER POSTAGE, LOOKING FOR SHORT-PAID MATTER AND EFFORTS TO HAVE COMPLETE, LEGIBLE ADDRESSES AND RETURN CARDS ON MAIL MUST BE GIVEN CONSTANT AND EARNEST ATTENTION

Approximately 90 per cent of the postal revenues are derived from the postage paid on mail of the several classes. Although the receipts from this source during the last fiscal year reached the enormous amount of almost \$588,000,000, this was collected in small amounts ranging from 1 cent upward, the average for the many billions of pieces of mail handled being only slightly more than 2 cents per piece.

In view of this condition it is manifestly of the utmost importance that postmasters and postal employees exercise the greatest possible care to see that the full amount of postage, computed at the rate prescribed by law, is collected upon every piece of mail which is properly subject to postage.

It appears from reports and other information coming to the department that there is some laxity among postmasters and their employees in the matter of classifying and rating mail and collecting the correct amount of postage thereon, notwithstanding notices on the subject have frequently appeared in the Postal Bulletin and the monthly supplements to the Postal Guide and all concerned have been cautioned to look for short-paid mail and ever be on the alert to safeguard the postal revenues.

Attention is therefore renewed at this time to the importance of eternal vigilance in this respect. Postmasters should give the matter their personal consideration and see that the employees in their offices do not become careless or lax. Mail, both incoming and outgoing, should be constantly scrutinized and examined, as far as it is practicable to do so, and every possible effort should be made to catch the short-paid pieces and collect the postage lawfully chargeable.

Another matter requiring unceasing attention and concerning which notices are frequently published in the Postal Bulletin and supplements to the Postal Guide is that of having a complete and legible address and return card, properly arranged, on every piece of mail. This is a fundamental postal condition, proper observance of which is a vital factor in promoting the efficient, expeditious, and economical handling of the mails. Postmasters should keep up a constant campaign for better addresses, and urge their patrons to cooperate to this end by not only having a full address and return card, plainly written or printed and properly arranged, on their mail, but by giving their complete address, including street and number, post office box, room number with name of building and street, rural route number, or other local address, on their stationery and in their advertisements, directory listings, etc.

The matter of supervision of the collection of postage and the requirements with respect to the address and return card on mail are assigned to and come directly under the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification. Instructions have been from time to time and as occasion requires will be in the future issued by the Third Assistant Postmaster General concerning the proper addressing of mail, the collection of postage and the precautions necessary to be taken in order properly to protect the postal revenues. Postmasters and postal employees should govern themselves strictly by such instructions. All irregularities and requests for information with regard to postage matters, including short-paid matter, matter held for postage, method of treating it, addressing, return card, etc., should be referred to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification.

CORRECTION IN THE NUMBERING OF INSERTS TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The inserts carrying amendments to the Postal Laws and Regulations, which were published on pages 67 and 69 of the April supplement to the Postal Guide, were incorrectly numbered. Postmasters and postal employees will please cause the numbers to be changed from "363 to 367," inclusive, to "263 to 267," inclusive.

CORRECTION IN THE NUMBERING OF CHANGES IN THE POSTAL GUIDE

ABRIDGED EDITION OF POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO POST-OFFICE CLERKS AND CITY CARRIERS

The 1922 edition of the manual, *Postal Laws and Regulations Applicable to Post Office Clerks and City Carriers*, is obsolete and the department's supply has been exhausted.

A revised edition is being compiled, but a supply will not be available before about October 1, 1927, and therefore postmasters should not make requisition on the Fourth Assistant, Division of Equipment and Supplies, for copies of the manual until about that date.

ILLEGIBLE POSTMARKS

Postmasters:

The attention of all postmasters is again directed to previous repeated instructions bearing on illegible postmarks.

There has just been called to the attention of the department several letters bearing postmarks which were undecipherable; and it was very important to the addressees that they know from what city the letters were mailed and also the date and hour.

Postmasters should personally check the work of their employees to see whether the instructions as to clear postmarks are being carried out; and if not, to apply such disciplinary measures as are necessary to effect compliance therewith.

REMOVAL OF STAMPS FROM MAIL MATTER BY POST-OFFICE EMPLOYEES

Section 522, *Postal Laws and Regulations*, predicated on United States Statutes, forbids the removal of any canceled stamp from any mail matter by a person employed in the Postal Service for resale or use, or to remove from any mail matter any stamp attached thereto in payment of postage. A violation of section 522, *Postal Laws and Regulations*, by a post-office employee subjects him not only to removal from the service, but also upon conviction to fine or imprisonment, or both.

Post-office employees are therefore warned against any infraction of these provisions of law, and should ignore any advertisements or other solicitations to purchase stamps from them.

PROPER STREET ADDRESSES

Postmasters:

Much has been said and done toward obtaining the cooperation of the public in placing proper street addresses on all matter deposited for mailing. It is evident, however, that there is still much to be accomplished.

One postmaster adopted with considerable success the plan of having all distributors note and report to the postmaster or proper supervisor when quantities of mail for city delivery offices, but without street address, are continually received from the same firm or individual, the postmaster, or a supervisor for him, immediately getting in touch with such mailer with a view to having him in the future include the street address on all such mail.

It is believed that if all postmasters will aggressively follow out this plan that the reward will more than compensate for the effort. There is yet entirely too much mail being rehandled because of insufficient address, and this should aid in remedying the matter. Postmasters or supervisors should frequently make a careful check to see that their instructions in this respect are being carried out.

Of course, this applies more particularly to the mailing office, but when at offices of address distributors note that considerable quantities of such insufficiently addressed mail are being received from any single office the postmaster of such office should be given the facts, with names of mailers, with the suggestion that he conduct an intensive local campaign for correct, complete, and legible addresses, including street, number, etc.

APARTMENT HOUSE MAIL RECEPTACLES

To Postmasters at City Delivery Offices:

In connection with the installation of mail receptacles in new or remodeled apartment houses, owners or managers should be notified that receptacles should be provided for the delivery of mail addressed to the resident manager, if any, and the janitor, as well as for the tenants.

BABY CHICK SHIPMENTS TO FLOODED MISSISSIPPI RIVER DISTRICTS

Postmasters of offices where chicken hatcheries are located will refuse to accept baby chick shipments addressed to points on either side of the Mississippi River, south of Cape Girardeau, Mo., on account of the interruption of transportation service by flood until such time as conditions again become normal and transportation service is resumed.

UNDELIVERED MAIL

The primary function of the post office is to handle and deliver mail. It therefore follows that every piece of mail possible should be delivered to the addressee.

In order to insure, so far as possible, the delivery of insufficiently, incorrectly, and illegibly addressed matter which has failed of delivery through the regular channels, it is directed that before such matter is returned to senders or sent in to the department, Division of Dead Letters and Dead Parcel Post or branches thereof, it be carefully examined by the most competent employee available for such purpose. This employee necessarily should be an old, experienced city distributor who has a wide knowledge of the patrons of the office and a good memory for the names of firms and individuals.

It is desired that all postmasters immediately issue such instructions as may be necessary to insure the efficient execution of this order.

OVERTIME SERVICE

To Postmasters at Offices of the First and Second Classes:

The attention of postmasters and supervisors is called to the provisions of law (secs. 348, 678, and 679, Postal Laws and Regulations) relating to the hours of

service and overtime service of employees. Any employee mentioned in the law who is permitted to work in excess of eight hours is entitled to pay therefor, and employees must not be permitted to work overtime unless there is need therefor. Employees must not be permitted to work overtime voluntarily without recording the same and without payment therefor.

The postmaster of International Falls, Minn., reports that much mail reaches his office for Laurel, Miss., and Laurel, Mont., his office serving Laurel, Minn.

The service will please exercise care in the distribution of mail to and from these offices in order that the missending of mail may be minimized.

The Following Notices Were Issued from the Bureau of the Second Assistant Postmaster General

W. IRVING GLOVER, SECOND ASSISTANT

CONTRACT AIR MAIL SERVICE

A contract has been awarded for service on that part of the present Government-operated route between New York and Chicago as route No. C. A. M.-17, to be effective on or soon after July 1, 1927.

With the establishment of route No. C. A. M.-17 (New York-Chicago) and route No. C. A. M.-18 (Chicago-San Francisco) this coming summer, the Government relinquishes the actual operation of air mail service by its own planes and personnel. During the period from 1918 to the present time the Post Office Department has demonstrated the practicability of transporting mail by aircraft, and in accordance with the original plan and the previously expressed purpose of the department, the service is being turned over to private enterprise for operation under contract.

IMPROPER USE OF NO. 1 POUCHES

It has come to the attention of the department that postmasters and other postal employees are using the large No. 1 pouches for making up domestic first-class mail. The use of these pouches is intended for shipments of foreign parcel-post mail only, and hereafter they are to be used only for such purpose. Postmasters and others not needing them for this purpose should forward surplus ones as they are received to either the postmaster at Boston, Mass., or New York, N. Y. Postmasters or others needing them for use in connection with the handling of foreign parcel-post mail should make requisition for them as needed, addressing such requisition to the General Superintendent Railway Mail Service.

DIVISION OF FOREIGN MAILS

PLANTS AND SEEDS IN PARCEL-POST MAILS TO BRAZIL

Information has been received that, effective at once, importers of live plants or live parts of plants (seeds, shoots, roots, etc.) in the parcel-post mails to Brazil are obliged to address to the vegetable sanitary inspector with jurisdiction over the port or border office through which the importation is to be effected a request for authorization, which must indicate the nature of the product, its quantity, the name of the country of origin, and the port of exportation. If the products do not come from countries affected by diseases or plagues, the inspector will furnish the importer a permit in three copies, in which will be given all conditions to which the importation must be subjected.

One of the copies of the permit should be sent by the importer to the exporter, and only after the requirements of the said permit are fulfilled will the Brazilian consuls abroad issue invoices for live plants or live parts of plants.

When the merchandise arrives at the port or border office through which the importation is permitted, the interested party will be obliged to apply to the vegetable sanitary inspector for the shipment in question, supporting his application with one copy of the import permit and complete information concerning the destination of the products in question.

The foregoing supersedes all previous information concerning the transmission of plants, parts of plants, seeds, etc., in the parcel-post mails to Brazil.

SENDERS OF PARCELS FROM THE UNITED STATES TO BRITISH NORTH BORNEO, NIGERIA AND THE BRITISH ZONE OF THE CAMEROONS (BLUEA AND VICTORIA) HAVE THE OPTION OF ATTACHING A SINGLE CUSTOMS DECLARATION TO ONLY ONE PARCEL COMPRISED IN A SHIPMENT MAILED SIMULTANEOUSLY BY THE SAME SENDER TO THE SAME ADDRESSEE AT ONE ADDRESS

Senders of parcels from the United States to British North Borneo, Nigeria and the British Zone of the Cameroons (Bluea and Victoria) have the option of attaching a single customs declaration to only one parcel comprised in a shipment consisting of any number of parcels mailed simultaneously by the same sender to the same addressee at one address.

Under this arrangement each parcel in a shipment should be clearly marked with a fractional number, the numerator of which will indicate in Arabic figures the number of the parcel and the denominator the number of parcels comprising the shipment. For example, if a single shipment were composed of 12 parcels, each parcel would be numbered, respectively, $\frac{1}{12}$, $\frac{2}{12}$, $\frac{3}{12}$, etc.

The customs declaration should be *securely* attached to one of the parcels, inasmuch as, in the event that the single customs declaration was lost, advice as to the entire shipment would be unavailable in the absence of the consular invoice, which is not required in case of shipments to British North Borneo.

The total number of parcels comprised in a shipment should also be invariably indicated on the customs declaration.

The postal administrations of Nigeria and the British Zone of the Cameroons will continue to require a customs declaration to be attached to each parcel for the United States.

LOCK SACKS RECEIVED FROM CANADA

The postal administration of Canada has requested that, in those instances where sacks are received in this service locked, the seam be opened rather than that the string be cut.

PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO CUBA

Information has been received that several postmasters in this country are forwarding eggs and baby chicks in outside packages to Cuba.

As neither the existing parcel-post convention between the United States and Cuba nor any special arrangement provide for the exchange of baby chicks, they should not be accepted for dispatch either inside mail sacks or as outside pieces when destined for the country mentioned.

Eggs may be accepted when packed in accordance with the provisions of section 59, on page 315 of the annual Postal Guide for 1926, but must be placed inside sacks when dispatched to Cuba.

Clerks will strictly comply with these instructions, and will turn over to the Postmaster at Key West, all packages not conforming to these regulations, endorsing such packages "Return to sender, prohibited entry into Cuba."

SPECIAL-DELIVERY SERVICE WITH ESTONIA

Effective April 15, 1927, articles (registered and unregistered) in the regular mails (letters, post cards, printed matter, commercial papers, and samples) addressed for delivery in Estonia will be given the benefit of special-delivery service when prepaid 20 cents, in addition to the regular postage, by United States special-delivery or other stamps affixed to each article.

The envelopes or covers of articles intended for special delivery in Estonia should have affixed labels reading, "Expres (special delivery)." However, until a supply of the said labels can be secured from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Equipment and Supplies, the articles should in all cases be marked in red ink "Expres" directly below but never on the stamps.

Insufficiently prepaid articles intended by the senders for special delivery in Estonia, posted in letter boxes and drops, should be marked by postmasters, "Not in special-delivery mail" and dispatched onward to destination as ordinary mail matter whenever such articles can not be returned to the sender for the deficiency in fee without seriously delaying the dispatch thereof.

Articles mailed in Estonia which are intended for special delivery in this service will be marked "Expres" or have labels affixed bearing that word.

Special-delivery articles received from Estonia will be subject to the same conditions in their delivery as special-delivery articles in the domestic service, attention being invited especially in this connection to section 1043, Postal Laws and Regulations, 1924, concerning the holding at the post office, to be called for by the addressee, of special-delivery mail believed to contain large sums of money or securities which can not be delivered without unusual risk.

ADDRESS OF ARTICLES INTENDED FOR DELIVERY IN GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND

Postmasters will give the widest publicity possible, without expense to the department, to the fact that, in order to avoid delay in delivery, the address of articles in the mails which are intended for delivery in London, England, should include the district initial and number, for instance, "London, S. W. 7, England"; and that, in the case of articles for delivery in other parts of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the name of the county is an essential part of the address.

PARCEL-POST SERVICE TO GREECE

The postal administration of Greece has advised that used clothing continues to be received in that service although announcements have been issued to the effect that such articles are prohibited in the parcel-post mails to that country.

It is also stated that used footwear will be returned to origin in the future if unfit for use, and it is requested that postmasters at offices of mailing exercise great care when accepting parcels destined for delivery in Greece in order to determine that articles of a prohibited nature are not included.

COMMENCING AT ONCE THE AIR MAIL FEES ON LETTERS MAILED IN THE NETHERLANDS MUST BE PREPAID BY MEANS OF NETHERLANDS POSTAGE STAMPS IN ORDER TO BE TRANSMITTED BY THE UNITED STATES AIR MAIL SERVICE

Pursuant to the request of the postal administration of the Netherlands, commencing at once, only Netherlands postage stamps will be recognized in prepayment of the fees required for onward transmission by the United States air mail service of letters mailed in the Netherlands.

Postmasters will please cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices and the widest publicity, without expense to the department, to be given thereto.

AIR MAIL FEES APPLICABLE TO LETTERS FROM FOREIGN COUNTRIES FOR TRANSMISSION BY THE UNITED STATES AIR MAIL SERVICE

Effective June 1, 1927, the air mail fees applicable to letters from foreign countries for transmission by the United States air mail service, regardless of distance or character of the air mail route or routes over which said letters are carried, will be 10 cents for each half ounce or fraction thereof, in addition to the regular postage.

This modifies the notice of this office dated February 4, 1927, and printed on page 7 of the Postal Guide for March, 1927.

Postmasters will please cause due notice of the foregoing to be taken at their offices.

NEW COUNTERFEITS

The Treasury Department furnishes the following description of a new counterfeit note:

\$10 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE

On the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, Ohio, series of 1914; check letter B; face plate No. 193; back plate No. 1314; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Jackson.

This counterfeit is a photomechanical production printed on two pieces of paper between which imitation silk threads have been distributed. The numbering and seal are executed in pale-blue ink. The letters forming the circular text within the seal are irregularly developed. Serial number of specimen at hand, D32239502A.

Care should be exercised in handling notes of this variety, as this counterfeit will deceive the unwary.

\$20 NATIONAL-BANK NOTE

On the First National Bank of Calexico, Calif.; series 1902; check letter "A"; charter number, 9686; bank number, 14646; Treasury number, U70522H; back plate number, 852; W. T. Vernon, Register of the Treasury; Lee McClung, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Hugh McCulloch.

This counterfeit is printed from engraved plates on two pieces of paper between which imitation silk threads have been distributed. The numbering is printed in glossy blue, while the seal is executed in a pale indigo shade. The cashier's signature seems to have been printed in the numbering operation, but the name of the bank president is rubber stamped in light purple. While this counterfeit is well made and is likely to deceive the unwary, its general tone is colorless, the face having an ashen hue which should excite suspicion and the back executed in pea green of doubtful luster.

\$20 NATIONAL-BANK NOTE

On the Pearsall National Bank, Pearsall, Tex.; series 1902; check letter "B"; charter number, 6989; bank number, 12205; Treasury number, N552496H; back plate number, 787; J. W. Lyons, Register of the Treasury; Ellis H. Roberts, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Hugh McCulloch.

This counterfeit is the handiwork of the persons responsible for the note above described and is identical in all fundamental details except for the fact that the signatures of the bank officials are rubber stamped in black ink. These two counterfeits are similar in workmanship to the notes described in Circular Letters Nos. 511 and 549, and like the latter two notes, are of Mexican origin.

DIVISION OF MONEY ORDERS**SPAIN TO ACT AS INTERMEDIARY IN THE EXCHANGE OF MONEY ORDERS BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND CERTAIN SPANISH POSSESSIONS OF THE GULF OF GUINEA**

The postal administration of Spain reports that beginning May 1 it will act as intermediary for money orders payable in Spanish territories of the Gulf of Guinea.

The offices to which orders may be sent under this arrangement are Santa Isabel and San Carlos on the island of Fernando Po, Elobey on the island of Elobey, and Bata in Guinea proper.

Postmasters are instructed to insert these four offices in their proper places in the ready reference table of the "International list" for 1926, with the notation, "See Spain."

Money orders payable at any of these offices are to be drawn in all respects as if intended for Spain; that is, the amount is to be expressed in the money of both countries (dollars and cents, pesetas and centimos), and the order marked "canceled" and sent with the advice and coupon properly made out to the New York exchange office.

INCREASED INTERMEDIARY MONEY-ORDER SERVICE WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

The attention of postmasters at international money-order offices is directed to the fact that in the October, 1926, edition of the "List of international money-order offices," Pamphlet XIV, there are included countries, not published in the 1924 edition, to which money orders may now be sent, and it is requested that when inquiry is made by an intending remitter as to countries and localities with which money-order business is transacted the ready reference table, pages 13 to 19, as well as Tables 2 and 3, pages 2 and 3, be carefully consulted.

It may be specially noted that while the direct exchange of money orders with Egypt was discontinued several years ago, and there is no probability of its immediate resumption, money orders may now be sent to that country through the intermediary of Great Britain.

THE "BELGA" THE NEW MONETARY UNIT OF BELGIUM

At the request of the Brussels office, it has been decided to express in "belgas" and "centiemmes" instead of francs and centimes the amounts of money orders issued in the United States for payment in Belgium.

Postmasters at all international money-order offices will therefore please explain to intending remitters of such orders that the "belga," the new monetary unit adopted by Belgium, is invariably reckoned as the equivalent of 5 Belgian francs, and that the centieme is the one-hundredth part of the belga.

If, notwithstanding this explanation, an intending remitter expresses the amount in his application for the issue of a Belgian money order in francs and centimes the postmaster will divide the sum by 5 to ascertain the correct amount in belgas and centiemmes and will then consult the table in Pamphlet 6749a prescribed by the department for the conversion of belgas into dollars (at present Table No. 42, 1 belga = 14 cents) to ascertain the amount to be collected for the issue of the order.

It is to be understood, of course, that in the issue of money orders for Belgium the amount is also to be stated in dollars and cents as heretofore.

ADVICES FOR MONEY ORDERS ON GREECE TO BE WRITTEN IN ENGLISH CHARACTERS

The New York Exchange office reports the receipt of several money-order advices issued for payment in Greece on which the name and address of payee are written in Greek characters, presumably by the remitters.

It is believed, therefore, that some postmasters have misinterpreted the third paragraph of the department's instructions in regard to the issue of Greek money orders published in the Postal Bulletin No. 14336 of March 19, and it is desired that the first sentence of the paragraph be amended to read as follows:

"Remitters must be required to furnish *in English characters on their original applications* the given names of payees as they are known to the Greek postal authorities," etc.

Postmasters will be careful to copy accurately on the advices the details shown in the original applications, and if they are deemed unintelligible the remitter may be asked to supplement them by writing in his own language the payee's name and address on a "Supplemental international advice," Form 6083, which, as in the case of money orders payable in any other country, will be attached by the postmaster to the original advice when this document is sent to the New York exchange office for certification.

APPLICATIONS FOR DUPLICATE MONEY ORDERS PAYABLE IN THE FOREIGN COUNTRIES WITH WHICH MONEY-ORDER BUSINESS IS CONDUCTED ON THE DOMESTIC BASIS MUST BE SENT TO THE OFFICE OF THE THIRD ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL

Postmasters at money-order offices are reminded that an application for a duplicate of an order drawn for payment in any of the countries named in Table 1, page 99, of the July, 1926, Postal Guide, should be sent direct to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders, Washington, D. C., and not to the office of payment in the foreign country.

It is not necessary for a postmaster to secure the signature of the remitter to Form 6002 when the communication from the paying country is referred to his office with Form 6569. Such cases will be greatly expedited if postmasters read carefully Form 6569 and follow instructions therein given.

WRONG OFFICE NUMBER ON MONEY-ORDER FORMS

It is reported that money-order forms supplied for use of the post offices named below and supposed to have been issued and paid bore incorrect office numbers. Postmasters having in their files coupons of any such orders should be careful to avoid being misled by such error in certifying to applications for duplicates and warrants, or in answering inquiries regarding payment.

South Bend, Station No. 18, Ind. Serial Nos. 1 to 200, inclusive. Correct office number is 34419 and not 34418.

Boxholm, Iowa. Serial Nos. 19001 to 19491, inclusive. Correct office number is 64554 and not 64854.

Landrum, S. C. Serial numbers 61001 to 61113, inclusive. Correct office number is 59424 and not 69424.

DIVISION OF CLASSIFICATION

IRREGULARITIES AND CARELESSNESS IN THE PREPARATION OF CARD NOTICES, FORMS 3540, 3548, AND 3578 MUST BE CORRECTED

In connection with the instructions of the Postmaster General appearing on page 1 of this Supplement under the heading "Collection of proper postage, looking for short-paid matter, and efforts to have complete, legible addresses and return cards on mail must be given constant and earnest attention," it is also necessary again to call attention to the fact that the department continues to receive complaints indicating that at some post offices there is negligence and carelessness in the preparation and furnishing of notices to senders and addressees on Forms 3540 and 3548, respectively, concerning undeliverable mail held for return and forwarding postage and notices to publishers on Form 3578 with respect to undeliverable second-class matter.

In some instances the name of the post office furnishing the notice is not inserted in the space provided therefor, and the form is either illegibly postmarked or not postmarked at all, so that the person receiving the notice can not tell from what office it was sent and, consequently, is unable to act on the notice. In other cases the full information called for by the cards in other respects is not shown.

Furthermore, in the case of notices on Form 3578, publishers can not correct their mailing lists unless they know the names of the post offices from which the notices emanate and their omission results in the continued mailing of undeliverable copies which must be handled by the postal service and the return of such copies to the publishers under label Form 3579, with consequent complaints by the publishers.

An instance is at hand where a notice on Form 3548 not bearing the name of the post office from which it was sent was recently addressed as follows:

Mr. M. Ehrlich,
General Delivery,
Shreveport, La.

Another instance is a notice on Form 3578 sent to the publisher of the Lawrenceburg News, Lawrenceburg, Ind., advising him that copies of the publication addressed to Sam Purnell, 3323 S. Tich., are undeliverable because of removal to 200 Idaho.

The post offices from which the notices above mentioned were sent will please immediately communicate with Mr. M. Ehrlich and the publisher of the publication named, respectively, explaining the error and inclosing new notices completely and properly filled out.

It is also desired to renew the suggestion previously made that when postmasters receive a supply of the forms mentioned they immediately place the names of their post offices, by hand stamp or otherwise, in the space provided therefor on the forms, so that when such forms are sent there will be no likelihood of the failure of the forms to show from what post offices the notices emanate.

Postmasters who observe irregularities of the nature mentioned above should make prompt report thereof to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Classification.

Cooperation in this matter will make for the betterment of the service and result in eliminating many complaints.

IRREGULARITIES IN RETURNING UNDELIVERABLE SECOND, THIRD, AND FOURTH CLASS MATTER BEARING A PLEDGE TO PAY RETURN POSTAGE

It is regretted that it is again necessary to call attention to the continued carelessness of some postmasters in failing to comply with the specific requirements of sections 614 and 615, Postal Laws and Regulations, when returning to the sender undeliverable mail of the second, third, and fourth classes. In some instances matter returned to the senders rated with the return postage in accordance with the provisions of section 614, Postal Laws and Regulations, has the address labels torn off or mutilated. This prevents the mailers from ascertaining to whom the matter was addressed or why it was returned, and of course makes it impossible for the senders to correct their mailing lists, which is the principal reason for having it returned charged with the return postage to be collected on delivery of the matter.

Some postmasters tie up in one bundle a number of individually addressed pieces of undeliverable matter and return it to the mailing office as one piece of mail rated at the third or fourth class rates of postage and indorse only the top piece in the bundle to show the reason for nondelivery, instead of properly rating and indorsing each piece. After being so rated and indorsed the individual pieces may be put up in suitable packages, labeled to the post office to which they are returned.

Cases of carelessness like those above indicated are constantly being brought to attention and much embarrassment is caused. Postmasters are therefore requested to give these matters their personal attention and make special efforts to have undeliverable matter properly indorsed without mutilating the wrapper or defacing the address thereon to such extent as to make it impossible for the sender to read the address and correct his mailing list.

Let all concerned cooperate to eliminate these causes for criticism and put a stop to the annoying practices mentioned.

PROPER ADDRESS AND RETURN CARD ON MAIL

The importance of a complete legible address and return card on each piece of mail can not be overemphasized. The mailing public have shown a fine spirit of cooperation in this respect and postmasters should continue their efforts to encourage the placing of a proper and legible address and return card on every piece of mail.

It is not only necessary that the address be complete and correct, but that it be arranged in the customary manner so as to facilitate the reading of the address when handling the mail with the rapidity required and to prevent improper treatment and delay.

To this end the addressee's street address, box number, or the number of his rural route should be placed under his name and above the name of the post office and State, in the lower right portion of the address side, the sender's return card being placed in the upper left corner, as indicated in the following:

Postmasters should urge their patrons to exercise the greatest possible care to see that mail is sufficiently and correctly addressed, in order to secure its prompt and certain delivery. Business concerns and others should be requested to include their street or box numbers in their stationery and advertisements and thus help to reduce the volume of insufficiently addressed mail.

ACCEPTANCE OF PROPERLY LABELED SEALED PARCELS AT THE THIRD OR FOURTH CLASS RATES OF POSTAGE

Sealed parcels of merchandise and other fourth-class matter may be mailed at the fourth-class rates of postage provided the parcels are labeled in printing to show the nature of the contents, as, for example, "Contents: Merchandise—Fourth-class mail," or "Contents—Merchandise," together with the printed name and address of the manufacturer, producer, or shipper, and the inscription "Postmaster: This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary." The word "postal" is essential in this notice. See paragraph 6, section 453, Postal Laws and Regulations, and article 57, page 15, of the July, 1926, Postal Guide.

Merchandise, books, seeds, and other articles, except circulars and miscellaneous printed matter, which when sent in parcels weighing 8 ounces or less are embraced in mail of the third class, may also be sealed and mailed at the third-class rates of postage, provided the parcels are appropriately labeled as indicated in the preceding paragraph.

Although a separate label bearing the indicia as to contents and inspection may be used provided it is placed close to the printed return card of the sender on the parcel, it is preferred that all these indicia be combined with the address on a single label arranged as follows:

All the foregoing indicia must be printed, so that the labels will be uniform and legible, thus facilitating the identification of the sealed parcels as entitled to be mailed under this provision. Hand stamping, typewriting, or writing the name of the sender and other indicia does not meet the requirements for sealed parcels mailed at the third or fourth class rates of postage. When desired the indicia may be printed on gummed paper tape, which is used by some shippers for sealing their parcels, but in such case the tape must be strong enough to enable the parcels to withstand the necessary handling in the mails.

Although the words "Return postage guaranteed" may be omitted from the above indicia when the parcels are sent as ordinary mail, it is desirable that they be placed on all parcels in order to expedite their return to the senders when undeliverable and relieve the latter of the trouble and additional expense of remitting postage to postmasters in advance of the return of the parcels. This will avoid delay and tend to keep mailing lists up to date.

When it is necessary to open sealed parcels of this character for postal inspection, they must be carefully repacked and indorsed:

"Opened for postal inspection by the postmaster at _____."

When parcels originally mailed, sealed under the foregoing regulation, are returned by the addressees to the original mailers at the third or fourth class rates of postage they should not be sealed unless they bear in printing the name and address of the person returning the matter as well as the other indicia set forth above.

Patrons should be cautioned against placing unauthorized inclosures in sealed parcels mailed at the third or fourth class rates of postage. Violations in this respect will not only lead to withdrawal of the privilege of mailing sealed parcels in such manner but constitute an offense punishable by a maximum fine of \$100.

DIVISION OF STAMPS

EXCESSIVE STOCKS OF STAMP SUPPLIES NOT TO BE REQUISITIONED BY POSTMASTERS

Based on the numerous letters received from postmasters at first and second class post offices requesting authority to redeem unsalable stamp stock and in accordance with information received from post-office-inspection reports, as well as other sources, it seems evident that proper care is not being exercised at many post offices in preparing stamp requisitions to avoid the accumulation of surplus supplies. This applies particularly to high and little used denominations of stamps, and may be due to some extent by the drawing of requisitions for stock packages of 10,000 stamps when the amount sold does not justify such quantities. While it is desirable, when practicable, for postmasters to order stamps in wrapped packages, the instructions in the Postal Guide under the heading "Stock packing of adhesive postage stamps" are not to be construed as authorizing postmasters to requisition full packages of stamps, when such quantities are not needed for immediate or early use. Postmasters have been known to order stock packages of the higher denomination stamps when such will constitute the requirements for a year or more, representing a total disregard of the instructions.

The department expects that postmasters shall provide an adequate supply of stamp stock sufficient to meet the local public requirements at all times, but the stock is to be limited to a three to six months' supply, the latter quantity only when the stamps can be securely protected against loss, as required by the instructions. Postmasters will please see that requisitions are prepared in strict accordance with these rules hereafter.

To postmasters who are still oversupplied with 1-cent stock, attention is invited to the instructions in the notice on page 21 of the November, 1925, Postal Guide, under the title "Disposition of surplus stocks of 1-cent stamps and stamped envelopes." Except that surplus stocks of 1-cent stamps in sheets in full packages of 50,000 each may be reported to the department for transfer, 1-cent envelopes and stamps in coils and books should be disposed of to the fullest extent possible locally, and in accordance with the existing instructions.

DIVISION OF REGISTERED MAILS

NO REGISTRY FEE COLLECTED IN CHILE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR CORPS CORRESPONDENCE OF COUNTRIES WHICH HAVE ADHERED TO THE PAN AMERICAN POSTAL UNION

Postmasters and postal employees will please note that the postal authorities of Chile have advised, through the Department of State, that instructions have been issued in Chile to the effect that no registry fee is to be collected in that country for the registration of correspondence of members of the diplomatic and consular corps of the countries which have adhered to the Pan American Postal Union.

In this connection, please note the instructions which have been issued regarding free registration of correspondence of the diplomatic and consular corps of the Pan American countries which have adhered to the principal convention of Buenos Ayres published on pages 22 and 23 of the April, pages 16 and 17 of the June, and page 12 of the October, 1925, Postal Guides.

PREPARATION OF OFFICIAL REGISTERED MAIL

It has been brought to the attention of the department that some postmasters and postal employees are not using proper care in the preparation of official registered mail.

In some instances it appears that official registers have been opened and resealed by the clerks preparing same for mailing, and in some instances an excessive quantity of mucilage has been used and the article postmarked before the mucilage had dried, causing the impression of the postmark to be out of alignment, making it appear likely that rifling had been attempted.

Postmasters and postal employees are instructed to use care to see that the official registered mail is properly prepared for registration, attention in this connection being invited to sections 860 and 874 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924.

OFFICIAL ENVELOPE NO. 47, DESIGNATED EXCLUSIVELY FOR REGISTERED MAIL, NOT TO BE POSTMARKED ON THE ADDRESS SIDE

The present edition of official envelope No. 47, designated to be used *exclusively* for transmitting funds by registered mail, has a space for the postmark on the address side which is misleading and has therefore caused some confusion in view of the requirements of paragraph 3 of section 874 of the Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 that registered letters shall be postmarked twice on the back as nearly as practicable at the crossings of the upper and lower flaps, and that the postmark shall not be placed on the face of first-class registered mail.

Postmasters are directed to observe the requirements referred to and not postmark official envelope No. 47 on the address side.

When a new supply of this envelope is printed, the space for the postmark will be omitted from the address side.

SPECIAL PACKING INSTRUCTIONS FOR INSURED PARCELS ADDRESSED TO GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND CONTAINING LIQUIDS OR ANY SUBSTANCE WHICH EASILY LIQUEFIES

It has come to the attention of the department that, although improperly prepared for mailing, postmasters are accepting for insurance to Great Britain and Northern Ireland parcels containing liquids or any substance which easily liquefies.

The Parcel Post Convention between Great Britain and Northern Ireland and this country, under the provisions of which mailable parcels are accepted for insurance, provides: "Any liquid or any substance which easily liquefies shall be packed in a double receptacle. Between the first receptacle (bottle, flask, pot, box, etc.), and the second (box of metal or of strong wood) shall be left a space which shall be filled with sawdust, bran, or some other absorbent material in sufficient quantity to absorb all the liquid contents in the case of breakage."

Postmasters are requested to take the necessary steps to have the above-cited requirements strictly complied with.

Failure to observe the requirements with regard to packing insured parcels not only jeopardizes the other mail in case of breakage of the containers of liquids but also deprives claimants of the right to indemnity in case of damage to the improperly packed articles.

SUFFICIENT EFFORT TO BE MADE TO EFFECT DELIVERY OF C. O. D. PARCELS

Complaints have been received by the department that sufficient effort is not being made at some post offices to effect delivery of C. O. D. mail. A considerable number of instances have occurred where addressees were not notified of the arrival of C. O. D. parcels addressed to them, although investigation showed that such parcels would have been promptly accepted had the addressees been notified of the arrival of such mail.

Postmasters at all offices are directed to see that the requirements set forth in articles 172 and 173, page 141 of the July, 1926, Postal Guide, are strictly complied with at all times by employees assigned to the delivery of C. O. D. mail.

At post offices not having carrier service postmasters are expected to use every means practicable, not involving expense to the department, to notify addressees that C. O. D. parcels are on hand for delivery, and delivery notice (Form 3849) should in each case be placed in the general delivery or in the post-office box if one is rented by the addressee.

Where C. O. D. mail is properly deliverable by carrier (city, village, or rural) the parcels shall be taken out once for delivery and if not accepted at that time for any reason, notice shall be given to, or left for, the addressees that the parcels will be held at the post office. While C. O. D. parcels which have not been refused on the first attempt at delivery will be taken out for delivery a second time by city, village, or rural carrier provided assurance is given that the parcels will be accepted, many addressees are not aware of such privilege. It is not doubted but that as a result many C. O. D. parcels which would otherwise have been accepted by the addressees in due course are held at the post office for the full period stated in senders' return requests and then returned as undeliverable.

It is therefore requested that postmasters instruct carriers (city, village, and rural) that when a C. O. D. parcel is taken out for delivery on the first attempt and is offered for delivery to the addressee or some responsible person for the addressee, but delivery can not be accepted because the amount of charges is not on hand, or the exact amount is not readily available and the carrier can not make change, the person to whom the parcel is tendered should be asked to state the exact date on which delivery will be accepted if the parcel is again brought out. The carrier should make an appropriate and conspicuous notation on the parcel itself for the information of the employee assigning C. O. D. parcels for delivery and the parcel should be again taken out for delivery on the date specified.

It is considered that this practice will be rendering proper service to patrons and will also tend to prevent congestion of C. O. D. parcels at post offices.

**RURAL CARRIERS MAY NOT ACT AS INSURANCE AGENTS OR ENGAGE IN ANY OTHER
BUSINESS INVOLVING THE QUESTION OF AGENCY**

The attention of postmasters and rural carriers is particularly invited to the fact that rural carriers may not engage in the insurance business, or in any other occupation involving the question of agency, such activity being in direct violation not only of the Postal Laws and Regulations, but of a specific act of Congress which provides that "Rural carriers shall not solicit business or receive orders of any kind for any person, firm, or corporation."

Postmasters will see to it that the rural carriers attached to their offices are made thoroughly familiar with the provisions of section 755, Postal Laws and Regulations, and will report promptly to this bureau any infractions thereof.

CHANGES AFFECTING THE OFFICIAL POSTAL GUIDE FOR JULY, 1926

NOTICE.—The changes affecting the Postal Guide, published on pages 49 to 63, inclusive, of the April supplement should have been numbered from 171 to 186, inclusive; *not* from 263 to 278, inclusive.

CHANGE No. 187.

The following modifies the information appearing under the item "Great Britain and Northern Ireland" on page 211:

Information has been received that the importation of silk and artificial silk goods into Great Britain through the regular mails (except samples) is now prohibited. Small packages containing bona fide trade samples of such goods may, however, be imported in the "samples" mails subject to the following conditions:

(1) The concession will be confined to bona fide trade samples of silk or artificial silk yarns, tissues, ribbons, braids, cords, and trimmings, and of raw silk and silk or artificial silk waste.

(2) The gross weight of each package must not exceed 16 ounces.

(3) Each packet must bear the full name and address of the consignee and must also be addressed "c/o The Officer of Customs and Excise, Mount Pleasant Depot, General Post Office, London, E. C." and be conspicuously marked with particulars of the contents, including their net weight and tariff category and a statement that they are bona fide trade samples.

(4) A fee of 6d. in addition to the duty, if any, payable on the contents of the packet will be collected on delivery.

Bona fide trade samples imported in accordance with the above provisions will be admitted free of duty if within the limits indicated below:

(a) Tissues (other than ribbons) in lengths not exceeding 1 yard, irrespective of the width from selvedge to selvedge.

(b) Piece goods liable to ad valorem rates of duty, such as cords, gimps, etc., in lengths not exceeding 1 yard.

(c) Ribbons in lengths not exceeding 2½ yards provided that they are snipped at the edges at intervals of not more than 9 inches.

(d) Yarns, raw silk, and waste silk not exceeding 4 ounces.

Silk and artificial silk goods imported by the sample or other prohibited post otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this notice will be liable to forfeiture.

In all cases only one sample of the same range or color will be admitted free of duty. The procedure described above does not apply to goods liable to lace and embroidery duty.

The following modifies the item "Greece" on page 287:

Information has been received that candy is now admissible in the parcel-post mails to Greece.

CHANGE No. 189.

The following modifies the item "Hedjaz, Kingdom of," and information shown thereunder appearing on page 213:

The following articles are prohibited in the regular mails to Hedjaz and Nedjed and Dependencies:

Articles of registered correspondence are prohibited admission into the Kingdom of Hedjaz and Nedjed and Dependencies with the exception of Djedda, Mecca, Medina, Yambo, El Wedja, Kenfeda, and El Tayef.

Arms; books contrary to the Islamic faith. Dutiable articles are admitted under the conditions shown on page 205.

CHANGE No. 190.

The following should be added to the item "Hungary" on pages 213 and 289: Receiving apparatus for wireless telegraphy and telephony, as well as essential parts of such apparatus, may be imported into Hungary without any special import permit if addressed to persons having a permit to manufacture, sell, or operate such apparatus. The addressee must present the permit in question at the time of delivery of the articles mentioned.

For the importation of sending apparatus and essential parts of such apparatus a special import permit is, however, demanded by the customs authorities.

A large number of articles are either prohibited altogether from importation into Hungary or may be imported only if a Hungarian import license is obtained in advance. If the sender of a parcel is uncertain as to whether its contents are admissible without a permit he should communicate with the addressee to obtain the desired information.

CHANGE No. 191.

The following modifies the item "Lithuania" on pages 215 and 295:

Effective at once, margarine products made with animal fats, and flours are admissible in the regular and parcel-post mails to Lithuania.

CHANGE No. 192.

The information now appearing under the subheading "Observations" of the item "Persia," on page 303 and in changes Nos. 55 and 59, on pages 37 and 39 supplement for October, is superseded by the following:

Every parcel must be addressed to a Poste Restante, as indicated below; and in the case of a parcel intended for transmission by service, (2) the words "By overland mail Haifa-Baghdad" must also be included in the address; for example: "Mr. X. Shiraz, Poste Restante, Bushire, by overland mail Haifa-Baghdad."

The addressees are advised of the arrival of the parcels at the Poste Restante, and must pay for their onward transmission, if they are to be forwarded into the interior, before they can be sent on.

All parcels must be packed in wood, tin, canvas, linen, or similar material, and not merely in paper or cardboard.

Poste Restante, Mohammerah.—Parcels for Abadan and all other places in the Province of Arabistan, except Ahwaz and Maidan-i-Naphtun.

SERVICE (2)

Poste Restante, Qasir-i-Shirin.—Parcels for Brujerd, Damghan, Hamadan, Ispahan, Kashan, Kazvin, Kermanshah, Kum, Malayer, Resht, Semnan, Senendej (Senneh), Shahrud, Sultanabad, Tabriz (Tauris), Teheran, Zenjan, and all other places in the Provinces of Azerbaijan, Guilan, Khorassan, and Mazanderan.

Poste Restante, Ahwa.—Parcels for Ahwaz and Maidan-i-Naphtun (Masjid-i-Suleiman).

Poste Restante, Bender Abbas.—Parcels for Bender Abbas and places in the Provinces of Kirman and Sistan.

Poste Restante, Bushire.—Parcels for Bushire, Shiraz, and Yezd.

Poste Restante, Chahbar.—Parcels for Chahbar.

Poste Restante, Henjam.—Parcels for Henjam.

Poste Restante, Jask.—Parcels for Jask.

Poste Restante, Lingah.—Parcels for Lingah and Lar.

Poste Restante, Mohammerah.—Parcels for Abadan and all other places in the Province of Arabistan, except Ahwaz and Maidan-i-Naphtun.

CHANGE NO. 193.

The following should be added to the item "Switzerland" on page 309:

Parcel-post packages weighing more than 11 pounds containing meat or preparation of meat are subject to importation authorization obtained at the request of the addressee in Switzerland by a competent cantonal authority. The import authorization must be requested in advance of the shipment.

CHANGE NO. 194.

The following should be added to the item "Union of the Socialistic Soviet Republics," on page 311:

Cotton imported from foreign countries in the form of parcel post may not be addressed to the cotton districts of the Union of Socialistic Soviet Republics unless a certificate is presented, attesting that it is not infested by harmful insects. These certificates are delivered to the senders when previously requested of the commission under the Directorate General of Textile Industry, Moscow, Place de Noghin, Delovoï Dvor.

By the word "cotton" is meant: All raw cotton, unmanufactured cotton wool, as well as cotton waste obtained at the time of spinning and other waste of any kind known under any commercial name.

Cottonseed, bolls, and plants addressed to any part of the Soviet Union must be disinfected at the expense of the addressee.

In case that the addressee refuses to pay for disinfection, the parcel, at the expiration of the period fixed, is returned to origin.

CHANGE NO. 195.

The following should be added to the item "Netherlands," on page 300:

Firearms and detached parts of firearms must be accompanied by a permit for importation or transit.

CHANGE NO. 196.

The following modifies the transit rates as shown under the item "Madeira Islands," on page 252:

1 to 3 pounds.....	\$0.48
4 to 7 pounds.....	.78
8 to 11 pounds.....	.96

The postage and transit rates must be prepaid by postage stamps affixed to parcels at time of mailing.

CHANGE No. 197.

Change No. 136, on page 67 of the February Supplement, is modified by the following:

Saccharine and similar products are now admitted without restriction in the parcel post mails to Belgian Congo (via England).

CHANGE No. 198.

The following should be added to the second paragraph of the subheading "Observations" of the item "Cameroun (French)" on page 273:
"Bafang, Campo, N' Dikinimmeki."

CHANGE No. 199.

The following should be added to the list of prohibited articles appearing under the item "Estonia," on pages 210 and 280:

Margarine and margarine cheese may be imported only by previous authorization from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. This authorization is granted only for margarines containing at least 82 per cent of fat and at most 16 per cent of water, which are not mixed with cow butter. Margarines destined for importation must also be free, in order to be admitted, from all harmful substances, and may not contain more than 0.2 per cent of benzoic acid.

In order to obtain the authorization to import, the importer is bound:

- (1) To send three samples of the margarine which he intends to import, each weighing at least 400 grams, to the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.
- (2) To state in writing the exact consistency of the margarine to be imported.
- (3) To send the said ministry a sample of the packing in which the merchandise will be imported into Estonia.
- (4) To submit a certificate delivered by a competent authority and confirmed by the respective Estonian consul attesting that the production of the margarine in question has been subject to sanitary control in the country of origin.
- (5) To state the firm name and address of the concern which has manufactured the margarine in question.

In addition to the authorization from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, articles containing margarine must bear a conspicuous inscription designating their contents; for example, "Margarine," "Margarine cheese," etc., and indicating the firm name and address of the concern which has produced the merchandise in question.

CHANGE No. 200.

The following modifies the announcement published as change No. 122 on page 51 of the February Supplement:

The Cairo-Baghdad-Basra air mail service will now operate on a weekly schedule.

NOTICE.—The inserts to the Postal Laws and Regulations, published on page 67 and 69 of the April supplement, should have been numbered "263 to 267" inclusive, not from "363 to 367" inclusive.

INSERT NO. 268. ORDER NO. 5347.

APRIL 11, 1927.

Paragraph 5, section 445, Postal Laws and Regulations, is amended to read as follows:

"The rate of postage on gold coin, gold bullion, and gold dust offered for mailing between any two points in Alaska, or between any point in Alaska and any point in the United States or its possessions, shall be 2 cents an ounce or fraction thereof, regardless of distance. Such gold coin, gold bullion, or gold dust shall be inclosed in sealed packages not exceeding 50 pounds in weight and sent by registered mail. (See sec. 863 for amount of registry fee.)

INSERT NO. 269. ORDER NO. 5360.

APRIL 26, 1927.

The Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924 are hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

"SEC. 478½. Pistols, revolvers, and other firearms capable of being concealed on the person are hereby declared to be nonmailable and shall not be deposited in or carried by the mails or delivered by any postmaster, letter carrier, or other person in the Postal Service: *Provided*, That such articles may be conveyed in the mails, under such regulations as the Postmaster General shall prescribe, for use in connection with their official duty, to officers of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or officers' Reserve Corps; to officers of the National Guard or Militia of the several States, Territories, and Districts; to officers of the United States or of the several States, Territories, and Districts whose official duty is to serve process of warrants of arrest or mittimus of commitment; to employees of the Postal Service; and to watchmen engaged in guarding the property of the United States, the several States, Territories, and Districts: *And provided further*, That such articles may be conveyed in the mails to manufacturers of firearms or bona fide dealers therein in customary trade shipments, including such articles for repairs or replacement of parts, from one to the other, under such regulations as the Postmaster General shall prescribe. Whoever shall knowingly deposit or cause to be deposited for mailing or delivery, or shall knowingly cause to be delivered by mail according to the direction thereon, or at any place to which it is directed to be delivered by the person to whom it is addressed, any pistol, revolver, or firearm, declared by this act to be nonmailable, shall be fined not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than two years, or both.

"*And be it further enacted*, That this act shall take effect ninety days after its approval by the President of the United States."

Act of February 8, 1927.

NOTE.—Law becomes effective May 10, 1927.

2. Pistols, revolvers, and other firearms capable of being concealed on the person shall be treated as nonmailable matter unless the conditions hereinafter prescribed have been complied with by the sender and addressee of such articles.

3. All parcels containing unloaded firearms capable of being concealed on the person shall be plainly marked by the sender:

FIREARMS

For _____

(State excepted class)

Postmasters see section 478½, P. L. and R.

the word "FIREARMS" to be in bold gothic (block) letters not less than 36 point (about one-half inch high and of corresponding width). The particular class of persons to which the addressee belongs authorized by the law to receive firearms through the mails must be indicated by inserting on the blank line under "FIREARMS" words descriptive of his official position or business, such as "Army officer," "Manufacturer," "Bona fide dealer," etc., as the case may be.

4. Except as provided in paragraph 10 hereof, parcels containing unloaded firearms properly prepared for mailing addressed for delivery to any officer of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Officers' Reserve Corps, or to any officer of the National Guard or Militia of any State, Territory, or District of the United States may be accepted for mailing, provided there be filed with the postmaster at the time of mailing by the sender or his agent an affidavit of the addressee of such parcel, setting forth that he is such an officer and that the contents of the parcel are intended for his use in connection with his official duty, and provided further that such affidavit shall bear a certificate signed by his commanding officer stating that the firearm is for the use of the addressee in connection with his official duty.

5. Except as provided in paragraph 10 hereof, parcels containing unloaded firearms properly prepared for mailing addressed for delivery to officers of the United States or of the several States, Territories, and Districts whose official duty is to serve process of warrants of arrest or mittimus of commitment may be accepted for mailing provided there be filed with the postmaster at the time of mailing by the sender or his agent an affidavit of the addressee of such parcel, setting forth that he is such an officer and that the contents of the parcel are intended for his use in connection with his official duty, and provided further that such affidavit shall bear a certificate stating that the firearm is intended for the use of the addressee in connection with his official duty. In the case of a Federal officer such certificate shall be signed by a judge of the Federal court for the judicial district in which the addressee's official services are rendered; and in the case of a State officer the certificate shall be signed by a judge of a court of record for the jurisdiction in which the addressee's official services are rendered.

6. Except as provided in paragraph 10 hereof, parcels containing unloaded firearms properly prepared for mailing, addressed for delivery to watchmen engaged in guarding the property of the United States, the several States, Territories, and Districts, may be accepted for mailing provided there be filed with the postmaster at the time of mailing by the sender or his agent an affidavit of the addressee of such parcel, setting forth that he is such a watchman and that its contents are intended for his use in connection with his official duty, and provided further that such affidavit shall bear a certificate signed by the chief clerk of the department, bureau, or independent branch of the Government of either the United States, the State, Territory, or District by which such watchman is employed, stating that the firearm is for the use of the addressee in connection with his official duty.

7. The affidavit and certificate required by paragraphs 4, 5, and 6 shall be retained in the files of the post office for a period of not less than three years.

8. The postmaster at the office of delivery shall require the addressee of any parcel covered by paragraphs 4, 5, and 6 to call at the post office and establish his identity as such addressee to the satisfaction of the postmaster. The parcel may then be delivered. A receipt therefor shall be taken and retained in the files of the post office for a period of not less than three years.

9. Parcels containing unloaded firearms properly prepared for mailing may be conveyed in the mails to manufacturers of firearms or bona fide dealers therein in customary trade shipments, including such articles for repairs or replacement of parts, from one to the other. At the time such parcels are presented for mailing there shall be filed with the postmaster a statement signed by the sender that he is a manufacturer of firearms or that he is a bona fide dealer therein and that the parcels are customary trade shipments or contain such articles for repairs or replacement of parts and that to the best of his knowledge and belief the addressees are manufacturers of firearms or bona fide dealers therein. If satisfied that the sender is a manufacturer of firearms or a bona fide dealer therein, the postmaster shall accept the parcel for mailing. Before making delivery of any such parcel the postmaster at the office of address shall satisfy himself that the addressee is a manufacturer of firearms or a bona fide dealer therein.

10. Parcels containing unloaded firearms properly prepared for mailing addressed for delivery to officers of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Officers' Reserve Corps; to officers of the National Guard or Militia of the several States, Territories, and Districts; to officers of the United States or of the several States, Territories, and Districts whose official duty is to serve process of warrants of arrest or mittimus of commitment; to employees of the Postal Service; and to watchmen engaged in guarding the property of the United States, the several States, Territories, and Districts for use in connection with their official duty, may be accepted for mailing when offered by an authorized agent of the Federal

Government, provided that such parcels shall bear plainly written or printed the official title and address of the sender together with the words "Official shipment." The postmaster before making delivery of any such parcel shall satisfy himself as to the identity of the addressee.

APRIL 26, 1927.

Section 474, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1924, is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraphs to be numbered 2 and 3:

2. Where there is doubt as to the mailability of unloaded firearms under section 478½ the parcel should be withheld from dispatch or delivery and the question, with a complete statement of the facts, submitted to the Solicitor of the Post Office Department for instructions.

3. Where parcels containing firearms are found in the mails obviously in violation of section 478½, the facts should be reported to the inspector in charge of the division in which the discovery is made.

Section 1273½ of the Postal Laws and Regulations is amended so as to add paragraph 16, as follows:

16. *It is ordered*, That the rates of pay established for the transportation of mail matter by the Boston & Maine Railroad over the line of railroad from Wells River, Vt., to Newport, Vt., be, and they are hereby, established as the fair and reasonable rates of pay for the transportation of mail matter over the said line by the Canadian Pacific Railway Co. on and after June 1, 1926. (Order of the Interstate Commerce Commission of September 18, 1926.)


To Show Reason For Non-Delivery

Failure to indorse returned mail with reason for non-delivery causes criticism of the service.

Furthermore, business concerns to whom unindorsed mail is returned are unable to correct their mailing lists.

In view of the regulations and instructions on this subject, there is little excuse for such failures.

Postmasters and supervisors will see that in the future all mail returned to senders is properly indorsed to show reason for non-delivery. Employees failing to observe these instructions will be suitably disciplined.
